5 2019 Private Investigators Licensing Board to order.

6 The first item of business, roll call of Board
7 members.

8 MR. INGRAM: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

9 Chair Nadeau?

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Here.

11 MR. INGRAM: Board Member Flynn?

12 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Here.

13 MR. INGRAM: Board Member Nixon?

14 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Here.

15 MR. INGRAM: Board Member Gronauer?

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Here.

17 MR. INGRAM: We do have a quorum.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

19 All right. Let's open it up for public
20 comment. Do we have any public, anyone from the public
21 that wishes to speak from the south?

22 Public comment can be comment on matters
23 appears on the agenda and/or other matters not appearing
24 on the agenda that the public would like to bring to the
25 attention of the Board. The Board may not discuss the

1 matters not appearing on the agenda, and may not act on
2 matters not on the agenda and will not be scheduled on a
3 future agenda. Public comments, then, are limited to
4 five minutes per person at the discretion of the Chair
5 and will not be restricted according to viewpoint.

6 Do we have anyone in the south that they have
7 public comment, anyone?

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No.

9 MR. INGRAM: I see none.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So I went through all
11 that for nothing?

12 All right. So the Board, the Executive
13 Director announcements, reports and updates.

14 MR. INGRAM: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

15 There's two items here that I'd like to cover.
16 First of all, I provided the financial report to the
17 Board. If you have any questions, I'd be happy to
18 answer those.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any questions of any of
20 the --

21 MR. INGRAM: We're on track to carry -- I'm
22 sorry.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any questions of the
24 Board members regarding the financial report?

25 Seeing none.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None down here.

2 MR. INGRAM: We are on track to have the amount
3 carried over required by statute to establish our budget
4 starting July 1. The budget will be completed next week
5 once the new fringe assessments are sent to us from the
6 Budget Division. And so we'll have a new budget for you
7 at the next Board meeting.

8 The second item, I'd like Chief of Operations
9 Lori Irizarry to go over our recent statistics for this
10 last quarter.

11 MS. IRIZARRY: Good morning. So I'm going to
12 go over the handout statistics that were on the table.

13 Starting on page 1, statistic overview, I tried
14 to put a legend next to it, so --

15 (The Reporter indicated that it's difficult to
16 hear Las Vegas.)

17 MS. IRIZARRY: Okay. So I'm going to start on
18 page 1 of the statistics. On the licensing application,
19 for the second quarter, there were 31 total applicants.
20 In private patrol category, only one person did not meet
21 the minimum requirements, so they are not here for the
22 Board. Everyone else in all other categories were --
23 met the requirements.

24 Moving down to work cards, there were 3,454
25 work cards processed in the last quarter. That's an

1 increase of over 1,700 from the first quarter. Usually
2 our second quarter of every year is this time of year.
3 That's because we have the Electric Daily Carnival,
4 which brought in a little over a thousand more
5 applications that we processed in the three months. The
6 JCK Jewelry Show. The Las Vegas Ballpark opened up,
7 which brought in a lot of applicants to get registered
8 work cards. And that's what came through. So for the
9 first quarter, we had a little, little less than 1,700.
10 We almost doubled that for the second quarter, of 3,400
11 work cards.

12 Right now, we have 108 pending work cards; 61
13 of those are because people are still missing
14 information. So it's not a complete application for us
15 to give them a work card. It's a fingerprint, a photo
16 ID is missing, or something's still pending on their
17 background. So, essentially, there are 47 of those
18 still pending that we are working at the moment. We
19 have a one-week turnaround time. So that would be those
20 things that we're still working on.

21 Page 2, on the back, last quarter we had about
22 10 complaints come through our office. Those complaints
23 varied either from licensing to the general public, work
24 card applicants.

25 One complaint was in regards to a work card

1 applicant. It was displaying disorderly conduct
2 reported by a licensee. We reported no findings. That
3 was something that we do not regulate in our statutes.
4 We refer them over to the Labor Board in order for them
5 to file criminal or, yeah, criminal charges against that
6 person. Three of those complaints we referred over to
7 the Labor Board. One was for a licensee not paying
8 their staff. And two for a licensee took money out of
9 individual's paychecks for uniforms. That's a labor
10 dispute, not with us.

11 Two unlicensed activities. One is -- they're
12 both still pending. One is a possible private
13 investigator. We're waiting on the complainant to
14 provide us more paperwork before we either close it or
15 issue a citation. And the other one is for a possible
16 private patrolman company. The suspect that we're
17 looking at has left the country. So that one is still
18 pending at the moment until we get further information.

19 There was one revocation of a work card.

20 And three were against a licensee. Three
21 against licensees all have been closed, because with no
22 findings. One was an intimidation case where the
23 general public claimed that a licensee was intimidating
24 them. We referred it over to Las Vegas Metro. One
25 claimed the licensee was not properly licensed. They

1 were. And a disgruntled ex-employee, but that did not
2 fall under our statute 648. So all those were closed or
3 referred over to another agency.

4 The last statistic here is our unlicensed
5 activity. We are very happy to announce that we are
6 pursuing unlicensed activity more actively now. That's
7 something we are also putting on our stats. Because
8 this past quarter, there was a total of 23 unlicensed
9 activity situations. 16 of those are still pending,
10 which totals about \$55,000 in citations. 12 of those
11 are bodyguards or executive protection persons that were
12 reported to us by our relationships with Las Vegas
13 Metro, the nightclub industry, or we found on our own.
14 Four of those were security companies reported by other
15 complaints. So one complaint turned into four others.
16 So it kind of bloomed into 16 of them are still pending.

17 Four unlicensed activities have been withdrawn.
18 Two were issued cease and desists. And two were
19 withdrawn, because after further review of their
20 information we found that they were not, they were not
21 violating our statute, 648. And three of those
22 unlicensed activities have been paid. Two were
23 bodyguards. From those two that were paid, unlicensed
24 activities, one is getting licensed. You'll probably
25 see them at a future Board hearing. And another one is

1 a security company. They paid their citation. They are
2 no longer pursuing to get licensed, and they partnered
3 with another licensee to make them compliant in our
4 state.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Very good. Thank you,
6 Lori.

7 Does the Board have any questions regarding
8 that report?

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I don't have -- Mr. Chair,
10 it's Ray Flynn. I don't have any questions, but I just
11 want to commend. There is something that we asked for.
12 And I love the reporting out. It gives us a good feel
13 of what's going on when we're not around.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I agree. Thank you.
15 Okay. Director Ingram, anything additional
16 that you have?

17 MR. INGRAM: No, that's all I have at this
18 time.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Would you mind
20 introducing staff that are present at the meeting,
21 please.

22 MR. INGRAM: Oh, absolutely. So on the far
23 left, I don't know if you could see her up there, we
24 have Gisela Corral. Gisela's our Licensing Specialist.
25 Next to her, we have Paul Maxwell; he's one of our

1 investigators here in the south. Shelly Donald, an
2 investigator in the south. Zachary Swarthout, an
3 investigator in the south. Lori Irizarry is my Chief of
4 Operations. And Vincent Saladino, he's our Supervisory
5 Investigator. And then to my left, we have Board
6 Counsel Rosalie Bordelove.

7 In the north, there to your right is Mary
8 Klemme; she's my northern Office Manager and
9 jack-of-all-trades.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Very good. Thank you.
11 Thanks, Kevin. Okay. Any other announcements or
12 reports or anything of that nature, Kevin? Nothing?

13 MR. INGRAM: No. But if you'd like me to go
14 through now, I can tell you there's some items on the
15 agenda that have either been postponed or withdrawn.
16 Would you like me to do that now?

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please proceed.

18 MR. INGRAM: Okay. So item number 15 on the
19 agenda, Envista Forensics, LLC, was unable to attend
20 today. They've requested to be postponed to the
21 September Board meeting.

22 Item number 19, Alfredo Francisco has withdrawn
23 his application.

24 Item numbers 49 and -- well, item number 49,
25 Trensese Love has requested to postpone his work card

1 denial until September.

2 Item number 60, Scott Macrina has requested
3 that his hearing be postponed until September as well.

4 The last one was 60.

5 Item number 66 on the agenda, Torrey Mitchell,
6 appealing the unlicensed activity citation, has been
7 postponed until the September Board meeting.

8 And item number 67, Dominique Fuiava, has been
9 postponed for the September meeting as well.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Very good. And we've
11 been -- we will not be having any meeting tomorrow. Is
12 that correct?

13 MR. INGRAM: That's correct. The meeting for
14 tomorrow has been cancelled. So we'll be finishing up
15 everything on the agenda today.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Very good.
17 Thank you, Kevin.

18 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Reviewing and approving
20 the transcripts. Any adjustments or corrections to the
21 transcripts?

22 If not, I'd accept a motion to approve the
23 transcripts.

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. Make the
25 motion to accept.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. Second.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have a
3 motion and a second for approval of the transcripts.
4 Any discussion on the motion?

5 Seeing none, all in all in favor, signify by
6 saying "aye."

7 (Board members said "aye.")

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

9 Passes unanimously.

10 One, before, before we do the swearing, I would
11 like to make an announcement that I have to leave at
12 12:00 noon. And Board Member Flynn will be taking over
13 the mantle of chairing the meeting. So.

14 Okay. It's now time to swear in all applicants
15 and witnesses. If you plan on testifying, please stand
16 and be sworn in.

17 MS. BORDELOVE: Will you please raise your
18 right hand. Do you swear that the testimony you give
19 today will be the truth, the whole truth, and nothing
20 but the truth?

21 (All applicants and potential witnesses present
22 in Las Vegas and Carson City were sworn in.)

23 MS. BORDELOVE: Thank you.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. At this point, I
25 would accept a motion for a block vote. Do we have any,

1 do we have a motion for a block vote?

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Mr. Chairman, I move to
3 have a block vote approved.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And which items?

5 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Items number 7, 8, 19, 11,
6 12, 13. And did we remove 16, Mr. Ingram?

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: We removed 15.

8 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Wait. 16 and then 18.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Can you repeat that again,
10 please? Yeah. Yeah, you jumped around. That's why.

11 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: That's 7, 8, 9, 10, 11,
12 12, 13, 16 and 18.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. And so if I'm
14 understanding you correctly, it did not include 6, 14
15 and 17; is that correct?

16 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Correct.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

18 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Chair, would you like me to
19 read those into the record?

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please.

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, I want to add 17.

22 MR. INGRAM: Oh, you want to add something?

23 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: 17, yes.

24 MR. INGRAM: Okay. Go ahead.

25 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Mr. Chairman, can I change

1 that? I wanted to add 17.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Add 17. Okay.
3 Kevin, please read them into the record.

4 MR. INGRAM: Okay. So item number 7, Rancho
5 Security's Services, LLC, license number 875, seeking
6 member approval for Zlata Zujic and Nenad Stojanovic.

7 Item number 8, E-Backgroundchecks.com, Inc.,
8 license number 1574, requesting a corporate name change
9 to Backgroundchecks.com, LLC. Craig Kessler will remain
10 the qualifying agent.

11 Item number 9, Zugress Security Services, Inc.,
12 license number 2126, is requesting a corporate name
13 change to NY SEB Inc. Perry J. Bonarrigo will remain
14 the qualifying agent.

15 Item number 10, Specialized Protection &
16 Security, LLC, dba RMS Protective Services, license
17 number 2294, requesting a corporate name change to RMS
18 Protective Services, LLC. Steven Rachminov will remain
19 the qualifying agent.

20 Item number 11, Certified Talent, LLC is
21 applying for a new private investigator license. If
22 approved, Brian F. McElwee, license number 2277, is
23 requesting that his individual license be kept in
24 abeyance so that he may become the qualifying agent.

25 Item number 12, Teflon Security, LLC is

1 applying for a new private patrolman license. If
2 approved, James M. Harden, license number 2016 is
3 requesting that his individual license be placed in
4 abeyance so that he may become the qualifying agent.
5 Member to be approved is Andre L. Bailey.

6 Item number 13, Event Staffing Professionals,
7 Inc., applying for a new private patrolman license. If
8 approved, Vincenzo Esposito is requesting that his
9 individual license be kept in abeyance so that he may
10 become the qualifying agent. Corporate officer to be
11 approved is Glen Ratcliff.

12 Item number 16, 3 Sixty Secure Corp is applying
13 for a new private patrolman license. If approved, Kurt
14 Strakaluse is requesting to transfer his qualifying
15 agent status from 30MinuteSecurity.com, LLC, license
16 number 1662. Corporate officers to be approved are
17 Thomas W. Gerstenecker and Carlo Rigillo.

18 Item number 17, Executive Security &
19 Protection, Inc., license number 2237, is applying for a
20 new canine handler license. If approved, Gregory B.
21 Conner is requesting to transfer his qualifying agent
22 status from High Powered Protection Dogs, LLC, license
23 number 1723.

24 Item number 18, Topgun Security Solutions, LLC
25 is applying for a new private investigator and private

1 patrolman license. If approved, Daniel E. Holley is
2 requesting that his individual licenses, license number
3 2611 be kept in abeyance so that he may become the
4 qualifying agent. Member to be approved is Ellen R.
5 Holley.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
7 for a block vote on those. Do we have a second on the
8 motion?

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn seconds.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'd like some
11 discussion on it.

12 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. I'll hold.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yeah, do we -- so we
14 have a motion and a second. Do we have discussion?
15 Member Gronauer?

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes. Gronauer. Yeah,
17 I would like to, I'd like to have number 7 and 16 heard
18 here.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 7 and number 16?

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, please.

21 MS. BORDELOVE: Ms. Nixon, do you want to
22 modify your motion to remove the two he requested?

23 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yes, I would like to
24 modify it.

25 MS. BORDELOVE: And, Flynn, would you modify

1 the second?

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes, I'll modify my second
3 to remove those two, 7 and 16.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Is there any
5 additional discussion on the motion?

6 Is there any public comment on it, is there any
7 public comment?

8 MR. INGRAM: None in the south.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. So we have
10 a motion. We have a second. All in favor of the
11 motion, signify by saying "aye."

12 (Board members said "aye.")

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

14 The motion passes unanimously.

15 Anyone that may be in the audience, associated
16 with those items that were just included in the block
17 vote, there is -- unless you would like to watch the
18 entertainment, you're welcome to be released.

19 All right. We'll then move on to item
20 number 6, American Protection Group, Incorporated.

21 (There was a brief discussion in Carson City
22 off the record regarding the Reporter's concern about
23 not being able to hear some of the people in Las Vegas.)

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Gronauer?
25 Member Gronauer?

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We're going to have to
3 ask you to speak up, because we're having a hard time
4 hearing you when you do talk.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn, for the record.
6 I have never heard that before in my life.

7 (There was laughter.)

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: In over 30 years of
9 knowing him.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I want a copy of that
11 transcript, please.

12 (There was laughter.)

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Very good.
14 Number 6, American Protection Group, Incorporated.
15 Please identify yourself, and let us know what your
16 plans are, please.

17 MR. BROWN: Anthony Brown for American
18 Protection Group.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And it's my -- you're
20 just adding a corporate officer to the license?

21 MR. BROWN: Correct.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Did any members
23 have any questions of Mr. Brown?

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Mr. Brown, this is
25 Commissioner Nixon. I had some questions about your

1 financials, the status. Could you explain a little bit
2 more about the situation with that.

3 MR. BROWN: Absolutely. We have, or I have
4 acquired a service called Rush Task to mitigate the
5 situation with the IRS and as well as the California
6 State Franchise Tax Board.

7 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Could you explain that a
8 little bit more about how the situation started.
9 Because it sounds like it has something to do with a
10 government shutdown, but it wasn't -- I wasn't quite
11 clear on how the situation started.

12 MR. BROWN: Understood. We've submitted
13 paperwork that both agencies have required. The federal
14 government shutdown didn't help the process of getting
15 this information out to them in a timely fashion. So
16 that information was submitted. And we are still
17 mitigating the situation.

18 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: So at this point, you
19 think you owe approximately \$7,000 to IRS?

20 MR. BROWN: Um.

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Oh, to be paid, \$7,000.

22 MR. BROWN: The total fees for owed, back-owed
23 taxes have been satisfied. We are negotiating within,
24 regarding returns for taxes, penalties, assessments, and
25 back fines that weren't assessed at the time.

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. So at this time,
2 then, you don't know how much you owe?

3 MR. BROWN: No. The attorneys are working on
4 that.

5 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Those are my questions.
6 Thank you.

7 MR. BROWN: You're welcome.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer. I
9 have a question for you, Mr. Brown.

10 MR. BROWN: Absolutely.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: The investigator has
12 asked for your records at least two times. And they
13 have not received them, from what I understand. Could
14 you tell us what -- do you have any paperwork with you
15 telling us what you're telling us?

16 MR. BROWN: Oh, I have submitted plenty of
17 paperwork to the investigator. Unfortunately, some of
18 the questioning in regards to what is outstanding is
19 what is in question, because there has been
20 modifications done during the process. So those actual
21 totals have changed. And that is the reason why I
22 cannot provide accurate numbers at the very moment. But
23 this has been and I have provided the investigator with
24 the documentation of the firm that is handling the taxes
25 and any other correspondence.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: That firm addressed
2 that to the Private Investigators Licensing Board, or
3 did you --

4 MR. BROWN: No, no. To the investigator.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. Because I'm
6 not a fan of things that are pending, whether criminal
7 or civil.

8 MR. BROWN: Understood.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And so I have, I just
10 have some problem with that. Because the way I
11 understood it when I read the report, you were asked,
12 you were asked more than once for the total. And I
13 understand your situation, also, at the same time, but.

14 MR. BROWN: It makes it really difficult, while
15 information that was submitted and then a government
16 shutdown did occur, sir. So, unfortunately, things
17 didn't transpire as quickly as we were hoping to have
18 this done. And I did ask if we should postpone this so
19 we should, we'd have, be able to have a little bit more
20 ample time to get the answers that are needed for the
21 Board. I was told that it would be okay to go ahead and
22 proceed.

23 I have shown evidence that the back taxes have
24 been paid. I have submitted evidence in regards to the
25 documentations, the tax filings. So those

1 documentations have been submitted for the record.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Investigator Donald?

3 MS. DONALD: Yes.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Do you want to weigh in
5 on this?

6 MS. DONALD: Sure. I've been working with
7 Mr. Brown for several months. Every time I've emailed
8 him, he's provided me information I need. We do have
9 proof that he has paid his back taxes. I just was never
10 able to get a definite amount owed from him because,
11 like he said, with the government shutdown and then the
12 situation changing, he wasn't sure of the total amount.

13 But he has been making an effort, and he has
14 provided me everything that I've asked for that he's
15 been able to acquire.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Where did those
17 documents you provided, where did they come from; did
18 they come from this Rush place, or did they --

19 MS. DONALD: Some of them did. But some of --
20 some of them are proof of payment that he paid the IRS.
21 I have receipts and statements of payment made to the
22 IRS.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I believe, the original
24 question was -- sorry. I don't want to put words in
25 your mouth. But, I believe, it was how did this all

1 come about, not the government shutdown. Is this prior
2 to the government shutdown when you had this problem?

3 MR. BROWN: Absolutely, sir.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. That's what I'm
5 trying to figure out. How did it come about?

6 MR. BROWN: Negligence on my part, sir.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you. No
8 further questions.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any additional
10 questions from the Board members?

11 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah, this is Ray Flynn.

12 Mr. Brown, why don't you explain to me. So
13 what type of business or security work does this firm do
14 in the state of Nevada?

15 MR. BROWN: We provide security services, both
16 patrol as well as tending cars.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Where?

18 MR. BROWN: Throughout the greater Las Vegas
19 metropolitan area. Sometimes in Henderson. Sometimes,
20 you know, just --

21 (Interruption by cell phone ringing.)

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: You're doing it like at
23 stores, casinos, high-security government sites?

24 MR. BROWN: No, mostly commercial, residential,
25 apartment complexes, shopping centers.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And so why don't you
2 explain to me about the back wages that was all owed,
3 complaint on you.

4 MR. BROWN: That's easily explainable.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I hope so.

6 MR. BROWN: Because we are based in the state
7 of California -- labor laws are quite different in the
8 state of California than it is here in Nevada -- there
9 was a misinterpretation during the semimonthly payroll
10 versus a semimonthly payroll in a federal statute. So
11 those were not understood correctly. So that's where we
12 have found ourselves in a bind. So we did correct that.
13 And to this very moment, we are very compliant in
14 regards to that. We've actually changed from a
15 semimonthly to a biweekly payroll, to avoid any
16 misunderstanding.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. Thank you.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Any
19 additional questions?

20 Sir, I do, I have a question. What is your
21 role in the corporation?

22 MR. BROWN: I am now the president and CEO.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.

24 All right. And no additional questions. Is
25 there any public comment?

1 Seeing none, I'd accept a motion.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll make a motion for
3 denial at this time. I don't have enough information.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have a
5 motion from Member Gronauer. Do we have a second?

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn seconds.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion and a
8 second. Discussion on the motion?

9 Member Flynn?

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I don't know if this is
11 resolved or not. That's my biggest concern. And I
12 understand there was a government shutdown, but that was
13 a long time ago. I'd be more comfortable if I knew that
14 this was all resolved.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

16 MR. BROWN: If I may?

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, you may not.

18 MR. BROWN: Okay.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Member
20 Nixon, do you have any comments or any discussion?

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I feel the same way.
22 Sorry. Yes, thank you. I feel the same way. I want to
23 understand how much is -- he ends up owing and a payment
24 or some other plan before we move forward.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Member Gronauer?

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir, I'm fine right
2 now.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right. We
4 have a motion. We have a second.

5 Mr. Brown, you wanted to add a comment. I'll
6 let you add a comment only because I wanted to see where
7 you were going.

8 MR. BROWN: Understood. I just wanted to let
9 the Board know we are trying to mitigate this situation
10 through the proper channels, through an attorney that is
11 very knowledgeable with the tax codes. I am not. And
12 we are progressing as information is given to us. So
13 I'm not trying to walk away from the situation. I have
14 done everything I can --

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right.

16 MR. BROWN: -- in my power to be sure --

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you, Mr. Brown.

18 Yeah, this is for counsel or for Kevin. If he
19 is denied, how soon can he reapply if he gets everything
20 sorted out accordingly?

21 MS. BORDELOVE: So I don't think on licenses
22 there's any requirements regarding when to reapply. But
23 you could also at this point, if it's more information
24 you wanted, see if he'd rather postpone it, so he
25 doesn't have to go through the whole licensing

1 application again, postpone it pending more information,
2 either if he could agree to it, you could make a motion
3 to table this.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Brown, do you
6 understand what we're talking about?

7 MR. BROWN: Yes.

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So, I think, I'm going
10 to -- I think, I'm going to vote against the motion. I
11 think, we're looking for information. I don't know that
12 suitability or anything of that nature has been
13 established at this point, pending getting that
14 information. I'd be much more comfortable with a
15 postponement or to table it for additional information.
16 I think, that's my position.

17 So we'll take a vote on the motion. All in
18 favor of the motion to deny Mr. Brown the corporate
19 officer status --

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Chair? Mr. Chair?

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes?

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. chair, it's Ray Flynn.
23 Correct me if I'm wrong. I understand where you're
24 going. And in the past, I recall, we've asked the
25 applicant if they wanted to, before we voted, so we

1 could change the motion. I'd like to proceed that route
2 instead of taking the vote right now.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. You're the maker
4 of the motion, if I remember correctly. So I need --

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Is the maker of the
7 motion willing to withdraw the motion? I guess, that's
8 the question.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer, the
10 maker of the motion, is willing to withdraw the motion.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. And is the
12 second willing to withdraw their second?

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes, I'm willing to
14 withdraw my second. And I would like to address the
15 applicant.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please, go right ahead.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. Mr. Brown, if we
18 were to do a vote, and if the vote was to pass in the
19 prior motion, you would have to wait a year before
20 coming before us.

21 MR. BROWN: Okay.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: What we're offering you is
23 if you voluntarily, that if you want to postpone it on
24 your own, you could come before us at the next meeting.

25 MR. BROWN: Okay.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And, hopefully, between
2 the attorneys --

3 MR. BROWN: I see.

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: -- and whatever work
5 you're doing, you'll be able to supply information to
6 the investigator that this is closed, everything's
7 up-to-date, everything's fine. So the ball is in your
8 court.

9 MR. BROWN: Understood.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: So what would you like to
11 do?

12 MR. BROWN: It would like to table this.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: You'd like to postpone
14 it --

15 MR. BROWN: Yes.

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: -- to the next meeting?

17 MR. BROWN: Yes.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: With that said --

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Chair, did you hear
20 that?

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes. And with that
22 said, I'd accept a motion for the postponement.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. I'll make a
24 motion for postponement, postponement to --

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: To the next meeting.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: -- the next meeting.

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn seconds.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a
4 motion, and we have a second. Discussion on the motion?

5 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
6 signify by saying "aye."

7 (Board members said "aye.")

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Mr. Brown,
9 please try to work on getting that information together,
10 please. All right.

11 MR. BROWN: Thank you.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Get with your attorney.
13 Get with your attorney.

14 MR. BROWN: Understood. Thank you.

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. Good luck to
16 you.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Moving
18 right along, I see number 7, Rancho Security Services,
19 LLC. Are they here?

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Is there anyone here
21 from -- anyone here?

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Rancho Security
23 Services?

24 MR. INGRAM: Zlata Zujic or Nenad Stojanovic?

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I pulled this because

1 they didn't show for the last meeting. And there was
2 some questions on here I had about the DUI that's
3 pending on one of them. There is some financial things
4 besides the bankruptcy that I want to know about.

5 With that, if they don't want to show, I just
6 have a -- my opinion is that I have a problem with them
7 not showing up for two meetings in a row. They've been
8 on the agenda. They've been notified. So I hate to
9 just say, you know, let's deny it. But, again, they
10 have had two opportunities to be here. And that just
11 gives me a little bit of angst. And if you care about
12 your business, you care what you're doing, I think, you
13 should show up and answer some questions. There's a lot
14 of people in this audience right now and, also, in the
15 north, I'm sure, that are there because they want to
16 represent their companies and say what's going on.

17 With that, I have to make a motion right now
18 that the way I feel is for denial of number 7, Rancho
19 Security Services, license number 875, seeking a member
20 approval for -- I might hurt these names -- Zlata Zujic
21 and Nenad Stojanovic. This is subject to. And that's
22 my motion.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
24 by Member Gronauer for denial. Do we have a second on
25 the motion?

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: This is Member Nixon. I
2 second.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Discussion on
4 the motion?

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Chair, Ray Flynn. I'd
6 like to ask the investigator a couple questions just to
7 get it on the record.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Go right ahead.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Maxwell, this is
10 yours. Have you had any communication with the
11 applicants?

12 MR. MAXWELL: I spoke to them --

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We can't -- I'm sorry.
14 We can't hear.

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: You might want to move up.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah, you might have to
17 sit there.

18 MR. MAXWELL: Ready?

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes.

20 MR. MAXWELL: I did notify them when I spoke to
21 them in reference to the DUI, which they provided the
22 court documents on. Mr. Stojanovic did complete the
23 program that he was meant to complete. And he is on
24 probation until May of 2020 for DUI.

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Did you tell them that the

1 Board wanted to see them?

2 MR. MAXWELL: I told them that the meeting was
3 on the 20th and to be here at 9:00 o'clock, yes.

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: So you did tell them the
5 Board wanted to see them?

6 MR. MAXWELL: Yes, sir.

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. All right. Then,
8 the other thing, I'd just confirm, both these applicants
9 live in Las Vegas. It's not like we're dealing with
10 someone that has to fly in from the East Coast.

11 MR. MAXWELL: To my knowledge, they do live in
12 Las Vegas, sir.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. I'm good,
14 Mr. Chair.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. So we have a
16 motion, and we have a second. Is there any public
17 discussion, any public comment?

18 Seeing none --

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: -- all in favor of the
21 motion, signify by saying "aye."

22 (Board members said "aye.")

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed? Nay.

24 So the motion passes three to one.

25 All right. We'll move on to number item 14,

1 Andrews Global Security, Incorporated.

2 MR. INGRAM: They're present in the south.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning,
4 gentlemen.

5 MR. COX: Good morning.

6 MR. ANDREWS: Good morning.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
8 yourselves and explain what you're embarking on.

9 MR. ANDREWS: Yeah, I'm Lee Andrews, the CEO of
10 Andrews Global Security. And we're looking for our
11 license out here in Nevada.

12 MR. COX: Robert Cox. I'm applying for
13 qualifying agent for Andrews Global once they're
14 approved.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Questions from
16 the Board. Board Member Flynn?

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, sir.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

19 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: For Mr. Andrews, you --
20 there was some unlicensed activity in Las Vegas in the
21 bidding. Could you explain that a little, little bit
22 further.

23 MR. ANDREWS: Yeah, we acquired a company in
24 California, doing business under the name JRM. And we
25 do a lot of work with Dick Clark Productions in

1 California. And they do a couple events out here in
2 Nevada. We thought we were compliant, being a corporate
3 officer of the company there and doing work as just
4 consulting for them. And we partnered with Bob's
5 company, Hi-Tech Security, when it was licensed and out
6 here. A few of the corporate officers didn't have their
7 guard cards out here. And they thought they were okay.
8 Once we found out, we had them licensed through Bob's
9 company. And, I believe, we were compliant after that.

10 Is that right?

11 MR. COX: Correct.

12 MR. ANDREWS: And then we were happy to pay the
13 fee once we found out. And, you know, it won't happen
14 again.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Any, any more
16 questions? Board Member Gronauer?

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You first.

18 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Sorry. The last question
19 I had was the outstanding case, a trademark
20 infringement, because I know your name is Andrews, but.

21 MR. ANDREWS: Yes. Yeah, absolutely. I had an
22 ammunition company called Andrews Ammo. And when I
23 started the security company, I -- I used my last name,
24 Andrews Global Security. And my father also had a
25 security company, Andrews International. But when it

1 was acquired by another company, they dissolved that.
2 And I -- it didn't even occur to me that it would be an
3 issue.

4 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: M-hm (affirmative).

5 MR. ANDREWS: So they did file a case against
6 us when we started winning contracts. And we -- we've
7 done a lot. Honestly, they don't really have a case.
8 But we filed a dba in California. All our licenses
9 changed. All the brand names changed. We're very
10 compliant with everything. And then we're happy to do
11 that here, if needed. But our lawyers assure us that
12 there is no case.

13 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. I have a question
14 for the counsel lady.

15 MS. BORDELOVE: M-hm (affirmative).

16 (The Reporter indicated we could not hear
17 Las Vegas.)

18 MS. BORDELOVE: I think, her question may have
19 been off the record.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It was a sidebar.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Let's take a
22 two-minute break.

23 (There was a period off the record, 9:44 to
24 9:46 a.m.)

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We're back on

1 the record.

2 Member Nixon, did you have any questions, any
3 additional questions?

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. We're back.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any additional
6 questions, Member Nixon?

7 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yes.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

9 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I'd like to ask, if
10 possible, because I may need to recuse myself. Who
11 acquired your company?

12 MR. ANDREWS: Sorry?

13 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Who acquired the company,
14 Andrews, and filed a case against you?

15 MR. ANDREWS: Andrews International was
16 acquired by a company called U.S. Security seven years
17 ago. And then U.S. Security was just purchased by
18 Allied Universal. So we're very far removed from the
19 original.

20 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Right. Okay. So, then, I
21 have to recuse myself from any decision being made today
22 on behalf of this situation.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.

24 MS. BORDELOVE: So just to clarify the
25 disclosure, the disclosure is due to your employment

1 relationship with Allied?

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Allied Universal, yes.

3 MR. ANDREWS: Okay.

4 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Sorry.

5 MR. ANDREWS: Oh.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Board Member

7 Gronauer?

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir. And let me
9 tell you, you have the name now.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And, sir, Mr. Andrews?

12 MR. ANDREWS: Yes.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You know, just going
14 through, it was 4-19 was supplied to me. You explained
15 that. I'm okay with that.

16 MR. ANDREWS: Yeah.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And then 3-19, the
18 month before, was this lawsuit, correct, or
19 infringement?

20 MR. ANDREWS: Yeah.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And you said something,
22 they don't really have a case, which means there's a
23 case pending.

24 MR. ANDREWS: We're in the -- what do you mean
25 by that?

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well, you explain it to
2 me. You're the one that said they don't really have a
3 case. It sounds to me, okay, that it was inferred, by
4 your statement, that you said they don't have a case.
5 And prior to that, you said something about how it's
6 gone about. So is there a lawsuit or not a lawsuit, is
7 it pending or not pending?

8 MR. ANDREWS: There is a pending lawsuit that's
9 being dealt with.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you.

11 MR. ANDREWS: Is there a concern with that
12 specifically? I know you don't like pending lawsuits.
13 But we can provide information that may be helpful. Are
14 you worried about that?

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well, who's the
16 investigator on this one?

17 MR. SWARTHOUT: Investigator Swarthout.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Can I ask you a
19 question, please?

20 MR. SWARTHOUT: Okay.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Did you get
22 into, delve into this a little deeper and drill down
23 into it and see what's going on with this case?

24 MR. SWARTHOUT: I talked with Mr. Cox. He,
25 essentially, said the same thing that Lee Andrews did.

1 He had already had a conversation with him. We do have
2 another reference from court through pay serve now on it
3 that discussed where it's at. It hasn't moved any
4 forward. All it shows on paper is that they were
5 served.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah, you said -- and I
7 said earlier, and you were listening. Okay. And I'm
8 sorry, but I have a problem, when we have cases pending,
9 that we don't know what that has to do with you in the
10 future.

11 MR. ANDREWS: Are you worried about insolvency
12 of the company, or what is the main fear there?

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: The company being --
14 having to feel that we have, for you, yourself, have had
15 a lawsuit.

16 MR. ANDREWS: We have -- we have plenty of
17 financial backing. And I'm happy to provide statements.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You did -- again, I'll
19 just again to the investigator. You did drill down.
20 Did you feel comfortable with it, with the information
21 you know now? You're a little closer than I am.

22 MR. INGRAM: For the record, Kevin Ingram. I
23 think --

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It's probably an unfair
25 question.

1 MR. INGRAM: I think, that's kind of a --

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It's an unfair question
3 put to you. I'm sorry about that. I'm good where we're
4 at. Thank you. Thank you, Kevin.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. Ray Flynn.
6 Have you got any other?

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, I'm good.

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. Explain this
9 trademark infringement. I'm missing something
10 somewhere. And --

11 MR. ANDREWS: Yeah, absolutely.

12 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I understand you. Okay.
13 I don't understand what you're trying to communicate.

14 MR. ANDREWS: In terms of what the case is, or?

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes.

16 MR. ANDREWS: So I named my company Andrews
17 Global Security.

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Right.

19 MR. ANDREWS: And my father 30 years ago had a
20 company called Andrews International.

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Right.

22 MR. ANDREWS: That was sold a couple times.
23 And throughout that time, that company was dissolved.
24 But what they're claiming is that because my -- I've
25 been using the name Andrews, that I've been winning

1 clients and contracts using my name. Which I'm allowed
2 to use my name. So that's why I said they don't have a
3 case. But that was not a legal representation or
4 anything. That was my opinion.

5 So, in California, we've gone by AGS, just the
6 initials, and we filed a dba with that. And we're happy
7 to do that here. It's really -- I feel it won't be
8 necessary. But that's where we're at right now.

9 Does that make sense?

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes, it's a lot clearer
11 now.

12 MR. ANDREWS: Yeah, absolutely.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any additional
14 questions from members?

15 Any public comment?

16 Seeing no public comment, I would entertain a
17 motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Chair, I'd like to ask
19 Mr. Cox if he's got anything to add.

20 MR. COX: Other than I've worked with both
21 Andrews and helping engaging us through the
22 investigators, I've been -- I was the qualifying agent
23 for Andrews 13 years ago, before I started my own
24 business, Hi-Tech Security, six years ago. And should
25 the Board approve AGS today, Andrews Global Security

1 today, then I'm folding up Hi-Tech Security to become
2 their qualifying agent. So I could vouch for
3 Mr. Andrews and what he states for today.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. I'm good. Thank
6 you.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Is anyone -- I'm
8 prepared to accept a motion.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: This is Ray Flynn. Just
10 to get this moving, I will make a motion to approve.
11 And I'm satisfied with the answers to the questions.
12 And the little bit I know about trademark infringement,
13 in terms of what's going on with the last name being
14 used, I don't think this has anything to do with the
15 quality or the integrity of their security services.

