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1 WEDNESDAY, MARCH 13, 2024

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3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good morning,
4 everyone. It's 9:00 a.m. We'll go ahead and get
5 started.

6 Executive Director Saladino, can we start
7 with roll call, please.

8 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Yes. Good
9 morning. Director Saladino, for the record.

10 We'll start with Chair Nixon.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Here.

12 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Board member
13 Bezick.

14 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Here.

15 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Board Member
16 Cortez.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Here.

18 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Board member
19 Gronauer?

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Here.

21 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Madam Chair,
22 we do have a quorum.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

24 Next item on the agenda is public comment.

25 Members of the general public may make

1 comment on matters appearing on the agenda, and may
2 bring up matters not appearing on the agenda to the
3 attention of the Board. The Board may discuss the
4 matters not appearing on the agenda, but may not act
5 on them at this time. If the Board desires, the
6 matters may be placed on a future agenda for action.

7 Public comments will be limited to five
8 minutes per person at the discretion of the
9 Chairperson, but will not be restricted according to
10 viewpoint.

11 Are there any -- is there any public
12 comment down south? Seeing there's no public
13 comment down south, is there any public comment up
14 north?

15 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: No public comment up
16 north.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Mr. Bezick,
18 your camera is, like, really blurry. I'm not sure
19 if it's you or us, but you're going to have to tell
20 us if there's anybody in the audience or coming up
21 to the podium.

22 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Okay, will do.
23 Right now there's nobody in the audience.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, so much.
25 Hearing there's no public comment, we'll

1 move to the next agenda item, agenda item No. 3,
2 Board/executive director announcements and updates.

3 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Director
4 Saladino, for the record.

5 The financials have been provided to the
6 Board via e-mail. Is there any questions on that?
7 No questions there.

8 And for our updates, for our stats, I'm
9 going to turn it over to Investigator Swarthout to
10 go over our stats for the last quarter.

11 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Investigator
12 Swarthout. So this March 1, we do our end of year
13 recap in comparison to the previous year.

14 So for licensing from -- the difference
15 between 2022 and 2023. 2022, we did 200 licenses
16 applied, 161 were approved, 39 were either withdrawn
17 or denied.

18 In 2023, it was a drop. It was 158 that
19 applied, 101 that were approved, and 57 that were
20 either withdrawn or denied.

21 So we do see a 21 percent decrease in
22 applications this past year than we did the year
23 before that. Approval, because we had less applying
24 also decreased because of that. We did have a
25 higher than the previous year withdrawn and denied.

1 For December 2023, we had a total of 46
2 applications, 24 approved, 22 withdrawn or denied.

3 For work cards, for 2022, we had a total
4 of 12,295 that were received. 10,593 that were made
5 active, 1,088 that were withdrawn, and 614 that were
6 denied.

7 For 2023, we had 15,115 in total that
8 applied, 13,036 that are active, 324 that are still
9 provisional, 1,032 that were withdrawn, and 723 that
10 were denied.

11 And then our comparison for just fourth
12 quarter of 2023 versus 2022. 2022, we processed
13 280- -- 2,843 applications were received in 2022
14 during that same time period.

15 In 2023 5,390 were received in that time
16 period. Of that, 4,378 are active, 316 are
17 provisional, 401 were withdrawn, and 289 were
18 denied.

19 Right now, for that provisional, what's
20 taking the longest is DPS did a change on how
21 fingerprints were submitted to them, and how they're
22 received back to us. So that kind of has had some
23 growing pains. So everyone is working on issues
24 trying to get it squared away.

25 Complaints and investigations. In 2022 we

1 received 78. 78 were closed and 19 violations were
2 issued out of those 78.

3 In 2023 we had 79. 75 of them are closed,
4 4 are still open, and 13 resulted in violations for
5 companies.

6 The complaints in 2023 fourth quarter that
7 we received, 18. 15 of them are closed, 3 are still
8 open.

9 Unlicensed activity comparison between the
10 two years. In 2022, we issued 27 unlicensed
11 activity. In 2023 we issued 30. Then we have the
12 breakdown on what all those were for.

13 And then quarter four, just the two
14 different quarters, 2022 we did issue seven
15 unlicensed activity in quarter four. This year we
16 only issued four in that time.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I guess a quick
18 question about (indiscernible).

19 THE REPORTER: Excuse me, Madam Chair, can
20 you speak up? I couldn't hear you very well.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: No problem.

22 Wondering if you thought the work card
23 applications increase was due to all the events that
24 we had towards the end of the year.

25 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yes.

1 So, we had Formula 1 in November, so we
2 did see a spike then. And then all of December, and
3 even into the first part of January and February, we
4 did have a massive spike in applications for the
5 Super Bowl.

6 So I expect the -- when we report this
7 quarter's at the next one, it will probably still
8 have that higher increase than we normally do for
9 work card applications.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: And the new process
11 for fingerprinting, have we had conversations with
12 the DPS? Is that starting to get streamlined or how
13 much longer do they think that slowdown will be?

14 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Director
15 Saladino, for the record.

16 We've been in communication with DPS. I
17 guess it's regarding their third party that they are
18 moving away from. So we do have our list that we're
19 checking against theirs to make sure we get the
20 fingerprints. And I believe there was some that
21 have to come back in and get reprinted. There were
22 some issues with the fingerprinting companies that
23 they did, no fault of ours or fault of anybody's,
24 just DPS with the growing pains. But we figure it
25 should be all fixed in about two weeks.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Are they moving
2 to another third-party vendor or are they just going
3 to do it in-house?

4 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: I think
5 they're moving away, totally away, from the
6 third-party.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any other questions on
8 the report from the Board?

9 Hearing no questions, we'll move to review
10 and approve the transcripts for December's meeting,
11 December 13th and 14th. It's open for possible
12 action.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
14 Cortez. I'm going to motion to approve the
15 December 13 and 14, 2023 minutes as written.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
17 motion. Do we have a second?

18 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, second.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion and a
20 second. All in favor say aye.

21 (All present Board members voted aye.)

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

23 Agenda Item No. 5. Counsel Harris, could
24 you please swear in any witnesses that are going to
25 testify today?

1 DAG HARRIS: Good morning. For anyone in
2 the audience, including in the north, who is on the
3 agenda or plans to testify for the agenda, please
4 stand and raise your right hand.

5
6 AUDIENCE MEMBERS,
7 having been duly sworn,
8 testified as follows:

9
10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, the next agenda
11 items are consent items for a potential block vote.

12 I do want to bring up one thing I noticed
13 on All Purpose, No. 6. Their birthdate would make
14 them, like, five-year-olds. So I think they typed
15 in 20 and then they couldn't fit in the rest. So if
16 we could just make sure when we have an opportunity
17 to go through their application we update that.

18 And then I did notice that there was one
19 that was contingent on the block vote, that was
20 No. 19.

21 Mr. Saladino, why is that -- Executive
22 Director Saladino, why is that contingent?

23 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO:

24 Mr. Campbell, we haven't received his fingerprints
25 yet. He did submit late, but we were hoping to just

1 get them in as a contingent upon negative
2 fingerprints.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have
4 consent items for a potential block vote, Item 6
5 through 18.

6 Does anybody have any issues or questions
7 for those consent items? Are we good to move
8 forward then?

9 So, I'll entertain a motion.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
11 Cortez motioning to approve block vote consent Items
12 6 through 18.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
14 we have a second?

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer, second.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
17 have a second. All in favor say aye.

18 (All present Board members voted aye.)

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

20 So, we have Agenda Item No. 19. Again, it
21 was up for potential block vote. The only reason it
22 did not go through is because -- or wasn't part of
23 the block vote is because it doesn't have
24 fingerprints. I will entertain a motion for this
25 agenda item.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
2 Cortez motioning to approve Item No. 19 for
3 Christopher D. Campbell applying for an individual
4 private investigator license, subject to clearance
5 of a clear background check with no positive hits.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
7 motion. Do we have a second?

8 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, second.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
10 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

11 (All present Board members voted aye.)

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

13 So, anybody that was a part of the block
14 vote that would want to leave now, you're more than
15 welcome to do so, or you can stay and join us. We
16 can be quite entertaining sometimes. But understand
17 if you have something else to do.

18 Agenda Item No. 20, private investigator.

19 It's 702 Consulting. Do we have David Logue here?

20 Good morning, sir.

21 MR. LOGUE: Morning.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Excuse me, Madam
23 Chair?

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I have a long-time

1 relationship with Mr. Logue with the police
2 department, Metropolitan Police Department. We were
3 never on the same chain of command, nothing like
4 that. We didn't work -- he didn't work for me, I
5 didn't work for him. I don't feel like I have any
6 problem.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Hi, David.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good morning, sir.
10 Tell us a little bit about yourself and the
11 intentions with the license.

12 MR. LOGUE: I did 29 years, retiring as a
13 lieutenant with Metro. Last ten years was with
14 criminal intelligence.

15 Since then, I've worked two years at
16 the -- when I retired in 2013, I worked two years at
17 the Wynn as the Director of Security. And I went to
18 Cosmopolitan, where I was vice-president of security
19 and surveillance, and have been so employed until
20 now.

21 I did give my resignation last week, and
22 agreed to work as long as April 30th, but I think
23 we've kind of compromised, maybe the second week of
24 April I'll be out. So -- and that's it for that.

25 And my intentions are to just work as an

1 expert witness and do some consulting in the city.

2 That's it.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, sounds good.

4 Any questions for Mr. Logue?

5 Hearing no questions, I'll entertain a
6 motion.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
8 Cortez, motioning to approve Mr. Logue for an
9 individual private investigator license, and that it
10 be placed in abeyance so that he may become the
11 qualifying agent and member, subject to all
12 statutory and regulatory requirements.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
14 motion. Do we have a second?

15 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, second.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
17 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

18 (All present Board members voted aye.)

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

20 Congratulations, good luck to you.

21 MR. LOGUE: Thank you.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. This portion of
23 the agenda is for Private Patrol Officer.

24 Agenda Item No. 21, David Praud.

25 Is he in the audience?

1 MR. PRAUD: Good morning.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good morning, sir.

3 MR. PRAUD: I have a hearing piece in,
4 just in case.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got you. Got you.
6 You're applying for an individual private
7 patrolman's license?

8 MR. PRAUD: Yes, I am.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Tell us a little bit
10 about yourself and the intentions with the license?

11 MR. PRAUD: I'm sorry?

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Could you tell us a
13 little bit about yourself and the intentions with
14 the license.

15 MR. PRAUD: Well, I'd like to thank you
16 for having me in. My name is David Praud, spelled
17 P-r-a-u-d. It's French, and that's the only French
18 word I know.

19 So I have applied for a security company
20 license. I've been a resident of the great state of
21 Nevada for almost 50 years.

22 In that time, I've seen growth beyond my
23 wildest imagination. Most of the growth has been
24 positive, but with the good also comes the bad. I
25 see the need for more well-trained security

1 officers. In fact, I know private security is the
2 fastest growing industry in Nevada right now.

3 As for myself, I'm a certified range
4 instructor, as well as certified with pistols and
5 rifles. I have been in the private security sector
6 for over 20 years.

7 And the most important training that I
8 have had is in Nevada state law and federal law,
9 which is really important.

10 The most important -- I have experts in
11 these fields ready to help me, join my group. And
12 as myself, ready to train my officers to the highest
13 security and ethical standards. My company motto
14 and goal will be exceptional training, superior
15 protection.

16 Again, I thank you for this opportunity,
17 and look forward to working with the PILB and
18 ensuring a safer and better Nevada. Thank you.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

20 Board, are there any questions for
21 Mr. Praud?

22 Hearing there are no questions, I'll
23 entertain a motion.

24 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick. I
25 move that we approve Mr. Praud for an individual

1 private patrolman license, subject to all statutory
2 and regulatory requirements.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
4 motion. Do we have a second?

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
6 Cortez. I'll second the motion.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
8 have a second. All in favor say aye.

9 (All present Board members voted aye.)

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.
11 Congratulations, sir. Good luck.

12 MR. PRAUD: Thank you, very much.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 22,
14 Raesheana Sullivan.

15 MS. SULLIVAN: Hello. How are you?

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good. Good morning,
17 ma'am. Please tell us little bit about yourself and
18 intentions with the license.

19 MS. SULLIVAN: Yes, ma'am. My name is
20 Raesheana Sullivan. I am currently --

21 THE REPORTER: Excuse me. Can you speak
22 up a little, please?

23 MS. SULLIVAN: I'm sorry.

24 I am 32 years old. I've been in the
25 security business since I was 16 working front

1 office. After that, I moved to various locations.

2 And doing security in different job sites.

3 After that I went to corrections. I was a
4 correction officer for two and a half years. And I
5 realized security is something that I've always
6 wanted to do. And I figured Nevada was my next step
7 in that.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Are there --
9 Board, are there any questions for Ms. Sullivan?

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.

11 Good morning, Ms. Sullivan. Your finances
12 are a little bit suspect.

13 MS. SULLIVAN: Yes, sir.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Can you explain 52
15 total delinquencies?

16 MS. SULLIVAN: Yes, I can. So, during
17 that time in corrections, I was also supporting two
18 households. My mother was sick. I made a lot of
19 decisions financially. And that 52 delinquencies
20 was my car loan. I paid off my car. Everything has
21 been corrected. As far as that car loan, it's paid
22 off. It's done.

23 I had -- did not have the adequate
24 financial literacy, but I currently have mentors who
25 are willing to help me, and I'm currently working

1 with people to help advocate for my credit as well.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, just to be clear,
3 all of these accounts, the delinquencies in three
4 accounts, they're all taken care of and closed?

5 MS. SULLIVAN: The car loan is currently
6 closed. However, the other two, one is being
7 disputed and the other one is in a payment plan. So
8 everything is literally being taken care of.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Once again,
11 Ms. Sullivan, what are your intentions with this
12 license?

13 MS. SULLIVAN: My intentions are to
14 currently open up a security company. I realize
15 security is something I've always been in. It took
16 me a while to understand that, but now I've grown
17 and matured. And again, I have several mentors who
18 are backing me. And my intention is to become one
19 of the best I can. Train my officers like I was
20 trained. Mentor my officers like I was mentored.
21 And provide the best services that I can.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Is Investigator
23 Diaz here?

24 Investigator Diaz, could you provide some
25 additional information on Ms. Sullivan, as -- are

1 all these taken care of?

2 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: Investigator Diaz, for
3 the record.

4 Yes, the three accounts closed and paid
5 for by collections. Those accounts are now closed.
6 It looks like she is in a payment plan for the
7 collections and for the high credits. She did
8 provide documentation to show that she is currently
9 paying it off. We have discussed that, so that part
10 is good.

11 The delinquencies, unfortunately, there is
12 nothing to fix that. The payments were delinquent.
13 Eventually they will fall off the credit report, but
14 as of now there have not been any delinquencies.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Just for my -- the
16 delinquencies happened back in 2010 or were they
17 more recent?

18 MS. SULLIVAN: A few of them were recent,
19 and some of them were back, yes. Again, it took me
20 a minute to gain financial literacy.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I understand.

22 MS. SULLIVAN: Which I now understand. I
23 know I need assurances, as far as payroll. I
24 understand the ins and outs.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: By more recent,
2 what are we talking about?

3 MS. SULLIVAN: Recent? The car loan?

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The delinquencies.

5 MS. SULLIVAN: Those -- my car was paid
6 off a year ago, so that's what I mean by recent.
7 That was the most recent thing.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
10 for the Board? Hearing there are no further
11 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

12 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

13 I move that Ms. Sullivan be approved for
14 an individual private patrolman license, subject to
15 all statutory and regulatory requirements.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
17 motion. Do we have a second?

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
19 Cortez. I'll second that motion.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
21 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

22 (All present Board members voted aye.)

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Ma'am, just -- you
24 know, running a business is very difficult. And I'm
25 glad that you've found your way to financial

1 literacy and you have some mentors, because that is
2 important. Just be really, really careful. I think
3 that's why we're hesitant, because you will be
4 responsible for payroll and other things that we
5 want to make sure that we don't have employees out
6 there that aren't getting paid.

7 MS. SULLIVAN: I'll make sure that they
8 get -- I'm working my hardest and I'll continue to
9 work hard.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: All right. Thank you,
11 and good luck to you, ma'am.

12 Motion passes. Thank you and good luck.

13 MS. SULLIVAN: Thank you, so much.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The next agenda item
15 is 23. Single Source Security. Do we have -- let's
16 see here. Mr. Bond, Mr. Cook, and Mr. Escamilla.

17 MR. HJELLE: Good morning.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Morning.

19 MR. HJELLE: My name is Mark Hjelle. I'm
20 the CEO for Single Source Security. So I'm joined
21 today by Bob Bond, who is our proposed Qualifying
22 Agent. I have members of my Board of Directors,
23 Andy Cook and Brandon (indiscernible).

24 THE REPORTER: What was the second name?

25 MR. HJELLE: Andy Cook. And over here is

1 Brandon Pinderhughes. Sorry, forgot the mike here.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Tell us a
3 little bit about your company and intentions with
4 the new license.

5 MR. HJELLE: Right. So we are Single
6 Source Security. We are what's known as a managed
7 services provider for security services. We serve
8 national customers. And we do that through locally
9 licensed security firms.

10 So our intent is really to be able to
11 serve our national customers in the state here,
12 again, through locally licensed security firms.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

14 MR. HJELLE: And I thought if it would be
15 okay, I came into the company in 2022 as the CEO.
16 There's a bit of history, I think, that came into
17 the report and background findings. If it would be
18 helpful to the Board, if I can just cover that
19 briefly, if that would be okay? Would that be
20 helpful?

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I think it would,
22 yeah.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Be very helpful.

24 MR. HJELLE: I have some notes here,
25 because it's -- this all predates my leadership of

1 the company. But going back to December of 2019.
2 Our original founders learned that even though they
3 are not performing directly the services in the
4 state of Nevada, you have a new license. They were
5 under the guidance from legal counsel that they
6 didn't require a license.

7 Also, we got the citation that said you
8 needed to be licensed. So that was back in December
9 of 2019. Tried to get in front of the Board in June
10 of 2020. Pandemic. Ultimately came before this
11 Board in September of 2020. In that hearing, the
12 transcript, our application was denied. Because I
13 think the two original founders could not
14 definitively say that we were properly licensed in
15 all the other states in which we operated.

16 So that was -- at that point, turning to
17 what we have, make sure we're properly licensed in
18 all other states across where we operate the
19 business. Apologize. If I can read my notes.

