4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I'll call this meeting
5 of the Private Investigators Licensing Board to order.
6 Today is December 13th.

7 We'll start with having, number one, a roll
8 call of Board members.

9 MR. INGRAM: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

10 Board Member Colbert?

11 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Here.

12 MR. INGRAM: Board Member Flynn?

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Here.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Present.

16 MR. INGRAM: Board Member Nixon?

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Here.

18 MR. INGRAM: And Chairman Nadeau?

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Here.

20 Very good. Welcome.

21 So we'll go with item number two, public
22 comment. We have two, for the public, we have two
23 opportunities for the public to comment on items not
24 necessarily on the agenda. There's a limitation of five
25 minutes per person. And the comments must be directed

1 to the Board. Additionally, the second public comment
2 will be at the end of the meeting.

3 So do we have anyone with public comment?

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None down south.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Nothing down south.

6 Nothing north.

7 Then, let's start with item number three, and
8 we'll go with Board and Executive Director
9 announcements, reports and updates. Let's start with
10 Director Ingram.

11 MR. INGRAM: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

12 I've provided the financials to the Board
13 members. If you have any questions about the
14 financials, I'd be happy to answer those questions.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: It looks to me like the
16 financials, we're in pretty good shape right now.

17 MR. INGRAM: Yes, sir.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And we're, what, about
19 40 percent -- no. About, what, 25, 30 percent
20 through -- what, 40 percent through the budget?

21 MR. INGRAM: That's correct, a little bit over
22 40 percent. We're about 30 percent as far as our
23 standings. So we're looking good, in good shape.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right. Very
25 good.

1 Any of the Board members have any comments?

2 Questions?

3 Okay. Kevin, continue.

4 MR. INGRAM: Okay. The next item, Mr. Nadeau,
5 I believe, you have a presentation you'd like to make.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Sure. Is former Board
7 member Mark Zane in the audience?

8 MR. INGRAM: Yes, he is. He's coming forward,
9 sir.

10 MR. ZANE: Good morning, Mr. Chairman.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning, Mark.
12 It's my pleasure to recognize your time on the PILB
13 Board. Though specifically representing private
14 investigators, your work in the area of private patrol,
15 repossession and process serving brought a vast array of
16 experience and expertise to the Board. And during your
17 tenure as chairman, you provided insight to the various
18 aspects as practitioners, but also brought humanity,
19 empathy and understanding for those working in the
20 field. This always impressed me.

21 So I truly thank you for your time and
22 commitment to the industry and to the PILB.

23 MR. ZANE: Thank you very much, Mr. Chairman.
24 I'd like to thank the current Board and the staff,
25 present and gone, for assisting me and meeting the

1 conflicts of those things that you give me accolades
2 for. Because without all of that, including Mr. Ingram
3 especially, that wouldn't have been such a good speech
4 you just gave.

5 MR. INGRAM: So, Mark, on behalf of the Private
6 Investigators Licensing Board, we'd like to award you
7 with this retirement plaque from the Board. It says
8 "Mark Zane, Board Chair, Private Investigators Licensing
9 Board: In recognition and sincere appreciation of your
10 distinguished service from October 2009 through June
11 2018. Congratulations and best wishes on your
12 retirement from the Board."

13 (Applause.)

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thanks again, Mark.

15 Okay. So review and approval or approve
16 transcripts from the September 10th, 2018 Board meeting.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'd move to
18 approve.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion to
20 approve. Do we have a second?

21 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Second by Board Member
23 Colbert.

24 All right. Is there any discussion on the
25 minutes, or on the transcripts?

1 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
2 signify by saying "aye."

5 It passes unanimously. And I'm not going to

9 like to share under item number three, if possible.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yeah, let's go back to
11 item number three, because I got moving and forgot that
12 you did have an item you wanted to point out. Thank
13 you.

14 MR. INGRAM: Thank you, sir.

15 So what we are going to start doing at every
16 Board meeting is give the Board and those in attendance
17 a breakdown of the audits, the number of work cards, the
18 number of applicants, so that the Board and those in the
19 audience can see what Board staff takes care of during
20 the quarters.

21 So I've provided an additional handout to the
22 Board this morning. And if you take a look at the nice
23 little graphs that Chief Irizarry put together for you
24 here, I'll kind of walk through that so that we can get
25 it on the record.

1 In the time frame of September 1st through
2 November 30th of this year, our staff processed 2,134
3 work card applications. Of those work card
4 applications, 1,478 are now active. 37 were denied.
5 And all 37 have appealed. 95 are in pending status.
6 And pending status could be anyone that's awaiting to be
7 made provisional. It could be because we're missing
8 information, or we have an incomplete app, or that, you
9 know, it takes a little bit more of a background to get
10 them cleared, maybe we're waiting on court documents.
11 So there are 95 currently pending.

12 There are 483 in a provisional status.
13 Provisional status just, basically, means that we have
14 not received the fingerprints back from the Nevada
15 Criminal Repository and the FBI. Once we receive those
16 back, they will either be cleared for an active card or
17 possibly denied based on criminal history. And of those
18 cards, 41 were withdrawn. And that can be at the
19 request of the applicant. Or it could be we've waited
20 beyond the 30 days to gather additional information from
21 them, and did not receive it, so they were withdrawn.

22 Are there any questions about the work cards
23 before I go to the next page?

24 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

25 MR. INGRAM: Hearing none, I'll go ahead and go

1 forward. On the back side of the page, you'll see the
2 same time frame. We received a total of 14 corporate
3 applications for licensure. Of the 14 corporate
4 applications, we approved 13. The one that was not
5 approved was a failure to meet the minimum
6 qualifications.

7 We received 36 individual applications. And
8 you can see the breakdown, as far as the categories that
9 we received them in. Canine, we received three.
10 Private investigator, we received 11. Private patrol,
11 we received 19. Process servers, we received two.
12 Repossessors, we received one. And all but one of those
13 applications was approved. There was a private patrol
14 officer that was aligning himself with that same
15 corporation that was denied who did not meet the minimum
16 qualifications, so that one was denied.

17 As far as the complaints, there were 15 total
18 complaints received by the Board. Now, these complaints
19 are over and above unlicensed activity complaints. So
20 these are complaints on license holders. We received a
21 total of 15, ranging from failure to pay employees
22 correctly, working without registered work cards,
23 insurance lapsing or -- and there were a couple that
24 were EEO complaints as well. I'm sorry. There was one
25 EEO complaint.

1 All of the complaints were satisfied, and we
2 did not write any citations of the licensees based on
3 the outcome. There were five that were referred over to
4 the Nevada Labor Commission for some payroll issues.
5 All of those are currently being resolved or have been
6 resolved. So no citations have been issued for that.
7 The one complaint that went to EEOC was really not under
8 our jurisdiction, and so the EEOC picked that up.

9 We had two of them that were complaints that
10 were not justified. I'll give you the example of one of
11 them. We had a complaint against a security company
12 working without a license. And when we investigated, it
13 was an employee of the 7-Eleven. And 7-Eleven was
14 employing them as a security officer. And as you know,
15 a bona fide employee of a company does not have to be
16 licensed with us. So two of those were nonjustified.

17 And then the last one was pending with the City
18 of Las Vegas. The City of Las Vegas had -- there was
19 violations of the city code, not Chapter 648. And the
20 city's taken care of that.

21 Right now, on all of our complaints, when they
22 come in, we have approximately one-week turnaround on
23 finalizing the investigations, with the exception of
24 some ongoing investigations that we are working directly
25 with IRS. We are working with some of the other local

1 law enforcement agencies who have taken a lead on it.
2 And then we also have the federal government involved in
3 a couple of the investigations that we're doing. So
4 they take the lead on that. Once a decision's made,
5 then we'll be able to bring those before the Board, if
6 need be.

7 As far as the unlicensed activity citations, we
8 issued 10 during this quarter. Four of the 10 have been
9 paid in full. One of the citations has been sent to the
10 Controller's Office for failure to pay, and it is
11 currently in collections. And we have five citations
12 that are still within the 30-day appeal process.

13 I'd answer any questions with the Board may
14 have.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Do any members of the
16 Board have any questions?

17 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah. This is Ray Flynn.

19 Kevin, is it possible for us to, for you guys
20 to produce a year-end now, or would that be something
21 that would be easier going forward?

22 MR. INGRAM: Going forward.

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

24 MR. INGRAM: Correct. The old database doesn't
25 have the ability to search a lot of this information

1 that we're now capturing in our new database.

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: M-hm (affirmative).

3 MR. INGRAM: So I can do my best to maybe throw
4 some numbers together. But, I think, going forward
5 would be the most accurate presentation of where we are.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Then, Mr. Chair, I would
7 ask that in the -- I'd really like that report, because
8 it's a good overview of the activity of the PILB. And I
9 would ask that that be part of our regular meetings, a
10 quarterly report out.

11 But I'd also like to see, if it's okay with
12 you, a year-end report also, going forward.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I agree with you, Board
14 Member Flynn. I think, this is really good data for us
15 to really get a perspective on what's going on as far as
16 unlicensed activity and all of the other things.

17 Kevin, I did have a question. What's the
18 normal turnaround on your unlicensed activity citations,
19 or do you -- I know you have some that are within the
20 30-day appeal process. But what's the normal turnaround
21 on this?

22 MR. INGRAM: Well, the minute that we receive a
23 complaint, we open an investigation in our new database.
24 And it's assigned to Supervising Investigator Vincent
25 Saladino. After his review, he'll assign it to an

1 investigator to go ahead and start gathering the data.
2 Obviously, we have Investigator Mahan there in the north
3 that we have assigned a couple to. He's done a
4 fantastic job following up on those. And then in the
5 south.

6 General turnaround, as far as gathering
7 information, is anywhere from, what, one to three weeks,
8 Vinny?

9 MR. SALADINO: (Nodded head.)

10 MR. INGRAM: So about one to three weeks on the
11 fact-gathering, depending on how complicated it is. As
12 I said, some of the investigations uncover criminal
13 violations. And at that time, we involve the
14 appropriate authorities for that.

15 As far as closure of the investigation, it
16 could be as quickly as one day. Or, as I've said, we
17 have some that just came in yesterday, as a matter of
18 fact, that have not been assigned yet. And a couple of
19 them look like it might take months to complete the
20 investigation, based on a cursory review.

21 But general turnaround, as long as we have all
22 the information, is approximately one week.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Good. Thank
24 you.

25 Any other questions from the Board?

1 Seeing none, Kevin, would you mind introducing
2 the PILB staff.

3 MR. INGRAM: Absolutely. I would love to do
4 that. Thank you.

5 To my left is Board Counsel Rosalie Bordelove.
6 She's been our Board Counsel for quite a while now. And
7 we have a really good working relationship with her and
8 her staff. Directly to her left is Supervising
9 Investigator Vincent Saladino. To his left is our Chief
10 of Operations, my number one, Lori Irizarry. Directly
11 to her left is Zachary Swarthout. He's one of our
12 investigators. Directly to his left is Shelly Donald,
13 Investigator. Directly to her left is Paul Maxwell, an
14 Investigator with us. And directly to his left is
15 Gisela Corral, and she is our Licensing Specialist.

16 And there directly behind you, to your left on
17 the screen, or to your right, is Investigator Shawn
18 Mahan. And to his right is Mary Klemme. She's our
19 northern Office Manager.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you. Thank you
21 very much.

22 MR. INGRAM: And directly in front of you,
23 also, is our court reporter, Ms. Shannon.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Great. Thank you.
25 Thank you very much.

1 All right. At this --

2 MR. INGRAM: Yes, sir.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: At this point, let's go
4 to item number five, and that will all applicants and
5 witnesses to be sworn in.

6 So if you are planning to --

7 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Chair, do you want us to go
8 ahead and give a overview our new website?

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Sure, why not.

10 MR. INGRAM: Okay. I know we had briefly
11 talked about this. And, I guess, I didn't want to get
12 too far into the agenda.

13 So while Lori's coming up and getting the
14 computer set up to give you the overview of our new
15 website, I think, Mr. Flynn, Board Member Flynn had
16 something he wanted to discuss.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Sure. I just want to let
18 you know that during the last quarter, I attended the
19 International Association of Security Regulators
20 Conference in Scottsdale. It's something that Kevin
21 made mention he's been actively involved with this
22 association for years. He was the current -- was the
23 president. He served out his term. And I'd asked over
24 a year ago the ability to go to observe what happens at
25 this. And he was able to fit it into the current

1 budget.

2 It was two days long, and it was definitely
3 well worth my time. There was not one session or a
4 breakout session that I did not learn something from,
5 everything from the history of regulating authorities to
6 policies and procedures that are commonplace throughout
7 not only our nation, but also other countries. I had a
8 great conversation with a representative from Canada, a
9 lot of shared interests.

10 The other thing that I really enjoyed was
11 interacting with the members of the security industry.
12 I'm one of the two Board members that are a citizen
13 at-large. And so I never worked in the security
14 industry. So it was really interesting to understand
15 their perspective and how they view regulations and,
16 also, the process of grading the regulations.

17 So I highly encourage Kevin to continue to try
18 to get funding for this, and encourage other members of
19 the Board. If we could have send one every year -- they
20 have an annual conference -- that would be great. And
21 if nobody wants to go, I'd volunteer to go to the next
22 one. That's how well worth it was to me. So.

23 MR. INGRAM: To add to that, we just had a
24 board meeting last week. The current president, Fabian
25 Blache from Louisiana, and then me, as immediate past

1 president, and we just approved a new membership for
2 South Africa. And we have members from the United
3 Emirates, India, eight provinces in Canada, the National
4 Council in France. So we truly are an international
5 association. And the sharing of information has been
6 phenomenal and has helped me to be successful in my
7 position.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So, and where is the
9 next conference next year?

10 MR. INGRAM: Right now, there's three areas
11 that are being considered: Washington D.C.; California,
12 here on the west coast; and, also, Canada, for the next
13 conference. It'll be held either October or November.
14 We're working out the details. Our theme for this
15 conference is going to be everything security and
16 investigative related to the cannabis industry and how
17 it's taken the states and countries by storm.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Very good. Now I can
19 understand why Ray volunteered to go to the next one, if
20 it's in Canada. All right. Very good.

21 MR. INGRAM: And at this time, I think, we're
22 ready for the presentation from Ms. Irizarry if you
23 don't have any other questions.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: No, let's go ahead and
25 go forward.

1 MS. IRIZARRY: Good morning. My name's Lori
2 Irizarry, Chief of Operations.

3 I was asked to do a brief presentation on our
4 new website. It's been up and running for a few months
5 now, probably about six or so months. But we haven't
6 actually --

7 (The Reporter indicated it's difficult to hear
8 Las Vegas.)

9 MS. IRIZARRY: Okay. I was asked to give a
10 brief presentation on our new website, go over with you
11 on what our new witness looks like.

12 Am I talking too fast, Shannon?

13 (There was a brief discussion with the Reporter
14 regarding an inability to completely hear Las Vegas.)

15 MS. IRIZARRY: Okay. We tailored our website
16 to model all of the other state websites. So if you go
17 to the Governor's website or to the Controller's Office,
18 all of our websites now have the same template type. So
19 it's a little bit more user-friendly.

20 It's going to give you a view of the tasks at
21 the top. So when we go onto our website, there's an
22 initial landing. There's a carousel. All these are
23 interactive. You can click on here. It'll take you to
24 a Google map of our location. There's an actual image
25 of our Las Vegas location. You have Crime Stoppers.

1 Here's our Carson City office. Crime Stoppers. See
2 Something, Say Something; as security industry or other
3 industries, the people we work in conjunction with, law
4 enforcement. So if a security officer needs to report
5 something, they can always come to our website instead
6 of looking for another state agency's website to find.

7 At the bottom, there are some key button items.
8 So the number one thing people usually come to our
9 website for is to apply for a work card.

10 Click the Identify for a Work Card. If you're
11 an employee -- employer, and you want to verify
12 someone's work card to make sure it's still currently
13 active, you can verify a work card.

14 Apply for a license. The apply for a license
15 function right now is not up and running. If you click
16 here, it takes you to a part of our website with some
17 information on the requirements to be a license holder,
18 and to contact our Licensing Specialist, Gisela. This
19 has the electronic license applications, don't have the
20 paper app at the moment for a license holder.

21 The initial landing for the website. Our
22 About Us page tells you about our mission statement.
23 You can meet our Board members here, read bios for each
24 of them. Our newsletters. Our statutes, NRS 648, and
25 NAC 648, which is what governs our agency. And our

1 organizational chart of all of our employees and our
2 staff. There's a brief overview of who we are.

3 The Public Access is one of the -- is going to
4 be probably the number one thing where you're going to
5 click on when you come onto our website. The Public
6 Access is going to be where you would verify, as the
7 public or as a Board member or as a licensee, if someone
8 has a work card, if it's active, the status of their
9 work card, our license holders. All of it is in one
10 spot.

11 So if you are looking for an individual person
12 who has a work card or their provisional, and you want
13 to see the status of it, you would type in their work
14 card number here. Or you can look them up by first and
15 last name. Some instructions here on the side. If I'm
16 looking for a John Smith, you have to type in a portion
17 of his first name with an asterisk and a portion of his
18 last name with an asterisk in order to find him. If you
19 type in the full name John Smith, you may get exactly
20 that person, but he may be John Smith, hyphen, Jones.
21 You won't find him unless you put that asterisk in. So
22 we recommend sticking that star in there.

23 You can look for a particular company name. If
24 you want to find -- let me give you an example. So
25 here's my test subject. So if I wanted to look for an

1 individual, I know that John Cruz has a work card, and
2 he's a license holder. I typed in J. You can add a few
3 more letters if you need to.

4 But John Cruz, any one of these, they're all
5 the exact same person, but it tells you here that he has
6 three different licenses. So any one of them, I get all
7 the information. I don't have to click on each one
8 individually. It tells you right at the top, John Cruz.

9 The first up information right here is going to
10 be his work card information. He's an active work card
11 holder. The status is right here, if he's active,
12 provisional, pending, denied, withdrawn. You're only
13 able to add someone, new license holders if they are
14 active or provisional. When they were given their
15 temporary card. When they were given their permanent
16 plastic card. And when their card is going to expire.

17 This is to keep in mind that someone may have a
18 provisional today, but in a couple months from now, when
19 we get their fingerprints back, they could be denied.
20 So you may have the paper in front of you. It's always
21 good to go on our website and double-check to make sure
22 they're still in provisional status before you hire
23 them.

24 Tells you what companies they're currently
25 working for. It does not list past companies. It is

1 the responsibility of the license holder to add and take
2 people on and off their roster.

3 Something I want to point out, as new license
4 holders that are at the company, if you add someone to
5 your roster today, they will automatically be on your
6 site that you're looking at. When you add them on
7 through your portal, as we call, it's realtime, you see
8 them on your portal right then and there. If you were
9 to come to our website and check to see if it's on the
10 public site, it takes approximately the end of the
11 business day for it to refresh. So the next day, you
12 will see it on this site if you want to verify it. So
13 John Smith added to your company, when you look on the
14 website, it won't actually show you that, because it
15 will probably come up the next day. It refreshes
16 overnight. So keep that in mind.

17 My person here, he works for Cruz
18 International. He is the qualifying agent, private
19 patrolman, private investigator. It tells you his
20 individual licenses are two are in abeyance.

21 So this one verification gives you all the
22 information on John Cruz that we have in our system for
23 him. This is a verification. This is not proof of
24 licensure. They cannot use this form to show that they
25 are licensed with us. This is to verify. They get a

1 certificate. They get a work card. They get a license
2 card. Those are proof of their license with us. This
3 is just for you to verify the information.

4 Back to our website real quick.

5 So Public Access. If you ever want to look up
6 a list of all of the security companies, all the P.I.
7 companies, any reposessor companies, you would click
8 into the list of the active licensees by category. You
9 would fill out the form. It an email, takes about 10,
10 15 minutes, a list of any, all active companies in that
11 category. So if you want to look for all the
12 reposessors here in the state, it can give you a list.
13 You type in your name, your email, and what you're
14 actually looking for or what category of license you're
15 looking for. We do to the produce lists of individual
16 work card holders, only license holders.

17 What I will say is that this information is
18 being updated constantly. So if a change you made
19 today, once again, it may not be updated until the next
20 day on that list itself.

21 MR. INGRAM: Lori, do you want to talk a little
22 bit about the corrupt file, you know, versus the new and
23 how we're going through that daily.

24 MS. IRIZARRY: So the main reason for the
25 update is because our previous system that we were using

1 was a little bit outdated, a little bit older. So
2 transitioning everything from the older system to the
3 new system, there has been some issues. And what we
4 are -- like somebody asked if our older, like old
5 addresses, some of the information was -- so verify
6 license holders coming up are probably --

7 (The Reporter interrupted due to an inability
8 to completely hear Las Vegas.)

9 MS. IRIZARRY: So we are trying to work through
10 some of the data issues that we're having. The way that
11 we're expecting to do that is to let our licensees know,
12 go on the website, here's what address to you want
13 displayed to the public, mailing or physical, what's
14 your contact information you want.

15 So when we finally clean up the data
16 information, that's what would be displayed on the
17 active licensee list. Some of the information is there
18 currently. So you can still go on in and find a company
19 and see some address. But we're trying to clean up,
20 because some addresses are still missing, some contact
21 information is still missing, because switching from one
22 to another there's always some hiccups in between.

23 On this Public Access page is where you file a
24 complaint. You can either download the form or actually
25 input the form. It goes directly to our -- to the

1 investigator. And, once again, like Kevin said earlier,
2 it takes about a week turnaround time to get it back to
3 you.

4 The Meetings tab is anywhere you would find
5 upcoming meetings, Board meetings, agendas, minutes.
6 These are all the current meetings for the past year.
7 And then you can go to our archived meetings and
8 workshops. If we are looking at changing any NRS, any
9 NRSs, NACs, any public workshops, this is where you'll
10 find the workshop and meeting dates here. And any of
11 our old, past meetings all the way to 2005. That's
12 minutes as well.

13 The Licensing tab is, if you want to be become
14 licensed, it lets you know right at the top this is not
15 for a work card. I know, in other states, the words
16 work card and license are interchanged. Here in Nevada,
17 a license is held by the company, a work card is for the
18 individual. So it lets you know right at the top this
19 is for a license only, tells you how to apply for a
20 license. Right now, you contact Gisela.

21 If you were going to be licensed and you
22 needed to know information about the exam, it's got exam
23 dates, tells you exactly what's going to be on the exam,
24 what you need to study, the book that you would need to
25 purchase if you are going to be a P.I., where the exam

1 locations are, and the exam dates.

2 Work cards. Another top button on our website
3 is going to be when someone wants to apply. Here you
4 find all the printable documents, the fingerprint
5 locations, the application itself, and you want to print
6 it out and bring it into the office. At the moment, you
7 are only able to apply in our offices. But we've just
8 finalized our work card application online. And this is
9 a kind of an example of what it will look like.

10 So this is the work card application. It has a
11 landing page. And what it tells you right here off the
12 bat is you have to complete the entire application from
13 start to finish and pay. You can't save and come back
14 to it. The work card application's only about six or
15 seven pages, so it shouldn't -- it's nothing that you
16 would need, like a license application, where you're
17 talking 20, 30 pages. It tells you the fees right at
18 the top, tells you what you're going to need before you
19 start the application, what you'll need to turn in,
20 either now or later, for it to be completed. And once
21 you read this, continue to the application.

22 Our application is much more user-friendly. It
23 goes tab by tab. Fill everything out. And when you get
24 to the bottom, click submit. And you're able to pay
25 online. Now, expedite fee, you weren't able to pay that

1 expedite fee online before, you had to come into our
2 office. We're now allowing you to pay expedite.

3 What expedite means -- if you pay the regular
4 fee, it takes about one to two weeks currently to get a
5 work card. If you pay the expedite fee, it takes about
6 two business days to be able to rush it now, if it had
7 come into our office now, as far as a website account.
8 It's going to make it a little bit more user-friendly.

9 This would be the work card process. It also
10 explains reasons the license would be denied and some
11 employment restrictions that our work cards have on
12 them.

13 The CFI tab is right now fairly minimal. The
14 goal with this is CFIs, Certified Firearms Instructors,
15 are able to input all their firearms information on our
16 website instead of having to drop off and mail their
17 information to us, which will help with the process
18 turnaround time. Pretty standard forms, has any form
19 that you may need would be here. Instead of going to
20 each individual tab, basically, the forms, all of our
21 forms will be listed here.

22 Our contact information. Our hours of
23 operation. We are closed for lunch every day 12:00 to
24 1:00. We do take credit cards in our office now. We
25 just still don't deal with cash.

1 And our online portal. This online portal is
2 where, when you are a license holder, where you would go
3 to adjust your roster, check to see if you have a fine
4 issued to you, how you could pay it, renew your license,
5 add or take away any of your -- update your contact
6 information, add a branch location, add an individual
7 sheet from your company that may not be a corporate
8 officer, but you want to add Mary as your person who
9 wants to update your roster, you can add it and do all
10 of it in your online portal.

11 Here are some instructions on how to create an
12 account, manage your roster, and renew your license.
13 When you click on the portal, what it will look like, or
14 this is what it looks like.

15 Every single new license holder, regardless if
16 you are on our old system or you're becoming licensed
17 today, you must request access to our site. None of
18 your old information from the old site transferred over
19 to the new site. Passwords aren't effective, so we
20 can't transfer passwords from one site to another. So
21 you are requesting to request access to our site. So
22 you would come on here and request access. What we're
23 looking for mainly is your email, first and last name,
24 date of birth, and social.

25 That's how it links everything, first name,

1 last name, date of birth, and social. And we're going
2 by what's on your state ID, because that's how we --
3 that's how we input you in our system. So if you go by
4 Bob, and your name's Robert, you need to go with that,
5 or it won't link your account, kind of a tip there,
6 because that's creating a little bit of problem. If you
7 have a hyphenated last name, and you only go by Jones,
8 but you're Jones, hyphen, Smith, you need to put
9 everything that's on that. Whatever you need with your
10 fingerprints is how we have you in the system, which is
11 how you would input it on this as well.

12 Once you log in and create an account, it takes
13 about 10 to 15 minutes. You'll get an email sent to
14 you. That email, you click on it, and then you're able
15 to access our account. That 10 or 15 minutes is what
16 it's doing is it's looking for you, gathering if you
17 have a license, a work card, if you have been denied.
18 What it's doing, it's creating one account, and then you
19 can log into one site and keep all of your stuff on one
20 site.

21 Many of our licensees have relogged in during
22 their renewal process. This online portal is not for
23 work card holders. It's only for license holders. If
24 you're a license holder and you have a work card, you'll
25 see your work card on there. But this is not for

1 someone who's applying for a work card. You only get
2 online, apply for a work card. You don't have an
3 account in our system if you have a work card.

4 And other than that, I'll leave it there, if
5 you have any questions, from the Board.

6 UNIDENTIFIED WOMAN IN THE AUDIENCE: So for our
7 application, would it be --

8 MR. IRIZARRY: There is a question, Board,
9 Board Chairman, if you want to respond.

10 MR. INGRAM: Well, I would just like to say
11 that if there's questions from the audience, that's
12 going to be handled in training sessions. So if the
13 Board has any questions about the presentation, we would
14 entertain the Board's questions.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Anybody have any
16 questions?