16 MR. ANDREWS: Yeah. Thank you.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So we have a motion to
18 approve by Member Flynn. Do we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. Second.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second.

21 Discussion on the motion?

22 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
23 signify by saying "aye."

24 (Board members said "aye.")

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

1 The motion carries unanimously on a three-zero
2 vote, with Member Nixon recusing herself.

3 Okay. Congratulations, gentlemen.

4 MR. ANDREWS: Thank you guys.

5 MR. COX: Yes, thank you, Mr. Chairman. Thank
6 you, Board.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 15 was
8 postponed.

9 Item number 16, 3 Sixty Secure Corp.

10 MR. STRAKALUSE: Good morning.

11 MR. RIGILLO: Good morning, Board.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning,
13 gentlemen. Please introduce yourselves and sort
14 through, let us know what you're -- how you want to
15 proceed.

16 MR. STRAKALUSE: Sure. Kurt Strakaluse,
17 qualifying agent, 30MinuteSecurity, license number 1662.

18 MR. ANDREWS: Tony Guimond, director of guard
19 services, 3 Sixty.

20 MR. RIGILLO: And Carlo Rigillo, chief
21 financial officer of 3 Sixty Secure Corp.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. And you're
23 requesting a new private patrol license and then the
24 corporate officer approvals and that.

25 Member Gronauer, I think, you had some

1 questions, I believe?

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, I did.

3 You guys are from Canada?

4 MR. RIGILLO: We are, yes.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Because I'm
6 unfamiliar with the military stuff in Canada, just so
7 you know. All right? So there's some questions I have.

8 Mr. Ger --

9 MR. RIGILLO: Gerstenecker.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you.

11 Gerstenecker. Because on that application is military
12 and military type of discharge, and it said other. I
13 don't know what other means, out of all the ones that
14 were on there. From honorable, dishonorable, all kinds
15 of stuff, you just put other. Then you put retired in
16 sub 5 over here. So I don't know what that means.

17 MR. RIGILLO: Right. He left the military in
18 2001 of his own accord to join the United Nations, in
19 the security apparatus with the United Nations.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It means he just walked
21 away from the military? I don't know.

22 MR. GUIMOND: You can -- depending how many
23 years you served, you have to, you apply for --

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: He answered for you,
25 so.

1 MR. GUIMOND: No, I'm not Mr. Gerstenecker. My
2 name's Tony Guimond. Mr. Gerstenecker's not here,
3 unable to travel.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. That is
5 something different.

6 MR. GUIMOND: Mr. Gerstenecker was in special
7 operations forces in Canada, retired.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. You're Mr. Tony
9 what?

10 MR. GUIMOND: Tony Guimond.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You're Mr.?

12 MR. STRAKALUSE: Strakaluse.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you. And on your
14 application, you only put your first name.

15 MR. STRAKALUSE: Yes.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Instead of putting your
17 last name. You know, and the application says you have
18 to fill in everything. So I don't understand why you --
19 you know, you're educated man, I'm sure. And I'm just
20 saying, when I look at things, and they refuse to put
21 their whole names in, it just isn't -- right? You have
22 to fill out all the blanks. That's what it says. All
23 right?

24 And then, also, for your driver's license,
25 class and state. You didn't put it in there, what kind

1 of driver's license you have, what class, what state.
2 If it's out of Canada, you can still say that.

3 MR. STRAKALUSE: That was an oversight. I
4 apologize, yeah.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: The other one for DUI,
6 do you want to explain it?

7 MR. STRAKALUSE: Sure. That happened several
8 years ago. I went through the whole process and took
9 care of everything. It was a holiday. It was
10 Thanksgiving, Christmas. And I did everything I was
11 supposed to, and I took care of it. And all the years
12 I've been a QA, I've shown that I'm an upstanding guy.
13 So I took care of all those issues. And that's where
14 I'm at.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And I read it and it
16 says that you are clean and sober and all that. And I
17 appreciate that. I think, it takes at a lot of work to
18 do that. And I commend you for that.

19 All right. I just wondered why. So, to me,
20 you're solid. I had a little area. Thank you. I
21 appreciate it.

22 That's all I have, sir.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Thank you.
24 Do any other members have questions? Member
25 Nixon?

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah, I've got a couple.

4 Just one of the three of you explain to me what your
5 company does and what you want to do in Nevada.

6 MR. GUIMOND: Sir, we provide security in
7 Canada. We do armed, armed guards for transport in
8 Canada, as well as the facility, mostly cannabis retail
9 locations in Canada. So we're slowly moving into the
10 United States. That's why we need to come in line with
11 Mr. Kurt here. And, basically, guard services is what
12 we're looking at doing in Nevada.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. Thank you.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any additional
15 questions?

16 Is there any public comment?

17 Seeing no public comment, I'd accept a motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer. I
19 pulled it off the consent agenda, I guess you would call
20 it. Okay. And I'm comfortable enough to make this
21 motion.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I make a motion to
24 approve Sixty Secure Corp.

25 MR. RIGILLO: 3 Sixty.

1 MR. GUIMOND: 3 Sixty.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: 3 Sixty Secure Corp is
3 applying for a new private patrolman license. If
4 approved, Kurt Strakaluse is requesting to transfer his
5 qualified agent status from 30MinuteSecurity.com, LLC,
6 license number 1662. And corporate officers to be
7 approved is Thomas Gerstenecker and Carlo Rigillo.
8 That's my motion.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Subject to all
10 statutory and regulatory requirements?

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah. I'm sorry.
12 Subject to all statutory and regulatory requirements.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.
14 Do we have a second on the motion?

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
17 for approval and a second. And discussion on the
18 motion?

19 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
20 signify by saying "aye."

21 (Board members said "aye.")

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

23 The motion passes unanimously.

24 Congratulations. Good luck.

25 MR. RIGILLO: Thank you very much.

1 MR. GUIMOND: Thank you very much.

2 MR. STRAKALUSE: Thank you, gentlemen.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 19 was
4 withdrawn.

5 We will move on to item number 20, Lemieux &
6 Associates, LLC.

7 MR. MOLNAR: Good morning.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning, sir.
9 Please identify yourself and tell us a little bit about
10 you and your intentions.

11 MR. MOLNAR: My name is Robert Molnar. I'm one
12 of the partners for Lemieux & Associates, a private
13 investigation company headquartered out of Connecticut.
14 And we've made the decision to expand nationwide due to
15 client request. And this is one of my last states. So.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: How many states are you
17 in?

18 MR. MOLNAR: 47 until we get this one. We're
19 not going to do Alaska or Hawaii.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right.

21 MR. MOLNAR: Just for vacations.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Thank you.
23 Do any of the members have any questions?
24 Member Flynn?

25 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, sir.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Nixon?

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Gronauer?

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir. You did one
5 year in the Navy?

6 MR. MOLNAR: Yes.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, I have no other
8 questions.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Is there
10 any public comment?

11 Seeing no public comment, I'd accept a motion.

12 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: This is Ray Flynn. I'll
13 make the motion that Lemieux & Associates, LLC be
14 granted a new corporate private investigator license.
15 Robert D. Molnar is applying for an individual private
16 investigator license. If this is approved, he is
17 requesting that his individual license be placed into
18 abeyance so that he may become the qualifying agent.
19 Members to be approved are Robert D. Molnar and
20 George A. Lemieux II. This is subject to all statutory
21 and regulatory requirements.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion for
23 approval. Do we have a second?

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion and a

1 second. Discussion on the motion?

2 Seeing none, all in favor, signify by saying
3 "aye."

4 (Board members said "aye.")

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

6 The motion passes unanimously. Good luck,
7 Mr. Molnar.

8 MR. MOLNAR: Thank you very much. Can I say
9 one thing real quickly? This is -- I've gone through
10 this with a number of states. This is the most
11 professional and organized one I've gone through. So
12 it's just so you know. You notice I said that after I
13 got approved, so. Thank you very much.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Can we revisit this?

15 MR. MOLNAR: I just know it was awesome. So.
16 thank you. It was great.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you for the
18 comments. We appreciated that.

19 Number 21, JD Consulting & Investigation, LLC.
20 Good morning, sir.

21 MR. DICKEY: Good morning.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
23 yourself, give us a little bit of your background and
24 what your intentions are.

25 MR. DICKEY: Good morning. My name is Joseph

1 Dickey. I'm applying for a new corporate private
2 investigator license for a company I'm starting called
3 JD Consulting & Investigation. I've been an FBI agent
4 in Las Vegas since 1997. I'm retiring next month.
5 Thank you.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you. How many
7 years with the FBI?

8 MR. DICKEY: 1997. I actually had a private
9 sector engagement from 2005 to 2006. So that backed me
10 up to just over 20 years.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Congratulations on your
12 retirement.

13 MR. DICKEY: Thank you.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any questions from the
15 Board? Member Gronauer?

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Just -- yes.
17 Mr. Dickey and I are not friends or related in any way,
18 but I've known of Mr. Dickey for quite some time. I
19 don't know if you know me.

20 MR. DICKEY: I do.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: The idea is we've never
22 had any relationship, I don't think, just the background
23 of it. I don't think I have any problem voting on this.

24 MR. DICKEY: Okay. Thank you.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you for the

1 disclosure.

2 Member Nixon?

3 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, sir.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Is there
7 any public comment?

8 Seeing no public comment, I'd accept a motion.

9 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: This is Tammy Nixon. I
10 move that JD Consulting & Investigations, LLC is
11 approved for the new corporate private investigator
12 license. Joseph G. Dickey is applying to have an
13 individual private license. If approved, he is
14 requesting that his individual license be placed into
15 abeyance so that he may become the qualifying agent.
16 This is subject to all statutory and regulatory
17 requirements.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I have a motion for
19 approval. Do I have a second?

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn seconds.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion and a
22 second. Any discussion on the motion?

23 Seeing no discussion, all in favor of the
24 motion, signify by saying "aye."

25 (Board members said "aye.")

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

2 It passes unanimously.

3 Kevin, do we need to put his license in
4 abeyance until his retirement from the FGI is effective?

5 MR. INGRAM: That's correct. He'll place it in
6 abeyance. As soon as we get the retirement paperwork
7 from him, we can activate it without coming before the
8 Board.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It's like next month?

10 MR. DICKEY: Yes, July 31st.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Well, good
12 luck. Thank you. You've been approved.

13 MR. DICKEY: Great. Thank you.

14 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you.

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Good luck.

16 MR. DICKEY: Sounds good.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 22, RMS
18 Protective Services, LLC.

19 Good morning.

20 MR. BRETNALL: Good morning.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
22 yourself, give us a little bit of your background, and
23 tell us what your intentions are.

24 MR. BRETNALL: Lyndon Brentnall, COO of RMS,
25 licensed in Florida. We do private investigation work

1 and also armed security in Florida. Looking to expand
2 and do a lot more work over here in Las Vegas,
3 specifically surveillance detection and technical
4 service-related items.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

6 Any questions from the members? Member Flynn?

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None at this time.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Nixon?

9 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: None at this time.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Gronauer?

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: None, sir.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Is there
13 any public comment?

14 Seeing none, I'd accept a motion.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm Gronauer. I'll
16 make a motion to approve. RMS Protective Service, LLC
17 is applying for a new corporate private investigator
18 license, Lyndon C. Brentnall applying for an individual
19 private investigator license. If approved, he is
20 requesting that his individual license be placed into
21 abeyance so that he may become the qualifying agent.
22 This is subject to all statutory and regulatory
23 requirements.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion. Do
25 we have a second?

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn seconds.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion and a
3 second. Do we have any discussion on the motion?

4 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
5 signify by saying "aye."

6 (Board members said "aye.")

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

8 The motion passes unanimously. Mr. Brentnall,
9 good luck, and you've been approved.

10 MR. BRENTNALL: Thank you, sir.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Congratulations.

12 MR. BRENTNALL: Thank you.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Moving on to number 23,
14 Alfred Lozano.

15 Is Mr. Lozano there? Oh, yeah, there he is.
16 Okay.

17 MR. LOZANO: Yes, sir.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning.

19 MR. LOZANO: Good morning.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
21 yourself, give us a little bit of your background, and
22 tell us what your intentions are.

23 MR. LOZANO: Good morning. My name is Alfred
24 Lozano. I retired from the San Diego Police Department
25 on July 1st, 2017, after 28 years. I had about 18, 18

1 years of investigative experience, the last 10 years
2 worked in a homicide unit. Currently, I am working with
3 the CoventBridge Group, which is an investigative group
4 out of Jacksonville, Florida. We're, I believe, in all
5 50 states. And I'm applying to be the qualifying agent
6 for the corporation here in Nevada.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

8 Any questions from the Board? Board Member
9 Gronauer?

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Nixon?

12 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

14 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah. Just, I'm just a
15 little confused on your background. You've got --
16 unless you did the -- had the wrong dates, you don't
17 have 28 years down for San Diego police force.

18 MR. LOZANO: There was two years of reserve.

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Oh, two years. Okay. Got
20 it. All right. I'm good.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Do we have
22 any public comment?

23 Seeing no public comment, I'd accept a motion.

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll make the
25 motion that Alfred Lozano be granted an individual

1 private investigator license. If this is approved, he
2 is requesting that his individual license be placed into
3 abeyance so that he may become the qualifying agent for
4 CoventBridge (USA), Inc., license number 1187. This is
5 subject to all statutory and regulatory requirements.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion for
7 approval. Do we have a second?

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll second. Gronauer.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And we have a second.
10 So we have a motion and a second. Discussion on the
11 motion?

12 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
13 signify by saying "aye."

14 (Board members said "aye.")

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

16 Mr. Lozano, you've been approved. Good luck.
17 Go forth. Do good.

18 MR. LOZANO: Thank you.

19 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Congratulations.

20 MR. LOZANO: Thank you.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 24, James T.
22 Born.

23 Good morning, sir.

24 MR. BORN: Good morning.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify

1 yourself, give us your background, and tell us what your
2 intentions are.

3 MR. BORN: My name is James Born. I've been a
4 licensed investigator in California for 41 years. I was
5 licensed in Nevada 1988 to 2000, I believe it was, 12
6 years anyway. My wife had multiple sclerosis at that
7 time, became quadriplegic. So I had to put aside
8 everything to care for her. And I'm back. She passed
9 away recently. So I'm ready to go back to work. I've
10 got 11 years, or 12 years in the -- 11 years in the Navy
11 and 12 years in the Army. And I've had over 5,000 hours
12 of training in 226 schools.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Did I see no Air Force
14 mixed in there, too?

15 MR. BORN: No, sir. I kind of by-passed that
16 one. I probably shouldn't say that, because I'm in Air
17 Force country here. But I was mess cook at the last
18 supper.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: My condolences on your
20 wife, sir.

21 Do we have any Board questions? Member Nixon?

22 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I just want to thank you
25 for your service.

1 MR. BORN: Thank you, sir.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Gronauer?

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah, I just want to
4 say thank you for your service. You also were a deputy
5 sheriff in Mineral County?

6 MR. BORN: Captain.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Captain?

8 MR. BORN: Yes, sir.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. How long
10 were you in Mineral County?

11 MR. BORN: Well, I was up there for one year,
12 because the -- I was a private investigator, so I had to
13 put my license in abeyance. And I went up there. They
14 were going through an insurance investigation for the
15 entire county, and the sheriff brought me up there to
16 help them with all their paperwork and organize the
17 whole system. The original sheriff what was there,
18 prior to the sheriff that I was helping, didn't get
19 reelected, so he destroyed everything. And so they were
20 left with a Lloyd's of London investigation without
21 anybody to help them.

22 And at that time, I was teaching crime scene
23 technology through Sirchie Finger Print Laboratories.
24 And the sheriff and the undersheriff came down and went
25 to my class, and they liked me and knew about my

1 qualifications, so they immediately got me up there. So
2 he says, "Would you come up there for at least one year?
3 That's all I'm asking." He says, "I'll make you a
4 sergeant." I said, "Well, I'll have to think about
5 that. That's a long time to put aside." By the time we
6 got through, he said, "Well, I'm going to make you a
7 lieutenant." And I went up there, and he said, "Look,
8 we decided to make you a captain." I said, "You know,
9 if I had waited one more day, I probably could have had
10 the sheriff's spot, you know."

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you for the
12 background. I appreciate it.

13 MR. BORN: Thank you.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you for all your
15 service.

16 MR. BORN: Thank you.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. So.

18 MR. BORN: I'm sorry about that.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. So do we
20 have -- is there any public comment?

21 Seeing no public comment, I'd accept a motion.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: It's Ray Flynn. I'll make
23 a motion to approve.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have a
25 motion to approve. Do we have a second?

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Second.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second.

3 Discussion on the motion?

4 Seeing no discussion, all in favor, signify by
5 saying "aye."

6 (Board members said "aye.")

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

8 Mr. Born, congratulations and good luck.

9 MR. BORN: Thank you, sir. Thank you, Board.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 25,

11 Maybeth G. -- I'm going to say Andrade ("An-dred-ee").

12 MS. ANDRADE: "An-draw-dee."

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: "An-draw-dee." Good
14 morning. Please identify yourself, give us a little bit
15 of your background, and tell us what your plans are.

16 MS. ANDRADE: Yes. Good morning. My name is
17 Maybeth Andrade. I'm currently working with Robert
18 Lawson Investigations. I do criminal defense. And I'm
19 hoping to continue in that field.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. And how long
21 have you been an investigator?

22 MS. ANDRADE: Going on four years in September.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Questions of the
24 Board. Member Gronauer?

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Don't slip on it

1 now (pronunciation of his name).

2 The applicant -- I kind of lot my notes here.
3 I believe that you worked for Robert Lawson?

4 MS. ANDRADE: Investigations, yes.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: For four years. Do you
6 have a work card?

7 MS. ANDRADE: I do have, yes.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Back there?

9 MS. ANDRADE: Yes, I do.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And, no problem.
11 No, that's it. Thank you.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Member
13 Nixon?

14 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No questions.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Any public
18 comment?

19 Seeing none, I'd accept a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: This is Nixon. I move
21 that Maybeth G. Andrade -- sorry -- is approved for an
22 individual private investigator license. This is
23 subject to all statutory and regulatory requirements.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
25 for approval. Do we have a second?

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. Second.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have a
3 motion and a second. Any discussion on the motion?

4 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
5 signify by saying "aye."

6 (Board members said "aye.")

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

8 The motion passes unanimously.

9 Congratulations.

10 MS. ANDRADE: Thank you.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good luck to you.

12 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you.

13 MS. ANDRADE: Thank you.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Item
15 number 26, ECAMSECURE.

16 MR. WORRELL: Good morning.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning. Please
18 identify yourself, and give us a little bit of your
19 background and what your plans are.

20 MR. WORRELL: My name's William Worrell. And I
21 served for eight years in the United States Air Force,
22 which is what brought me out here to Nevada. I've been
23 out here for about 34 years, working on and off in all
24 aspects of the security industry, both electronic and
25 physical, mostly electronic. And I'm here for

1 ECAMSECURE. I've worked for them for 14 years. And to
2 become the qualifying agent so that we can move into
3 some areas where we are now going to be required to
4 carry a patrolman's license. So that's what I'm hoping
5 to accomplish.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Director Ingram,
7 did we have -- did we want to touch on an area before we
8 go into questions?

9 MR. INGRAM: Yes. Thank you, Mr. Chair.
10 ECAMSECURE came before the Board at a previous Board
11 meeting, and there was a question on the background for
12 the member to be approved, Christopher Coffey. The
13 investigator had picked up on something that had already
14 been cleared and presented to the Board when Mr. Coffey
15 got licensed several years ago. And, unfortunately,
16 with the turnover in investigators, that didn't come out
17 that that had already been resolved.

18 So there is no issue with Mr. Coffey's
19 background. Everything was taken care of, again,
20 several years ago. So they are returning at the request
21 of the Board.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.
23 Any member questions? Member Flynn?

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Nixon?

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: None at this time.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Gronauer?

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Is there any
5 public comment?

6 Seeing no public comment, I would accept a
7 motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll make the
9 motion that ECAMSECURE is applying for a new corporate
10 private patrolman license. William D. Worrell is
11 applying for an individual private patrolman license.
12 If this is approved, he is requesting that his
13 individual license be placed into abeyance so that he
14 may become the qualifying agent. Member to be approved
15 is Christopher L. Coffey. This is subject to all
16 statutory and regulatory requirements.

17 And for the record, he is coming back before
18 us. He has addressed our concerns.

19 And I also want to thank you for your service.

20 MR. WORRELL: Thank you.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So we have a motion for
22 approval. Do we have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a second. Is
25 there any discussion on the motion?

1 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
2 signify by saying "aye."

3 (Board members said "aye.")

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

5 The motion passes unanimously.

6 Congratulations, Mr. Worrell. And good luck.

7 MR. WORRELL: Thank you. Thank you.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 27 is here,
9 up north, I believe. Right? Ball & Chain Security
10 Services. I really like that name.

11 MR. GOWER: The chain is in the back
12 (indicating a woman in audience).

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Sir, please
14 identify yourself, give us some of your background, and
15 tell us what your plans are.

16 MR. GOWER: Robert Gower, 29 and a half years,
17 approximately, in corrections. I retired as the warden
18 of the California Correctional Center. A friend of mine
19 called me up and asked me to help him out. He is in the
20 process of growing hemp, largest outdoor grove in the
21 United States currently, mostly automated. And it's in
22 Nevada, White Pine County.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Very good. All right.
24 Do we have any member questions? Member Gronauer?

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, I just want to

1 comment. I enjoyed his application where he explained
2 the lawsuits. Just being in corrections, you're going
3 to get sued. That's important. So I have no problem
4 whatsoever. I'm good. Thank you.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Nixon?

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Is there any
10 public comment? We have none north.

11 MR. INGRAM: No.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Nothing south. Then,
13 all in -- let's see. Then, I'll -- I guess, we better
14 get a motion before we can vote on it. I'll accept a
15 motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. I'll make a
17 motion to approve. Ball & Chain Security Services is
18 applying for a new corporate private patrolman license.
19 Robert L. Gower is applying for an individual private
20 patrolman license. If approved, he is requesting that
21 his individual license be placed into abeyance so that
22 he may become the qualifying agent. This is subject to
23 all statutory and regulatory requirements.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion. And
25 do we have a second?

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion, and
3 we have a second. Any discussion on the motion?

4 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
5 signify by saying "aye."

6 (Board members said "aye.")

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

8 The motion passes unanimously. Good luck,
9 Mr. Gower.

10 MR. GOWER: Thank you. Have a good day.

11 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Chair?

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yeah, it's Ray Flynn. Can
14 we take a five-minute bio break?

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Absolutely. Five
16 minutes for a bio break.

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Chair, we don't know
21 where Mr. Gronauer is. I propose we move forward with
22 the three of us.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Moving on, we'll
24 go to item 28, Eye Witness Security.

25 Good morning, sir.

1 MR. HOLT: Good morning, sir.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
3 yourself, give us a little bit of your background --

4 MR. HOLT: My name is --

5 BOARD MEMBER NADEAU: -- and what your plans
6 are.

7 MR. HOLT: Okay. My name is Derwin D. Holt.
8 For the last five years, we do event staffing. I worked
9 as the number one subcontractor for Allied Security as
10 well as CSC. I also started a ministry called Worship
11 to Work. We've gainfully employed over 300 young men
12 and women. And I'm looking to bring that here in Nevada
13 state, Nevada as well, with my ministry.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Member
15 questions. Member Nixon?

16 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Is there any public
20 comment?

21 MR. INGRAM: None.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Seeing no
23 public comment, I'd accept a motion.

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll make a
25 motion that Eye Witness Security, LLC be granted a new

1 corporate private patrolman license. Derwin D. Holt is
2 applying for an individual private patrolman license.
3 If approved, he's requesting that his individual license
4 be held in abeyance so that he may become the qualifying
5 agent. Member to be approved is Derwin D. Holt. This
6 is subject to all statutory and regulatory requirements.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion to
8 approve. Do we have a second?

9 (Board Member Gronauer rejoined the meeting.)

10 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Can I make a brief
11 comment?

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes.

13 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I do not know Mr. Holt,
14 but he is a subcontractor for Allied Universal. But
15 I've not met him before, so I don't think that I even
16 have a problem making a decision in this case. I just
17 wanted to put that in the record.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.
19 Thank you for the disclosure. Were you going to make a
20 second, Member Nixon, were you going to do the second?

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yes.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

23 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I will do the second.
24 Thank you.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have a

1 motion to approve. Discussion on the motion?

2 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
3 signify by saying "aye."

4 (Board members said "aye.")

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

6 Passes unanimously. Mr. Holt, congratulations.

7 Good luck.

8 MR. HOLT: Thank you guys very much.

9 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Thank you.

10 MR. HOLT: God bless you.

11 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Chair, for the record, Board
12 Member Gronauer is back with us.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Did I go somewhere?

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Item
16 number 29, Blackstone Security Services.

17 MR. SWINDALL: Good morning.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning. Please
19 identify yourself, give us a little bit of your
20 background in the company and what your plans are.

21 MR. SWINDALL: Yes. Good morning, Board.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning.

23 MR. SWINDALL: My name is Dan Swindall. I'm
24 the president and CEO of Blackstone Security Services,
25 based out of Phoenix, Arizona. I have got started in

1 security as an Air Force security policeman. And when I
2 got back from overseas, I went into the security
3 industry. It's been 42 years now. I'm the qualifying
4 party for Blackstone in Arizona and New Mexico, and I
5 currently sit on the DPS hearing board for the State of
6 Arizona. I'm also a member of "Viasser" (phonetic
7 spelling). And I'm applying for corporate private
8 patrolman license.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

10 Any questions for Mr. Swindall? Member
11 Gronauer?

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir. Again, good
13 morning to you.

14 MR. SWINDALL: Good morning.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You did five years in
16 the Air Force?

17 MR. SWINDALL: Correct.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And what type of
19 discharge? It doesn't show on here.

20 MR. SWINDALL: Oh, it's honorable. It's
21 honorable.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And what is the
23 service?

24 MR. SWINDALL: I had a four-year tour, and I
25 got orders to England. And I was married and had a

1 small child. And so, in order to take a family
2 overseas, you had to stay for 12 months. So I did a
3 three-year tour there.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. It just wasn't
5 marked, so I didn't know.

6 MR. SWINDALL: No. I apologize.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you. That's all.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Nixon?

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you for your
10 service.

11 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Is there
15 any public comment?

16 Seeing none, I'd accept a motion.

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I move that Blackstone
18 Security Services, Inc. is applying for a new corporate
19 private investigator's license. Daniel L. Swindall is
20 applying for an individual private license. If
21 approved, he is requesting that his individual license
22 be placed into abeyance so that he may become the
23 qualifying agent. Corporate officer to be approved is
24 Daniel L. Swindall. This is subject to all statutory
25 and regulatory requirements.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion for
2 approval. Do we have a second?

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. Second.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. And we have
5 a motion and a second. Any discussion on the motion?

6 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
7 signify by saying "aye."

8 (Board members said "aye.")

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

10 It passes unanimously. Good luck,
11 Mr. Swindall. And go forth. Congratulations.

12 MR. SWINDALL: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Thank
13 you, Board.

14 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck.

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Thank you.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 30, Timothy
17 Wells.

18 Good morning, sir.

19 MR. WELLS: Good morning, sir.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
21 yourself, give us a little bit of background on you and
22 what your -- and the company, and your plans.

23 MR. WELLS: Yes, sir. My name is Timothy
24 Wells. I am with Bedrock Protection Agency, since
25 December of this year became the branch manager. I'm

1 retired military, 20 years with the Army. From there,
2 moved to Las Vegas. Well, let me kind of go back up. I
3 also served as a hospital supervisor in Columbia, South
4 Carolina, for awhile. After that, I became a police
5 officer down with the South Carolina Department of
6 Public Safety, working mental health, before moving out
7 here to Las Vegas to become a security officer with G4S
8 Secure Solutions. I worked with them for 10 years. I
9 started as a regular officer and moved up through the
10 company to become an HR manager before transferring out
11 to Arizona for about eight months and becoming the
12 general manager.

13 I like Las Vegas a lot better. The company
14 went through a restructure. So I came back to Las
15 Vegas. And now I'm with Bedrock Protection Agency as
16 the branch manager. And I look to service the company
17 with our residential and commercial accounts and to grow
18 a business here.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

20 Any questions from the members? Member Nixon?

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None. Thank you for your
24 service.

25 MR. WELLS: Thank you, sir.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And Member Gronauer?

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It was the Army. None,
3 sir.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Is there
5 any public comment?

6 Seeing no public comment, I would accept a
7 motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I move that Timothy Wells
9 is applying for an individual private patrolman license.
10 If approved, he is requesting that his individual
11 license be placed into abeyance so that he may become
12 the qualifying agent for Bedrock Protection Agency, LLC,
13 license number 2183. This is subject to all statutory
14 and regulatory requirements.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion for
16 approval. Do we have a second?

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. Second.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
19 and a second. Discussion on the motion?

20 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
21 signify by saying "aye."

22 (Board members said "aye.")

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

24 The motion passes unanimously.

25 Congratulations, Mr. Wells. And good luck.

1 MR. WELLS: Thank you very much, sir. Thank
2 you, Board.

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good luck.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Item number 31,
6 Frederick Hutchison.

7 MR. HUTCHISON: Good morning.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good morning.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
12 yourself, outline your experiences and what your plans
13 are for you and your company.

14 MR. HUTCHISON: My name is Frederick Hutchison.
15 I grew up here in Las Vegas. I was in security in the
16 early '90s, got into a career in law enforcement, where
17 I just retired about a couple years ago from the
18 Henderson Police Department, where I served as a gang
19 detective, also in intelligence, various task forces,
20 along with the ATF was the last task force I worked
21 with. I retired and was approached by SecureCar, a
22 member there, to become their qualifying agent. I
23 accepted. And I'm just excited for a new adventure.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Great. Any questions
25 from the Board members? Member Flynn?

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes. What, when, what's
2 your retirement date?

3 MR. HUTCHISON: Retirement date is November
4 2016, I think it is.

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And what have you been
6 doing between then and now?

7 MR. HUTCHISON: I've been -- I got my PILB
8 card, and I've been doing some executive protection work
9 for some local companies. Team Zebra Tactical is one.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

11 MR. HUTCHISON: And with the guys over there, I
12 knew them from my search warrants I wrote.

13 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Did you buy time in PERS?

14 MR. HUTCHISON: I bought a little bit of time,
15 yeah.

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. Thank you. No
17 other questions.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Member
19 Gronauer?

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir. What did you
21 do prior to Henderson P.D.?

22 MR. HUTCHISON: I worked with Clark County
23 School District P.D. for about three years. I was, I
24 got to be, in that three-year period, I became an
25 instructor. And I was a gang detective over there. It

1 was kind of where I wanted to go.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm satisfied that it
3 wasn't some place before that wasn't accounted for.

4 Okay. I'm good.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Member
6 Nixon?

7 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I do have another
9 question, though. I mean Gronauer brings this up. Why,
10 this is why we've got -- normally, you breeze right
11 through. There's stuff that's missing in your
12 application. Why didn't you list like the school
13 district police?

14 MR. HUTCHISON: I think, it just asked for --
15 was it 15 or 10 years back? And that's all I listed
16 back. I apologize about that.

17 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, you don't have
18 anything to apologize. You're one of the few people
19 that follow that rule.

20 MR. HUTCHISON: I saw the instructions, so I
21 put it down.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. I take that
23 back. Thank you so much.

24 MR. HUTCHISON: You're welcome, sir.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Is there

1 any public comment?

2 Seeing none, I'd accept a motion.

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I make a
4 motion that Frederick Hutchison be granted a private
5 patrolman license. If approved, he is requesting that
6 his individual license be placed into abeyance so that
7 he may become the qualifying agent for SecureCar, LLC,
8 license number 2118, subject to all statutory and
9 regulatory requirements.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion for
11 approval. Do we have a second?

12 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion and a
14 second. Discussion on the motion?

15 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
16 signify by saying "aye."

17 (Board members said "aye.")

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

19 The motion passes unanimously.

20 Congratulations, Mr. Hutchison. Good luck.

21 MR. HUTCHISON: Thank you. I appreciate it.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck.

23 MR. HUTCHISON: Thank you.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 32, Brian P.
25 Koehn ("Kohn").

1 MR. KOEHN: Good morning, everybody.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Semper Fi.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Good morning, sir.

4 MR. KOEHN: Good morning.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
6 yourself, tell us a little about -- tell us about
7 yourself and what your plans are for you and your
8 company.

9 MR. KOEHN: Well, good morning again. My
10 name's Brian Koehn ("Kayn"). I'm a warden at the Nevada
11 Southern Detention Center. I've been in corrections for
12 26-ish years, the last 11 as warden. This is my fourth
13 facility as warden. Transferred to Las Vegas. And I'm
14 really happy with that, by the way. And so I'm here so
15 that we can keep doing business in Pahrump, Nevada with
16 our facility.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you. And I
18 apologize for mispronouncing your name.

19 MR. KOEHN: Ah, everyone does.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Do we have any
21 questions from the members? Member Gronauer?

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: How do you question a
23 Marine? Let me see. Do you know Howard Scully?

24 MR. KOEHN: No, sir.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: He was the previous

1 warden. Nevada State Prisons. Okay.

2 MR. KOEHN: I don't know the state facilities.
3 I don't. I'm not real familiar with them.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. So you
5 never worked at the prison. Okay. What I'm doing is
6 just I wanted to know, how many years did you put in
7 detention?

8 MR. KOEHN: Well, 26 years in corrections.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: 26. Sorry.

10 MR. KOEHN: 26 years, yeah.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. No problem.
12 Thank you. I'm good.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.
14 Member Flynn?

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No. All good.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Nixon?

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Is there any public
19 comment?

20 Seeing no public comment, I would accept a
21 motion.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. I'll make
23 the motion. I make the motion to approve Brian P.
24 Koehn.

25 MR. KOEHN: Close enough.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Is it close? Is
2 applying for an individual private patrolman license.
3 If approved, he is requesting that his individual
4 license be placed into abeyance so that he may become
5 the qualifying agent for CoreCivic, Incorporated, dba
6 Nevada Southern Detention -- Detection Center, license
7 number 2135. This is subject to all statutory and
8 regulatory requirements.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion to
10 approve. Do we have a second?

11 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion and a
13 second. Discussion on the motion?

14 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
15 signify by saying "aye."

16 (Board members said "aye.")

17 Opposed?

18 The motion passes unanimously. Mr. Koehn, good
19 luck. Congratulations. Thank you.

20 MR. KOEHN: Thank you, sir. Appreciate it.

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Thank you.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Thank you, and good luck
23 to you.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Number 33, Michael
25 Reece.

1 Good morning, sir.

2 MR. REECE: Good morning.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
4 yourself, give us a little bit of your background, and
5 tell us what your plans are.

6 MR. REECE: My name is Michael Reece. I've
7 been in security management for approximately the last
8 27 years. From '98 to 2016, I was corporate director of
9 security with Camden Property Trust. Prior to that, I
10 was with Hotel Gaming Companies. I'm looking to get my
11 private patrolman license. And that's it.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

13 Questions from the Board members? Member
14 Nixon?

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yes, I had questions
16 concerning the 2017 domestic violence.

17 MR. REECE: Yes. It was an unfortunate
18 situation involving my 36-year-old son who,
19 unfortunately, put his hands on his mother. And I
20 defended his mother. Went to court, prosecuted, decided
21 it was self-defense on behalf of my wife, and the case
22 was dismissed.

23 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Thank you.

24 MR. REECE: You're welcome.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any additional

1 questions?

2 No. Board Member Flynn?

3 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes. Mr. Reece, on the
4 application it doesn't have the date of your bankruptcy.

5 MR. REECE: 2010.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: 2010. Okay. And then
7 what have you been doing since 2016?

8 MR. REECE: 2016. I'm currently employed with
9 Cypress Security as a business development manager, as
10 of tomorrow, as they recently sold to Allied Universal.

11 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Why is that not on your
12 application? Because your application --

13 MR. REECE: It was a recent job prior to the
14 application.

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I'm sorry. What?

16 MR. REECE: I became employed with Cypress
17 after the application was filed.

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: So what did you do for
19 three years?