20 We were in regular contact with Kevin
21 Ingram at the time. He advised around February of
22 '21 that we were -- had not made enough progress, so
23 we should not come before the Board.

24 And then ultimately, in March of 2021, we
25 received a second citation. So at that point, which

1 should not have happened. Again, I wasn't here, but
2 unacceptable. Apologize to the Board for that.

3 But at that point, we ceased and desisted
4 operations in the state of Nevada. And we put our
5 full focus on really making sure we were completely
6 complying in all the other states.

7 So at that point, went to every single
8 state in which we operated, validated we had a
9 proper license, or if we needed to get one we got it
10 in place.

11 And then subsequent to that, we actually
12 hired a direct licensing compliance specialist for
13 our company, which is led by our in-house legal
14 counsel to make sure we are legally compliant in all
15 states in which we operate.

16 So at this point in time, I can tell the
17 Board that we are fully compliant in all the states
18 in which we operate with licensing. So -- which is
19 extremely important.

20 Early in my career I was a lawyer, so I
21 take the law very seriously. So that brings us to
22 this hearing today.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I appreciate that
24 work. I know it's not easy and it's confusing with
25 so many different states, and they're different --

1 states have different laws and regulations. So I
2 appreciate that.

3 Board, are there any further questions for
4 this group?

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.
6 Who is Mr. Pinderhughes?

7 MR. PINDERHUGHES: Me, sir.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Can I speak with
9 you?

10 MR. PINDERHUGHES: Sure.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. There's
12 several civil filings towards you. And the
13 investigator questioned you about the civil things,
14 filings, and he stated he was -- he was stating you
15 were unaware of them and currently contacting
16 Cumberland County to resolve these.

17 MR. PINDERHUGHES: Correct.

18 MR. GRONAUER: Did you contact Cumberland
19 County?

20 MR. PINDERHUGHES: I did.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have any
22 documentation?

23 MR. PINDERHUGHES: I do. I provided it to
24 the investigator.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, Investigator Diaz,

1 is everything cleared on those -- on those civil
2 filings?

3 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: Investigator Diaz, for
4 the record.

5 Yes, ma'am. Mr. Pinderhughes, he provided
6 documentation a few weeks ago. He did contact them
7 and provided multiple pages to show all of these are
8 closed and taken care of.

9 He did get an explanation from the courts.
10 It looks to be that there was some kind of dispute
11 between him and his mother and an apartment complex.
12 All of that is taken care of. The apartment complex
13 has reached out. They confirmed all payments are
14 completed. The courts confirmed all payments are
15 good. This whole issue is completely taken care of.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Awesome, thank
17 you for that.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you. Thank
19 you for doing that due diligence.

20 MR. PINDERHUGHES: I was unaware, but it's
21 resolved. Thank you.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Now, is this
23 Single Source Security or is it Protos Security?

24 MR. PINDERHUGHES: Single Source Security,
25 sir.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: D/b/a Protos?

2 MR. PINDERHUGHES: Correct.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any other questions
5 from the Board? Hearing no questions, I'll
6 entertain a motion.

7 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

8 I move that we approve Single Source
9 Security for a new private patrolman license, and
10 Robert William Bond be approved for an individual
11 private patrolman license, and that his individual
12 license be placed in abeyance so he may become a
13 Qualifying Agent.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
15 we have a second?

16 Do you want to finish the rest?

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: There's additional
18 members to be approved, Board Member Bezick, so we'd
19 have to finish out that motion.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The second part.

21 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Sorry, I don't have
22 that information in front of me.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do you want me to
24 make the motion?

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we'll -- can we

1 just --

2 DAG HARRIS: If Board Member Bezick could
3 just withdraw his motion, and I just need another
4 Board member to make the new motion.

5 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Board Member
6 Bezick. I withdraw the motion.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.
9 I make a motion to approve Single Source Security,
10 LLC as applying for a new corporate license, Robert
11 W. Bond is applying for an individual private patrol
12 officer license -- officer license. If approved, he
13 is requesting that his individual license be placed
14 in abeyance so he may become the Qualifying Agent.
15 Members to be approved are Robert W. Bond, Andrew T.
16 Cook, Anthony Hill Escamilla, Mark...

17 MR. HJELLE: Hjelle.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Hjelle, and
19 Brandon Pinderhughes. This is subject to all
20 statutory and regulatory requirements.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
22 we have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, second.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
25 have a second. All in favor, say aye.

1 (All present Board members voted aye.)

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

3 Thank you for doing all the hard work. We
4 appreciate you, and good luck to you.

5 MR. HJELLE: Thank you, very much.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 24, SK
7 Security, LLC. Do we have Sidney Kile?

8 MR. KILE: Good morning.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Tell us a little bit
10 about yourself and the intentions with the license,
11 please.

12 MR. KILE: My name Sidney Kile. I'm 26
13 years old. I started a security company where I'm
14 from, in Kansas City, Missouri, seven years ago. So
15 I was very young. In that time frame, we've grown
16 to be the largest private security company in
17 Kansas City, with the largest fleet, with employees
18 of almost 100.

19 We operate there, and we've done a great
20 job of making the community safer, established
21 really good relationships with the police
22 departments and operated by the book.

23 In 2019, it was the first time that I had
24 ever traveled to Las Vegas, and I immediately fell
25 in love. So April of last year I decided to move

1 here, and now I'd like to continue with my goal of
2 improving the communities that touch my heart so
3 dearly. And that's why I'm applying.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you.
5 Board, are there any questions for Mr. Kile?

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.
7 Investigator Swarthout, on the arrests,
8 are they dismissed?

9 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yes, they are.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
11 Cortez.

12 Investigator Swarthout, what year was the
13 second arrest in?

14 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: 2022.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: On or about the same
16 time as the first? Was it concurrent?

17 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The second
18 arrest. 2013. That arrest actually doesn't even
19 show up on his fingerprints.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you for
21 disclosing.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: 2013 was the DUI?

23 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yes.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
25 from the Board?

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Still thinking.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We'll let you think.

3 MR. KILE: If I may, Counsel, my -- that
4 DUI was when I was 16 years old. I was very naive
5 and young and I learned very quickly.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: So you're breaking
7 two laws, drinking and driving underage.

8 MR. KILE: Yes, sir.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: The diversion
10 program we have, there was documentation of that?

11 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: There should be
12 in his file that we had documentation for it.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
15 Cortez.

16 I do have a question regarding the
17 assault. I do see that it was -- the disposition
18 was nolle prosequi. Give me a little bit of the
19 history of that, what happened.

20 MR. KILE: It was an event where I felt
21 like my life was in danger.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm a visual kind of
23 a person, so I need you to paint me the story.

24 MR. KILE: Absolutely. It was on the 31st
25 of March in 2022. I was proceeding to my vehicle.

1 And as I entered my vehicle, there was an individual
2 in my driver's seat. I had -- I always carry a
3 firearm with me while I'm in Kansas City. So I had
4 asked the individual to get out of my car. The
5 interaction became very heated in that moment, so I
6 had taken out my weapon at the ready.

7 As soon as he saw the weapon, he
8 immediately started to comply. Got out of the
9 vehicle and started to walk away.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: He was in the
11 driver's seat?

12 MR. KILE: Correct.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Got it.

14 MR. KILE: And he had broken the latch to
15 get in.

16 Once -- once he had exited the vehicle and
17 started to walk away, I turned around to the
18 individual that I was with, which was my girlfriend
19 at the time, and asked her to call the police.

20 As soon as he heard me say that, he
21 immediately turned around and then became -- a
22 situation that he approaching me. Running at me
23 directly. We proceed backwards about 25 feet. And
24 when he was two feet away reaching for the firearm I
25 chose to shoot him.

1 He survived. It was a very long process.
2 And I think the judicial process is ultimately what
3 led to the dismissal. Once he testified and gave
4 his actions.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood. Thank
6 you for your transparency.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
8 for the Board? Hearing there are no further
9 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
11 Cortez, motioning to approve Mr. Kile for an
12 individual private patrol license, and that it be
13 placed in abeyance so that he becomes the Qualifying
14 Agent. Member to be approved is Sidney P. Kile.
15 All is subject to statutory and regulatory
16 requirements.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
18 we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, second.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
21 have a second. All in favor say aye.

22 (All present Board members voted aye.)

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.
24 Congratulations, and good luck to you.

25 MR. KILE: Thank you so, so much.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: The show me state.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We will move on to

3 Agenda Item No. 25, Marvel Tate.

4 Good morning, sir.

5 MR. TATE: Good morning.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The gentleman with

7 you?

8 MR. PRICE: I'm one of the managing

9 members, Kendrick Price.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Tell us a little bit

11 about yourself, sir, and intentions with the

12 license.

13 MR. TATE: My name is Marvel Tate. I'm 40

14 years old.

15 THE REPORTER: Can you speak up, please?

16 MR. TATE: Sorry. My name is Marvel Tate.

17 I'm a father of seven. I've been doing security

18 since I was 18 years old. I'm (indiscernible) --

19 THE REPORTER: Can you repeat that?

20 I'm having -- can the mike come a little

21 closer?

22 MR. TATE: Sorry. My name is Marvel Tate.

23 I'm 40 years old. I'm a father of seven, from

24 Belleville (ph), Illinois. I've been doing security

25 since I was 18 years old. My story is really

1 unique.

2 When I first started doing this job,
3 honestly, it was just a job. It was just, you know,
4 18 years old, it was just something that was easy to
5 do at the time. This job has grown to be more than
6 just a job. It's grown to be a profession. Sort of
7 like a dream for me, a passion.

8 So the fact that I'm here where I am for
9 me is a big win where I come from, where I started
10 at as a guard that had, you know, zero understanding
11 of how important a job was for others, even myself.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: What are the
13 intentions with the license?

14 MR. TATE: To grow the security company,
15 build jobs for others. Trying to keep that same
16 thing going for myself to the other guards that are
17 starting off, that they can do just what I'm doing.
18 That it's possible.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Are there any further
20 questions from the Board?

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.
22 Says if you are granted this license, you
23 want to put a license in abeyance and become the
24 Qualified Agent.

25 MR. TATE: Yes, sir.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you know what a
2 Qualifying Agent requires?

3 MR. TATE: Yes.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Explain to me.

5 MR. TATE: Well, one, they monitor
6 everything --

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I can't hear you.

8 MR. TATE: They monitor 99 percent of
9 everything that goes on with the security company.
10 As far as the requirements from the PILB, standards
11 and everything.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Is there an admin
13 person in your company that would handle the
14 paperwork, licensing, all that, and he would just be
15 overseeing it, or would be --

16 MR. PRICE: I handle all the paperwork. I
17 handle all the paperwork.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: And could you state
19 your name for the record, and your position?

20 MR. PRICE: Kendrick Price. I am the CFO.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Why aren't you
23 going to be the Qualifying Agent, then?

24 MR. PRICE: I am currently a couple
25 hundred hours short.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. With
2 previous work history.

3 MR. TATE: Yes, sir.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You worked for
5 multiple companies. And when they were asked about
6 your employment, they stated there were several
7 issues.

8 MR. TATE: Yes, sir.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: The most common
10 complaints from the companies were sleeping on duty;
11 no call, no show; multiple call offs, meaning not
12 showing up for work; just calling in sick or
13 whatever; just quit showing up and no communication;
14 unprofessional conduct; violations of company
15 policy; hard to contact when on post; uniform
16 issues; commit to schedule issues; very aggressive
17 per client; did not file reports.

18 That background does not sound like a very
19 good Qualifying Agent for me.

20 MR. TATE: Yes, sir.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: So, what do you
22 have to say about this?

23 MR. TATE: To be honest with you, sir,
24 I --

25 THE REPORTER: Can you --

1 MR. TATE: I define the person that I am.
2 I know who I am. I know what I have performed with
3 these jobs. I been as high as a vice-president of
4 operations for a security company. And as long as
5 operations manager, supervisor, pretty much,
6 90 percent of these companies I've been with, I know
7 what I can do. The only difference is now is, I was
8 given 96 hours a week some of these jobs. I'm now
9 doing it for myself. So I define the person that I
10 am.

11 And to be totally honest with you,
12 accountability starts with the top. Every guard is
13 not perfect. Every organization is not perfect.
14 So, pretty sure that any organization need guards,
15 they're not going to get up here and they're only
16 going to tell one side of the story. So I can only
17 speak for myself and what I think of myself.

18 I'm confident in myself. I know what I
19 give. I know my work ethic. That's why I'm here
20 today. I can't control what's being said. I can
21 only control my own actions. That's exactly what I
22 tell my guards.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I believe past
24 performance doesn't always indicate future
25 performance, okay? I can give you that benefit of

1 the doubt. However, to me, there's so many for so
2 many companies and so many different instances, it
3 creates a problem for me.

4 MR. TATE: Uh-huh.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Especially as a
6 Qualifying Agent. Because you're responsible for
7 that whole business.

8 That's all, thank you.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
10 Cortez.

11 I do have some follow-up comments and
12 possibly questions.

13 When you indicated that you can only speak
14 for yourself and accountability starts at the top, I
15 didn't really hear you take any kind of
16 accountability regarding a collective opinion on
17 numerous, numerous companies. Everybody --
18 everybody in this room can't be wrong if we all
19 agree that you have -- you're sleeping on duty,
20 you're not calling in, not showing, multiple calls
21 off, just quit, not showing, unprofessional conduct.
22 And all I heard you say is that you can only stick
23 to who you are as a person. I get that. Be who you
24 are.

25 But unfortunately, who you are has

1 described unpleasant descriptives of who you are as
2 an employee. And you're asking to be a Qualifying
3 Agent. You would be at the top.

4 So if all I had basically in front of me
5 was based off a collection of individuals who have
6 pretty much painted you as not an individual who's
7 going to be responsible, or even reliable, is that
8 what you're going to teach everybody behind you?
9 Because it starts at the top. You said it starts at
10 the top. And this is a standard of where you're
11 starting. It's incredibly disappointing.

12 MR. TATE: (Indiscernible.)

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I don't have any
14 questions at this time. I just -- you had your
15 opportunity to speak. I was hoping you were going
16 to come back strong with something, but
17 unfortunately I didn't hear that. I didn't hear
18 that.

19 No questions at this time.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Anything further from
21 the Board? Hearing there's no further questions or
22 comments, I'll entertain a motion.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.

24 Move to deny the appeal of Mr. Marvel L.
25 Tate, who's applying for an individual private

1 patrol officer license. If approved, he is
2 requesting that his individual private patrol
3 officer license be placed in abeyance so he may
4 become the Qualifying Agent for Sentinel Security
5 Force, LLC, License No. 4016. Subject to statutory
6 and regulatory requirements.

7 And reason for denial is past history of
8 too many negatives that for a Qualifying Agent, that
9 this doesn't fit the bill.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
11 we have a second?

12 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, second.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
14 have a second. All in favor say aye.

15 (All present Board members voted aye.)

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So the motion was that
17 you were not approved for the license, and that has
18 been approved.

19 You know, I have to agree with everything
20 everybody said. There's just an issue with
21 performance and that's the problem.

22 So appreciate you applying. You're more
23 than welcome to apply again in a year, and hopefully
24 there's been some change. Thank you.

25 Next agenda item is Agenda Item No. 26,

1 Best Crowd Management.

2 Sir, please tell us little bit about
3 yourself and your intentions of the license.

4 MR. MOSS: Good morning. I'm Steven Ray
5 Moss. I'm a very young 56 years old. Originally
6 from Louisiana. United States Air Force veteran.

7 With -- my background mainly -- had been
8 in law enforcement. I was -- worked for Grant
9 Parish Sheriff's Office in Leesville, Louisiana for
10 13 years. Ten of those, I was criminal
11 investigator, detective. For the last year or so I
12 was their evidence custodian and crime scenes
13 investigator and team lead on our SRT team, our SWAT
14 team.

15 Went into defense contracting after that
16 for about a decade. Traveling throughout the United
17 States for companies Mobius Industries and Threat
18 Tech. Was under a federal contract, in which we
19 were training United States military soldiers that
20 were deploying to Iraq and Afghanistan. Again, did
21 that for about a decade, and then branched off into
22 event security and was hired by Best
23 (indiscernible) --

24 THE REPORTER: Best?

25 MR. MOSS: Best Crowd Management. Been

1 with Best for approximately two years now. My first
2 year with Best I was on their national event team,
3 and that's what I was hired as. And was responsible
4 for managing and coordinating the event security at
5 Super Bowl last year in Phoenix and 2023 FISU World
6 University Games up in Lake Placid, New York.
7 That's what I did for pretty much the first year
8 with Best.

9 During that time, I had been contacted
10 through Best management that there was an
11 opportunity in Las Vegas to be the general manager
12 and to handle their branch here. It's one of the
13 largest branches in Best. We have contracts
14 throughout the United States with NCAA, NFL, NHL.
15 Do a lot of sporting events.

16 Here, our biggest contract is with MGM
17 event operations. We handle the event security at
18 T-Mobile Arena, Michelob Ultra, Dolby Live, Grand
19 Garden. We do have guest services that we do. And
20 we have some other contracts as well. Employ a
21 thousand to 1200 staff.

22 And moved, me and my family moved here
23 from Louisiana. It's been about a year now. We
24 moved here permanently to take the role as general
25 manager.

1 That's -- that is me in a nutshell.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you.

3 MR. MOSS: You're welcome.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You know, I forgot to
5 ask, did you guys swear in?

6 MR. MOSS: We did, yes.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I just wanted to make
8 sure.

9 MR. MOSS: I know there's some -- probably
10 some financial -- individual financial, personal
11 financial questions that you all may have for me,
12 which I'll be glad to explain.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

14 Board, are there I any questions for --

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
16 Cortez.

17 Go ahead with the explanation. Thank you.

18 MR. MOSS: Well, first and foremost, let
19 me apologize. When I received the background check,
20 I had a Chapter 13 bankruptcy right out of the
21 Air Force. As a young airman, I had met and married
22 my high school sweetheart. We separated, she ran up
23 some credit cards on me, but since I was still in
24 the Air Force, I was held responsible for them.

25 And when I got out, at the advice of my

1 father, saw an attorney, set up a Chapter 13, paid
2 it off over -- I think I paid \$163 for three years
3 and paid it all off. And I think that was in '92.
4 So, it was a good 30, 31 years ago.

5 I honestly thought I had put that in my
6 background. Was nothing I was trying to not
7 disclose. But when I went back so -- I was so
8 certain that I did, I'm, like, no, they made a
9 mistake. I went back and looked and it was at the
10 bottom of the page underneath where I had some other
11 judgments that I had disclosed and I just simply
12 missed it.