17 You can go ahead and take the website down, if
18 you would, Lori.

19 Great. Thank you very much.

20 Do any of the Board members have any questions
21 or follow-up?

22 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

24 MR. INGRAM: No questions here.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions. Thank you.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, I'd just make a
4 comment, if you will, Mr. Chairman.

5 I started with this since it went into effect.
6 And with very little help, had some help Kevin, but very
7 little, it was very easy to handle as a licensee. I
8 think, it's a great improvement by everybody that's
9 involved in it.

10 That's all I had.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

12 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I want to compliment
14 you. Because, number one, I think, the old website,
15 wasn't it pilb.org or something like that? Now it's
16 consistent with all the state websites. I think, that's
17 great. It's, what, pilb.nv.gov, right?

18 MS. IRIZARRY: Yes, correct.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: That's great. And, I
20 think, it looks very user-friendly. It looks very
21 user-friendly. So, good job.

22 And how are we doing now, are we caught up on
23 all the renewals and everything else?

24 MS. IRIZARRY: Yes. So there's no more, caught
25 up right now. We are focusing on our work cards, apply

1 online. And then, from there, we're going to let
2 licensing apply. We're just doing one thing at a time
3 instead of kind of jumping in all at once.

4 And then the next step is we are planning, as
5 soon as the new year starts, we are going to email our
6 license holders, letting them know the training
7 sessions, so we can go more in-depth of here's what it
8 will look like, kind of a how-to, and just giving
9 instructions. Because in that, I would train them on
10 how to use it, them and their staff, whenever they want
11 to come in to train, use our system.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. I think, it
13 looks great, much, much, much better than the old site.
14 It's improved.

15 MS. IRIZARRY: Thank you.

16 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any other comments or
18 questions from the Board?

19 Well, thank you very much for the presentation.
20 That's awesome.

21 MS. IRIZARRY: You're welcome.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Kevin, did I miss
23 anything else that we talked about?

24 MR. INGRAM: Sir, I think, we're ready for item
25 number five.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you. Finally.

2 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. So let's go
4 ahead and do the all applicants and witnesses to be
5 sworn in.

6 So if anyone's going to do any testifying, then
7 please rise and be sworn in.

8 MS. BORDELOVE: Please raise your right hand.
9 Do you solemnly swear to tell the truth, the whole
10 truth, and nothing but the truth?

11 (All applicants and witnesses present in
12 Las Vegas and Carson City were sworn.)

13 MS. BORDELOVE: Thank you.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Moving right
15 along, let's go ahead and address corporate officer.

16 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chairman?

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Did you have something?

18 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, would you
19 entertain a block vote?

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I would.

21 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Okay. I'd like to, for
22 consideration for the block vote, I'd like to use number
23 six, number seven, number eight, number nine, number 10,
24 number 11, number 12, number 13, number 14, and number
25 15 for approval.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. I have a motion
2 for a block vote.

3 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Chair, before we move forward,
4 I do need to let you know that one of those items has
5 been postponed till March. That is item number 13. So
6 we will not be making a decision on item 13 at this
7 time.

8 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Okay. I'll remove
9 number 13.

10 MR. INGRAM: And while I'm at it, let's go
11 ahead and go through the rest of the items. Item
12 number 16 has been postponed till March at the request
13 of the applicant.

14 Item number 29 has been postponed till March at
15 the request of the applicant.

16 And item number 52 of the work card appeals has
17 been resolved. So that the not be heard today, either.

18 Thank you.

19 So let me go through those again. Items number
20 13, 16, 29 have been postponed till March. Item number
21 52 has been resolved and will not be heard today.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. So we have a
23 motion for a block vote.

24 Kevin, would you read the items that have been
25 put into the block vote.

1 MR. INGRAM: The block vote items would be six,
2 seven, eight --

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I'm sorry. Kevin,
4 would you go ahead and read what they are.

5 MR. INGRAM: Yes.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And address it, kind of
7 read the item, so that anyone that's here for any of the
8 items will know specifically what we're addressing?

9 MR. INGRAM: Absolutely. Agenda item six is
10 CoreCivic, corporate officer status for Cole G. Carter.

11 Item number seven is AppFolio, Inc., license
12 number 1691, corporate officer approval for Clifford C.
13 Carlson, Ida K. Kane and Jason R. Randall.

14 Item number 8, Sedgwick SIU, Inc., license
15 number 1658, corporate officer approval for Kimberly D.
16 Brown-Carlisle.

17 Item number nine, Fire Cause Analysis, license
18 number 755, corporate officer status for Karen T. Peak.

19 Item number 10, Protective Force International,
20 LLC, dba Protective Force International, is applying for
21 a new private investigator and private patrol license.

22 Jonathan G. Alvarez, license number 2665, requesting his
23 individual license be placed in abeyance so that he may
24 become the qualifying agent. And the members to be
25 approved are Jonathan G. Alvarez and Andre D. Scott.

1 Item number 11, Armored Empire, LLC, dba
2 Armored Empire Security, is applying for new private
3 patrol license. And if approved, Mena Boktor, license
4 number 2650, requesting that his individual license be
5 placed into abeyance so that he may become the
6 qualifying agent.

7 Item number 12, Omega Executive Protection,
8 LLC, is applying for a new private patrol license. If
9 approved, William C. Walden, license number 2198,
10 requesting that his individual license be kept in
11 abeyance so that he may become the qualifying agent.
12 Member to be approved is William C. Walden.

13 Item number 14, Darryl A. Kelley, requesting a
14 change of licensing status. Mr. Kelley's requesting
15 that his individual license, number 12 -- I'm sorry --
16 1921, license number 1921, be kept in abeyance so that
17 he may become the qualifying agent for Chenega Infinity,
18 LLC, license number 2289. Member to be approved is
19 Robert L. Cox.

20 Item number 15, Angeline Walker, requesting a
21 change of licensing status. Ms. Walker is requesting
22 that her individual license, license number 2668, be
23 kept in abeyance so she may become the qualifying agent
24 for Specialized Attorney Services, Inc., license number
25 2627.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a
2 motion. Do we have a second?

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn seconds.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

5 For the public, we have the block vote, which
6 means that all of these items can be considered in one
7 vote. Is there anyone that has any public testimony or
8 any public comment on any of these items?

9 MR. INGRAM: None in the south.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I'm sorry?

11 MR. INGRAM: I'm sorry, sir. I said none in
12 the south.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

14 Is there any discussion from the Board? Board
15 Member Flynn?

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, sir.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

18 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

22 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Hearing no
24 discussion, all in favor of the motion, signify by
25 saying "aye."

1 (Board members said "aye.")

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All those opposed?

3 It passes, the motion passes unanimously.

4 MR. INGRAM: So anyone that's here for those
5 item numbers on the agenda, you're free to leave, or
6 you're welcome to stay and participate in the rest of
7 the meeting. Staff will be in contact with you within
8 the next three business days.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Moving
10 along on the agenda, item 16 was postponed.

11 So we'll move to item number 17, AccuSource,
12 Incorporated, is applying for a new corporate private
13 investigator license. Lianne Charton-Holder is applying
14 for an individual license and requesting that her
15 individual license be placed in abeyance so that she may
16 become the qualifying agent. Corporate officer to be
17 approved is Lisa M. Holder.

18 So is there someone from AccuSource here?

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning. Please
21 identify yourself and give us a little bit of your
22 background and what your plans are.

23 MS. CHARTON-HOLDER: My name is Lianne Charton,
24 of Corona, California, with AccuSource, Incorporated.
25 We do background checks for employers who need to hire

1 new personnel. And part of the reason we are required
2 to get a private investigation license is to be able to
3 access the public records in your state.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Very good.

5 Do we have any questions from the Board?

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, sir.

7 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I have no questions.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Do we have a motion?
10 Or excuse me. Do we have any public comment?

11 MS. CHARTON-HOLDER: Well, I personally do. I
12 actually wanted to thank Shelly and Gisela, because they
13 were amazing during this process. Your state is very
14 responsive to the needs of the licensees, yeah.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you. Thank you
16 very much. We like to hear the good side. Thank you.

17 Okay. I'll accept a motion, then.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer. I'll
19 make a motion to approve.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Do we have a second to
21 the motion?

22 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

23 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion and a
25 second by Colbert. Any discussion on the motion?

1 All in favor, signify by saying "aye."

2 (Board members said "aye.")

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All opposed?

4 It passes unanimously. Congratulations. Thank
5 you very much for being here.

6 MS. CHARTON: Thank you. Thank you.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 18, Brand
8 Security Corporation. Is there anyone from Brand
9 Security?

10 MS. HOLDRIDGE: Yes, sir, over here.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please.

12 MS. HOLDRIDGE: Good morning.

13 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Good morning.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning. Please
15 identify yourself and tell us a little bit about you and
16 what your company plans to do.

17 MS. HOLDRIDGE: Yes, good morning. My name is
18 Heather Holdridge, and I'm from Brand Security
19 Corporation. I was actually raised in Fallon. And I
20 currently operate and have a private investigator
21 license out of California. And I have a couple of
22 clients that are moving into Nevada, and I would like to
23 continue doing business with them in the state, as well
24 as when additional business comes.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. And do we have

1 any questions or any comments from the Board?

2 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

3 It doesn't look as such. Was this the one that
4 someone had a question about the use of the term
5 security --

6 MS. HOLDRIDGE: That's correct.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: -- in your name?

8 MS. HOLDRIDGE: Yes, that's correct.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Inasmuch as you do
10 investigations but not necessarily security?

11 MS. HOLDRIDGE: Yes, we do no security. The
12 name Brand Security is in reference to Brand Detection.
13 The Brand name is trademarked as copyright.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Kevin, or the
15 investigator, did we have any questions as far as this
16 one?

17 MR. INGRAM: No, we did not. I reached out to
18 Ms. Holdridge to ask about the name. And when she
19 explained it that it's, you know, the brand protection
20 security, but it's actually they're doing
21 investigations, we just felt we needed to put that into
22 your background reports, so that the Board would
23 understand why the name said security as opposed to
24 investigations.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And now it's on record

1 in here, too. So very good.

2 MR. INGRAM: Correct.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Do any of the Board
4 members have any questions? Board Member Flynn?

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, sir.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

7 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

11 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. With that,
13 is there any public comment?

14 Nothing north.

15 MR. INGRAM: Nothing south.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Nothing south. I'd
17 accept a motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I make a
19 motion to approve.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes, you know, I made
21 the mistake of reading that whole thing the first time.
22 I think that, I think, we need to be clear on the motion
23 for the record. So if you wouldn't mind reading all of
24 that into the record.

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No problem.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Or completing the
2 motion.

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: My motion is that Brand
4 Security Corporation, they're applying for a new
5 corporate private investigator license. Heather M.
6 Holdridge is applying for an individual private
7 investigator's license. If approved, she is requesting
8 that her individual license be held in abeyance so that
9 it may become -- so that she may become the qualifying
10 agent. The corporate officer to be approved is
11 Heather M. Holdridge. This is subject to all statutory
12 and regulatory requirements.

13 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion. We
15 have a second by Colbert. All in favor -- is there any
16 discussion on the motion?

17 All in favor of the motion, signify by saying
18 "aye."

19 (Board members said "aye.")

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any opposed?

21 Seeing none, the motion passes unanimously.
22 Congratulations.

23 MS. HOLDRIDGE: All right. Thank you very
24 much, sir.

25 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Thank you.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 19,
2 Amanda L. Meredith.

3 Good morning.

4 MS. MEREDITH: Good morning.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: First, identify
6 yourself, please. Explain your background and what your
7 intentions are.

8 MS. MEREDITH: Okay. My name's Amanda
9 Meredith. I have been with AccuSearch, Inc., here in
10 Nevada since the company started in 2011 here. We
11 perform primarily private public records research. And
12 we also have access to the statewide CNC program. So
13 for that, we're required to have our license through the
14 Board here.

15 As the team lead and manager for our office
16 here in Nevada, I am the responsible party for decisions
17 and actions taken here. So I'd like to obtain the
18 license so that my license reflects that status.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Very good.

20 Do we have any questions from the Board? Board
21 Member Flynn?

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: None, sir.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

3 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Is there
5 any public from the -- is there any comments from the
6 public, or public comment?

7 MR. INGRAM: None in the south.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Seeing
9 none, then I would accept a motion.

10 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I'd move that
11 Amanda L. Meredith be approved an individual private
12 investigator's license and that her individual license
13 be placed into abeyance so that she may become the
14 qualifying agent for AccuSearch, Inc., license number
15 1677. This is subject to all statutory and regulatory
16 requirements.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
18 Board Member Colbert. Do we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Second by Board Member
21 Nixon. Any discussion on the motion?

22 Seeing none, all in favor, signify by saying
23 "aye."

24 (Board members said "aye.")

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

1 Seeing none, the motion passes unanimously.

2 Congratulations.

3 MS. MEREDITH: Thank you very much.

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Thank you.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We're now moving to the
6 Private Patrol section, item number 20. Is that Onyxcts
7 ("Onyx")? I'm trying to figure out how to pronounce it.
8 Onyxcts, LLC?

9 MR. CAPONE: Yes, sir.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Come on up.

11 MR. CAPONE: Good morning. Marcus Capone here
12 for representing Onyxcts.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Great. And, sir, so
14 would you identify yourself and give us your background
15 and talk a little bit about the company.

16 MR. CAPONE: Yes, of course. I'm Marcus
17 Capone. I come from a special operations background.
18 And I started a company two years ago with several
19 partners. We went through a recent acquisition by a
20 larger defense contractor, and now we've changed the
21 name to Onyxcts, and we're building out their commercial
22 security division.

23 And we have potential opportunity in projects
24 in the state of Nevada and why we're applying for this
25 license.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you. And where's
2 your office located?

3 MR. CAPONE: We have several. The holding
4 company is out of Columbus, Ohio. We're in Dallas.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

6 MR. CAPONE: We have an office in Virginia.
7 Yeah.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: If you're going to
9 spend some time in Nevada, it's "Neh-VAD-ah," not
10 "Neh-VAW-dah."

11 MR. CAPONE: Nevada.

12 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Very good. That will help
13 to get clients.

14 MR. CAPONE: I spent two days here and no one's
15 corrected me yet.

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: That's why we're here.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: That's right, special
18 operations, special forces venue. Very good.

19 Is there any public comment on this?

20 Does the Board, do the Board members have any
21 questions or comments? Board Member Flynn?

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir, just one.

2 Do you have, currently have an office in
3 Nevada?

4 MR. CAPONE: We don't, sir. And we're just
5 waiting to see if we get the license. Then we're going
6 to move forward with everything else.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: So you don't plan to
8 have an office in Nevada until you have under contract?

9 MR. CAPONE: We would like to see if we're
10 going to, if we're able to move forward with anything.
11 And if we do, then we have to make those arrangements
12 to, you know --

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: An office where?

14 MR. CAPONE: Excuse me?

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Make the arrangements
16 to have an office where, again, what state? Nevada?

17 MR. CAPONE: Currently?

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No.

19 MR. CAPONE: Nevada ("Neh-VAD-ah"), yes. I
20 won't make that mistake again.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: That's all.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Very good.
23 Any other questions, Board Member Gronauer?

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, I'm fine. Thank
25 you.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board Member
2 Colbert?

3 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Seeing none, is there
5 any public comment?

6 MR. INGRAM: None in the south.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And none north. All
8 right. With that, I would accept a motion.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll make a
10 motion. Maybe you can help me out with the
11 pronunciation. How do you pronounce the company name?

12 MR. CAPONE: "Onyx-C-T-S."

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

14 MR. CAPONE: Yes, sir.

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: The motion is that Onyxcts
16 ("Onyx-C-T-S"), LLC, is applying for a new corporate
17 private patrolman license. Marcus A. Capone is applying
18 for an individual private patrolman license. If
19 approved, he is requesting that his individual license
20 be placed into abeyance so that he may become the
21 qualifying agent. Members to be approved are Gregory K.
22 Miller and Jon J. Ricker. This is subject to all
23 statutory and regulatory requirements.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I have a motion by
25 Board Member Flynn. Do I have a second?

1 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Second. I second.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second by
4 Board Member Nixon.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And that --

6 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Chair, we just need him to
7 refine that motion just a little bit.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: What I forgot to say is
10 that I'm making a motion to approve.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Oh. All right. Thank
12 you very much.

13 Okay. So we have a motion to approve made by
14 Board Member Flynn, seconded by Board Member Nixon. Any
15 discussion on the motion?

16 All in favor of the motion, signify by saying
17 "aye."

18 (Board members said "aye.")

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Those opposed?

20 Seeing none, the motion passes unanimously.

21 Mr. Capone, thank you for your service, by the way. And
22 congratulations.

23 MR. CAPONE: Thank you, sir. I look forward to
24 working in Nevada.

25 You told us to do the website. So we'll chat.

1 Thank you.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We'll now go to item
3 number 21, CA Casino Property 1 LLC. Is there anyone
4 here representing them?

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Come on up.

6 MR. INGRAM: Yes, sir.

7 MS. POVILL: Good morning. I'm Lisa Povill.
8 Hello.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning.

10 MS. POVILL: Good morning. I'm Lisa Povill.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
12 yourself, give us some background, and tell us a little
13 bit about your company.

14 MS. POVILL: My name is Lisa Povill. I'm
15 presently and already am a Nevada's licensee. I have a
16 P.I. license and recently took the test and passed for
17 the private patrolman's license. I'm the qualifying
18 agent for, with the Nevada P.I. license for another
19 corporation.

20 And this would be for a different company,
21 under the private patrolman license for -- and the name
22 is deceiving. It was just -- it's going to be changed,
23 and we'll file something. This was just something that
24 it never got to be changed in the process. So it's
25 going to be something more security sounding. But it's

1 going to be security and patrol. We're going to provide
2 security and patrol. And I'm going to be the qualifying
3 agent.

4 So I'm here representing them, but it's going
5 to be here in this state, and they will be providing
6 security services and patrol services for people that
7 they know. And I would be supervising, I guess, in the
8 qualifying agent capacity.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Very good.
10 Any questions from the Board? Board Member
11 Flynn?

12 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, sir.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

14 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, I have one
17 question, just I'll put it to our counsel. I'm not sure
18 that we can, if it's something on the agenda that's
19 under one name, and she wants it approved under a
20 different name. That's the way I understood it, that
21 they're going to operate under a different name.

22 MR. INGRAM: Well, what we would have to do in
23 that case would be, when you approve it under this name,
24 they would have to establish themselves in the state with
25 this name. And once they do a corporate name change,

1 they would have to come before the Board again, to get
2 the corporate name change approved.

3 So you would have to make your decision under
4 this name.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And that will be a
6 different agent item at another time?

7 MR. INGRAM: Different agenda item at a future
8 Board meeting, yes, sir.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. I just wanted to
10 be clear on it. Thank you.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any additional
12 questions?

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm okay. No, I'm
14 fine.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Good.
16 Board Member Colbert?

17 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Do we have
19 any public comment?

20 Seeing or hearing none, then I would entertain
21 a motion.

22 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I'd move that
23 CA Casino Property 1 LLC be approved for a new corporate
24 private patrolman's license, and that Lisa Povill be
25 approved an individual private patrolman license, and

1 that her individual license be placed into abeyance so
2 that she may become the qualifying agent. Member to be
3 approved is Nigel F. White. This is subject to all
4 statutory and regulatory requirements.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
6 Board Member Colbert. Do I have a second?

7 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second by
9 Board Member Nixon. Any discussion on the motion?

10 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
11 signify by saying "aye."

12 (Board members said "aye.")

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Those opposed?

14 Seeing none, the motion passes unanimously.
15 Congratulations. Good luck.

16 MS. POVILL: Thank you very much.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 22,
18 Tactical Protection Agency, LLC. Is there anyone that
19 are representing them?

20 MR. WICKERHAM: Good morning.

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning.

22 MR. WICKERHAM: My name is Andrew Wickerham.
23 I'm apply for the QA.

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you, sir. You

1 can sit down.

2 I'm sorry. Could you give us the lowdown on
3 your background, and talk about, a little bit about the
4 company, please.

5 MR. WICKERHAM: My background is a Marine Corps
6 veteran, and for 10 years, and I've been in the security
7 since 2007. I also qualified as a license holder for a
8 CFI. And we plan on doing a dba to Nevada Protective
9 Services, once we've been granted.

10 And our company is just mainly to provide the
11 service to community's businesses and individuals for
12 any sort of executive protection, personal protection,
13 and standard security.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Very good.

15 Do we have any questions from the Board? Board
16 Member Flynn?

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, sir.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

19 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

23 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Seeing
25 none, do we have any public comment?

1 MR. INGRAM: None in the south.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: In that case, I'd
3 entertain a motion.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I make the motion to --
5 well, I guess, I have to read it. Sorry.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: That's what we all do.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah. I'm sorry. This
8 is Gronauer. I make a motion to approve Tactical
9 Protection Agency, LLC. They're applying for a new
10 corporate private patrolman license. Andrew L.
11 Wickerham, United States Marine Corps veteran, is
12 applying for his individual private patrolman's license.
13 If approved, he is requesting that his individual
14 license be placed into abeyance so that he may become
15 the qualifying agent. Corporate officer to be approved
16 is --

17 Can you tell me that name? I can't. Corporate
18 officer to be approved is, can you tell me the name?

19 MR. WICKERHAM: Just Dane Lee.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Kyonghun Lee. This is
21 subject to all statutory and regulatory requirements.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
23 Board Member Gronauer. Do we have a second?

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second by

1 Board Member Nixon. Any discussion on the motion?

2 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
3 signify by saying "aye."

4 (Board members said "aye.")

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any opposed?

6 Seeing none, the motion passes unanimously.

7 Congratulations. And thank you for your service.

8 MR. WICKERHAM: Thank you, sir.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Moving on,
10 we have item number 23, T.A.C. Protective Services, LLC.

11 MR. WHIDDON: Hi, good morning, Chairman. Good
12 morning, Board.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning. Would
15 you please identify yourself, give us a little bit of
16 your background, and then talk about the company and
17 what they do.

18 MR. WHIDDON: Yes, sir. My name is Tony
19 Whiddon. I'm also a Marine Corps veteran. I've lived
20 in Nevada for the last 50 years. My experience is 28
21 years in the private sector, basically in senior
22 leadership in the casino industry.

23 And we're looking forward to opening up our own
24 company and, you know, serving southern Nevada with
25 patrol services, executive protection, and whatnot.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Do we have
2 any questions from the Board? I'm going to start with
3 Board Member Gronauer first.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll leave this Marine
5 off the hook. I'm fine.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Board
7 Member Nixon?

8 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None. None.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

12 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Is there
14 any public comment?

15 MR. INGRAM: None in the south.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And seeing none, I
17 would accept a motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I move that
19 T.A.C. Protective Services, LLC, be approved for a new
20 corporate private patrolman license, that Tony R.
21 Whiddon be approved an individual private patrolman
22 license, and that his individual license be placed into
23 abeyance so that he may become the qualifying agent.
24 This is subject to all statutory and regulatory
25 requirements.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
2 Board Member Colbert. Do we have a second?

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn seconds.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second by
5 Board Member Flynn. Any discussion on the motion?

6 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
7 signify by saying "aye."

8 (Board members said "aye.")

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

10 The motion passes unanimously. Thank you very
11 much. Congratulations. And thank you for your service.

12 MR. WHIDDON: Thank you. Thank you.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 24, SWATA,
15 LLC.

16 MR. FLEURY: Good morning.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning to you.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning, sir.

19 Please identify yourself, tell us a little bit about
20 your background and then a little bit about the company.

21 MR. FLEURY: My name is Christopher Fleury.

22 I've been in the security for about 10 years, operation.

23 The company's headquarters are in Maryland, D.C.,

24 Virginia. Some of our clients are in Nevada, requesting

25 some of our services.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Any
2 questions from the Board? Board Member Nixon?

3 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Nothing.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board member Colbert?

9 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Is there
11 any public comment?

12 I just had one question and with the
13 investigator. I believe, that was Investigator Maxwell.
14 And we were confirmed on the hours? The hours, I just,
15 there was something about the hours that I was
16 questioning. The -- boy, I'm stuttering here. You were
17 good with the hours?

18 MR. MAXWELL: Yes, sir.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Good enough.
20 All right. With that, I would accept a motion.

21 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I move
22 that --

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll make a --

24 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Go ahead.

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Go for it. Go for it.

1 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I move that
2 SWATA, LLC, be approved a new corporate private
3 patrolman license, and that Christopher U. Fleury be
4 approved an individual private patrolman license, and
5 that his individual license be placed into abeyance so
6 that he may become the qualifying agent. Members to be
7 approved are Christopher U. Fleury. This is subject to
8 all statutory and regulatory requirements.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
10 Board Member Colbert. Do we have a second?

11 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn seconds.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second by
13 Board Member Flynn. Any discussion on the motion?

14 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
15 signify by saying "aye."

16 (Board members said "aye.")

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

18 The motion passes unanimously.

19 Congratulations, Mr. Fleury.

20 MR. FLEURY: Thank you, sir.

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Have a good day.

22 MR. FLEURY: Thanks.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 25, CDA
24 Incorporated.

25 Good morning.

1 MR. PATTISON: Good morning.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
3 yourself, give us a little bit of your background and a
4 little bit about the company.

5 MR. PATTISON: My name is Todd Pattison. I
6 currently live in Annapolis, Maryland. My first career
7 was a state trooper for the State of Iowa. And I
8 transitioned into the private security industry
9 approximately 20 years ago.

10 I am the owner of CDA Incorporated. We are a
11 federal government contractor holding a top-secret
12 facility clearance. And the reason we're seeking
13 licensure in Nevada is there are federal government
14 contracts coming out to bid, and we wish to submit a
15 proposal.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

17 Any questions from the Board? Board Member
18 Gronauer?

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

25 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Is there any public
2 comment?

3 MR. INGRAM: None in the south.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. With that,
5 I would accept a motion.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn will make a
7 motion to approve, that CDA Incorporated is applying for
8 a new corporate private patrolman license. Todd A.
9 Pattison is applying for an individual private patrolman
10 license. If approved, he is requesting that his
11 individual license be placed into abeyance so that he
12 may become the qualifying agent. This is subject to all
13 statutory and regulatory requirements.

14 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
16 Board Member Flynn and a second by Board Member Colbert.
17 Any discussion on the motion?

18 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
19 signify by saying "aye."

20 (Board members said "aye.")

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

22 The motion passes unanimously.

23 Congratulations, Mr. Pattison. Good luck.

24 MR. PATTISON: Thank you very much.

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you. Have a

1 good day.

2 MR. PATTISON: Thank you. Have a good day.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 26, Beau
4 Security & Investigations, Incorporated.

5 Good morning, sir.

6 MR. HURLEY: Good morning, Mr. Chairman.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
8 yourself, give us a little bit of your background and a
9 little bit about the company.

10 MR. HURLEY: Okay. My name is Patrick Hurley.
11 I am a graduate of the United States Naval Academy,
12 former naval aviator, a veteran of the first Persian
13 Gulf War. And for about the last 20 years, I've been in
14 several key risk management, leadership and security
15 positions, including vice president in the office of
16 global security at a large international bank.

17 Currently, I'm the executive vice president at
18 Beau Dietl & Associates, Beau Security Investigations,
19 based in New York. We're applying for a license here in
20 Nevada primarily because we have a large client who's
21 made a significant investment here, an existing client
22 here in Las Vegas, and they've requested we provide
23 security services for them going forward as they build
24 out on their investment. And that's why I'm here today.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

1 Does the Board have any questions? Board
2 Member Colbert?

3 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes, I do.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

5 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Sir, could you give me a
6 little, details on your Chapter 13 filing.