20 MR. REECE: I've been pretty much kicking it,
21 retired.

22 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay.

23 MR. REECE: Yeah.

24 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I get that one.

25 MR. REECE: Yes.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And then last, but not
2 least, I don't understand, what does an illegal use for
3 transportation means?

4 MR. REECE: That was involved with a situation
5 when I was 18 years old. And the vehicle in which that
6 I was driving, that belonged to me, but it didn't have
7 tags and et cetera, and the tag that was on it was
8 incorrect, so they filed a misdemeanor charge of illegal
9 use of transportation.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. Incorrect or
11 fictitious?

12 MR. REECE: It was incorrect. It was not, it
13 was not the right plate for the vehicle, fictitious, I
14 guess. It was a plate that I had taken off my mother's
15 vehicle.

16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. All right. I
17 think, I got it. We've got three cops on the Board.

18 MR. REECE: 40 years ago. Yeah, I see.

19 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: We've heard things that we
20 call them queuing policing. All right. All right. I
21 appreciate your responses. Thank you.

22 MR. REECE: You're welcome.

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: And that was a long time
24 ago.

25 MR. REECE: Yes, it was.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: I want the Board -- I want
2 the record to reflect that. Okay.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Gronauer?

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I think, Member Nixon
5 would like to say something first.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Oh.

7 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Again, I don't know
8 Mr. Reece, but I need to make it, you know, public that,
9 you know, he's been acquired by Allied Universal. And
10 so I'm not recusing myself, because I don't know him. I
11 think I can make a decision. But I wanted to make a
12 public record.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you for the
14 disclosure.

15 Any additional questions?

16 Seeing none, do we have any --

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Oh, I have a question,
18 sir.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Oh, you do? Okay.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, Mr. Chair. I
21 know, it's surprising.

22 On the investigative report, on page 3, all
23 right, it had on there the investigator found some
24 adverse information. Is that the information we were
25 talking about? That's all I need to know.

1 MR. SWARTHOUT: Correct.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Then, we're
3 good. Thank you for that.

4 I'm fine. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Thank you.
6 Is there any public comment?

7 Seeing no public comment, I'd accept a motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: It's Ray Flynn. I'll make
9 a motion for approval based on anything that was of
10 concern. We've got time and distance as well as
11 dismissals. And the applicant satisfactorily answered
12 our questions. And that Michael Reece is applying for
13 an individual private patrolman license. This is
14 subject to all times statutory and regulatory
15 requirements.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
17 to approve. Do we have a second?

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. Second.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion and a
20 second. Any discussion on the motion?

21 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
22 signify by saying "aye."

23 (Board members said "aye.")

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

25 All right. The motion passes unanimously.

1 Good luck. Congratulations.

2 MR. REECE: Thank you.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What was that phrase
4 you used for that licensure? What was the phrase you
5 used, how you described it?

6 MR. REECE: Fictitious.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Oh, that's what it is.

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Incorrect.

9 MR. REECE: Incorrect, incorrect license plate.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We're now moving to the
11 process server approvals. Number 34, Lisa W.
12 Logan-Hawkins.

13 Good morning.

14 MS. LOGAN-HAWKINS: Good morning.

15 MR. SOTO: Good morning.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
17 yourself and the gentleman at the table with you.
18 Please tell us a little bit about your background and
19 experience and what your plans are going forward.

20 MS. LOGAN-HAWKINS: I'm applying for the
21 process server license. I've been a resident of
22 Las Vegas for about 20 years. Over the last five,
23 pretty much five years, I've worked for ABI Document
24 Support Services. We handle process serving. I do
25 notaries for the company. And I'm looking to become

1 a -- the qualifying agent for ABI Document.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

3 Do we have any questions --

4 Oh, the gentleman with you.

5 MR. SOTO: Oh, I'm sorry. My name is John
6 Soto. I've been with ABI for 10 years. Excuse me. I
7 was just recently licensed by the Board as a process
8 server and was applying as a qualifying agent. But the
9 company has just recently handed me the state of Texas
10 to oversee as well as California and Nevada. So that
11 kind of delayed my move to Nevada, which is why we're
12 here today to have Ms. Hawkins licensed and, hopefully,
13 move to the qualifying agent.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

15 All right. Do we have any questions from the
16 members? Member Gronauer?

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir.

18 Ms. Logan-Hawkins, good morning.

19 MS. LOGAN-HAWKINS: Good morning.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have a work card
21 now, process server work card?

22 MS. LOGAN-HAWKINS: Yes, I do.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. How long has
24 that been in effect?

25 MS. LOGAN-HAWKINS: It's like eight years now.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. All right. Now,
2 there was something else on your report about a
3 settlement that you're recovering. Yeah, and do you
4 have any dates or documents to say this is all settled?

5 MS. LOGAN-HAWKINS: It's not totally settled.
6 We just came up with a settlement for a reduced amount.
7 And I'm working on -- yes, I -- yes, I did.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You did submit it to
9 them?

10 MS. LOGAN-HAWKINS: Yes, I did.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. That question's
12 been answered. So I'm fine.

13 MS. LOGAN-HAWKINS: Okay.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Member
15 Nixon?

16 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, I'm all good. Thank
19 you.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Is there any
21 public comment?

22 MR. INGRAM: None.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Seeing no public
24 comment, I would accept a motion.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. I'll make a

1 motion to approve. Lisa W. Logan-Hawkins is applying
2 for an individual process server license. If approved,
3 she is requesting that her individual license be placed
4 into abeyance so that it become -- she may become the
5 qualifying agent of ABI Document Support Services, LLC,
6 license number 1579. Members to be approved are Clare
7 Arguedas, Wesley J. Campbell and Jose M. Fernandez
8 de Castro. This is subject to statutory and regulatory
9 requirements.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion to
11 approve. Do we have a second?

12 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion and a
14 second. Discussion on the motion?

15 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
16 signify by saying "aye."

17 (Board members said "aye.")

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

19 The motion passes unanimously. Good luck.
20 Congratulations.

21 MS. LOGAN-HAWKINS: Thank you much.

22 MR. SOTO: Thank you, Board.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We now move on to
24 canine handler, number 35, Protective Force
25 International.

1 MR. ARRANT: Good morning.

2 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good morning.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good morning.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
5 yourself, talk about your --

6 MR. ARRANT: My name's Gary --

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: -- your --

8 MR. ARRANT: My name's Gary Arrant. I just
9 graduated academy, canine academy in -- from North
10 Carolina, a seven-week academy. I was number one in my
11 class. I'm happy.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.

13 Kevin, do we have any additional information on
14 this?

15 MR. INGRAM: I believe, Mr. Arrant was
16 scheduled once before for a Board meeting and was unable
17 to attend.

18 Is that correct?

19 MR. ARRANT: No.

20 MR. INGRAM: No? I guess not, then.

21 MR. ARRANT: No.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right.

23 MR. INGRAM: I guess not.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Thank you.

25 Are there any questions from the members?

1 Let's start with Member Nixon.

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Just for the investigator.

5 Who's Woody Chan?

6 MR. SWARTHOUT: Woody Chan is the canine

7 handler over at the Las Vegas Convention Center.

8 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: He works for the LVCC?

9 MR. SWARTHOUT: Yes.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Thank you. Just wanted to
11 clarify that. No, nothing further.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Member Gronauer?

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah, I just want to
14 say that I happened to meet Mr. Reece at my office. And
15 he has, they have an office in the same office complex,
16 78 offices, where my office is located. I met him just
17 by a handshake, saying hello. And that's about it. I
18 do not know him. I'm not personally involved with him.
19 So I don't feel I couldn't provide judgment to his vote.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Thank you
21 for the disclosure.

22 Is there any public comment?

23 Seeing none, I'd accept a motion.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Ray Flynn. I'll make a
25 motion that Protective Force International, LLC, license

1 number 2687, be granted a new canine handler license.
2 That Gary E. Arrant is applying for an individual canine
3 handler license. If approved, he is requesting that his
4 individual license be placed into abeyance so that he
5 may become the qualifying agent. This is subject to all
6 statutory and regulatory requirements.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion for
8 approval. Do we have a second?

9 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion and a
11 second. Discussion on the motion?

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I just have to say, I
13 just used the wrong name when I said that I know him. I
14 don't know him. It's Mr. Arrant. I said Mr. Reece.
15 So. Sorry about that.

16 MR. ARRANT: Okay.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No other discussion.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Seeing no
19 additional discussion, all in favor of the motion,
20 signify by saying "aye."

21 (Board members said "aye.")

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

23 The motion passes unanimously. Good luck, sir.

24 MR. ARRANT: Thank you. And thank you.

25 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Congratulations.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We'll move on to
2 private investigator and process server. Lawrence E.
3 Sanchez.

4 MR. INGRAM: Sanchez?

5 Not present.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Then, let's move
7 on. Let's just trail that and move on to number --
8 private patrol and canine handler, number 37, Global K9
9 Protection Group.

10 Good morning.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good morning.

12 MR. HOOKER: Good morning.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Please identify
14 yourself, give us a little bit of your background and
15 experience, and what your plans are for you and the
16 company.

17 MR. HOOKER: Absolutely. My name's William
18 Hooker, with Global K9 Protection Group. Spent -- I'm
19 retired military, 10 years as a military handler,
20 trainer, kennel master; 15 years reserve in
21 antiterrorism; and I had 15, or 14 years out of 15 years
22 in the private sector of canine. The plan for today is
23 to acquire a new private patrolman license and canine
24 handler license.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you. Did I see

1 that you're an explosives dog handler, or not; is that
2 correct, is it?

3 MR. HOOKER: Yes, sir. Yes.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Very good.

5 Any questions from the members? Member
6 Gronauer?

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir. You listed
8 four previous employments. And I'm told that you didn't
9 list any supervisor. Is there a reason for that?

10 MR. HOOKER: No. One of them was my own
11 company, one that we sold to another company. If I
12 failed to put that down, it was just my mistake.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Which company was that?

14 MR. HOOKER: MSA Security. And if I didn't put
15 one for the current one, for Global, that recently
16 changed as well.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And you allowed your
18 previous license, the Nevada license to expire?

19 MR. HOOKER: Yeah, when I left with MSA
20 Security, correct. It was not a good parting.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You ended up a major?

22 MR. HOOKER: I'm sorry?

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You ended up a major?

24 MR. HOOKER: Chief.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. All right.

1 Thank you. I have no more questions. Chief. I'm good.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Nixon?

3 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: None at this time.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

5 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No. Thank you for your
6 service.

7 MR. HOOKER: Thank you, sir.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: No more questions from
9 the Board members. Is there any public comment?

10 MR. INGRAM: None.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Seeing no public
12 comment, I'd accept a motion.

13 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Nixon. I move that Global
14 K9 Protection Group, LLC is applying for a new private
15 patrolman and canine handler license. William D. Hooker
16 is applying for an individual private patrol and canine
17 handler license. If approved, he is requesting that his
18 individual license be placed into abeyance so that he
19 may become the qualifying agent. Members to be approved
20 are Donald J. Clarkson and Eric S. Hare. This is
21 subject to all statutory and regulatory requirements.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion for
23 approval. Do we have a second?

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll second. Gronauer.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion and a

1 second. Any discussion on the motion?

2 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
3 signify by saying "aye."

4 (Board members said "aye.")

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

6 The motion passes unanimously. Good luck,
7 Mr. Hooker.

8 MR. HOOKER: Thank you, sir. Thank you, Board.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you.

10 MR. INGRAM: Is Mr. Sanchez here?

11 Still no Mr. Sanchez.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Let's go ahead
13 and move to registration appeals. And let's note that
14 with registration appeals there is no public comment.
15 This is, these are administrative hearings.

16 And we'll start with number 38, Richard Black.

17 MR. INGRAM: Richard Black?

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Are you Mr. Black?

19 MR. BLACK: Yes.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Mr. Black is up
21 north. And he was not sworn, sworn in. So he'll need
22 to be sworn in, as will -- you'll need to be sworn in at
23 the same time. Okay.

24 MS. BORDELOVE: Do we want to -- or let's go
25 ahead and do, reswear anybody who wasn't sworn in

1 earlier, if they may give testimony, both in the north
2 and south.

3 Will you be stand. Or raise your right hand,
4 good enough. Do you swear that the testimony you give
5 today will be the truth, the whole truth, and nothing
6 but the truth?

7 (All applicants and potential witnesses present
8 in Las Vegas and Carson City were sworn in.)

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Thank you
10 very much.

11 Okay. All right. Give us just a moment,
12 Mr. Black.

13 This looks like Investigator Saladino.

14 MR. SALADINO: Yes, Mr. Chair, Investigator
15 Saladino. The applicant was denied for a 1990 --
16 actually, it was for a 1993 sexual assault first degree,
17 which was changed to false imprisonment at a felony
18 level. The applicant received a sentence of one to --
19 one and a half to three years in prison. It wasn't
20 disclosed.

21 Also, in the fingerprint report, there was a
22 1990 sexual assault, two counts. Those two were
23 dismissed.

24 And then in '98, there was a misdemeanor DUI
25 where he was found guilty.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. So just to
2 confirm, identify yourself.

3 MR. BLACK: I'm Richard G. Black.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Richard G.
5 Black. So, Mr. Black, did you hear what he just
6 explained, that there are three --

7 MR. BLACK: No, I don't know where they came
8 from. The only one I know about was in Omaha. I don't
9 know what he's talking about, the rest.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. So --

11 MR. BLACK: In Omaha, what happened wasn't what
12 happened. I mean she was going to throw her down a set
13 of stairs. I stopped her from doing it. The next thing
14 I knew, she said, "My boyfriend said I can jump out of a
15 four-story window and fly." And I said, "No, you can't
16 believe it. You can't, you can't fly."

17 And then the cop came in. She had run. The
18 next thing I know, I went to jail. And the only thing I
19 heard from the government that was brung, and he had to
20 go on a case, he said, "Don't worry, it's a simple
21 case." He said, "Don't worry about a thing." The next
22 thing I know, they give me a new order.

23 Everything you say don't count. You don't look
24 back, the ones we look forward to. That was the last.
25 So I just, might as well give up. I'd probably get 50

1 years. The next thing I know, I don't know what
2 happened after that.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So you were convicted,
4 correct? Did you serve time in prison?

5 MR. BLACK: I was -- did the six months. They
6 didn't take me to court or nothing. They waited another
7 six months. Then they let me go.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Were on you
9 probation or parole?

10 MR. BLACK: No, none of that.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: You didn't have to
12 report or anything like that?

13 MR. BLACK: No.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. And what year
15 did that happen; do you recall?

16 MR. BLACK: It had to be around -- let's see.
17 Probably '91.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. So according to
19 the records that the PILB received from the FBI, you had
20 an arrest in 1990 for sexual assault, two counts. And
21 those, that, those were dismissed. Then you had an
22 arrest in 1993 for sexual assault --

23 MR. BLACK: No.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Let me finish. Listen,
25 listen through. The charge was changed to false

1 imprisonment, and that, and you were given time for
2 that. Were you -- have you ever been arrested for DUI?

3 MR. BLACK: No. I've been in jail. I was --
4 the cop who came here, I was having -- kicking, and put
5 me in the police station, because I wouldn't leave, so
6 they put me in jail. All right.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Were you drunk?

8 MR. BLACK: Huh?

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Were you drunk?

10 MR. BLACK: I had a few beers, you know. I
11 mean I wasn't totally drunk. They didn't want to put me
12 in jail, but I made them put me in jail.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. So how come you
14 didn't, how come you didn't disclose the one arrest that
15 you have had --

16 MR. BLACK: When I -- when we got the sheriff
17 here, my wife said, "He ain't got me on the record, so
18 go get security." I -- so I believed her, and I didn't
19 mention. Otherwise, I would have. I'm an honest
20 person. I don't believe in breaking the law. I don't
21 believe in a lot of things. And whether they're coming
22 or not, I do it the way of the law.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right. The
24 other Board members may have questions, so.

25 MR. BLACK: I'll ask any -- I'll answer

1 anything that I can.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Board
3 Member Flynn, do you have any questions?

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: No, sir.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Nixon?

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, sir.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Gronauer?

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right. Does
10 the investigator have anything else to add?

11 MR. SALADINO: No, Mr. Chair.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

13 All right. Then, I'll accept a motion.

14 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I'll make a
15 motion to deny the appeal based on staff's
16 recommendation.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
18 to uphold the denial. Do we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have a
21 motion and a second. Any discussion on the motion?

22 All in favor of the motion, signify by saying
23 "aye."

24 (Board members said "aye.")

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

1 So, Mr. Black, you are not going to be able to
2 get your registration now.

3 MR. BLACK: Okay.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. You can come
5 back in a year and reapply.

6 MR. BLACK: Can I ask one question?

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes, sir.

8 MR. BLACK: I went down and worked for Security
9 Unlimited.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

11 MR. BLACK: I worked 48 hours and never got
12 paid for it.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Now, there's a
14 remedy for that. And that remedy is that you go to
15 the -- help me out, Kevin.

16 MR. INGRAM: It's the Labor Commission.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I'm sorry?

18 MR. INGRAM: That the would be the State Labor
19 Commission.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I'm sorry. I still
21 didn't understand you.

22 THE REPORTER: THE State Labor Commission.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Oh, State Labor
24 Commission. There's an office in Reno. Do you live in
25 Reno, or to you live in Carson City?

1 MR. BLACK: I live here in Carson.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. There's an
3 office in Carson City. You go to the State Labor
4 Commission and you make -- you complain to them, and
5 they'll work with you to try to --

6 MR. BLACK: No, I think that whole company is a
7 real -- especially on a -- on a whatcha call it, you
8 know, they said.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

10 MR. BLACK: While I was sleeping in there.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So what was the name of
12 that company, again?

13 MR. BLACK: Security Unlimited.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Security Unlimited.

15 So, yeah, you can reapply for your registration,
16 security registration, a year from now. Okay?

17 MR. BLACK: Okay.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: But you can't now for a
19 year. But you can work, if I understand, you can work
20 in like a casino or something like that.

21 Is that correct, Kevin?

22 MR. INGRAM: Yeah, if he passes the background,
23 he can potentially work in security there.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Now, whenever you're
25 asked, when you're trying to apply for security, if

1 you're ever asked "Have you been arrested?" you need to
2 disclose. Okay?

3 MR. BLACK: Okay.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And there's no time
5 limit. You have to disclose. Okay? If you spend time
6 in jail, you have to tell it.

7 MR. BLACK: Okay.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right?

9 MR. BLACK: I'm not, I'm not even staying
10 there. Okay.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right.
12 Well, go to the Labor Commission. All right? Thank
13 you, Mr. Black.

14 MR. BLACK: Thank you.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. Number 39,
16 Lee Roy Calloway.

17 MR. INGRAM: Not present.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We'll trail
19 that one.

20 Number 40, Dewayne Darby.

21 MR. INGRAM: He's here.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. This is
23 investigator? Please identify yourself, sir.

24 MR. SALADINO: Investigator Saladino. The
25 applicant was denied for a 2007 carrying a concealed

1 weapon out of California. It was a misdemeanor. The
2 applicant received 36 months probation. And he did
3 disclose the application on the arrest, on the --
4 disclosed the arrest on the application.

5 And there was also a 2006 possession of a
6 controlled substance out of California. It was a
7 misdemeanor and another 36 months probation. That was
8 not disclosed. That was found on the fingerprint
9 report.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Sir, would you identify
11 yourself, please.

12 MR. DARBY: I'm Dewayne Darby.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

14 MR. DARBY: I moved to Las Vegas last year in
15 October.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Do we have
17 questions from the members? Member Gronauer?

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good morning,
19 Mr. Darby.

20 MR. DARBY: Good morning.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What you have -- how
22 long have you lived in Las Vegas?

23 MR. DARBY: Since last -- last year, October.

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. What have you
25 been doing?

1 MR. DARBY: Right now, I've been doing staffing
2 companies. I tried the security, trying to get a guard
3 card first. So I've been doing staffing companies.
4 Under the table, a little work, construction work.
5 That's it really right now.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have family
7 here?

8 MR. DARBY: Yes, ma'am. Yes, sir.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You disclosed the CCW,
10 carrying a concealed weapon --

11 MR. DARBY: Yes, sir.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: -- in the background.
13 Is there a reason you didn't disclose the PCS,
14 possession of controlled substance?

15 MR. DARBY: I forgot about that.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You had 36 months
17 probation. It's pretty hard to forget about it, you
18 know.

19 MR. DARBY: I'm just trying to forget about
20 certain stuff I did in the past. Right now, I got my
21 daughter and my kids with me. So I'm trying to do
22 better in life right now.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Where have you been
24 living since 2007?

25 MR. DARBY: 2007 was a long time ago.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Where did you live
2 since then till now?

3 MR. DARBY: Till now, gosh, well --

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Would it be in
5 California?

6 MR. DARBY: In California, I was in South
7 Central, Long Beach, Gardena, Beverly Hills. Then, in
8 2018, moved out here, me and my fiance, my three boys
9 and my two daughters.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right.

11 MR. DARBY: And I've had casino work. And I
12 was just, I've been doing staff work. I got custody of
13 my three boys. So I was trying to maintain everything
14 for them.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: So you lived in South
16 Central, also?

17 MR. DARBY: Yes, sir.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: How long did you live
19 in South Central; do you know what years you lived
20 there?

21 MR. DARBY: I was nine years old.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Oh, okay. All right.
23 When you're a teenager, it's a different place to live.
24 Okay. All right. So you had no other arrests since
25 2007?

1 MR. DARBY: No, sir.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No problems or run-ins
3 with the cops, no citations, no driving?

4 MR. DARBY: Oh, probably driving, yes. I got,
5 it was a speeding ticket out here. That was last month.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What have you done with
7 that speeding ticket?

8 MR. DARBY: I have a court date. I tried to
9 pay for it so I wouldn't go to court, to see how much it
10 was, and stuff like that. That's it.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have a driver's
12 license now?

13 MR. DARBY: Yes, sir.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Which state?

15 MR. DARBY: Los Angeles. California. I'm
16 sorry for that.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. All right.
18 Thank you. That's all I have.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.
20 Member Nixon?

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

23 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes. Mr. Darby, why do
24 you want to work in security?

25 MR. DARBY: Well, my friend's friend was doing

1 it up in California. My girl, her brother told me about
2 it. And I was planning on doing it before I left
3 California, but the time was kind of off. So when I
4 came here, go ahead and do security, help my family out,
5 what I'm trying to do right now. And I was working
6 at -- was it Allied Universal, to do it up here,
7 something about doing security. It'll help me out, for
8 my family.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: What was the controlled
10 substance?

11 MR. DARBY: Really I don't remember, sir.

12 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. What was the
13 weapon?

14 MR. DARBY: It was a nine-millimeter.

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: What was that all about?

16 MR. DARBY: Living in a nonsafe place, and I
17 thought I'd need one to -- just to have one, sir.

18 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. One other
19 thing. You need a Nevada driver's license.

20 MR. DARBY: Right.

21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: You're supposed to get one
22 within 45 days of living here.

23 MR. DARBY: Okay.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Any additional
25 questions from the members, anything?

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah, I'd like to
2 follow up, Mr. Chairman.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Go right ahead.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: On the carrying a
5 concealed weapon, it says with prior convictions. I
6 just have to ask the investigator. So, now, was that
7 prior arrest, prior arrest, is that for weapons?

8 MR. SALADINO: No, sir.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: That was the drug?

10 MR. SALADINO: Yeah, the reason he got it for
11 prior convictions was the controlled substance was 2006.
12 The weapons charge was 2007. And then, also, on the
13 fingerprint report, it does show a 1203.4 for the
14 weapons charge.

15 And the applicant does have a Nevada driver's
16 license. He provided us the interim document during his
17 application process.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You have a driver's
19 license?

20 MR. DARBY: Yeah, I have an ID, my Nevada ID.
21 I haven't gotten the driver's license yet.

22 MR. SALADINO: It's an ID card.

23 MR. DARBY: Yeah, for right now.

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. No problem.
25 All right. Thank you. That's all I had.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Any additional
2 information from the investigator?

3 MR. SALADINO: Just that the weapons charge was
4 dismissed under 1203.4.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

6 MR. SALADINO: And then we do have a Nevada ID.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Got it. Thank you very
8 much.

9 All right. With that said, I'd accept a
10 motion.

11 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: It's Ray Flynn. I'm going
12 to make a motion to approve based on time, distance. He
13 did admit to the more serious of the two charges, so
14 I've got reason to believe he did forget about the other
15 one. So that's my motion.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
17 to --

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll second.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: We have a motion to
20 overturn the denial, and we have a second. Any
21 discussion on the motion?

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, I second.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. So we have
24 a motion with a second, no discussion on the motion.
25 All in favor of the motion, signify by saying "aye."

1 (Board members said "aye.")

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

3 The motion passes unanimously. Sir, you will
4 get your registration.

5 MR. DARBY: Thank you.

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Congratulations.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It may be because of
8 your kids. That says a lot.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. Good luck to
10 you.

11 MR. DARBY: Thank you.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

13 With the indulgence of the Board, I'm going to
14 call number 62, Michael Pullos. Because I have to leave
15 early, I would like to have all the north ones taken
16 care of before I leave.

17 So please identify yourself, sir.

18 MR. PULLOS: Good morning. My name is Michael
19 Andrew Pullos.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And, I think, this is
21 Investigator Maxwell.

22 MR. MAXWELL: Yes, sir. Mr. Pullos was denied
23 for the following.

24 In 1996, out of California, he had a CCW in a
25 vehicle, which was a misdemeanor offense. The

1 disposition was convicted and jail. This was the reason
2 for the denial. It was not disclosed.

3 In 1997, out of California, possession of a
4 controlled substance, which was marijuana. It was
5 unknown. So was the disposition. They did not
6 disclose.

7 2000, out of California, possession of a
8 controlled substance and paraphernalia, at a misdemeanor
9 level, two years probation, four months jail. This was
10 disclosed.

11 Also in 2000, same offense, possession of
12 controlled substance and paraphernalia, misdemeanor,
13 one-year probation, seven months jail, fined, and the
14 probation was modified. This was not disclosed.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Mr. Pullos.

16 MR. PULLOS: Yes.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Would you explain why
18 you did not disclose three of the four that he just
19 discussed.

20 MR. PULLOS: Yeah, at the time of my
21 application, I explained to the lady that I really did
22 not know the dates of all the offenses.

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

24 MR. PULLOS: And the CCW, I totally forgot
25 about that one. Because I was stopped, and I was

1 actually taking a gun to someone else's house, because a
2 friend of mine called and said her and her husband were
3 fighting, and there was a gun in the house. So I just
4 removed it and was taking it to a friend's house. But I
5 totally forgot about that one. I had no idea that was
6 there.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Where was the gun
8 concealed in your car?

9 MR. PULLOS: I told the officer it was
10 underneath the front seat of my car.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

12 MR. PULLOS: I was driving a Volkswagen Karmann
13 Ghia. There was no place else to put it actually.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And what about the --
15 are all these accurate as far as the --

16 MR. PULLOS: Yes, sir.

17 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: You've been arrested
18 three times for possession --

19 MR. PULLOS: Absolutely.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: -- of a controlled
21 substance?

22 MR. PULLOS: Yes. That was a time in my life
23 where I was stoned, using a lot of drug,
24 methamphetamines, started to regret every minute of it.
25 I went to jail, and I did RCP, and I did a bunch of

1 programs in jail, got the only certificate of completion
2 in one of the psychology classes. And I just -- that's
3 the past. You know, it's something I did. I'm done.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: How long have you been
5 not using drugs?

6 MR. PULLOS: September 15, 2007.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

8 MR. PULLOS: Oh, it's actually 2005. Sorry.
9 Yeah.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

11 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Chair, just for the record,
12 there are two additional pages --

13 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yeah.

14 MR. INGRAM: -- of charges that we didn't get
15 to.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Correct.

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yeah.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: There are two what?

19 MR. PULLOS: There's probably more. I had a
20 lot of charges.

21 MR. INGRAM: Additional pages of charges.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Oh, okay.

23 MR. PULLOS: Yeah.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. I got it.
25 Thank you very much.

1 MR. PULLOS: And when I -- that's when I was
2 filling out the application, I told the secretary that I
3 just don't know all the dates I have. And even in my --
4 and I wrote a statement that I don't know all the dates.
5 But I am guilty of everything that it says.

6 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Okay. Yeah,
7 thanks for pointing that out. I just didn't scroll
8 down far enough.

9 Question. Where did you fill out your
10 application?

11 MR. PULLOS: Right here in Carson City.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Here at the --

13 MR. PULLOS: The PILB office.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right.

15 MR. PULLOS: Got everything submitted. I mean
16 I have actually overturned my felonies, had my felonies
17 down, converted to misdemeanors. I did everything I was
18 supposed to do. I did everything.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

20 MR. PULLOS: Actually, there's one that's
21 probably not here, an arrest in Reno in two thousand --
22 it was two years ago, for possession of drug
23 paraphernalia. Which was a dumb mistake. I picked up a
24 woman and gave her a ride. And we got pulled over.
25 Why, I don't know. But she had a meth pipe in her bra,

1 and she said it was mine. I took responsibility of it.
2 I did 20 days in jail so I didn't have to do a two-year
3 probation period. And the judge told me it would be off
4 my record, and I had no -- no conviction, I think.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

6 MR. PULLOS: I've been working ever since, and.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Where do you
8 work now?

9 MR. PULLOS: Right now, I work for Chewy.com.

10 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right.
11 Member Nixon, do you have any questions?

12 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yeah. The gentleman said
13 that he had been clean since two thousand, I think, five
14 or seven.

15 MR. PULLOS: Yes.

16 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: But he's got arrests for,
17 you know, paraphernalia all the way up until '17, you
18 know, 2015, 2015, 2017. So I mean have you --

19 MR. PULLOS: There should be nothing in 2015.
20 2017 is the drug paraphernalia that I just mentioned.
21 But I was tested, and I was not under the influence of
22 anything. I was released the same day on my own
23 recognizance.

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: On the report it says 20
25 days in jail.

1 MR. PULLOS: Right. That was after I went and
2 did --

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Was that time served?

4 MR. PULLOS: Yes, absolutely.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

6 MR. PULLOS: I was released, and then I chose
7 to do the 20 days rather than do the two years
8 probation. And that was after my court appearance.

9 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay.

10 MR. PULLOS: But 2015, I'm not sure what you're
11 referring to.

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: In 2015, it's
13 California prohibited owning or -- and possession.
14 Anyway, obviously, ammunition and maybe a gun.

15 MR. PULLOS: No gun. No, it was ammunition
16 that was --

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Possession of --

18 MR. PULLOS: -- for four shotgun shells. And
19 they told me that would be off my record if I completed
20 what they requested of me. I did 40, 40 hours of
21 community service and did informed drives. And the
22 reason why there was -- it said I was a felon in
23 possession of ammunition. And I had my felonies
24 overturned, so they reduced that. And I haven't heard
25 anything about it. I paid a \$400 fine, and I did my 40

1 hours of community service.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Nixon, any
3 additional questions?

4 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Again, why didn't you
5 disclose any of these? It says they were not disclosed.

6 MR. PULLOS: I thought I disclosed most of
7 them. I really did not know the dates. And on my
8 application, I listed 1990 plus, meaning that there was
9 more convictions up until 2000. I just didn't know the
10 dates at all. I had no -- I was putting that behind me.
11 And it's been a long time.

12 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No more questions.

13 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.
14 Member Flynn?

15 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: None.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Gronauer?

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right.
19 Then, I'll accept a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Ray Flynn. I move to
21 follow staff's recommendation for denial. We do not
22 have neither time nor distance. Plus, we have at least
23 a half dozen did not disclose. And I'm not satisfied
24 with the applicant's responses.

25 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Do we have a

1 second?

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We have a
4 motion and a second. Discussion on the motion?

5 All in favor of the motion, signify by saying
6 "aye."

7 (Board members said "aye.")

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. So you can
9 reapply in a year.

10 MR. PULLOS: Okay.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: And I would suggest
12 that you get with the office here and get a copy of the
13 criminal history.

14 MR. PULLOS: All right.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So that you know what
16 you're dealing with. And so if you do decide to
17 reapply, then you can go ahead and disclose.

18 MR. PULLOS: Because that's with a background
19 check, and I couldn't find any of that on that record.

20 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Yes.

21 MR. PULLOS: All right.

22 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Well, a different
23 level.

24 MR. PULLOS: All right. I appreciate your
25 time.

1 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right,
2 Mr. Pullos.

3 We'll move right along to go to item number 41,
4 Sade Easley ("Es-lee"). Easley ("Ees-lee")? I guess,
5 it's Easley.

6 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Not here.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: All right. We'll trail
8 that one.

9 Number 42, Emmanuel Foster.

10 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Mr. Foster is here.

11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

12 Please identify yourself.

13 MR. FOSTER: My first name is Emmanuel Gerald
14 Foster.

15 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. And Investigator
16 Saladino.

17 MR. SALADINO: Yes, Mr. Chairman. The
18 applicant was denied for a 1989 felony possession charge
19 out of California, a 2007 felony possession out of
20 California again, and a 2008 second degree felony
21 robbery where he received three years prison time. Two
22 years prison time. The applicant did disclose all the
23 arrests and convictions on his application, also
24 provided court documents showing that he completed all
25 the requirements for the courts, and has been very

1 forthcoming with information in regards to the arrests
2 and convictions. And that's why we're here today for
3 the appeal process.

4 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Thank you.

5 Mr. Foster, do you want to explain the arrests
6 and those circumstances?

7 MR. FOSTER: It's pretty much, in California,
8 trying to get clean and sober, kept -- kept relapsing,
9 kept, you know, trying all the, you know, different
10 rehabs.

11 And on the second degree burglary, robbery -- I
12 don't know which one -- you know, so I was just trying,
13 you know, to get clean one more time, just couldn't do
14 it, you know what I'm saying, out in the streets, you
15 know. So I did. And, you know, that was back in
16 January 20, 2008. I've been clean ever since, worked
17 for Solutions Recovery. And when Solutions --

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: What were of the
19 circumstances of the robbery?

20 MR. FOSTER: Under the influence.

21 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: What, who, what or who
22 did you rob?

23 MR. FOSTER: It was a hotel.

24 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. Questions from
25 the Board. Member Gronauer?

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What have you been
2 doing since two thousand -- when you say you're --
3 you're recovered now?

4 MR. FOSTER: Well, I came out here in 2012.
5 And I worked like little odds and ends jobs, you know.
6 And I went to work for -- in treatment for Solutions
7 Recovery. I was working in detox. I worked with them
8 for four years. They sold the company to American
9 Addiction. I'm active and on rehab.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Are you employed now?

11 MR. FOSTER: Yes. I work for Fletcher Goods
12 (phonetic spelling) on 14th and Fremont. You know, so
13 it's really I haven't really had a -- since I've been
14 out here, I haven't really been unemployed. I've been
15 unemployed for like maybe six months. I always worked.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What is the total time
17 you built?

18 MR. FOSTER: As far as what?

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Prison.

20 MR. FOSTER: Did 21 months.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: 21 months?

22 MR. FOSTER: Yeah, I went in on January 28 and
23 got out October the 15th, 2009. The 28th, January 28th.
24 And I got out in '09, the 15th of October.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have a driver's

1 license?

2 MR. FOSTER: Yes.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Have you had any other
4 run-ins with the law since then?

5 MR. FOSTER: No.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No traffic citations?

7 MR. FOSTER: Not even a traffic ticket.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good. I appreciate it.
9 Thank you.

10 MR. FOSTER: I did my homework.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Apparently, you studied
12 well.

13 MR. FOSTER: Thank you.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you. No more,
15 sir.

16 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

17 Member Nixon?

18 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

19 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Member Flynn?

20 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Why do you want to work
21 in the security field?

22 MR. FOSTER: For me, you know, it's something
23 different. I have a sister in Oakland, California doing
24 security. She told me, you know, "Once you do try it,
25 you'll understand." You know, I'm just trying to, you

1 know, do stuff now to -- you know, like I said, for me.
2 It's real hard for me to sit here right now, I mean. I
3 just lost my brother. And I lost my mom in 2014. I
4 just lost my brother May 10th, 2019. Just, you know, I
5 just came back from California, you know. So like I was
6 telling him, just like I told her, that I'm ready to
7 change. I'm just trying to keep changing. I just keep
8 trying to change and go forward.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Okay. Thank you.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Can I have a follow-up
11 question, Mr. Chair?