13 The more recent stuff was just
14 unfortunate. It was -- it was after a divorce,
15 unfortunately. I had two vehicles, my son's and my
16 ex-wife now. It was their vehicles that I let them
17 keep after the divorce. I was actually paying
18 them -- paying her to pay it. And she was not.

19 Those two vehicles went into repossession
20 without my knowledge. At that time I was in defense
21 contracting and I was traveling the nation. I was
22 away for weeks at a time.

23 Unfortunately, the -- it was through
24 (indiscernible) Federal Credit Union --

25 THE REPORTER: You said --

1 MR. MOSS: Barksdale. The loans were
2 through Barksdale Federal Credit Union in Leesville,
3 Louisiana. They sought judgment against me.

4 All that paperwork and -- they were served
5 to my mother, my elderly mother at her house. I
6 never saw the paperwork. By the time I saw the
7 paperwork and they were delivered to me, it was a
8 stack about this high. She had very nicely kept
9 them for me, but didn't inform me that these were
10 coming in.

11 Unfortunately, there was a judgment
12 against me. I spent three years paying all that
13 off. It was probably \$20,000 or so I paid off,
14 which I think I concluded all that just a couple
15 years ago.

16 So that's -- that was the two issues that
17 I had.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Are there any further
20 questions? If there's no further questions I'll
21 entertain a motion.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
23 motioning to approve Best Crowd Management a new
24 corporate patrol -- private patrol officer license.
25 And that Mr. Steven R. Moss be approved the private

1 patrol license, and that it be placed in abeyance so
2 he may become the Qualifying Agent. Corporate
3 officers to also be approved are Rene P. Crosswhite,
4 Mark R. Porterfield, and Walter P. Robertson. All
5 subject to statutory and regulatory requirements.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
7 motion. Do we have a second?

8 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, second.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
10 have a second. All in favor say aye.

11 (All present Board members voted aye.)

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

13 Congratulations. Good luck to you guys.

14 MR. MOSS: Thank you, so much.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 27,
16 Mr. Kelley Murcray. If the Board indulges,
17 Mr. Murcray and I used to work together at Allied
18 Universal. He subsequently left and has moved on to
19 another company, as evidence of this. We did not --
20 we were counterparts. I didn't work for him, he
21 didn't work for me. So I feel comfortable making
22 any decision on there, but I just wanted to put it
23 on the record that we do know each other. Okay.

24 Mr. Murcray, tell us a little bit about
25 yourself and the intentions with the license.

1 MR. MURCRAY: Yeah, good morning. My name
2 is Kelley Murcraay. I'm a senior vice-president for
3 Prosegur Services Group for the west region, which
4 includes the six states on the left side of the map.

5 Been in the private security industry for
6 25 years. As mentioned, 23 of that was with Allied
7 Universal. The last 18 months or so were with
8 Prosegur Services Group, international, global
9 company. We currently do not provide services in
10 Nevada, but switching our qualified agent to myself
11 for future business opportunities.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

13 Any questions for Mr. Murcraay? Hearing
14 there are no questions, I'll entertain a motion.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
16 Cortez motioning to approve Mr. Kelley W. Murcraay
17 for a private patrol officer license, and that he be
18 placed in abeyance so that he becomes the Qualifying
19 Agent license -- with license No. 2187, subject to
20 all statutory and regulatory requirements.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
22 we have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, second.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
25 have a second. All in favor say aye.

1 (All present Board members voted aye.)

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

3 Congratulations.

4 MR. MURCRAY: Thank you. Take care.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good seeing you.

6 So, the next group starts at 10:30. I
7 think we'll take a -- looks like we do have some
8 folks in the audience. So we'll take a brief break
9 and then start the next portion of the agenda items,
10 which would be registration and appeals.

11 So let's say 10:15?

12 DAG HARRIS: Yeah.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. See you
14 back then.

15 (Off record.)

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Is everybody back and
17 ready to go?

18 So, we're here for the second part of the
19 agenda, which is the registration appeals. When you
20 hear your name, please come up and come forward.

21 Prior to that, we're going to have Counsel
22 Harris swear everybody in.

23 ...

24 ...

25 ...

1 AUDIENCE MEMBERS,
2 having been duly sworn
3 testified as follows:

4
5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: If we can have Agenda
6 Item No. 28, Korthary Ratcliffe. Okay. We'll go
7 ahead and trail that agenda item.

8 Agenda Item No. 29, Harold Jones. Thank
9 you.

10 Investigator Swarthout, would you tell us
11 why we're for Mr. Jones

12 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
13 denied for a felony conviction. It was -- the
14 applicant had listed it as November 2011. We have
15 since got the prints back. The arrest was on
16 September 4th of 2009 out of Chicago, Illinois.

17 It was disclosed, it was a felony
18 conviction for possession of cannabis.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So it was
20 disclosed, just the wrong dates were given.

21 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Correct.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
23 questions for Mr. Jones?

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: First of all, this
25 is Gronauer.

1 Fingerprints come back on him?

2 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yes, they did.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And were
4 good?

5 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yeah.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Morning,
7 Mr. Jones.

8 MR. JONES: Good morning, sir.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. What do you
10 plan on doing with the work card if you're approved?

11 MR. JONES: I'm trying to be a security
12 guard.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I can't understand
14 you.

15 MR. JONES: Trying to be a security guard.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have any
17 prospects?

18 MR. JONES: The Circa and The Plaza.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
21 for the Board? Hearing there are no questions, I'll
22 entertain a motion.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
24 Cortez.

25 Motion to approve Mr. Harold Jones, his

1 appeal.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
3 we have a second?

4 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, seconds.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
6 have a second. All in favor say aye.

7 (All present Board members voted aye.)

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

9 You'll get your card. The office will
10 contact you with further steps. And I do, you
11 know -- really, so everybody understands. I
12 appreciate that you disclosed your arrest. And not
13 knowing the date, even though you didn't know the
14 date, it was incorrect, at least you disclosed it.
15 We can find that out later. We do appreciate that,
16 so thank you, very much, sir.

17 MR. JONES: Yes, ma'am.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 30,
19 Brian Jakovich.

20 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Mr. Jakovich is up
21 north and he's approaching the podium.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

23 Good morning, Mr. Jakovich.

24 Mr. Swarthout, could you tell us why we're
25 here for Mr. Jakovich?

1 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
2 denied for a conviction of the illegal use,
3 possession of a dangerous weapon March 11, 1981 out
4 of California. Misdemeanor CCW in vehicle. He was
5 sentenced to 36 months probation and a fine of \$65.
6 He did provide court documents with his appeal
7 dealing with this case.

8 And then he had another arrest, May 31st,
9 2020 out of California. This one, also, was
10 disclosed. And it was for exhibiting a deadly
11 weapon not a firearm in violation of civil rights
12 with force or threat, and that case was dismissed.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
14 there any questions for Mr. Jakovich?

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
16 Cortez.

17 Mr. Jakovich, could you talk to me about
18 the 2020 incident? I do understand that it was
19 dismissed; however, I'd like to hear your story of
20 what occurred.

21 MR. JAKOVICH: This is the May 31st, you
22 said?

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That is correct.
24 2020.

25 MR. JAKOVICH: Yes, ma'am.

1 I was living in Oregon, leaving Crescent
2 City Home Depot. It was the fifth morning of the
3 BLM riots. I was legally carrying a firearm
4 concealed in my vehicle.

5 And as I drove past the line of
6 protesters, you know, I felt harassed, just like I'm
7 sure everybody else here.

8 And it was a warm day and I heard -- I was
9 called some racial names. And I yelled back and
10 that was it. And then a light turned red and I
11 grabbed my cell phone, snapped two pictures that I
12 still have, and thought nothing of it. Never, ever,
13 ever touched my concealed firearm. There's no
14 point. I have 100 protesters on a sidewalk. No
15 point, no threat. And I was concealed.

16 And the next thing I know, I'm about to
17 cross back into Oregon, in which I have my CCW for
18 five different states. And next thing I know, I
19 have two CHPs behind me coming Code 3. And I just
20 had a feeling they were there for me. I pulled into
21 the parking lot, was arrested at gunpoint, charged
22 with brandishing a firearm. And PC 4226A,
23 disrupting a protest.

24 I owned a 1981 conviction. I was in a
25 ranch truck, just had a pistol under the seat. I

1 was 18 years old. I was stupid. Didn't know any
2 better. I was out in the country. But this one was
3 just not fair. All I did was drive by, they yelled
4 at me, I yelled something back, and next thing I
5 know, I was arrested at gunpoint and it was an
6 18-month nightmare just for running my mouth and
7 exercising my First Amendment right.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Thank you, so
9 much.

10 Investigator Swarthout, could you -- do
11 you have the police report with you?

12 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Not -- we don't
13 have the police report in that case.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do you have any
15 information as far as what was the exhibit of the
16 deadly weapon? Because on here the charge is not a
17 firearm, but --

18 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: That's all the
19 prints and all the paperwork that he provided from
20 California. That's all it says, that it was not a
21 firearm, just a deadly weapon.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Thank you.

23 MR. JAKOVICH: May I add? It was a DA
24 reject that the prosecutor never filed charges.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I see that,

1 Mr. Jakovich.

2 My concern was, is that you kept -- you
3 continuously indicated that you had your registered
4 firearm; however, your charge was exhibited deadly
5 weapon not a firearm. So I'm wondering, did you
6 have anything else on you? Did you have a dagger?
7 When you said that you yelled out explicit (sic)
8 back? And you said you took your phone --

9 MR. JAKOVICH: No, ma'am. I never touched
10 my firearm. It was just a complete fabrication by
11 three African-American women that just made this up.
12 Just because I ran my mouth at the -- I made the
13 mistake of opening my mouth at the stoplight as I
14 went by.

15 And I was a complete victim of that,
16 ma'am, with all respect. It was -- 18 months of my
17 life was on hold.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay, thank you.

19 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Madam Chair,
20 if I could. Director Saladino, for the record.

21 Being that the situation with the BLM and
22 the protesters, they could have charged him with the
23 deadly weapon not a firearm because of his vehicle,
24 being that he was driving through. The protesters
25 probably mentioned to CHP that almost hit them or

1 something to that effect. That's probably why they
2 charged it as not a firearm.

3 MR. JAKOVICH: I was, with all respect,
4 charged with PC 422.6(A) terrorist threats and PC
5 417(a), brandishing a firearm. Which was all
6 complete false allegations. With all respect.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
8 for the Board?

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
10 Cortez.

11 I do have one last question. What are
12 your intentions if you were to get this guard card?

13 MR. JAKOVICH: It's my -- I used to have
14 my work card in California. I was -- I worked for
15 California Department of Corrections 30 years. I
16 retired in 2012. I had a long career. And I used
17 to work -- had my guard card in California, used to
18 do high-end moonlighting, do high-end celebrity
19 work. So I'd like to get back into that. I already
20 have a job offer from Joe at Triumph Protection to
21 do high-end security for him.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Is that armed or
23 unarmed?

24 MR. JAKOVICH: It would be armed, yes. It
25 would be armed.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm going to be
2 honest with you. I do have a little bit of concern.
3 I understand that it was dismissed. However, you're
4 going to get into a position where you are going to
5 come face-to-face with individuals of color. That
6 you, being white, may also, again, say racial
7 comments back to you. My question is, how are you
8 going to --

9 MR. JAKOVICH: -- explain that --

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Hang on one second,
11 please.

12 How are you going to handle that if you
13 get called yet another racial slur and you are in an
14 armed position?

15 MR. JAKOVICH: With all respect, ma'am.
16 The last 15 years of my career I was a state parole
17 agent, ran fugitive apprehension team. I've had
18 many African-Americans work for me. I've never had
19 a problem. I'm not prejudiced in any way.

20 That BLM thing was just a terrible
21 incident that happened. Race had nothing to do with
22 it, as far as I was concerned. They called me an
23 F-ing redneck, and, yes, they got a reaction as I
24 went by, with all respect.

25 I've been in many, many life-threatening

1 situations, many officer involved shootings,
2 directly, indirectly. I was CAD rated at the
3 academy for 12 years. Taught five different
4 tactical classes. And I would believe I would be an
5 extreme asset to your industry and whatever company
6 hired me.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood. Thank
8 you.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
10 for the Board?

11 MR. JAKOVICH: No ma'am.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Hearing there are no
13 further questions, I'll entertain a motion.

14 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

15 I move that Mr. Jakovich be granted his
16 work card based on full disclosure of information.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
18 I have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer, second.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion, I
21 have a second. All in favor say aye.

22 (All present Board members voted aye.)

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

24 Sir, you will get your work card. The
25 office will contact you shortly.

1 MR. JAKOVICH: Thank you, very much. I
2 appreciate your time. Thank you, very much.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck
4 to you.

5 Agenda Item No. 31, Sean Wilson. Is
6 Mr. Wilson in here?

7 Good morning, sir.

8 MR. WILSON: Good morning.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
10 Swarthout, could you tell us why we're here for
11 Mr. Wilson?

12 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: So, the applicant
13 was denied due to a felony conviction. June 2nd,
14 2008 out of California, second degree burglary and
15 violation of parole. The applicant received three
16 years Wasco State Prison.

17 December 18th, 2005 out of California,
18 felony conviction for grand theft from person;
19 received 16 months prison.

20 November 6, 2016 out of Nevada, DUI,
21 misdemeanor.

22 And then August 12th, 2013 out of
23 California, misdemeanor possession of controlled
24 substance.

25 The applicant was previously denied, and

1 this is his second time coming before the Board.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
3 questions for Mr. Wilson?

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Morning,
5 Mr. Wilson.

6 MR. WILSON: Good morning.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You were denied
8 last time for failed to disclosure arrest, correct?

9 MR. WILSON: Yes, sir.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I appreciate you
11 coming back and disclosing everything and doing what
12 you're asked to do.

13 MR. WILSON: Thank you.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Wish more people
15 would do that. Thank you.

16 MR. WILSON: You're welcome.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
18 for the Board? Hearing there's no questions, I'll
19 entertain a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.

21 Motion to grant the appeal of Sean Wilson
22 who applied for registration and was denied.
23 Reason, that he did all the stuff he was required to
24 do.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion.

1 Do we have a second?

2 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, second.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
4 have a second. All in favor say aye.

5 (All present Board members voted aye.)

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations, sir.
7 Thank you, again, for doing everything
8 you're supposed to and coming back. We appreciate
9 it. Good luck to you.

10 The office will contact you shortly.

11 MR. WILSON: Thank you.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 32,
13 Daniel Mundo.

14 MR. MUNDO: Mundo.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Mundo.

16 Investigator Swarthout -- good morning to
17 you.

18 Investigator Swarthout, why are we here
19 for Mr. Mundo?

20 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
21 denied due to felony conviction June 19th, 2013 out
22 of Nevada. Conspiracy to commit robbery. Sentenced
23 to 24 to 60 months NDOC.

24 March 13th, 2012 out of California. Two
25 counts of robbery, second degree. Sentence on the

1 first count was 12 months prison, second count was
2 36 months prison to run concurrent.

3 The applicant also did provide paperwork
4 showing that he was no longer on parole out of
5 California.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
7 questions for Mr. Mundo?

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
9 Cortez.

10 I actually have a question for
11 Investigator Swarthout.

12 When you indicated the paperwork for
13 termination of parole was received, what date was
14 probation terminated, and was it terminated
15 positively?

16 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: It looks like
17 from the paperwork it was terminated on June 23,
18 2022. And it looks like -- it doesn't say that it
19 was a bad discharge, it looks like it was a normal
20 discharge.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Mr. Mundo, did you
22 complete all of your requirements with parole?

23 MR. MUNDO: Yes, ma'am.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Was it a successful
25 completion?

1 MR. MUNDO: Yes, ma'am.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Was it?

3 MR. MUNDO: Yes, ma'am.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Morning,
6 Mr. Mundo. This is Gronauer. You're not on paper
7 now?

8 MR. MUNDO: No, sir.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Because it says
10 three years. 2019, 2022, okay.

11 That's all, thank you.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Have you put in
13 applications already for employment --

14 MR. MUNDO: Yes, ma'am.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: -- working towards
16 that?

17 MS. SULLIVAN: I actually have a company
18 that wants to hire me for security unarmed. I
19 believe the company is called Sentinel. So I'm
20 hoping to get my card (indiscernible).

21 THE REPORTER: Get your card?

22 MR. MUNDO: Yes, ma'am.

23 THE REPORTER: Thank you.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, if
25 there's no further questions, I'll entertain a

1 motion.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.

3 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

4 Go ahead, Mr. Gronauer.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Go ahead

6 Katherine.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member

8 Cortez.

9 I'm going to motion that we approve

10 Mr. Mundo his appeal for the registration card based

11 on full disclosure and that he is no longer actively

12 on parole.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do

14 we have a second?

15 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, second.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we

17 have a second. All in favor say aye.

18 (All present Board members voted aye.)

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

20 So you will be granted your work card.

21 The office will contact you shortly, okay?

22 MR. MUNDO: Thank you, very much.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you.

24 Agenda Item No. 33, Lisa Doggans.

25 MS. DOGGANS FARR JAGODSINSKI: Good

1 morning.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good morning.

3 Just to verify, you've been sworn in?

4 MS. DOGGANS FARR JAGODSINSKI: Yes.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Investigator
6 Swarthout, why are we here for Ms. Doggans?

7 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
8 denied for a felony conviction and for failure to
9 disclose.

10 January 26th, 1993 out of Connecticut,
11 credit card fraud in connection with an Axis device.
12 She was sentenced to serve time served, six months
13 house arrest, three years supervised release. This
14 arrest was by the U.S. Secret Service.

15 And then in December 26, 1992 out of
16 California, this arrest wasn't disclosed, it's a
17 felony conviction for grand theft of Axis card, sell
18 with intent to defraud. Convicted to three years
19 probation and 181 days jail, suspended.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Any questions
21 for Ms. Doggans?

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board member
23 Cortez. Is it Jagodsinski?

24 MS. DOGGANS FARR JAGODSINSKI: Yes.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Why did you fail to

1 disclose the 1992 conviction?

2 MS. DOGGANS FARR JAGODSINSKI: I thought I
3 put them together. Because they were ran concurrent
4 into one case. And I thought I did disclose the
5 whole story as best I could in the information
6 that -- or lines that were provided. I believe that
7 I said something about it, because they were back to
8 back, ran concurrent into one case.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay.