7 MR. HURLEY: Yeah, I did put that. I gave
8 feedback to the investigator when he asked me about
9 that. That was something that I was -- personally kind
10 of had no other option in trying to work with a bank
11 that, basically, was not working with us at all. And,
12 basically, for the well-being of primarily my family, in
13 order to move forward with this, I filed for that.

14 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Okay. Thank you.
15 Nothing further.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: None. Board Member
17 Gronauer?

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Board
20 Member Nixon?

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, sir.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Is there any public
25 comment?

1 MR. INGRAM: None in the south.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: None in the north. All
3 right. With that, I would accept a motion.

4 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I would like to make a
5 motion. This is Nixon, Board Member Nixon. I move that
6 Beau Security be approved, Beau Security &
7 Investigations be approved for the new corporate private
8 patrol license. That Patrick J. Hurley is applying for
9 an individual private patrolman license. If approved,
10 he is requesting that his individual license be placed
11 into abeyance so that he may become the qualifying
12 agent. Corporate officers to be approved are Rick, or
13 I'm sorry, Richard --

14 Dietl ("Deet-1")?

15 MR. HURLEY: Dietl ("Deet-1").

16 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. And -- oh, wow. I
17 did the first one.

18 MR. HURLEY: Gioacchino ("Jah-keen-oh"). Jack.
19 Giacchino.

20 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Gioacchino Viola.

21 MR. HURLEY: Yep.

22 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: This is subject to
23 statutory and regulatory requirements.

24 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn seconds.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
2 Board Member Nixon. We have a second by Board Member
3 Colbert. Any discussion on the motion?

4 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
5 signify by saying "aye."

6 (Board members said "aye.")

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

8 MR. HURLEY: Thank you.

9 The motion passes unanimously.

10 MR. HURLEY: I was waiting for it.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: The motion passes
12 unanimously. Congratulations. Good luck.

13 MR. HURLEY: Thank you.

14 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Have a good day.

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Good luck.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We're on
17 item number 27, Strategic Security Corporation.

18 MR. YONKER: Good morning.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
20 yourself, give us your background, and then also explain
21 about the company.

22 MR. YONKER: My name is Michael Yonker. I've
23 been -- I was born in Nevada, and I've been raised here.
24 I'm a third generation law enforcement.

25 I am working with Strategic Security

1 Corporation out of New York. The company was originally
2 started by some New York cops and is currently run by
3 several different people that are both current and
4 retired law enforcement. They pride themselves in
5 hiring higher-end security, paying the higher-end wages
6 in order to keep that, retain their security personnel.

7 And I think that this is an awesome opportunity
8 for both me and the people that we potentially will
9 employ in the state of Nevada, as they do take good care
10 of their employees and their customers.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Good.

12 Do we have any questions from the Board? Board
13 Member Nixon?

14 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

20 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes, I do.

21 Mr. Yonker, what happened with Washoe County;
22 did you lose your job there?

23 MR. YONKER: Yes, sir. So I was a deputy for
24 approximately 18 and a half years. I was involved in a
25 pursuit of a felonious criminal, a high-speed pursuit

1 with my lights and sirens. During that pursuit, a
2 person pulled in front of me, and I was involved in an
3 accident. No one, luckily, no one was injured in that
4 accident.

5 But due to the fact that I had had current
6 dealings with the current sheriff, Chuck Allen, who's
7 not decided to retain office, he terminated me for the
8 pursuit. Which it's still in arbitration. But it was
9 just an unfortunate chain of events in light of that,
10 so.

11 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: So were you in
12 compliance with all the requirements for a Code 3?

13 MR. YONKER: Yes, lights, sirens.

14 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: M-hm (affirmative). All
15 right. Okay. Nothing further.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. I did have a
17 question. You know, just a few, couple months ago, you
18 filed for bankruptcy?

19 MR. YONKER: Yes, sir.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Could you please
21 explain that.

22 MR. YONKER: So when I lost my job, my wife
23 talked me into cashing out all of our savings and our
24 retirement, and in order to make the family feel more
25 comfortable, make her feel more comfortable with that,

1 that I unexpectedly lost my job. So when I did that,
2 she took all that money and then asked for a divorce.
3 So, unfortunately, due to that, and the fact that I've
4 been, you know, obviously trying to find good
5 employment, I have been unable to pay my bills as I
6 would like to. So it was kind of a forced situation,
7 and it was a last-ditch effort.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: What's the status of
9 that now?

10 MR. YONKER: It's still in litigation. But I'm
11 not sure exactly what's going on with it in the future.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And your partners in
13 the LLC are aware of all of this and your financial
14 history?

15 MR. YONKER: And they're not, they're not
16 involved in that at all. They're financially very
17 stable.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

19 MR. YONKER: They have a great record, and
20 their company is highly regarded on the East Coast.
21 They work with FEMA. They work, do work with several
22 large corporations internationally, so.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. And I'm just
24 trying to verify --

25 MR. YONKER: No problem.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: -- the viability of the
2 corporation.

3 MR. YONKER: No problem. I do understand.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Any other
5 questions?

6 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: I do.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

8 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: To the investigator, is
9 it --

10 MS. DONALD: Yes, Investigator Donald.

11 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes. I notice that you
12 had several locations that he had previously worked with
13 that have since shut down or were not available or
14 whatever. Was there any attempt to contact the
15 Secretary of State or anything, with California, to get
16 any further information on those locations or possible
17 supervisors?

18 MS. DONALD: We had done research and were
19 unable to locate on one of them. Systematic, Systanic
20 Investigations, I think, that's how you say it.

21 I believe, that was a family member's company,
22 if I recall, that you worked for out there.

23 MR. YONKER: Yes.

24 MS. DONALD: Yeah.

25 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Okay.

1 MS. DONALD: So. And then the other one, Ron
2 Davis (phonetic spelling), was licensed in Nevada, but
3 Mr. Yonker stated he only worked in California for him.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.

5 Any other questions from the Board?

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah, Gronauer. I just
7 have, because this one case is going on, and it's
8 still -- the court date's not till 12-18. And 12-18 of
9 '18, that just a few days from now. But I have a
10 problem when we don't have everything settled, you know,
11 we have where it's going, what's going to happen with
12 it. So that's a problem with me. I'll have a difficult
13 time of approving it.

14 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I've got a
15 question, also.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Go ahead.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: For the investigator.

18 MS. DONALD: M-hm (affirmative).

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Did we get any information
20 from Washoe County itself, on their version of the
21 events that led to the termination of employment?

22 MS. DONALD: I did not.

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. Did we ask?

24 MS. DONALD: No.

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. Yeah, my concern is

1 the length of employment and the fact that he was
2 terminated. I always feel more comfortable when I hear
3 both sides of the story. So for me to go forward on
4 this, I'd like our investigator to reach out to Washoe
5 County and find out some more about this incident.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any other comments or
7 questions?

8 Is there any public comment?

9 MR. INGRAM: None in the south.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So. Well, first off,
11 let me ask. Do we have a motion?

12 Mr. Yonker, I think, there's a little
13 reluctance on behalf of the Board to move forward with
14 some unanswered questions.

15 And if we have a motion, I guess, my sense is,
16 for your motion, it would be to deny at this point, was
17 the consensus on the Board. I can wait for that motion.
18 But the other piece of it would be to table this until
19 our next meeting and have the investigator go back and
20 get a little bit more information for the Board.

21 Is that kind of the sense of the Board?

22 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes.

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah, Mr. Chair, but as in
24 past practice, the applicant would have to agree to
25 postpone. If the applicant doesn't want to postpone,

1 then we go ahead and vote. And then, based on the
2 outcome, he could wait up to another year.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yeah, Kevin, is it a
4 year that they have to wait for reapplication?

5 MR. INGRAM: Traditionally, that's what the
6 Board has --

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: On up for a license. I
8 know, on a work permit, it's set in NAC that there's --
9 you have to wait a year. But I'm not sure what, how
10 that reads for a license.

11 MR. INGRAM: Right, it does not state that for
12 the license. However, traditionally, the Board has
13 followed the same parameters.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

15 MR. INGRAM: However, if he requested to
16 postpone, we could agendize him for the next Board
17 meeting.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Counsel, we could even
19 make, have a motion to delay this till the next Board
20 meeting, correct? I think, we've done that.

21 MS. BORDELOVE: I think, you may have done that
22 before. I mean, because we have it on the agenda here,
23 I'd be more comfortable if the applicant was in
24 agreement. If he really wants a decision today, I would
25 probably recommend the Board to make one. But, I think,

1 you might, I guess, get his answer on that first.

2 MR. YONKER: I'm okay with postponing this.

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Then --

5 MS. BORDELOVE: I don't think, you don't need a
6 motion to postpone. If he's agreeing to postpone, you
7 can. But I don't believe you necessarily need a motion
8 to table it, since you're not making a decision on it at
9 this time.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. So I'd let the
11 record should reflect that Mr. Yonker has indicated that
12 he's willing to wait, to delay the decision until the
13 next Board meeting.

14 And, I guess, then, the direction to staff
15 would be to follow up on some of the questions that the
16 Board has directed at them.

17 Is the Board comfortable with that?

18 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes.

20 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yes.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Mr. Yonker, I
22 think, that's the direction we will go.

23 MR. YONKER: All right. I was just confused.
24 I thought she talked to them. I would like, I'd just
25 like to state that I've been open and honest about

1 everything that I've been involved with, with the
2 investigator. And I'm not sure why the county wasn't
3 contacted already.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

5 MR. YONKER: So.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Well, they'll follow up
7 on that.

8 MR. YONKER: Okay.

9 MS. DONALD: I just want to --

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I'm sorry?

11 MS. DONALD: It's been verified. There was no
12 question that he worked there. But they don't give out
13 information, you know, general information like that,
14 so. Everything, he has been open is honest. And, you
15 know, we've done what we can for the background. But I
16 wasn't able to obtain any information from his employer.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: When they --

18 MS. DONALD: And, you know, basic, basic, you
19 know, verification of hours.

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn, just to
21 comment, because I'm unsure of the process. Does the
22 applicant sign a release for information? Because
23 departments will not release that kind of information
24 without being provided a release.

25 MS. DONALD: Right. And the CSEQ he provided

1 was from HR, and it verified his hours and that he
2 was --

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Right. But we're asking
4 for more.

5 MS. DONALD: Right, I understand.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

7 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Chair, what we can do, in an
8 investigation of this type, you know, employers are more
9 reluctant, even with a release, to release that kind of
10 information. But we do have the ability to subpoena
11 those records. And, therefore, we'll follow through on
12 it and make sure we obtain all the necessary information
13 that the Board's requesting.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. If you
15 don't -- it might be possible Mr. Yonker could go get
16 that information himself, with their letterhead and that
17 information, without the possibility of subpoenas and
18 all. But if we could do that in a timely manner, then
19 we won't have to go through the subpoena process, and it
20 just becomes a big, big mess that we don't need.

21 But, Mr. Yonker, I think, you can go, on your
22 own, and request that information, get it from their
23 letterhead from somebody in charge.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I think, Mr. Yonker, I
25 think, you can work with out -- with the investigator

1 and try to work your case.

2 MR. YONKER: Yes, definitely.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Thank you
4 very much.

5 MR. YONKER: Thank you.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We'll move
7 on to item number 28, William R. Thomas.

8 MR. THOMAS: Good morning, ladies and
9 gentlemen, Mr. Chairman.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning. Good
11 morning. Could you please identify yourself, give us
12 your background, and then talk a little bit about the
13 company.

14 MR. THOMAS: Yes, sir. My name is William R.
15 Thomas, no kin to the company. I've been doing security
16 over 10 years. We have, currently have two properties
17 out here in Nevada. We are located in 34 states. The
18 chairman of the board for the company, Carl Thomas, is a
19 retired sheriff of Dallas County, started the company in
20 1981.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Do we have
22 any questions from the Board? Board Member Colbert?

23 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes, I have a question
24 or two here.

25 Looking at your financial stuff and all the

1 issues going on there, can you give me some
2 clarification to what's taken place there?

3 MR. THOMAS: Yes, sir. I am currently working
4 on trying to get all of those taken care of, repaired,
5 and trying to get my credit built back up. You know, my
6 salary that I receive every week pretty much goes to
7 doing that.

8 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: What's the status with
9 the small claims judgment from North Carolina?

10 MR. THOMAS: The small claims judgment -- yes,
11 sir. The small claims judgment, that occurred well over
12 10 years ago. I had called and spoke with them, and
13 they had informed me they couldn't send me anything
14 because it has been deleted from their system, so no
15 longer, it no longer exists.

16 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Okay. Did you make any
17 payments at all on that claim?

18 MR. THOMAS: No, sir.

19 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Okay.

20 MR. THOMAS: The reason being is I was a
21 foreign contractor at the time. The person that had
22 sued me for that was a friend of mine. He was a
23 building contractor. He got sued for building the house
24 that he had built wrongly. Part of it was my mistake
25 for not having him sign a waiver when I put the flooring

1 in for him, because he was a friend. And that was a
2 very hard lesson learned.

3 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: What created the issue
4 here with these items all going into collection, that
5 are currently in collection?

6 MR. THOMAS: Just basically not making enough
7 money to be able to keep up on everything, trying to
8 keep up on everything.

9 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: And I notice that there
10 was also a number of other items going back a little
11 ways that are also charged off. Is that all part of
12 this financial problem, or what?

13 MR. THOMAS: No, sir. No. Those, that was,
14 basically, meeting the wrong woman. She had charged me
15 with quite a few charges. I entailed, had her charged
16 with obstruction of justice.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

18 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: I have another one.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Sure.

20 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Also, looking at --
21 excuse me here for one minute.

22 Looking at your -- going back a little bit in
23 time there with your arrest history, what was going on
24 back then that you had so many different issues taking
25 place, and I mean is it just anger management issues, or

1 what?

2 MR. THOMAS: No, sir. No. Basically,
3 stupidity. I've been married. A couple of those were
4 ex-wives. And then one was an ex-girlfriend. Just
5 issues. I was actually going through the police academy
6 back in 2013, graduated the police academy. But before
7 that, the women, it was just stupid moves on my part.

8 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Okay.

9 MR. THOMAS: Meeting the wrong women.

10 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Okay. No further.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Board
12 Member Flynn, do you have any questions?

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah, I have a couple.
14 What police academy did you go to?

15 MR. THOMAS: North Carolina Justice Academy,
16 run through county community college.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And what happened after
18 you graduated?

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Basically, I stayed in
20 North Carolina. And you pay to go through the academy.
21 When you graduate, you have one year to find a job.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: M-hm (affirmative).

23 MR. THOMAS: I was three months into my last
24 year. I got a provisional offer. And because of all
25 the stuff on there, and I didn't list an address on item

1 three, which I didn't realize they were sending my job
2 offer. And that's when I made the decision to move to
3 Las Vegas.

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. I'm looking at your
5 current work history.

6 MR. THOMAS: Yes, sir.

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And maybe you could
8 explain. You're not with anyplace for any length of
9 time. Two months, three months, six months, four
10 months. Do you want to explain that?

11 MR. THOMAS: The longest time I spent was with
12 Acme Security. I was a supervisor with them. Almost
13 all the companies I've worked for out here, I didn't
14 like them. I don't like the way they train their
15 employees. I don't like the way they handle their
16 employees. I don't like the way they handle payroll.
17 Basically, the companies I've worked for, you're given a
18 shirt, and here's your property, have a nice day.

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. I have no
20 other questions.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon, do
22 you have any questions?

23 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No. No, sir.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well, yes, sir.

1 It says that you were employed by Cambridge
2 Security.

3 MR. THOMAS: Yes, sir.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: December of '16 to
5 September of '17.

6 MR. THOMAS: Correct.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Are you currently
8 employed?

9 MR. THOMAS: No, sir. I am, I am employed with
10 Thomas Protective Services.

11 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Well, it says this -- the
12 employment was past employment, the way I understand
13 this. I might be wrong. It looks like they verified
14 that you were employed at one time. I don't see it at
15 you're employed now.

16 Am I wrong here, Investigator?

17 MR. SWARTHOUT: Investigator Swarthout. He
18 does have a contract with them. I included the ones,
19 the employment were the ones --

20 (The Reporter interrupted due to an inability
21 to completely hear Las Vegas.)

22 MR. SWARTHOUT: Investigator Swarthout. We
23 did, did contact them. He does have a contract for
24 employment, that was included with his application, with
25 Thomas Protective Services. We went off of the

1 experience, off of the CSEQs that were provided.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you. I
3 can see that was on the CT, on his 2018. And that's
4 still valid?

5 MR. SWARTHOUT: Correct.

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. No more questions.
7 Thank you.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.

9 Any follow-up questions by the Board?

10 Is there any public comment?

11 MR. INGRAM: None in the south.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Seeing no public
13 comment, I would entertain a motion.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Could I ask one more
15 question? This is Gronauer.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Absolutely.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. You signed up
18 for the Thomas Investigations. Are they here?

19 MR. THOMAS: No, sir.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. That's all I
21 had. Thank you.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. I'm still
23 looking for a motion.

24 For the purposes of discussion, I'll make a
25 motion. I move that William R. Thomas be granted an

1 individual private patrol license, that his individual
2 license be placed in abeyance so that he may become the
3 qualifying agent for Thomas Protective Services, license
4 number 1309, subject to all statutory and regulatory
5 requirements.

6 There's been a motion. Is there a second?

7 The motion dies for lack of a second. And do I
8 have an alternate motion?

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll make a
10 motion for denial. And the main reason is I know I
11 asked questions related to his multiple shortness of
12 employments, but mainly the financial situation.

13 I don't want to speak for Board Member
14 Gronauer, but I'd be more comfortable if the owner of
15 the company was here, too. But because of the -- give
16 him some time to get his financial situation in order,
17 I'm going to make a recommendation to deny.

18 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
20 Board Member Flynn for denial, a second by Board Member
21 Nixon. Discussion on the motion?

22 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: I also concur with that
23 same belief.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. I, too, am going
25 to support the motion.

1 Any additional comment by any Board member?

2 And, again, I guess, I'm going to -- so, for
3 the record, the reason I'm supporting the denial is we
4 have significant financial issues involved. And I can't
5 really weigh the criminal activity, the criminal
6 arrests, because all of them have either been expunged
7 or, you know, in other words, they're arrests, they're
8 not convictions. And so, therefore, that doesn't carry
9 any weight in my mind.

10 But, I think, the final aspect to be a
11 qualifying agent -- and it's all recency, too. It's
12 not, it's not something that waits in the long path. So
13 I'm going to support the motion based on that.

14 So that said, all in favor of the motion,
15 signify by saying "aye."

16 (Board members said "aye.")

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed to the motion?

18 Mr. Thomas, I think, there's some other routes
19 that you can go, if you want to continue pursuing this,
20 to be a qualifying agent for this company. One is
21 demonstrating some, you know -- well, there's some
22 routes that you have, I think, you can look at with the
23 company and maybe work out some arrangements with them.

24 So with that said, your application has been
25 denied.

1 MR. THOMAS: Thank you, sir. Thank you.

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good day.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 29 has been
4 postponed.

5 So we'll move on to the area of process server,
6 starting with Rebecca D. Godwin.

7 MS. GODWIN: Good morning.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
11 yourself, and give us a little background.

12 MS. GODWIN: Sure. My name's Rebecca D.
13 Godwin. I'm employed with James Legal Service. They've
14 been in business since 1973. I have been employed with
15 them for 10 years. I manage the process serving
16 department as well as the office. We handle process
17 service for local attorneys, in Clark County also,
18 statewide and nationwide. We handle runner service,
19 deliveries to and from court.

20 And I am applying for my process server's
21 license to be put in abeyance today.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Any questions
23 from the Board? Board Member Gronauer?

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

5 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I have one question,
7 and that is directed to counsel. The item on our agenda
8 does not indicate placing her process server license in
9 abeyance. Can that be --

10 MS. BORDELOVE: I think, we had --

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: -- added to the motion
12 at her request?

13 MS. BORDELOVE: I think, we've had this one
14 come up before. I don't think it requires a Board
15 action to put the license in abeyance.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Perfect.

17 MS. BORDELOVE: She can simply request that of
18 Director Ingram.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

20 MS. BORDELOVE: So, I think, just make your
21 motion regarding her individual license. And then she
22 can take the abeyance, she can do that with staff.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And then, but in
24 order -- the purpose for putting it in abeyance would be
25 she would become qualifying agent. That would require

1 additional Board action, correct?

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Not necessarily.

3 MR. INGRAM: I don't believe that's the
4 request.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: No, I --

6 MR. INGRAM: The QA's going to stay in place,
7 correct?

8 MS. GODWIN: M-hm (affirmative).

9 MR. INGRAM: You're just placing in abeyance
10 for the future?

11 MS. GODWIN: Exactly.

12 MR. INGRAM: Okay.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. I got it. Thank
14 you. Thank you for the clarification. I appreciate
15 that.

16 Is there any public comment?

17 MR. INGRAM: None in the south.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. With that,
19 I'd accept a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. I make a
21 motion to approve Rebecca D. Godwin for an individual
22 process service license.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Subject to all --

24 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: I --

25 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Subject to all
2 statutory and regulatory requirements?

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm sorry. Subject to
4 all statutory and regulatory requirements. It was so
5 easy, I just wanted to keep it easier.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have a
7 motion by Board Member Gronauer and a second by Board
8 Member Colbert. Any discussion on the motion?

9 All in favor of the motion, signify by saying
10 "aye."

11 (Board members said "aye.")

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any opposed?

13 The motion passes unanimously.

14 Congratulations. Good luck. And just contact the Board
15 to put it in abeyance.

16 MS. GODWIN: Thank you.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 31, Johnny R.
18 Soto.

19 MR. INGRAM: He's in the south.

20 MR. SOTO: Good morning.

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good morning, sir.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning. Would
24 you please identify yourself and give us a little
25 background.

1 MR. SOTO: My name is Johnny R. Soto. I'm from
2 California. I work for a company called ADI Document
3 Support Services, LLC, in the process of trying to
4 obtain my individual process server's license, with
5 knowledge that the company may be changing ownership
6 next year, in hopes of then becoming the qualifying
7 agent.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Good.
9 Any questions from the Board? Board Member
10 Flynn?

11 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, sir.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

13 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have any Nevada
16 licenses now?

17 MR. SOTO: Just with the PILB. Oh, a work
18 card. I don't have any licenses.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Just a work card.
20 Okay. You do have a work card?

21 MR. SOTO: Yeah.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. That's all. No
23 more.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Board
25 Member Colbert?

1 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Is there
3 any public comment?

4 MR. INGRAM: None in the south.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Seeing none, I'd accept
6 a motion.

7 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I move that
8 Johnny R. Soto be approved an individual process server
9 license. This is subject to all statutory and
10 regulatory requirements.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
12 Board Member Colbert. Is there a second?

13 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Second by Board Member
15 Nixon. Discussion on the motion?

16 All in favor of the motion, signify by saying
17 "aye."

18 (Board members said "aye.")

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

20 It passes unanimously. Congratulations. Good
21 luck.

22 MR. SOTO: Thank you. Thank you.

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Number 32,
25 Baechler Investigative Services, Incorporated, for

1 private investigator and process server.

2 MR. BAECHLER: Good morning.

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good morning, sir.

5 MR. BAECHLER: Nice to meet you all in perfect,
6 in person.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Or perfect.

8 MR. BAECHLER: Or purpose, yes, right.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Did I pronounce your
10 last name correctly, or did I --

11 MR. BAECHLER: It's "Bak-lor."

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: "Bak-lor." Okay.

13 Sorry. Please, identify yourself, which you have, but
14 give us a little bit of your background and what, how
15 you're going to proceed and what's the plan.

16 MR. BAECHLER: Sure. My name is Jeremiah
17 Baechler. I've been involved in the investigative
18 process service for 19 years. My family has been
19 involved in this business for 30 years this year. I
20 primarily specialize in surveillance, difficult process
21 service, also doing interviews, background checks.

22 That's a brief synopsis of some of my
23 investigative process service and experience.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Do we have any
25 questions from the Board? Board Member Gronauer?

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Why not. Do you have
2 offices in Nevada now?

3 MR. BAECHLER: No.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Are you planning to
5 have an office in Nevada?

6 MR. BAECHLER: If it's meant to be, hopefully,
7 at some point. But immediately, not at the moment. My
8 main purpose in seeking the license is to be aboveboard,
9 legal. And particularly, if I need to come into the
10 state on a surveillance or a process service, I can do
11 so legally, which I've never done previously.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: That is a good point
13 there.

14 MR. BAECHLER: Okay. No unlicensed activity
15 here.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, I understand.
17 Okay. Thank you.

18 MR. BAECHLER: Yeah.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: That's all for me.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Board
21 Member Flynn?

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

1 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes.

2 Sir, could you give me a little more
3 clarification on your 2018 bankruptcy?

4 MR. BAECHLER: Yes. Unfortunately, I had to
5 file bankruptcy. I exhausted all other options. The
6 situation mainly being is, is that -- and one of my main
7 sources of investigative work previously has been as a
8 subcontractor with my father's company. I have also
9 independently had my own investigative company up until
10 this year. And so the investigative work, as a
11 subcontract I was receiving from my father's company,
12 was slowing down. Which at the time, wasn't quite sure,
13 but my father ended up having terminal cancer.

14 And so, in conjunction with that at the time, I
15 also sought to take loans to compensate my loss of
16 income. And, two, I even sought to do some work as a
17 driver for Uber and Lyft, which, so I could have
18 flexibility to also be able to service my investigative
19 clients.

20 All those things combined, unfortunately, was
21 not adequate. And so, kind of also feeling like I was
22 at the end of my options with that, I had to reluctantly
23 file bankruptcy. I really wish I did not have to do
24 that. Shortly after that time, my father passed with
25 terminal cancer, third round of cancer.

1 Since then, at this time, my income and
2 business has done much better, which, unfortunately, is,
3 I want to say, as a result of so, I mean, I mean, one
4 way or the other. I inherited my father's business, a
5 large client base, and have done significantly better
6 financially since that time.

7 Also, during that time last year, my brother
8 was also -- my brother is fully disabled, so needing
9 family assistance. He is also now on a kidney
10 transplant list.

11 So these are some of the circumstances,
12 unfortunately, that led to filing bankruptcy.

13 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Thank you for the
14 clarification. Sorry for your loss.

15 MR. BAECHLER: Thank you.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So are there any
17 follow-up questions by the Board members?

18 Do we have any public comment?

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I just thought of one
20 more follow-up question, on the bankruptcy. This is
21 Gronauer.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Sure.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Of course. Where is
24 this most recent bankruptcy now, where is that in the
25 courts?

1 MR. BAECHLER: It's done. It's finalized.
2 That was finished up in, I believe, February. I gave
3 that document back with my application and a
4 supplemental letter regarding that.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well, you gave the
6 document on the investigator side,, but hat's a good
7 answer. Thank you.

8 MR. BAECHLER: And, too, I would just like to
9 add that the bankruptcy was pretty much exclusively
10 consumer debt. I've never had any liens, any judgments,
11 no tax liens. I've never been delinquent on student
12 loans. And last year, when I was at this point that I
13 had to do this, I voluntarily called my auto financier
14 and voluntarily surrendered the vehicle.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: That's all.