12 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Absolutely.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Mr. Foster, do you have
14 a security job lined up?

15 MR. FOSTER: I was just told, once you get the
16 guard card, you know. Because they did give me a
17 temporary one. I was supposed to, I was supposed to be
18 here in March. I don't know what happened. They just
19 didn't have me up on the calendar or something. And I
20 was supposed to get here. So now I'm here again trying
21 to get the guard card.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. I just wanted to
23 know if you have a job, anything lined up right now.

24 MR. FOSTER: No.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. No problem.

1 Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

2 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you.

3 Any additional Board member questions?

4 Any, any additional information from the
5 investigator?

6 MR. SALADINO: No, sir.

7 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. All right. I'll
8 accept a motion.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll make a motion to
10 approve, what do I say, set aside the denial, to set
11 aside the denial and approve Emanuel Foster, who applied
12 for registration and was denied, and approve that
13 Mr. Foster receive his card.

14 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Okay. We have a motion
15 to set aside the denial or overturn the denial. Do we
16 have a second?

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

18 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: So we have a motion and
19 a second. Discussion on the motion?

20 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion,
21 signify by saying "aye."

22 (Board members said "aye.")

23 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Opposed?

24 Mr. Foster, you'll get your registration now.

25 MR. FOSTER: Thank you.

1 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Good luck to you.

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Good luck.

3 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Board Member Flynn?

4 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Sir.

5 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: I'm turning the reins
6 over to you. Good luck.

7 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Thank you.

8 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Write if you get work.

9 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: All right. Have a good
10 day.

11 * * * * *

12 (Board Chairman Nadeau left the meeting, and
13 Acting Board Member Flynn began chairing the meeting.)

14 * * * * *

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.
16 Should we adjourn for the day?

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yeah.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I second.

19 (Laughter.)

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

21 number 43, Harvey Sidney. Mr. Sidney, are you here?

22 Well, we'll trail that one.

23 44, Joe Henry.

24 Mr. Henry, how are you, sir?

25 MR. HENRY: I'm all right, sir. How are you

1 doing?

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. If
3 you want to be in security, and at the same time you are
4 required to register as a sex offender, you're going to
5 have to convince this Board. We've never done this one
6 before. I'll be up front with you.

7 MR. HENRY: I understand that. I've been in
8 the state for 25 years now. And Arizona started. I was
9 based for 25 years. Moved out here in '93. So I was
10 working there. And I moved out here. Been with the job
11 for 25 years, until just February 9th -- February 14th
12 this year, I was released, let go.

13 I had no problem receiving, on my own, gaming
14 card, all that. I went -- when I applied for my gaming
15 card, they did call me, questioned it. And I still was
16 approved and everything else so far. I have not had no
17 issues at all receiving cards at all.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Did you -- were
19 you working for Arizona Trellis in 2009?

20 MR. HENRY: Yes, sir.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Did they know
22 about this arrest?

23 MR. HENRY: Yes, sir. I started working there
24 in '93.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Do you want to

1 tell us about the circumstances of that one?

2 MR. HENRY: I was, at the time, I was a foster
3 parent, dealt with foster kids, got the kids. And I had
4 a kid in the house, and she accused me of doing
5 something I didn't do. And I didn't want to get -- I
6 wanted to get involved. I got an attorney. He said,
7 "Hey, take the deal. They're going to put you on
8 probation for a year. You won't lose none of your
9 weapons or none of that, and continue working at the
10 casino." I'm like, "Okay. I'll take a deal." And my
11 attorney was Weiner, Dale Weiner. I went to court. He
12 went to court with me. They gave me probation for a
13 year. I went through my probation, went to classes like
14 I was supposed to and everything. After my probation, I
15 got a dishonorable discharge because I didn't just pay
16 my fine.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.
18 Investigator, do you have anything else to add?

19 MR. SALADINO: When gaming was contacted in
20 regards to the charges, they were quite surprised that
21 he still had his gaming registration, and that now it's
22 up for to be renewed, and they said they would not renew
23 it.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Do you
25 have the arrest report?

1 MR. SALADINO: I have the court documents. I
2 do not have the police report.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. All right.
4 Any questions from the Board?

5 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: This is for Investigator
6 Saladino. So he's been getting a gaming card every
7 year, or what is it, every five years?

8 MR. HENRY: Every five years, yes.

9 MR. SALADINO: So when it was renewed after the
10 incident had happened, I guess, they have a -- the chief
11 that was there was no longer there. The investigator
12 had put an opposition in the report for them to move
13 forward. And, apparently, it fell through the cracks,
14 and now it won't be renewed.

15 MR. HENRY: I even went through it again since
16 the five years. I got another five years and applied
17 for it. You know, I get, HR gets to pay for it, send it
18 for fingerprints and all that. And I got my gaming
19 license again. Every five years, four to five years,
20 whatever it was. I've been coming for 25 years.

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: And you said you're no
22 longer working for Arizona Trellis, they dismissed you?

23 MR. HENRY: Yes, ma'am.

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: And they knew about the
25 conviction since --

1 MR. HENRY: Yes, ma'am.

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Did they say why they
3 dismissed you?

4 MR. HENRY: Just released on -- they saw a
5 glitch in the computer, didn't say it was computer, a
6 glitch somewhere. But I got pulled over, and they said
7 I did not register. And I had registered. I had my
8 paperwork to prove it. They arrested me. Even though
9 the officer said, "I see you're registered, but I don't
10 know why this is saying you didn't."

11 So I went to court. The judge said, "You have
12 the paperwork?" I showed him my paperwork that it got
13 dropped to a misdemeanor. He said, "Okay. Release
14 him."

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: And when did you get
16 pulled over?

17 MR. HENRY: This was in December of twenty --
18 December of 2018 is when this happened, two thousand --
19 this is '20. 2019. It was in the last year. That's
20 when I got it, that's when they released me in February.

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay.

22 MR. HENRY: And I had called off. Well, you
23 can't call off and be incarcerated in jail. And I was
24 following all the rules and stuff under the rules and
25 regulations.

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. So that's why you
2 were dismissed?

3 MR. HENRY: Yes, ma'am.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Gronauer?

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. That was
6 December 2018?

7 MR. HENRY: '19.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No.

9 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: When you were pulled over.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: When you were pulled
11 over. It's not December '19 yet.

12 MR. HENRY: This is '20.

13 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: This is '19.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is 2019.

15 MR. HENRY: Oh. I'm thinking '20.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Just confuse me.

17 MR. HENRY: I'm thinking 2020. I'm sorry. I'm
18 sorry. Yes.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. So. All
20 right. In December 2018, you got pulled over.
21 Apparently, you had a citation or something, right? Did
22 you get arrested for it?

23 MR. HENRY: They arrested me because they said
24 I didn't have -- I wasn't registered.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And you applied

1 for your work card in March of 2019?

2 MR. HENRY: Yes, sir.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Don't show that arrest
4 on your record.

5 MR. HENRY: Because he dropped it right away.
6 The judge dropped it right away, because I had my
7 paperwork, and she was like --

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I have no problem with
9 that.

10 MR. HENRY: Oh, okay.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Mr. Santano, can you
12 help me out here?

13 MR. SALADINO: Yeah, Mr. Saladino.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Oh, I'm sorry.
15 Saladino.

16 MR. SALADINO: There was a December 25th, 2018
17 arrest for prohibited failing to register. He was found
18 guilty of a misdemeanor, and he got credit for time
19 served.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Apparently, I
21 just found that on my screen.

22 MR. SALADINO: I'm sorry about that.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And it might have been
24 one of the things that was added later on.

25 MR. SALADINO: It wasn't on the report that I

1 submitted.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Right. Okay. It's
3 just difficult, I need to tell you. You know, you seem
4 like a nice gentleman. You worked 23 years in one
5 place.

6 MR. HENRY: 25 years, yes.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: 25 years. That's cool.
8 But if gaming revoked your -- revokes your gaming card,
9 it makes it really difficult on this, on my behalf, the
10 way I look at it. Okay?

11 MR. HENRY: All right.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm just looking at it.
13 It's not personal. It's all business now.

14 MR. HENRY: I do understand it. I do
15 understand that, yes, sir.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you, sir.
17 Anyway, I have no more questions, sir.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. I'll
19 entertain a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm going to have to
21 make a motion on Mr. Henry to uphold the denial. Joe
22 Henry applied for registration and was denied.
23 Mr. Henry is, was appealing to the Board pursuant to
24 NRS 648.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: We have a motion.

1 Do we have a second?

2 Counsel, can I second? All right. I'll second
3 the motion. Any discussion?

4 Okay. Call for a vote. All in favor, say
5 "aye."

6 (Board members said "aye.")

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Opposed?

8 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Nay.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Two
10 to one to follow the recommendations of staff.

11 Number 45, Oveon Toney. And if I mispronounce
12 a name, my apologies.

13 MR. TONEY: You got it correct, sir.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Oh, wow.

15 MR. TONEY: How's going?

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: It's going good.
17 How are you today?

18 MR. TONEY: All right.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

20 Mr. Toney, your work card was denied. Why don't you
21 talk to me and tell me what you know.

22 MR. TONEY: In two thousand --

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You've got to talk a
24 little louder, though.

25 MR. TONEY: In 2005 --

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Do you want to
2 move that over towards you (microphone)? All right.
3 He's going to sit there.

4 MR. TONEY: I believe, it was between 2005,
5 2006.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Right.

7 MR. TONEY: I had a concealed weapon charge.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Right.

9 MR. TONEY: I ended up getting probation for
10 that.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: M-hm
12 (affirmative).

13 MR. TONEY: And did complete that, that
14 sentence to prison for two years. Got out in three
15 months. I haven't been in trouble ever since then, you
16 know.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Who's the
18 investigator on this?

19 MR. SALADINO: Investigator Saladino.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Boy, you're busy
21 today. You mentioned that he failed to disclose these.

22 MR. SALADINO: It was, the carrying a concealed
23 weapon was listed. The 2005, obtain or possess a credit
24 card without owner's consent, that gross misdemeanor was
25 not listed. The probation was revoked, and the sentence

1 was modified to nine months CCDC, minus 181 days for
2 credit for time served.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Well.

4 MR. TONEY: I don't remember that.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: What?

6 MR. TONEY: I don't remember that.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Well, you
8 remember it now. You didn't remember it when you did
9 your application. Do you want to explain?

10 MR. TONEY: It slipped my mind totally.
11 Totally.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You were
13 sentenced to nine months and it slipped your mind?

14 MR. TONEY: Yeah.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. All right.
16 Any other questions from the Board?

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, sir.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. I'll
20 entertain a motion from the Board.

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I move that we uphold the
22 decision to deny Joe Henry's --

23 MR. TONEY: No, Toney.

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Sorry. What's the first
25 name? I am so sorry.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Oveon.

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Oveon Toney's registration
3 due to not disclosing the conviction.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Got a
5 motion. Do I have a second?

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Second.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Any discussion?

8 All right. Call for a vote. All in favor of
9 the motion, say "aye."

10 (Board members said "aye.")

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All opposed?

12 Okay. The motion carries. Your work card will
13 remain denied. You can reapply in a year, sir.

14 MR. TONEY: Thank you.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

16 MR. INGRAM: Mary?

17 MS. KLEMME: Yes?

18 MR. INGRAM: Mary, can I get you to mute your
19 microphones unless you need to speak to us, because
20 we're getting some feedback.

21 MS. KLEMME: Okay.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

23 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Oh, that's much
25 better. Not that we don't mind hearing you. Okay.

1 All right. Number 46, Frank Troiano
2 ("Try-an-yoh"). I hope I --

3 MR. TROIANO: "Try-awn-oh."

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: "Try-awn-oh."

5 Okay. Okay. Are you okay, sir?

6 MR. TROIANO: Okay. I have a peg leg.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

8 MR. TROIANO: Thank you.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You're quite
10 welcome. All right. Your work card was denied. And
11 you've got some recent history, which is never good for
12 the Board. But I will let you say what you want to say,
13 sir.

14 MR. TROIANO: I was charged this summer with a
15 concealed without a permit. And it got dropped to a
16 misdemeanor. I ended up paying some fines. And that
17 was it. It'll come off my record soon, even my attorney
18 was saying. The reason being is two years ago, on
19 St. Patrick's Day, I was shot, nearly killed. I died
20 twice, 10 minutes each time. I lost too much blood. I
21 got hit in the artery. I suffered from PTSD after that.
22 And for two years, it's been quite a road, you know.

23 And I was just on my motorcycle. And because
24 of my plastic up here on the socket, I couldn't like
25 open carry my weapon, and so I put it right here

1 (indicating) just to get from point A to point B. And I
2 got pulled over. I told him. I was honest with him.
3 And he took me, he had to take me to jail.

4 It all got dropped, though. And I didn't even
5 have to do probation, never did jail time, never even --
6 I'm 41 years old and never had any real, never any,
7 nothing serious at all, you know.

8 And here I am, I just want to forward with my
9 life and serve a purpose. I have a job opportunity with
10 amazing people that know me well and like me a lot.
11 And, you know, with my leg situation, you know,
12 disability thing, I'm too young. I have a lot of life
13 to live. I just, I have this job opportunity, and I
14 just really would love to. This would mentally and
15 physically be great for me.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Are you
17 looking?

18 MR. TROIANO: No, I'm not.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: So why don't you
20 explain to me the circumstances of you being shot.

21 MR. TROIANO: I was actually a Good Samaritan,
22 you know, wrong place, wrong time. I was coming home
23 from a friend's house, and there was a road rage
24 incident at a red light. The guy said I cut him off.
25 And he pulled up in his car. And I ride a motorcycle,

1 you know. And I still ride a motorcycle, you know. And
2 he jumped out of his car and hit me off the bike. The
3 bike fell. And so I got up. And he pulled out a gun,
4 and he shot me and ran off. And I was left there at
5 2:00 in the morning to die on the street like a dog.
6 And I didn't even do nothing wrong, you know. I woke up
7 in the hospital on life support. Miraculously, I'm
8 here.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

10 MR. TROIANO: And I never had any other stuff
11 in my life. I'm 41 years old. I want to start a
12 family. I met an amazing woman. And this job means
13 everything to me.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: What are you
15 doing for employment now?

16 MR. TROIANO: Right now, I'm just waiting.
17 Because I don't have anybody lining up to hire a guy
18 with one leg, you know. So I've been -- it was two
19 years to recover. I was in a wheelchair for 12 months,
20 you know. So I had a lot of physical therapy to get
21 where I'm at right now.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: So why do you
23 want to work in security?

24 MR. TROIANO: It's not security. It's actually
25 repossessing vehicles, recovery agent. And just either

1 the camera cars, stealing plates, or in the tow truck.
2 So this, this will be like the biggest thing to change
3 my life around. Like to just mentally, after all the
4 stuff I've been through, suffering, it will really help
5 me.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

7 MR. TROIANO: That's all.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. All
9 right. Any questions from the Board?

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes, sir.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Gronauer.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm just trying to
13 understand. They had two charges for this, chase, speed
14 21 miles per hour over the posted limit, dismissed out
15 of the courts. Okay. And a firearm charge was reduced
16 from a felony to a misdemeanor. Do you have any weapons
17 now?

18 MR. TROIANO: No.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you own any weapons?

20 MR. TROIANO: No. Ever since then, I left it
21 alone. I just want to move forward, you know.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I appreciate you
23 disclosing this. And it's very recent, and it's just
24 July of 2018.

25 MR. TROIANO: Yeah.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And then, can I ask you
2 what company is offering you a job?

3 MR. TROIANO: Recovery Network of Nevada, sir.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Recovery Network?

5 MR. TROIANO: Yes.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Mr. Saladino?

7 MR. SALADINO: Yes, sir.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Is that you? Okay.
9 Did we get anything from an employer, a prospective
10 employer, any kind of letter or anything?

11 MR. SALADINO: I have not, sir.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Do you have a
13 letter from your employer, from the possible employer?

14 MR. TROIANO: No, I don't, sir. But they would
15 back me up on anything.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well --

17 MR. TROIANO: They're good friends and
18 everything.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. You have to
20 understand that the CCW, carrying concealed weapon, but,
21 you had a suspended jail sentence, because that means
22 you still were found guilty.

23 MR. TROIANO: Yeah.

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. You said there
25 was nothing to it and that everything was done. And

1 it's -- well, it's not exactly the truth. So you have
2 to understand how that goes. Right now, that's all I
3 have, sir.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Any other
5 question from the Board?

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No questions.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I'll entertain a
8 motion.

9 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I'll make a motion. I
10 move that we overturn Joe Henry's denial. Mr. Henry is
11 appealing the decision, and that I move that we overturn
12 it since he did disclose it.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. I have a
14 motion. Do I have a second?

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Oh, sorry. It's the wrong
16 name.

17 MR. TROIANO: Frank Troiano.

18 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Frank Troiano. Sorry.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You're going to
20 have to scratch Joe Henry. Just color it all in, color
21 it all in.

22 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Thank you.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You're welcome.

24 All right. We have a motion. Do I have a
25 second?

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It's the very first for
2 you.

3 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: The very first.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yeah, I'll call
5 for a second a second time.

6 And I'll call for a second a third time.

7 All right. The motion doesn't pass. I'm
8 seeking another motion.

9 All right. I'll make a motion. I'll make a
10 motion we're going to deny, only because we don't have
11 time and distance.

12 You've been sitting here this morning. We're
13 looking at people that haven't been arrested in 10
14 years, 12 years, 15 years. You haven't even been 12
15 months. And I understand what you're going through. So
16 what I would ask you to do is come back in a year. And,
17 also, bring your potential employer.

18 MR. TROIANO: Okay.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Because that's
20 got a lot.

21 MR. TROIANO: Yeah.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: We will take that
23 into mind.

24 MR. TROIANO: Okay.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: But please

1 understand, it hasn't even been 12 months.

2 MR. TROIANO: Yeah.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: So I don't even
4 have time and distance. But don't go anywhere. They
5 don't always agree with me.

6 MR. TROIANO: Okay.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. But
8 that's my motion. Do I have a second?

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll second.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. We
11 have a motion and a second. Any further discussion?

12 All right. I'll call for a vote. All in favor
13 of the motion, say "aye."

14 (Board members said "aye.")

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All opposed, say
16 "nay."

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Nay.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. The motion
19 passes two to one. We will support staff. Your work
20 card is denied.

21 MR. TROIANO: Okay.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Good
23 luck to you, sir.

24 MR. TROIANO: Thank you.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Come back in a year,

1 and get that employer to talk up for you. Okay?

2 MR. TROIANO: Okay. Thank you.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Number 47, Tomas
4 Baltazar.

5 Have a seat. You know what, do me a favor.
6 Sit in that one. Either that or move the mic. Your
7 choice. All right. That's even better. Thank you.

8 MR. BALTAZAR: Yep.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.
10 Mr. Baltazar, you are in front of us. And tell us
11 what's going on and why you think you should get a work
12 card.

13 MR. BALTAZAR: I came like two years ago. You
14 told me to come back in a year. So I'm trying again.
15 And I've been working retail ever since I came, got
16 denied. I work with the public. So I got to be right
17 with them, you know, be nice and everything. And the
18 first time, I think, you had a problem with the other
19 thing. So I was denied.

20 But, yeah, I'm just trying to get it again
21 right now, see how you guys think.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Who's the
23 investigator on this?

24 MS. DONALD: Investigator Donald.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Ms. Donald, is

1 that correct, we asked him to come back?

2 MS. DONALD: That is correct. He appeared
3 before the Board in September of 2016. He had two
4 arrests in 2000 and that he did disclose. He received
5 probation and jail time for them, and he was honorably
6 discharged. The reason he was originally denied back
7 then was because it was a weapons conviction at the
8 misdemeanor level.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Yeah, I --
10 I'll go out on a limb here. I think, I was the one that
11 asked you to come back.

12 MR. BALTAZAR: Yes, I remember you
13 specifically.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Oh, yeah, well,
15 I'm easy to remember. Trust me. All right. What have
16 you been doing the last two years?

17 MR. BALTAZAR: Right now, I've been working. I
18 worked at Toys "R" Us before they closed. Then I was
19 unemployed for like two months. And right now, I'm at
20 Target.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Thank
22 you for coming back. Thank you for hanging in there.

23 MR. BALTAZAR: Thank you.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You haven't been
25 in trouble in the last few years.

1 MR. BALTAZAR: Yeah, I'm trying to do right.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Any
3 other questions from the Board?

4 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. I'll make
7 a motion that we overturn the denial.

8 You've stayed out of the trouble. We have time
9 and distance. We've got 11 years since you've been in
10 trouble. You are gainfully employed. And you answered
11 all the questions truthfully.

12 That is my motion. Do I have a second?

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Second.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Motion and
15 a second. Any further discussion?

16 All in favor, say "aye."

17 (Board members said "aye.")

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Any opposed?

19 The motion carries. You will get your work
20 card.

21 MR. BALTAZAR: All right. Thank you very much.
22 Thank you.

23 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Congratulations.

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: That's a big deal.

25 MR. BALTAZAR: All right. Thank you guys.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

2 Mr. Boerdam? Okay. I'll try another one. Is Jason
3 here?

4 All right. Mr. Boerdam doesn't appear to be
5 here. We will trail that one, also.

6 Ms. Maxey.

7 Ms. Maxey, will you help me out with your
8 proper pronunciation of your first name.

9 MS. MAXEY: "Roy-ahn-ah."

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: "Roy-ahn-ah."
11 Good afternoon.

12 MS. MAXEY: Good afternoon.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. So tell us
14 what's going on. Why do you want a work card?

15 MS. MAXEY: Honestly, I'm just, I'm ready to
16 change my life. I've been arrested about five times,
17 and it was all just to provide for my kids. And I was
18 young and didn't really have an understanding to life
19 and the right things that I should be doing, and I made
20 bad choices. And the choices was just to provide for my
21 kids. Like everything that I was doing, I was just
22 trying to provide for my kids. That was all.

23 And now I'm 25 years old. And I know that
24 those choices that I was making, even though it was, you
25 know, to make sure my kids didn't go hungry or anything,

1 I know that they weren't right. And I know that I have
2 to work, and I have to earn my living the right way.

3 And that's why I'm here now just trying to
4 change any life around so that I won't be taken away
5 from my kids again.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. We're not
7 even two years since your last arrest.

8 MS. MAXEY: Two years?

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: July of 2017.
10 It's not July yet. What kind of items were you
11 stealing; were stealing items to resell, or were you
12 stealing food?

13 MS. MAXEY: Yes, sir, I was stealing items to
14 resell.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. What are
16 you doing the last two years since, or the last 23
17 months?

18 MS. MAXEY: I've just been doing hair. Because
19 I've been doing hair since I was 13 years old. It's --
20 I don't have a lot of clientele. I don't really know a
21 lot of people like that. So I wasn't making enough
22 money to provide for my kids and to pay, you know, where
23 I was staying at.

24 And I'm just trying to make a different way,
25 just trying to do something different. Like I don't

1 want to -- I'm not that type of person, and just put
2 myself in destruction. Like I just want to do better
3 for my kids. That's all. I just want to do better.
4 That's it.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. I have no
6 further questions. Any other questions from the Board?

7 What?

8 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: This is the one we're
9 talking about?

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yeah, we're done
11 with Joe Henry.

12 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Thank you.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Can you say that, what
14 happened?

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yeah. So could you
16 explain why you didn't disclose the -- there's some back
17 in 2014 that weren't disclosed in the initial
18 application.

19 MS. MAXEY: 2014. I don't remember what was
20 going there. What went on back then?

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: There's petty larceny and
22 battery, petty larceny, petty larceny and false --

23 MR. INGRAM: Statement.

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: -- statement, obstruction.
25 And these were here in Nevada.

1 MS. MAXEY: I have my arrest, everything that's
2 on my record with me. I thought that I disclosed
3 everything on there. Because I had it right here in
4 front of me.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: These are North
6 Las Vegas and Henderson arrests.

7 MS. MAXEY: North Las Vegas and Henderson
8 arrests? Yes. What do you want me to say, talk to you
9 about this?

10 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Did you -- you didn't
11 disclose them. Was there a reason why?

12 MS. MAXEY: Honestly, I'm guessing that I
13 forgot. I got a copy of my -- my background from Metro
14 Police Department, and I put everything that was on the
15 record on my application.

16 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Gotcha. Thank you.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Who's the
18 investigator on this?

19 MS. DONALD: Investigator Donald.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Anything you want
21 to add?

22 MS. DONALD: No.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Any other
24 questions from the Board?

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes. Are you working

1 now besides doing hair?

2 MS. MAXEY: No, I'm not.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: How many children do
4 you have?

5 MS. MAXEY: I have older two kids. I have an
6 eight-year-old, a six-year-old. And I just had a baby,
7 but she's one now. So I have three in total.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And they live with you?

9 MS. MAXEY: Yes.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And what are you
11 planning on doing if you get a work card?

12 MS. MAXEY: Working.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Where?

14 MS. MAXEY: I had, I had a job lined up. I'm
15 not sure if it's still in place right now, because it's
16 been about two months ago. I applied for Bedrock
17 Protection Security, and they wanted me to bring in my
18 guard card and stuff like that. But I knew that once
19 I -- I applied first for my work card, but I knew I had
20 to have time in order for it to get approved. And with
21 me not having any felonies or anything like that, I
22 thought that I would be approved. So that's why I
23 applied for the Bedrock Protection Security. But I
24 ended up getting something in a note saying that I
25 wasn't approved. So I never went to the interview or

1 anything like that.

2 And I'm just here now just trying to see where
3 to go from here.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well, I think, you
5 heard earlier, you know, time and distance is a big
6 thing. And you have quite a few of these larcenies on
7 your record. And they go -- you know, '14 was bad year
8 for you, and then in '16, but then again in January of
9 '15. And these are all guilty. And the ones you
10 forgot, you had to spend some time in the jail, from
11 what it says here, two days in jail in 2014. And, you
12 know, it's -- I worked in the jail one time.

13 I guess, I have a problem with the time and
14 distance on it. I mean you seem like a very nice lady.
15 You seem like you really want to turn your life around.
16 And you had that job lined up. Have you ever pursued
17 any more about it, since you knew you were coming for
18 your work card or anything?

19 MS. MAXEY: I haven't pursued anything else.
20 But I just wanted to get everything in order to make
21 sure that once I go for it, that it's all said and done.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. The ones that
23 you didn't disclose, like I said, are North Las Vegas
24 and Henderson. And whatever Metro gave you, I don't
25 know, but it wasn't on the North Las Vegas, Henderson

1 crime. That's all. Thank you.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Any other
3 questions?

4 All right. Call for a motion.

5 I'll call for a motion a second time.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm thinking.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I know, but the
8 motion will die.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm trying to be quiet.

10 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I move that we uphold the
11 denial of Ms. Maxey due to time and distance and the not
12 disclosing the 2014 larcenies.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I'm going to
14 second that. And, well, any discussion?

15 You know, besides time and distance, ma'am,
16 there's also the fact that you were a prolific
17 larcenist. And one the things in the security industry
18 is the folks that work that are entrusted with property,
19 and lots of property. And, I think, we need some more
20 distance between your arrests to show that you've gotten
21 larceny out of your heart. Okay. So.

22 All right. All in favor, say "aye."

23 (Board members said "aye.")

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Motion
25 carried. The work card is denied.

1 MS. MAXEY: Thank you.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Good luck to you.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Come again in a year.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Mark White.

5 How are you today?

6 MR. WHITE: Good afternoon.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. You had a
8 work card application denied. Let's hear your side.

9 MR. WHITE: Yeah, it was, it was denied. I
10 didn't know that I didn't disclose any of my record.
11 Actually, I -- 17 years, I've been, you know. Whether I
12 did or did not, they wanted it, they wanted it
13 disclosed, so.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Who's the
15 investigator?

16 MS. DONALD: Investigator Donald.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I'm really
18 confused. Do we have the right, do we have the right
19 gentleman? Yeah, you did disclose.

20 MS. DONALD: And the reason he was denied --

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You told the
22 truth.

23 MR. WHITE: Well, I -- when -- yeah, but I'm
24 saying that I...

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Your hair is going to

1 grow.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Let's
3 start from scratch. I'll go with the investigator
4 first. Maybe she can remind you what you said or you
5 didn't say. Okay. Go ahead.

6 MS. DONALD: In 1998, Mr. White was sentenced
7 to seven years prison for possession with the intent to
8 distribute cocaine.

9 In 1996, he was -- in 1996 and -- okay, yeah,
10 transporting, selling narcotic, controlled substance.
11 That was a felony. He was sentenced to three years.

12 He served both the '96 and '98 sentences
13 currently. He was released from prison in 2003.

14 In '92, he had a possession purchasing cocaine
15 felony. He was sentenced to four years and ended up
16 serving about one year.

17 So he was denied for the felony charges. He
18 disclosed them on the application. His fingerprint
19 results confirmed what he listed. And he's not been in
20 trouble with the law since his release from prison in
21 2003.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: So your history,
23 going from user to seller, when you went to prison. And
24 you have not been in trouble since 1998. Is that
25 correct?

1 MR. WHITE: No trouble. Well, it was using.
2 Of course, you sell to support to use it, so.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: People do.

4 MR. WHITE: Well, yeah, exactly. But, yeah,
5 no, I haven't been in trouble. I've been working since.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Well, call
7 it what it is, it's a drug deal.

8 MR. WHITE: Yeah. Yeah, that period, so.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. But
10 it was over 20 years ago. All right. What are you
11 doing now, today?

12 MR. WHITE: I'm one of the -- I'm a newer
13 self-employed, got my own business, Property
14 Preservation. And I also do Uber. And I'm trying to do
15 this in between, because my contracts pay me every other
16 day. So I got to supply in between.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: What is your own
18 business?

19 MR. WHITE: Property Preservation.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Which means?

21 MR. WHITE: Which means you preserve property.
22 Meaning when the house is going to foreclose, they send
23 me the work orders, and I go take care of the
24 winterization, plumbing, roofing, the lawn, whatever it
25 needs, so they can get it back, so they can basically

1 sell it, everything's up to code, so they can say, hey,
2 we can sell it.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Thank
4 you.

5 Anything other questions from the Board?

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes. Do you have a
7 business license?

8 MR. WHITE: Yes, I do have a Nevada business
9 license. And I have, I have two, because I have to have
10 one for Uber, and I have one for what I do, for Property
11 Preservation. And I have an asset managing permit. So,
12 yeah, I got everything.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Good. I'm good.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. I'll
15 entertain a motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll make a motion to
17 overturn the denial. Not on that one.

18 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No, that's the other guy.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Number 51.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I've got it right here.
21 Overturn. I make a motion to overturn the denial of
22 Mark White, who applied for a registration and was
23 denied. I really believe that because of the time and
24 distance and he seems to have his feet on the ground
25 now. So that's my motion.

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: There's a motion.
3 Do I have a second?

4 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Any
6 further discussion?

7 Hearing none, call for a vote. All in favor?

8 (Board members said "aye.")

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Any opposed?
10 Okay. You'll be getting your card.

11 MR. WHITE: Thank you, sir. Appreciate it.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Bassey.
14 Jacques Bassey?

15 All right. We will trail Mr. Bassey.

16 Mr. Brown, Kenneth Brown. Come on up.

17 MR. BROWN: How are you today?

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I'm doing great.
19 People remember me two years later.

20 Okay. Mr. Bassey, why are -- let's see. Ooh,
21 you're another recent one. All right. I want to hear
22 the story.

23 MR. INGRAM: It's Mr. Brown.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Oh.

25 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yes.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: My apologies.

2 Now I'm -- see, it's not just her.

3 MR. INGRAM: We're going to have to separate
4 you guys.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. All
6 right. We got a failure to disclose. All right. Let's
7 go.

8 MR. BROWN: Oh, I just moved here from Texas --

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Uh-huh
10 (affirmative).

11 MR. BROWN: -- in January.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Sure.

13 MR. BROWN: And I've been working security here
14 for Allied Universal. And I applied for my card, and
15 they just denied me. And I did say I disclosed it, on
16 my case where I'm from. And I'm just trying to
17 overturn it.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: So you're working
19 for security?

20 MR. BROWN: Yes, sir. Well, I don't work for
21 Allied no more, but I work for CAC. It's event
22 staffing.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I'm a little
24 confused now.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Now I'm confused.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I'm really
2 confused. Who's the investigator on this?

3 MR. MAXWELL: Investigator Maxwell.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Maxwell,
5 please. I'm confused.

6 MR. MAXWELL: He was initially made
7 provisional, because the arrests that's denying him were
8 out of Texas. We didn't see them until we got the
9 fingerprint report.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Gotcha. Okay.
11 All right.

12 Go on.

13 MR. BROWN: Oh. That's it. I just, I hope
14 that I can get the denial to get my work card so I can
15 work in security.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: What did you do
17 in Texas before you moved here?

18 MR. BROWN: Oh, I was working in a warehouse,
19 different jobs, odd jobs, and stuff like that.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

21 MR. BROWN: I worked for CAC down there, too.
22 I did like a lot of sporting events and stuff like that.
23 And, basically, that's it. I mean I'm a pretty good
24 worker. And, basically, that's it.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. So,

1 Mr. Maxwell.

2 MR. MAXWELL: Sir.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: He admitted, he
4 disclosed the aggravated robbery in 1994, correct, but
5 he did not disclose the criminal trespass where he
6 served 30 days in 2005?

7 MR. MAXWELL: Sir, there was no disclosure on
8 the application.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: For either one of
10 them?

11 MR. MAXWELL: Right, no, sir.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Okay.
13 Any other questions?

14 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Why didn't you disclose
15 the convictions that you had?

16 MR. BROWN: Well, I did, but I didn't know how
17 to process it, you know. I mean I'm new here. I don't
18 know how to process getting a card. Because certain
19 states, you know, I just worked. I didn't know anything
20 about it. But if they would have asked me, I would have
21 disclosed it. I'm not trying to lie to you. But I'm
22 hearing from the Board to tell you that I had did some
23 time. And, also, that I'm -- like I said, I'm a pretty
24 good worker. I got letters here for -- I'm a student at
25 CSN. I had no cases here in Nevada like that.

1 Basically, that's it. I mean I'm not trying to hide
2 anything from you.

3 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Did you fill out your
4 application the office, the PILB office?

5 MR. BROWN: Yes, ma'am.

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: You did. Did you ask any
7 questions when you were filling it out, when it came to
8 that section?

9 MR. BROWN: No, I didn't.

10 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Thank you.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Robert?

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: When were you released
13 from prison?

14 MR. BROWN: 2004.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well, you built some
16 time there, then. How much time did you have altogether
17 in prison?

18 MR. BROWN: I just did eight years.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah, the charge was in
20 '94. I see. By the time it goes to court and
21 everything else, all right. I mean what did you do
22 prior to Texas, back in California; did you do anything?
23 Were you in California? Now I'm getting the same
24 disease.

25 MR. BROWN: I've been to the West Coast before,

1 and I never --

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Stay away from it.
3 Okay. That's all I have. Well, I have one more thing.
4 Do you have a driver's license?

5 MR. BROWN: Yes. And I have a Nevada ID.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Nevada ID and what
7 driver's license do you have?

8 MR. BROWN: I have a Texas driver's license.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You work for Uber,
10 right?

11 MR. BROWN: No.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Well, I'm done
13 again.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: We're going to be
15 taking a break soon. Okay. All right. Any other
16 questions?

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Apparently, I have
18 none.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. I
20 will entertain a motion.

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: This is Nixon. I move
22 that we uphold the denial of Kenneth Brown -- just
23 making sure -- due to nondisclosure.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. I have a
25 motion. Do I have a second?

1 All right. Ray Flynn. I will second that.

2 Any other, further discussion?

3 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion?

4 (Board members said "aye.")

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Any opposed?

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Nay.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. The motion
8 carries two to one. All right. Mr. Brown, you have a
9 year, you can come back in a year. You need to
10 disclose your arrests. I've seen the application. I
11 personally asked to see the application. It was pretty
12 clear: Have you ever been arrested or convicted? We
13 need to know. All right. You have a good day, sir.

14 MR. BROWN: All right.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Good luck to you.
16 Thank you.

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Can we take a break?

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yes, we're taking
19 a break. We're taking a break for 15 minutes.