10 Investigator Swarthout, is that the -- one
11 was in December of '92, the other one was January.
12 Was the case concurrent?

13 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: On the PACER
14 record, it didn't show if it ran concurrent from the
15 federal courts. They're both similar charges and
16 around the same time, so that could be why she
17 thought she did disclose it, because...

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Were you able
19 to pay off that fine?

20 MS. DOGGANS FARR JAGODSINSKI: Yes.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You did? Okay.

22 What are your plans with your guard card,
23 should you be granted one?

24 MS. DOGGANS FARR JAGODSINSKI: Well, I
25 sell real estate in California and Nevada. And my

1 grandkids are here, so I started to look for
2 part-time gigs to help me to pay for all of the real
3 estate fees.

4 And I heard about Best. They do Rhino
5 Staging, different things. In between selling real
6 estate.

7 So when I heard about Best, I filled out
8 the application, and then they told me to go get
9 fingerprinted. And I found out there that I was
10 going to need to do a (indiscernible).

11 THE REPORTER: To do a what?

12 MS. DOGGANS FARR JAGODSINSKI: To do the
13 whole appeal process to get a card. I had no idea.
14 And then, I'm 59 this month. And I think I might
15 have been 25, -6 or something back then. So it's
16 kind of -- it's been so long. It's a whole other
17 lifetime.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, Investigator
19 Swarthout, just to make sure. She did disclose one
20 portion of it when she was doing her initial
21 application. It was the second one that --

22 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: That is correct.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: -- may have run
24 concurrently. Okay, got you.

25 MS. DOGGANS FARR JAGODSINSKI: They did

1 run it concurrent, though, from Connecticut. One
2 was in California and the other in Connecticut. And
3 they brought it together to send me back to
4 California to do all the probation and all --
5 everything.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

7 Board, any further questions? Hearing
8 there are no further questions, I'll entertain a
9 motion.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer.

11 I make a motion for -- to approve the
12 appeal of Lisa Doggans Farr Jargodsinski for time
13 and distance.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
15 we have a second?

16 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
18 have a second. All in favor say aye.

19 (All present Board members voted aye.)

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

21 The office will contact you for next
22 steps.

23 I apologize for not seeing the last
24 portion of your name. But, yeah, good luck to you.

25 MS. DOGGANS FARR JAGODSINSKI: Thank you.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You're welcome.
2 Agenda Item No. 34, Antoinette Johnson.
3 Just to confirm, you are -- did you get
4 sworn in?

5 MS. JOHNSON: Yes.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

7 Mr. Swarthout, why are we here for
8 Ms. Johnson?

9 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
10 denied for a felony conviction.

11 January 1st, 2003 out of California,
12 felony possess, purchase cocaine base for sale.
13 Sentenced five years prison.

14 January 8th of 2002 out of Nevada, felony
15 conviction for conspiracy to violate Uniform
16 Controlled Substances Act. Sentenced to 12 to 30
17 months, Nevada State Prison. Credit for 155 days
18 served.

19 October 5th, 2001 out of California,
20 felony conviction for possess, purchase cocaine base
21 for sale. Sentenced to five years prison.

22 April 8th, 1989 out of California, felony
23 conviction for transportation, sale controlled
24 substance. 30 days jail, 48 months probation.

25 February 3rd, 2011 out of California,

1 misdemeanor DUI.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And all of
3 these were disclosed?

4 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yes. She
5 disclosed all of them and listed a whole bunch of
6 stuff and all the charges out of that were the
7 initial charges, but those were the convicted
8 charges.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any questions
10 for --

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.
12 Morning, Ms. Johnson.

13 MS. JOHNSON: Good morning.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Your past history
15 with drugs, being involved in drugs, have you
16 completed any drug programs?

17 MS. JOHNSON: Yes, I have.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: How long ago?

19 MS. JOHNSON: I don't even remember how
20 long, it's been so long ago. I don't know. It's
21 been a long time.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. What do you
23 do now?

24 MS. JOHNSON: I do in-home support service
25 for veterans.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm sorry, I
2 didn't hear you.

3 MS. JOHNSON: In-home support service for
4 veterans.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have any
6 more problems with drugs now?

7 MS. JOHNSON: No.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm good.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any other questions
10 for the Board? Hearing there's no questions, I'll
11 entertain a motion.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
13 Cortez.

14 I'm going to motion that we approve
15 Ms. Antoinette Johnson her appeal for the guard card
16 based on full disclosure and time and distance.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
18 we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
21 have a second. All in favor say aye.

22 (All present Board members voted aye.)

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, motion is granted.
24 You will get your work card. The office will
25 contact you with next steps, okay?

1 MS. JOHNSON: Thank you.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck
3 to you.

4 No. 35, Lewis Evans.

5 Please confirm, sir, you've been sworn in?

6 MR. EVANS: Yes.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Mr. Swarthout --
8 Investigator Swarthout, why are we here for
9 Mr. Evans?

10 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
11 denied for a felony weapons conviction and for
12 failure to disclose arrest history.

13 February 23rd, 1995 out of California,
14 felony, willful discharge firearm in grossly
15 negligent manner. And then attempted grand theft of
16 money. The applicant was convicted to three years'
17 misdemeanor probation with formal felony
18 supervision. The applicant did get the felony
19 charge reduced by PC 17(b) out of California and was
20 granted a 1203.4 dismissal in this case.

21 The applicant was made provisional because
22 on his original application he did not disclose this
23 arrest history.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any questions
25 for Mr. Evans?

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
2 Cortez.

3 Mr. Evans, why did you fail to disclose
4 your conviction?

5 MR. EVANS: I didn't know I had to,
6 because I was -- this happened 30 years ago. And I
7 had an expungement and I thought it was removed.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you fill out the
9 application yourself?

10 MR. EVANS: Yes, I did.

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you go through
12 every page nice and slow?

13 MR. EVANS: No, I didn't.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: The reason I'm
15 asking you is, there's one page where it has a nice
16 big red stop sign. And right under that it says to
17 list all convictions, regardless of the disposition,
18 regardless of the California PC code of the
19 dismissal.

20 MR. EVANS: Right. I didn't...

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You missed that
22 whole page.

23 MR. EVANS: I was not aware of that.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You're killing me.
25 All right. No further questions. Thank

1 you.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
3 for Mr. Evans? Hearing there are no further
4 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

5 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

6 I move we deny the appeal for Mr. Evans
7 based on failure to disclose criminal history.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
9 motion. Do we have a second?

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer, second.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have motion, we a
12 second. All in favor say aye.

13 (All present Board members voted aye.)

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, unfortunately, it
15 does not pass.

16 Again, the application is very clear, and
17 it states you have to disclose all issues with law
18 enforcement. So that transparency is important.

19 You are able to apply again in a year,
20 just like the first gentleman that came up.
21 Hopefully you will come back and see us in that time
22 frame. Sorry about that, but good luck to you, sir.

23 Agenda Item No. 36, Angelica Gomez. Okay.

24 MS. GOMEZ: Good morning.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good morning. Have

1 you been sworn in? Are you under oath?

2 MS. GOMEZ: I'm not sure.

3

4

ANGELICA GOMEZ,

5

having been duly sworn

6

testified as follows:

7

MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator

9

Swarthout, why are we here for Ms. Gomez?

10

INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was

11

denied for failure to disclose.

12

November 5th, 2005 out of California,

13

dealing smuggling driver, repeat violation of USC --

14

I'm not going to finish all that long number for it,

15

transporting aliens. It was an arrest only by CBP

16

at one of their stations.

17

October 6, 2005 out of California,

18

misdemeanor, two counts of willful cruelty to a

19

child that was dismissed.

20

January 6, 2003 out of California, felony,

21

alien smuggling. Arrest only at the CBP station.

22

November 3rd, 2002 out of California,

23

felony, alien smuggling. It was an arrest only out

24

of the CBP station.

25

September 21st, 2001 out of California,

1 felony, failure -- or fraud to obtain, (a) perjury.
2 This it was a warrant arrest that applicant was
3 asked to provide court documents for this charge.

4 MS. GOMEZ: May I just say --

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Hang on one second.

6 MS. GOMEZ: Sorry.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sure.

8 Board, any questions for Ms. Gomez?

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
10 Cortez.

11 I actually have a question for
12 Investigator Swarthout. What's CSC?

13 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: It is one of our
14 licensees Contemporary Services Corporation. They
15 paid for her application. She was working for two
16 companies already on their roster when we denied the
17 card.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: When they paid for
19 the application, does that mean -- who filled it
20 out?

21 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: She would have
22 filled it out. And for them doing it, they fill it
23 out and then they give it to somebody and they type
24 it up and submit paper.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood. Thank

1 you.

2 This is Board Member Cortez.

3 Ms. Gomez, good morning. Why did you fail
4 to disclose all of your convictions?

5 MS. GOMEZ: The truth is, I never put it
6 in any application. Since I did housekeeping for a
7 whole nine years, never asked for anything. Since
8 it was, like, 18 years ago, I never put it anywhere.
9 I did not think to put it. It never crossed my
10 mind. I swear it didn't cross my mind at all.

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You filled the
12 application yourself --

13 MS. GOMEZ: I filled the application, yes.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I don't know if you
15 heard my question earlier with the gentleman that
16 just appeared before you, but there is a page where
17 it has a nice big red stop sign. And says the
18 following page, you need to list all of your
19 convictions.

20 MS. GOMEZ: The truth is, I don't remember
21 seeing that one. Since it was in California, I
22 don't remember seeing that big stop sign.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: It's online and also
24 the paper application.

25 MS. GOMEZ: I did have the paper, yes.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay.

2 MS. GOMEZ: Can I just say something?

3 Real fast?

4 The two last ones --

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Ma'am --

6 MS. GOMEZ: Those are not mine. I had
7 identity theft a while ago. Those two are not mine,
8 the last ones. The two last ones.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: That's something that
10 you're going to have to clear up with the court.

11 MS. GOMEZ: I'm trying to do that, yes.
12 I'm on that right now, trying to clear that up.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, all right.
14 Thank you.

15 Any further questions for the Board?
16 Hearing there's no questions, I'll entertain a
17 motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
19 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial based on the
20 nondisclosure of any conviction.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
22 we have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, second.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. We
25 have a second. All in favor say aye.

1 (All present Board members voted aye.)

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, the motion passes.
3 You will not be given your work card because you did
4 not disclose all of your arrest history on your
5 application.

6 You can come back and see us in a year,
7 fill out your application again, speak with the
8 office, they'll help you go through that. But
9 they'll probably ask for documentation and
10 paperwork. And as long as you disclose, you
11 shouldn't -- you know, I'm not telling you you'll
12 get through, but disclose everything, okay?

13 MS. GOMEZ: Okay. Southern California --
14 how do I do that over here?

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You can call the
16 office. They'll help you.

17 MS. GOMEZ: PILB?

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes.

19 MS. GOMEZ: Thank you.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

21 MS. GOMEZ: Thank you.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 37,
23 Robert Esquivel postponed. We will see him later.
24 Agenda Item No. 38 Anthony Hutchison.

25 Good morning, sir.

1 MR. HUTCHISON: Morning.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
3 Swarthout, why are we here for Mr. Hutchison?

4 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
5 denied for a felony conviction and for -- and
6 illegal use or possession of a dangerous weapon.

7 On December 2nd, 2021 out of Nevada,
8 misdemeanor carry, conceal weapon without a permit,
9 disorderly conduct. Guilty on both counts.

10 January 17th, 2021 out of Nevada,
11 misdemeanor carry concealed weapon without a permit.
12 Guilty, time served.

13 August 11, 2016 out of Nevada, felony,
14 attempted embezzlement. Sentenced to 12 to 32
15 months NDOC to run concurrent with the other case.

16 July 17th, 2014, out of Nevada, felony,
17 attempted burglary, sentenced to 24 to 60 months
18 NDOC and four years probation.

19 February 25th, 2013 out of Nevada, felony,
20 possess marijuana, one ounce. But it is 50 pounds
21 of marijuana. Third offense DUI, possession
22 controlled substance. That charge was dismissed.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And just to
24 make sure I understand this -- none of this was
25 disclosed?

1 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: They all were
2 disclosed.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: They were disclosed.
4 Okay, Thank you.

5 Board, are there any questions?

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
7 Cortez.

8 Mr. Hutchison.

9 MR. HUTCHISON: Yes, ma'am.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Why do we have so
11 much contact with law enforcement?

12 MR. HUTCHISON: Just have a -- bad luck
13 with law enforcement.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm sorry, one more
15 time?

16 THE WITNESS: Bad luck with law
17 enforcement. It's not like -- the time that I did
18 get caught, that was -- wasn't mine, like, so my
19 lawyer got the case -- I thought the charges was
20 dismissed. Even though I did disclose them, my case
21 was dismissed. I just --

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Are you talking
23 about the 2023 case that was dismissed?

24 MR. HUTCHISON: DUI.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: No, that would be

1 for the marijuana charge.

2 MR. HUTCHISON: Yes.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Then let's
4 discuss the 2021, both in January, and then -- wait,
5 there might be a typo in the years. No, it actually
6 could be -- yeah.

7 Officer Swarthout -- or Investigator
8 Swarthout. Nos. 1 and 2, I've got December of 2021
9 and then I've got January of 2021.

10 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: They -- on the
11 fingerprints they're listed as two separate cases.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Got it. So let's
13 discuss that. The 2021. Why is there so much law
14 enforcement contact?

15 That one you were guilty on both counts,
16 so it's not that it was a mistaken identity or
17 somebody else's fault. These, you have been found
18 guilty of both counts.

19 MR. HUTCHISON: Yes, ma'am.

20 My reason is because I wasn't taking my
21 life as serious as I should have been now because I
22 know how it can affect me, like, now, basically
23 trying to get a job. It's kind of hard for me to
24 get a job. I do have offers from Allied Universal,
25 and I do have the contact of the site supervisor if

1 you would like to contact them.

2 But I'm also a personal chef. I just
3 bought me a food truck last week. So I'm a personal
4 chef and I cater. And have two kids. So I made
5 some mistakes back when I was younger. I understand
6 that's not too far --

7 THE REPORTER: Excuse me. I understand
8 that? And then what did you say?

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You have to slow down
10 because she's taking -- she's a court reporter.

11 MR. HUTCHISON: Sorry, sorry.

12 THE WITNESS: I was just saying that I
13 made some mistakes when I was younger and I
14 understand mistakes that I've made and the choice
15 that caused me to be where I am at.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.

18 Okay. February 25th, 2023. Interaction
19 with law enforcement. Possession, 50 pounds of
20 marijuana, DUI third offense, possession of
21 Schedule 1 and 2 controlled substance. What was
22 that about?

23 MR. HUTCHISON: I didn't have 50 pounds of
24 marijuana, sir. I only had an eighth of weed, which
25 is like 3.5 grams. And I had my medical card when

1 they searched me. And I still have it on me as we
2 speak. They didn't ask for that, but my lawyer had
3 presented that when we went to court.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What happened to
5 the DUI?

6 MR. HUTCHISON: The what?

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: The DUI. Driving
8 under the influence.

9 MR. HUTCHISON: Is that from 2021?

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Third offense.
11 2023.

12 MR. HUTCHISON: That was what -- that was
13 what they tried to call it, third offense, because
14 they seen I had marijuana in the car but I was not
15 smoking. I was smoking a cigarette. A different
16 officer said he seen me spark up something but
17 didn't know what it was. So then that's when they
18 made the -- made me pull over. But I told them I
19 had an eighth in my car. And then they could have
20 searched me, they pulled me out and they tried to
21 conclude it as a third DUI because I already had two
22 DUIs prior. That's one that had said something
23 about the 50 pounds of weed when it was only an
24 eighth, and I had my medical card on me, present.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. You just

1 stated that you made -- you were younger and you
2 made some mistakes. This is nine years later and
3 you're still making mistakes, getting involved with
4 law enforcement.

5 MR. HUTCHISON: I just got a random pull
6 over and they assumed because I sparked a cigarette,
7 they assumed that I was sparking something else.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: A random pull
9 over?

10 MR. HUTCHISON: Yeah. I was driving down
11 the strip when I was smoking -- I sparked up a
12 cigarette, and then they pulled me over
13 because officer --

14 THE REPORTER: Because the officer pulled
15 me over?

16 MR. HUTCHISON: Huh?

17 THE REPORTER: You're speaking very
18 quickly and I can't keep up. You said the officer
19 pulled me over.

20 MR. HUTCHISON: Yeah, but it was two
21 different officers. One officer said that seen me
22 spark something but didn't know what it was. So
23 another officer -- he called that officer, and that
24 officer pulled me over right across the street from
25 the Venetian. I was outside for about 45 minutes to

1 an hour while they -- while I let them search my
2 car. And I told them that I had weed in my glove
3 compartment, which was only an eighth.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
5 Swarthout, how do they -- does it mention the 50
6 pounds? I mean, how did that get to the 50 pounds?

7 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: That is the
8 charge that they listed. It could be because of
9 that, or it could be they had concentrated cannabis,
10 the THC on. All it says is possession of marijuana,
11 less than 50 pounds.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Oh, less than 50
13 pounds. Okay.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
15 Cortez. To be quite honest with you, the DA denied
16 the case back in 2023, but here's my bigger concern.

17 So in 2024 you caught yourself a case.
18 And then you got yourself on probation for four
19 years. But then in 2016, you also caught an
20 attempted embezzlement charge to run concurrently
21 with the 2014. Again, that would end your probation
22 in 2018.

23 So I would like to believe that you
24 learned some kind of lesson between 2014 and 2018.
25 But then in 2021 you got two charges. Carrying

1 concealed weapon without a permit. Not once, but
2 twice. So I'm having a little hard time
3 understanding that you were young and then, you
4 know, now you learned.

5 But let me back up. There was also a 2020
6 DUI offense. My problem is, that I'm not sure
7 you're quite understanding that you need to have
8 zero contact with law enforcement before you're
9 asking for a guard card.

10 There are certain standards that you are
11 held to when you hold that guard card. And when I'm
12 looking at your record, you consistently have law
13 enforcement contact. That's a problem for me.

14 No further comment.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
16 from the Board? Hearing there are no further
17 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board member
19 Cortez.

20 I'm going to motion that we uphold the
21 denial based on time and distance. Like I
22 indicated, we have law enforcement contact as early
23 as 2021. I need to establish a little more time of
24 consistency with no law enforcement contact.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion.

1 Do we have a second?

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer, second.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion,
4 we have a second. All in favor say aye.