16 MR. BAECHLER: I tried to do what I could to
17 make a bankruptcy as straightforward as possible, as
18 honorable, if there is such a thing.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you,
21 Mr. Baechler.

22 Any additional follow-up questions?

23 Seeing none, public comment?

24 MR. INGRAM: None in the south.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Then, I would accept a

1 motion.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Again, I'm sorry, but
3 on the agenda item, it says applying for individual
4 process server. It doesn't say anything about private
5 investigator.

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yes, it does.

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah, it does.

8 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes, it does.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Did I read it wrong?

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: It's number 32.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I read it wrong. Damn,
12 I made a mistake. I mean I'm sorry, I made a mistake.
13 All right. No problem.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I'm still looking for a
15 motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll make the motion.
17 Gronauer. I'll make a motion to approve Baechler
18 Investigative Services, Incorporated, for a new
19 corporate private investigator and process server
20 license. Jeremiah Baechler is applying for an
21 individual private investigator and process server
22 license. If approved, he is requesting that his
23 individual license be placed in abeyance so that he may
24 become the qualifying agent. The corporate officer to
25 be approved is Jeremiah Baechler. This is subject to

1 all statutory and regulatory requirements.

2 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I have a motion by
4 Gronauer, a second by Colbert. Any discussion on the
5 motion?

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Well, I just want to
7 comment on Mr. Baechler's honesty and forthcomingness.
8 And, also, I've been doing this three years, first time
9 I've seen letters of reference not only from your
10 landlord, but also your minister. So.

11 MR. BAECHLER: And the landlord is one of the
12 things I also wanted to present to the -- with my
13 application to the Board, back to that I've had no
14 delinquency. I'm sure my landlord would say rave good
15 things about me, hopefully.

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: He did.

17 That's it.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any other comment from
19 the Board?

20 I'm going to support the motion. I think,
21 Mr. Baechler has indicated the financial issues was a
22 personal bankruptcy, not a corporate bankruptcy. And so
23 I'm going to support the motion. I think, he's done
24 everything he could to try to clear the issue up.

25 With that said, all in favor of the motion to

1 approve, signify by saying "aye."

2 (Board members said "aye.")

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All those opposed?

4 It passes unanimously. Congratulations,

5 Mr. Baechler. Good luck.

6 MR. BAECHLER: Thank you very much.

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Have a great day.

9 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Chair, for the record, Kevin
10 Ingram. Could we take a short bio break before we get
11 into the registration appeals?

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes. I'm glad you
13 suggested that. Thank you very much.

14 We'll be on a 15-minute break.

15 * * * * *

16 (A break was taken 11:01 to 11:15 a.m.)

17 * * * * *

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Let's bring
19 it back into session.

20 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Maybe not.

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: We're all here.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We're back
23 in session. See, I've gotten to use it twice today
24 (gavel).

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Chair, before we

1 proceed, could we check and see if everybody's been
2 sworn in.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good idea. Has
4 everybody here been sworn in?

5 Okay. Please stand.

6 We've got one up here.

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Anybody here that has not
8 been sworn in, and you're going to speak before the
9 Board, please stand.

10 MS. BORDELOVE: Do we have everybody?

11 Okay. Raise your right hand. Do you swear to
12 tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the
13 truth?

14 (All appellants and witnesses present in
15 Carson City and Las Vegas were sworn.)

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Thank you.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thanks for the
19 reminder, Board Member Flynn. I forget about that.

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: You're welcome, sir.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We're now in --

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Your load is heavy.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We're now on
24 registration appeals.

25 So we'll start with number 33, Article O.

1 Barlow.

2 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Chair, just now, two
3 additional people walked in the room and will need to be
4 sworn.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Let's go ahead and
6 swear them in.

7 MR. INGRAM: Okay. So those of you that just
8 stepped in, that have not been sworn in yet, in you'll
9 go ahead and stand and raise your right hand, please.

10 MS. BORDELOVE: Do you swear to tell the truth,
11 the whole truth, and nothing but the truth?

12 (Additional appellants and witnesses present in
13 Las Vegas were sworn.)

14 MR. INGRAM: Okay. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Let's go
16 down the list. Artice O. Barlow.

17 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Barlow?

18 He's not present.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We'll trail
20 that.

21 Number 34, Grefford G. Dixon.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Not here.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We'll trail number 34.

24 35, Jacara L. Fincher.

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes, she's here.

1 MS. FINCHER: Good morning.

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good morning.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: This looks like
5 Investigator Maxwell. Please, Investigator, please
6 identify why this permit was denied.

7 MR. MAXWELL: Yes, sir. In June of 2010, out
8 of California, Ms. Fincher was arrested for possession
9 of a controlled substance for sale. It was at the
10 felony level. The disposition gives a four-month jail
11 term and five years probation. The arrest was disclosed
12 on the application and confirmed using the fingerprint
13 report. Ms. Fincher was not made provisional.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Ms. Fincher,
15 would you please explain to us what the story is behind
16 all of this.

17 MS. FINCHER: At the time, I was a teen. And I
18 had just lost my father. He passed away to kidney
19 failure. My mother had just got sent to prison. So I
20 was pretty much on my own and trying to do what I can to
21 fend for myself.

22 It turned out to be a stupid mistake that,
23 apparently, I'm still paying for it.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Do we have any
25 questions of the Board? Board Member Flynn?

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes, sir.

2 Ms. Fincher, what was the substance that you
3 were selling?

4 MS. FINCHER: Is was crack cocaine.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. And what are you
6 doing these days?

7 MS. FINCHER: Right now, I'm currently employed
8 as a fill-out courier. February it'll be two years.
9 And I'm also employed at Amazon Windows, and I'm going
10 on a month there.

11 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. Thank you.

12 MS. FINCHER: No problem.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon, any
14 questions?

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir.

18 Are you currently on paper?

19 MS. FINCHER: No.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You're off, then?

21 MS. FINCHER: Yeah. That was only for five
22 years.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Right.

24 MS. FINCHER: And, yeah, I didn't get in
25 trouble again. I'll get it expunged, which I'm still

1 working on.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You're still working on
3 that?

4 MS. FINCHER: Yes.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. I'm good with
6 that. I'm good.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board Member
8 Colbert?

9 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Just for
11 those present, this is an administrative hearing. There
12 is no public comment elicited on any of these denial
13 appeals.

14 So we'll just proceed to Board action. I would
15 accept a motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll make a
17 motion to grant the appeal based on time, distance, the
18 fact that it didn't involve violence or a weapon.

19 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

20 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So we have a motion by
22 Board Member Flynn, a second by Board Member Colbert.
23 Discussion on the motion?

24 All in favor of the motion, signify by saying
25 "aye."

1 (Board members said "aye.")

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Those opposed?

3 Ms. Fincher, your appeal has been granted, and
4 you will be issued a card.

5 MS. FINCHER: Thank you.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: You're welcome.

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you. Merry
8 Christmas.

9 MS. FINCHER: Thank you. That sounds good.

10 MR. INGRAM: Those of you that are approved in
11 this process, you will be notified by one of our office
12 staff within the next three to five business days.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Chair?

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes?

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: We had a request,
16 applicant number 63, if he could go sooner.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Is there a reason for
18 the request?

19 MR. INGRAM: Reason for the request.

20 MR. SALADINO: The reason for the request, just
21 the individual is in a wheelchair, and it's kind of
22 tight in here. So we're just looking to accommodate
23 him.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Sounds reasonable to
25 me. Let's go to number 63.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. Mr. Jackson.

2 MR. JACKSON: Good morning.

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning to you.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Investigator Saladino,
5 was this your case?

6 MR. SALADINO: Yes, sir. Investigator
7 Saladino. Mr. Jackson was denied for a 2007 felony
8 burglary conviction, which the applicant disclosed the
9 conviction, provided court docs. And he was honorably
10 discharged from probation in '09. It was actually
11 October 24th of '09.

12 And that's why we're here today.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Mr. Jackson,
14 would you be kind enough to explain the circumstances of
15 all this.

16 MR. JACKSON: Yeah, I was -- I was -- I had
17 just turned 18. And I was with some peers of mine. And
18 we -- I was just in the wrong place at the wrong time.
19 And I just got -- I made a stupid mistake with the wrong
20 people.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. I'm going to
22 ask. Did you do any prison time or jail time?

23 MR. JACKSON: No. Yeah, I did, I had a -- I
24 had a -- maybe did like -- no, I didn't really do any,
25 any prison time, no.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right. Are
2 there any questions from the Board? Board Member
3 Gronauer?

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir.

5 The follow-up question is that you didn't do
6 any prison time; did you jail time?

7 MR. JACKSON: Yes, I did.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Local jail?

9 MR. JACKSON: The G.I. county jail, two months.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Investigator, when --
11 you know, which -- you say you're here on one charge,
12 right? That's the one he didn't disclose?

13 MR. SALADINO: He disclosed the charge.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay.

15 MR. SALADINO: It was only the one. The
16 applicant has no other arrests.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

19 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Have you been working
20 since this incident?

21 MR. JACKSON: Yes, I have.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What do you do?

23 MR. JACKSON: I've been working at -- I worked
24 at numerous retail stores, but I've recently been
25 working at Ross for like a year and a half now. And I

1 have recently got hired at Staff Pro. That's pretty
2 much it.

3 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. Thank you.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: What did you burglarize
6 back in '07?

7 MR. JACKSON: It was Radio Shack.

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. Nothing
9 further.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

11 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. No
13 additional questions from the Board. I would entertain
14 a motion.

15 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I would move
16 that Aaron Jackson's denial be reversed.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
18 Board Member Colbert. Do we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll -- sorry.

20 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: We second.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second by
22 Board Member Nixon.

23 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, that's all
24 based upon time and distance and no further issues.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. As far as

1 discussion, Board Member Colbert.

2 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: I base that on the time
3 and distance and nothing of any violence involved there,
4 and.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Any other
6 discussion by the Board?

7 All right. With that said, all in favor of the
8 motion to reverse the denial, signify by saying "aye."

9 (Board members said "aye.")

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

11 It passes unanimously. Congratulations,
12 Mr. Jackson.

13 MR. JACKSON: Thank you.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You're welcome. Merry
15 Christmas.

16 MR. JACKSON: Thank you, Mr. Gronauer. Thank
17 you.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We'll revert back to
19 the agenda. We'll go to item number 36, Jovani S.
20 Fulton.

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Is Mr. Fulton here?

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Not present.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: He's not there?

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We'll trail that

1 one.

2 Number 37, Cameron L. Lyles.

3 MR. INGRAM: He's present.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right.

5 MR. LYLES: Good morning, sir.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I believe, this is
8 Investigator Maxwell.

9 MR. MAXWELL: Yes, sir. In June of 2012,
10 Mr. Lyles was arrested in California for carrying a
11 concealed dirk or dagger. This was a misdemeanor
12 offense. And he received three years probation. The
13 applicant did disclose the arrest and listed the
14 disposition as a dismissal. The applicant was made
15 provisional. The fingerprint report confirmed the
16 arrest, which showed the disposition as a conviction.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Mr. Lyles, could you
18 explain the circumstances of the arrest and the
19 confusion as far as determining, you indicating that it
20 had been dismissed.

21 MR. LYLES: Well, at the time, I had got
22 arrested for riding a minibike without a helmet, and I
23 had a knife I used to tune to idle on the minibike.

24 And I had put this, listed that I completed the
25 three years probation. So at the time, I asked the

1 person at the PILB, and she said put, if you finished
2 the case, then put dismiss. So, in my eyes, I believed
3 it was dismissed, since I finished the three years
4 probation. I didn't try to hide it. I just didn't word
5 it correctly. And for that, I apologize.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Do we have any
7 questions from the Board? Board Member Nixon?

8 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Have you been working?

9 MR. LYLES: Yes. I do light warehouse work
10 with Staffmark at the moment. I've been doing that for
11 about six months.

12 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: M-hm (affirmative).

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

14 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes.

15 Mr. Lyles, how long have you been living in
16 Las Vegas?

17 MR. LYLES: I've been out here for about a year
18 now.

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. And you're in
20 California the whole other time?

21 MR. LYLES: Yes, sir.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. Thank you.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: When was your probation
25 up?

1 MR. LYLES: Well, the case is seven years old.
2 I honestly can't remember, sir. But at the time, it had
3 to be around, I would say, about twenty -- 2015, I
4 believe.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah, because I mean
6 arrest date, you know, and when you go to court, you
7 know, there's always a distance there, time and
8 distance. That's what I was trying to figure out.

9 Mr. Maxwell, is there a way to confirm that the
10 probation was taken care of?

11 MR. MAXWELL: I'd have to check when I get back
12 to the office, sir.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And you
14 understand why I want this, you get arrested one time,
15 and you may not go to court for two years, for certain
16 circumstances and all that. So. Okay. No problem.
17 But you -- I don't know if you said that. You're off
18 probation?

19 MR. LYLES: Yes, sir, I completed probation
20 years ago.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

23 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Investigator Maxwell,
25 the denial was based on the fact that it was a concealed

1 weapon. It was a weapons violation, correct?

2 MR. MAXWELL: Yes, sir, that's correct.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Even though it
4 was a misdemeanor. Okay. That clarifies it for me.

5 Any other questions by the Board?

6 Seeing none, I would accept a motion.

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll make a
8 motion to grant the appeal.

9 I'm basing this on the fact that the California
10 authorities decided to charge him with a misdemeanor.
11 This is not a firearm. We did not have any evidence
12 that he's been in trouble since. And which is usually a
13 problem here, people don't disclose. He did disclose.
14 And I understand, especially coming out of the
15 California system, sometimes people have confusion
16 whether their probation just went away or it was
17 dismissed. It's not the first time we've heard that
18 from California residents.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
20 by Board Member Flynn. Do we have a second?

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Second.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second by
23 Board Member Nixon. Any discussion on the motion?

24 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
25 signify by saying "aye."

1 (Board members said "aye.")

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

3 It passed unanimously. Congratulations,

4 Mr. Lyles. You will get your permit.

5 MR. LYLES: All right. Thank you, you guys.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: You have a good day.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Moving on to number 38,

8 Terry L. Moses.

9 MR. MOSES: Good morning.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning, Mr. Moses.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning,

12 Mr. Moses.

13 MR. INGRAM: Have you been sworn?

14 Okay. Mr. Moses came in a little bit late. He
15 needs to be sworn before the testimony.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

17 MS. BORDELOVE: Please raise your right hand.

18 Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth, and
19 nothing but the truth?

20 MR. MOSES: Yes.

21 MS. BORDELOVE: Okay.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Mr. Moses,
23 hold on just a second.

24 Investigator Maxwell, is this yours?

25 MR. MAXWELL: Yes, sir.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

2 MR. MAXWELL: All of the arrests were out of
3 New Jersey. November of 1997, possession of marijuana,
4 possession of burglary tools. The level was not known.
5 Disposition was 60 days suspended confinement and one
6 year probation.

7 July of '91, receiving stolen property at
8 felony level. The disposition was 364 days jail, two
9 years probation.

10 June 1994, receiving stolen property at felony
11 level. The disposition was 364 days in the Essex County
12 pen.

13 September of 1996, two counts, one a felony
14 burglary, one a felony theft. The dispo was 364 days
15 jail, three years probation.

16 April of '97, criminal trespass at felony
17 level. The disposition was aggregated sentence from
18 October 1999, state prison 18 months, minus 113 days for
19 time served. On 8-8 of '97, the probation was revoked,
20 and the applicant was sent to New Jersey State Prison
21 for four years, less 145 days for time served.

22 None of the arrests were disclosed, and were
23 found on the fingerprint report. The applicant did
24 disclose a 2008 arrest in South Carolina for misdemeanor
25 disorderly misconduct, which was dismissed. The

1 applicant was not made provisional.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you,
3 Investigator.

4 Mr. Moses, would you please kind of give us a
5 rundown of all of this. It looks to me like you had
6 quite a run there in the mid '90s. Can you explain what
7 was going on then and the reason why you did not
8 disclose?

9 MR. MOSES: I didn't -- well, I was in my 20s.
10 And I had a hard time in New Jersey. I was like,
11 basically, homeless, and I was just doing what I could
12 to eat back in that time. But I did let them know that
13 I had a felony warrant, not a warrant, but I had a
14 jacket.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. I'm sorry. Did
16 you indicate why you did not disclose?

17 MR. MOSES: I thought I did. I should have,
18 because before I got the job, they told me I might as
19 well just go ahead and be honest and let them know if I
20 was arrested or not. So that's what I did.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right. Any
22 questions from the Board? Board Member Gronauer?

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir.
24 When did you get out of prison?

25 MR. MOSES: Nineteen -- well, I was extradited.

1 I got out in 2006 for my --

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: 2006?

3 MR. MOSES: Right.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Where were you
5 extradited from?

6 MR. MOSES: From South Carolina. From South
7 Carolina.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: From South Carolina.
9 Okay. Well, where have you lived -- how long have you
10 lived in Las Vegas?

11 MR. MOSES: Eight months.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Are you employed now?

13 MR. MOSES: No, I'm not.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: When's the last time
15 you were employed?

16 MR. MOSES: October.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: October this year?

18 MR. MOSES: Yes.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Who were you employed
20 by?

21 MR. MOSES: SOS Security.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Why aren't you employed
23 by them now?

24 MR. MOSES: Because of my guard card.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And you thought

1 you reported all these on your application?

2 MR. MOSES: Yes, I did. And before I got --
3 the guy that hired me, I told him and everything. He's
4 like, well, this is so long ago, it shouldn't even
5 matter.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Who said that?

7 MR. MOSES: The guy that hired me for SOS
8 Security.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. Well, he
10 has a license. He knows it does matter that you report
11 everything.

12 MR. MOSES: Right.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And you know that now,
14 right?

15 MR. MOSES: Yes, sir.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. How much time
17 did you build altogether in prison?

18 MR. MOSES: Well --

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: How much time did you
20 spend in prison? I'm sorry.

21 MR. MOSES: Altogether, maybe three years.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Pardon?

23 MR. MOSES: Probably three years.

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And you had time
25 off for good, good behavior?

1 MR. MOSES: Yes.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Where do you
3 live now?

4 MR. MOSES: Right now, I just moved to -- I
5 don't even know the name of the place. (Looked in
6 wallet.) Harbor Island Apartments.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Are you living
8 by yourself?

9 MR. MOSES: No. I have my spouse with me.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Does your spouse
11 work?

12 MR. MOSES: No, she don't. She's filed for
13 disability.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. I just --
15 thank you. I just want to make sure you're getting
16 solved. That's all.

17 MR. MOSES: Yes.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. Thank you.

19 MR. MOSES: Thank you.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Board
21 Member Nixon?

22 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: How long did you work for
23 SOS Security?

24 MR. MOSES: I started in -- about three and a
25 half months or so.

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. Investigator
2 Maxwell, did you say he was not issued a guard card?

3 MR. MAXWELL: Correct, yes, he was not made
4 provisional.

5 MR. MOSES: I had a temporary guard card.

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: So when you went to the
7 PILB to get your license, did you admit to the -- on
8 that paperwork, or did you do your paperwork at SOS
9 Security?

10 MR. MOSES: I did my paperwork at SOS Security.

11 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: For your security license,
12 or for your job application?

13 MR. MOSES: I think -- did I? I think, no, I
14 think, I went to the place to do it.

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Up in the northwest?

16 MR. MOSES: Right.

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yeah. Okay. And then did
18 you write on that paperwork that you had your
19 convictions?

20 MR. MOSES: Yes, I did. I'm pretty sure I did.

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay.

22 MR. MOSES: That's why I'm not understanding.
23 The guy that hired me, he told me it shouldn't matter,
24 because it was over 20 years. But I'm quite sure I put
25 it down, because he told me don't even lie about

1 anything, so I did.

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I assume that we're
4 looking at something down there?

5 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Sorry. Yes. Sorry about
6 that.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Chair, I got some
9 questions while we wait.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Go ahead, Board
11 Member Flynn.

12 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Moses, what kind of
13 problems have you had with drugs?

14 MR. MOSES: Oh, I had some drug problems. When
15 I was in New Jersey, I was doing heroin, you know, bad.
16 It was real bad. I think, once I moved -- well, the
17 last time I went to prison there, you know, and once I
18 moved, I left my parole, I went to South Carolina. I
19 was doing better ever since. I haven't seen, I haven't
20 touched it. The move saved my life even though I ran
21 from parole.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: When was the last time
23 you got some sleep?

24 MR. MOSES: Sleep?

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes, because you look

1 pretty tired right now.

2 MR. MOSES: I'm not tired. Last night.

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. I have nothing
4 else.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board Member
6 Colbert?

7 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Did we find
9 out what they were looking for?

10 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I think, they're still
11 looking.

12 MR. MAXWELL: One second, sir.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.

14 MS. IRIZARRY: Terry, what's your middle name?

15 MR. MOSES: Lee.

16 MS. IRIZARRY: So I do show that Terry Lee
17 Moses was made provisional on May 11th of '18, and his
18 provisional expired 8-9 of '18. But he was, obviously,
19 not given the permanent work card.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: So that -- excuse me.
21 Gronauer. So that would say that he had the
22 provisional?

23 MS. IRIZARRY: He was, during that time frame.

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. So I'm trying to
25 get this all straight.

1 MR. SALADINO: Mr. Chairman, Investigator
2 Saladino. On the applicant's application, on page five,
3 where it's got spot that says to put down your arrest
4 history, he did disclose in '92 he was on probation out
5 of Irvington, California. Or Irvington, New Jersey. He
6 put a start date at '92, date completed '94. On page
7 six of the application, for more arrest history, have
8 you ever been convicted of a felony charge, he did
9 indicate yes on that. Also, he did disclose, in '07,
10 out of South Carolina, driving under a suspended
11 driver's license. And '92, simple assault out of
12 New Jersey.

13 So, yes, the applicant did disclose a few of
14 the arrests and did note that he was on probation and
15 stuff in the early '90s.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you for
17 clarifying that. Appreciate that.

18 All right. Are there any other questions from
19 the Board?

20 Seeing none, I would entertain a motion.

21 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I move that
22 we grant the appeal for Terry L. Moses, based upon time
23 and distance and the fact that he's lived in Nevada
24 since 1981, there's not been any issues.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion

1 by Board Member Colbert. Do we have a second?

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Second, but that he has
3 not lived here since '81, no.

4 MR. MOSES: No.

5 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No?

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: He's only lived here
7 for about the last eight months. Eight months.

8 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Oh, I'm sorry. I
9 thought I heard '81. Sorry.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have a
11 motion. I'm sorry. We have a motion by Board Member
12 Colbert, a second by Board Member Gronauer. Any
13 discussion on the motion?

14 Seeing no discussion, all in favor of the
15 motion, signify by saying "aye."

16 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Aye.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Aye.

18 All opposed, signify by saying "nay."

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Nay.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So I didn't hear, I
21 didn't hear any votes from Gronauer or Nixon. Could we
22 clarify that.

23 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Oh, I said "aye."

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: They said "aye."

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I said "aye."

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. So the
2 motion passes by a vote of four to one. And, Mr. Moses,
3 you will get your work card.

4 MR. MOSES: Thank you.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: You're welcome. Good
6 luck.

7 MR. MOSES: Thank you.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good luck.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We probably need to be
11 clear for the record that Flynn voted no.

12 THE REPORTER: Oh, yeah, I got that. It's on
13 the record.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right. We
15 now go to number 39, Lisa R. Priola.

16 MR. INGRAM: Lisa Priola?

17 Not present.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We'll trail
19 that one.

20 Number 40, Charles A. Reynolds.

21 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Reynolds?

22 Not present.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Number 41,
24 Michael E. Stanley.

25 MR. INGRAM: He's present.

1 MR. STANLEY: Good morning.

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning.

3 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Good morning.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Again, I believe, this
5 is Investigator Paul Maxwell.

6 MR. MAXWELL: Yes, sir. Mr. Stanley returned.
7 He was initially at the September Board, where the Board
8 members asked him to get court documents or police
9 reports and then return in December.

10 The initial denial was for attempting to carry
11 a concealed weapon, and the severity was unknown, and he
12 got two years probation. This was in 1993 out of Ohio.
13 The arrest was not disclosed. It was found through the
14 fingerprint report. The applicant was made provisional
15 as the charge was not shown on the initial background
16 check.

17 The applicant, as stated, appeared at the
18 September Board and did not return with documents in
19 December. The applicant did attempt to get court
20 documents and has kept in contact with me throughout
21 this three-month period. This office also managed to
22 the get court records. And it was stated that he has
23 applied for expungement of the offense and, but he will
24 not hear anything until December 19th of this year. But
25 he has made attempts to get paperwork to satisfy the

1 Board's request.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you,
3 Investigator.

4 Mr. Stanley, how do you attempt --

5 MR. STANLEY: Yes, sir.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: -- to carry a concealed
7 weapon? Can you explain that, what the circumstances
8 were on that? And, also, why you did not disclose.

9 MR. STANLEY: Basically, when it happened was
10 that I had an argument with my wife, my ex-wife. And
11 the gun was in my car. And she had called because she
12 was upset. And when I pulled back into the driveway,
13 the Maple Heights police was there, and they came and
14 they asked me did I threaten her or anything like that.
15 I said no.

16 The other officer went to my car, went into my
17 car. The gun was purchased legally. I had the receipt
18 and everything for it. He went in, and he said that
19 because I didn't have the receipt in the car, that it
20 was illegal.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. So if I'm clear,
22 he said, because you didn't have the receipt in the car,
23 then it was illegal; is that what you said?

24 MR. STANLEY: Yes.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

1 MR. STANLEY: Yes.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And why did you not
3 disclose?

4 MR. STANLEY: Because I had filed my
5 expungement a long time ago. It was like in two
6 thousand and -- I want to say 2003 when I got off
7 probation. And I had obtained papers and everything.
8 Basically, when I went to get the papers for the Board,
9 I spoke to the bailiff that was handling the
10 expungement, and he told me that I would be receiving
11 all this information. So what happened was that they
12 had them a water damage situation. Because he called
13 me, and he told me that I would be receiving this before
14 I even came to the Board meeting that I would have.

15 And I explained that to Mr. Maxwell to let him
16 know that that's what I was told, and the information
17 should be coming. So I disclosed that to Mr. Maxwell to
18 let him know that that's what, that's the only reason
19 why I didn't have the papers today in my hand.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Are there any Board
21 questions? Board Member Flynn?

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I just want to be clear.
23 The paperwork that we wanted from the courts for him to
24 get, what was that going to state?

25 MR. MAXWELL: It was just clarifying the arrest

1 and the severity, and things like that, were requested
2 that last time at the September meeting.

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Right.

4 MR. MAXWELL: And, also, any -- if it was
5 expunged or anything like that.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: But, for our knowledge, he
7 has not been in trouble since 1993?

8 MR. MAXWELL: No, sir.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. All right. Thank
10 you.

11 MR. SALADINO: Mr. Chair, Investigation
12 Saladino.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes.

14 MR. SALADINO: According to the court documents
15 from Ohio, it was a '93 arrest. There was two years of
16 probation, which he did serve. And he was also
17 scheduled for regular drug testing, attended a county
18 concealed weapons program, and had to pay some court
19 fees.