20 Are you okay with that up north? Give me a
21 thumbs-up if you're okay with it.

22 MS. KLEMME: Yes.

23 THE REPORTER: Yes.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

25 * * * * *

1 (A break was taken, 12:28 to 12:46 p.m.)

2 * * * * *

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: We're just
4 waiting on the attorney.

5 (There was a brief period off the record.)

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. We're
7 ready to get started. And if we get into a legal
8 problem, then we'll pause.

9 Good morning, Mr. Butler.

10 MR. BUTLER: Good morning, Chairman. Good
11 afternoon, everybody.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Good afternoon.
13 We've all had our break. We know who's up here. We all
14 got the right stuff on our computers.

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Maybe.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Well,
17 we denied you a work card. Why don't you give me your
18 side of the story, sir.

19 MR. BUTLER: I've learned from my mistakes.
20 I'm very humble. Right now, I search for job security.
21 Since my release date, I believe in '94, I haven't been
22 in any trouble. Maybe a few minor things, but other
23 than that, I've been very good, very humble.

24 I'm goal-orientated. The last three or four
25 years, I was a line haul driver. That kind of conflicts

1 with my goals. I am working right now. It's a decent
2 job. It's just right now it's not enough. I have two
3 possibilities for a security job already. I just need
4 this guard card.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Maxwell.

6 MR. MAXWELL: Sir.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Anything else to
8 add?

9 MR. MAXWELL: No, sir, only that he -- he did
10 disclose all the arrests and provided court documents
11 and was very forthcoming with information when asked.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Any
13 questions from the Board?

14 Okay. This is the easy one. I'll entertain a
15 motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Find the right guy.

17 I will make a motion to overturn the denial of
18 Dorien Butler. He applied for registration, was denied.
19 And that's where I'm at.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. I'll
21 second and add to that that we definitely have time and
22 distance. It's been over 21 years since he's been in
23 trouble, so. All right. We got a motion. We got a
24 second. Any discussion?

25 All in favor of the motion, say "aye."

1 (Board members said "aye.")

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Any opposed?

3 Congratulations. You'll be getting your card.

4 MR. BUTLER: Thank you. Thank you all very
5 much. You have a wonderful day. Yes, sir. Thank you
6 all very much. You have a good day.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Thank you.

8 MR. BUTLER: Thank you.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Eva Camarillo.
10 Good afternoon, ma'am.

11 MS. CAMARILLO: Howdy, howdy.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

13 Denied your work card. Why don't you talk to us and
14 tell us why you think you should get one.

15 MS. CAMARILLO: Well, I've spoken to
16 Mr. Maxwell, or Investigator Maxwell. And he requested
17 information from me. But I did disclose. So I
18 submitted all that information to him. My certificate
19 of rehabilitation dated back 2002. My documentation
20 showing my case was expunged from Kern County, I believe
21 that was in '94, '98, something like that. I haven't
22 been in any trouble since.

23 What I've done, what I've done and been doing
24 since 2002 is going to school. I'm about seven classes
25 away from my bachelor's, Fresno State. I have got, I

1 have received my associate's. I have received a minor.
2 I received certificates along the way, substance abuse
3 counseling; certification, not patient counseling. I
4 thought I'd clear that up. You know, so I've done a lot
5 of things along the way. Raised my kids.

6 I do do security. I have worked in jobs where
7 I have handled money. I've never had any issues since
8 my issues. So I'm trying to just get it cleaned up and
9 get my guard card here in Nevada.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

11 MS. CAMARILLO: I have my guard card in
12 California.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: How long have you
14 lived in Las Vegas?

15 MS. CAMARILLO: I don't. I live in Fresno.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Oh, you want to
17 move here?

18 MS. CAMARILLO: No. I live in Fresno.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Right.

20 MS. CAMARILLO: The company I work for, CFC,
21 there's also a branch here, and there's a branch in
22 Reno. And they sometimes call us to come work here.
23 And I have a better chance of getting called to fill
24 those positions if I have a guard card. So.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. You have

1 your California guard card?

2 MS. CAMARILLO: Yes, I have my California guard
3 card.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. I'm
5 up to speed. I got it.

6 MS. CAMARILLO: Yeah. That's why I said I have
7 my California guard card.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I connected the
9 dots.

10 MS. CAMARILLO: Yeah.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: It's amazing.
12 All right. Thank you.

13 Mr. Maxwell.

14 MR. MAXWELL: Sir.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Anything else to
16 add?

17 MR. MAXWELL: No, sir, only what Ms. Camarillo
18 mentioned before. She was very, very helpful with
19 providing information. And she disclosed the arrests.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Well, he said you
21 were helpful. He usually doesn't.

22 MS. CAMARILLO: I try. I try.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Any
24 questions from the Board?

25 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. I'll
3 entertain a motion.

4 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I move to we overturn
5 Camarillo's denial and award her a guard card.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Do I have
7 a second?

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll second.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Any
10 discussion on the record?

11 All right. I want the record to reflect that
12 we definitely have time and distance. And she's
13 currently working for a security company in California,
14 and the reasons why she wants a card, so. Okay. With
15 that, all in favor, say "aye" on the motion.

16 (Board members said "aye.")

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Any opposed?

18 The motion carries. Congratulations.

19 MS. CAMARILLO: Awesome. Thank you very much.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thanks for waiting so
21 long.

22 MS. CAMARILLO: Thanks. Not a problem. Thank
23 you. I appreciate everything. Thank you.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay,
25 Mr. Collins, Ronald Collins.

1 MR. COLLINS: Good afternoon.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Good afternoon.

3 MR. COLLINS: Good afternoon to the
4 investigators and those up north. My name's Ron
5 Collins.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Collins, the
7 card was denied. And, also, you failed to disclose. So
8 let's talk about it.

9 MR. COLLINS: The fact that Mr. Maxwell --
10 can you update me on what's on my disclosure? Can I --
11 can he go first, so I know what I'm dealing with?

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Just tell us about your
13 side.

14 MR. COLLINS: Oh, well, I had a conviction in
15 1970. I'm 66 years old now.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Right.

17 MR. COLLINS: This conviction took place when I
18 was 17 years old in the city of Chicago in North
19 Lawndale where I was born and raised. And I was
20 convicted of voluntary manslaughter and sentenced to 10
21 years in the state penitentiary, which I did 18 months.
22 And since then, I've been living a productive citizen,
23 you know, so.

24 So I don't remember what I failed to disclose.
25 I mean the question was a felony. Right?

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: The question was
2 if you'd been arrested.

3 MR. COLLINS: Okay.

4 MR. MAXWELL: Sir, if I may.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yes, you may,
6 Mr. Maxwell.

7 MR. MAXWELL: Mr. Collins did, in fact,
8 disclose that arrest for the disclosure of the murder
9 charge in 1970 at felony level. In 1971, he was
10 sentenced to Joliet two to 10 years. Also in '71, the
11 charge was amended to voluntary manslaughter, and he was
12 paroled to Rockford, Illinois on 12-21-1972.

13 The arrests that were not disclosed was a theft
14 arrest in 1970, which he got one year's probation, and a
15 1976 petty theft, which it was another one year's
16 probation. Those are the only two things that were not
17 disclosed.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: How much time did
19 you do for the manslaughter?

20 MR. COLLINS: 18 months.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You only did 18
22 months?

23 MR. COLLINS: Right. It was, basically, like a
24 self-defense thing. Like I said, I was 17 years old.
25 And I was being robbed. And, you know, it went from

1 there. And, you know, since I got out of prison in
2 1973, I started working for the Rockford Housing
3 Authority in 1978. I worked there for 30 years.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

5 MR. COLLINS: And then I got sick and come out
6 with disability. I moved out here to Nevada. Which I
7 had been coming to Nevada for the last 30 years. And so
8 when I retired from my job, I relocated to Las Vegas.
9 Six months after I moved here, my daughter died. So I
10 had to take in her three children. I'm a single parent.
11 And so I took them, her three children, and put them all
12 through school out here in Nevada. All three of them
13 have graduated. They're all working. And life is going
14 on.

15 I don't think I have any other blemishes on my
16 history. I could have brought some documentation, some
17 paperwork, or some pastors and politicians and all of
18 that here to talk for me. But I figured that I'm just
19 going to talk for myself, sir.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: No, and I
21 appreciate that. How long have you been living in
22 Nevada, then?

23 MR. COLLINS: I've been here since 2010.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: And what are you
25 doing for a job right now?

1 MR. COLLINS: Well, I'm retired. You know,
2 that's why, that's why I'm trying to get a job, so I can
3 do something. You know what I saying?

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

5 MR. COLLINS: Yeah, I'm trying to be
6 productive, you know. I haven't drank in 31 years. I
7 haven't smoked a cigarette in 30 years. And, you know,
8 I don't have any blemishes on my driving record. So
9 it's, you know -- I'm at your mercy this morning.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Well, we're not
11 going to go that far.

12 MR. COLLINS: Oh, okay.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: So if I
14 understand correctly, you just forgot about the theft
15 charge?

16 MR. COLLINS: Well, the question, I thought the
17 question was felony. That's -- you know, it wasn't that
18 I was digging deep into the -- you know.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: No, I --

20 MR. COLLINS: Like I said, I'm 66. I got the
21 loss of memory thing like you guys have been discussing,
22 so.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Gronauer
24 likes to, oh, I don't know about it, I don't know what's
25 going on.

1 MR. COLLINS: Yeah.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I mean you
3 admitted to the manslaughter. I mean I can see where
4 you made a mistake on the minor charge. You admitted to
5 the more --

6 MR. COLLINS: That's up in North Lawndale. If
7 any of you guys are familiar with Chicago, coming up in
8 that era. You can go there right now at, what, 3:00
9 o'clock and you'll see hundreds of young folks standing
10 on corners. So that's the kind of the environment that
11 I come out of.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

13 MR. COLLINS: And I brought my grandchildren
14 out of there so they wouldn't be caught up in that type
15 of lifestyle.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

17 MR. COLLINS: So I brought them out here,
18 figure we can have a better quality of life in Nevada.
19 And that's happening, you know.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Isn't it amazing?

21 MR. COLLINS: Yes, sir.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Any
23 other questions from the Board?

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I just had.
25 Mr. Maxwell.

1 MR. MAXWELL: Sir.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Is there anything to
3 add?

4 MR. MAXWELL: No, sir.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, I have none.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. No
7 discussion. I'll entertain a motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll make the motion to
9 overturn the denial on Mr. Ron Collins.

10 MR. COLLINS: Thank you, sir.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Who applied for
12 registration and was denied.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I have a motion.
14 Do I have a second?

15 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I'll second.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Any
17 discussion?

18 Okay. I just want to add it's been over 40
19 years since Mr. Collins has been in any type of legal
20 trouble.

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I agree.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Call
23 for a vote. All in favor of the motion, say "aye."

24 (Board members said "aye.")

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Any opposed?

1 The motion carries. You'll be getting your
2 card. Good luck to you, sir.

3 MR. COLLINS: Sounds mighty well, too. Thank
4 you.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.
6 Ms. English. Breiana English.

7 Okay. We will trail that one.
8 Tommy Garner.

9 Mr. Garner, how are you, sir?

10 MR. GARNER: Good afternoon. All right.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: That's not your
12 photo album, is it?

13 MR. GARNER: No. This is my charges.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: This is going to
15 be an interesting one. All right. Mr. Garner, let me
16 catch up here.

17 Okay. We denied your security guard card. So
18 tell us why you think you should have one and what you
19 did in the past.

20 MR. GARNER: I'm from California. What I did
21 in the past, I was working for C1, a radio station out
22 there in California, for about nine years before I moved
23 out here in December of 2018. The only reason I moved
24 out here is because of my son. But I was making \$35 an
25 hour out there. It's just after I lost my grandma about

1 three years ago, we lost our house; you know, mama gave
2 it up to foreclosure.

3 So after we lost the house, I was sleeping in
4 my '96 Benz, trying just to go back and forth for work,
5 in and out of the L.A. My son called me November 20th.
6 And when I used to come back and forth, I used to
7 whisper in his ear and tell him I was going to move out
8 here. When I got that call, he told me, he was like,
9 "Oh, Dad, are you still coming out here for my
10 birthday?" And I go, "Are you living out here?" And
11 his birthday is October. So when I got that call on his
12 birthday of October 21st, I came out here two days after
13 his birthday. I sold everything. And I decided to make
14 a bust. And my best friend from high school took me in,
15 and he was saying that whatever you got to do, he going
16 to be there to help me.

17 So I'm just out here, I'm trying to do for my
18 son. You know, I'm trying raise a kid. So that's the
19 only reason I'm out here.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Take a couple
21 breaths.

22 MR. GARNER: Oh, no, I'm good. It's just, it's
23 touching just talking about it.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.
25 Mr. Maxwell.

1 MR. MAXWELL: Sir.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: How do you get
3 all of these?

4 MR. MAXWELL: Yes, sir.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Go talk to your
6 boss. Anything you want to add?

7 MR. MAXWELL: No, sir.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. What I
9 want you to talk about, Mr. Garner, is all your arrests
10 had to do with violence or something that could cause
11 violence. Okay. I mean I don't have a larcenist here.

12 MR. GARNER: Yeah.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: And I don't have
14 a DUI or a drug user. I've got somebody that either
15 done violence or brought something to do violence. So
16 why don't we talk about that.

17 MR. GARNER: Okay.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Before I decide
19 why I want to allow you to be a security in our state.

20 MR. GARNER: Well, which one do you want to
21 talk about?

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Talk about them
23 all. I want to talk about all of them.

24 MR. GARNER: Okay. So let's start off with the
25 gun case.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yeah.

2 MR. GARNER: 2007, just graduated from high
3 school, from Boston High School out there in
4 San Bernardino County. Came to visit, on my dad's side,
5 cousins and family members that I haven't seen in a long
6 time. My little cousins wanted to go to a party. There
7 was no cars around there. The only person that was
8 there was me, being the oldest -- I'd just turned 18 --
9 and my grandma. My grandma was there.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Were you --

11 MR. GARNER: Huh?

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Why were you
13 carrying a gun?

14 MR. GARNER: Oh, I'm going to tell you.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

16 MR. GARNER: My grandma was there. She knew
17 the area. Like I said, I wasn't in L.A. I'd just
18 graduated from high school in San Bernardino County.
19 She knew the area. She gave me her personal gun, in the
20 case and everything. I put it in my -- she told me to
21 put it in my backpack. I put it in my backpack. She
22 told me to put it in my backpack. I put it in my
23 backpack. And she told me to take them to the actual
24 party that they wanted to go to, which is another family
25 member's party who was graduating from high school and

1 going into college, playing football for USC.

2 So on the way back, we got pulled over for a
3 curfew stop, because we looked young. When I got pulled
4 over, the officer asked us, "Hey, how old are you guys?"
5 I told him, "I'm 18." Then it was like, "You got any
6 weapons?" I told him that I got a backpack, I said, "I
7 got a backpack. There's a gun in there, and it's in the
8 case and all that. I'm 18. It's my grandma's. She
9 told me to take it for protection." And then from
10 there, he looked at it and said, "Okay. Well, we just
11 got you on a traffic stop. I'm going to take you in.
12 Thank you for being honest, but I'm going to take you in
13 for that gun."

14 So I don't know if you guys got the reports,
15 but it should have my grandma name listed on the actual
16 document of the courts.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Never
18 heard that one.

19 MR. GARNER: So --

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Let's move
21 forward.

22 MR. GARNER: The fight.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yeah, the 2013,
24 let's just talk about that.

25 MR. GARNER: It was my birthday, the night

1 before my birthday.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Uh-huh
3 (affirmative).

4 MR. GARNER: My cousin had a female end up --
5 you know, we were having a party in my house. Had a
6 female end up in the rest room, and she told him, "Stop,
7 no, leave me alone." So I broke into the door, because
8 I knew, you know, it was the tone, it might not be --
9 why he's holding her hostage. Let her go. Let her do
10 what she want to do. They wasn't together, nothing like
11 that. He was getting mad, all hostile. He didn't want
12 to leave my home. Which he stayed right across the
13 street. He didn't want to leave. I said, "Man, just
14 leave. You know me. Just rub it off the next morning."

15 So it got into a fight. I went to his side,
16 because we stay in a cul-de-sac. So I went to his
17 house. And I wasn't on his premises, but he called the
18 police before he even came down his walkway. And that
19 was the actual fight of me getting arrested on my
20 birthday.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: And what was the
22 false ID part?

23 MR. GARNER: False ID because I didn't have ID
24 on me.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You had a false

1 ID on you?

2 MR. GARNER: No, I didn't have ID on me at all.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Did you identify
4 yourself incorrectly to the officers?

5 MR. GARNER: No. I didn't identify myself at
6 all. I was pointed out on the call. They already, they
7 already gave, they already had to give a description of
8 the clothes that I had on.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. And you
10 did 22 days in jail?

11 MR. GARNER: Yes, sir.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: For fighting in a
13 public place?

14 MR. GARNER: Yes, sir.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. No
16 other questions from me. Anybody else, questions from
17 the Board?

18 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: And that was the fight in
19 2013, right? Because there was one for a fight, noise,
20 offensive words.

21 MR. GARNER: It was 2008.

22 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. What is that type
23 of -- I'm sorry. Thank you.

24 MR. MAXWELL: That, that one actually is linked
25 in with the carrying the firearm.

1 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Gotcha.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I apologize.

3 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: They're together.

5 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: They're together. All
6 right. Thank you. No further questions. Thank you.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Mr. Garner.

8 MR. GARNER: Yes, sir.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have a problem
10 with anger issues?

11 MR. GARNER: No, sir.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You just happen to get
13 in them spots, and things happen, right?

14 MR. GARNER: Well, I've just been in certain
15 situation that I had no control over. But I've always
16 been honest.

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I have a follow-up. And
18 I'm sorry if I missed it. But what have you been doing
19 since you've gotten here to Nevada?

20 MR. GARNER: I was working for SOA. I was
21 communicating with the club just to try to figure out
22 why my card wasn't actually coming, because I did a -- I
23 guess, a speed process for the card. So I was just
24 checking on it like every week, calling in to make sure,
25 when my card is coming, and found out that I have to go

1 to a board, you guys denied me. Since then, I've just
2 been hard-pressed just to make rent. So I'm going to go
3 back to LA.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: One other
5 question. Did you work in security in California?

6 MR. GARNER: I was doing, I was doing private
7 security, working with celebrities, A-listed
8 celebrities.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Thank
10 you.

11 Do you have anything else?

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, I'm good. Thank
13 you.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. No
15 other questions. I'll call for a motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I'll move to overturn
17 Mr. Garner's denial due to time and distance and the
18 fact that he actually did disclose the arrests.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Do I have
20 a second?

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll second. You
22 second? I'll second this time.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Oh. Okay. I
24 have a motion. And Board Member Gronauer seconded it.

25 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Is there any
2 discussion on the motion?

3 All in favor, say "aye."

4 (Board members said "aye.")

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Any opposed?

6 Okay. Congratulations. You'll be getting your
7 card.

8 MR. GARNER: Thank you.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Good luck to you.

10 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Good luck.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good luck to you.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Anthony Lujan.

13 MR. LUJAN: You said my name right. Good
14 afternoon.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Good afternoon to
16 you. I have to catch up. And let's see.

17 Okay. Your work card process was denied.
18 We've got nondisclosures, as well as we've got some
19 crimes of violence. So let's hear your side, sir.

20 MR. LUJAN: For the nondisclosure, I believe
21 that I said that I had a felony on my record from about
22 29 years ago. I didn't disclose the fact that there was
23 a weapon and which actually was -- it was an incident
24 with a family member. And there actually was, it was a
25 butter knife that I threatened him with.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

2 MR. LUJAN: But, anyway, the cops were called,
3 and they arrested me. And I went to court. I actually
4 took the advice of the lawyer instead of fighting it.
5 He asked me, told me that I should plead nolo contendere
6 or contendere.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: M-hm
8 (affirmative).

9 MR. LUJAN: And the outcome was supposed to be
10 that I was going to have probation. And then it was
11 going to be a sealed record for a certain amount of
12 years. And then, if I didn't get any other charges, it
13 was supposed to be expunged from my record. But they
14 never did do that.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. You had a
16 DUI in 1982. It was a long time ago, but you didn't
17 disclose that.

18 MR. LUJAN: Yeah. I was just -- I thought they
19 were just looking for felony stuff and that stuff. I
20 mean I've had three DWIs, and they were three years
21 apart. And I actually quit drinking after that, because
22 I did not want to get another one. And I swore I would
23 never drive until I quit drinking, and which I did back
24 in -- when I was about 30 years old.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: How long have you

1 been living in Nevada?

2 MR. LUJAN: I just moved here in January.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: And what have you
4 done for employment in the last --

5 MR. LUJAN: Oh, well, I actually was working
6 for Securitas in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: M-hm
8 (affirmative).

9 MR. LUJAN: Which I still have, I actually have
10 a card right here which is still valid till November.
11 It's the guard card from there. And I was transferring.
12 And then I had to go to the PILB and apply, and they
13 denied it because of that came up. And they actually
14 had a position for me, but I couldn't take it because I
15 didn't have my card. And I actually worked at Golden
16 Corral as well, and I was able to transfer with them,
17 too. So I still had a job secured here.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Let
19 me guess. Mr. Maxwell, is this yours, too?

20 MR. MAXWELL: Yes, sir.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.
22 Anything you want to add?

23 MR. MAXWELL: Just that Mr. Lujan was not made
24 provisional because he did, in fact, disclose the felony
25 arrest.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Any
2 questions from the Board?

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes. Mr. Lujan, do you
4 intend to work in security?

5 MR. LUJAN: Yeah.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Armed or unarmed?

7 MR. LUJAN: I'm just looking for not armed.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Because I know, in
9 Nevada, if you have a domestic violence, it's better if
10 you don't have a gun.

11 MR. LUJAN: Yeah, I think, I knew that.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: There's not a lot of
13 open carries over here, even though it's -- it was
14 angry, and it started without the domestic violence, and
15 I know how that works.

16 MR. LUJAN: Yeah.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And because you're
18 here, because --

19 MR. LUJAN: No, I didn't have a gun.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You're used to
21 something else. It's still domestic violence as far as
22 the court goes.

23 MR. LUJAN: Right.

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. So I wanted
25 to make sure if you're doing armed or unarmed. How long

1 have you lived here?

2 MR. LUJAN: I moved here in January when I was
3 going to transfer with Securitas.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And where have you been
5 working since January?

6 MR. LUJAN: Golden Corral.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: We have a Golden
8 Corral?

9 MR. LUJAN: We have two actually. We're in the
10 process of getting three more.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No kidding?

12 MR. LUJAN: Yes. You should go there. It's
13 great.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I remember, I seen that
15 we used to have one at the Harrah like 30 years ago.

16 MR. LUJAN: Oh. And the one I work at is, it's
17 just --

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah, help me out, sir.
19 Thank you.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. No
21 other questions. I'll entertain a motion.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll make a motion, if
23 you don't mind, to set aside the denial and approve
24 Anthony Lujan, who applied for registration and was
25 denied prior.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. I have a
2 motion. Do I have a second?

3 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I'll second.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Motion and
5 a second. Any discussion on the motion?

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It's just time and
7 distance.

8 MR. LUJAN: Thank you. Appreciate it.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. All
10 in favor of the motion, say "aye."

11 (Board members said "aye.")

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Any opposed?

13 The motion carries. You'll get your card.
14 Congratulations. Good luck to you.

15 MR. LUJAN: Thank you. Appreciate it. Have a
16 good day.

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: You, too.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. I'm
19 just going to go through this, and you can help me with
20 the last name and pronunciation of it here. Vincent,
21 with an M?

22 All right. We'll trail that one, too.

23 Jeremy Shechtman.

24 MR. SHECHTMAN: Here, Your Honor.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I'm not Your

1 Honor. Did I pronounce it correctly?

2 MR. SHECHTMAN: Yes, sir.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

4 Mr. Shechtman, let's talk about we denied you, you
5 didn't disclose some things, you did some things. Let's
6 hear it from you.

7 MR. SHECHTMAN: As far as the reason why I was
8 denied, I was told that it was because of an offensive
9 weapon, sir. I didn't write that down. In that year,
10 towards the end of 2010, I came back from my second tour
11 of Iraq. I came back to a mother who had second-degree
12 lymphoma, second-stage lymphoma. At that time, I found
13 out that my mother and my ex-fiance', my fiance' at the
14 time, my ex-fiance' now, had gotten into a big argument,
15 because they had -- she had said that she wanted to tell
16 me that my mother had cancer, my mother did not want her
17 to tell me because of where I was at, was afraid that it
18 was going to affect me. So on my return home, we warred
19 with each other. If I was with one, the other one would
20 yell at me. If I was with the other, that one would
21 yell at me.

22 On the day that this arrest happened, I had
23 gotten, just gotten back from Philadelphia, where I had
24 taken my mom to chemotherapy. So when I got back to the
25 house, with my ex-fiance' there, she had got into a

1 verbal argument with me, accused me of doing all these
2 things, not loving her as much as I loved my mother.
3 And I left the area. She proceeded to call her mom and
4 tell her mom that we had been in a -- not a physical
5 altercation, but an argument. Her mother proceeded to
6 call the police.

7 They picked me up down the road. And when the
8 police officers took me out of the car, it turned out
9 that there was a family member who was part of that
10 police department. They went through the car. I was a
11 little aggressive because of the situation that I had
12 just come out of. And they had found a baseball bat,
13 which I had put in the car. I have pictures of what the
14 baseball looked like in the car and the --

15 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Shechtman, you just put your
16 papers over the microphone. The court reporter won't be
17 able to hear you. Actually, push that up towards me, so
18 it won't pick up the papers rustling.

19 MR. SHECHTMAN: Understood.

20 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

21 MR. SHECHTMAN: This is the picture of the bat
22 and the hook that it was in. So the bat was laying in
23 there along with a scraper for my car and some stuff.
24 The reason why it was put in there like that was to keep
25 it from rolling around. I had a '99 TransAm at the

1 time, which had -- there was no trunk room. So.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Like
3 you said, you got mouthy with the officers.

4 MR. SHECHTMAN: Yes, sir.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: And they say what
6 happened with this one.

7 MR. SHECHTMAN: Yes.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. It's
9 some time ago. What have you done in the last --

10 MR. SHECHTMAN: Currently, I am the senior
11 vice president of CRI Counterterrorism Training School.
12 I have trained veterans. I trained contractors, law
13 enforcement and future military forces that are going
14 overseas in how to protect themselves, weapon training,
15 hand-to-hand combat and such.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: So, and you're
17 applying for a guard card?

18 MR. SHECHTMAN: I am, sir, yes.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I'm missing
20 something here. You're the CEO of a company that does
21 training, and you're trying to get a guard card?

22 MR. SHECHTMAN: Senior vice president.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yeah, okay.

24 MR. SHECHTMAN: So I also, I also work as a
25 bodyguard for the CEO of that company. And I go with

1 him, with his family, if there's ever anything that he
2 needs protection-wise.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

4 MR. SHECHTMAN: I'd like to start, continue to
5 serve the Nevada community and get my -- all my
6 certifications.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. So
8 you don't live here?

9 MR. SHECHTMAN: Sir?

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Do you live here?

11 MR. SHECHTMAN: I do live here.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. We
13 pronounce it "Neh-VAD-ah."

14 MR. SHECHTMAN: Yes.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

16 Mr. Maxwell.

17 MR. MAXWELL: Sir.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Anything you want
19 to add?

20 MR. MAXWELL: Just that he disclosed everything
21 that's on the denial report.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. All right.
23 I have no further questions. Anybody else on the Board?

24 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I don't have any question.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It's easy to call it

1 "Neh-VAD-ah."

2 MR. SHECHTMAN: I'm from Philadelphia, sir, so.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Are you from
4 Philadelphia or somewhere around there?

5 MR. SHECHTMAN: Oh, originally from
6 Philadelphia, sir.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. I know it well.
8 That's where were you arrested, in Philly?

9 MR. SHECHTMAN: Yes, sir. It was right outside
10 Philadelphia, right outside.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You're a Pennsylvania
12 boy?

13 MR. SHECHTMAN: Yes, sir.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. No, I'm good.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. I'll
16 entertain a motion, since there's no further questions
17 from the Board.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll make a motion to
19 overturn the denial on Jeremy Shechtman. Time and
20 distance. He applied for his registration card.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. I have a
22 motion. Do I have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I second.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I have a second.
25 All in favor -- any other discussion on the motion?

1 All in favor of the motion, say "aye."

2 (Board members said "aye.")

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Any opposed?

4 The motion carries. You'll get your card.

5 Congratulations.

6 MR. SHECHTMAN: Thank you, sir. Have a good
7 day.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You know, some people
9 came in late again.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yeah. How many
11 people are here for work card appeals?

12 Nobody. They're just entertainment.

13 All right. I need to call these fellows. Is
14 Mr. Bryson Blue here?

15 All right. I will call him one more time.

16 I'm going to go through those that were
17 trailed. They were trailer this morning.

18 All right. I have a private investigator and
19 process server license that I'm trailing, a Lawrence E.
20 Sanchez. Is Mr. Sanchez here?

21 All right. He is not here. What does the
22 Board want to do with this one?

23 Who's the investigator on this, Mr. Sanchez?

24 MR. SALADINO: Oh. I'm sorry.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: What do you know

1 about this guy?

2 MR. SALADINO: Let's see. Mr. Sanchez was
3 licensed previously here in Nevada. He did, however,
4 let it expire in '18. That's why he was reapplying. He
5 also has Sanchez Investigations in California. It is in
6 good standing with California DSIS. He did provide
7 forms from DSIS verifying the license is in good
8 standing and has been kept that way since 1989, since he
9 applied. He was notified.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. They
11 do not have to be here, so. All right. Any questions
12 from the Board? I did not, myself, I did not have
13 questions on this one.

14 MR. INGRAM: Yes. For verification, normally,
15 the Board history is if they're applying for a new
16 license, they're required to report before the Board, or
17 they ought to.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Oh, they are?

19 MR. INGRAM: Yes. The change of statuses would
20 be the ones that you don't normally require them here.

21 In the past, you've traditionally gone ahead
22 and postponed it to the next Board meeting. However,
23 you can go ahead and decide on it without him being
24 present if you would like to.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Nope, first time

1 chairing, so. So I don't need a motion to postpone it,
2 do I?

3 MS. BORDELOVE: No.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. We
5 will postpone number 36 to the next meeting.

6 Thank you.

7 All right. That's it from the morning session.

8 Registration appeals. Is Mr. Calloway here?

9 Mr. Calloway's not here. I make a motion we
10 deny his appeal. Do I have a second?

11 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Second.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All in favor?

13 (Board members said "aye.")

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. We're
15 agreeing with staff for denial.

16 Sade Easley. Is Sade Easley here?

17 Okay. I'll make a motion that we deny his
18 appeal. Do I have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Second.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. All in
21 favor?

22 (Board members said "aye.")

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Denied.

24 Number 43, Sidney Harvey. Is Mr. Harvey here,
25 or Ms. Harvey?

1 Okay. I'll make a motion we deny the appeal.

2 Do I have a second?

3 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Second.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: We have a motion
5 and a second. All in favor, say "aye."

6 (Board members said "aye.")

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Harvey's
8 denied.

9 Number 48, Jason Boerdam. Mr. Boerdam, are you
10 here?

11 He's not here. I make a motion we deny the
12 appeal. Do I have a second?

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Second.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. We have a
15 motion and a second. All in favor, say "aye."

16 (Board members said "aye.")

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Motion
18 carries. And I was aye on that.

19 Number 52, Jacques Basse. Is Mr. Basse here?

20 He's not here. I make a motion that we deny
21 the appeal. I need a second?

22 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Second.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. I have a
24 motion and a second. All in favor, say "aye."

25 (Board members said "aye.")

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. His appeal
2 is denied.

3 Number 57, Breiana English. Is Ms. English
4 here?

5 Okay. She is not here. I make a motion we
6 deny that appeal. Do I have a second?

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Second.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I have a second.
9 All in favor?

10 (Board members said "aye.")

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: The motion
12 carries.

13 Number 61, Vincent Miozza. Is Mr. Miozza here?
14 He is not. I make a motion to deny the appeal.
15 Do I have a second?

16 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Second.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I have a second.
18 All in favor, say "aye."

19 (Board members said "aye.")

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Any opposed?
21 Motion carries.

22 Number 64, Mr. Bryson Blue, are you here?
23 He is not here. I make a motion we deny the
24 appeal.

25 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Second.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I have a second.
2 All in favor, "aye."

3 (Board members said "aye.")

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Any opposed?

5 Okay. That is it for the morning session. We
6 have a disciplinary hearing next.

7 MR. INGRAM: Do you want to take five or 10
8 minutes --

9 MS. BORDELOVE: Yeah.

10 MR. INGRAM: -- to let them prepare, and?

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yeah, five's
12 good.

13 MS. BORDELOVE: I need to run out and prep.
14 And we're going to shift Board Counsel to Mr. Detmer.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Let's take 10 so
16 nobody's rushing. We're going up and down stairs.

17 I want to do this because this is the end of
18 the -- I've never done this. The morning session is
19 over (gavel).

20 We're on a 10-minute break.

21 * * * * *

22 (A break was taken, 1:26 to 1:55 p.m.)

23 * * * * *

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. We'll
25 call to order the disciplinary hearing for Adam Plant,

1 R, as in Robert, 085960, pursuant to NRS 648.156, for
2 possible action.

3 Will all the parties identify themselves,
4 starting with the State.

5 MR. DETMER: And, Mr. Chairman, I apologize.
6 As to the Board, are all the -- do we have a quorum as
7 far as members and as far as the names of the members
8 that are present for the hearing?

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You know what, we
10 will, I'll call a roll, might be the best, best thing to
11 do.

12 MR. INGRAM: Do you want me to do that?

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yeah, why don't
14 you do that.

15 MR. INGRAM: All right. Board Member Gronauer?

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Here.

17 MR. INGRAM: Board Member Nixon?

18 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Here.

19 MR. INGRAM: And Board Member Flynn?

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Here.

21 MR. INGRAM: Okay. We do have a quorum for
22 this meeting.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

24 MS. BORDELOVE: Okay. My name's Rosalie
25 Bordelove. I'll be representing the Board and,

1 potentially, staff today.

2 And, as you see, Mike Detmer is here as your
3 counsel. So any questions you have regarding any of
4 your role as Board or those questions, please direct
5 towards him. He's there to give you advice today.

6 MR. REID: Good afternoon. Stephen Reid. I
7 am --

8 (The Reporter indicated that it's difficult to
9 hear Las Vegas.)

10 MR. INGRAM: Shannon, can you hear them okay?

11 (There was a brief discussion off the record.)

12 MR. REID: Do you want me to try again?

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Why don't you try
14 again.

15 THE REPORTER: Yeah, thank you.

16 MR. REID: Stephen Reid. I'm an attorney. I'm
17 representing the respondent here, who is Adam Plant, who
18 is present.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You got that?

20 THE REPORTER: Yes, I did. Thank you. Great.
21 Yes.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Any
23 preliminary motions?

24 MS. DETMER: Any stipulations?

25 MR. REID: We have, we have exhibits that are

1 being filed between myself and the Attorney General's
2 Office. We have agreed to admit both sides of all the
3 exhibits. And we have presented those, I think, to the
4 Board already, one from the respondent's side, one from
5 the petitioner's side.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

7 MS. BORDELOVE: Yes, we're both stipulating to
8 the admittance.

9 MS. BORDELOVE: And then the other preliminary
10 matter, I think, I had, which, I believe, counsel has
11 agreed to, is to stipulate to that, and I will withdraw
12 these paragraphs, and correct me if I'm wrong on any of
13 them, but that certain paragraphs in the complaint would
14 be the ones that were admitted in the answer, but to
15 consider them, stipulate to considering them proven.
16 And then I won't go through anything on them. And those
17 would be paragraphs 1, 3, 5, 8, 11, 13, 15, 17, 19, 20,
18 23, 26, 27.

19 To the extent that any of you don't have -- I'd
20 advise you to start with this. The complaint, I know,
21 it's probably supporting material for this meeting, is
22 also Exhibit 1 in those binders, and the answer I made
23 Exhibit 2, just so those would be in the record and easy
24 to find.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

1 MR. REID: And, also, we have no issues with
2 admitting those and given those based upon the answer to
3 the complaint.