5 (All present Board members voted aye.)

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Unfortunately, at this
7 point you won't get your guard license. I do
8 appreciate that you disclosed everything. That's
9 what has to happen. But unfortunately, the Board
10 feels you need to have a little more time and
11 distance between your last interaction or contact
12 with law enforcement and when you're in front of the
13 Board. So you're more than welcome to come and see
14 us again in a year. Same with the first gentleman.
15 He was able to come back and get his license. So
16 please work with the office. They'll help support
17 you in any way they can for your next application.

18 MR. HUTCHISON: Thank you, so much.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck
20 to you.

21 Agenda Item No. 39, Josiah Smith.

22 Good morning. Investigator Swarthout,
23 could you tell us why we're here for Mr. Smith?

24 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
25 denied for a felony conviction.

1 We have an August 28, 2017 out of Hawaii
2 misdemeanor, promote a detrimental drug, third
3 degree prohibited acts. That case was dismissed.
4 That one was not disclosed.

5 June 20th, 2013 out of Hawaii.
6 Misdemeanor, theft, fourth degree, shoplifting.
7 Sentenced to three days. That arrest was disclosed.

8 March 7th, 2012 out of Hawaii. Felony,
9 theft, forgery of card; theft, second degree.
10 Sentence, five years confinement for both charges.
11 And they ran concurrently. That one was also
12 disclosed.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
14 questions for Mr. Smith?

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
16 Cortez.

17 Mr. Smith, why did you fail to disclose
18 the 2017 charge?

19 MR. SMITH: I honestly forgot about it.
20 I'm not going to lie. That was my fault.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you forget that
22 you had law enforcement contact.

23 MR. SMITH: Yes. I know. I just -- as he
24 read it, I remembered it. I thought I disclosed
25 everything on there. My main ones were the

1 felonies, that's why I put those down, because
2 that's -- that was my mistake.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Were you
4 successfully terminated off parole?

5 MR. SMITH: Yes, correct.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Because I do see
7 that you had a couple violations.

8 MR. SMITH: Yes, I did. I completed
9 parole June 16, 2020.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: No contact with law
11 enforcement since?

12 MR. SMITH: No.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: What are your plans
14 to do with the guard card if you're approved.

15 MR. SMITH: I would like to do security
16 with it. I have three students that run private
17 security. And I would like to do that.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
19 from the Board? Hearing there are no further
20 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.
22 Deny the appeal -- motion is to deny the
23 appeal for Josiah Smith for failure to fully
24 disclose.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do

1 we have a second?

2 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, second.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
4 have a second. All in favor say aye.

5 (All present Board members voted aye.)

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

7 So, unfortunately, because you didn't
8 disclose. We appreciate the other stuff that you
9 disclose, but you have to get it all. You're more
10 than welcome to come back and see us --

11 MR. SMITH: I'll see you in a year.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Awesome. We look
13 forward to seeing you.

14 MR. SMITH: Thank you.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. What time was
16 the second group supposed to come in, 11:30? And
17 that -- that's what number?

18 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: That's going
19 to be 40.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Let's go back to
21 Agenda Item No. 28 we trailed, Ms. Ratcliffe.

22 Good morning, ma'am.

23 MS. RATCLIFFE: Good morning.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Have you been sworn
25 in?

1 MS. RATCLIFFE: No, I have not.

2

3 KORTHARY RATCLIFFE,
4 having been duly sworn
5 testified as follows:

6

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
8 Swarthout, why are we here for Ms. Ratcliffe?

9 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
10 denied for a felony conviction.

11 May 20th, 1996 out of Minnesota, felony,
12 theft, \$500.

13 Convicted out of Minnesota, August 6th,
14 1992, felony financial charge, credit card fraud.
15 She was sentenced to six months to one year -- one
16 year, one day in prison, suspended, probation three
17 years.

18 October 20th of 1987 out of Minnesota.
19 Offering forged check. 60 days jail, suspended, two
20 years probation.

21 March 16th, 2004, gross misdemeanor out of
22 Minnesota for theft.

23 January 20th, 2004 out of Minnesota.
24 Misdemeanor false information to police. She was
25 given probation for that one.

1 November 9th, 1996 out of Minnesota.

2 Disorderly conduct, misdemeanor, convicted.

3 January 1st, 1986, out of Illinois,
4 misdemeanor possession of marijuana, two days jail.

5 December 3rd, 1985, out of Illinois,
6 misdemeanor prosecution. That charge was dismissed.

7 October 28th, 1984 out of Illinois,
8 misdemeanor shoplifting. Convicted, two days jail.

9 August 19th, 1984 out of Illinois,
10 misdemeanor retail theft, two days jail.

11 The applicant did disclose all of her
12 arrests on her application and was not made
13 provisional.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Fantastic. Board, any
15 questions for Ms. Ratcliffe?

16 Hearing there are no questions, I'll
17 entertain a motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
19 Cortez motioning to approve Ms. Ratcliffe's appeal
20 based on full disclosure of convictions.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
22 we have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer, second.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
25 have a second. All in favor say aye.

1 (All present Board members voted aye.)

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

3 You will get your work card. The office
4 will contact you with next steps, okay?

5 MS. RATCLIFFE: Okay. Thank you.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You're welcome. Good
7 luck to you.

8 So, we're now in the second half, Agenda
9 Item No. 40, Aaron Miller.

10 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Madam Chair,
11 Director Saladino, for the record.

12 This next group was told to be here at
13 11:30.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sorry. We'll go ahead
15 and take a short recess and then come back -- take
16 those guys?

17 All right, let's clear the room. Let's
18 see. Let's go around. Sir, what number are you?
19 Agenda Item No.?

20 MR. SMITH: Me?

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes.

22 MR. SMITH: 73.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, what agenda item
24 are you?

25 MS. RATCLIFFE: Not sure. 53.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: 53?

2 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: What's your name?

3 MR. QUINTANA: Henry Quintana.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: 51.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, what agenda item
6 are you?

7 MR. MILLER: Agenda, not sure, but it's
8 Ryan Seegmiller.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Ryan?

10 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Ryan Seegmiller?

11 MR. SEEGMILLER: Seegmiller.

12 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: 49.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, what agenda item
14 are you?

15 MR. WILLIAMS: I don't know what that is,
16 but my name is Dejonte Williams.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: All right. So we will
18 go in order. That means Dejonte Williams.

19 Sir, if you could come up. Sir, if you
20 will -- is there anybody in the room that has not
21 been sworn in yet?

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Have you been sworn
23 in, sir? Because I don't recall you standing up
24 last time.

25 UNIDENTIFIED AUDIENCE MEMBER: Yeah, I was

1 here in the morning. Do I need to stand every time?

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: No, not every time,
3 but I don't recall seeing you.

4 UNIDENTIFIED AUDIENCE MEMBER: I'll stand
5 again.

6
7 AUDIENCE MEMBERS,
8 having been duly sworn
9 testified as follows:

10

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.

12 So, Investigator Swarthout, why are we
13 here for Mr. Williams?

14 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
15 denied for a conviction of a felony, illegal use of
16 possession of weapon and failure to disclose arrest
17 history.

18 August 27, 2006 out of California.
19 Felony, assault with a stun gun taser. Sentenced to
20 two years' prison.

21 March 31st, 2016 out of California.
22 Misdemeanor, obstructing, et cetera, public officer.
23 That case -- that charge was dismissed.

24 December 10th, 2004 out of California.
25 Felony, force with a deadly weapon not a firearm.

1 The applicant was a minor for that one.

2 May 8th, 2003 out of California. Battery
3 on school employee, threat, criminal intent to
4 terrorize, obstruct public officer. Also a minor on
5 that one.

6 July 18th, 1997 out of California.
7 Felony, burglary. The applicant was also a minor
8 for that case.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. But just to be
10 clear, we didn't disclose any of the arrest history.

11 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: He did not
12 disclose any of it.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
14 questions for Mr. Williams?

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
16 Cortez.

17 Mr. Williams, why did we fail to disclose
18 any conviction?

19 MR. WILLIAMS: My reasoning why I didn't
20 disclose that was because I've been doing security
21 work for the last four, almost five years in
22 California. And in California, they say anything
23 longer than seven years you don't have to put --
24 check the box that you have a felony.

25 So since I already previously had a guard

1 card, private officer card, I went ahead and
2 followed suit and did the same thing here. Because
3 this is my first time moving to Las Vegas. Moving
4 with my company. So this happening just kind of
5 shockwave. I was hoping I could get my card back so
6 I can get back to work.

7 But I apologize for -- you know, I don't
8 know the laws in Nevada. I'm really sorry for it.
9 I don't want to lie to you guys about anything. But
10 I was just following what I thought was right.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Did you fill out your
12 application, sir?

13 MR. WILLIAMS: Yes, ma'am.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Because in the
15 application it does state in there there's a --

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: There's a nice, big
17 stop sign.

18 MR. WILLIAMS: I seen -- I seen the -- on
19 the paperwork. But like I said, I was going off of
20 how California is, you know.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: This is Nevada. So
22 that was a difference. That's why we put it on
23 there, the big stop sign so you make sure you read
24 this. Understand, any arrest, any convictions, any
25 anything, all right? So, it's not California. It's

1 a little bit different. So that's why we try to
2 make it as obvious as possible for you to stop and
3 make sure you read.

4 Any further questions for the Board?
5 Hearing there are no further questions, I'll
6 entertain a motion.

7 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

8 I move we uphold denial for Mr. Williams
9 based on nondisclosure of criminal history.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
11 motion, do we have a second?

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer, second.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
14 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

15 (All present Board members voted aye.)

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So unfortunately, you
17 won't get your guard card. Again, it's very clear
18 in the application. We do everything that we can to
19 make sure that everybody understands the process.

20 MR. WILLIAMS: Sorry, you guys. But, you
21 know, due to this happening -- I moved out here with
22 my company. And the job that's available to me is
23 not enough for me to make it. So I'm kind of -- I'm
24 in a hole where I might be losing everything that I
25 worked so hard for, you know. And I'm -- really

1 apologize that the application, I didn't see it on
2 there. But I really don't have really no other
3 choice. I'm pretty much losing everything. I
4 worked hard.

5 Like, I understand that I have a juvenile
6 record and, you know, a past life, but I turned it
7 around. You know, I've been walking straight path.
8 I even filed paperwork with the governor of
9 California to be pardoned so that I can go farther
10 than my career.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We understand that.
12 And we do appreciate what you're going through,
13 right? I do get that.

14 The unfortunate part is, we have to remain
15 consistent with what we do. If we do it for you,
16 then we have to do it for the next person and next
17 person and then we've kind of lost control of the
18 standard, right?

19 So my suggestion is, there's a lot of
20 opportunity out here in Las Vegas beyond security.

21 MR. WILLIAMS: I'm going to be honest with
22 you. I've been trying to get -- I just been fired
23 from two jobs because the employer felt like I
24 wasn't being good fit. But I was doing a great job.
25 And I'm not -- I'm really not steady about it, and

1 really feel like -- I'm just hurting because I'm
2 losing my life, you know. And I -- I don't have no
3 family out here.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I can appreciate that,
5 I really can. This is a tough town. Just --
6 seriously, you will make it. You've done great
7 things with what you've done so far. So keep your
8 head up and don't let this define you, okay?

9 MR. WILLIAMS: Trying.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I believe that you
11 can.

12 But definitely, there's opportunity out
13 here. Please come see us in a year and disclose
14 everything and we will, you know, be able to make a
15 different decision based off of your application
16 then, okay? Work with this team. They will help
17 you.

18 MR. WILLIAMS: I'm just going to -- I do
19 my best.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Look forward to seeing
21 you.

22 MR. WILLIAMS: Thank you.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you, sir.

24 Agenda Item No. 49, Ryan Seegmiller.

25 Good morning, sir.

1 MR. SEEGMILLER: Morning.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Diaz, can
3 you tell us why we're here for Mr. Seegmiller?

4 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: The applicant was
5 denied for a misdemeanor possession of drug not for
6 interstate commerce conviction out of Las Vegas,
7 Nevada in 2011. The applicant was sentenced to 90
8 days in jail.

9 He also has a 2020 misdemeanor for
10 possession of a controlled substance and possession
11 of dangerous weapon. This arrest was dismissed and
12 disclosed.

13 He did disclose all arrests, and later
14 submitted a written letter of appeal. He was not
15 made provisional, and is here to appeal today.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
17 questions for Mr. Seegmiller? Hearing there are no
18 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.
20 Motion to grant the appeal of Ryan
21 Seegmiller, and the reason is time and distance.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
23 Cortez.

24 I'll second the motion.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we

1 have a second. All in favor say aye.

2 (All present Board members voted aye.)

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Reason being, to --
4 along with the full disclosure -- or sorry, along
5 with the time and distance is full disclosure.

6 So congratulations. You will receive your
7 work card. The office will contact you with next
8 steps.

9 MR. SEEGMILLER: Thank you. Appreciate
10 your time.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 51,
12 Henry Quintana.

13 Good morning, sir.

14 MR. QUINTANA: Morning.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigate Diaz, why
16 are we here for Mr. Quintana?

17 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: The applicant was
18 denied for a felony possession of cocaine with
19 intent to distribute conviction out of Salt Lake
20 City, Utah in 1992. The applicant was sentenced to
21 27 months in prison.

22 He did disclose the arrest and was aware
23 he would be denied, and submitted a written letter
24 of appeal at the time of applying. He was not made
25 provisional and is here to appeal today.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any questions --
2 Board, any questions for Mr. Quintana?

3 Hearing there are no questions, I'll
4 entertain a motion.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
6 Cortez motioning to approve Mr. Quintana's appeal
7 based on time and distance and full disclosure.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
9 we have a second?

10 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
12 have a second. All in favor say aye.

13 (All present Board members voted aye.)

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So motion
15 passes.

16 You will get your guard card -- or your
17 work card. The office will contact you with next
18 steps.

19 MR. QUINTANA: Perfect, thank you.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

21 What number were you?

22 MR. SMITH: 73.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We'll go ahead. Come
24 on down, you're the next contestant.

25 So this is Agenda Item No. 73, Joshua

1 Smith. Ms. Cuevas, tell us why we're here for
2 Mr. Smith.

3 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: This is
4 Investigator Cuevas for the record.

5 Mr. Smith was denied for his disclosed
6 felony conviction from 2003 out of California for
7 possession of stolen property.

8 He also disclosed misdemeanor convictions,
9 including 2019 DUI, a 2016 disobey a court order.
10 He was not made provisional, disclosed all arrests,
11 and was aware he would be denied and is here to
12 appeal.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any questions
14 for Mr. Smith?

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: For investigator,
16 did his fingerprints come in?

17 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes, the
18 fingerprints have been received and they confirmed
19 there's nothing new.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
22 from the Board?

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
24 Cortez.

25 I do have a question. Mr. Smith, are

1 you -- what's the status of your probation?

2 MR. SMITH: I'm not on probation no more.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: When did you
4 terminate?

5 MR. SMITH: I terminated years -- 2020 --
6 for DUI?

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Yes.

8 MR. SMITH: '22? '22, I think. '22, '23.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You weren't
10 sentenced to any time, you just got off on
11 probation?

12 MR. SMITH: Yes.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
14 from the Board? Okay. Hearing there are no
15 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.
17 Make a motion to approve -- no. To grant
18 the appeal of Joshua Smith, time and distance.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
20 motion. Do we have a second?

21 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
23 have a second. All in favor say aye.

24 Opposed?

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm not opposed.

1 I'm going to say aye, but I will disclose this was a
2 tad too close for time and distance. You just got
3 off probation. But I am going to agree with the
4 motion.

5 MR. SMITH: Thank you.

6 (All present Board members voted aye.)

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, motion passes and
8 your work card will be approved. The office will
9 contact you for next steps, okay? Thank you.

10 MR. SMITH: Thank you.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Now we'll take a brief
12 recess until 11:30 when everybody else is supposed
13 to come in.

14 (Off record.)

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: It's 11:35. Want to
16 make sure everybody's back. We'll go ahead and get
17 started. We might go out a little out of order
18 here, because we don't have a whole bunch of people
19 in the audience.

20 If you were not here earlier and you did
21 not swear in, which I don't think any of you guys
22 did, if you could please stand and Counsel Harris
23 will swear you in.

24 DAG HARRIS: If you're on the agenda or
25 plan on testifying, please stand.

1 AUDIENCE MEMBERS,
2 having been duly sworn
3 testified as follows:

4
5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Probably easier just
6 for me to ask what agenda item they are.

7 DAG HARRIS: DAG Harris, for the record.
8 Given that they were given the initial
9 start time of 11:30, just to go in order and we'll
10 just trail.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.
12 Up north, do you have any -- anybody up
13 there?

14 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: We have no one in
15 the audience up north.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: All right. We'll go
17 ahead and start with Agenda Item No. 40, Aaron
18 Miller.

19 Mr. Miller, or Ms. Miller, are you in the
20 audience?

21 Agenda Item No. 41, Marshall Brown?

22 MR. BROWN: Yes, ma'am.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Please come to the
24 front.

25 Investigator Swarthout, can you tell why

1 we're here for Mr. Brown?

2 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
3 denied for a felony conviction and for failure to
4 disclose arrest history.

5 May 13th, 2012 out of California. Felony
6 conviction for petty theft with prior jail. Four
7 years prison.

8 April 19th, 2005 out of California.
9 Felony, petty theft with prior jail. Three years
10 prison.

11 August 15th, 1996 out of California.
12 Second degree burglary. Two years, eight months
13 prison, plus additional five years for parole
14 violation.

15 March 10, 1989 out of California.
16 Misdemeanor petty theft. 15 days jail, 24 months
17 probation. Those arrests were disclosed.

18 There is an additional Excel with the rest
19 of his arrests. And those other arrests, none of
20 those other ones were disclosed.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Sounds good,
22 thank you.

23 Board, any questions for Mr. Brown?

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board indulgence.

25 No questions.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Hearing there
2 are no questions, I'll entertain a motion.

3 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

4 I move we uphold the denial based on the
5 fact that Mr. Brown did not disclose many of his
6 arrests.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
8 motion. Do we have a second?

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Second. Numerous
10 arrests, nondisclosure.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
12 have a second. All in favor, say aye.

13 (All present Board members voted aye.)

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, sir, you did
15 disclose the first part of the arrests, but the
16 application states that you have to disclose -- you
17 have to tell us all of them. And so because you
18 have a whole second page here that none have been
19 disclosed, felony nor misdemeanors were disclosed.