20 In 2008, the applicant did apply to seal the
21 record. And for some reason, the courts, there's a gap
22 between '08 and 2018. But the water damage to Ohio was
23 verified. And we were able to find this on their online
24 system, and it shows that the expungement or the sealing
25 process will take place no later than December 18th, or

1 December 19th of this year.

2 So they are moving forward with the sealing of
3 it. It was a misdemeanor charge. And the applicant did
4 complete all the requirements of probation.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you,
6 Investigator.

7 Board Member Nixon, do you have any questions?

8 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir. Thank you.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, I do not. Thank
11 you.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

13 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Then
15 I'd entertain a motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll make a
17 motion that we grant his appeal. We have received
18 answers to our questions. We've got time and distance
19 of in excess of 25 years. Mr. Stanley has not been in
20 any trouble since then. And I appreciate his patience
21 and coming back.

22 MR. STANLEY: Thank you, sir.

23 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
25 Board Member Flynn and a second by Board Member Nixon to

1 overturn the denial. Any discussion on the motion?

2 Seeing none, all in favor, signify by saying
3 "aye."

4 (Board members said "aye.")

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Anyone opposed?

6 Congratulations, Mr. Stanley. You will get a
7 work card.

8 MR. STANLEY: Thank you, sir.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Merry Christmas.

10 MR. STANLEY: Thank you. Happy holidays to
11 you.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We'll go to item
13 number 42, Joey L. Wells.

14 MR. INGRAM: He's in the south.

15 MR. WELLS: How are you all doing?

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good.

18 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Good.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I believe, this is
20 Investigator Maxwell.

21 MR. MAXWELL: Yes, sir. November of 1996, out
22 of Louisiana, Mr. Wells was picked up for a DWI at
23 misdemeanor level. The disposition states one year
24 unsupervised probation. This was not disclosed.

25 In July of 2013, again in Louisiana, operating

1 a vehicle while intoxicated at first degree, which is at
2 felony level. The fine was unsupervised probation.
3 This arrest was disclosed on the application as a
4 misdemeanor, but the fingerprint report showed this as a
5 felony.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Mr. Wells, would
7 you be kind enough to --

8 MR. WELLS: I have the paperwork that's showing
9 that I don't have a felony. I just got it the other
10 day.

11 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Wells, they're addressing you
12 right now.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I'm sorry. Now,
14 Mr. Wells, good afternoon. Mr. Wells, would you explain
15 to us both of those arrests and the reason why you did
16 not disclose the first DUI.

17 MR. WELLS: Oh, it was so many years ago, I
18 actually didn't even remember. I was like 19.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. So the paperwork
20 you gave Investigator Saladino, what was that paperwork?

21 MR. SALADINO: The applicant stated this was
22 showing that the felonies were not, were not felonies.
23 I'm just verifying the dates on it and looking over the
24 paperwork right quick.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Thank you.

1 While they're verifying the paperwork, are
2 there any Board questions? Board Member Colbert?

3 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes.

4 On the most recent DUI, did you do any jail
5 time at all?

6 MR. WELLS: Yes, sir.

7 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: How much?

8 MR. WELLS: I did 30 days, and probation and
9 the fine.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right.

11 MR. WELLS: And I was in there, and then I got
12 15 days extra. I was already in there for awhile, and
13 then they gave me 15 more days.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

15 MR. WELLS: For like with the fine.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board Member
17 Gronauer?

18 MR. WELLS: And then probation.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board Member
20 Gronauer, do you have any questions?

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir.

22 Mr. Wells, are you still having any, did you or
23 are you still having any problems with alcohol?

24 MR. WELLS: I went to rehab. And I drink a
25 little bit, but not nowhere near what I used to.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: When did you --

2 MR. WELLS: And I don't drink and drive.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: When did you go to
4 rehab?

5 MR. WELLS: About, it would be around, a little
6 over a year ago. I went twice.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Explain the
8 twice. I don't know what that means. So you were going
9 a year ago and then before that?

10 MR. WELLS: Yeah, I went before, a long time
11 ago. And I was clean for a long time. And then I
12 started back, and my wife wanted me to go back to rehab.
13 So I went back to rehab. Because she don't want me
14 drinking.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have a valid
16 driver's license?

17 MR. WELLS: No, sir. I'm not driving anymore.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You do not have a valid
19 driver's license?

20 MR. WELLS: No, I do not.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. No, I'm just
22 asking you about it.

23 MR. WELLS: I don't, I don't drink and drive or
24 anything. Actually, I'm fixing to get a Nevada driver's
25 license, because I'm really from Louisiana.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have a Nevada
2 ID?

3 MR. WELLS: That's what I'm fixing to get. I
4 got stood up by Louisiana.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. How long --

6 MR. WELLS: I've been here six months.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. So where do you
8 live?

9 MR. WELLS: I live on Boulder, 5600 Boulder,
10 Sportsman's.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Sportsman's. Okay. I
12 know the place.

13 MR. WELLS: My wife was here before me. And I
14 was working. And that's why I'm trying to get a card,
15 because I want to go back. Because I'm on disability.
16 And I was trying to work there. And then I come back
17 with my wife. And I'm trying to get my card so I can
18 work here, because I want to get off disability.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. So if you --

20 MR. WELLS: So I feel that I could go back to
21 work.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. That's good
23 enough for me. But the rest, the rest of it is you've
24 been here six months. Have you been working?

25 MR. WELLS: Not a whole six months.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. Have you
2 been working?

3 MR. WELLS: I'm on disability.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay.

5 MR. WELLS: And that's why I've got to have a
6 card to be able to do.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What kind of work do
8 you plan on doing?

9 MR. WELLS: Guard.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have a job lined
11 up?

12 MR. WELLS: I've got a job at three companies.
13 Like I said, I just need my guard card.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Can you tell me --

15 MR. WELLS: Trinity --

16 (The Reporter indicated it's difficult to hear
17 Las Vegas.)

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: She's having a hard
19 time understanding. Say the last part where you've been
20 working at.

21 MR. WELLS: Most of my jobs I worked long
22 times.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Oh, okay. I'm sorry.

24 MR. WELLS: When I worked, I worked always like
25 eight and 10 years.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And now you applied for
2 three different jobs, right?

3 MR. WELLS: Right. They told me just bring my
4 guard card.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Where are the jobs?

6 MR. WELLS: Sir?

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What companies?

8 MR. WELLS: Trinity, Allied, and Green Valley.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Investigator Saladino,
11 do we have an answer to your question?

12 MR. SALADINO: Yes, Mr. Chair. We do have
13 court documents from Louisiana showing that the
14 applicant did plead guilty to the DUI offense and that
15 it was dismissed, as he completed all the requirements
16 for the courts. And I do have that stamped from the
17 clerk of the courts out of Louisiana.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right. Do
19 we have any more Board questions?

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Seeing none, I would
22 accept a motion.

23 For purposes of discussion, I'll make a motion
24 that the appeal be overturned. Is there a second?

25 All right. It dies for lack of a second. Is

1 there another motion?

2 With the lack of any motion or an action, the
3 denial is upheld. Mr. Wells, your appeal has been --
4 has not been overturned. So. Or it's not been
5 approved. So, therefore, you will not be issued a work
6 card. And you have a year. In a year, you can reapply.

7 MR. WELLS: Thank you.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Counsel, is that the
9 correct route?

10 MS. BORDELOVE: Because it's an official appeal
11 to the Board, I would recommend that the Board take an
12 action, one direction or the other.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll make a motion.
15 I'll make a motion. Gronauer. I make a motion that the
16 appeal of Mr. Joey L. Wells be denied for the
17 registration.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
19 by Board Member Gronauer. Do we have a second on that
20 motion?

21 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second by
23 Board Member Colbert. Any discussion on the motion?

24 I'm going to vote against the motion, based on
25 consistency of the Board to -- on issuing or the

1 overturning the appeal. So I will be voting in
2 opposition to the motion.

3 All in favor of the motion, signify by saying
4 "aye."

5 (Board members said "aye.")

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Those opposed? Nay.

7 So the motion passes four to one. All right.

8 So, again, Mr. Wells, your appeal has been denied. You
9 can come back in a year and reapply.

10 MR. WELLS: Thank you.

11 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 43, Bruce A.

13 Willis.

14 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Willis?

15 Not present.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Then we'll
17 trail Willis.

18 Number 44, Alfredo Y. Esteban.

19 MR. ESTEBAN: Good afternoon.

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good afternoon.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good afternoon,
22 Mr. Esteban.

23 MR. ESTEBAN: How's it going?

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Give me just one
25 moment.

1 All right. This looks like this is
2 Investigator Donald.

3 MS. DONALD: Yes. Investigator Donald. In
4 December of 2017, he was convicted of a misdemeanor
5 possession of drugs, received a suspended sales
6 sentence, fines. It's now completed.

7 March of 2009, convicted of a misdemeanor,
8 possession controlled substance with prior, and received
9 a fine and a work program.

10 February of 2009, convicted of a misdemeanor,
11 lewd and lascivious conduct. He received credit for
12 time served.

13 February of 2009, convicted of a gross
14 misdemeanor for unlawful possession of a controlled
15 substance. This started out as a felony but was reduced
16 to a gross misdemeanor. Suspended jail sentence and
17 probation, which was completed as of May of 2012.

18 January of 2009, convicted of a misdemeanor DUI
19 and possession of a controlled substance. He received
20 fines, community service and traffic school.

21 Although Mr. Esteban isn't convicted of any
22 felonies or weapons charges, I went ahead and denied him
23 for failure to disclose the arrests. Once I ran it
24 through SCOPE, I was able to go online and pull up the
25 court documents that showed the conviction and the

1 disposition of the five arrests.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you,
3 Investigator.

4 Mr. Esteban, is there a reason why you did not
5 disclose any of these?

6 MR. ESTEBAN: Honestly, I didn't, I wasn't so
7 concerned with how to disclose things. So I didn't
8 write on it, when I signed up for it, I didn't write on
9 the paperwork any of my, what I had, because I wasn't so
10 sure of what I had on my record.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Do we have any
12 questions from the Board? Board Member Flynn?

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Esteban, you're saying
14 you don't remember an arrest from a year ago?

15 MR. ESTEBAN: With all -- what do you mean by
16 disclose?

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Well, disclose means you
18 have to tell us if you've ever been arrested or
19 convicted or jailed or imprisoned.

20 MR. ESTEBAN: Yeah. Right. No, I forgot to,
21 honestly.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: So you forgot an arrest
23 from a year ago for the possession of drugs --

24 MR. ESTEBAN: Yeah.

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: -- in interstate commerce?

1 Okay. Thank you. Appreciate your answer.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

3 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Are you currently working?

4 MR. ESTEBAN: Yeah, I actually work two
5 part-time jobs, as a parking lot attendant down by the
6 Strip. That's where I heard from the security, so I
7 thought it would be -- that's why I applied for it. And
8 I work at a Trop Stop at a car wash.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Investigator
10 Gronauer?

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: How about Board Member?
12 I could be an investigator, whatever you want.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: He'd be a heck of an
14 investigator.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You can you me Mrs.
16 All right. Mr. Esteban, a year ago, that
17 arrest, what was the drugs involved?

18 MR. ESTEBAN: It was cocaine.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And it was a
20 misdemeanor?

21 MR. ESTEBAN: Yeah, because I was at -- it was
22 at the wrong -- I was at the wrong place at the wrong
23 time. And it was just not me involved in the situation.
24 There was other, other peers of mine in there.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. So when you were

1 arrested, though, it was a felony, and then they knocked
2 if down to a misdemeanor?

3 MR. ESTEBAN: Yes, sir.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. So I understand
5 that part. All right. Thank you. Appreciate it.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So Board Member
7 Colbert?

8 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Any
10 additional questions from the Board?

11 Seeing none, I'd accept a motion.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. I make a
13 motion for denial for Mr. Alfredo Y. Esteban on his
14 appeal.

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So we have a motion by
17 Gronauer and a second by Nixon to uphold, uphold the
18 appeal. Excuse me. Uphold the denial.

19 Any discussion on the motion?

20 Hearing none, all in favor of the motion,
21 signify by saying "aye."

22 (Board members said "aye.")

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

24 The denial was upheld by a unanimous vote.
25 Mr. Esteban, you can reapply in a year.

1 MR. ESTEBAN: All right. Thank you.

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Thank you.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good luck.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 45, Jaime
5 Garcia-Mendoza.

6 MR. INGRAM: He's in the south. And,
7 Mr. Chair, we'll be using a translator. Gisela Corral
8 will be translating for us.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. That sounds
10 fine.

11 This looks like Investigator Donald again.

12 MS. DONALD: Yes. August of 2007,
13 Mr. Garcia-Mendoza was convicted of a felony for one
14 count of DUI with priors and one count of forced assault
15 with a deadly weapon not a firearm. He received three
16 years in prison for the DUI and prior, and one year in
17 prison for the force.

18 2005, in December, he had one count of DUI.
19 The disposition was unknown.

20 July of 2004, one count of force, assault with
21 a deadly weapon. The disposition was unknown. Which
22 could possibly be related to the 2007 arrest as well.

23 2011, June, felony conviction for one count of
24 DUI with alcohol. He was sentenced to 16 months in
25 prison.

1 In May of 2001, one count of DUI. Disposition
2 is unknown.

3 And May of 1996, convicted of receiving known
4 stolen property. It was unclear if it was a felony or a
5 misdemeanor, but he was sentenced to 180 days in jail
6 and received three years probation.

7 All the arrests were out of California, and he
8 did not close these.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you,
10 Investigator.

11 Is it possible Mr. Garcia-Mendoza can explain
12 to us why none of these were disclosed, and explain the
13 circumstances?

14 (Ms. Corral interpreted for the appellant.)

15 MS. CORRAL: Okay. The reason why he did not
16 disclose any of the arrests is because he does not read
17 or write English. So, therefore, he brought someone
18 with him to fill out the application at the PILB office,
19 and that person did not, never asked him to list any
20 arrests, so he didn't.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Are there any
22 question from the Board? I'll start with Board Member
23 Nixon.

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes, I have a couple.

2 Can he explain to us the circumstances of the
3 firearms arrest?

4 (Ms. Corral interpreted for the appellant.)

5 MS. CORRAL: Does he have a firearm? Which
6 one?

7 MS. DONALD: It's not a firearm. It's a count
8 of force, assault with a deadly weapon, but not a
9 firearm.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. I misread that. My
11 apologies.

12 MS. CORRAL: Do you still want him to explain?

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah, if you want to
14 explain what we were told what the deadly weapon was.

15 (Ms. Corral interpreted for the appellant.)

16 MS. CORRAL: So what year was that?

17 MS. DONALD: In 2007.

18 (Ms. Corral interpreted for the appellant.)

19 MS. CORRAL: Okay. So in regards to that
20 arrest, he was working at a "fav-ay," like a factory, he
21 said. And a lot of different employees used to fool
22 around. And one time, he was actually playing around
23 with another employee, and he pushed him, and the
24 employee actually got hurt, because he hit himself with
25 like a corner of one of the big machineries that they

1 were working on, and so he cut himself. So he got
2 arrested, and they said that he was using a deadly
3 weapon, not item firearm, but he was actually not in
4 possession of any knife or anything like that, any form
5 of deadly weapon.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. And how long has he
7 lived in Las Vegas?

8 (Ms. Corral interpreted for the appellant.)

9 MS. CORRAL: Since 2010.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And what's he been doing
11 here the last eight years?

12 (Ms. Corral interpreted for the appellant.)

13 MS. CORRAL: He's always been employed by a
14 casino. Currently, he works at the Silver Legacy.

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. Thank you.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

17 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah, I have a couple.

20 First of all, not a firearm. All right. It's
21 2004. Then, it may be related to the 2007. I agree
22 with that. But is that the truth?

23 (Ms. Corral interpreted for and conversed with
24 the appellant.)

25 MS. CORRAL: Okay. Sorry. I was just trying

1 to clarify. So, absolutely, it was, it's always been
2 just one single case of the use of deadly weapon not a
3 firearm.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And, now, has he
5 attended any DUI classes or any kind of alcohol classes
6 or rehabs?

7 (Ms. Corral interpreted for the appellant.)

8 MS. CORRAL: Yes, he did attend DUI classes,
9 and he's been to AA --

10 MR. GARCIA-MENDOZA: AA.

11 MS. CORRAL: -- AA class. Everything was back
12 in California. He does have a valid driver's license
13 here in Nevada.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: He does have a valid
15 driver's license?

16 MS. CORRAL: Correct.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Does he drink now,
18 alcohol?

19 (Ms. Corral interpreted for the appellant.)

20 MS. CORRAL: No, he does not drink anymore. He
21 likes to drive his car.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And we have no record
23 of any other arrests since then?

24 (Ms. Corral interpreted for the appellant.)

25 MS. CORRAL: No, he has not had any arrests

1 ever since.

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Can I have a follow-up
3 question?

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes.

5 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Why did he apply for a
6 guard card now?

7 (Ms. Corral interpreted for the appellant.)

8 MS. CORRAL: Because he's always worked at a
9 casino. Right now, he just had surgery. So every
10 single employment at the casino, it's kind of like a
11 hard kind of job for his condition right now. So he's
12 trying to look for something, you know, easier.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Any other Board
14 questions?

15 Seeing none, I would accept a motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Chair, Ray Flynn.
17 I'll make a motion to grant the appeal. But this is the
18 first one for me. Because, normally, in my record of
19 voting is people that don't disclose, I automatically
20 say no. But the fact with the language barrier, and he
21 brought somebody in to fill out the application for him,
22 and the fact that he has not been in trouble since
23 living in Nevada, he's got a long-term employment, and
24 nothing, and no arrests in Nevada, I'm going to
25 recommend granting his appeal.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
2 to grant the appeal. Do we have a second on that
3 motion?

4 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second, based on the
5 same reasons, I think, the language barrier.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have a
7 motion by Board Member Flynn, second by Board Member
8 Nixon. Any discussion on the motion?

9 All in favor, signify by saying "aye."

10 (Board members said "aye.")

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All opposed?

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No. No. Nay.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So we have -- the
14 motion passes four to one, with Board Member Gronauer
15 voting no.

16 All right. Ma'am, would you advise
17 Mr. Garcia-Mendoza that he will receive his work card.

18 (Ms. Corral interpreted for the appellant.)

19 MS. CORRAL: He thanks.

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: De nada.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We'll go to
22 number 46, Dale A. Imbriani.

23 Sir, did I pronounce your last name correctly?

24 MR. IMBRIANI: Yes, "Im-bree-AWN-ee."

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Imbriani. Okay. It

1 looks likes, Investigator Donald, you're up again.

2 MS. DONALD: In October of 1982, Mr. Imbriani
3 was convicted of a felony for aggregated assault on a
4 police officer. So, he was convicted. The court
5 provision was that he abide by the court restrictions.
6 He did. And, but he did not disclose the arrest. That
7 was his only arrest.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. So,
9 Mr. Imbriani, could you explain the circumstances of the
10 arrest and, also, why you did not disclose.

11 MR. IMBRIANI: Yes. Actually, I truly thought
12 it was dismissed. But at the time of the arrest, my
13 buddy got arrested for a DUI. And one of the officers
14 slammed his head against the top of the car. I got
15 upset, grabbed the officer, told him he didn't need to
16 slam his head. And that was it.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Do we have any
18 questions from the Board? Board Member Flynn?

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: How long have you lived in
20 Nevada?

21 MR. IMBRIANI: We have a place here and, also,
22 in Phoenix. So we've had a place here for four years,
23 four years now.

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And what do you do for
25 employment, sir?

1 MR. IMBRIANI: We own a repo company.

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

3 MR. IMBRIANI: So I owned Night Hawk Recovery
4 since '91. We are in Phoenix, Kingman, Flagstaff. And
5 then went through a divorce and had to close it down.
6 Changed the name to B.O.L.O. Auto Recovery. And we
7 opened up here four years ago and, also, in Phoenix.

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. And you want the
9 work card for what?

10 MR. IMBRIANI: Well, I manage the employees.
11 And I just felt I should probably get one as well,
12 because all my employees have to have it, and our camera
13 drivers have to have it. Our office staff, I make them
14 get it. So I require everybody to get the card, so I
15 figured I should get one as well.

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. Maybe I need
17 help from Kevin.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Me, too.

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Because I'm really
20 confused.

21 MR. INGRAM: Well, he's not a license holder.
22 So even if he's an owner, he's not a license holder.

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. But --

24 MR. INGRAM: So he doesn't have any credentials
25 to work.

1 Are you a corporate officer for the company?

2 MR. IMBRIANI: Well, manager, we'll say.

3 Because once I went through a divorce, and she was
4 trying to take everything, so.

5 MR. INGRAM: And how long have you been
6 associated with B.O.L.O. here in Nevada?

7 MR. IMBRIANI: Since we started four years ago.

8 MR. INGRAM: And you never received a work card
9 at that time?

10 MR. IMBRIANI: No, because I only come up here
11 from time to time. Just I come up and help Stephanie,
12 who's my girlfriend.

13 MR. INGRAM: Stephanie French?

14 MR. IMBRIANI: Right. She -- her mom was in a
15 car accident, in a coma, so, for over 30 days. So I had
16 to start coming up here a little bit and help out.

17 MR. INGRAM: And you understand that you have
18 to have a work card before you can actually work here in
19 Nevada?

20 MR. IMBRIANI: Correct.

21 MR. INGRAM: And you just testified under oath
22 that you're working here without a work card.

23 MR. IMBRIANI: Well, I -- I don't go out on the
24 road. So I have nothing to do with it. Because the
25 only thing I do is payroll.

1 MR. INGRAM: Okay. If you're an employee of a
2 license holder, you must have a registered work card
3 regardless of what duties or responsibilities you have.

4 MR. IMBRIANI: Okay. Getting it.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah, this would be an
6 easy one if you would have disclosed. You were 19, and
7 it was a long time ago. But I'm more concerned about --
8 and I'm sure staff will follow up. I'm more concerned
9 about the position you hold right now.

10 MR. IMBRIANI: Okay.

11 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And the fact that you're
12 not licensed. I think, that's actually something for
13 you to worry about now. This is minor.

14 MR. IMBRIANI: Okay.

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I'm done.

16 MR. INGRAM: And, for the record, in an
17 instance where an employee is working for a license
18 holder without a work card, the citation would be issued
19 to the qualifying agent of B.O.L.O. Recovery, which
20 would be Stephanie French. She will be receiving a
21 citation for employing someone without a work card in
22 Nevada. They're responsible for allowing somebody to
23 work without a work card.

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And just, Mr. Chair, just
25 one other comment.

1 I don't know how it's going to go. I mean you
2 can see we think differently. But if it goes in the
3 direction that you're not happy with, you can apply
4 again in a year. And if you disclosed, you know where I
5 stand.

6 MR. IMBRIANI: Okay.

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon, do
9 you have any --

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I'm done, Mr. Chair. I'm
11 done.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board Member
13 Nixon, do you have any questions?

14 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, I think, I'm good.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, Mr. Chairman.

17 B.O.L.O. Recovery is a licensed corporation?

18 MR. IMBRIANI: Correct.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And your
20 position there is what?

21 MR. IMBRIANI: Well, I was trying to say, I've
22 been in Phoenix. So I've had to come up here for the --
23 a couple of times because of Stephanie's mom getting in
24 a car accident. So I told her that I would come up,
25 make sure. But since, since it's happened, she's hired

1 Richard Peroni, that got a card, and he worked for us
2 for, I don't know, five years down in Phoenix. So he's
3 moved up here.

4 So I want to get a work card so I can come up
5 here and help. Me and Stephanie actually flew back
6 yesterday from Maui just so I could come here to this
7 hearing.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well, I appreciate
9 that. You know, it's -- is Stephanie here?

10 MR. IMBRIANI: No. She's off, she's in
11 Phoenix.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay.

13 MR. SALADINO: Mr. Chair, Investigator
14 Saladino. Prior to -- I'm sorry. I'm probably going to
15 butcher your name.

16 MR. IMBRIANI: It's all right.

17 MR. SALADINO: Prior to the applicant getting
18 his work card, Ms. French did reach out and asked about
19 how the application process would go, being that he does
20 manage the operations in California.

21 MR. IMBRIANI: Phoenix.

22 MR. SALADINO: In Phoenix.

23 MR. IMBRIANI: Right.

24 MR. SALADINO: The Secretary of State for
25 B.O.L.O. here in Nevada only lists Stephanie French on

1 it. And, you know, Ms. French did reach out to us and
2 asked how the application process would go for the work
3 card. I did know about her mother being in a car
4 accident and stuff.

5 So Stephanie did reach out to us, and we set
6 the process up with the appeal, knowing the criminal
7 history was there.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you,
9 Investigator.

10 Investigator -- Board Member Colbert, do you
11 have any questions?

12 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'd like to continue
14 with one more.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Oh, I'm sorry. I
16 apologize.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: That's okay.

18 But you've been coming up here for the last
19 four years, at times, so you've been actually doing
20 business without a license.

21 MR. IMBRIANI: Well, I come because I --

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir.

23 MR. IMBRIANI: I like Vegas. So. We have fun
24 at the concerts.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Sir, yes or no?

1 MR. IMBRIANI: No. I just started coming two
2 months ago. Because I like Phoenix. I mean I like
3 Vegas for the night life, you know, and going to shows.
4 But I have a house in Phoenix. My friends are in
5 Phoenix. I teach in Phoenix. So.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you.

7 MR. IMBRIANI: You're welcome.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any other questions?

9 I didn't hear why you did not disclose. I
10 think, I missed it.

11 MR. IMBRIANI: Well, I think, they said it was
12 in '82. And I truly just -- I didn't, I didn't think of
13 anything back on '82. '82, I'd have been -- 1955, so.
14 You know, that's a lot of -- yeah, I'm trying.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.

16 All right. Are there any other questions from
17 the Board?

18 I'll accept a motion.

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll make the
20 motion, based on my earlier comments, that we deny the
21 appeal based on disclosure. I've got no issues if he
22 reapplies in the time frame and discloses it.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I second.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
25 Board Member Flynn to uphold the denial and a second by

1 Board Member Gronauer. Discussion on the motion?

2 I have a couple comments from my position.
3 We're talking 36 years ago. I mean this Board has not
4 held that if someone failed to disclose that long ago,
5 unless there's aggravating circumstance and more recency
6 of issues.

7 As far as the issue goes, B.O.L.O., and him
8 working without a permit or a work card, he applied for
9 a work card, and it was denied. I just think the
10 circumstances are such that the appeal should be upheld.
11 So I will be voting no on this motion.

12 Any other comment from the Board, discussion?

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well, you know,
14 Mr. Chairman, I would really understand what you're
15 saying there, and I understand that about the time and
16 distance on that. But it seems like there's a
17 preponderance of evidence here about other things,
18 including working without a work card. So that just
19 creates me a problem. I'm sorry. That's the way I feel
20 about it.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And, you know, this is
22 not an argument. I understand your position.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. I didn't --

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I believe that
25 B.O.L.O. --

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I didn't think it's
2 argument.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I believe that B.O.L.O.
4 is trying to put forth good effort to try to meet
5 statutory and regulatory requirements. So, again, you
6 know, we can disagree on the thing.

7 So that. And unless there's additional
8 discussion, all in favor of the motion, signify by
9 saying "aye."

10 (Board members said "aye.")

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And those opposed?
12 Nay.

13 So the motion passes four to one.
14 Mr. Imbriani, you may come back in a year and apply.

15 MR. IMBRIANI: Okay.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: But understand that if
17 you're working for B.O.L.O., B.O.L.O. is now subject to
18 information that they have employees working without
19 proper registration.

