PROPOSED CHANGES, NRS 648

Re: Polygraph

(added) deleted

NRS 648.0103 "Polygraph" (and instrument) defined. "Polygraph" (or "instrument") means an instrument (a device) or mechanical or electronic device (, whether electronic or mechanical,) which records (or is purported to record) or measures (indices) of physiological effects of psychological stimuli to permit the examiner or intern to form an opinion as to the veracity of the statements made by the person examined.

NRS 648.0106 "Polygraphic examination" (and "examination") defined. "Polygraphic examination" (or "examination") means the (entire) procedure by which an examiner or intern renders his (/her) expert opinion as to the veracity of the statements made by the person examined (, including the interview phases prior to and subsequent to the testing phase.)

NRS 648.0109 "Polygraph Examiner" and "examiner" defined. "Polygraph examiner" or "examiner" means a person who by virtue of his (/her) education, training, and experience is capable (possesses the qualifications) of (to) conducting a valid and reliable polygraphic examination.

(NRS 648.0110 "Polygraphic technique and technique defined. "Polygraphic technique" or "technique" means the types of questions used and the sequencing of those questions during the testing phase of an examination, as well as the procedures used in evaluating data recorded.)

NRS 648.060

(4. A person licensed as a polygraphic examiner or intern may not employ a non-licensed person to perform any portion or phase of an examination.)

NRS 648.110

2. ((h) Effective June 2010, An applicant for renewal of a license as a polygraphic examiner, or for reinstatement of a license held in abeyance as a polygraphic examiner, must have completed not less than 40 classroom hours of advanced polygraphic instruction satisfactory to the board during the 2 years immediately prior to his/her application.)

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NRS 648.185 Approval of a polygraph (instrument) required. Conditional Approval.

- 1. Each Instrument (Any electronic or mechanical device, instrument, data acquisition system or sub-system and software) used to conduct a polygraphie (an) examination must be of a type approved by the Board. The Board shall (only) approve instruments (devices) which:
 - a. Are of commercial manufacture (and design);
- b. Visually, permanently and simultaneously record (digitally or) on a moving graph, (indices) of physiological effects, including respiratory activity, cardio vascular activity, and skin conductance activity (electro-dermal activity, and physical movement on the part of the person examined,) as well as any other activity which the Board deems relevant to the purposes of a polygraphic examination; and
- c. Meet minimum standards of accuracy and reliability adopted by the Board.

NRS.640.195 Opinion of an examiner.

- 1. An examiner or intern shall not render an oral or written opinion (concerning the veracity of the person examined) based upon his(/her) analysis of polygraphic charts (the indices of physiological effects recorded during the examination) without administering two or more charts with the same questions on at least two of the charts (unless:)
- (a. The analysis covers two or more repetitions of the same questions used for comparison.
- b. A sound and/or video recording was made of the entire examination process.
- c. A minimum of one hour and 30 minutes was devoted to the examination process.
- d. The examiner or intern has not conducted or attempted more than four examinations in the 24 hour period immediately preceding the examination.
- e. The examination was conducted in a manner which complies with the minimum standards, procedures, and requirements of ASTM International (formerly the American Society for Testing and Materials) for forensic psycho physiological detection of deception examinations.)

Sub paragraphs 2, 3, and 4 remain as written.