20 So rather than go through that whole
21 history and read it out, I'm sure you're aware of
22 it. If you're not, the Board -- the licensing
23 office can help you with that because we now have
24 it.

25 But you do have to wait for one year to

1 reapply for a work card, okay? So, your application
2 has been denied. You will not get your work card.
3 You're able to reapply in one year. Work with them.
4 They have all of your information and can help you
5 fill out the application, okay?

6 MR. BROWN: Do I get to say anything?

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sure. The decision's
8 been made, but --

9 MR. BROWN: Okay, thank you.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You're welcome.
11 Agenda Item No. 42, Brigitte Bautista.
12 Did I say that right?

13 MS. BAUTISTA: It's Brigitte.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Brigitte, okay.
15 Investigator Swarthout, why are we here
16 for Ms. Bautista?

17 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
18 denied for a felony conviction and conviction of
19 illegal use or possession of a dangerous weapon and
20 failure to disclose.

21 August 25th, 2012 out of New York.
22 Misdemeanor criminal possession, weapon, fourth
23 degree, intent to use. One year probation. That
24 wasn't disclosed.

25 August 14th, 2007 out of Washington.

1 Felony, robbery, second degree. Sentenced to nine
2 months jail, 12 months community custody. That one
3 was disclosed.

4 July 2nd, 2022 out of Nevada. Misdemeanor
5 domestic battery. That charge was dismissed, but it
6 wasn't disclosed.

7 May 8th, 2018 out of Nevada. Misdemeanor
8 battery, that was one dismissed.

9 July 3rd, 2017 out of Nevada. Misdemeanor
10 battery, that one was dismissed.

11 January 24th, 2015 out of Kansas. Felony,
12 aggravated assault; felony, criminal damage to
13 property, misdemeanor. That one was dismissed.

14 December 29th, 2013 out of Kansas. Felony
15 domestic battery. Sentenced to six months' jail
16 suspended, 12 months probation.

17 June 16th, 2010, out of Washington. Gross
18 misdemeanor, assault, fourth degree. Sentenced to
19 365 days jail suspended, 24 months probation and
20 \$5,000 fine.

21 December 23rd, 2009 out of Washington.
22 Gross misdemeanor, theft, third degree. Sentenced
23 to 365 days jail, 338 days suspended, and a fine of
24 \$50.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

1 Board, any questions for Ms. Bautista?

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
3 Cortez. Brigitte, why did you fail to disclose your
4 convictions?

5 MS. BAUTISTA: I was just in a car
6 accident, and that's how I got this scar on my face.
7 They said it was going to jog my memory. So when I
8 went in, I tried to write down the most that I could
9 remember.

10 I'm rehabilitated now. I've been doing
11 what I need to do. I just want to put my past
12 behind me. I don't want that to define me. I
13 actually wrote something, but I don't know if I can
14 read what I wrote.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I don't -- I have no
16 further questions.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
18 questions?

19 Hearing there are no -- sorry. Typically,
20 we don't allow folks to read things. So at this
21 point we're going to go ahead and not do that.

22 Board, if we have no further questions,
23 I'll entertain a motion.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
25 Cortez.

1 I'm going to motion that we uphold the
2 denial based on nondisclosure of a number of
3 convictions.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
5 motion. Do we have a second?

6 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
8 have a second. All in favor say aye.

9 (All present Board members voted aye.)

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, the motion -- you
11 won't be issued your work card today. The reason is
12 the number of interactions that you had with law
13 enforcement, but also the nondisclosures.

14 So, I know you said you had an accident
15 and you have an issue with your memory. You are
16 able to come back and reapply in one year. Work
17 with the office, because now they have your arrest
18 history and they can help you through that, okay?
19 So don't be afraid to come and ask them for help,
20 because they will help support you. I've been
21 working with this group a long time. They are
22 really good about that. You can come back in one
23 year, reapply and, you know, go through this process
24 again. And then, you know, the outcome would
25 probably be different, okay?

1 But the most important thing is to make
2 sure that you report everything, okay?

3 MS. BAUTISTA: Okay. Thank you.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you.

5 MS. BAUTISTA: Thank you.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 43,
7 John Nelson.

8 Sir, were you sworn in?

9 MR. NELSON: Yes.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, thank you.

11 Investigator Swarthout, why are -- can you
12 tell us why we're here for Mr. Nelson?

13 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
14 denied for a felony conviction.

15 May 9th, 2010 out of Nevada. Felony,
16 battery with substantial bodily harm. Sentenced to
17 12 to 36 months NDOC, probation for three years.

18 The applicant disclosed this. The
19 applicant was dishonorably discharged from probation
20 on 11-16-2012.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, if I can ask,
22 because I know you guys have more experience than I
23 do, what does dishonorably discharged mean from
24 probation?

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Didn't follow the

1 rules. Pretty much it.

2 MR. NELSON: I didn't pay -- oh, sorry. I
3 can say?

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I was going to say,
5 we might -- probably going to get more information
6 out of you. So you were given -- this is Board
7 Member Cortez.

8 You were given a number of court orders.
9 What did you not fulfill?

10 MR. NELSON: Basically, I didn't -- I
11 didn't pay the restitution.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: How much was the
13 restitution?

14 MR. NELSON: Four grand, I believe. No,
15 12 grand.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you complete
17 your community service hours.

18 MR. NELSON: Yes.

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you go to any
20 classes?

21 MR. NELSON: Yes -- I didn't think I had
22 to do no classes. I just had community service.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Have you had any
24 kind of -- this is battery with substantial bodily
25 harm, not domestic.

1 MR. NELSON: This is just substantial
2 bodily harm.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So it's not
4 domestic --

5 MR. NELSON: No, ma'am --

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: It was just
7 another --

8 THE REPORTER: Excuse me. Really fast.

9 MR. NELSON: Sorry.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, it was the
11 restitution. And you said it was 1,000.

12 MR. NELSON: It was 12 grand.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Oh, 12,000.

14 MR. NELSON: I think I only got, like, a
15 grand.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You said you've only
17 paid 1,000 of it?

18 MR. NELSON: I think it was. Something
19 like that.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Are you aware if you
21 have any civil liens on you?

22 MR. NELSON: No, ma'am.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Investigator
24 Swarthout, do we have any kind of knowledge of any
25 kind of liens based off --

1 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: When I searched
2 the case, it was only the case that showed up. It
3 didn't show any liens out of the Eighth Judicial.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Basically, because he
6 couldn't afford it they discharged you.

7 MR. NELSON: Yes.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, in the adult
9 system, and I'm not sure how it works as far as
10 restitution, usually the case stays open until that
11 restitution is paid in full. Especially if this is,
12 like, a substantial bodily harm.

13 But, in that case, I would imagine the
14 victim has recourse to file a -- I would imagine a
15 civil lawsuit pending if there were any kind of
16 medical damages or not. So I'm not sure how it
17 worked out with the adult system. But I know if
18 there is outstanding restitution, that case is not
19 going to close until that restitution is paid in
20 full. But I --

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: It does show on the
22 paperwork it was discharged.

23 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yes. It does
24 show that the case was closed.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further

1 questions for Mr. Nelson?

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.

3 Mr. Nelson, what -- if you get a card,
4 what do you plan on doing with it?

5 MR. NELSON: I was just trying to work.
6 Just basically.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have any
8 prospects at this time?

9 MR. NELSON: Couple of them, security
10 jobs. Other than that, I'm just working right now.
11 Security, I work Salvation Army right here. So I
12 just want to work, that's all. And if it betters my
13 opportunity, that's really what I went for, to ask.
14 And I haven't been in trouble in a long time. Check
15 my record.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What have you been
17 doing recently?

18 MR. NELSON: Just working, taking care of
19 my children.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What kind of work?

21 MR. NELSON: Security at the Salvation
22 Army. Cook at the KFC.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
24 from the Board?

25 Has he disclosed -- you did disclose,

1 okay.

2 If there's no further questions, I'll
3 entertain a motion.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
5 Cortez. I'm going to motion that we approve
6 Mr. Nelson's appeal and grant him his work card.

7 MR. NELSON: Thank you, so much.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We're almost done.

9 So, we have a motion. Do we have a
10 second?

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer, second.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion,
13 we have a second. All in favor say aye.

14 (All present Board members voted aye.)

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, the motion passes.
16 You will get your work card. The office will work
17 with you and call you in a couple days and help you
18 get through that, okay?

19 MR. NELSON: Thank you, so much, guys.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Stay out of
21 trouble.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Good luck to you.

23 Agenda Item No. 44 Benjamin Hall. Trail.

24 Agenda Item No. 45, Guillermo Martinez.

25 MR. MARTINEZ: Here.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes. Good afternoon.

2 MR. MARTINEZ: Good afternoon, guys.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator

4 Swarthout, tell us why we're here for Mr. Martinez.

5 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
6 denied for a felony conviction and failure to
7 disclose arrest history.

8 August 15, 2006 out of California. Felony
9 for transporting illegal aliens and aiding and
10 abetting. 24 months BOP. Granted time served. Two
11 years supervised release to include four months of
12 home detention.

13 September 14th, 2023 out of California.
14 Robbery. He was arrested on a fugitive warrant out
15 here for that case.

16 December 10th, 2007 out of Nevada. It's
17 drugs. 30 hours community service.

18 The applicant was not made provisional
19 because at the time he submitted his application,
20 the other investigator had asked for court documents
21 dealing with that warrant arrest. And we had not
22 received them, to my knowledge.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: And the warrant arrest
24 is for 2023?

25 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yes, that's

1 September 14th.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any questions
3 for Mr. Martinez?

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
5 Cortez.

6 Mr. Martinez, why did you fail to disclose
7 your convictions?

8 MR. MARTINEZ: The first one is 2006. I
9 forgot about that one. But the one in 2023, I was
10 going through the case. I have proof it was
11 dismissed. I was wrongfully arrested for it.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay, hang on. Why
13 did you fail to disclose it? I'm not asking about
14 the disposition.

15 MR. MARTINEZ: I did put it -- this one.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: On here, on your
17 application?

18 MR. MARTINEZ: Oh, this one? I didn't put
19 it because my attorney had told me that I was going
20 to get dismissed and it wasn't going to be in my
21 record. So --

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This was an attorney
23 in California?

24 MR. MARTINEZ: Correct. I was --

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did your attorney

1 help you fill out the application?

2 MR. MARTINEZ: No, he didn't.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And the reason why
4 I'm asking you that is because the attorney would
5 have seen a nice big red stop sign. You need to
6 list all of your convictions, despite the
7 disposition, despite what city, what state, and if
8 it was dismissed. So I'm -- it's sad to hear that
9 your attorney counseled you incorrectly.

10 MR. MARTINEZ: Correct, correct.

11 And I have proof that it was dismissed,
12 and --

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I understand that,
14 thank you. No further questions.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Any further
16 questions from the Board?

17 If we have no further questions, I'll
18 entertain a motion.

19 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick. I
20 move we uphold the denial for Mr. Martinez based on
21 the fact that he failed to disclose his criminal
22 history.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
24 we have a second?

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member

1 Cortez. I am going to second that motion based on
2 no disclosure.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
4 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

5 (All present Board members voted aye.)

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So, you know,
7 again, as she stated, it's on the application. You
8 have to put in all of the information. Because of
9 that, you're not going to be granted your work card
10 today. You are able to come back in one year,
11 reapply, and make sure that you list all of your --

12 MR. MARTINEZ: Previous past history.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yeah. And if they ask
14 you for any paperwork, make sure you turn it in.
15 Don't bring it here to turn it in to us, you need to
16 turn it in to them before the meeting.

17 MR. MARTINEZ: Thank you.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yeah. Good luck to
19 you, sir.

20 Okay. We already did Agenda Item No. 46.
21 So, Agenda Item No. 47, Collins has been
22 postponed.

23 Agenda Item No. 48, Willingham has been
24 postponed.

25 We've done Agenda Item No. 49.

1 We're now on Agenda Item 50, Tavita Taaau.
2 Seeing they're not here, we'll trail that.
3 We already done Agenda Item No. 51.
4 Agenda Item No. 52 has been postponed.
5 Agenda Item No. 53, Chantia Reynolds.

6 Thank you. So 52 is at 12:30?

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Postponed, right?
8 52?

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So the rest of the
10 folks were told to come in at 12:30.

11 What we'll do now is go around the room.

12 Sir, you've been here the longest, I
13 think. What's your agenda item number?

14 MR. JOHNSON: 59.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: 59.

16 Sir, what's your Agenda Item?

17 MR. MARTINEZ: I'm just here for an
18 appeal.

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: What's your name,
20 sir?

21 MR. AKINS: Debonair Akins.

22 DAG HARRIS: 57.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. What's your
24 name, sir?

25 MR. MARTINEZ: Andre, 61.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: 61, okay.

2 If you have -- if you weren't here earlier
3 to be sworn in, could you please stand up and raise
4 your right hand and Counsel Harris will swear you
5 in.

6
7 AUDIENCE MEMBERS,
8 having been duly sworn
9 testified as follows:

10

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, we'll go ahead and
12 start at the beginning, Agenda Item No. 57, Debonair
13 Akins. Are you here?

14 MR. AKINS: Yes.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Please come up to the
16 podium.

17 Investigator Blackmore, hi.

18 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Hi.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Can you tell us why
20 we're here for Mr. Akins?

21 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes.

22 So, the applicant was denied for a weapons
23 conviction and failure to disclose.

24 He does have a 2023, January 30th,
25 carrying concealed weapon. 180 days suspended

1 sentence, 48 hours of community service, and to
2 complete firearms safety course. He did not
3 disclose his arrest.

4 And then he also has a January 30th as
5 well, 2023. This was actually denied, disregard for
6 safety of person or property. Applicant did not
7 disclose this arrest.

8 As well as -- top of that, same date,
9 there was a use, possession of drug paraphernalia.
10 Notice possession was listed and applicant did not
11 disclose arrest.

12 He was not made provisional and that
13 wishes to appeal.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any questions
15 for Mr. Akins?

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
17 Cortez.

18 Mr. Akins, a couple questions, but No. 1,
19 why did you fail to disclose any of your
20 convictions?

21 MR. AKINS: Well, I just kind of signed up
22 for the job, so I thought that the background report
23 would be enough to state for itself.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you go slow
25 filling out that application?

1 MR. AKINS: I filled it out. I mean,
2 yeah, I was there for, like, an hour for sure, just
3 doing paperwork.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. The reason
5 why I'm asking is because you might have missed that
6 nice big red stop sign where it asks you to list all
7 of your criminal convictions. There's one page in
8 there that literally has a big red stop sign.

9 The following page is when you're supposed
10 to list all of that. So that's why I was asking you
11 if you went nice and slow on it, because you failed
12 to list all of it.

13 Second question is, what are you doing
14 running around with a concealed weapon?

15 MR. AKINS: Well, I have a CCW. And the
16 concealed weapon that I had -- the concealed weapon
17 that I had was a nine millimeter P80 pistol. So I
18 built that from scratch. The Nevada law states that
19 you can build your own firearm. And it be fine
20 without the CCW. But I went to go take the CCW
21 anyways. And I also bought a shotgun, which is
22 where the situation came in. I had a safety
23 failure. So we exchanged words with the court, got
24 that handled.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood. Okay.

1 Thank you.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
3 from the Board? Hearing there are no further
4 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
6 Cortez. I am going to motion to uphold the denial
7 based on the nondisclosure and time and distance.
8 We've got charges of last year.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion.
10 Do we have a second?

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer, second.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
13 have a second. All in favor say aye.

14 (All present Board members voted aye.)

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes. You
16 will not get your work card at this time. You do
17 have the information, and you're able to apply in
18 one year. The office will help you if you can't
19 remember or if you just don't have all of the
20 information that you need. So definitely want the
21 office to help you with that.

22 THE REPORTER: Can I interrupt? They're
23 really loud next door.

24 (Off record.)

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, we're on Agenda

1 Item No. 58, Oscar Huerta.

2 DAG HARRIS: We're going out of order
3 since the next one comes at 12:30.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Donald Johnson.
5 Agenda Item No. 59, Donald Johnson.

6 Have you been sworn in, sir?

7 MR. JOHNSON: Yes, ma'am.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Cuevas,
9 why are we here for Mr. Johnson?

10 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: So,
11 Mr. Johnson is returning at the Board's request from
12 the December Board meeting.

13 When he was seen, he had a 1998 felony
14 conviction that showed on the results as a lifetime
15 probation. He was asked to provide court documents
16 that he is no longer on paper and it was completed.
17 He has done so, provided from the State of Michigan,
18 court documents to show that he actually was only
19 required to complete one year of probation and has
20 been discharged.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Awesome.

22 Board, any questions for Mr. Johnson?
23 Hearing there are no questions, I'll entertain a
24 motion.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez

1 motioning to approve the appeal for Mr. Johnson.

2 Thank you for doing exactly what you were
3 asked to do.

4 MR. JOHNSON: Yes, ma'am. Thank you.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
6 we have a second?

7 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, seconds.

8 THE COURT: We have a motion, we have a
9 second. All in favor say aye.

10 (All present Board members voted aye.)

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes. The
12 office will contact you with next steps, okay?

13 MR. JOHNSON: Yes, ma'am. Thank you.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, very much.

15 MR. JOHNSON: Have a good day.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You, too.

17 Agenda Item No. 61, Andre Hicks.

18 MR. HICKS: Hello.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Hello.

20 Investigator Cuevas, why are we here for
21 Mr. Hicks?

22 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Mr. Hicks was
23 denied for his listed felony conviction from 2011
24 out of California for sale of controlled substance
25 where he was sentenced to 180 days jail and three

1 years' probation.

2 He also has a 2022 misdemeanor in
3 California for grand theft. Looks like he was also
4 sentenced to three days jail.

5 A 2016 felony from Nevada which was
6 dismissed. It was an arrest warrant for another
7 state for the -- for California.

8 2004 misdemeanor from California for
9 public nuisance.

10 2003 arrest from California for possess
11 counterfeit item. He did list all arrests and was
12 not put on provisional and wishes to appeal.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
14 there any questions for Mr. Hicks?

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.
16 Good afternoon, Mr. Hicks.

17 MR. HICKS: Hello.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Can you explain
19 the grand theft in July of 2022?

20 MR. HICKS: That actually was nine, ten
21 years ago, that I actually had that case.

22 But when I went to San Diego to go see my
23 kids, the kids in San Diego, I got pulled over
24 crossing the border because I went to Tijuana. And
25 that's when I had the warrant. So that's why it

1 says 2022. And I had to do the three days, they
2 dropped the case or whatever. But since I live here
3 now, here since 2015.