4 MS. BORDELOVE: And then you -- any other
5 preliminary matters?

6 MR. REID: I have no motions or issues. The
7 only concern I have is, is that there is an ongoing
8 criminal case against Mr. Adam Plant for these, this
9 exact situation. I have advised my client to plead his,
10 take his Constitutional right to the Fifth Amendment, to
11 invoke that Fifth Amendment right. He does wish to
12 speak to the Board.

13 I just want the Board to know that that, when I
14 jump up and stop him or if I stop him from answering
15 certain questions, it's because that's my advice that
16 I'm requesting him not to answer those questions based
17 upon his ongoing criminal case. And I presume the Board
18 is aware of the criminal case. And if it's not, it is
19 in my exhibits, and it's Exhibit G, which is
20 Bates-stamped RES041.

21 MR. DETMER: And I'm sorry, counsel. So we
22 have a binder up here. There's two packets of exhibits.

23 MR. REID: Oh, I made it easier, sir. The
24 binder is where the Attorney General's Office, and mine
25 is just the smaller package in the binder.

1 MR. DETMER: Okay.

2 MS. BORDELOVE: And when he's referring to
3 Bates-stamped, any of you that may not be familiar, it's
4 on the bottom right. The Attorney General's, the ones
5 brought forth by the petitioner and my exhibits, are
6 Bates-stamped with PILB Bates at the bottom right in the
7 left of the binder.

8 MR. KLEMME: Excuse me. Excuse me. Am I going
9 to be giving Shannon these exhibits right now?

10 MS. BORDELOVE: You may. I believe, they've
11 all been admitted at this point by stipulation.

12 MS. KLEMME: Okay. They all have been
13 admitted. Okay.

14 MR. DETMER: Mr. Chairman, that they have been
15 admitted.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I'm sorry. What?

17 MR. DETMER: Just as far as the declaration for
18 the record, that the exhibits of the counsels have been
19 admitted into the record.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: They have been
21 admitted.

22 (Petitioner's Exhibits 1 through 15 and
23 Respondent's Exhibits A through H were marked for
24 identification prior to the commencement of the hearing
25 and are admitted by stipulation.)

1 MS. BORDELOVE: Then, yes, you may give them
2 all to Shannon.

3 MS. KLEMME: Oh, okay. Thank you.

4 MR. DETMER: And Mike Detmer, serving as Board
5 counsel.

6 As far as the --

7 (The Reporter indicated that it's difficult to
8 hear Las Vegas.)

9 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, Board Counsel.

10 As far as the statement of intent to exercise
11 the Fifth Amendment right to not self-incriminate, a
12 properly exercised right to avoid self-incrimination
13 should be observed and the non-testimony not taken
14 adversely against the witness. But that would be a
15 properly exercised Fifth Amendment observation.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

17 MR. DETMER: And as far as -- and this is for
18 my edification, actually the Board's, everyone's
19 edification. I'm talking too fast again, I know. Do
20 the parties wish to exercise a motion to exclude
21 witnesses?

22 MR. REID: We have no wish to.

23 MS. BORDELOVE: I have no wish to.

24 MR. DETMER: And are there any additional
25 stipulations or motions preliminary to the hearing?

1 MR. REID: I think, that's everything.

2 MS. BORDELOVE: Okay.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Let's
4 get started.

5 MS. BORDELOVE: Okay. Then, I will, I guess,
6 start and give you a bit of an overview.

7 What we have here today is an individual who,
8 in the eyes of, I guess, petitioner in this, or the
9 Board, has been using his registered work card as a full
10 license to provide private security and executive
11 protection services for clients within the state of
12 Nevada.

13 As I will show you, in going through these
14 exhibits and through testimony, the respondent was
15 informed on numerous occasions that he needed a full
16 license to be able to provide these services. But
17 instead of getting licensed, he disregarded the
18 requirements of NRS 648.060 and continued to perform
19 private security and executive protection services
20 despite receiving five unlicensed activity citations.

21 And I wanted to point out a couple of things
22 just to clarify what I'm asking for today. None of
23 these five citations have been appealed within the
24 required time frame, which is 30 days by statute. But
25 what I am asking for you to do is to revoke his work

1 card, his registration, under NRS 648.156, because he
2 violated the provisions of NRS Chapter 648 and showed an
3 utter disregard for their contents.

4 So I just wanted to, I guess, clarify that this
5 isn't a citation appeal hearing as you had before. And
6 I'm -- though I'm going to be going through some of the
7 facts in the citations. But we are basing off of NRS
8 648.156, subsection 2. And I don't know if any of you
9 want to take a look at that at the outset of this. I
10 can also pull it up from somewhere in here.

11 Oh, there you go. He had a second binder. But
12 it, 648.156 states that the Board may revoke the
13 registration of a registered employee if the Board
14 finds, after a hearing, that the registered -- on or
15 after the date which the Board issued the registration
16 to the registered employee, the registered employee
17 commits or attempts or conspires to commit any acts
18 prohibited by this chapter or any regulation adopted or
19 order pursuant thereto.

20 So this here is a hearing regarding
21 respondent's work card and whether or not he should be
22 allowed to retain that work card after what I'll show
23 you today.

24 MR. REID: I have just a short opening
25 statement, and that is, is to say that there is two

1 issues here.

2 There's the legality of the citations that were
3 issued. What we have is five different citations that
4 were issued. They are almost identical in the wording
5 and the language that's used. We have a statute that
6 states, NRS 648.162, each notice of violation must, A,
7 be in writing and describe with particularity the nature
8 of the violation. I'm going to show you a case law
9 which has that exact same phrase and that exact same
10 case law on point, to say that they -- to describe with
11 particularity the nature of the violation needs a more
12 description in the citation. That's on the legal side.

13 On the other side, we understand that -- I have
14 some issues. We have a criminal case that's ongoing. I
15 want to make sure that my client doesn't say anything
16 that's going to incriminate him for that case, because
17 he has that right, and I have to protect him. But my
18 client does want to speak to you, does want to let you
19 guys know his side of the story, and he wants to be able
20 to plead for some type of an arrangement with this
21 Board.

22 And that's why we're here today. Thank you.

23 MS. BORDELOVE: To the legal arguments, I
24 guess, if now would be the time for me to respond to
25 those, or would you rather hear those later?

1 MR. REID: The closest, the closest one, we do
2 the opening, and then we put the evidence on.

3 MS. BORDELOVE: Okay. Then I'll go into the
4 evidence. I would, yeah, I -- then, my first witness
5 I'm going to call is Lori Irizarry. And I don't know if
6 we want to move this at all, so (microphone). We can
7 move it, if we need to, if you want to cross-examine at
8 all. So I want her to feel she's able to talk.

9 MR. DETMER: Will you please stand.

10 MS. IRIZARRY: Oh. Yes.

11 MR. INGRAM: Can we swear everybody at once?

12 MS. BORDELOVE: They were sworn earlier. But
13 we can swear them again. They were sworn at the
14 beginning of the meeting, I believe.

15 MR. DETMER: Raise your right, please. Do you
16 hereby swear and affirm that you will tell the whole
17 truth, tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but
18 the truth?

19 MS. IRIZARRY: I do.

20

21 L O R I I R I Z A R R Y,
22 having been first duly sworn/affirmed,
23 was examined and testified as follows:

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DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MS. BORDELOVE:

Q. Will you please state and spell your name for the record.

A. Lori Irizarry. That's L-O-R-I, I-R-I-Z-A-R-R-Y.

Q. Okay. And will you please describe your position with the Private Investigators Licensing Board.

A. I am the Chief of Operations. I oversee the investigators that we have on staff in the Las Vegas office.

Q. Okay. And did you work for the PILB in January of 2016?

A. Yes.

Q. And what was your position then?

A. I think, I was the same title, Chief of Operations, as well.

Q. Okay. And will you, in that exhibit book there, please turn to Exhibit 3. I realize we don't have tabs in there. It is page 15, if that helps. Do you recognize this document?

A. Yes.

Q. What is it?

A. It is the work card application.

Q. Is it respondent's work card application?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. Did the PILB receive this document from the
3 respondent?

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. Will you describe a little bit the process for
6 applying for a registered work card.

7 A. So, in 2016, you could either apply online or
8 come into the office to apply. We have, the Las Vegas
9 office is set up that there is a window in the lobby.

10 (The Reporter indicated that it's difficult
11 hear to hear Las Vegas. There was a minute off the
12 record to relocate the microphone in Las Vegas.)

13 BY MR. BORDELOVE:

14 Q. So you were describing the process for applying
15 for a registered word card as it was in 2016.

16 A. So the work card application process, you can
17 either apply online or apply in the office. Our
18 Las Vegas office is set up where you grab an
19 application, fill it out in our office or bring it home,
20 turn it in to someone at the window. And then they look
21 over the application before turning it in. At that
22 time, we're just looking for completeness, anything, if
23 at that time there would possibly be a reason why, if
24 you're missing anything, what you're missing, or the
25 certain things that would deny you, we try to catch it

1 there at the window.

2 Q. Okay. And can you please turn to -- I think,
3 it's page 4 of the application. It's Bates-stamped PILB
4 four zeroes 17.

5 A. Okay.

6 Q. Okay. Can you read, in the middle of the page,
7 the employment history for me, please?

8 A. So the company name listed is Mayweather
9 Promotions. The location is Las Vegas, Nevada.
10 Position, bodyguard. From December 28, 2007 to
11 October 1st of 2015. And the reason for leaving is
12 "Started private my own security."

13 Q. Okay. And is this information provided by --
14 was this provided by the respondent?

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. On the application?

17 A. Correct.

18 Q. Okay. And at the bottom of the page here,
19 there's a note. Will you please read that.

20 A. The date is 1-26-16. A-P-P-L, reduced for
21 applicant, applicant worked for Mayweather Productions,
22 not contract, not contracted, informed this card not a
23 license. Aware needs to work for licensing. And then
24 my initials.

25 Q. Okay. So did you write this note?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. And can you describe to me why you wrote that
3 note?

4 A. So oftentimes, in chief operations, when
5 someone's at the front window, if there's a question on
6 an application that they're unsure of, they would bring
7 it to my attention. This one was brought to my
8 attention because the person at the front noticed that
9 they're listing that they're doing bodyguard work, but
10 they're getting a work card. So I wrote the note
11 because, at the time, after speaking to Mr. Plant at the
12 window, I asked him, "What type of work are you doing?
13 Because I see you're not doing that anymore." Because
14 by the time he's applying. He explained that he was
15 doing contracted work for Mayweather. And I let him
16 know, just like I do most applicants when they come to
17 the window, "Just so you know, this is not a license.
18 You cannot use your work card unless you're associated
19 with the licensee."

20 So for that reason, that's why I make the note
21 at that same exact time. And I usually make it right
22 there in front of them as they're standing there right
23 in front of me at the window.

24 Q. Okay. So you did inform him that the work card
25 was not sufficient to provide bodyguarding services

1 without working for a licensee?

2 A. Correct.

3 Q. Okay. Then will you turn to, I think, page 10
4 of the application, which is Bates-stamped twenty --
5 where am I? 26.

6 A. Okay.

7 Q. Can you tell me what this is?

8 A. This is the security guard exam questions.
9 This is the questions that are required if you want to
10 do security work in the state of Nevada.

11 Q. Okay. And will you please read to me -- let's
12 start with question number 2.

13 A. No person may engage in the business of private
14 investigator, private patrol officer, process server,
15 reposessor, canine handler, security consultant, or
16 polygraphic examiner, slash, intern unless the person
17 is, blank.

18 Q. And what is the correct answer?

19 A. Licensee.

20 Q. And what did -- on the preceding page, which is
21 Bates-stamped 25, what is that page?

22 A. So this is where they're supposed to put their
23 answers. So Mr. Plant, this is his answer sheet that he
24 filled out, with his handwriting and whatnot. And
25 that's what that is.

1 Q. What did he answer for number 2?

2 A. He is answered correctly. He answered
3 question B, or answer B.

4 Q. And for -- will you also read question
5 number 5, please.

6 A. A person with a word card, with an active work
7 card is able to engage in the business of private
8 investigator, private patrol officer, process server,
9 reposessor, canine handler, security consultant, or
10 polygraphic examiner under a person licensed in the
11 related field.

12 Q. What is the correct answer to that question?

13 A. That is true.

14 Q. And how did Mr. Plant answer that question?

15 A. He answered it correctly, he answered true.

16 MS. BORDELOVE: Okay. I think, that is all the
17 questions I have for you.

18 I can pass the witness to you. I reserve that
19 I may have some questions on redirect.

20

21 CROSS-EXAMINATION

22 BY MR. REID:

23 Q. I'm sorry. I didn't get your last name. But
24 can I call you Lori, if that's okay?

25 A. Yes.

1 Q. Okay, Lori. Lori, why did you write this note
2 under the child support section?

3 A. Because I usually make the note on the page in
4 which it's pertaining to. So because it's regarding the
5 work card, I did it -- I'm sorry. Because it's
6 regarding his employment, it's on the exact same page.
7 I just use a spot with an empty, blank spot.

8 Q. Is there any reason why you didn't put it
9 below, in the employment information, where it says
10 "Started private my own security"; is there a reason why
11 you didn't put it there just to highlight that this is
12 an issue?

13 A. No, because, to myself, from in the middle of
14 the page, that's their application, so I don't want to
15 overwrite what they have written. So I usually put it
16 somewhere, at the top or at the bottom, just so I'm not
17 in their space of where it's above their application.

18 Q. At the end, it says "Aware needs to work for
19 license." Then is that your initial at the end, LF?

20 A. LI, yes.

21 Q. LI. Okay. Did you have my client initial that
22 as well?

23 A. No.

24 Q. Why not?

25 A. Because it's not his statement. It's my

1 statement that I'm making at the time when I did the
2 application. So I'm not asking him to verify anything.
3 It's just my statement that I wrote.

4 Q. Did he sign this application prior to you
5 writing that information?

6 A. He would have filled out the application,
7 brought it to the window, and then I would have spoke to
8 him, before paying.

9 Q. But when he signed, to confirm that everything
10 is true and correct, he would have signed that prior to
11 you writing that information, correct?

12 A. There is no signature required on the 2016
13 application.

14 Q. But it's -- looking at page Bates PILB 21, it
15 says April 13. Is that a different signature strip, or?

16 A. Yes. So what you're looking on Bates stamp 21
17 is the Department of Public Safety's requirement to get
18 fingerprinted.

19 Q. Correct.

20 A. That is part of the application. But our
21 application, it's not that page.

22 Q. So there's nowhere for an applicant to put
23 their signature so that they confirm that this is true
24 and accurate?

25 A. In 2016, no, that's correct.

1 Q. Did my client receive a copy of this
2 application back, with your note added to it?

3 A. Not unless he requested one.

4 Q. Is that standard for a person not to receive a
5 copy?

6 A. Correct.

7 Q. Do you usually get people trying to start their
8 own private security using a registration card after
9 applying in an application like this?

10 A. Can you repeat the question?

11 Q. Do you usually get people who say to you that
12 they're going to be starting their own business as a
13 private security company when they're applying for a
14 registration card?

15 A. I don't know if I'd use the word usually, but
16 it does happen sometimes. They are -- they
17 misunderstood our process. So that's usually when we
18 catch them. And we would notify them at that time
19 that's not what you're wanting to fill out, and we would
20 redirect them to speak to someone about being licensed.

21 Q. Okay. And did you do that with Mr. Plant?

22 A. No, because he stated at that time that he's no
23 longer doing that sort of work. So I'm just informing
24 him, okay, just so you know, this is not a license.

25 Q. Did you redirect him to someone to discuss

1 about the license?

2 A. No, I did not.

3 MR. REID: Okay. I have no more questions.

4 MS. BORDELOVE: I don't have any other
5 questions for you.

6 So does the Board have any questions for
7 Ms. Irizarry?

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I don't.

9 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: No.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No.

11 MS. BORDELOVE: Okay.

12 MR. DETMER: Is Ms. Irizarry free to leave, or
13 is she being withheld for rebuttal?

14 MS. BORDELOVE: I think, she's free to leave.
15 But, I think, she's probably staying till the end of the
16 meeting anyway.

17 THE WITNESS: Okay.

18 MS. BORDELOVE: The next witness I will call is
19 Zachary Swarthout.

20 MR. DETMER: Before you sit down, if you could
21 please raise your right hand. Sir, do you swear or
22 affirm to tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing
23 but the truth?

24 THE WITNESS: I do.

25 ///

1 Z A C H A R Y S W A R T H O U T,
2 having been first duly sworn/affirmed,
3 was examined and testified as follows:
4

5 DIRECT EXAMINATION

6 BY MS. BORDELOVE:

7 Q. Mr. Swarthout, will you please state and spell
8 your name for the record.

9 A. Zachary Swarthout, Z-A-C-H-A-R-Y, last name
10 Swarthout, S-W-A-R-T-H-O-U-T.

11 Q. And what is your position at the PILB?

12 A. I'm a compliance audit investigator.

13 Q. And what does that position entail?

14 A. So I go and I audit our licensed companies to
15 make sure that they're following the rules. I also look
16 for compliance violations, not just for unlicensed
17 activity, but through our licensees, also.

18 Q. Okay. And what type of investigation do you
19 often do when looking for unlicensed activity?

20 A. I look for social media posts that are posting
21 bodyguard, security services, canine handlers, any, any
22 variation of what we license and register with.

23 Q. Okay. And what type of investigations did you
24 perform in August of 2018, when looking for unlicensed
25 activity?

1 A. Mostly social media.

2 Q. Okay. Did you encounter any social media posts
3 by Mr. Plant?

4 A. Yes, I did.

5 Q. Let's see. Can I have you switch, turn to
6 Exhibit 4, please? If you would please flip through and
7 familiarize yourself with the documents contained in
8 there.

9 A. (Witness complying.)

10 Q. You can flip -- and you don't have to look at
11 every page exactly, since, I think, we've already
12 admitted them. But do you recognize these documents?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. What are they?

15 A. They're screen prints from his Instagram page,
16 from Mr. Plant's Instagram page, where he's detailing
17 that he's doing security and bodyguard services.

18 Q. Okay. Can I take you to the page Bates-stamped
19 33?

20 A. 33. All right.

21 Q. Will you please, I guess, describe what this
22 page is.

23 A. So this is Mr. Plant's Instagram page. This is
24 a header. This is like the main front page when you
25 actually go onto it, with what he has put down and

1 described and what he's posted.

2 Q. Okay. Will you please read what it says right
3 after his name, Adam Plant, just that little bit right
4 there.

5 A. At six seven 350, I am co-owner of The Great
6 Wall TGW Executive Protection Service taking care of my
7 wife and three children through God's grace. DM me for
8 service.

9 Q. Thank you. And then will you move on to
10 page 42. Will you please read what it says under The
11 Great Wall TGW.

12 A. Who need some block protection? Offering TGW
13 protection, and appearances very soon. Let us know.

14 And then there's some hashtags. Do you want me
15 to read those, also?

16 Q. No, that's okay. Then will you move to
17 page 48, please. And will you please read the caption
18 posted by Mr. Plant.

19 A. When the best cornerback in the NFL Real
20 Patrick Peterson comes to Las Vegas, you know he wants
21 the best in private security, At Adam Plant to hold him
22 down, and he has the best private host in At Elena Kess
23 my homegirl taking care of all his bookings.

24 Q. And what's the hashtag at the end of that?

25 A. Clients of Adam Plant.

1 Q. Thank you. And will you turn to page 52,
2 please. Will you please read just what was posted, the
3 caption posted by Mr. Plant.

4 A. We got my client feeling right, or feeling
5 great right now, At Mr. Adam Plant, At Big Church 71, At
6 Big Marko 17, Big Derrick, hashtag, Client of Adam
7 Plant, hashtag, The Great Wall TGW Executive Protection
8 Supporting Service, Execution Protection Service.

9 Q. Okay. And Will you move to page 54, please.
10 Will you please read the caption Mr. Plant posted to
11 that one.

12 A. It's the way of Mr. Adam Plant and my company,
13 At The Great Wall TGW Executive Protection Service to
14 only provide G -- G-O-R -- I'm assuming "for" -- my
15 client the best in private security service. I deal
16 with clients that pay very well to have professional
17 services provided by professional men. And I take the
18 utmost pride in my name, my company, and most of all my
19 work. So with that being said, I'd like to thank God
20 for everything.

21 Q. Okay. Will you move to page 64. And I don't
22 think you need to read the whole one, but will you read
23 starting about halfway through where it says I really
24 want to become.

25 A. To really become a multimillionaire in the

1 field of private security, executive protection,
2 bodyguarding, and I want my company At The Great Wall
3 TGW to become the most notorious name in.

4 Q. And will you move to page 66, please. And will
5 you read just the caption posted by Mr. Plant there.

6 A. Just got my Utah concealed firearms permit to
7 add to my bodyguard credentials, so I now have a CCW for
8 Nevada, Florida, and Utah, hashtag, Clients of Adam
9 Plant.

10 Q. Thank you. Let's see. Will you move to
11 page 74, please. And will you please read the caption
12 by Mr. Plant.

13 A. If people ever had the nerve to question me
14 about my business, I'll just break out my paperwork and
15 tell them please don't get me confused with bullshit, my
16 company. At The Great Wall TGW is a security company
17 and clothing line in which we are an LLC company with a
18 tax ID number that we pay taxes for, and we own our
19 trademarks. So miss me with any foolness, At Mr. Adam
20 Plant, At Big Church 71, At Dr. --

21 Q. With that, and then -- okay. I don't know if I
22 have an exhibit page here, but what I -- I think, this
23 Exhibit 5. But either way, it's page 78. What is this
24 a screenshot of?

25 A. This is a screenshot of The Great Wall TGW's

1 website.

2 Q. And will you please read what it says under
3 The Great Wall Executive Protection Services.

4 A. The Great Wall TGW is an executive protection
5 service company and brand founded by Big Adam, Mr. Adam
6 Plant Sr., and Big Church, Mr. Alfonso Redic, with
7 managing member Dr. Adronica Handie, with the armament
8 of years of protecting your favorite celebrities,
9 athletes and high profiles. Mr. Plant and Mr. Redic
10 decided to launch their own executive protection
11 services company accented by his very own The Great Wall
12 TGW merchandising brand which is trademarked. Big Adam
13 and Big Church have traveled the world, worked with the
14 most popular entertainers, elite business executives and
15 have an enormous amount of experience in executive
16 protection services. With the assistance of their
17 partner Dr. Adronica Handie a plan was forged to launch
18 The Great Wall TGW Executive Protection Services.

19 And then there's space. The company is focused
20 on providing exemplary executive protection. Our motto
21 is the protection, protecting the elite one event at a
22 time. The company relies on the service of multiple men
23 of an enormous stature. These individuals range and
24 tower in the size of six nine to seven two in height.
25 Request our services and we'll provide the executive

1 protection services you, your organization or event
2 deserves. Shop our brand Walking With the Wall.

3 Q. Thank you. And you viewed all these documents,
4 or all these posts on the internet in August of 2018,
5 correct?

6 A. Correct.

7 Q. Okay. And, I guess, we can move to Exhibit 6,
8 page 92. And will you please read the first probably
9 four lines of what it says under goods and services.

10 A. Okay. Do you want the IC number or just the --

11 Q. And, I guess, first, what is this a screenshot
12 of?

13 A. This is a trademark from the U.S. Patent and
14 Trademark's offices.

15 Q. Okay.

16 A. What you can find online for.

17 Q. And what is the mark for?

18 A. The Great Wall TGW.

19 Q. Okay. Then will you read the first four lines
20 of the goods and services.

21 A. Bodyguard services; security consultancy;
22 security guard services; security services, namely armed
23 escorts and security personnel for celebrities, boxers,
24 fighters; security services, namely providing security
25 assets for business and governmental agencies; security

1 threat analysis for personal protection purposes;
2 security threat analysis for protecting personal
3 property; security threat analysis for protecting public
4 safety.

5 Q. That's probably good. And at the time of
6 reading all these, did you verify whether or not
7 Mr. Plant was listed on the roster?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. For any security company?

10 A. Yes. At the time, he wasn't listed for any
11 company.

12 Q. Okay. Then, will you move to Exhibit 7 and
13 read what this document is.

14 A. Okay. This is citation I-060-18.

15 Q. Okay. And did you issue this citation?

16 A. Yes, I did.

17 Q. Okay. And did you at any point receive any
18 appeal of this citation?

19 A. No, I did not.

20 Q. Okay. Did you have any contact with Mr. Plant
21 regarding this citation after its issue?

22 A. Yes, I did.

23 Q. Will you describe what that contact was.

24 A. He came into the office. I believe, it was
25 around August 13th, 12th, 13th area. He spoke with

1 myself and Supervisor Investigator Vincent Saladino.

2 Q. Okay. And will you please describe the nature
3 of that meeting.

4 A. We went over the citations. We told him that
5 his work card was not a license. We also talked him
6 through the process of getting a license and provided
7 him the application for the license.

8 Q. Okay. And how did Mr. Plant respond to this?

9 A. He said that he was going to get in contact
10 with his business partners.

11 Q. Okay. Will you move on to Exhibit 8. Did you
12 do follow-up investigations after that citation
13 regarding Mr. Plant's activities?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. Okay. And these posts in Exhibit 8, are they
16 ones that you observed after -- I think, they have dates
17 on here. Are they ones you observed in October of 2018?
18 I guess, are the screenshots, the dates at the bottom of
19 screenshots, do you believe that those are correct dates
20 as to when you observed these posts?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. Okay. And will you turn to page 106. And will
23 you please read the caption there.

24 A. The key to being a great bodyguard, slash,
25 private security businessman in Las Vegas is that one

1 will always have to establish business relationships
2 with the top club host and casino host at every prime
3 location in Las Vegas such as my guy right here, At
4 Richard Candido, the lead host at Omnian Nightclub. And
5 that is what separates me from the others, other. I
6 been doing this thing for almost 20 years now in
7 Las Vegas.

8 Q. Okay. And will you move to page 112, please.
9 And will you please read the first sentence of the
10 caption to that picture.

11 A. Off to work I go and see in this bodyguard line
12 of work you got to be able to carry a firearm concealed
13 to really be a professional at this cuz at the end of
14 the day your client must be able to go home safely. And
15 all of Adams Plant's clients are secured entirely.

16 Q. Thank you. Let's see if there's any others of
17 these I want to point out. Would you turn to page 128,
18 please. And will you please read the caption by
19 Mr. Plant.

20 A. Took my clients to the At Encore Beach Club
21 Night Swim. I am always grateful to God for great
22 clients, especially clients that like to pay their
23 security well, L-O-L. I thank you. Hashtag, Clients of
24 Adam Plant.

25 Q. Okay. Will you move to page 136, please. And

1 will you please read the caption there, but you can
2 leave off the hashtags.

3 A. Always a pleasure of doing security for my
4 brother At Warren G.

5 Q. Thank you. Okay. And will you please move to
6 Exhibit 9. It is page 142, if that's helpful. What is
7 this a screenshot of?

8 A. This is a Thumbtack advertisement. It's kind
9 of like an Angie's List kind of website where you can
10 post out what services you're providing.

11 Q. Okay. And what is this advertising? I guess,
12 can you read the "About this pro"?

13 A. The Great Wall TGW Executive Protection
14 Service. As a professional bodyguard I have been able
15 to provide professional personal bodyguard services for
16 celebrities such as Snoop Dogg, Floyd Mayweather, and
17 Shaquille O'Neal while at the same time being able to
18 privately secure extreme partygoers.

19 Q. Okay. And from this webpage, Thumbtack, would
20 you be able to, essentially, request services or get in
21 contact?

22 A. Yes. You can also request estimates.

23 Q. Okay. At the time of viewing these most recent
24 social media posts and the Thumbtack page that you read,
25 did you verify whether or not Mr. Plant was on any

1 security company's roster?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. And was he?

4 A. No.

5 Q. Then will you turn to Exhibit 10, please. Did
6 you issue this citation?

7 A. Yes, I did.

8 Q. And to your knowledge, has this citation been
9 appealed?

10 A. No.

11 Q. Okay. Let's move on to -- let's see.
12 Exhibit 11. When did you view, or around when did you
13 view the social media posts that are in Exhibit 11?

14 A. Around November 26th, 2018.

15 Q. Okay. Will you please turn to page 151. And
16 will you please read the caption by Mr. Plant on that
17 page.

18 A. Another gig, another check, holding down, At
19 Warren G.

20 Q. M-hm (affirmative). And will you move on to
21 Exhibit 12, please. Will you turn to page 155. And
22 will you read beginning where it starts in all caps.

23 A. Okay. I work for those clients known as big
24 gamblers and this wonderful group of people know how to
25 pay security and that's some real talk. I was having

1 the most diverse group of clients because I am a real
2 bodyguard and I know people and how to provide great
3 services to any type of personality and will never be
4 stopped. I am a master of my craft and will do this
5 work setting the bar for myself. In this bodyguard
6 business the world will know the name Adam Plant.

7 Q. Okay. And will you please move to page 159,
8 please, and read the caption there.

9 A. That's them bodyguards that's gone, gone great,
10 at least a million apiece out the security shit. Just
11 keep watching us cuz we ain't watching no one else.
12 Remember the name.

13 Q. Okay. At the time of these social media posts,
14 did you verify if Mr. Plant was listed on a roster of
15 any security company?

16 A. Yes, I did.

17 Q. Was he listed?

18 A. No.

19 Q. Okay. Will you turn to Exhibit 13, please,
20 page 160. Did you issue this citation based on those
21 social media posts?

22 A. Yes, I did.

23 Q. To your knowledge, has this situation been
24 appealed?

25 A. No.

1 Q. And will you please describe to me your
2 activities regarding the investigation into Mr. Plant on
3 the evening of January 10, 2019 and into the early
4 morning hours of January 11th, 2019.

5 A. Myself, Director Ingram and Supervisor
6 Investigator Saladino were down at the Wynn, along with
7 a couple officers from Las Vegas Metropolitan Police
8 Department. We were down there because a post by
9 Mr. Plant said that they would be providing security
10 services for a client at the XS nightclub.

11 Q. And did you observe Mr. Plant providing private
12 security and/or executive protection services that night
13 or in the early hours of January 11?

14 A. Yes, we did.

15 Q. And can you describe what you observed?

16 A. Mr. Plant and his associates and his clients
17 were pulled out of the high roller section by Metro.
18 Him and his cohorts and his client, they were walking in
19 a formation trying to stop people from getting close to
20 his client.

21 Q. Okay. Then will you look to Exhibit 14. And
22 at the time of -- on January 11, 2019, was Mr. Plant
23 listed on the roster of any security company?

24 A. No, he wasn't.

25 Q. Okay. Did you issue Exhibit -- let's see. The

1 citation that's in Exhibit 14, is that a citation you
2 issued?

3 A. Yes, it is.

4 Q. Okay. And was it based on that January 11th
5 observation?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. Okay. And Exhibit 15, will you take a look at
8 that. Will you describe to me the basis for that
9 citation.

10 A. This citation was issued out because he was
11 seen providing security services for Adrien Broner while
12 walking him into the MGM Grand.

13 Q. Did you have contact with Mr. Plant after this
14 citation was issued?

15 A. Yes, we did.

16 Q. And can you describe what that contact was?

17 A. He came into the office. It was either January
18 17th or 18th. He came in to discuss the citations and
19 that and what was going on.

20 Q. Okay. And what occurred during that meeting?

21 A. Myself, Supervisor Investigator Saladino and
22 Director Ingram were involved, along with two, two,
23 three Metro officers. During the conversation, we
24 provided him copies of the last three citations. We
25 also told him that you cannot continue to provide

1 services. And he was also discussing possibly entering
2 into a payment plan with the Director.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I'm sorry. I
4 didn't get that last.

5 THE WITNESS: Entering into a payments plan
6 with the Director on the citations.

7 BY MS. BORDELOVE:

8 Q. To your knowledge, have any of these citations
9 been appealed?

10 A. No, they have not.

11 Q. To your knowledge, have any amounts been paid
12 to the PILB on any of these citations?

13 A. To the PILB, no.

14 Q. Okay. I believe, there may have been something
15 with the Controller's. So were any of the citations
16 submitted to the Controller's Office for collections, to
17 your knowledge?

18 A. Yes, the first two.

19 Q. And that might be beyond your knowledge, but to
20 the extent that you have knowledge of any payments to
21 the Controller's Office?

22 A. Yes, there was some payments.

23 MS. BORDELOVE: Okay. I think, that actually
24 might have been admitted. So we may leave that out.

25 But I'll pass the witness to you if you have

1 any questions.

2 MR. REID: Sure.

3

4 CROSS-EXAMINATION

5 BY MR. REID:

6 Q. Mr. Swarthout, I want to go back to the first
7 citation, if that's okay, which is Exhibit 7, which is
8 going to be nine six.

9 A. 96, you said?

10 Q. Nine six, correct.

11 A. Okay.

12 Q. This is the citation that's dated on the bottom
13 August the 6th, 2018, and that's your signature on the
14 left, correct?

15 A. Correct.

16 Q. Why was this citation given?

17 A. It was issued out for the website and the
18 social media posts.

19 Q. Can you describe that a little more, because
20 I'm sure that you don't give out citations just for any
21 website, or?

22 A. For him describing on his website that he's
23 providing executive protection service.

24 Q. Do you state that in the citation, that it's
25 for the website and for the social media for advertising

1 protective services?

2 A. No.

3 Q. Why not?

4 A. I was just listing out the definition of the
5 services he was providing.

6 Q. But you didn't describe them for the website
7 and for the social media?

8 A. No, I did not.

9 Q. We can now move to the next citation, which is
10 Exhibit Number 10, which is on Bates stamp number 145.
11 This is the one dated October the 10th, 2018 with your
12 signature on the left. Do you see it?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. What was this citation issued for?

15 A. It was issued for the social media posts and a
16 Thumbtack page.

17 Q. Did you describe that in the citation?

18 A. No, I did not.

19 Q. Why not?

20 A. I listed the definition of the -- for private
21 patrol officer services.

22 Q. But why didn't you describe the actual
23 violation itself?

24 A. I don't know why I didn't post that.

25 Q. Okay. I'm going to the next citation, if

1 that's okay. It should be the third one, which is on
2 PILB 160. It's the one dated January the 10th, 2019.
3 And this is your signature on the left-hand side. What
4 was this citation given for?

5 A. This was given for him providing services,
6 Mr. Plant, The Great Wall TGW, for providing services in
7 the nightclub Hakkasan on December 31st, 2018.

8 Q. What was he doing?

9 A. He was providing executive protection services.

10 Q. What was he actually physically doing?

11 A. Employing, providing for others, persons
12 bodyguards and executive protection.

13 Q. Okay. I know you're reading from the citation
14 a vague description. But I'm asking you, what was he
15 physically doing, what was his person doing, what was he
16 saying, what was he doing, what were his hands doing,
17 how was he walking, what was he doing in violation to
18 receive this citation?

19 A. He checked in with Hakkasan nightclub saying
20 that he was doing security.

21 Q. So just to confirm, it says here that the --
22 "This office is in receipt of information which
23 confirms, confirms that The Great Wall TGW, Adam Plant,
24 has continued to the provide said services within the
25 state of Nevada at the nightclub Hakkasan on December

1 31st, 2018." But you're now saying that he checked into
2 Hakkasan saying that he was providing security services,
3 correct?

4 A. That's correct.

5 Q. Do you know who you spoke to?

6 A. Dan Hoban.

7 Q. Who is?

8 A. Who is the -- for Hakkasan Group, I believe,
9 he's security manager.

10 Q. And you got that information prior to issuing
11 the citation?

12 A. Correct.

13 Q. Why didn't you put the information in the
14 citation?

15 A. We normally don't provide our evidence when
16 give them the citation.

17 Q. I was trying, what I'm trying to get at is, why
18 didn't you state what the actual physical thing that
19 he's going to be doing? Because you're saying that he
20 checked in with Hakkasan saying that he was going to be
21 providing the services, correct?

22 A. Correct.

23 Q. And did he provide services?

24 A. From what he told Hakkasan, yes.

25 Q. So he checked in, said he was going to provide

1 services, then he checked again afterwards and said that
2 he had provided those services?