20 MR. IMBRIANI: Right. Yeah, I stay in Phoenix,
21 so. All right. Thanks.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have
23 number 47, Markus Moore. He's up here.

24 MR. MOORE: Good afternoon, ladies and
25 gentlemen of the Board. And I'd like to say I am very

1 appreciative that I've been given this opportunity to
2 appeal and speak to the Board.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So, I believe,
4 Investigator Donald, you're still up.

5 MS. DONALD: Yep. Mr. Moore was convicted in
6 Utah in 2015 for possession of a weapon. He was
7 originally charged with a felony, but it was reduced to
8 a misdemeanor. He had to pay a fine, did some jail time
9 and probation. The applicant did disclose the arrest
10 and has had no other incidences.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Mr. Moore,
12 would you explain the circumstances.

13 MR. MOORE: Yes. Oddly enough, when I was
14 living in Utah, I was living with my ex-girlfriend at
15 the time. And I had just -- we were renting out a room
16 from her mom's house. And, well, after I paid the rent,
17 her and her mom got in a very big argument. She left.
18 But I was planning on like moving down here to Nevada at
19 the end of that month. And I already paid her rent, and
20 she talked to me, and she asked when's the soonest I can
21 move out. I told her I could be out by the end of the
22 week. That didn't work for her. So.

23 And she knew that my father had just bought me
24 a Desert Eagle .44. She called the cops and said that
25 she was freaking out because there's a person with a gun

1 in her house. And, well, it escalated from there. I
2 let the cops in. I showed them exactly where they could
3 find the weapon. It was Condition 4, which means no
4 magazine in the magazine well, no round in the chamber,
5 and the weapon's on safe. I also had a trigger lock on
6 it. And it was locked inside of another drawer.

7 So I didn't see any real problem with that.
8 The issue that they had, when they found it, is that
9 even though I was renting the room and sharing it with
10 another person, they did find paraphernalia in the same
11 room. And even though the weapon was locked away in a
12 locked drawer, they still considered it within the
13 vexus.

14 So since that -- they took me into jail. And
15 we came to a plea agreement. Since it was my first
16 offense, it was nonaggressive, I completely complied
17 with every order that the officers gave me, they were
18 able to drop it down to a misdemeanor, the attempted
19 possession by a restricted person.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board questions?
21 Board Member Colbert?

22 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir. Mr. Moore.

25 MR. MOORE: Yes, sir.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It's the first time I
2 heard by a restricted person. What does that mean?

3 MR. MOORE: I think, it has something to do
4 with specifics within Utah law. I can't really go into
5 that. Your guess is as good as mine, sir. It was just
6 the lesser charge.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Can I ask the
8 investigator, do we have anything deeper on that?

9 MS. DONALD: That was his only arrest.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It doesn't say
11 restricted person or anything? Because what I consider
12 is a restricted person is a little different, I guess.

13 MS. DONALD: Exactly. But, no prior record,
14 other than that one arrest and conviction.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Where have you lived
16 prior to Utah?

17 MR. MOORE: I'm sorry, sir. What was that?

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Where were you residing
19 prior to Utah?

20 MR. MOORE: I was in Florida. And then, before
21 that, I was in Idaho. And before that, I was in
22 California. And before that, I was in Okinawa, Japan.
23 And before that, Afghanistan. And before that,
24 California again. And then Butte, Montana. And then
25 Idaho.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Most of that
2 traveling is because of the military service or perish
3 military?

4 MR. MOORE: The military service, sir, United
5 States Marine Corps.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Hm. Okay. All right.
7 Thank you.

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I -- oh, I'm sorry.

9 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, you can.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, I got to wait for you.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: No, go ahead. Go
12 ahead, Board Member Flynn.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I'm ahead of myself.

14 For the applicant, in Utah, a restricted person
15 most commonly means, not like Nevada, means it's drug
16 user. So what kind of paraphernalia was in the room?

17 MR. MOORE: Marijuana. It was just a pipe. It
18 want any drugs. It was just used paraphernalia.

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah, I know what
20 paraphernalia is. But if they found dope there, they
21 would have arrested you for dope. So that's what the
22 restriction, that's why you got arrested for the
23 restriction, my guess.

24 MR. MOORE: Oh.

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Is because of the -- you

1 were in possession of a firearm in your room, along with
2 evidence of drug use. What are you doing now --

3 MR. MOORE: I'm a door dasher, sir.

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: -- for employment?

5 MR. MOORE: I'm employed as a door dasher, sir.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. Thank you.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Is that it?

8 Board Member Nixon?

9 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I'm good. Thank you.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. What's a
11 door dasher?

12 MR. MOORE: It's like Uber, but for food.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Oh.

14 MR. MOORE: Yeah, you go and pick up people's
15 order and you drive it to them.

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Door dasher.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Thank you.

18 I lived on the wrong side of the railroad tracks.

19 Nobody wants to deliver to my address.

20 Board Member Colbert?

21 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Was the weapon returned
22 to you, or they just confiscated it?

23 MR. MOORE: They confiscated it. I guess, they
24 wanted it. I never even fired it. And my dad just
25 thinks the gun is the coolest thing, so he got me one as

1 a gift. And he told me, he was like, "Son, I found the
2 greatest deal, and it's only this price because there's
3 a scratch on it, never been fired before." I'm like,
4 "Well, thank you." I could have really preferred money
5 instead of a gun, but.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. By the way,
7 thank you for your service.

8 MR. MOORE: Yes, sir. I had the best job in
9 all of the Marine Corps. I was a combat engineer.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: You have a fellow
11 Marine right there.

12 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Up here.

13 MR. MOORE: Yeah?

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: On this end of the
15 Board.

16 MR. MOORE: Semper Fi, sir?

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Semper Fi.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So. All right. Any
19 additional questions?

20 If not, I'd accept a motion.

21 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I'd move that
22 we grant the appeal.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I have a motion by --

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: -- by Board Member

1 Colbert, and we have a second by Board Member Nixon.

2 Any discussion on the motion?

3 All in favor, say "aye."

4 (Board members said "aye.")

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

6 It passes unanimously. Congratulations.

7 You'll get your work card.

8 MR. MOORE: Thank you, members of the council.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board, but that's all
10 right.

11 MR. MOORE: Board. I'm just excited.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: No, that's great. So
13 you can talk to Shawn there, and he'll explain the work
14 card.

15 MR. MOORE: Thank you.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Moving
17 right along, are we okay, or did we need a break?

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Anybody need a break?

19 No.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Then, we'll
21 move on to number 48, Albert Nava.

22 MR. NAVA: Las Vegas good afternoon everyone.

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Gavin.

24 MR. NAVA: Good afternoon, everyone.

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good afternoon.

1 MR. MOORE: Good afternoon.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good afternoon,
3 Mr. Nava. Give me one moment.

4 MR. NAVA: Sure.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Investigator Donald,
6 this is yours?

7 MS. DONALD: Yes, it is. Mr. Nava was
8 convicted in California in 2010 for a misdemeanor
9 possession of a switchblade. He received three years
10 probation and a 30-day suspended jail sentence. He
11 disclosed this arrest and has had no other incidences.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Would you,
13 Mr. Nava, would you explain to us the circumstances of
14 the arrest.

15 MR. NAVA: Yeah. So what happened was, in
16 2010, I believe it was June of that year, I was on my
17 way home from visiting a friend's father that was
18 recently put in the hospital. I was pulled over by a
19 Temple City sheriff's unit. Upon being pulled over, I
20 realized that I didn't have my wallet. And my -- I list
21 that my truck was registered to at the time. My uncle,
22 also, who didn't live with me, had his forwarding
23 address sent there. I guess, he had a warrant for his
24 arrest.

25 And me not having my ID on me, they searched my

1 truck and found my work knife. Which it wasn't an
2 actual stiletto switchblade. It was more of a -- was
3 kind of like a little handle with an open end to
4 unfolding it. They, I guess, took me in because of that
5 and not having my driver's license on me. And I tried
6 telling them. I gave them my birthday and my social,
7 driver's license number and everything. They took me
8 in. I spent two days in their lockup and was bailed out
9 by my family.

10 The 30 days suspended jail time was actually --
11 I did 30 days in service. But I mean I had never heard
12 that term, specific, suspended jail time. But the three
13 years that I did, I didn't have a parole officer or
14 anything or a probation officer. I, three years, went
15 through probation, worked off on and on, different jobs.

16 And, I believe, I did file to have it expunged
17 from my record. I'm not sure if it shows that. But
18 that was pretty much par for the course for what
19 happened.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board questions?
21 Board Member Gronauer ("Jen-our")?

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: "Jen-our."

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Every time, it's a
24 different name, but I like it.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I know. I'm still

1 trying to get through it.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well, let me ask you
3 one question here, Mr. Nava.

4 MR. NAVA: Yes, sir.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Where do you work now?

6 MR. NAVA: Right now, I'm currently employed
7 with Meineke Auto Center as a mechanic.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have your work
9 knife on you now?

10 MR. NAVA: No, they took that back in 2010.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have a work
12 knife?

13 MR. NAVA: No, I carry at work a box-cutter in
14 case I need to cut a piece of hose or anything like
15 that. I stopped carrying --

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You don't have that
17 box-cutter now?

18 MR. NAVA: No.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Just checking.
20 Do you have any weapons on you right now?

21 MR. NAVA: No, no weapons on me whatsoever.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. I have no
23 problem.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

25 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Where's Temple City in
3 California?

4 MR. NAVA: Temple City is in the San Gabriel
5 Valley, which is, from what I see on the maps is it
6 looks southeast, I guess, we would consider.

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. I just want to know
8 where we're going.

9 I have no other questions.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

11 Board Member Colbert?

12 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yeah, yes.

13 Was that, was it a spring-operated knife, or
14 was it just all finger-flicked open?

15 MR. NAVA: No, sir. It was a -- it wasn't
16 spring-operated. It was just -- it had a -- it was a
17 locking knife that had a -- like a little lever on it to
18 assist pulling the blade out, and then you would fold
19 that and you would click it till it locked.

20 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: All right. And how big
21 was this knife?

22 MR. NAVA: Like about the size of my palm.
23 Half of it was serrated. So that's why I had it, it was
24 used as a tool. But they just classified it as a
25 switchblade when they found it.

1 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Okay. All right. Thank
2 you. No further.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Any other
4 questions?

5 Seeing none, I would accept a motion.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll make a
7 motion to grant the appeal, based on time, distance.
8 It's a single offense. And he hasn't been in trouble
9 since. And he did disclose.

10 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I have a motion for
12 approval of the appeal. Do we have a second?

13 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Second by Board Member
15 Colbert. All right. Any discussion on the motion?

16 Seeing none, all in favor, signify by saying
17 "aye."

18 (Board members said "aye.")

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Those opposed, "nay."
20 The motion passes unanimously. Mr. Nava, you
21 will get your work permit.

22 MR. NAVA: I've heard you say how long it
23 takes, three to five business days?

24 MR. INGRAM: Yes, you'll be contacted by one of
25 our staff within three to five business days.

1 MR. NAVA: Oh, okay, a phone call?

2 MR. INGRAM: Yes.

3 MR. NAVA: All right. Is that it?

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: That's it.

5 MR. NAVA: All of you, have a good afternoon
6 the rest of your day.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Agenda item
8 number 49, Christopher Thomas.

9 MR. THOMAS: Good afternoon.

10 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Good afternoon.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Give me just one
12 second.

13 All right. Investigator Donald.

14 MS. DONALD: Mr. Thomas was denied for a
15 weapons charge. In 2015, he was convicted of a
16 misdemeanor carrying a loaded firearm. He served 45
17 days in jail and received three years probation. He
18 disclosed the arrest.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Mr. Thomas,
20 would you explain to us the circumstances of the arrest,
21 please.

22 MR. THOMAS: Yes. I was driving home, and
23 before I reached home, I picked up a friend. And when
24 he got in the car -- I was dropping him off. And he hid
25 the gun in the car. I'm not knowing that it was in

1 there. When I got to the stoplight, I didn't yield all
2 the way, I kept going. There was a cop on my left-hand
3 side, I seen him. He pulled me over.

4 When they searched the car, the gun looked to
5 be like a little cap gun. So it didn't have no grip to
6 it or nothing. So when the cop searched it, they asked
7 me did I know it was in the car, and I told them no.

8 They took me in. When I went before the judge,
9 he said it was just a misdemeanor because they didn't
10 find it on me. I served, I was going to say 45 days.
11 They released me Saturday morning. And I served three
12 years summary probation.

13 I got out. After I got out, I moved out here
14 to Nevada, started working under a Safe Security, turned
15 out to be it wasn't even a real company, because he
16 wasn't licensed. The investigator came on the site when
17 I was in uniform and asked me for my paperwork. I
18 didn't have it, because the job that I was going to was
19 supposed to take care of everything and license me as a
20 security guard, and a work card. But it turned out that
21 the company was not legit. And to this day, they're
22 still looking for him.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board questions?

24 MR. SALADINO: Mr. Chair, Investigator
25 Saladino.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes.

2 MR. SALADINO: When we did arrive on site,
3 Mr. Thomas was very cooperative. He was new to Nevada.
4 He didn't understand all the rules and stuff that he
5 needed to abide by. He was very cooperative with
6 helping us in regards to our investigation with the
7 unlicensed activity. And I told him, you know, by all
8 means, you should apply for a work card. There's an
9 appeal process.

10 And you know, that's why we're here today for
11 the appeal.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you,
13 Investigator.

14 Board questions? Board Member Flynn?

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes.

16 Mr. Thomas, a couple things. One, here it says
17 three years summary probation. So, normally,
18 California, summary probation means there's also other
19 conditions. Did you have community service?

20 MR. THOMAS: No, I just had to --

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Classes?

22 MR. THOMAS: No.

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: What?

24 MR. THOMAS: I just had to stay out of the way
25 of the cops.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. I appreciate that.
2 That's a good condition. But you're still on probation.

3 MR. THOMAS: No. I'm done.

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. You're going
5 to have to explain that one to me. My math isn't that
6 bad. You were arrested on 12-30 of 2015.

7 MR. THOMAS: M-hm (affirmative).

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I'm sure you had to go
9 to court, unless what it's like when it's down south in
10 Louisiana, where you went to court the same day. They
11 gave you three years summary probation.

12 MR. THOMAS: Yeah. That was 2018. I'm off.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: You will be --

14 MR. THOMAS: Yeah.

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: -- in a couple weeks.

16 Okay. Thank you.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member, and I'll
18 try it again, Gronauer?

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: That's very good.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Very good.

21 That's what was confusing to me, also, is the
22 dates. Okay. 12-30, you went to court somewhere, a
23 month, two months later, something like that. And then
24 they found you -- they convicted you. At that time, the
25 judge said it's not a felony, it's going to be a

1 misdemeanor.

2 MR. THOMAS: Correct.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. I don't
4 know what a misdemeanor carrying a loaded firearm is.

5 MR. THOMAS: If I knew, I -- I didn't even have
6 it on me. I didn't even --

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I understand. No, I
8 understand your story. Right? And I understand what
9 happened. But it concerns me when the probation dates
10 are not up yet.

11 MR. THOMAS: Right.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And do we have
13 anything that tell us about the probation date,
14 Mr. Saladino?

15 Mr. Chair, we're just looking up the probation
16 stuff now.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Gotcha.

18 MR. SALADINO: Yeah, Mr. Chair, Investigator
19 Saladino. Unfortunately, the State of California, they
20 do not put an end date to the probation on here. It
21 does show that it did -- 12-30 of '15 was the date of
22 the arrest. But we don't have an end date for the
23 probation.

24 MR. THOMAS: Yeah, because I didn't have to
25 check in with nobody, so. It was just a summary

1 probation.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do we have a court date
3 on it?

4 MR. SALADINO: The only date we have is 12-30
5 of '15.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you.

7 You know, I'm going to -- I appreciate all the
8 cooperation, because this investigator said you were
9 cooperative.

10 MR. THOMAS: Yes.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It's just that one of
12 the things that bother me, you never had a P&P officer
13 or any --

14 MR. THOMAS: No, sir.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

19 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. I have a
21 question. Have you received anything from the court?

22 MR. THOMAS: No, sir.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: That told you that
24 you're off probation?

25 MR. THOMAS: No. I haven't received anything.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

2 Any other questions from the Board?

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah. This is Ray Flynn.
4 I've got a question for staff or counsel.

5 MS. BORDELOVE: M-hm (affirmative).

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: If we deny him, he can't
7 come back before us for a year, correct?

8 MS. BORDELOVE: That's correct.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: But if he agrees to
10 postpone to the next meeting, and then we know for a
11 fact that he's definitely off probation, if he agreed to
12 that, we could do that, correct?

13 MS. BORDELOVE: Correct.

14 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. Thank you.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So, Mr. Thomas, what
16 Board Member Flynn was just saying is this. If this
17 Board takes action, and that action is that they affirm
18 the denial, in other words, they say your work card is
19 denied, then it's a year before you can apply for a work
20 card again.

21 But if you think that, you decide that you are
22 willing to wait till our March Board meeting for this
23 appeal to be heard again, and there's confirmation that
24 the probation has been fulfilled, we can get some
25 verification from the court, that may drive a different

1 decision than the denial.

2 Do you understand what I'm -- kind of what I'm
3 saying?

4 MR. THOMAS: Yes.

5 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Mr. Chair, can we make
6 one -- here in one second, they'll have that.

7 MR. SALADINO: Mr. Chair, just give me one
8 second real quick.

9 MS. IRIZARRY: Two.

10 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Two seconds.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Two seconds.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Two seconds. We
13 have two seconds.

14 MS. IRIZARRY: Christopher, do you have a
15 middle name or middle initial?

16 MR. THOMAS: Louis.

17 MS. IRIZARRY: Louis?

18 MR. THOMAS: Uh-huh (affirmative).

19 MS. IRIZARRY: L-E-W?

20 MR. THOMAS: No, it's L-O-U-I-S.

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: We're trying to find
22 something. Mr. Chair, if I may address that.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Absolutely.

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: We're trying to find
25 something that will work for you.

1 MR. THOMAS: Okay.

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I've been here three
3 years. We've never granted an appeal of anybody on
4 probation. We've never granted anything to anybody on
5 probation. And you're really close to getting off. So
6 that's why we're trying to find something, that you go
7 to the next meeting, you'll be off probation. If you
8 haven't been in trouble, it'll work out for you for the
9 better. I can't speak for my colleagues. But I'm
10 not -- I can't in good conscience give somebody without
11 this information.

12 MR. SALADINO: Mr. Chair, we had the wrong
13 county. L.A. County in California doesn't allow for
14 searches. But Pomona, we were able to pull up 11-24 of
15 '17 was the end date for the probation.

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Oh, that's even better.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: 11-24 of '17. Okay.
18 So that, Mr. Thomas, tells us that you're off probation.

19 MR. THOMAS: Yes, sir.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. So are there any
21 other Board questions?

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I'm satisfied.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Seeing
24 none, do I have a motion?

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah. Ray Flynn. I'll

1 make the motion that we grant the application's appeal,
2 based on the fact that he's off probation, he hasn't
3 been in any other trouble, he's got a job, and his
4 honesty in the application process and before the Board.

5 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
7 Board Member Flynn, a second by Board Member Colbert.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. That's even
9 better.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: The motion is to
11 approve the appeal. All those in favor, signify by
12 saying "aye."

13 (Board members said "aye.")

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed, "nay."

15 It passes unanimously. Mr. Thomas, you will
16 get your work card.

17 MR. THOMAS: Thank you.

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Thank you.

19 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Congratulations.

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And to staff, thank you
21 for the team effort.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Latrice Wilson.

23 MR. INGRAM: She's down here.

24 MS. WILSON: Yes. Hi.

25 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Hi.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Hi.

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning, or
3 afternoon.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Investigator Donald.

5 MS. DONALD: Ms. Wilson was convicted for a
6 felony burglary out of California in 2008. She was
7 sentenced to jail time, 365 days, minus 54 days for
8 credit for time served. She received 36 months formal
9 probation, fines and restitution. The applicant did
10 disclose the arrest.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Ms. Wilson,
12 would you explain the circumstances of the arrest.

13 MS. WILSON: Yes. I was at home, and my
14 friends came over and asked me could I do something for
15 them. So we all went outside, and they asked me could I
16 watch across the street, like sit in the house, but
17 watch them across the street as they enter a home, and
18 lie still.

19 And they got caught two weeks later. I got
20 caught three months later, because they told them that I
21 was part of, you know, watching the house. And if so,
22 if I was to fight it, I was going to get six, six years.
23 And they said if I just plead guilty, I'd just get a
24 year. So I just took the deal, because I was 18, and I
25 didn't know really how to be smart.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Questions from
2 the Board?

3 MS. WILSON: And I was an accessory to the
4 crime, so.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I'm sorry. You were
6 what?

7 MS. WILSON: An accessory to the crime.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board Member
9 Colbert, any questions?

10 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I don't know where
13 these questions come from. But, okay. Yes.

14 It says fines and restitution. Do we have
15 anything that says that this has all been cleared up,
16 the fines and restitution?

17 MS. DONALD: It was from 2008.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay.

19 MS. DONALD: She hasn't had anything since.
20 Her probation is finished. She had it for 36 months.
21 So.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: So, apparently, it's
23 all taken care of?

24 MS. DONALD: Yeah. Yes, she's done. It's
25 closed.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you work now?

2 MS. WILSON: I was working, but I was doing
3 security, and they -- when I got the papers and stuff, I
4 stopped. ATD.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you.
6 Well, when's the last time you worked?

7 MS. WILSON: That was the last time.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: When?

9 MS. WILSON: Oh. October.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay.

11 MS. WILSON: When I applied, I started working
12 three days later.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. Thank you.

14 MS. WILSON: M-hm (affirmative).

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

16 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yes. How long have you
17 been in Nevada?

18 MS. WILSON: Since 2010.

19 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. Thank you.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Prior to your security
22 job, what type of employment did you have?

23 MS. WILSON: I worked at a fast food place.

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I just have one

1 question. What was stolen?

2 MS. WILSON: They stole like turtles, juices,
3 drinks. Like they didn't steal any electrics. They
4 just stole dumb stuff. Because we were 17 and 18. And
5 it was little stuff. It wasn't TVs or something like
6 that.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Were you the only
8 18-year-old?

9 MS. WILSON: No. It was two of us. I was one
10 of them.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

12 MS. WILSON: And we was the only ones that got
13 charged with the crime. The other two was minors, so it
14 was dismissed for them.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.

16 Any other Board questions?

17 All right. With that said, and looking like
18 there's no other questions, I'll accept a motion.

19 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair --

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah, I'll make a
21 motion to grant the appeal of Latish Wilson.

22 MS. WILSON: Latrice.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Pardon?

24 MS. WILSON: Latrice.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Latrice. I'm sorry.

1 For Latrice Wilson. And that's it.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Time and distance.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by

5 Board Member Gronauer. Do we have a second?

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

7 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have a
9 second by Board Member Nixon. Discussion on the motion?

10 Seeing none, all in favor, signify by saying
11 "aye."

12 (Board members said "aye.")

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Those opposed, "nay."

14 It looks like it passes unanimously.

15 Ms. Wilson, you will be getting your work card.

16 MS. WILSON: Oh, thank you so much. Thank you
17 all.

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Congratulations.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 51, Brian Allen.
20 Bryant Allen.

21 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Allen?

22 Not present.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 52. No. No,
24 that's right, 52 is resolved.

25 53, Meisha Hester.

1 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Chair, for the record, I
2 believe, she needs to be sworn.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

4 MS. HESTER: Good afternoon.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good afternoon.

6 MS. BORDELOVE: Please raise your right hand.
7 Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth, and
8 nothing but the truth?

9 MS. HESTER: I do.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Investigator Saladino.

11 MR. SALADINO: Oh, actually, I believe, this is
12 going to be Investigator Mahan in the north.

13 MR. MAHAN: Investigator Mahan in the north.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Oh, okay.

15 MR. MAHAN: So Mrs. Hester's criminal history
16 commenced on or about 1994, and her most recent arrest
17 was in 2017. Ms. Hester excluded and did not disclose
18 any of these arrests.

19 MS. HESTER: He said I did not disclose?

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Ms. Hester,
21 could you explain to us the arrests and particularly why
22 you did not disclose.

23 MS. HESTER: I thought I did disclose. Do you
24 guys have my paperwork?

25 MR. SALADINO: We'll have it in a second.

1 MS. HESTER: Oh, okay. To my knowledge, I did
2 disclose. I even put that it was expunged, but the
3 gentlemen told me that it was still coming up as a
4 felony.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Well, at least
6 explain to us what this series of arrests are.

7 MS. HESTER: Well, in '94, in '94, does it tell
8 you where? '94, I think, I had Santa Barbara and L.A.
9 County. No, I think, '94 is Santa Barbara. Is that
10 correct?

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: You're telling the
12 story.

13 MS. HESTER: It's been awhile, so I'm not
14 exactly sure what you're looking at.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Just tell us the
16 circumstances of that. All we show is California. So
17 it's kind of tough for us to -- you take us through the
18 roadmap.

19 MS. HESTER: Well, back then, I think, that was
20 Santa Barbara County. It was a -- it should have been a
21 burglary from a mall. We had a young lady, friends of
22 mine knew a young lady who'd shoplift or boost, and he
23 paid her cash for the clothes. And then the young lady
24 got caught. And she told them that she was stealing the
25 clothes for us. And they took us unsuccessfully back

1 in.

2 I received -- I think, I did a couple of days
3 and received a couple of years probation. I eventually
4 got it expunged. So I'm thinking that's what you guys
5 are looking at from '94.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Okay. That
7 explains '94. What about '97 and then 2000?

8 MS. HESTER: '97, gosh, I'm trying to
9 remember. '97.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: It said something about
11 conspiracy to commit a crime, possession of cocaine.

12 MS. HESTER: Oh, that was L.A, L.A. County,
13 correct? I had a possession of sales charge from
14 Los Angeles. I was dealing with a gentleman. We were
15 downtown Los Angeles. I had on his jacket at the time.
16 And when the police came, I remembered that he had some
17 stuff in his jacket pocket. And I got caught with that
18 stuff. I tried to throw it, but the officer found it.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. What
20 about -- we have the petty theft in 2001. We have
21 transporting and selling narcotics, controlled substance
22 in 2003.

23 MS. HESTER: Actually, that was a little while
24 back, so the dates are kind of jumbly. But the petty
25 theft is what I was thinking of in Santa Barbara. I'm

1 not sure what '94 was.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Any questions
3 from the Board? Board Member Flynn?

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah, I've got a couple.
5 Let's talk about your most recent one, so you
6 don't have to try to remember back years ago. Driving
7 on a suspended license, DUI, last year.

8 MS. HESTER: Last year? My DUI should have
9 been 2010.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Right. But it says you
11 were driving on a suspended license.

12 MS. HESTER: Oh, that, yes, that was unpaid
13 fines, actually, going back and forth to work still.
14 I've always lived one place and commuted to another
15 place. So I was driving without my license due to
16 unpaid tickets. But I do currently -- I've taken care
17 of all that stuff and had my license back for over a
18 year.

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: How long have you been
20 living in Nevada?

21 MS. HESTER: A few months.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. Are you employed
23 currently?

24 MS. HESTER: Yes. I work for Amazon. And
25 prior to that, I was always employed. I was doing home

1 healthcare for elderly people for the last few years
2 before moving here.