4 So it was, like, 2014 or 2013 I stole from
5 my job to -- I was going through -- me and my family
6 was homeless or whatever and we were sleeping on the
7 streets, parks. I had my daughter's three kids at
8 that time.

9 And I was just really depressed and I
10 ended up stealing from the job. To move here to try
11 to, you know, do better. Been here nine years now.
12 Had two more kids now.

13 So, the reason it says 2022 is because the
14 warrant was from 2013 or something like that. So
15 when they arrested me, I told them I had been
16 negative for nine years now and dropped the case.
17 And I was able to get out in three days. I haven't
18 done nothing since I've been here.

19 Those crimes, of course, when I was in my
20 20s. I just turned 40, so trying to change my life.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: What do you do now?

22 MR. HICKS: I was working at Jay's Market
23 and Door Dash. But the job, security. My cousin,
24 he does security, and his checks be a lot better
25 than mine. So I was, like, I've done security

1 before in San Diego. So that's it.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Any further
3 questions from the Board?

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Investigator
5 Cuevas, is there a -- any kind of paperwork to back
6 up what he's saying.

7 MR. HICKS: Yeah, so --

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No, this is for
9 the investigator.

10 MR. HICKS: I was thought you was asking
11 me.

12 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: So, yes. The
13 original looks like it was 2011. And then it does
14 show in 2022. He did provide me court documents
15 from California, San Diego.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
17 Cortez.

18 Just to clarify, so the original charges
19 were back in 20- -- what year?

20 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: 2011.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Got it, thank you.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
23 for the Board? Hearing there are no further
24 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member

1 Cortez motioning to approve Mr. Hick's appeal for
2 the guard card based on full disclosure, time and
3 distance.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion.
5 Do we have a second?

6 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
8 have a second. All in favor say aye.

9 (All present Board members voted aye.)

10 MR. HICKS: Thank you, guys.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You're welcome. So it
12 will be granted. The office will contact you for
13 next steps, okay?

14 MR. HICKS: Thank you, guys, so much.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yeah, you're welcome.
16 So when was the next group told to come
17 in?

18 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: 12:30.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We'll go back and go
20 through our trailed items before we move on to the
21 next section.

22 Agenda Item No. 40, Aaron Miller. Is
23 there an Aaron Miller?

24 And then Agenda Item No. 44, Benjamin
25 Hall?

1 So, seeing that they were told to come in
2 at what time, 11:30? Do we want to wait until the
3 end of the session?

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Until 12:30.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have one other
6 Agenda Item, No. 50, Tavita Tuaau? No? So we have
7 those three agenda items. They were told to come in
8 at 11:30. We'll wait until 12:30 and then make a
9 motion after that.

10 Does anybody need a quick break or good to
11 keep going?

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Good to go. Just
13 two.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, you came in
15 first. What agenda item are you?

16 MR. LUONG: 55.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: 55. Okay.

18 And, sir, what agenda item were you? Or
19 ma'am. What's your name?

20 MR. ISON: Ison, Michael.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: 62.

22 Gentlemen, you need to stand up so you can
23 be sworn in by Counsel Harris and we'll go ahead and
24 take you guys.

25 ...

1 AUDIENCE MEMBERS,
2 having been duly sworn
3 testified as follows:

4
5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Mr. Luong, if you
6 would come up.

7 Investigator Diaz, Agenda Item No. 55.
8 Investigator Diaz, could you tell us why we're here
9 for Mr. Luong?

10 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: The applicant was
11 denied for a felony burglary conviction out of
12 Rancho Cucamonga, California in 2000. The applicant
13 was sentenced to 36 months probation and did receive
14 a California PC 1203.4 dismissal. He did disclose
15 the arrest and was aware he would be denied and
16 later submitted a written letter of appeal. He was
17 not made provisional and is here to appeal today.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.
19 Board, any questions for -- am I
20 pronouncing your name right, Luong?

21 MR. LUONG: Yes.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Any questions
23 for Mr. Luong? Hearing there are no questions, I'll
24 entertain a motion.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member

1 Cortez motioning to approve Mr. Luong's appeal for
2 the work card based on full disclosure, time and
3 distance.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
5 we have a second?

6 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
8 have a second. All in favor say aye.

9 (All present Board members voted aye.)

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So the motion
11 passes. You will get your work card. The office
12 will contact you for next steps, okay?

13 MR. LUONG: Thank you, ma'am.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck
15 to you.

16 Agenda Item No. 62, Michael Ison.

17 Investigator Cuevas, could you tell us why
18 we're here for Mr. Ison?

19 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Mr. Ison was
20 denied for his disclosed 2008 felony from California
21 for burglary, first degree; use of firearm during
22 commission of felony. He was sentenced to eight
23 years prison.

24 He also has a 2004 felony conviction from
25 California for transport controlled substance.

1 A 1996 felony conviction from California
2 for transport controlled substance again.

3 He does have another felony from 2007 out
4 of California, but that was dismissed and denied,
5 and that was for the manufacturer, possession of
6 dangerous weapon and possession of controlled
7 substance.

8 He did disclose all arrests and was not
9 made provisional and is here to appeal.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
11 questions for Mr. Ison? Hearing there's no
12 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

13 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick. I
14 move to grant the work card for Mr. Ison based on
15 full disclosure of criminal history and time and
16 distance.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
18 motion. Do we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
20 Cortez. I'll second.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
22 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

23 (All present Board members voted aye.)

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes. Good
25 luck to you.

1 MR. LUONG: Thank you.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, we have no one in
3 the audience, and the next group is supposed to come
4 in at 12:30. So we'll be on recess until 12:30.

5 (Off record.)

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: It's 12:30. We'll go
7 ahead and start working on the next session.

8 Please, if you weren't here earlier, and I
9 don't think any of you guys have been, please stand
10 up and Counsel Harris will swear you in.

11

12 AUDIENCE MEMBERS,
13 having been duly sworn
14 testified as follows:

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You guys can have a
17 seat.

18 Mr. Bezick, is there anybody up north?

19 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: We have nobody in
20 the north.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we'll start
22 with the trailed items. I think is it -- start with
23 44?

24 DAG HARRIS: There's 40, 44, and 50.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So Aaron Miller. Is

1 there an Aaron Miller? Okay. No Aaron Miller.

2 Then we have 44, Benjamin Hall? Okay.

3 And then the last one from the last
4 session is Agenda Item No. 50, Tavita Taaau.

5 Board, since they did not make the last
6 session, they were required to be here by 11:30,
7 it's now 12:30, I will entertain a motion for those
8 three items.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
10 motioning to uphold the denial for items No. 40, 44,
11 and 50 for no call, no show. They were -- as
12 stated, they were told to be here at 11:30. It is
13 now 12:32.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
15 motion. Do we have a second?

16 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
18 have a second. All in favor say aye.

19 (All present Board members voted aye.)

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, motion passes.

21 We're now into Agenda Item No. 52, Tamara
22 Johnson. That one was postponed.

23 So Agenda Item No. 53, Chantia Reynolds.
24 Trail that for now.

25 Agenda Item No. 54, Devan Cooper-Walker.

1 Good afternoon.

2 MR. COOPER-WALKER: How are you doing?

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good. How are you.

4 MR. COOPER-WALKER: I can't complain.

5 It's Wednesday.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good.

7 Investigator Diaz, could you tell us why
8 we're here for Mr. Cooper-Walker?

9 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: The applicant was
10 denied for a misdemeanor possess, slash, use
11 dangerous weapon conviction out of Las Vegas, Nevada
12 in 2022. The applicant was sentenced to a suspended
13 60 days in jail. He did disclose the arrest and
14 later submitted a written letter of appeal. He was
15 not made provisional, and is here to appeal today.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
17 questions for Mr. Walker?

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
19 Cortez.

20 Mr. Cooper-Walker, talk to me about the
21 charge, possession of use of dangerous weapon. What
22 happened?

23 MR. COOPER-WALKER: That was an incident
24 back in July of 2022, like they said, at work, at a
25 grill house in North Las Vegas. Where I shot a

1 firearm in the air. Later on that day -- because I
2 worked that night, got off that morning. So later
3 on that day, maybe roughly maybe 1:30, 2:00 in the
4 afternoon, that's when the cops came to the house,
5 revealed to me that they had footage of it. And I
6 complied with them, let them know, yeah, it was me
7 on the footage. It was me. This and that. And
8 went to jail for, I think, like, 18 hours. Like, a
9 long 18 hours. And then bailed out and did the
10 community service, did everything instructed.

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You said you fired a
12 shot in the air?

13 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Yes.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: For what?

15 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Because -- like, that
16 sounds really bad, but all I can do is be direct.
17 Like, it was 4th of July night, I was upset I had to
18 work, and things got the best, emotions got high,
19 and that's what happened that night.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Have you taken a
21 firearm training course?

22 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Since then, yes.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: No. Prior to, since
24 then?

25 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Prior to and since

1 then, yes. Absolutely.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And during that
3 course, did, at any point, an instructor tell you
4 that firing a shot in the air was reasonable or
5 allowed?

6 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Negative. No to be
7 direct.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, you were at work
9 and you were upset. Were you working with other
10 people?

11 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Oh, yeah, I wasn't the
12 only one at work that night, yeah. It was me and
13 others, yes.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So you just went out
15 into the parking lot and shot a shot in the air?

16 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Yeah. It was just one
17 of those random moments, 4th of July night, working
18 outside of a grillhouse with a bunch of people. And
19 that was that. I was held accountable for what I
20 did. And made no mentions of anything else.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Did you get fired?

22 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Saying -- what?

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Did you get fired from
24 the --

25 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Oh, absolutely.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

2 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Yeah. That was a
3 given.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Did you have a CCW?

5 MR. COOPER-WALKER: At the time, yes.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You did.

7 MR. COOPER-WALKER: I currently have one
8 now, yes. The CCW was given back, that PILB ended
9 up giving my guard card back later on once -- down
10 the road after the case closed. Like, October --
11 September, October, November. Later on that year.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So --

13 MR. COOPER-WALKER: That's why -- go
14 ahead, I'm sorry.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So you were a security
16 officer at the grillhouse?

17 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Yes.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: With -- armed security
19 officer?

20 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Yes.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got it. Okay,
22 different. Okay.

23 MR. COOPER-WALKER: My bad if there was
24 any confusion.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: No, I think that

1 probably -- so, just to be clear, you're an armed
2 security officer out on site, upset that you were
3 working, and you fired your firearm. Okay.

4 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Yes.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
6 other questions? Hearing there are no further
7 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick. I
9 move we grant the work card for Mr. Cooper-Walker
10 based on full disclosure of criminal history.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
12 we have a second?

13 If there's no second what do we do?

14 DAG HARRIS: Then the motion fails.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The motion fails.

16 So with that motion failing, I'll
17 entertain another motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.

19 Make a motion to deny Devan Cooper-Walker
20 his work card. Weapons charge only seven months
21 ago. That's my reason.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So time and
23 distance.

24 Okay. We have a motion. Do we have a
25 second?

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
2 Cortez. I'm also going to second that motion based
3 on time and distance. We have a weapons charge that
4 occurred in 2022. And I did not hear enough of a
5 justification or reasoning as to why a 30-some year
6 old with experience of a firearm, thinking it's a
7 good idea to fire a weapon -- or fire a bullet in
8 the air because it's 4th of July.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
10 have a second. All in favor say aye.

11 Aye.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Aye.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Aye.

14 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Nay.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sorry. Opposed?
16 Okay.

17 So the motion -- the second motion passes
18 to uphold the denial.

19 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Understood.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You know, you're more
21 than welcome to come and apply in a year. But,
22 yeah, they're pretty serious charges for --

23 MR. COOPER-WALKER: If I may ask a
24 question. I don't mean to interrupt you by any
25 stretch of the imagination. If my guard card and

1 CCW were given back to me later on that year, which
2 is the year 2022 and here we are in 2024, does that
3 weigh any option to the reason of this denial?

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: No.

5 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Okay, absolutely.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

7 MR. COOPER-WALKER: Got you.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Agenda Item No.
9 56, Maurice Harris.

10 MR. HARRIS: Yes.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good afternoon, sir.

12 MR. HARRIS: Hello, everyone.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Hello.

14 Investigator Diaz, could you please tell
15 us why we're here for Mr. Harris?

16 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: The applicant was
17 denied for a felony robbery conviction out of
18 Chicago, Illinois in 2002. The applicant was
19 sentenced to 18 months probation.

20 The applicant also has a driving under the
21 influence misdemeanor conviction in 2007. He was
22 sentenced to one year probation. This arrest was
23 disclosed.

24 There was also a domestic battery
25 misdemeanor conviction in 2012. Sentenced to one

1 year probation. This arrest was not disclosed.

2 He did not disclose all arrests and was
3 aware he would be denied and submitted a written
4 letter of appeal. The applicant was not made
5 provisional, and is here to appeal.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, on the criminal
7 history, the last one wasn't put on there. Was that
8 one found from the fingerprints; is that...

9 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: That is correct.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
11 questions for Mr. Harris?

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
13 Cortez.

14 Mr. Harris, could you tell us why you
15 failed to disclose the last arrest that was found in
16 the fingerprints?

17 MR. HARRIS: In 2012?

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Investigate Diaz, is
19 that the year, 2012?

20 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: Yes, it is a 2012
21 conviction.

22 MR. HARRIS: Okay. So what happened with
23 that -- okay. It's -- it might sound crazy.
24 Honestly, I was going to come home from work. And
25 then the following day I had court for child support

1 from my daughter. And my youngest son mother just
2 basically sent me to jail for domestic, just so my
3 daughter mother can make a case for my daughter
4 because she thought she should be home with her at
5 the age of 11 because she was going to start her
6 period.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Hang on, Mr. Harris.
8 I believe Investigator Diaz was trying to say
9 something?

10 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: No, ma'am. I
11 apologize.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay.

13 Mr. Harris, let me get back to my
14 question, because you're telling me what occurred.
15 But my question is, why did you fail to disclose
16 that conviction? You told us about the other two,
17 but you didn't tell us about this one.

18 MR. HARRIS: Honestly, I honestly forgot
19 about it. It was some crazy. And she came and got
20 me right out. She came and bonded me out. Came and
21 visit me the next day and everything.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Investigate Diaz,
23 could you tell me one more time, my apologies, what
24 were the charges and disposition?

25 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: Yes, ma'am. For 2012

1 or for all of them?

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: The 2012.

3 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: The fingerprint report
4 reads a domestic battery, misdemeanor conviction,
5 class A, guilty, probation of one year. And that is
6 dated January 12, 2012.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Mr. Harris, have you
8 had any law enforcement contact since?

9 MR. HARRIS: No, I don't -- haven't been
10 in any trouble or anything.

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: What do you plan to
12 do with a guard card if granted one?

13 MR. HARRIS: Honestly, I'm married with
14 five kids and a five-year old grandson. And I just
15 want a second job so I can support them better.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do you have a
17 company or agency that's willing to give you one, or
18 is there one on standby? Have you --

19 MR. HARRIS: Yes. The Walmart security.
20 I believe the lady's name is Deja. She came to me
21 and asked me would I like to work for her. She saw
22 me working at another job doing security. So I said
23 yes, and I went along through it.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood, thank
25 you.

1 MR. HARRIS: And, like, I was young, when
2 that happened, you know? Just -- I'm older now,
3 wiser. I just want to support my family.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any other questions
5 from the Board? Hearing there are no further
6 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

7 MR. HARRIS: May I say anything?

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
9 Cortez. Under normal circumstances, because you
10 have failed to disclose, I would normally deny or
11 recommend the uphold -- upheld the denial. However,
12 because there was time and distance, talking over
13 ten years ago, you failed to disclose one of -- out
14 of the three. I am going to motion to overturn the
15 denial and grant you the work card.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
17 we have a second?

18 No second, the motion fails. So we'll
19 entertain another motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick. I
21 make a motion to uphold the denial based on
22 nondisclosure of criminal history.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
24 we have a second? All in favor -- we have a motion.
25 Do we have a second? Sorry.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer, second.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
3 have a second. All in favor say aye.

4 Aye.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Aye.

6 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Aye.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Opposed?

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Nay.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, unfortunately,
10 because you didn't disclose that one we're going to
11 have to remain consistent and say that we can't move
12 forward and grant you a work card.

13 You are able to come back in one year and
14 reapply. And these folks will help you. They have
15 all of your history, and so as long as you don't get
16 in any trouble between now and then, you will be
17 able to use the same paperwork to help you fill this
18 out, okay? We hope to see you in another year,
19 okay?

20 MR. HARRIS: How do I get it disclosed?

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So --

22 MR. HARRIS: I knew that I would have done
23 it back then.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, disclosing is just
25 telling us that it happened, right? So you told us

1 about two of the items. You didn't tell us about
2 the third item.

3 MR. HARRIS: I forgot about that,
4 honestly.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I understood.

6 MR. HARRIS: And they told me about it --

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: When they ran your
8 fingerprints.

9 MR. HARRIS: I honestly forgot about that.
10 But they told me to make sure I tell you guys.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We understand that.
12 But unfortunately, we have many people come in front
13 of us that choose not to tell us or they forget
14 because it's been so long ago. And we have to
15 remain consistent, because we deny them as well.
16 You have an opportunity to come back and see us in
17 one year, and then you have all this paperwork to go
18 by to do it again, okay?

19 MR. HARRIS: So in a year I just file
20 another motion?

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You go see the office
22 and fill out another application and then you'll
23 have all -- they'll have that information to help
24 you fill out your application.

25 MR. HARRIS: All right. Thank you.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you.

2 Thank you.

3 Agenda Item No. 58, Oscar Huerta.

4 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: He's in Carson City.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Oh, he is. Okay.

6 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: And he needs to be
7 sworn in.

8 AUDIENCE MEMBER,
9 having been duly sworn
10 testified as follows:

11

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Could you tell us --
13 investigator Blackmore, could you tell us why we're
14 here?

15 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Investigator
16 Blackmore, for the record.

17 Applicant was denied due to failure to
18 disclose and illegal use or possession of a
19 dangerous weapon. In 2011 -- sorry, the reason for
20 denial is in 2016, assault with a deadly weapon. He
21 did five years' probation, 364 days in jail.
22 Applicant did not disclose arrest.