3 A. He checked in. When he goes in, he showed his
4 work card and said he's providing security services.

5 Q. Okay. And that was prior to -- what day was
6 that on, December 31st, 2018?

7 A. That's when he provided the services. I
8 believe, the email was January 3rd.

9 Q. Oh, so there was an email?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Who was the email from and to?

12 A. It was from Dan Hoban to the Director and
13 Supervisor Investigator Saladino.

14 Q. And do we have a copy of that email?

15 A. We do.

16 THE WITNESS: It would have been within the
17 packet I gave you.

18 MS. BORDELOVE: I thought the only email I had
19 was regarding to as far as things working out tomorrow.
20 Because we are not having it, that I'm aware of.

21 THE WITNESS: I have a copy in my binder.

22 MS. BORDELOVE: Let me take a look.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Reid, are you
24 fine with a five-minute break?

25 MR. REID: Sure.

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(A break was taken, 2:53 to 3:10 p.m.)

* * * * *

ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. The hearing is continuing after our little break there.

Do you guys want me to just say that we're entering this email as defense Exhibit I?

MR. REID: Sure.

MS. BORDELOVE: Yes.

MR. REID: We will speak up. The last time was --

ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Can you hear me?

THE REPORTER: I did hear that actually. But, yeah, thank you.

(Exhibit I was marked and admitted.)

ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

BY MR. REID:

Q. Okay. Mr. Swarthout, I was asking questions about the citation dated January 10th, 2019, and you indicated that there was an email. Now, there's just been a new exhibit added to the respondent's exhibits, I. I think, you have that in front of you.

A. Yes, I do.

Q. This is an email, it looks like, from Vincent Saladino to yourself on January the 3rd, 2019. And

1 below that is an email from Daniel Hoban dated
2 January 2nd to Kevin Ingram and Vincent Saladino. Is
3 that correct?

4 A. Correct.

5 Q. Now, this email does start out saying "Thank
6 you for the update on McIlwain." And then it
7 immediately goes on to "We saw very few private security
8 this past weekend, which we can attribute to our meeting
9 with you both, so thank you." Do you know if there was
10 a chain of emails prior to this email?

11 A. No, I do not.

12 Q. Do you know if there was a conversation between
13 Mr. Ingram and Mr. Saladino with Mr. Hoban prior to this
14 email?

15 A. No, I do not.

16 Q. Do you know why Mr. Daniel Hoban would forward
17 an email like this to Mr. Ingram and Mr. Saladino? And
18 if you don't know, I don't expect you to guess, presume.

19 A. From my knowledge, Dan Hoban has been sending
20 us emails about the private security that's been coming
21 into the nightclubs.

22 Q. Is that what most security specialists,
23 supervisors do throughout the city?

24 A. No. It is the Hakkasan Group that has taken it
25 and started doing it.

1 Q. Did they take it on their own initiative?

2 A. I do not know.

3 Q. How regular do you see emails like this?

4 A. Maybe once a month.

5 Q. So this email was the basis for the citation
6 dated January 10th, 2019; is that correct?

7 A. Correct.

8 Q. What was the illegal activity that Adam Plant
9 was doing on December 31st, 2019?

10 A. From Hoban's email, he said that they were
11 claiming to be security, and the Golden Knight Warriors
12 would not -- because they were going to deny entry to
13 Mr. Plant and Mr. Alley, and the Golden Knight Warriors
14 said that they would not come in if their security was
15 not entried.

16 Q. So, effectively, he was providing security for
17 the Golden State Warriors at Hakkasan nightclub on
18 December 31st; is that correct?

19 A. Correct.

20 Q. Did you state that in your citation dated
21 January 10th, 2019?

22 A. I did not state that he was providing security
23 for the Golden Knight Warriors.

24 Q. Why not?

25 A. I don't have an answer.

1 Q. Okay. We'll move on to the next one, the next
2 citation, which is on PILB 164. This is the one dated
3 January 14th, 2019.

4 A. Okay.

5 Q. Can you please tell me the violation that
6 Mr. Plant conducted to receive this citation.

7 A. He was observed providing private patrol
8 officer services to a client at the Wynn Las Vegas at
9 zero fifteen hundred hours.

10 Q. What was he doing as a private patrol officer?

11 A. He was providing bodyguard and EP services,
12 executive protection.

13 Q. What was he doing?

14 A. He was providing protection for his client.

15 Q. Physically, what was he doing?

16 A. They were standing around the client. The
17 client was in the middle. Mr. Plant was on one of the
18 corners, and his other associates were on the other
19 corners around his client.

20 Q. And you earlier testified that -- and correct
21 me if I'm wrong -- Mr. Plant and his cohorts were in
22 formation stopping for people coming towards their
23 client?

24 A. Correct.

25 Q. Is that approximately what you said? I

1 scribbled it down, what you said.

2 A. Correct.

3 Q. Did you put those physical actions in the
4 citation?

5 A. No, I did not.

6 Q. Why not?

7 A. I don't know.

8 Q. Was Mr. Plant arrested on this day?

9 A. Yes, he was.

10 Q. What was he arrested for?

11 A. For providing executive protection services.

12 Q. Was he arrested for anything else?

13 THE WITNESS: Do you guys have a copy of the
14 arrest report?

15 MS. BORDELOVE: No, but if you're just
16 referring to yourself, we don't -- we're not trying to
17 admit it. We don't need a copy.

18 THE WITNESS: Okay. So it was listed, it was
19 listed down from -- the charges from Metro was FTC laws,
20 slash, regs, re: investigator, slash, related P-R-O-F
21 two plus. And then the second charge was no work card
22 security guard.

23 BY MR. REID:

24 Q. When it says no work card security guard, what
25 does that mean?

1 MS. BORDELOVE: To the extent you know.

2 BY MR. REID:

3 Q. To the extent you know, what does it mean when
4 he is -- he does not have the valid work card; what does
5 that mean?

6 A. I do not know. All they did was list it as NRS
7 648.060(1).

8 Q. Did Mr. Plant have a valid work card at the
9 time of January the 10th, 2019, January 11, 2019?

10 A. Yes, he did.

11 Q. Do you know why he received this surprise
12 charge for working without a valid card, work card?

13 A. No, I do not.

14 Q. I may have already asked this question, and I
15 apologize. And counsel might object. Did you state in
16 the citation words to the effect that Mr. Plant and his
17 cohorts were in formation to stop people from coming to
18 his client?

19 A. No, I did not.

20 Q. I'm going to just the last citation, if that's
21 okay, and that's on page 168 of the PILB exhibits. What
22 was the reason for this violation? Or this citation?
23 Sorry.

24 A. On January 15th, photos did come out that he
25 was providing protection services for Adrien Broner

1 while he was walking in for the arrivals for the fight
2 that weekend at the MGM Grand.

3 Q. What were those photos?

4 A. Of him walking in front, pushing the crowd away
5 from Adrien Broner.

6 Q. Do you have those photos?

7 A. Yes, I do.

8 Q. May I see them?

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: We don't have
10 those.

11 MR. REID: Okay. Thank you.

12 The Board's indulgence.

13 MS. BORDELOVE: If we show them to the Board, I
14 think that I'm okay with them being admitted. If I --
15 instead of making copies now, can the Board read them
16 all, and I will ensure the court reporter gets a copy
17 later?

18 MR. DETMER: I see no -- if you have an
19 objection.

20 MR. REID: I don't need to have them admitted.
21 I'm sure the Board's only looked, so that they're about
22 to see the pictures. And I'm not here trying to stop
23 them from seeing information. So if you want to do it
24 that way, that's fine. If you want the Board to look at
25 them, we can admit them as an exhibit.

1 MS. BORDELOVE: We'd be okay if all the Board
2 sees them. They become public record. And so I'm fine
3 with it.

4 But if you're fine with that, Shannon, I will
5 make sure a copy is at least emailed to you. We'll call
6 this Exhibit J -- what are we on, I? J?

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: J.

8 MS. BORDELOVE: J. The Board will view them
9 now. I will make sure that they get scanned in and a
10 copy is sent, gotten to the court reporter in some way.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Shannon,
12 can you hear me?

13 THE REPORTER: Yes, I can hear you.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yeah, I just want
15 to state that the Board is accepting this, these
16 photographs, actually printed papers of photographs into
17 evidence as Exhibit J, as in John.

18 THE REPORTER: All right.

19 (Exhibit J was marked and admitted.)

20 MS. DETMER: Does counsel need this?

21 MR. REID: I don't need it. I just --

22 MS. BORDELOVE: Do you want to ask him
23 questions about it, or?

24 MR. REID: I think, just do it that way, go
25 through them, but nothing, nothing specific to the

1 pictures.

2 MS. BORDELOVE: Okay.

3 MR. REID: I just thought the Board would want
4 to see them.

5 MS. BORDELOVE: Okay. Then, I don't know who
6 I'll -- or somewhere, yeah, we just need to keep track
7 of them so we can get a copy to the court reporter.

8 BY MR. REID:

9 Q. So, Mr. Swarthout, where did we obtain these
10 pictures from?

11 A. Some of them were from the Las Vegas Review
12 Journal. And some of them were from Mr. Plant's
13 Instagram and somebody else's Instagram page.

14 Q. Okay. And did you speak to Mr. Plant about
15 this issue, or did you send out the citation?

16 A. I sent out the citation.

17 Q. In the citation, did you describe that -- I
18 think, you testified the pictures showed him, I believe
19 you said, pushing people out of the way of his client,
20 Mr. Adrien Broner. Did you describe that in the
21 citation?

22 A. No.

23 Q. So is it correct to say that the description
24 you wrote was: On January 15th you were at the MGM
25 providing services for Adrien Broner arrival?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. What services did you mean, in that sentence?

3 A. Providing bodyguard, executive protection
4 services.

5 Q. How many times did you speak to Mr. Plant
6 throughout these issues of these citations?

7 A. I believe, twice.

8 Q. Was that in person, or was that on the phone?

9 A. In person.

10 Q. Was it at your office?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. On those occasions, did Mr. Plant explain that
13 he wishes to provide services for people who wish to pay
14 for protective services?

15 A. No.

16 Q. What did he say?

17 A. He didn't go into any real detail about it. He
18 just said, said that he didn't know that he needed a
19 license in the first one, and he thought his work card
20 was a license.

21 Q. And so the second time you spoke to him, what
22 did he say then?

23 A. That was in January. The Director and
24 everybody else was there, involved. He didn't say much.
25 We went over the latest three citations that were issued

1 out. And the Director talked to him, seeing if he would
2 be interested in doing a payment plan. Mr. Plant
3 alluded that he might be interested in doing that. And
4 that was really all that was going down.

5 Q. Did he describe that he does have numerous
6 people who would like for him to provide security
7 services?

8 A. I don't remember him saying that.

9 Q. Did he ever say to you or did you hear him say
10 to anyone in your office that he wishes to be able to
11 provide services for members of the public?

12 A. Not that I remember.

13 Q. Did you say or anyone in the office say words
14 to the effect of, if you want to do this, if you want to
15 continue doing this and provide services to a member of
16 the public, then you need to fill out this license form
17 and obtain a license with the PILB?

18 A. I believe, when we met in August, we did give
19 him the application, we did go over the application
20 process and all that.

21 Q. And so you gave him the application and went
22 through it with him and then did that; is that correct?

23 A. Is that correct?

24 A. Correct.

25 Q. After -- and that was, you said that was in

1 August?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. Was that before or after the first citation?

4 A. That was after.

5 Q. Did you speak to him after the second citation,
6 which was -- according to the documentation, that's
7 dated October the 10th?

8 A. No.

9 Q. Did you just send out this citation, did not
10 discuss anything about it?

11 A. Did not discuss it any further.

12 Q. How about the third citation, which is dated on
13 January 10th, when he got arrested; when did you speak
14 to him after January 10th?

15 A. On January 17th or 18th area, when he came into
16 the office.

17 Q. And you said earlier, you testified that it was
18 yourself, Mr. Ingram, and, I believe you said two or
19 three police officers?

20 A. Yep, and Supervisor Investigator Saladino.

21 Q. Why were the police officers there?

22 A. Because of what had been going on.

23 Q. And was that a meeting that was scheduled
24 between your office and Mr. Plant?

25 A. No.

1 Q. How did the Metro officers know that Mr. Plant
2 was going to be there?

3 A. Mr. Plant came down to the office earlier that
4 morning, and the Director was not available. We alerted
5 the Director, who was out at the time, who then -- I
6 don't know. I assume he called the Metro officers to
7 come down.

8 Q. Do you know what the reason for the Metro
9 officers being there was for?

10 A. Most likely, just to discuss the situation.

11 Q. You said there was three of them; is that
12 correct?

13 A. Correct.

14 MR. REID: Okay. I have no more questions.

15 Oh, I apologize. I apologize. I have one more
16 question. I apologize.

17 MS. BORDELOVE: Go ahead.

18 BY MR. REID:

19 Q. Have you spoken to any of the head of security
20 at the casinos regarding Mr. Plant?

21 A. Me? No.

22 Q. Do you happen to know if your office has spoken
23 to the head of securities at any casinos?

24 A. The security, I'm not sure. I know some of the
25 nightclubs we have talked to.

1 Q. About Mr. Plant?

2 A. About a couple unlicensed activity personnel.

3 Q. Does that include Mr. Plant?

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. And what were those discussions?

6 A. I don't remember. I don't have the emails on
7 that.

8 Q. Can you give me a rough indication?

9 A. It would probably just be that he has been
10 cited previously for providing these services. And if
11 he seems to be providing those services, let us know
12 when he comes in.

13 Q. Have there been any conversations with heads of
14 securities of casinos, heads of securities of the
15 nightclubs or the casinos --

16 (At 3:34 p.m., the videoconference connection
17 with Las Vegas was lost. There was a period off the
18 record to reconnect.)

19 BY MR. REID:

20 Q. Okay. Just to repeat the question, the
21 question was, have there been any conversations with the
22 heads of security of the casinos or the nightclubs
23 asking Mr. Plant not to enter any of their locations?

24 A. Not that I know of.

25 Q. Are you aware that TGW sells T-shirts?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. Is that in violation of any of the citations
3 that you're aware of?

4 A. No.

5 MR. REID: I have no further questions.

6

7

REDIRECT EXAMINATION

8 BY MS. BORDELOVE:

9 Q. Okay. I don't have very many follow-up. But I
10 want to look back at -- let's go to the citation
11 number -- page 96. Will you read just the first two
12 lines of the description there, under where it lists the
13 offense and the fine amount, just the first two lines.

14 A. It was determined that The Great Wall TGW, Adam
15 Plant, Alfonso Redic, Adronica Handie, has offered
16 private patrol officer services in the state of Nevada,
17 engaged in the business of employing and providing for.

18 Q. So has offered. Did you include advertising as
19 has offered?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. Okay. And then let's look at page 145. That's
22 the next citation. Okay. And is that same language,
23 continued to offer, included in that, in the description
24 there?

25 A. Yes.

1 Q. Okay. And let's see. On page 160. Will you
2 read the first line, well, through the comma, so
3 probably halfway through the second line.

4 A. It was determined that The Great Wall TGW, Adam
5 Plant, has continued to offer or advertise private
6 patrol officer services in the state of Nevada.

7 Q. M-hm (affirmative). And let's see. Page 164.
8 Will you read that language out of that same section.

9 A. It was determined that The Great Wall TGW, Adam
10 Plant, has continued to offer or advertise private
11 patrol officer services in the state of Nevada.

12 Q. Okay. And I don't think I need that on the
13 last one. Do you normally contact or reach out to
14 individuals who you have sent citations to?

15 A. No.

16 Q. After the citation?

17 A. No.

18 Q. Okay. During the meeting in August of 2018
19 with Mr. Plant, do you recall either you or Investigator
20 Saladino informing Mr. Plant of his ability to appeal
21 the citations?

22 A. Yes, we did.

23 Q. Okay. And in the meeting in January that you
24 attended, was Mr. Plant informed of the ability to
25 appeal citations within the 30 days?

1 A. I believe so.

2 MS. BORDELOVE: I think, that's all my
3 questions.

4 Do you have any?

5 MR. REID: Yeah, I just have a very quick one
6 on something you brought up.

7

8 RECROSS-EXAMINATION

9 BY MR. REID:

10 Q. On page 164 of the PILB exhibits, counsel
11 stated that, or you read out the first line "It was
12 determined that The Great Wall TGW, Adam Plant, has
13 continued to offer or advertise private patrol
14 services." What was he offering or advertising for this
15 citation?

16 A. He wasn't offering as the basis of this
17 violation.

18 MR. REID: Okay. I don't have questions.

19

20 FURTHER REDIRECT EXAMINATION

21 BY MS. BORDELOVE:

22 Q. I guess, the last question would be, as the
23 basis for this citation, did you witness him providing
24 private patrol officer services?

25 A. Yes.

1 MS. BORDELOVE: Okay. I don't have anything
2 further.

3 MR. DETMER: Were there any further questions
4 by counsel?

5 MR. REID: I have no other questions.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Done. Done,
7 done. Done.

8 MR. REID: Done, done, done.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Any
10 questions from the Board before we move on?

11 And the basis of my questions, Ms. Bordelove,
12 has to do with -- are you calling any more witnesses for
13 your case?

14 MS. BORDELOVE: No.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. That
16 besides your conversations with Hakkasan Security Group
17 and Metro, were there any other conversations outside of
18 the PILB concerning this case?

19 THE WITNESS: Not that I know.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. So did you
21 ever speak -- you mentioned his cohorts. Oh. Sorry
22 about that.

23 (The microphone was moved in Las Vegas.)

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Where were the
25 citations issued?

1 THE WITNESS: They were issued from our office.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: No, but where --
3 at your office? They weren't issued at the location?

4 THE WITNESS: No.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Did you,
6 in the course of your investigation, contact Clark
7 County business license to see if --

8 THE WITNESS: Yes.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: And what
10 happened?

11 THE WITNESS: They don't have any licenses.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Did you
13 contact the state, Secretary of State?

14 THE WITNESS: Yes.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: And what
16 happened?

17 THE WITNESS: No business license.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. What about
19 the Department of Taxation?

20 THE WITNESS: We did not contact Department of
21 Taxation.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. So we
23 don't know whether he's paying taxes on his business or
24 not?

25 THE WITNESS: I don't know.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

2 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the Board.

3 If I may, do any other members of the Board
4 have any questions based on Chairman Flynn's
5 questioning?

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I do. Do we know if any
7 of the people that were with him are considered
8 employees?

9 THE WITNESS: We don't. We do know, from
10 Employment Security Division's -- from some of the
11 employees, we did not find anything being paid into
12 there, which under our statutes is the definition of the
13 employee-employer relationship.

14 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: The second question, did
15 they have any, did those individuals have guard cards?

16 THE WITNESS: Some of them did, some of them
17 don't.

18 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I'm good.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm good.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: We're good.

21 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record.

22 If I may, do counsel have any questions based
23 on the questions asked by the Board?

24 MS. BORDELOVE: No.

25 MR. REID: I just had one other question.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Let's move...

2 MR. REID: Sorry.

3 (The microphone was moved in Las Vegas.)

4

5

FURTHER EXAMINATION

6 BY MR. REID:

7 Q. Just to confirm, one of the questions was, did
8 you check with the Secretary of State if there was a
9 business license. Did you check the Secretary of State
10 for business license for Adam Plant?

11 A. I searched under his name, under the
12 association's and under the company name and didn't find
13 anything.

14 Q. What do you mean under the company name?

15 A. Under The Great Wall TGW and under associated
16 names, we can put in officers or the associated company
17 names, and didn't find anything.

18 Q. And when you searched for The Great Wall or
19 TGW, you didn't find anything with the Secretary of
20 State?

21 A. No.

22 MR. REID: I have no further questions.

23 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record.

24 Just as a general statement, does anybody else
25 have any questions, whether it be Board or counsel?

1 MS. BORDELOVE: No.

2 MR. DETMER: So with that, is this witness
3 excused?

4 MS. BORDELOVE: This witness is excused. And I
5 do not have any further witnesses.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Reid, are you
7 ready to present your case?

8 MR. REID: I am.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Go ahead.

10 MR. REID: Let's go ahead. We'd like to call
11 Mr. Adam Plant. Adam Plant.

12 (There was a minute off the record to move the
13 microphone in Las Vegas.)

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Do you want --
15 where do you want to sit? Do you want to sit in the
16 witness chair?

17 MR. DETMER: If you would raise your right
18 hand, sir. Do you swear or affirm to tell the truth,
19 the whole truth, and nothing but the truth?

20 THE WITNESS: Sure. Yes, sir.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: State your name
22 for the record.

23 THE WITNESS: Adam Plant, A-D-A-M, P-L-A-N-T.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Thank you.

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A D A M P L A N T,

having been first duly sworn/affirmed,
was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. REID:

Q. Mr. Plant, can you tell the Board about
yourself?

A. Yes.

Q. What type of person you are.

A. Adam Plant. I'm a former football player,
professional football player. I went to Kansas City
Chiefs. And later on that year in 2002, I played with
the BC Lions. Upon receiving, acquiring an injury, my
career was cut short. And then the next thing for me to
do was find out how I can make money with my size. And
security was, obviously, the field I felt into.

I worked in Hollywood during 2002, 2003 as a
club security. In 2004, I was hearing that, you know,
security jobs were better here in Las Vegas. So I
decided to -- I would drive up on the weekends. I lived
in Long Beach, California, at the time. And I got a job
at the Hard Rock. Later on that year, Snoop Dogg came
and did a performance there at the Hard Rock. And his
head of security, who I had known, had seen me and asked

1 me, well, what was I doing in Vegas. And I said, "Well,
2 you know, I come up here on the weekends to work." And
3 said, "Man, you drive up here every weekend?" I said,
4 "Yeah." He said, "Man, come see me on Monday. I got a
5 job for you."

6 So starting in August of 2004, I became Snoop
7 Dogg's, one of his security. While working for Snoop
8 Dogg, I worked well enough to become the head of
9 security. So by 2007, I was the head of his security.

10 At the end of 2007, my current, my current
11 partner right now, Alfonso Redic, who was working for
12 Floyd Mayweather, asked me if I would, if he could get
13 me a position here, would I want to move to Las Vegas
14 and work for Floyd. And it seemed like, you know, a
15 good opportunity at that time, so I took it. And I
16 moved to Las Vegas December 28th of 2007 as a bodyguard
17 for Floyd Mayweather.

18 During that time, from 2008 to 2017, I was off
19 and on with Mayweather. And I would -- I had other
20 clients that I had previously that were coming to
21 Las Vegas that I would take to clubs and different
22 things like that. And so in 2016, I was going to a
23 club, Hakkasan, and the head security there had told me,
24 he said, "Hey, bro, we've seen you for years. We know
25 you never cause any problems. You're a good guy." He

1 said, "But, man, to do, to continue to do bodyguard work
2 in our clubs, you got to get a PILB card." I was like,
3 "Well, what is that?" He said, "Well, that's the card
4 that you got to get for, you know, any private security
5 to come into clubs and stuff like that."

6 So a couple days later, I went down to the
7 office and got this card.

8 Q. I'm going to stop you there, because that's
9 where I'll now ask you some more questions.

10 A. Okay.

11 Q. That would have been January 26, 2016?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. And do you remember filling out the forms? In
14 the binder in front of you, you were shown page 15 of
15 the PILB, right near the front, page 15 in the binder.

16 A. Okay. Yep.

17 Q. Do you remember completing this form?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. Is this your handwriting on the first page?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. If you'd turn to page 16, is that your
22 handwriting on that page?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. On 17, is that your handwriting, except for the
25 bottom two lines?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. Have you ever seen that, those two lines
3 written before?

4 A. Never. This is the first time.

5 Q. Do you remember who you spoke to when you
6 completed this application and handed it in?

7 A. I believe, the young lady to my right, right
8 here.

9 Q. Would that be Lori?

10 A. Yes, sir.

11 Q. Is that Lori?

12 A. M-hm (affirmative).

13 Q. Do you remember discussing with her that you
14 wish to start your own security company?

15 A. Yes, because that was after the Berto fight
16 that Floyd had, and after the fight Floyd had issued a
17 letter to all employees and he said, "At this time, you
18 guys need to decide on making up moves, because I'm
19 going to retire after this fight."

20 And so me and my partner at the time decided
21 that he would call -- he would call us The Great Wall.
22 That's where the name came from, because we were the two
23 front guys in his security. Due to our size and how we
24 could, you know, control the crowd, that's what he
25 nicknamed us. So we decided let's take that name and

1 start a clothing company.

2 So we, our first initial thing with The Great
3 Wall was to have T-shirts, hats, socks and different
4 things like that. And we had, we got started from a
5 third partner, Dr. John Handie, who's an orthopedic
6 surgeon in Oklahoma, who started everything for us and
7 created the -- got the LLC for us.

8 And so that was the origination of The Great
9 Wall. It wasn't a security company. The Great Wall was
10 a clothing company. And so that's what I had stated on
11 here, because I decided, I said, "Well, since we have
12 the clothing, we might as well make it a security
13 company."

14 Q. And, and when you filled out this form, and it
15 states here that you "started private my own security,"
16 did Lori speak to you about starting your own security
17 company?

18 A. Not too much. I believe, I told her that, and
19 she did state that this was not a license. But she did
20 not inform me that along with this card, that I also
21 needed to work under a license or have a license of my
22 own. I was not informed of that. I was not told that.
23 Now, I do see that's on the test. I just, I didn't
24 remember that. But verbally, nobody told me that I
25 needed to have a PPO license to perform my security.

1 And like I said before, when I went to
2 Hakkasan, the head of security there is the one who
3 alerted me to this, because I wasn't even -- I hadn't
4 even heard of the PILB board prior to that. And that's
5 just due to my -- my own lack of getting proper
6 knowledge of the PILB board. So that's on me.

7 Q. So when you completed this form --

8 A. M-hm (affirmative).

9 Q. -- and you submitted it, and you obtained your
10 card, what did you believe you could do with that card?

11 A. Continue to go to clubs and work. Because like
12 I said, the guy said, and several other heads of
13 securities at different clubs had told me, when I would
14 come in, "Do you got your the PILB card?" And I said,
15 "Yeah, right here."

16 And like I said, I've been doing this work for
17 a number of years where everybody in Vegas knows me.
18 I've had a great name out here. I have never had any
19 issue in Las Vegas.

20 Prior to January 10th, I never wore a pair of
21 handcuffs in my life. I'm 43 years old, from south
22 central Los Angeles, never had any kind of record. I've
23 been around the world. I'm a married man. My wife's
24 back here of 22 years. I have three kids. All went to
25 Bishop Gorman. My third one is going to Bishop Gorman

1 right now. My daughter is graduating from Nevada Reno
2 next year with a degree in psychology. My son plays for
3 TCU. He's a first draft pick in 2022. And my daughter,
4 my last one right here, Ashley, she's a volleyball
5 player, and she does music, and she will be going to
6 Bishop Gorman.

7 Every penny that I've made in security goes on
8 taking care of my wife and my three kids. I don't do
9 anything for bragging, bolstering, I work for this, I
10 work for that. I have advertised in Instagram because
11 the work I do is --

12 Q. Mr. Plant, as your attorney, you have to
13 remember that we have an ongoing -- this is for the
14 Board's sake.

15 A. Okay.

16 Q. That we have an ongoing criminal case. So I do
17 not want you to say anything about these current
18 citations we have right now.

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. Okay. At the time of completing this
21 registration form, if you would have known that you
22 needed to have got a license, would you have obtained a
23 license?

24 A. I would. As soon as I got this, I would have
25 had asked for the application to get the PPO license.

1 There is no way that I want any of my work to be
2 interrupted and for me not to be able to work. As I
3 have stated, I have never been a criminal. I don't have
4 no kind of criminal record. And, obviously, you know,
5 everyone can see that. So if you think that I would
6 want to mess up me making money to take care of my
7 family, then that's ridiculous.

8 Q. Did you create an LLC for your company?

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. What about in the state of Nevada?

11 A. State of Oklahoma, because, like I said, our
12 partner, who's an orthopedic surgeon in Oklahoma, had
13 the resources to create the LLC. I hadn't known how to
14 do it, but he did. So he did that for us.

15 Q. Any income that's brought in for this LLC, is
16 taxes paid on that?

17 A. Yeah, because we never made money from TGW.
18 Everything, any work I've done has always been paid to
19 Adam Plant. I have a -- I've had the same tax lady for
20 the last 12 years. Me and my wife file jointly every
21 year. That's one agency I will never mess with in my
22 life is the IRS. I pay taxes completely.

23 Q. Okay. We have these five citations here. I'm
24 not going to ask any questions about those five
25 citations. I don't want you to say anything factually

1 about the incidents.

2 A. M-hm (affirmative).

3 Q. We also have the Instagram posts. And I can't
4 talk about those Instagram posts since they are related
5 to the citations. Is there anything else that you
6 wanted to say to the Board?

7 A. As far as when you asked the gentlemen has my
8 name been discussed with any club, club security or
9 casino, head security of a casino, it has been. There
10 are several guys who have come to me and said, "Man,
11 those guys from the PILB board, they were bragging that
12 they arrested you. They were telling me, 'Yeah, we got
13 the guy, Plant.'"

14 And I feel that I'm being targeted for some
15 unknown reason. I went to Drai's Nightclub maybe about
16 three weeks ago, me and my wife. The head of the
17 security there said, "You can't come in." I said,
18 "Chris" -- I know him -- "why can't I come into Drai's?"
19 "Oh, man, you got issues with the PILB board." I said,
20 "What issues do I have, man? I'm coming in as a regular
21 patron, me and my wife. Why can't I enter the club?"
22 He said, "Man, you got to work out the issues with
23 them."

24 I was offered to work a job at XS last week.
25 And I told the gentleman, I said, "Well, I can't work

1 right now because my card is suspended." And if -- for
2 whatever reason, they don't want me there. The head of
3 security there told me if I came to XS, I would be
4 trespassed. And I said, "Trespassed for what?" I
5 haven't did anything. I mean I got arrested here by the
6 PILB board. And since then, I realize, you know, the
7 severity of these violations. I realize that. I
8 realize the mistake. And which I want to correct going
9 forward.

10 I'm not in any way a bad person. I'm just
11 explaining my position as far as I'm a family man, I
12 take care of my family. This is my livelihood. Me
13 working is how I take care of my family. I need to
14 work. Currently, I've had to resort to working at Crazy
15 Horse 3 strip club. I don't want to be in no strip
16 club. But I mean I have to make an income.

17 Now, I'm sure, if you all are parents like me,
18 you want the best for yourself, your spouses and your
19 children, like I do. I'm a hard-working man. This is
20 what I do. Security is my -- my livelihood.

21 So I just want to, if we can, moving on, how I
22 can resolve that is I have a buddy right here, William
23 Whitfield, who was my former bodyguard, who has a PPO
24 license, who said that he's willing for me to work under
25 his license until I can obtain my own. So that's how I

1 want to make this situation correct.

2 Q. There's currently outstanding fines for these
3 citations. If you -- if the Board were to be lenient
4 and be able to reduce these fines to a more reasonable
5 amount -- I believe, right now, it's at \$37,500. If it
6 were a more attainable amount, and you'd be on a strict
7 payment plan, would you -- what would your thoughts be
8 on that?

9 A. Of course. Of course, I will pay that. I did
10 go down and talk to Mr. Ingram before about making a
11 payment plan. But when my card was restricted, I didn't
12 have the money to pay. Now, mind you, I just told you I
13 had, I had -- both of my two older kids graduated from
14 Gorman. But I'm sure you guys know about Bishop Gorman.
15 It's a very expensive school. You know what I mean?
16 And because of the bodyguard work I've done, me and my
17 wife were in agreements that I wanted my wife to always
18 be in the house so our kids could always have a parent
19 in the house, with homework, you know, and do everything
20 the parent does, while I was out working. But because
21 I'm the sole provider, it's really strenuous. And I
22 have to work as many gigs as I can work and have as much
23 clientele as I can to earn money to take care of my
24 family.

25 So, yes, if we can come to an agreement, I'd be

1 more than willing to pay these fines. And I feel that
2 the work that I do, there is no other bodyguard in town
3 like me, because nobody has worked with the level of
4 celebrities that I've worked for, at the same time the
5 different type of clientele that I've worked for.

6 Q. Mr. Plant, you were arrested on December --
7 January 10th of this year.

8 A. M-hm (affirmative).

9 Q. How did that affect you?

10 A. I had nightmares beyond that. I mean that
11 really psychologically messed me up. Because like I
12 stated, I've never worn a pair of handcuffs in my life,
13 never. I've never had any criminal history, any
14 criminal record, nothing. And for that to happen, it
15 was an embarrassment to me. I think, it was an
16 embarrassment to the city. Because, I think, I
17 represent Las Vegas well. I have had numerous amounts
18 of people that said the only reason why they even came
19 to Vegas is because they knew that me and the guys that
20 worked with me could protect them. My thing is having
21 large size guys, because I know --

22 Q. Mr. Plant.

23 A. Hm?

24 Q. I'd like to stop you from that diverging from
25 my direct question.

1 A. Right. Right, right.

2 Q. With regards to the arrest --

3 A. M-hm (affirmative).

4 Q. -- how long were you in custody for?

5 A. I believe, it was either 20 or 22 hours,
6 something like that.

7 Q. Is there anything else you would like to say to
8 the Board that's not related to the citations?

9 A. I just, I don't want any defamation on my name.
10 I don't want my name being dragged in any kind of mud in
11 Las Vegas. I worked too hard to establish myself in
12 this city. And I feel that I -- because I have a fair
13 and logical resolution to this, which I've stated,
14 working under my buddy's license until I could obtain my
15 own, I think, that is a reasonable resolution to this.

16 And I would like to be able to go into any
17 club, any casino without being harassed, without any mud
18 being dragged on my name. Because that's not who I am.
19 I'm a stand-up man who takes care of his family. And I
20 don't deserve any mud to be put on my name, never.
21 Because I haven't did anything, other than what has been
22 stated, to deserve that. I don't deserve anybody to go
23 talk about me.

24 There was the last big client I had in the
25 media, he had some situations that were his personal

1 thing. But I've also heard that all the members of this
2 board have related me to him, a rapper named Six Nine.
3 And I heard that from several people. "Man," they said,
4 "you had something to do with that?" How do I have -- I
5 don't have anything to do with anybody, a bodyguard's
6 personal life. My thing is, when you're with me, I want
7 you to be protected. What you're doing personally,
8 that's what you do.

9 That's like my buddy here, who was my
10 protection bodyguard, it's like saying he had something
11 to do with my personal life. No, he didn't. He's the
12 security. When we provide security, that's what we do,
13 we take care of you while you're on our watch.

14 What you do personally is what you do. We have
15 nothing to do with that. So why would I ever be
16 associated with somebody's activity outside of them with
17 me when I'm working?

18 MR. REID: I pass the witness.

19

20 CROSS-EXAMINATION

21 BY MS. BORDELOVE:

22 Q. Okay. I have a few questions.

23 A. M-hm (affirmative).

24 Q. Back in 2016 --

25 A. M-hm (affirmative).

1 Q. -- you said it was security at Hakkasan that
2 told you you needed to get a PILB card?

3 A. The guy, the head of security, yes.

4 Q. The head of security there?

5 A. I don't know his name. I know he has a -- I
6 think, he was a UFC fighter, has like a cauliflower ear.

7 Q. Okay.

8 A. I remember him telling me that.

9 Q. And did any of -- you mentioned, it sounded
10 like -- did other clubs' security or personnel --

11 A. Head of security for --

12 Q. -- tell you you had to --

13 A. The head of security from XS, the head of
14 security from Encore, from Club Joe, and Club 1-0 all
15 told me that.

16 Q. And did they all tell you that at the same
17 time?

18 A. Different, different times.

19 Q. Okay.

20 A. M-hm (affirmative).

21 Q. When you came into the PILB --

22 A. M-hm (affirmative).

23 Q. -- and discussed with Ms. Irizarry regarding
24 your application for a work card --

25 A. M-hm (affirmative).

1 Q. -- what did you think she meant when she said,
2 "This is not a license"?

3 A. Exactly what she said, "This is not a license."
4 I clearly understood that. But my thing is, if you knew
5 that I had to have a license, why wouldn't you tell me
6 that? Why wouldn't you say, "Okay. Mr. Plant, in
7 addition to you getting your PILB card, you know that,
8 you know, you need to get a license as well, or you need
9 to be working under a license"? And at that time, I
10 would have made provisions to do that.