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. So you -- I want to
4 understand. You said that you did disclose all these?

5 MS. HESTER: To my knowledge, yes. I wrote a
6 few things on my paperwork. I told them about it. They
7 said that they had would come up. When they denied the
8 card, and I asked the gentleman about it, he said that
9 my -- I said this should have been expunged. But he
10 said they were still coming up as a felony and that I
11 could seal it.

12 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. Mr. Chair,
13 could I address the investigator?

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Actually, I was going
15 to ask the investigator to come up to the microphone,
16 because he has an explanation on the disclosure.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah, and I also wanted to
18 ask him. There's -- on the paperwork here, it also says
19 that she made a false statement as a matter of fact,
20 besides the failure to disclose. So I'd like him to
21 cover both of those issues.

22 MR. MAHAN: Well, for clarity, she did disclose
23 four arrests. However, they did not coincide with
24 actual arrests. She listed, in 2010, a drunk driving
25 arrest; in 2003, a petty theft arrest. In 2013 to '16,

1 she wasn't sure. She wrote a traffic violation and
2 cited she was not arrested.

3 And then there was no action taken on a fraud
4 in 2005. The fraud was for welfare scams, and she was
5 ultimately convicted for that. She was arrested in 2000
6 on the other charges not listed. And in 2017, she did
7 not list that, either.

8 So it was a mishmash of dates that she tried to
9 put together that did not coincide with her actual
10 criminal history.

11 MS. HESTER: I didn't have it in front of me,
12 and I told the gentleman I wasn't definite on the dates,
13 so he told me to just do the best that I could.

14 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. And then what about
15 the false statement of material fact?

16 MR. MAHAN: That was involved. She gave, she
17 had two accounts of that, with providing false
18 information to law enforcement officers at the time of
19 arrest.

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Oh, okay. That's not a
21 false statement type. It says here false statement of
22 material fact on the application. It's checked. Maybe
23 you didn't check it. But it's coming up on mine that it
24 was checked.

25 MR. MAHAN: Oh, I see.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And in the past, that
2 normally has been reserved for a fraudulent name,
3 fraudulent address, fraudulent Social Security number.

4 MR. MAHAN: I think, I may have marked that not
5 knowing the material that she falsely presented.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

7 MS. HESTER: And, yeah, I do recall that. When
8 I got pulled over, I was nervous, I was trying to give
9 the officer everything.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Do you guys have
11 something?

12 MR. SALADINO: No, that was --

13 MS. IRIZARRY: He has it.

14 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. I'm done.
15 Thank you.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

17 Board Member Nixon?

18 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: And these are, I think,
19 somewhat recent or within the last couple of years. Why
20 is there confusion on the dates?

21 MS. HESTER: Well, the most -- really,
22 actually, the 2017, I don't have a DUI from 2017. I
23 have one DUI, and that was from 2010, and everything was
24 completed with that. They wouldn't have given -- I
25 haven't had to do any other.

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: The driving on a suspended
2 license.

3 MS. HESTER: That, definitely I was pulled
4 over, actually while I was on my way to work. That's
5 how I initiated getting my license fixed and all that
6 stuff, because the officer did take me in and cited me
7 and released me with court dates. And I just made dates
8 for all of my stuff, to take care of everything and to
9 receive my license back. So those are my -- that was
10 the traffic information, but I wasn't sure on the dates.
11 I didn't have it in front of me.

12 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: How much jail time did you
13 do altogether, with all these?

14 MS. HESTER: I haven't even, never done a year.
15 I haven't even ever done six months. It was always
16 spaced out a couple days here and there. I have proof
17 of two expungements that should exist; but, I guess,
18 they're not showing up.

19 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. Thank you.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir.

22 Ms. Hester, do you have a driver's license now?

23 MS. HESTER: Yes, sir.

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: How long have you lived in
25 Nevada?

1 MS. HESTER: I'm been in Nevada since July.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Since July?

3 MS. HESTER: M-hm (affirmative).

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What state is your
5 license issued?

6 MS. HESTER: (Looking.) I received my license
7 back -- what is it? 8-29 of 2017.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Is that a Nevada
9 license?

10 MS. HESTER: Oh, no. I haven't switched my
11 license over since I got here.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: That would be since
13 July?

14 MS. HESTER: Yes.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you.

16 MS. HESTER: M-hm (affirmative).

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

18 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes.

19 When was the DUI that you had your license
20 suspended for, when did that occur?

21 MS. HESTER: 2010.

22 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: 2010?

23 MS. HESTER: Yes, sir.

24 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: And so you were driving
25 with no license from 2010 through 2017?

1 MS. HESTER: Off and on. I didn't drive the
2 entire time. But off and on, here and there, I was
3 guilty of driving without my license, yes, sir. And
4 before, it wasn't -- before that, I had tickets for
5 driving without my license, but it wasn't from like
6 drinking or nothing like that. It was just unpaid
7 tickets that I couldn't afford to pay at the time, that
8 had actually suspended my license in the first place.

9 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Okay. Thank you.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Any other
11 questions from the Board?

12 Seeing none, I would accept a motion.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer.
14 My motion would be for denial, Meisha Hester.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
16 to uphold the denial by Board Member Gronauer. Do we
17 have a second?

18 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second by
20 Board Member Colbert. Discussion on the motion?

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah, it's Ray Flynn.

22 So that you understand, it's not necessarily --
23 I mean you've got a past, there's no doubt about it.
24 But your most recent arrest is 2017.

25 MS. HESTER: That says DUI. They wouldn't have

1 given me my license if I had a DUI from 2017. I don't
2 have a DUI from 2017.

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. What I hear, that
4 you were arrested in 2017.

5 MS. HESTER: For driving without my license,
6 right.

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Driving on a suspended
8 license.

9 MS. HESTER: Yes.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Let me finish. That is
11 why I'm supporting this motion. You've been here most
12 of the morning. We look at time and distance and what
13 people have done. It's barely been a little over a
14 year. And that's besides the fact of your failure to
15 disclose some of these. It doesn't mean you can't come
16 back in a year.

17 And another thing that you need to be aware of
18 is you are violation of the law right now. The State of
19 Nevada requires you to get a Nevada driver's license
20 within 45 days of residency.

21 MS. HESTER: Well, I wasn't a permanent
22 resident.

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. We're not -- just
24 you're living here. You're getting a paycheck.
25 You're -- correct?

1 MS. HESTER: Just recently, though. But, yes.

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. I'm done,
3 Mr. Chair.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes. All right. We
5 have a motion and a second. Is there any further
6 discussion?

7 Just from my perspective, I'm going to support
8 the motion to recency and the confusion on
9 nondisclosure. I think, disclosure is very important,
10 particularly not necessarily of just arrests, but also
11 convictions. And so I think that is impacting my
12 decision. So I will support the motion.

13 All in favor of the motion, signify by saying
14 "aye."

15 (Board members said "aye.")

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

17 The motion passes unanimously. Ma'am, you can
18 come back in a year and apply again.

19 MS. HESTER: Okay. Thank you.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 54, Dallas Roe.
21 Okay. Investigator, do you want to tell us
22 what we have?

23 MR. MAHAN: Mr. Roe has a substantial criminal
24 history he failed to disclose. The charges he failed to
25 disclose include indecent exposures on multiple

1 accounts, harassing and intimidating phone calls of a
2 sexual nature, and attempted arson and criminal
3 mischief.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And how far back do
5 these go?

6 MR. MAHAN: Quite a ways back. 1982, I
7 believe, was his first harassment by communication
8 charge.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And then the most
10 recent?

11 MR. MAHAN: His most recent was two thousand --
12 looks like 1995.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: 1995.

14 MR. MAHAN: I think, there were some other ones
15 after that, but. 2006, fleeing to elude a police
16 officer, that was his most recent.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Mr. Roe, would
18 you please explain what all of this is about.

19 MR. ROE: Well, I know, when I was living in
20 Pittsburgh, of course, I get -- I get nervous, you know,
21 when I see police officers around. And that's all. I
22 just don't know what to say, you know.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Why, why didn't
24 you disclose any of these arrests?

25 MR. ROE: Excuse me, sir?

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Why did you not
2 disclose, and why did you not put these on your
3 application at the time you filled out your application?
4 Why didn't you tell about the arrests?

5 MR. ROE: I thought, because it was -- when
6 they said on the application that have you ever been
7 arrested after a certain amount of time, I said no.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

9 MS. SWANSON: Can I say something first?

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes. Would you
11 identify yourself, please.

12 MS. SWANSON: Yes. My name is Susan Swanson.
13 I am his cousin. He's lived here in Nevada for eight
14 months. He's been working for me at Broadway West. He
15 has been a model citizen. He has a letter here from his
16 brother, who is a major in the Air Force. He's from a
17 military family. He's very disciplined. He didn't
18 remember it. Age 16, has had open-heart surgery. For
19 lack of blood going to his brain, he didn't understand
20 some of the things that were being brought up.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.
22 Thank you.

23 MS. SWANSON: So he did not remember.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you for
25 your explanation.

1 Questions from the Board. Board Member Flynn?

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: For the investigator, you
3 made mention his last arrest was 2006?

4 MR. MAHAN: Yes, sir.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I don't have that. I
6 don't have that on the paperwork here. What do you know
7 about it, what can you tell me?

8 MR. MAHAN: Well, that was my failure to put
9 that on the denial report. But it was 2006 out of LVSCA
10 "can-pita," fleeing to elude a police officer. And the
11 outcome was unknown at that time, but he was arrested.

12 MR. ROE: I don't know what LVSC means.

13 MR. MAHAN: Pittsburg, like it was out of
14 Pittsburg.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: It was out of
16 Pittsburg.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Oh, it was out of
18 Pittsburg.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: That's part of their
20 border patrol.

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. These, you've had
22 some serious charges in your life. And I know you know
23 that. I don't mean to put you on the spot. But if
24 you've been sitting here most of the morning, then you
25 know how this Board feels about failure to disclose.

1 And the fact that you didn't disclose, especially the
2 things here involving young children.

3 So why don't you try again and explain to me
4 why you didn't disclose.

5 MR. ROE: What's that, sir?

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Why didn't you put on your
7 paperwork that you'd had these arrests?

8 MR. ROE: Because I thought that they were --
9 because they were so far back. I thought it really
10 didn't matter and, you know.

11 MS. SWANSON: Did you remember?

12 MR. ROE: No.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. I have nothing
14 further.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

16 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I have nothing.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir. Can I ask
19 the investigator a question, please?

20 It says on here, again, this has made a false
21 statement of material fact on the application. Well,
22 where, how did that come about?

23 MR. MAHAN: On his denial report?

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes.

25 MR. MAHAN: It might have been just through the

1 failed to the disclose. I don't have any particular
2 evidence behind that.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. I didn't know if
4 it was something on the application other than the
5 failure. So thank you.

6 MR. MAHAN: Yes, sir.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Anything else?

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Not from me, sir.

9 Thank you.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

11 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes, I have some.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

13 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Roe, do you recall
14 the 2006 arrest?

15 MR. ROE: No, sir, I don't.

16 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: All right. Thank you.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Any other
18 questions from the Board?

19 Seeing none, I would accept a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I move that we uphold
21 Dallas Roe's denial.

22 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion by
24 Board Member Nixon to uphold the denial and a second by
25 Board Member Colbert. Any discussion on the motion?

1 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
2 signify by saying "aye."

3 (Board members said "aye.")

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

5 Mr. Roe, your denial of your work card has been
6 upheld. You may come back and reapply in one year.

7 MR. ROE: Yes, sir.

8 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Good luck to you. Thank
9 you.

10 MS. SWANSON: Thank you.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I'm going to -- how
12 about we take a bio break for about 10 minutes, and then
13 come back and start with number 55.

14 * * * * *

15 (A break was taken, 1:29 to 1:41 p.m.)

16 * * * * *

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Let's move
18 along to number 55, Robert Scott.

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Scott.

20 MR. SCOTT: Here.

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good afternoon.

22 MR. SCOTT: Good afternoon, too.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Investigator.

24 MR. MAHAN: Mr. Scott has been arrested for
25 battery and assault. His most recent arrest for battery

1 was October 4, 2016, which resulted in arrest warrants
2 being issued. He was also arrested for felony drug
3 possession, which was later reduced in severity.

4 He currently -- well, scratch that. He doesn't
5 have any active warrants at this time. But he did not
6 disclose any of these on his PILB application.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Mr. Scott, could you
8 explain the arrests and why you did not disclose.

9 MR. SCOTT: The first arrest was a crime of
10 opportunity. Somebody asked if I could make some money
11 doing that.

12 The assault and battery charge, there was a
13 gentleman, tried to take my dog. We had altercation
14 about it. He ended up calling the police, and I didn't,
15 because he didn't get my dog. And the police said
16 because he called and I didn't, in the court proceeding,
17 they told me it was just easier to plead out. It was a
18 misdemeanor. It wasn't a felony.

19 And the reason I didn't write either one of
20 those on the paper was this is my second attempt at
21 coming to the group. I put it down on the first
22 application. And that's where they told me to reapply.
23 Once it was finalized, the finalization for the battery
24 was a week after the initial review board. And they
25 told me they couldn't issue it to me at that time

1 because the case was still open.

2 Now that it's closed, I reapplied. I didn't
3 think -- they asked me if I had been arrested on
4 anything new. I didn't put down anything, because the
5 previous application, it was already on it. And I did
6 submit that I did have a traffic ticket. But, no,
7 nothing new, nothing current as far as being arrested.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So if I'm to understand
9 correctly, you're saying that the reason you didn't put
10 them down on this is because you had already disclosed
11 them previously?

12 MR. SCOTT: I put them down on the first
13 application. Yes.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board questions.
15 Board Member Colbert?

16 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes.

17 So you had listed the September 2018 warrant
18 out of Vegas there, on your other one?

19 MR. SCOTT: No, I didn't know about it. I was
20 informed about it and went and got it taken care of for
21 the review today. That warrant was for a traffic
22 citation from a 2007 that I was unaware of.

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: So you weren't arrested
24 for the warrant?

25 MR. SCOTT: No, I wasn't arrested.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: You found out about the
2 warrant going through this process?

3 MR. SCOTT: Yes.

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: So you went down and took
5 care of it? Okay.

6 MR. SCOTT: And I went down and took care of
7 it, and they told they that I was warrant-free at that
8 point.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: That's a good term.

10 MR. SCOTT: I liked it. Yes, this was last
11 week.

12 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. So during
14 the Board's investigation, the warrant was discovered,
15 and so as a result of finding out there was a warrant
16 out there, you went down and took care of it?

17 MR. SCOTT: Yes.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yeah, I seem to
19 remember. Okay.

20 Any other questions?

21 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yes.

22 So do you currently have proof of insurance for
23 your vehicle?

24 MR. SCOTT: No, I'm without a vehicle right
25 now, and license. I have no job, so. Well, I'm working

1 with a temp service. It's not enough to afford a car.

2 I have no insurance, I have no car.

3 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Okay. Thank you.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Board --

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Chair, I've got a
6 question for staff.

7 Just whosever's got this, remind me when we met
8 last with this gentleman. Oh. Remind me when we met
9 with this gentlemen last and what we asked.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: It was at our last
11 meeting.

12 MR. SCOTT: At the previous reversal, last
13 year.

14 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: So it was three months
15 ago?

16 MS. IRIZARRY: No.

17 MR. SCOTT: No. Last year. It was a year ago.

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: It was a year ago.

19 MR. SCOTT: Yes.

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And what did we ask?

21 MS. IRIZARRY: He's here to reapply. I'm not
22 sure exactly what they asked for.

23 MR. SCOTT: You asked me to --

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. Well, since
25 staff doesn't remember, what do you remember?

1 MR. SCOTT: I remember you guys said that I
2 would be denied because the case was still open. The
3 court date for the case was a week after the review
4 board's date, and it was still open.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I do remember that. Okay.
6 I'm good.

7 MR. SCOTT: Open.

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I remember. Thank you.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes, me, too.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I'm clear. It took me a
11 while to get there, but I'm clear.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Board
13 Member Nixon, do you have any questions?

14 MR. SCOTT: Mission accomplished.

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I guess, I just want to
16 confirm, all of this stuff was previously listed on his
17 first application?

18 MS. IRIZARRY: His first app was just reapplied
19 for.

20 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Right, but the first one
21 was --

22 MS. IRIZARRY: Yes.

23 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. Thank you.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer,
25 do you have any questions?

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yes, sir.

2 Mr. Scott, you don't have a vehicle, so you
3 don't have to worry about car insurance. Do you have a
4 driver's license?

5 MR. SCOTT: Not a -- Maryland one, I had a
6 Maryland license, but I had to turn it in for a Nevada
7 ID.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You had to turn it in?

9 MR. SCOTT: Yes.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. So you have no
11 license now?

12 MR. SCOTT: No, no driver's license, but I have
13 a Nevada ID.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And why do you
15 want this work card?

16 MR. SCOTT: I've been doing security for most
17 of my life. Aside from that, I do professional mixed
18 martial arts. It goes hand-in-hand with my profession,
19 or my hopeful profession of being in property
20 management. I'm in school for it now. And so I'm not
21 cut out for telemarketing, anything of that sort. I've
22 been forced to kind of pick up to make ends meet.
23 Security works for me.

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Obviously -- to the
25 investigator, to the chairman, the warrants are taken

1 care of, are satisfied?

2 MR. MAHAN: Yes, they were.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Where do you --
4 how long have you been in Nevada?

5 MR. SCOTT: 2005, 2006. I left for a period,
6 for about two years. I have children, took them back
7 east to see my family. But now we're back out here as
8 far as 2010. So.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. I'm fine.
10 Thank you.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Any other Board
12 questions?

13 All right. Then, I'd accept a motion.

14 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll move to
15 grant the appeal. I do remember this case. He
16 satisfied the issue on the other warrant. He went right
17 down when he found out. And it was a -- the current
18 warrant was for display of a bogus license plate. I
19 think, Board Member Gronauer verified he's not driving.
20 We don't have to worry about that issue anymore.

21 And I believe, I mean he did disclose these on
22 the first app. And I believed his explanation that he
23 felt that he didn't need to do it, since we already had
24 the paperwork.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion

1 to overturn the denial. Do we have a second?

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a second
4 by Board Member Nixon. Any discussion on the motion?

5 All in favor of the motion, signify by saying
6 "aye."

7 (Board members said "aye.")

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed, "nay."

9 It passes unanimously.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Look at that smile.

11 MR. SCOTT: Yeah, I'll be working, I'll go to
12 work for these guys.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I appreciate what you did.
14 And thank you for coming back.

15 MR. SCOTT: Thank you.

16 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Congratulations.

17 MR. SCOTT: I'm really appreciative. Thank
18 you.

19 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Good luck.

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Do a good job.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 56, Annetta
22 Alvarez.

23 MR. INGRAM: Alvarez?

24 Not present.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: She's not there?

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Next.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We'll trail
3 that one.

4 The next one is Jesse Booth.

5 MR. BOOTH: Good afternoon.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good afternoon.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Who has this one?

8 MR. SALADINO: Investigator Saladino.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Investigator
10 Saladino.

11 MR. SALADINO: The applicant was denied for a
12 2003 felony possession of marijuana out of Texas, where
13 he received six years in prison. He did disclose, and
14 was advised of the appeal process at the time of the
15 application.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right.
17 Sir, could you express the arrest. And would you also
18 explain how many years you did in prison.

19 MR. BOOTH: Well, the arrest was I was caught
20 with the marijuana, so I did sign the deal. I did admit
21 that I was wrong. And I was on the I-10 on the way to
22 Atlanta. I'm from California. Young and dumb, thinking
23 that was the best way to making money. But I haven't
24 been in trouble since then, and I've been working ever
25 since then.

1 I did five and a half years on the six-year
2 prison sentence. And I did five more, I did a half,
3 like six months on parole. Which I'd never been in
4 Texas before, but they made me stay there to finish my
5 parole. So, you know. They let me go. I was living in
6 motels and everything, just to keep my parole. But I
7 did complete my parole and everything.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

9 MR. BOOTH: It was just a young and dumb
10 mistake. So that's what it was. I was a very young,
11 stupid dude, made a lot of young mistakes. But I
12 haven't been in trouble since then.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

14 Board questions? Board Member Gronauer?

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir.

16 How long have you been a resident of Nevada?

17 MR. BOOTH: Sir, I've been a resident this time
18 right here, about nine months, eight months, sir, eight
19 or nine months, close to that.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Are you working now?

21 MR. BOOTH: Yes, sir, two jobs. I work for the
22 Aztec Casino. And right now, I'm doing the warehouse
23 work right now for Culvert.

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you.

25 That's all.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

2 Board Member Nixon?

3 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Nothing?

5 Board Member Flynn?

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I'm just curious on this
7 one. How much pot was it?

8 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I was just curious.

9 MR. BOOTH: Yeah, well, see, the thing about it
10 was, when I got out, it was legal, so I was mad, too.
11 But being that I had something, you know, my prior
12 record was so bad, I went ahead and signed it and took
13 it. But it was 55 pounds of weed that would get me
14 \$6,000.

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

16 MR. BOOTH: Cash money.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. I appreciate
18 your honesty. Thanks.

19 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yeah.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

21 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. No
23 additional questions from the Board. I'll accept a
24 motion.

25 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I move --

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I make a
2 motion that we grant Mr. Booth his work, his appeal. We
3 definitely have time and distance. He hasn't been in
4 trouble since. He's been forthcoming before the Board.

5 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So we have a motion by
7 Board Member Flynn and a second by Board Member Colbert.

8 Is that right?

9 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Well, who seconded?

11 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Me, Tammy Nixon.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Second by Board
13 Member Nixon. Discussion on the motion?

14 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
15 signify by saying "aye."

16 (Board members said "aye.")

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

18 The motion passes unanimously. Good luck,
19 Mr. Booth.

20 MR. BOOTH: Thank you very much for making it a
21 lot easier for me. Thank you.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you.

23 Oh, someone's happy back there.

24 MRS. BOOTH: Hi.

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: That's her job. Let's

1 keep the spouses happy.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It's the best thing
3 that happened to you.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Moving on, number 58,
5 Lawrence, Lawrence -- I believe, it's Divetro
6 ("Div-eh-troh")?

7 MR. DIVETRO: "Da-VEE-troh." Good afternoon.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good afternoon.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good afternoon.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Is it, do you pronounce
11 it "Div-eh-troh"?

12 MR. DIVETRO: "Da-VEE-troh."

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: "Da-VEE-troh." Thank
14 you.

15 MR. DIVETRO: Yes. Yes, sir.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Investigator Saladino,
17 your name's on this one, too.

18 MR. SALADINO: Yes, sir. Mr. Divetro was asked
19 to come back after the September Board meeting, with the
20 Henderson police report from the incident from his
21 conviction of burglary and impersonating a peace
22 officer.

23 According to the Henderson Police Department,
24 the applicant entered Sunset Spa, the Sunset Spa with
25 the intent of committing a crime of impersonating a

1 peace officer. The intention was shown. There were a
2 series of similar events at other locations. The
3 applicant did, in fact, show a badge, identify himself
4 as a police officer, placed down the police scanner, and
5 gave every indication that he was a police officer.

6 Due to the fact that the applicant did tell the
7 victim that they were under arrest and unlawfully
8 detained -- unlawfully detained her against her will,
9 the applicant was also charged with second degree
10 kidnapping.

11 The applicant was convicted of burglary and
12 impersonating a peace officer.

13 That was at the request of the Board that we
14 gather the police report from Henderson. There was
15 three other events that had taken place in Henderson,
16 that once the Sunset Spa came forward, Henderson, you
17 know, kind of gathered that that was the MO, and those
18 other events have been closed out.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Mr. Divetro,
20 would you refresh our memory on your account of the
21 events.

22 MR. DIVETRO: I had no, I had no connection
23 with those other. There was three different incidents
24 that happened. There was a couple of other gentlemen
25 impersonating a peace officer with a -- with a loaded

1 weapon. But I wasn't in connection with that.

2 But I do, I have nothing to deny. I was, I was
3 guilty of -- I entered the spa not with the intent to
4 commit a crime. But I was propositioned. And I got --
5 I was under a lot of distress, under a lot of
6 medication.

7 And there's no excuse for what I did. It
8 doesn't matter how it happened. I fixed it, went to a
9 detox program. Two days in the detox program, I had a
10 grand mal seizure, split my head open. I completed a
11 program.

12 Since then, I haven't been in any trouble. Way
13 out of character. It was an unfortunate incident. And
14 I don't expect anybody to understand about what
15 happened. But there is the medical report saying what
16 happened to me, as far as the medication. So I'm not
17 making any excuses. I'm just stating the facts. And I
18 have nothing to deny. Just I apologize for what
19 happened. Never, it was way out of character.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.
21 Board questions? Board Member Colbert?

22 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: No questions?

24 Board Member Gronauer ("Grawn-our"), Gronauer
25 ("Grown-our"?)

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Bobbie G.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: You know --

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Bobby G works.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: You know, the good news
5 is, is that I'm far enough away you can't reach up and
6 slap me, so.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well, as you said
8 earlier, we could agree to disagree.

9 All right. No, I'm good.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board Member
11 Nixon?

12 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I'm good. No questions.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

14 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes.

15 Mr. Divetro, if you remember, I was the one
16 that requested --

17 MR. DIVETRO: Yes.

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: -- that information.

19 MR. DIVETRO: Yes.

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Because I had issues with
21 yours explanation last time.

22 MR. DIVETRO: Okay.

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And what, the police
24 report is significantly different than how you
25 articulated the --

1 MR. DIVETRO: I remember you asked me if I
2 showed a badge. Yes, I did show a badge. But as far as
3 the handcuffs were concerned --

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: We're not in --

5 MR. DIVETRO: I'm sorry. I'm sorry.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. What I'm just
7 saying is that the police version of the report, as well
8 as what you ended up pleading guilty to, is
9 significantly different than what you told us here. And
10 I asked for that report. I would give you the benefit
11 of the doubt. So. And we also have a -- you know, a
12 recency.

13 So I appreciate your coming back. And I
14 appreciate you trying. So we'll see what happens this
15 morning. Or this afternoon. It's been a long day.

16 I'm done.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Any
18 additional questions from the Board?

19 Seeing none, I'd accept a motion.

20 MR. DIVETRO: Could I say something else?

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Chair, the applicant
22 is asking if he may say something.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Of course.

24 MR. DIVETRO: Like I said, I've been trying to
25 turn my life around. And I haven't had a problem since.

1 Like I said, this is the fourth time I've actually been
2 back here, because I -- you told me to come back in a
3 year. I didn't come back in a year. So I came back.
4 Then they told me to come -- there was too much in
5 recency. So I came back again. And now, and they told
6 me to come back again, and now I'm back again.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. I just have a
8 question. When did you complete your probation?

9 MR. DIVETRO: It's kind of a blur, I mean.

10 MR. INGRAM: Investigator Saladino is checking
11 that for you, sir.

12 MR. SALADINO: The order of -- the petition, or
13 the probationary was discharged on 8-26 of '16.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

15 All right. Back to the Board. I will accept a
16 motion.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer. I'll
18 make a motion for denial on Lawrence Divetro's
19 application.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have a
21 motion to uphold the denial. Do I have a second?

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn seconds.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second by
24 Board Member Flynn. Discussion on the motion? I'm
25 going to --

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: If you don't mind,
2 Mr. Chairman, I just -- the police report is what put a
3 lot of weight on and then created me a little more
4 problem than what we had earlier. So that's why my
5 motion is as it is.

6 That's all. Thank you.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you,
8 Mr. Gronauer.

9 I'm going to support the motion. I think, I
10 still think the recency. I think, the explanation. I
11 think, the -- a variety of things. So that.

12 So, with that said, all in favor of the motion,
13 signify by saying "aye."

14 (Board members said "aye.")

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

16 Mr. Divetro, the denial has been upheld.
17 Again, you have the opportunity to come back in a year.
18 I know that's not a good explanation for you, but I'm
19 just saying that that's it.

20 On to item number or agenda item number 59,
21 Mary Tolliver Foster.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Not here.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: She's not there. We'll
24 trail that.

25 Go to item 60, Tonika Garrett?

1 MS. GARRETT: Good afternoon.

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good afternoon to you.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Investigator Saladino,
4 is this you, also?

5 MR. SALADINO: Yes, sir.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right.

7 MR. SALADINO: The applicant was denied for a
8 1996 theft charge that started off as a felony burglary,
9 reduced to theft. There was a 1997 burglary. Another
10 theft in '97. A felony robbery in '04, where they
11 received, where the applicant received 87 days in jail
12 and three years of probation, along with a fine.

13 The applicant had been previously denied and is
14 coming back again to -- you know, a year later. We do
15 have 1203.4 paperwork now for the dismissal of the
16 felony robbery. And that was all provided on this
17 go-round with the application.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: What I see in front of
19 me reflects that she did not disclose any of these in
20 this application?

21 MS. GARRETT: No.

22 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: That's not for --

23 MR. SALADINO: On the notes there, it says she
24 did not list any of the convictions, but did provide
25 court documents when requested. On the next -- yeah,

1 that was my fault there for not putting that in there
2 that they were disclosed on the second go-round.

3 MS. GARRETT: Okay.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

5 MR. SALADINO: And she did provide the 1203.4
6 documents for the felony that was 1203.4 dismissed out
7 of California.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.
9 Thank you, Investigator.

10 Board questions? Board Member Colbert?

11 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: So I just want to clarify
16 that this time around, she did, she did disclose?

17 MR. SALADINO: Yes.

18 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. Thank you.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, we asked her to come
21 back. We asked her to disclose. She was able to get
22 the robbery dismissed. She did what we asked. And she
23 waited a year.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: With no additional
25 questions, I would accept a motion.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. My motion is
2 to grant her appeal.

3 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

4 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Second.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So we have a motion by
6 Board Member Flynn to grant the appeal and a second by
7 Board Member Colbert. Colbert. Maybe I can beat you
8 this time.

9 So, discussion on the motion?

10 My comments is that I concur with Board Member
11 Flynn's observations.

12 With no further discussion, all in favor,
13 signify by saying "aye."

14 (Board members said "aye.")

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

16 It passes unanimously. Ms. Garrett, you will
17 get your work card. Congratulations.

18 MS. GARRETT: Thank you. You guys have a good
19 day.

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Have a good day.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Have a good holiday.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So we'll go to
24 number 61, Nunzio -- I think, it's Guadagni.

25 MR. GUADAGNI: Good afternoon, ladies and

1 gentlemen of the Board.

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: How do you pronounce your
3 last name?

4 MR. GUADAGNI: Excuse me, sir?

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: How do you pronounce your
6 last name?

7 MR. GUADIAGNI: "Wa-dah-nee." The second G is
8 silent.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I'm just going call you
10 Nunzio.

11 MR. GUADAGNI: Sure. Nunzio means messenger.

12 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Chairman, if I may, Nunzio had
13 approached me in the hallway to let me know that if
14 everybody could speak up a little bit during his inquiry
15 here, he would appreciate it. He is a little hard of
16 hearing.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Good. We'll do
18 that.

19 Investigator Saladino, is this yours, also?

20 MR. SALADINO: Yes, sir. The applicant was
21 denied for a 1997 conspiracy to possess a controlled
22 substance, meth, which was a felony. Also, a
23 falsification of a firearm form, which is -- it was also
24 in 1987.

25 The applicant listed both felony convictions.

1 The firearms, falsification of the firearm form ran
2 concurrent with the possession charge. The applicant
3 was released from parole on 5-10 of '92. And he did
4 disclose it. And those were the only arrests on his
5 history.

6 I also received a letter from one our
7 licensees, George B. Barros, license number 2358, that,
8 you know, speaks to his character, on how he's known him
9 for years. He did have the, you know, mishap early on,
10 in ninety -- in '87. And there's been no other
11 situation or arrest with law enforcement moving forward.
12 He also, Mr. Barros also stated, if he was approved for
13 his registered work card, he would have a job for him,
14 with no concerns whatsoever.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you,
16 Investigator.

17 Mr. Guadagni, could you please explain the
18 circumstances of the arrest?

19 MR. GUADAGNI: Excuse me?

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: What happened with the
21 arrest?

22 MR. GUADAGNI: What happened with the arrest?

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: The crime that your
24 committed.

25 MR. GUADAGNI: I was stupid, young. I wanted

1 to be somebody. I got with a bodyguard to an Italian
2 mob guy in San Diego. And then I was his bodyguard.
3 And I got caught. There was a big investigation on him.
4 I didn't even know. If I did, I wouldn't have joined
5 them.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.

8 MR. GUADAGNI: And I made a mistake. But I
9 did -- may I say something, please?

10 I did help the judge, who he used to be the
11 prosecutor, settle the case that he had. He asked me
12 for help, and I had it, I helped him when I was out.
13 When I was done with parole, I was running a
14 single-resident occupancy hotel. And one of my tenants
15 was -- he wanted her to come in with him. She was
16 scared. She didn't want to go anywhere. Because the
17 guy was a gang member. So I told him I would bring her
18 to court. And I did it, I brought her to court, safely,
19 and brought her home. She testified and everything.

20 And he told me, "Whenever you need anything,
21 let me now. I owe you. You did help, a great job."
22 And he told me, "Why, why did you do that? You know
23 you're an ex-con." I said, "You know what, I want to
24 turn my life over."

25 And what saved me really, my twins, my twin

1 girls.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board questions?
3 Board Member Flynn?

4 MR. GUADAGNI: Yes, sir.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Nunzio, how long have you
6 lived in Nevada?

7 MR. GUADAGNI: Excuse me?

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: How long have you lived in
9 Nevada?

10 MR. GUADAGNI: Nevada, since August.

11 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. And what type of
12 employment have you had over the last, say, 10 years?

13 MR. GUADAGNI: I haven't had. I've been
14 staying off welfare.

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. Thank you.

16 MR. GUADAGNI: And my brother, I live with my
17 brother and my mom and dad.

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right.

19 MR. GUADAGNI: I'm trying to prove myself.
20 Like San Diego, I was doing security there. I had a
21 guard card there, in San Diego. And other things out
22 here, it's much better, more money. And me and the
23 mother of my children were not getting along. So I had
24 placed them. I needed to move, couldn't pay rent there.
25 Rent's so high. So I moved out here.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Thank you.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

3 MR. GUADAGNI: And my mom and dad's getting
4 old.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Nothing else.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board Member
7 Nixon?

8 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No questions, sir.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

12 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No questions.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Seeing no additional
14 questions, I'd accept a motion.

15 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I move we
16 grant the appeal, based upon time and distance, no
17 further issues.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion to
19 grant the appeal by Board Member Colbert. Do we have a
20 second?

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I have a second by
23 Board Member Nixon. Any discussion on the motion?

24 Seeing none, all in favor, signify by saying
25 "aye."

1 MR. GUADAGNI: Oh, my God, thank you.

2 (Board members said "aye.")

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Those opposed, "nay."

4 It passes unanimously.

5 MR. GUADAGNI: Thank you very much.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Mr. Guadagni, you have
7 your work card.

8 MR. GUADAGNI: Thank you. Oh, God, Jesus,
9 thank you.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you. Merry
11 Christmas.

12 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Congratulations.

13 MR. GUADAGNI: Thank you. Have a wonderful
14 day.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 62, Sidney
16 Harvey.

17 MR. INGRAM: Harvey is not present.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We'll trail
19 Harvey.

20 Number 64, Christopher Kearney.

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: He's here.

22 MR. KEARNEY: Thank you. Thank you for the
23 opportunity. Thank you, Mr. Chairman and Board.

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Who did you bring with
25 you; is that your spouse?

1 MR. KEARNEY: That's my wife of 26 years.

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. How are you
3 today?

4 MS. KEARNEY: Fine.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Investigator Saladino,
6 I have your name on this one, too.

7 MR. SALADINO: Yes, sir. According to his
8 SCOPE, our local SCOPE, for the background, the
9 applicant is a seven-time convicted felon. He has been
10 arrested 17 times in Nevada, along with 10 citations for
11 possession, trespassing and failing to register with the
12 county as a felon.

13 Now that we have the fingerprint report, most
14 of the convictions -- the one in '92, out of Florida,
15 received a year and a half. The grand theft, another
16 year and a half. They weren't really high prison
17 sentences. But they were felonies nonetheless.

18 His last arrest was in 1996, here in Las Vegas,
19 for possession of drug paraphernalia, which it looks
20 like the courts threw out, as it was denied.

21 Other than that, he's been -- you know, no
22 run-ins with law enforcement.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: The report I'm looking
24 at shows a 2001 arrest.

25 MR. SALADINO: Oh, I'm sorry. Out of Michigan,

1 yes.

2 MR. KEARNEY: '99.

3 MR. SALADINO: There was a '99 possession of
4 cocaine. 2001, larceny, out of Michigan as well.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right. Very
6 good. Thank you, Investigator.

7 Mr. Kearney, would you explain your arrests,
8 arrest history, and.

9 MR. KEARNEY: Mr. Chairman and Board, a long
10 story short, I was an extremely heavy crack-addicted
11 person. I was the person you saw right there on Owens
12 in Las Vegas. I had no sense of direction. I was just,
13 basically, lost in drugs.

14 It took prison, homelessness and God to bring
15 me where I am today. My last conviction was two years,
16 scared me to death. I got out of prison. I went to the
17 V.A. Which I'm honorably discharged. They put me in an
18 extensive program for four years, four long years. It
19 was the best thing that ever happened in my life. I've
20 never looked back since.

21 I've been married for 26 years. My wife and I
22 raised 16 children, who've never been in trouble. And
23 I'm proud of that. That's all I have.

24 I've been working in other states in security,
25 because no one would give me a job here in Nevada. This

1 is my home. My father was in the Air Force. I grew up
2 here. And I came back home. I'm 61 years old. And my
3 wife and I are afraid of -- and just I can't continue to
4 sleep in the car and send my money home. It's just not
5 a life.

6 So I'm asking you, Mr. Chairman and the Board,
7 to allow me to work as a non-armed guard at minimum
8 wage. Thank you.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you, Mr. Kearney.
10 Would your wife like to say anything, or?

11 MRS. KEARNEY: Yes. I just want to say he's
12 been very productive and supportive of our kids and
13 family, and did just recently raise like three
14 grandchildren. And he really has turned his life around
15 tremendously. And I'm very proud of him.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

17 Board questions? Board Member Gronauer?

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, I'm fine.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

20 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I'm good. No questions.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Did you say you helped
23 raise 16, one six, children?

24 MR. KEARNEY: Yes, sir.

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: God bless you.

1 All right. That's it. I'm done.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Board
3 Member Colbert?

4 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. So with no
6 additional questions, I would accept a motion.

7 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I move that
8 we --

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I -- go for
10 it.

11 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Okay. Mr. Chair, I move
12 that we grant the appeal, based upon time and distance
13 and no -- nothing of any recent nature. All this stuff
14 is ancient history just about.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
16 by Board Member Colbert to overturn the appeal. Or
17 excuse me. To overturn the denial. Do we have a
18 second?

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn seconds.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second by
21 Board Member Flynn. Discussion on the motion?

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: We ought to wear an
23 Army hat here. No, it's all good.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: If there's no further
25 discussion, we'll vote on the motion. All in favor of

1 the motion, signify by saying "aye."

2 (Board members said "aye.")

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed, "nay."

4 The motion carries unanimously. Mr. Kearney,
5 you will get your work card. And thank you for your
6 service.

7 MR. KEARNEY: Thank you. Thank you, thank you
8 so much.

9 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Congratulations.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Have a good day.

12 MR. KEARNEY: Yes, sir. Thank you.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 65 is up here in
14 the north, Mr. Perez.

15 Okay. Is this Investigator Saladino again?

16 MR. SALADINO: Yes, sir. The applicant was
17 denied for a 1994 concealed weapon violation, which was
18 a misdemeanor, out of California, where he received
19 three years of probation and 31 days in jail. The
20 applicant did not disclose this misdemeanor conviction.
21 It was found on the fingerprint report.

22 There was also a 1989 theft of personal
23 property, which was a misdemeanor, in California as
24 well, where he received one year probation, one day in
25 jail, and a fine.

1 These were not disclosed on the application.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Anything
3 additional?

4 MR. SALADINO: Nothing additional.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Thank you,
6 Investigator.

7 Mr. Perez, would you explain why you didn't
8 disclose. Number one, explain the arrests. And, number
9 two, why you did not disclose.

10 MR. PEREZ: I didn't disclose it because
11 actually I didn't even remember that being on my record,
12 as far as when I got in trouble with that concealed
13 weapon.

14 And as far as the concealed weapon, I had an
15 issue with my dad. And I forgot that the gun was in the
16 car. And I got pulled over, and they found it and
17 stuff. And I wouldn't have got a ticket if it was
18 showing. I only got a ticket because it was inside the
19 door panel, the pocket of the door panel and stuff, so
20 they considered it a concealed weapon, because they
21 couldn't see it right off the bat.

22 And as far as the theft, that I can remember,
23 it was a box of condoms that I took from a Long's drug
24 store. Basically, that was it on that one. And I got
25 caught with the condoms.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: No arrests since then?

2 MR. PEREZ: No.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And, obviously, you
4 work in security somewhere right now?

5 MR. PEREZ: Silver Legacy.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: At the Silver Legacy?

7 MR. PEREZ: Yes.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Questions from the
9 Board? Board Member Colbert?

10 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Did you do any jail
11 time?

12 MR. PEREZ: I did some jail time, yeah, I did.
13 It was pretty much the 30 days that he's talking about.
14 But, again, it was a long time ago. I just don't
15 remember being in jail that long.

16 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Were you arrested on
17 both of them, or do you know? I mean did you do jail
18 time for each charge?

19 MR. PEREZ: For the gun charge, they did take
20 me into custody. But they let me go with a citation.
21 And as far as the other one, they did take me into
22 custody. So it's one day on each one of them. But when
23 I went to court, they gave me the 30 days.

24 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: And did they confiscate
25 the gun?

1 MR. PEREZ: Yes, they confiscated the gun. It
2 belonged to me. I bought it legally.

3 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Okay. No further.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Questions from
5 the Board. Board Member Gronauer?

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

8 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, sir.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: As you probably heard
12 while you're sitting here, you know, nondisclosure is
13 something that's kind of a big issue with the Board.
14 How long have you been in Nevada?

15 MR. PEREZ: Since '96.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Since '96?

17 MR. PEREZ: Yes.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And you've been working
19 security since then, or what?

20 MR. PEREZ: I started in security in 2009, and
21 then to the present date. And before that, I was a
22 press operator for a printing press.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Any
24 additional questions?

25 Seeing none, I'd accept a motion.

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I move that we uphold the
2 denial due to lack of disclosure.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion to
4 uphold the denial due to lack of disclosure. Do I have
5 a second for that?

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll second.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Second by Board Member
8 Gronauer. Discussion on the motion?

9 Seeing none, we'll vote on the motion. All in
10 favor of the motion, signify by saying "aye."

11 (Board members said "aye.")

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Those opposed? Nay.

13 So it passes four-one on the denial. You're
14 welcome to apply in another year.

15 MR. PEREZ: Okay.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And if you do apply, if
17 you choose to reapply, make sure you disclose any
18 arrests that you've had.

19 MR. PEREZ: Okay.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Number 66,
21 Corey Powns.

22 MR. POWNS: Good afternoon, everyone.

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good afternoon.

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good afternoon.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Investigator Saladino?

1 MR. SALADINO: Yes, sir. The applicant was
2 denied for a 2009 possession of a firearm, which was a
3 misdemeanor out of California. The applicant did
4 receive one year probation and was told to stay out of
5 trouble for four months. He did disclose this
6 conviction. And the one-year probation and four months
7 was verified on the fingerprint report.

8 At the time of the denial, I was awaiting the
9 fingerprint report. Since getting it, it does show the
10 one-year probation, four months stay out of trouble.
11 And, again, this was disclosed. That was the only
12 arrest on the applicant's arrest history, and that was
13 the 2009.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you,
15 Investigator. And the denial was based on the firearm
16 violation?

17 MR. SALADINO: Correct.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

19 All right. Mr. Powns, would you explain the
20 arrest and the circumstances around it.

21 MR. POWNS: At the time, I was 19 years old,
22 fresh out of high school. I graduated at 17. My son
23 got incarcerated -- not incarcerated. Sorry about that.
24 My son got taken by the Department of Social Services,
25 so I was going through a hard time. I was a single

1 father, and he was three years old.

2 It was a lot of partying. I guess, I was one
3 of the only ones with no record. I got stuck with it.
4 And just by getting out, trying to gain custody of my
5 son, I jumped on my first few and didn't know the
6 system. So there was no probation. I didn't have to
7 check in with anybody.

8 I stuck with school. A lot of sweatshops. I
9 moved me and my mother to Nevada a year and a half ago.
10 I worked at Walmart last year out here.

11 I'm just trying to better myself to show my
12 three sons now. I have two sons that were born in
13 Nevada, that I just had last year and this year. I'm
14 just trying to be a better man in life now, you know,
15 being married. I really got to look at things, I guess,
16 so. I'm just changing me. It was so long ago, I'm
17 surprised I still remember it, so.

18 Other than that, it was one young mistake. And
19 I grew up in Watts, so, worst area you can find in L.A.
20 So not my fault, but my apologies.

21 That's about it.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board questions? Board
23 Member Nixon?

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Colbert?

5 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No, sir.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: With no additional
7 questions, I'd accept a motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. I'll make a
9 motion for the denial to be reversed on Mr. Powns.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion for
11 the denial to be, well, reversed or overturned. Do I
12 have a second?

13 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

14 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Second.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second by
16 Board Member Colbert. Any discussion on the motion?

17 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
18 signify by saying "aye."

19 (Board members said "aye.")

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

21 It passes unanimously. Mr. Powns, you will get
22 your work card.

23 MR. POWNS: Thank you, sir.

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you.

25 MR. POWNS: Thank you.

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Congratulations.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 67. I'm going
3 to try this, and I'll see if I'm successful. It looks
4 like Lui Taulua.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Not here.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I went to all that work
7 and he's not there?

8 All right. Number 68, Barry Williams.

9 MR. WILLIAMS: Good evening.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good evening. I'll go
11 with that, I'll go with that one.

12 MR. SALADINO: Mr. Chairman, Investigator
13 Saladino again.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

15 MR. SALADINO: The applicant was denied for a
16 1999 possession of a concealed weapon. It was a
17 misdemeanor. He did pay a fine for it. Or was supposed
18 to pay a fine for it. The second charge that you see
19 there, September 27th of the '98, that possession charge
20 was the same one. The first one had gone to a warrant,
21 and then he had to do the 60 days in jail. The
22 applicant did list this on his application. And that's
23 why we're here today.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Thank you,
25 Investigator.

1 Mr. Williams, will you explain the arrest, and.

2 MR. WILLIAMS: At the time -- and I also want
3 to say, you said '99. It was '96.

4 MR. SALADINO: I'm sorry. '96.

5 MR. WILLIAMS: Right. I was young, misled, no
6 direction. And I don't know what to say other than I
7 got to take responsibility for it, you know. I'm not
8 that person anymore. I tried to stay out of trouble as
9 much as I can.

10 Since then, I've been a single father for seven
11 years. I've watched three children graduate high
12 school. And my son is now in Jamestown, North Dakota,
13 on a football scholarship, and he just got honorable
14 mention for the GPAC division for wide receiver this
15 year.

16 So the person you see on paper and the person
17 you see now are two separate people. And I've learned.
18 And I've moved on. And I'm trying to find some kind of
19 work that works with me. You know, I did construction
20 and demolition and stuff like that. It's too bad for my
21 knees now, you know. I'm old, so. So, you know. I got
22 to need something that's more accommodating for me.
23 And, I think, the security position would help me out in
24 a big way.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.

1 Questions from the Board? Board Member
2 Colbert?

3 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

7 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, that's going to be an
10 easy one.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Seeing no
12 questions, I'd accept a motion.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll make a
14 motion to grant the applicant his appeal.

15 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Second.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So we have a motion to
17 grant the appeal by Board Member Flynn and a second by
18 Board Member Colbert. Discussion on the motion?

19 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
20 signify by saying "aye."

21 (Board members said "aye.")

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed, "no."

23 It passes unanimously. Congratulations,
24 Mr. Williams.

25 MR. WILLIAMS: Thank you.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Have a good day.

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Congratulations.

3 MR. WILLIAMS: Thank you. Appreciate it.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good luck to your kids,
5 too, sir.

6 MR. WILLIAMS: Thank you. Appreciate it.

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: You're assuming we're
8 going to call you. I'm done, I'm done for the day. I'm
9 going to ask you to continue for three months.

10 (Board Member Nixon left the meeting room.)

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 69, Charles
12 Yates.

13 I guess --

14 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Chairman, the last name starts
15 with a Y, but.

16 MR. YATES: Yes, sir.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: We should reverse.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. I guess --

19 MR. SALADINO: Yes, Mr. Chair, it's
20 Investigator Saladino again.

21 The applicant was denied for a 2004 bank fraud,
22 which was a felony. The applicant did report it on his
23 application at the time he filled out his application.
24 At the time the denial went through, I did not have the
25 fingerprint reports. But now I have the fingerprint

1 report. And the applicant received 36 months of
2 probation, had to pay a restitution of \$9,750.35. And
3 there was a \$100 assessment for the court fees and
4 whatnot attached to it as well. Everything has been
5 completed for the courts.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Mr. Yates, could
7 you explain what the circumstances were.

8 MR. YATES: Yes, sir. Unfortunately, it's the
9 case made here today about being young and dumb. At the
10 time, my mother's household was under foreclosure. She
11 was on a third mortgage. And I couldn't think of any
12 other way to get the money, a regular job. So I was
13 just being young and stupid in trying to help her, yeah.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So how did you get the
15 money?

16 MR. YATES: How did I get the money? I got
17 police. No, I didn't get the money. My older brother,
18 he actually stepped in. And to this day, he still owns
19 the house.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Questions from
21 the Board. Board Member Flynn?

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board member Gronauer?

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah, I'm a little bit
25 lost. Because that was a good question about the money.

1 The answer, wait a minute, you had to pay back \$9,000.

2 MR. YATES: Oh that. Right after that -- it's
3 funny, it takes you getting in trouble to actually do
4 the right thing. For me, the right, that I started
5 working at Circuit City. And I got a second job. I was
6 Dave Chapelle's bodyguard for Chapelle Season 2.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you. I'm good.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board Member
9 Colbert?

10 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: No.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I must have missed
12 something. I still -- what was the bank fraud? I
13 guess, that's what I'm trying to nail down.

14 MR. YATES: It was check fraud. It was check
15 fraud. So I gave someone a fake check, and they went
16 into a bank and they deposited it. They got to court,
17 well, the bank teller got to court, and she told on the
18 guy, and the guy told on me.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. That clears it
20 up for me.

21 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Yeah.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Was it a one-time
23 occurrence, or was there a series of checks?

24 MR. YATES: Of course, one time. No, one time.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. That

1 answers my questions. Any additional questions from the
2 Board?

3 Seeing none -- and you made a note that Board
4 Member Nixon has stepped away?

5 THE REPORTER: Yes, I did.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.

7 That said, I'd accept a motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I'd move that
9 we grant the appeal, based upon time and distance and no
10 further charges.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: There's been a motion
12 by --

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll second it.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: -- Board Member
15 Colbert, with a second by Board Member Gronauer, to
16 approve the appeal. Any discussion on the motion?

17 All in favor of the motion, signify by saying
18 "aye."

19 (Board members said "aye.")

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any opposed?

21 It passes unanimously with four votes.

22 MR. YATES: Thank you.

23 (Board Member Nixon returned to the meeting
24 room.)

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Chair, I know we've
2 got a lot of trailing, but there is nobody in the
3 audience here. I don't know if you have any up north,
4 but.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: No, we have no one up
6 north.

7 MR. INGRAM: I have one other item. Item
8 number 34 had to leave. He did request his appeal be
9 delayed until the March Board meeting. And that's for
10 Grefford G. Dixon.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Do we need a motion to
12 grant that request to the next -- we don't need a
13 motion?

14 MS. BORDELOVE: No.

15 MR. INGRAM: No.

16 MS. BORDELOVE: No, because that was at his
17 request.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. So, Mr. Ingram,
19 can you go --

20 MR. INGRAM: Would you like me to read into the
21 record the ones that are trailed?

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yeah, would you go
23 through the ones that you have as being trailed.

24 MR. INGRAM: Yes, sir. So, item number 33,
25 Artice O. Barlow; and, again, he's not present.

1 Item number 36, Jovani S. Fulton.

2 Item number 39, Lisa R. Priola.

3 Item number 40, Charles A. Reynolds.

4 Item 43, Bruce A. Willis.

5 Item number 51, Bryant Allen.

6 Item number 56, Annetta Alvarez.

7 Item number 59, Mary Tolliver Foster.

8 Item number 62, Sidney Harvey.

9 Item number 67, Lui Taulua. You did better
10 than I did on that one. Taulua.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I would accept a motion
12 to uphold the denial on all of those.

13 BOARD MEMBER COLBERT: Mr. Chair, I'd move that
14 we deny those.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have a
16 motion to deny all of those.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn seconds.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. By Board Member
19 Colbert, with a second by Board Member Flynn.

20 Discussion on the motion?

21 All in favor, signify by saying "aye."

22 (Board members said "aye.")

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And you made a note
24 that Board Member Nixon is back?

25 THE REPORTER: I did.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

2 Okay. At this point, we go to Other Business,
3 item number 70, Board comment and future agenda items.

4 Is there anything I should remember on this
5 one, Director Ingram?

6 MR. INGRAM: I forgot. I think, we're good.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Then, it's,
8 obviously, item number 71, public comment.

9 Do we have any public down there?

10 MR. INGRAM: No public.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have
12 none up here.

13 So do we -- just for my edification, do we need
14 an actual motion for adjournment, or we can just
15 adjourn?

16 MS. BORDELOVE: No.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. First off --

18 MS. BORDELOVE: You can adjourn. You don't
19 have to make a motion. Robert Rules of Order require a
20 motion. But you have nothing requiring you to use
21 Robert's Rules of Order. A lot of people just do. But
22 it's not required.

23 MR. INGRAM: Non-Robert.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Before we adjourn, I
25 really want to thank staff for their preparation and

1 preparing us and providing us with the paperwork, too,
2 so that we can have a coherent conversation here. So I
3 really do appreciate it.

4 And wish everyone a merry Christmas.

5 We're adjourned.

6 Whoa, whoa, wait (used gavel).