11 I don't want anything messing up my money. I
12 don't want anything stopping the flow of me taking care
13 of my family. So, obviously, if I went to go get this
14 when I told that that's what I needed, I would have at
15 that time applied for the application, or I would have
16 found somebody whose license I could work for at that
17 time.

18 Q. So what did you think a license did that a work
19 card didn't?

20 A. Because all of the head security told me that
21 this is what I -- this is all that I needed, I had
22 assumed, because that's what they told me, that this is
23 what all I needed.

24 Q. And did you ask what the difference, if that
25 wasn't a license, what the difference was between a

1 license and a work card?

2 A. At that time, I did not. No, I didn't.

3 Q. Okay. Did you attempt to look that information
4 up yourself?

5 A. I didn't, because like, once again, like I
6 said, all of the head securities said all you needed was
7 a PILB card. And I wasn't really alerted to you needed
8 a license until around the end of 2018 they said that
9 other guys that were doing private security had some
10 events that happened. One happened, one event happened
11 at club XS. Another event happened at club Hakkasan.
12 Which they said triggered like a red light for guys
13 doing private security. And so that was the only time
14 that I heard that, you know. I mean a guy from Omnian
15 had told me, also, reached out to me and said, "Hey, Big
16 Adam Plant, I want to tell you this because, you know, I
17 know you." He said, "Man, that PILB card, that's" --

18 (At 4:08 p.m., the videoconference connection
19 with Las Vegas was last. There was a period off the
20 record to reconnect it The Reporter indicated where we
21 were when we lost the connection.)

22 BY MS. BORDELOVE:

23 Q. Okay. I can move on to another question. Or
24 do you think you had more answer to that?

25 A. Oh, no, I put it in everything.

1 Q. Okay. When you were arrested in January, who
2 was it that arrested you?

3 A. So, walking out of Encore tower suite --

4 MR. REID: Hold on.

5 THE WITNESS: Oh, okay.

6 MR. REID: I will advise you not to speak about
7 any facts of the case.

8 THE WITNESS: M-hm (affirmative).

9 MR. REID: Answer the question that's been
10 asked.

11 THE WITNESS: Okay.

12 MR. REID: The question was --

13 THE WITNESS: It was a Metro officer, to the
14 best of my knowledge, a Metro officer.

15 MR. REID: And I apologize to the Board and
16 Mr. Plant. I don't want to sound rude. I just want to
17 just advise him accordingly pursuant to what we have to
18 do. I don't want to --

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: We're okay.

20 MR. REID: Okay.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: No, you're fine.

22 MR. REID: Okay.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You're not even
24 close.

25 MR. REID: Thank you.

1 BY MS. BORDELOVE:

2 Q. You mentioned that you agreed to a payment plan
3 with Director Ingram?

4 A. M-hm (affirmative).

5 Q. But without your card, you were not able to
6 pay?

7 A. I was not able to pay the -- yeah.

8 Q. Did you contact Director Ingram about your
9 inability to pay?

10 A. No, because at that time, I had decided to seek
11 counsel.

12 Q. So you did not at any point request a lower
13 payment plan or an adjustment?

14 A. No, I didn't. No.

15 MS. BORDELOVE: I think, that may be the extent
16 of my questions that you won't instruct him not to
17 answer. But I'll turn it to you if you have any
18 additional questions.

19 THE WITNESS: I just have. Might I add
20 something else?

21 MR. REID: I have two questions, but.

22 THE WITNESS: Okay.

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REDIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. REID:

Q. When you applied for the license, or the card on January 26th, 2016, were you told that you need to get a license to be able to provide services to members of the public?

A. No, not at all.

Q. My next question is, is pertinent to counsel's question regarding the payments. Did you know that you could contact Mr. Ingram and change or amend the current payment plan that you had agreed to?

A. No, because I thought once we agreed to that, that's what it would be.

Q. If you would have known that you could have called Mr. Ingram and changed the payment plan and discussed, renegotiated, would you have done so?

A. Yes.

Q. Did you receive a call from the Board, members of the PILB to discuss why you hadn't paid any of the --

A. No.

Q. -- payments?

MR. REID: I have no more questions.

MS. BORDELOVE: I have one more, though it's about your original questions, not one you just did here.

1 MR. REID: Okay.

2

3 RECROSS-EXAMINATION

4 BY MS. BORDELOVE:

5 Q. But that would be, to the extent that you
6 stated clubs aren't willing to let you in, have any of
7 them stated to you that they are not allowed to let you
8 in?

9 A. Like I'll go back to the Draai's incident. The
10 head of security came out. Me and my wife were outside.
11 As I was approaching to go in, he said, "Adam, come
12 here. I can't let you in." And I said, "Why can't I
13 come in?" He said, "Man, those guys with the PILB
14 board, they're like really hot, man. I mean you made
15 them pissed off. And whatever it is, man, I just can't
16 take the chance, I can't, I can't risk it." I said,
17 "Risk what? What am I doing?"

18 Like I said before, I've never had an issue in
19 any club, in any casino, anywhere in Las Vegas, never,
20 until that arrest. So why was I -- I just wondered why
21 was I being denied entry. And then, on top of that,
22 come to find out, it's up to them, the security
23 themselves. So for whatever reason, he just felt that
24 he was pressed by the PILB board enough to not let me
25 in.

1 Q. Okay.

2 A. And I felt that that was discrimination against
3 me, because I had not done anything. And this is where
4 the confusion comes in. I can be, I can want to go to a
5 club, casino as a regular patron. If they say that I'm
6 working, then all they have to, oh, he's working, that's
7 not right. How are you going to say I'm working, and
8 I'm not? I there with my wife. Working with my wife?
9 Come on now. It's not logical. That's the thing I'm
10 saying. My name has been unfairly dragged through the
11 mud. I've been unfairly targeted.

12 I have a Utah CCW, a Florida CCW, a Nevada CCW.
13 I have a Nevada guard card. I have a passport. I have
14 a visa to Moscow, Russia. I've been doing this, and
15 I've been doing a great job at what I do.

16 I just did not educate myself properly on the
17 process of the PILB board. Which I know now. So going
18 forth or going further, I want to do it proper so I
19 don't have this delayed. And that's all I'm asking.
20 Since I have a remedy to this problem, can that remedy
21 be administered and we move on and get this matter
22 closed? And can the dirt be not thrown around?

23 MS. BORDELOVE: I don't have any further
24 questions.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Any questions?

1 MR. REID: I have no more questions.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Anybody else?

3 MR. REID: No.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Board
5 questions? We'll start with Gronauer.

6 (There was a minute off the record to relocate
7 the microphone in Las Vegas.)

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Mr. Plant.

9 THE WITNESS: Yes, sir.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I think, you're an
11 impressive gentleman. Okay?

12 THE WITNESS: Thank you, sir.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: 43 years old, where you
14 came from, where you're at and all. I really do. And I
15 believe you're a family man. You're articulate,
16 intelligent and actually charming.

17 THE WITNESS: Thank you, sir.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. But my
19 problem comes up with, because you're all that, you
20 received the first citation that said you shouldn't be
21 doing this. If you received the first citation, why
22 didn't you come to the Board or come to the PILB office
23 and talk to them, discuss it, and get your knowledge
24 base straight?

25 THE WITNESS: I did, sir. After the first

1 citation, I did go down to the office. And that's when
2 the two gentlemen did give me the application for the
3 PPO license. To be honest with you, sir, I just, I
4 didn't think that it would come to an arrest. I just
5 didn't put the urgency on it. I'm going to be totally
6 honest with you.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. But, still, you
8 had the information.

9 THE WITNESS: Yes.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Then you got the second
11 citation.

12 THE WITNESS: M-hm (affirmative).

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And you get it. See,
14 to me, it just seems like you didn't take it seriously
15 enough. This is a licensing state.

16 THE WITNESS: Yes, sir.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I have to be licensed.

18 THE WITNESS: M-hm (affirmative).

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: We all have to be
20 license to run everything we run here. I have three
21 different licenses, corporate licenses, all kinds of
22 stuff.

23 THE WITNESS: Yes, sir.

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: So, and the thing is,
25 when you read that NRS, particularly the NRS, because we

1 want you to read them into them citations. And
2 especially the first one, okay, I can see maybe the way
3 you felt.

4 THE WITNESS: Right.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: But the second one
6 pretty much tells you it's sort of like a little wake-up
7 call.

8 THE WITNESS: Yes.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Again. And that's the
10 part I don't understand, why you didn't take care of
11 business at that time. That's the thing to you, you
12 come in here now and saying you have somebody to help
13 you out to do this. I'd be all for it, I really do.
14 But it doesn't excuse where we were from the beginning.

15 THE WITNESS: Right.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: At the beginning, I
17 take exception to you think that we're targeting you.
18 Okay?

19 THE WITNESS: M-hm (affirmative).

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I really have a bad
21 feeling about that word. Because there's people -- if
22 you've been here all day --

23 THE WITNESS: M-hm (affirmative).

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: -- there's people got
25 some big problems.

1 THE WITNESS: Yes. Yes.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And nobody's targeted.

3 THE WITNESS: M-hm (affirmative).

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It's just that we're
5 expecting you to go by the law. And NRS 648 says what
6 you're supposed to do. And that's the biggest thing.
7 Like I say, when I tell you, that's the way I feel about
8 you, you are intelligent.

9 THE WITNESS: Yes.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You are a sharp man.

11 THE WITNESS: Thank you.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good family man. I
13 understand that. But because of that intelligence, it
14 creates me more of an angst because of the second
15 citation. And then to go on to a third and fourth and
16 to finally get arrested, you get a wake-up call.

17 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record, Board
18 counsel.

19 Just briefly, just --

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm done.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: That wasn't a
22 question.

23 MR. DETMER: And that's where I was coming
24 from.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Well, let me

1 understand. Why didn't you take care of that second
2 citation?

3 THE WITNESS: Because I -- just to be honest
4 with you, sir, I just, I didn't think it was that
5 serious at that time.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Asked and
8 answered.

9 THE WITNESS: But --

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Asked and
11 answered.

12 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I do, I have a few
13 questions. You made a statement that you were at a
14 club, and someone told you that the PILB board was going
15 to start having people do a PPO. At that time, you
16 listened to them the first time when they told you you
17 needed to get a guard card.

18 THE WITNESS: M-hm (affirmative).

19 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Why didn't you listen to
20 then, when they said that you really need a PPO?

21 THE WITNESS: The main reason, ma'am, is
22 because, like I said it before, when I came here and
23 worked Mayweather in 2008, obviously, everybody knew I
24 worked for him. They knew that I also had side clients.
25 My thing was, if this was such an issue, why wasn't I

1 warned way back then? That, that was my -- that was my
2 thinking, to be honest with you.

3 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. You also mentioned
4 that you have a CCW.

5 THE WITNESS: I have three, yes.

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. Do you use in the
7 state of Nevada a concealed weapon while you're doing
8 your private bodyguard services?

9 THE WITNESS: I've never brought a weapon onto
10 any property, no. I've never had to. I just, but I
11 wanted to, I wanted to have the license in case I ever
12 had a situation where it was called for.

13 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay.

14 THE WITNESS: But I've never had to use it.
15 I've never brought a weapon on anybody's property at
16 all.

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Did you have an armed
18 guard card?

19 THE WITNESS: I have a guard card, not an armed
20 guard card.

21 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. So you --

22 THE WITNESS: And so I -- to answer that
23 question, no, I haven't worked with a gun while I was
24 working, no.

25 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. I go back to the

1 same question that -- and, I guess, it's asked and
2 answered, that you didn't think that you needed to
3 follow up after the first letter. Because, you know,
4 \$5,000 isn't a little amount of money.

5 THE WITNESS: M-hm (affirmative).

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: That would have had all of
7 my red flags up and would have gone in and taken care of
8 it.

9 THE WITNESS: It did. But, like I said, ma'am,
10 I usually work every day.

11 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay.

12 THE WITNESS: And when you have -- I don't know
13 if you all have kids, spouses.

14 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Yep.

15 THE WITNESS: In my line of work, because I
16 have to go make sure that, you know, we're getting money
17 somehow every day, I just got caught up in the motion of
18 not putting the severity on it that I should have. And
19 that's my mistake.

20 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Thank you. I'm done.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Plant.

22 THE WITNESS: Yes, sir.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I agree with
24 everything my colleague Mr. Gronauer said. You're a
25 good guy, you seem like a good guy. But you're thick

1 sometimes.

2 THE WITNESS: M-hm (affirmative).

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I think, maybe
4 your wife would agree with me. We would not be here if
5 you would have taken the first citation seriously.

6 THE WITNESS: Sir.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: We would not be
8 here if you took the second citation seriously. We
9 would not be here if you took the third citation
10 seriously. We would be here if you took the fourth
11 citation seriously. And the fifth, when you got
12 arrested, that one is on you, nobody else. Out of
13 2.3 million people that live here, that one was on you.

14 So what I'm throwing out to counsel right now,
15 we're done in 38 minutes. We don't have a choice.

16 And you want to continue to support your
17 family.

18 THE WITNESS: Yes, sir.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: And I understand
20 that. I'm a parent of three Gorman graduates, and I was
21 president of the board of regents of Gorman. So I know
22 the dedication that you have and your wife has to
23 provide that type of education.

24 So what I will throw out to the group here, do
25 you guys want to confer? Because we're done at 5:00.

1 He's in limbo. I don't know when we'll meet again. It
2 might be three months, might be four months. I'm saying
3 this because we're trying to be fair. That's probably
4 the best word I can come up with.

5 So I throw it to counsel.

6 MR. REID: We'd like to confer and try and
7 discuss it, confer on a settlement.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. I'll give
9 you 20 minutes, and then I want a status.

10 MR. DETMER: If I may ask, does the defense
11 counsel have any additional witnesses beyond Mr. Plant?

12 MR. REID: It was just going to be Mr. -- I
13 forget his name. I apologize.

14 MR. INGRAM: Whitfield?

15 MR. REID: If he had a position available,
16 whether or not --

17 (The Reporter indicated that it's difficult to
18 hear Las Vegas. There was a minute off the record.)

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Just
20 to sum up, so you know, I've asked counsel if they want
21 to get together so they can try to resolve this in the
22 next 37 minutes.

23 So we're going to take a 20-minute break.
24 We're going to come back. That'll give us 17 minutes.
25 We'll see what happens. Now, if they get done before

1 that, we might come back before 20 minutes.

2 THE REPORTER: We'll be here.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You got that up
4 there?

5 THE REPORTER: Yep. Yes.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Good,
7 good with that? All right.

8 I appreciate, seriously, Mr. Plant --

9 THE WITNESS: Yes, sir.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: -- for your
11 honesty and your forthrightness before the Board. I
12 don't appreciate the decisions you made before we got
13 here.

14 THE WITNESS: Yes, sir.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

16 MR. REID: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

17 MR. DETMER: Are we in recess?

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: We are in recess.
19 I'm shutting this off.

20 * * * * *

21 (A break was taken, 4:23 to 4:36 p.m.)

22 * * * * *

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Rosalie, are you
24 ready to proceed?

25 MS. BORDELOVE: I am.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Reid, are you
2 ready to proceed?

3 MR. REID: Yes. Before, I believe, we did not
4 excuse Mr. Plant.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Before he
6 walks all the way over, we don't have any other
7 questions.

8 MS. BORDELOVE: I've got a few.

9 MR. REID: Do we need to put him in --

10 MR. DETMER: Let's get back on the record and
11 make sure it's stated for the record.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

13 MR. DETMER: If we had any additional questions
14 or he could be released.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. So we're
16 starting up. Can you hear me?

17 THE REPORTER: Yes.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: We're starting
19 the hearing. Can you hear me?

20 MS. KLEMME: Yes.

21 THE REPORTER: If you keep talking loud, we can
22 hear you.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Okay.
24 We're starting here. And I've been informed by all the
25 parties involved that they were not able to resolve

1 this. So the hearing will continue.

2 Mr. Plant was up here. There is no other
3 questions from the Board for Mr. Plant. I don't believe
4 counsel's got any other questions.

5 MS. BORDELOVE: Correct.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: So Mr. Plant is
7 excused.

8 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record.

9 I just wanted to ask Mr. Reid whether or not he
10 has additional witnesses he'd like to call for his case
11 in chief.

12 MR. REID: I was going to call Mr. Whitfield,
13 who is here. I can waive that, because I'm happy that
14 he does have a potential position.

15 MS. BORDELOVE: I'm willing to stipulate to
16 that fact.

17 MR. REID: Okay.

18 MS. BORDELOVE: That he has an employment
19 offer.

20 MR. REID: And if the question would be, do you
21 have a job opportunity for Mr. Plant, my client would
22 say yes. But we could stipulate to it.

23 MS. BORDELOVE: I'm willing to stipulate to
24 that fact.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: And, I think, the

1 Board would be fine. We're very aware that people work
2 under other people's licenses on a regular basis.

3 MR. REID: Okay.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: He's got a good
5 friend to offer that.

6 MS. BORDELOVE: I would like to call one. If
7 that's all you have, I have one rebuttal witness, which
8 would be Director Ingram.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Oh, I love it
10 when Director Ingram's up here.

11 MR. INGRAM: Do you want me to come down there?

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Oh, I want you
13 down there.

14 MR. INGRAM: Okay.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. We put
16 everybody else down there.

17 MS. BORDELOVE: Yes.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: If it's good
19 enough for your staff, it's good enough for you.

20 MR. DETMER: Sir, you're raising your right
21 hand. Do you swear, do you swear and affirm to tell the
22 truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth?

23 MR. INGRAM: I do.

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K E V I N I N G R A M,

having been first duly sworn/affirmed,
was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION ON REBUTTAL

BY MS. BORDELOVE:

Q. Have you had any conversations with casino and
nightclub security regarding Mr. Plant?

A. Yes.

Q. Can you describe the nature of those
conversations?

A. Absolutely. I'm part of the coalition, it's
called the Night Watch. Gaming Control and Las Vegas
Metro reached out to me and said they were having a lot
of problems in the nightclubs with unlicensed activity,
with sex trafficking, drugs, and wanted to know if I'd
be interested in joining that coalition. So I,
obviously, agreed to that.

We meet a couple times, actually probably once
a quarter with the Night Watch. I'm also part of the
Security Peace Association. And so we meet on a monthly
basis. And then I'm also part of the Zone Committee,
which is all the security, heads of security at all the
casinos.

So with those relationships, the casinos have

1 reached out to us and asked for our assistance in
2 addressing unlicensed activity in the casinos. So we do
3 this with every casino. They specifically asked if
4 certain individuals were licensed. Mr. Plant was one of
5 the individuals as well. And then what they do is, on a
6 regular basis, I receive emails from the different
7 security directors, and they say these are the
8 individuals that were in our nightclubs, they said they
9 were working security. Some of the nightclubs actually
10 have them sign in on a sign-in sheet and the reason for
11 being there. And on occasions, Mr. Plant has signed in
12 that he's providing security services. So he actually
13 signs in doing that.

14 They then email myself and Investigator
15 Saladino to see if they were working for a licensed
16 company. And then we relate back to them either, yes,
17 they are working for a licensed company or, no, they
18 were not. And then the casinos make decisions on who
19 they're going to let into their nightclubs and casinos.

20 So we don't give them any direction. We have
21 no authority over them. We just answer the questions
22 that they ask.

23 Q. Have you ever instructed any casino or
24 nightclub security to deny admittance to any person?

25 A. Absolutely not.

1 MS. BORDELOVE: I think, that maybe answered my
2 questions.

3

4 CROSS-EXAMINATION ON REBUTTAL

5 BY MR. REID:

6 Q. With regards to you saying that there was a
7 list that people would come in and sign to say that
8 they're providing services, do you ever see any of those
9 lists?

10 A. I have.

11 Q. And have you ever seen Mr. Adam Plant's name on
12 those?

13 A. I don't recall seeing his specific name, no.

14 Q. Have you asked to look for any of those lists
15 with Mr. Adam Plant's name?

16 A. I have not.

17 Q. Why did you not ask for a list?

18 A. I answer the questions when they provide them
19 to me. And I provide them the answers. And that's the
20 extent of the relationship I have with them.

21 Q. Do you have any knowledge as to why some of
22 these casino security and casino -- security personnel
23 and nightclub security would deny Mr. Plant access to
24 their premises?

25 A. I wouldn't be privileged to that. They make

1 their decisions on their own.

2 Q. So you would have no idea as to why they would
3 have a negative influence regarding Mr. Plant?

4 A. Well, they have verified that he's not
5 licensed. So, I guess, in that respect, they don't want
6 unlicensed activity in their casinos or nightclubs. So
7 they're making a decision based on information we
8 provide them.

9 Q. Are you aware of any of -- yourself or any one
10 of your team explaining to any of the head of security
11 that he had been, Mr. Plant had been arrested?

12 A. It wasn't needed. They contacted us and said,
13 "I understand he was arrested." The word spread on its
14 own. We would not share that information with
15 individuals.

16 Q. How did they contact you?

17 A. They can contact via email. I get phone calls.
18 I attend all those meetings that we're talking with the
19 security directors just face-to-face.

20 Q. But how did they -- they contacted you, and how
21 did they contact you to let you know that, to let you
22 know that he had been arrested?

23 A. There were about 12 individuals that we had
24 been tracking unlicensed activity on as well.
25 Mr. Plant's one of about 20 or so people that we've been

1 tracking. After his arrest, 12 individuals came into
2 our office that same week and said, "We want to get
3 licensed, and we want to pay our citations." So they
4 told us that the word was out that we were arresting
5 people.

6 Q. So, but just to confirm, so the Board's aware.

7 A. M-hm (affirmative).

8 Q. So after Mr. Plant's arrest, 12 people came in
9 to obtain a license and to pay for their citations?

10 A. Either to apply or pay for their citations,
11 yes. And we had meetings with them as well, sit-down
12 meetings, as we did with Mr. Plant, explaining their
13 licensing.

14 Q. Would you say that that was a good example for
15 the public for Mr. Plant to be arrested?

16 A. No.

17 Q. Sorry. Not the public. Not for the public.
18 For people applying for licenses, was that a good
19 example for Mr. Plant to be arrested so they could apply
20 for their licenses and pay for their citations?

21 A. I wouldn't say that. I mean, I think, they saw
22 that the PILB was serious about when we write our
23 citations, that they need to be paid, and they need to
24 follow up with us.

25 Q. Would you say he was made an example of?

1 A. Absolutely not.

2 Q. How many other people have you arrested?

3 A. He's the only one. He's the only one that has
4 been issued more than two unlicensed activity citations.

5 Q. Did you ever -- you said 12. So people that
6 have the unlicensed activity citations, are they, are
7 your personnel actively looking at their activities?

8 A. Absolutely, daily.

9 Q. So you wouldn't say that he was made an example
10 of, then?

11 A. Absolutely not.

12 MR. REID: Okay. I have no further questions.

13 MS. BORDELOVE: The Board.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yeah. Do we have
15 any questions?

16 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I do. So after -- so just
17 to be clear, Mr. Plant was the only one arrested that
18 evening for this type of activity?

19 THE WITNESS: Yes.

20 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Okay. And then, after
21 Mr. Plant came in after, I think, the first or second
22 citation, and you gave him the license information so
23 that he could obtain his PPO, did he ever follow up with
24 you guys, ask any questions, do any type of follow-up on
25 obtaining his license?

1 THE WITNESS: No.

2 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: I'm good. Thank you.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm good.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Mr. Ingram,
5 Mr. Reid asked you the question, did the PILB make an
6 example of Mr. Plant, and your response was?

7 THE WITNESS: No.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. And do you
9 have an ability to do a press release for the PILB?

10 THE WITNESS: I do.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Was a press
12 release done, then, based on his arrest?

13 THE WITNESS: Absolutely not.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Do you have the
15 ability to speak with the press about matters involving
16 the PILB?

17 THE WITNESS: Absolutely not. We need a public
18 information officer.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Have you spoken
20 to the press about the arrest of Mr. Plant?

21 THE WITNESS: Absolutely not.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. You
23 mentioned before this was the only time you've arrested
24 someone for unlicensed bodyguard executive protection
25 work?

1 THE WITNESS: Correct.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. And in the
3 prior, have we, has the PILB issued citations for
4 executive protection body work?

5 THE WITNESS: Yes.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Have we ever had
7 to issue a citation more once to an individual?

8 THE WITNESS: Yes.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: More than twice?

10 THE WITNESS: Not to my knowledge.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Did you have a
12 conversation with Metro regarding the arrest or the
13 potential for an arrest?

14 THE WITNESS: Yes.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: And why did you
16 do that?

17 THE WITNESS: As part of the Night Watch
18 program, they were aware that we were tracking
19 individuals that were providing unlicensed activity. We
20 have a criminal statute that the first offense of any
21 violation of our chapter is considered, can be
22 considered a misdemeanor, and any subsequent violation
23 is a gross misdemeanor. So in speaking to them, they
24 said, "Well, you know, how do we get this to stop?"

25 And so the task force at that time was run

1 by -- I've forgotten his name now. I apologize.
2 Anyway, the lieutenant and the captain that were in
3 charge of the task force asked if we wanted assistance
4 and if we wanted to actually have him arrested for his
5 continued violations, and we said yes.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. I have
7 no -- oh, I do. And can somebody tell me what the total
8 fine is right now on paper?

9 THE WITNESS: 37,500.

10 MS. BORDELOVE: Minus. He made a payment to
11 the Controller's Office.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You're going to
13 need to --

14 THE WITNESS: Oh, that's right. I'm sorry. He
15 made a \$57 and some change payment to the Controller's
16 Office. The first two citations have been sent to the
17 Controller. So that's \$7,500 minus the 57 and change
18 that he made.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: But it's what?

20 THE WITNESS: And then three outstanding.
21 Those are collections.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

23 THE WITNESS: The outstanding citations of
24 \$37,000 is owed to them at this point.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

1 THE WITNESS: Just for the record, any
2 citations that are collected by the Board are referred
3 back by statute to the State General Fund. The Board
4 does not keep any of that money.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: That is correct.

6 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Quick question. So after
7 the initial citation, and had he come in and gotten the
8 license, would that have stopped all other activities,
9 as far as the Board is concerned, in fines, or, you
10 know, would have resolved the issue and not gone to the
11 point of arrest?

12 THE WITNESS: Absolutely. In fact, when I had
13 a conversation with Mr. Plant, I told him, "You got a
14 great product. You got a great name. You've got people
15 that you can hire. You can corner the market. Get
16 licensed." And he didn't follow through.

17 BOARD MEMBER NIXON: Thank you.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: One last
19 question. To your knowledge, has Mr. Plant started any
20 of the licensing process?

21 THE WITNESS: No.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Thank you.

23 I don't know if there's any other. No other
24 questions from the Board.

25 MR. REID: I have no other questions based upon

1 the questions of the Board. Oh. I have no other
2 questions as a result of the questions of the Board.

3 MS. BORDELOVE: I don't, either.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Thank
5 you, Mr. Ingram. That made my day having you up there.

6 MR. DETMER: Mr. Chairman, if I may?

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yes, you may.

8 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record.

9 Just as a procedural matter, we go to closing
10 arguments absent -- I'm sorry. Does counsel have any
11 rebuttal witnesses, or re-rebuttal witnesses?

12 MR. REID: No.

13 MS. BORDELOVE: No.

14 MR. DETMER: So with that, they go to the
15 closing by both. It would be closing Ms. Bordelove,
16 closing by Mr. Reid, and then Ms. Bordelove has the
17 opportunity to do a final closing. But then I know that
18 is now 4:50.

19 The question is, what would be a good stop time
20 to bifurcate? Do you want your closing argument? Does
21 counsel think they can finish closing argument in 10
22 minutes?

23 MS. BORDELOVE: I can be very quick with
24 closing argument. I will also note to you they won't
25 actually kick you right out at 5:00.

1 MR. DETMER: Oh.

2 MR. INGRAM: Oh, they don't. Okay.

3 MS. BORDELOVE: I've continued with witnesses
4 before. I don't want to do that here today. I will
5 make my statement extremely --

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Well, it all
7 depends on whether we keep the feed.

8 MS. BORDELOVE: It's true. We need the feed
9 for our court reporter.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Because I have
11 been here before when she shuts off her file, so.

12 MS. BORDELOVE: And I will remind that we
13 need -- I don't know that we'll have any, but maybe a
14 public comment period before we can end the meeting,
15 whatever we do.

16 MR. DETMER: So, then, does the Board want
17 to --

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Well --

19 MR. DETMER: -- risk it, or?

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Well, what the
21 Board is going to do right now is, does anybody -- this
22 is the public comment section, because we got to get it
23 done no matter what.

24 MR. DETMER: Right.

25 MS. BORDELOVE: We just have to say it before

1 adjournment. It could be now, you know.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.
3 Shannon, we're going -- I'm asking for public comment.
4 Anyone have anything they want to bring before the
5 Board?

6 MS. BORDELOVE: It can't be regarding --

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: It can't be
8 regarding this case. It can be the other 137 things we
9 did this morning or something in the future.

10 All right. We don't have anybody here for
11 public comment. Public comment's now closed.

12 MR. DETMER: Awesome.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

14 MR. INGRAM: Mary, do you know what the
15 telephone number is in that room, in case we lose feed?

16 MS. KLEMME: Let's see.

17 MR. INGRAM: Because we could finish up on
18 conference call.

19 MS. KLEMME: I think, it's the -- there's a
20 number taped to that phone, I think.

21 MR. INGRAM: So, Mary, Mary, why don't go out
22 and talk to somebody and find that out. Then, we can
23 proceed while you're gone.

24 MS. KLEMME: Okay.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: So I just want to

1 make sure. Mr. Reid, are you okay with us trying to
2 proceed? We have no idea where this is going to end or
3 if we can get it to end.

4 MR. REID: I would like to attempt.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. I just
6 want to make sure you're okay with that.

7 MR. REID: Thank you.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Obviously, you're
9 okay with it, Rosalie, right?

10 MS. BORDELOVE: Yes.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Let's
12 go on.

13 MS. BORDELOVE: Okay. Then, I will try and be
14 as brief as possible.

15 I just want to, I guess, revamp maybe a little
16 bit of my opening, reframe the issues a bit. I know
17 counsel's made arguments regarding the amount of
18 specificity or in the citations themselves. And I just
19 want to remind you here of the statute that we're going
20 under, a few statutes.

21 The first would be NRS 648.156, which, again,
22 is only -- it allows you to revoke a registration if you
23 find that after the date of receiving that registration
24 the registered employee committed acts prohibited by the
25 chapter, or attempted to. And it does not require,

1 since we were not in citation appeals here, it doesn't,
2 so the citations themselves do not actually have to be a
3 part of your basis here. That's why I went through all
4 the social media posts.

5 I also want to point to NRS 648.060, because it
6 specifically prohibits not just the engaging in the
7 business of private patrol officer, but it includes
8 advertising a business of private patrol officer, or any
9 of the other licenses under this chapter, irrespective
10 of the name or title actually used.

11 So I want to remind you of all the Instagram
12 posts and the webpage that we looked at earlier today
13 where the respondent was holding himself out to the
14 public as a bodyguard, providing executive protective
15 services -- which under our chapter are private patrol
16 services requiring a license -- advertising those
17 services, as well as, you know, we have evidence that at
18 least in January our investigators actually witnessed
19 him performing those services.

20 So I would state that regardless of the
21 citations themselves, that has been proven here to show
22 that he violated provisions of the chapter. And the
23 Board has the ability to revoke the registration based
24 on that.

25 And the reason that on behalf of staff I am

1 coming forward and asking for that revocation is because
2 it's gone on this long. Had he applied for licensure,
3 you know, even as some of you said, had he applied for
4 licensure after that first citation when he was given an
5 application, we wouldn't be here today. It wouldn't
6 have been brought before you.

7 This was brought before you because, because
8 there were five instances where the Board notified him
9 that what he was doing was not something that he could
10 do with just a work card, and that he needed a full
11 license in order to be working for an individual. I
12 would actually say that on six instances, because one of
13 those happened at the time he applied for the work card.

14 And because of that, I would ask today that you
15 revoke his registration. He has the ability, after that
16 revocation, he could apply again at a later date. Or he
17 could apply for licensure at a later date. But I would
18 ask that the Board take that seriously into
19 consideration, that there needs to be some constant
20 enforcement of our licensing here.

21 And I'm done with my closing.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Was that a period
23 at the end?

24 MS. BORDELOVE: It might not have sounded like
25 it, but it was.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

2 MR. REID: As I stated in the opening
3 statement, I have two issues here. It's the legal side,
4 which I'm going to, going to argue. And then it's the
5 lazy side that I'm going to argue afterwards.

6 The first I'll state is the citations. Counsel
7 has stated that the NRS 648.150 states that the Board
8 may discipline any licensee for any of the following
9 causes. One is to be in violation of the provisions of
10 this chapter or of a regulation adopted.

11 MS. KLEMME: Excuse me. Can I interrupt?

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yeah, we don't
13 have a choice.

14 MS. KLEMME: Okay. Can you hear us? All
15 right. This is Jan Riherd.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yes.

17 MS. JAN RIHERD: Yes. I'm the office
18 manager --

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Hi, Jan.

20 MS. JAN RIHERD: Hi. I'm the office manager of
21 the A.G.'s Office. And we don't have security here
22 after 5:00. So they're going to have to vacate the
23 building.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.

25 MS. JAN RIHERD: Sorry about that.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: They don't look
2 like they're going to steal anything to me.

3 MS. JAN RIHERD: I understand. But if they're
4 not a member of our office and they haven't through our
5 background check, that they can't be in here without
6 other employees.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay. Thank you.

8 MS. BORDELOVE: Do you want to --

9 MR. REID: Just, just very quickly, just try
10 and resolve some issues, so they don't --

11 (The Reported indicated that it's difficult to
12 hear Las Vegas.)

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right. Guys,
14 you're going to have to speak up.

15 MR. REID: I apologize. This is Stephen Reid.

16 We are requesting for the Board to consider
17 both respondent and petitioner to file a written closing
18 statement. The Board does have 45 days to make a
19 consideration regarding this decision. So if we have a
20 written statement, then that gives them some time. If
21 we can have maybe one week just to provide that written
22 statement, give it to the Board, and for them for their
23 consideration.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: I just have a
25 question. Do we have 45 days from the submittal or 45

1 days from today?

2 MS. BORDELOVE: Well, so there's actually a
3 couple things I'll mention. You still have to
4 deliberate in an open meeting.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Yeah.

6 MS. BORDELOVE: So I would be happy to do
7 closing briefs. I would ask that we both get the
8 opportunity. I don't know how we want to orchestrate
9 it, but, basically, do a written brief, and then I'll do
10 a rebuttal, or something of the sort.

11 You would still need to deliberate in an open
12 meeting. That could be done. I mean we've done short
13 telephonic meetings before. We could do a special
14 meeting that was done that way. As long as Director
15 Ingram is willing to facilitate, you Board members could
16 call in -- there would have to be a typical location
17 somewhere in the state -- for your deliberation. And
18 you would need to come to a decision at that point. The
19 order can then be issued after it.

20 I don't know if you have any thoughts.

21 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record.

22 It's just a thought. Would the Board be --
23 would the Board desire to reconvene at a time when the
24 transcripts have been printed and they're able to review
25 it for those purposes?

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You know, we --
2 all right. Let me. Because we're going to have to wrap
3 this up. Okay. So tell me if I can do this. I want to
4 end the hearing. And we can talk in terms of logistics
5 when we're going to meet next. Or does that have to be
6 part of the record?

7 MS. BORDELOVE: If we're doing closing briefs
8 or something like that, that --

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: No, I want to end
10 it, so no -- so Mr. Reid's not rushed and we're not
11 rushed.

12 MS. BORDELOVE: Okay.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: But I want to be
14 able to continue a conversation about logistics of the
15 next meeting. Does that have to be on the record?

16 MS. BORDELOVE: No, the logistics of scheduling
17 dates does not.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Okay.

19 MR. REID: So that's fine.

20 MR. INGRAM: I'll see if I can get some dates
21 and get back to you right away.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: Ladies?

23 MS. KLEMME: Yes.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: We're going to
25 close the hearing.

1 MS. KLEMME: Okay.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: You guys can go
3 home. Thank you so much. We'll be in touch.

4 MS. KLEMME: Thank you.

5 THE REPORTER: All right. Bye-bye. Thank you
6 all.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN FLYNN: All right.
8 Bye-bye.