23 Concurrent with that arrest, there was
24 also an assault with intent to rape. That was later
25 dismissed.

1 And then he was -- another 2016 incident
2 in November, assault with a deadly weapon. There's
3 no disposition listed on the fingerprints.
4 Applicant did not disclose.

5 And then he has a 2011 contempt of court
6 that was later dismissed. Applicant did not
7 disclose.

8 He was made provisional, but he was not
9 added on to any company roster and he wishes to
10 appeal.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

12 Sir, can I ask now, do you have a weapon?

13 MR. HARRIS: No. I do not. 2016 it
14 was --

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: No, sir, I'm asking,
16 do you have a weapon right now?

17 MR. HARRIS: Oh, no. I do not.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

19 Board, are there any questions for
20 Mr. Huerta?

21 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

22 Mr. Huerta, why did you not disclose your
23 criminal history?

24 MR. HUERTA: I wasn't aware that for
25 Nevada we were supposed to do from the May '18 and

1 above. I was -- California, where it's ten years
2 within the 10-year period.

3 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: It clearly states on
4 the Nevada application that you have to disclose all
5 criminal history.

6 MR. HUERTA: I apologize. I did not see
7 that.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Any further
9 questions for Mr. Huerta?

10 Sir, can I ask, you're in a uniform now.
11 Are you working for a security company?

12 MR. HUERTA: Correct.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You're working for a
14 security company in Nevada?

15 MR. HUERTA: In California. In
16 California.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. In California.
18 And you just came over today for your appointment?

19 MR. HUERTA: Yes. I just got off work.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got you.

21 Any further questions? Hearing there are
22 no further questions, I'll entertain a motion.

23 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

24 I move we uphold the denial based on
25 nondisclosure of criminal history.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
2 Cortez. I'll second that motion.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
4 have a second. All in favor say aye.

5 (All present Board members voted aye.)

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, like you heard me
7 explain before to the other gentlemen, if you would
8 like to apply in a year they do have your criminal
9 history. The office will help you fill out your
10 application. But you will have to wait one year.

11 MR. HUERTA: Thank you.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

13 Agenda Item No. 60, Juan Matthews.

14 MR. MATTHEWS: Good morning. How are you
15 guys doing?

16 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Have you been sworn
17 in? He's got to be sworn in, also.

18
19 AUDIENCE MEMBER,
20 having been duly sworn
21 testified as follows:

22
23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
24 Blackmore, why are we here for Mr. Matthews?

25 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Investigator

1 Blackmore, for the record.

2 He was denied due to failure to disclose,
3 as well as habits. For his first arrest, it was
4 2016. DUI alcohol, caused bodily injury, five years
5 probation and 164 days in jail.

6 Second arrest was in 2014. There's three
7 charges. Charge one is willful cruelty to child.
8 Charge two is assault with a deadly weapon. Third
9 charge is false imprisonment.

10 For the first charge he did three years
11 probation and 60 days in jail. And charge two and
12 three just listed probation or jail.

13 2014 there was obstruction, public
14 officer. Three years probation and ten days in
15 jail.

16 In 2010 he did have another DUI, five
17 years probation and 185 days in jail.

18 As well as a 2007 DUI, three years
19 probation and 30 days in jail.

20 Applicant did not disclose his arrest.
21 There is page 2 and 3, as well as an Excel of
22 additional arrests.

23 He was made provisional, but he was not
24 added to a company roster.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any questions

1 for Mr. Matthews?

2 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

3 Again, Mr. Matthews, why did you fail to
4 disclose any of your arrests?

5 MR. MATTHEWS: Yeah, I think I can see on
6 the -- on the convictions that there's a pattern
7 there. It's all behind alcohol, if you guys haven't
8 noticed.

9 And two years ago I straightened up my
10 life with rehab. I got paperwork for that. I got
11 two cases of previous DUIs where I lost my dad. I
12 went heavy on the bottle. Almost lost everything.

13 I'm a PPO operator in California. So I
14 switched up my life. The Gaming Board gave me my
15 gaming card. I got my California guard card.

16 And the reason I did not, I was rushing
17 the application and I did see it, disclose all, but
18 you got a totally different -- California. I
19 realize that now. It was an honest mistake on my
20 part. It seems like I'm lying, something to hide.
21 I've got nothing to hide. I ain't got no guilt.

22 All that's in my past. And I'm an
23 outstanding citizen in South Lake Tahoe. Got a
24 great relationship with PD, the sheriffs, the chief
25 of police.

1 We do have the ability -- and the only
2 reason I'm trying to get my guard card for Nevada is
3 because there's another company that gets its PPO
4 out here. And we're a small company, that we
5 combined together and we do contract out there in
6 Stateline, Nevada where I can't do business at. So
7 we go under his PPO and do -- conduct business.
8 Without this and -- it's going to be tough.

9 I bought a house in Garnerville, Nevada.
10 So I was trying to get my PPO out here so I can --
11 business out here. I'm in community out there. I
12 talk to kids about alcohol addiction.

13 Obviously, my past don't look good and
14 seems like I lied to you guys. But I truly -- I
15 didn't. Those -- California, you don't even have to
16 put arrest record on there. They just go off the
17 FBI and background checks. And I'm off probation
18 on -- in Nevada I'm off probation as of February.
19 That's why I sent the appeal. I'm off probation
20 from this year. I have completion of the rehab.

21 And for California, I'm on court informal
22 probation for five years because of the recent DUI.
23 But I can get that off my record in -- hopefully
24 within two years. I paid all the fines and
25 everything.

1 That's why I'm here. And I'm trying to
2 better my life for my son. I got a nine year old.
3 And it was all behind alcohol, but I'm an
4 outstanding citizen -- community, and I would love
5 to do business in Nevada.

6 If I have to stay with my buddy in
7 California I will. You guys are way tougher than
8 California. I respect that. I learned a lot, even
9 coming to this appeal. So, thank you.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

11 Board, any further questions? Hearing
12 there are no further questions, I'll entertain a
13 motion.

14 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

15 I move that we uphold the denial based on
16 failure to disclose criminal history.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
18 motion. Do we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer, second.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
21 have a second. All in favor say aye.

22 (All present Board members voted aye.)

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

24 Sir, appreciate everything that you're
25 trying to do. But I would state to you that you

1 have all the criminal history now listed. The
2 office will help you when you fill out the
3 application again. You do have the opportunity to
4 do it in one year.

5 MR. MATTHEWS: Okay. I was told -- yeah.
6 I was told by the -- just a quick question. I was
7 told by -- I would never have appealed it if I -- it
8 cost me, like, three months now. I thought you went
9 case by case. Is there just a standard, if you
10 don't -- so that's the bottom line. I got to wait a
11 year to reapply, right?

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes, sir.

13 MR. MATTHEWS: For the PPO to get a
14 business license out here, is that the same thing,
15 or I got to be off California probation?

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You have to be off
17 probation, for sure.

18 MR. MATTHEWS: California, okay. All
19 right.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck
21 to you.

22 MR. MATTHEWS: Yeah. That was a big
23 mistake. Going to cost me a lot of money, but
24 lesson learned. Keep it moving.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 63,

1 they have withdrawn.

2 Agenda Item No. 64, Ernestine Bowdry?

3 Sir, what agenda item are you?

4 MR. DAVIS: Ma'am?

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: What's your name, sir?

6 MR. DAVIS: Is Wilbert Davis.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: 74.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Why don't you
9 come on down, sir, and we'll see.

10 Just to confirm, sir, you've been sworn
11 in?

12 MR. DAVIS: Yes, ma'am.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, thank you.

14 Investigator Manzo, could you tell us why
15 we're here for Mr. Davis?

16 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Mr. Davis was
17 denied because of undisclosed weapon conviction from
18 1992 in Nevada for carrying a concealed weapon.

19 He disclosed his older domestic battery
20 and violence arrest, but did not disclose his most
21 recent arrest from 2021 in Nevada that was for
22 domestic battery with use of deadly weapon. It was
23 dismissed.

24 And then he -- or the other arrests that
25 were disclosed were 2004 from California,

1 misdemeanor inflict corporal injury to spouse or
2 cohabitant.

3 A 2002 arrest from Nevada for domestic
4 battery.

5 And a 1996 arrest from California for --
6 THE REPORTER: For?

7 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: 1996 arrest
8 from California for inflict corporal injury to
9 spouse or cohabitant.

10 Again, he disclosed the three older
11 misdemeanor arrests, but not the 1992 misdemeanor
12 carry concealed weapon or the recent 2021 felony
13 that was dismissed.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

15 Board, any questions for Mr. Davis?
16 Sorry, senior moment.

17 Sir, why did you fail to let us know about
18 your most recent arrest?

19 MR. DAVIS: Well, my most recent arrest?

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes. In 2021.

21 MR. DAVIS: In 20- -- I -- I thought you
22 talking about with --

23 THE REPORTER: With what?

24 THE WITNESS: With my ex, Rhonda?

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: It says domestic

1 battery, use of a deadly weapon.

2 MR. DAVIS: Oh, no. That was threw out of
3 court because she had lied. I did not hit her with
4 the car. And then '92, I think, about the concealed
5 weapon? What happened, I got robbed. And I went
6 back (indiscernible) to get my money.

7 THE REPORTER: You went back where?

8 MR. DAVIS: -- Englestad. D turn into
9 Englestad, up Lake Mead. I was in that area. I was
10 young. I went back to get my money. And on the way
11 back, I see a lady I know by the name of Ms. Liddy
12 (ph). An old lady I worked with at Landmark years
13 ago. And me and her talk. And then we got talking.
14 I went to walk back to the house. Because, like,
15 forget it. It ain't worth it. And then that's when
16 I ran into the police. And I did have a concealed
17 weapon. So I surrendered the gun. And north -- I
18 talked to -- not the public defender, but the other
19 guy, the -- and me and him talk. This is my first
20 time --

21 THE REPORTER: First time?

22 MR. DAVIS: First time being in that --
23 never had a concealed weapon. That was my first
24 incident.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, so the question

1 is -- the question is, on the application it asks
2 you to tell us about all that, right?

3 MR. DAVIS: Right.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You didn't put it on
5 your application.

6 MR. DAVIS: I didn't put the '92 on the
7 application because I thought it was threw out. I
8 never heard it. I never came back up on me.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: But the application
10 says you have --

11 MR. DAVIS: About the paper, the cleaners.
12 I went -- I didn't know that that was on me at the
13 time until I talked to that lady. Then I went and I
14 found out at the same time it was a woman. So I
15 went down and turned myself in and found out what
16 was going on. That's when I knew that was on there.
17 And that's when that got threw out. I really didn't
18 know that none of that was on me.

19 And then '92, they had threw that out. In
20 court, to my knowledge, from the waving the gun. So
21 I really didn't know until I appear for this card
22 that this was even on there.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, did I understand,
24 were any of these disclosed?

25 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes. He

1 disclosed three: 2004, 2002, and 1996, which were
2 all for either, like, domestic battery related.

3 The ones that were not disclosed was the
4 oldest, which was the 1992 misdemeanor carry
5 concealed weapon. And then`the most recent one,
6 which was the 2021 battery -- domestic battery with
7 deadly weapon, which was dismissed.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Got it.

9 Any further questions from the Board?
10 Hearing there are no further questions, I'll
11 entertain a motion.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.

13 Motion to uphold the denial of Wilbert
14 Davis's card, fail to disclose.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
16 motion. Do we have a second?

17 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
19 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

20 (All present Board members voted aye.)

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, now you have the
22 paperwork that says what you've been arrested for
23 and convicted of, okay? In one year you can come
24 back and reapply. Work with the office. They'll
25 help you with that paperwork, okay?

1 MR. DAVIS: Go where?

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Go to the office, the
3 PILB office.

4 MR. DAVIS: But that's in a year.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: That's in a year. And
6 they'll help you work through this, okay?

7 MR. DAVIS: Could I ask a question?

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sure.

9 MR. DAVIS: Is that because I didn't know
10 that that was on me?

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes.

12 MR. DAVIS: Okay. Thank you.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You're welcome, thank
14 you.

15 So the others are supposed to come in at
16 1:30? So we're on recess until 1:30.

17 (Off record.)

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Everybody's ready?
19 We'll go ahead and start the next session.

20 This was the -- we'll close out the 12:30
21 session. We had trailed Agenda Item No. 53, Chantia
22 Reynolds? No? Okay. Seeing that she's not here in
23 the audience, she was scheduled to be here at
24 12:30 -- so, sorry, 53, Chantia Reynolds is not
25 here.

1 I'll entertain a motion.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
3 Cortez, motioning that we uphold the denial for
4 Chantia Reynolds, Item No. 53, for the no call, no
5 show. It is now 1:30 p.m.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
7 we have a second?

8 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
10 have a second. All in favor say eye.

11 (All present Board members voted aye.)

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

13 Now we're starting with Agenda No. 63; is
14 that correct? Or 64? 64. Ernestine Bowdry.

15 Actually, you know what? For everyone
16 that just came into the audience, could you please
17 stand and get sworn in by counsel Harris.

18

19 AUDIENCE MEMBERS,
20 having been duly sworn
21 testified as follows:

22

23 THE COURT: Was there anybody up north,
24 Mr. Bezick?

25 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Nobody up north.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.
2 Agenda Item No. 64, Ernestine Bowdry.
3 Investigate Cuevas, could you please tell
4 us why we're here for Ms. Bowdry?

5 MS. BOWDRY: Bowdry, bow.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Bowdry?

7 MS. BOWDRY: Yes, ma'am.

8 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Investigator
9 Cuevas, for the record.

10 Ms. Bowdry was denied her disclosed felony
11 conviction from 2017 out of Texas for theft greater
12 than or equal to 2,500 less than 30,000.

13 She disclosed all arrests, including
14 another felony from Texas for forgery of financial
15 instrument, also from 2017. Those did combine
16 together, and she did do concurrent sentences on
17 those.

18 She also has a 2011 arrest from Texas for
19 misdemeanor theft.

20 2011 arrest from Texas for misdemeanor
21 assault, cause bodily injury to family member.

22 Again, she did disclose all arrests, was
23 not made provisional, and wishes to appeal.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any questions
25 for Ms. Bowdry? Hearing there's no questions, I'll

1 entertain a motion.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
3 Cortez, motioning to grant Ms. Bowdry's appeal for
4 the work card based on full disclosure, time and
5 distance.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
7 motion. Do we have a second?

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer, second.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
10 have a second. All in favor say aye.

11 (All present Board members voted aye.)

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, motion passes.

13 The office will contact you with next
14 steps, okay? Congratulations. Good luck to you.

15 MS. BOWDRY: Thank you, so much.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 65,
17 Hakeem Muhammad.

18 Good afternoon -- yeah, it's afternoon.
19 Investigator Cuevas, could you tell us why we're
20 here?

21 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes.
22 Mr. Muhammad is coming back. He was originally seen
23 and denied by the Board December 15th of 2022. He
24 was denied for failure to disclose. He has
25 reapplied and has disclosed all arrests, including a

1 1986 felony conviction from California for robbery,
2 which was amended to possession of controlled
3 substance.

4 1993 felony conviction from California for
5 possess driver's license to commit forgery.

6 2004 felony from California, and that is
7 for corporal injury to spouse or cohabitant.

8 2005 California conviction for possession
9 of controlled substance, also a felony.

10 And a misdemeanor from 1987 from Hawaii
11 for assault and harassment.

12 Again he's reapplying. He disclosed all
13 arrests and wishes to appeal.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you, very
15 much.

16 Board, any questions for Mr. Muhammad?

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.

18 Good afternoon, Mr. Muhammad.

19 MR. MUHAMMAD: Good afternoon, sir.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: If you get
21 approved with a card, what do you plan on doing with
22 it.

23 MR. MUHAMMAD: I continue to work as a
24 security job for Allied. Transferred from
25 California to Nevada for Allied. And Nevada, I

1 learned have its own different, separate laws for
2 obtaining a guard card. And that's why I'm here.
3 To continue.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Where are you
5 employed now?

6 MR. MUHAMMAD: I'm employed with Golden
7 Entertainment. And they allowed me to get a gaming
8 card, which I got a lead when I was here last year
9 that I can do that. So I did do that. And now I
10 work in the vault. I'm a utility vault clerk. I
11 verify millions of dollars a day that's coming in.
12 And really appreciate that opportunity.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I hate to mention
15 this, but do I see, are you a Marine, sir?

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Semper Fi.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Give him that.

18 Are there any further questions for the
19 Board? With no questions, I'll entertain a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.
21 Make a motion to grant the appeal Hakeem
22 Muhammad, time and distance.

23 MR. MUHAMMAD: Thank you, sir.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
25 Cortez.

1 I'm also going to second the motion.
2 Thank you for doing exactly what you were asked to
3 do and disclose all of your convictions.

4 MR. MUHAMMAD: Thank you, ma'am.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Coming back and
6 doing everything is great.

7 MR. MUHAMMAD: Thank you. I appreciate
8 it.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
10 have a second. All in favor say aye.

11 (All present Board members voted aye.)

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, motion passes.
13 Congratulations. Good luck to you.

14 MR. MUHAMMAD: Thank you, Board. I
15 appreciate it.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you for your
17 service, sir.

18 MR. MUHAMMAD: Thank you.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The office will
20 contact you with next steps, sir. Don forget your
21 hat.

22 MR. MUHAMMAD: Thank you.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Called a cover.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 66,
25 Jajuan Rogers?

1 Good afternoon.

2 MR. RODGERS: Hello.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Cuevas,
4 could you tell us why we're here for Mr. Rodgers?

5 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes.

6 Mr. Rodgers was denied for his disclosed
7 weapon conviction from 2021 out of California. It
8 was a misdemeanor carry concealed weapon and possess
9 controlled substance without valid prescription. He
10 was sentenced to one year probation.

11 The applicant was previously denied by the
12 Board on September 13, 2022. He is reapplying, has
13 disclosed all arrests, and wishes to appeal.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
15 questions for Mr. Rodgers? Hearing there are no
16 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

17 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

18 I move we grant the work card for
19 Mr. Rogers based on the fact he revealed his full
20 criminal history.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
22 motion. Do we have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer, second.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
25 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

1 (All present Board members voted aye.)

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, very much,
3 for coming in and taking care of what we asked you
4 to do. Your work card will be processed, and the
5 office will contact you with next steps.

6 MR. RODGERS: All right. Thank you.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 67,
8 Matthew Weston. Trail that.

9 Agenda Item No. 68, Tiffany Scott.

10 Agenda Item No. 69, Kinyatte Thurston.

11 MR. THURSTON: Yes, ma'am.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good afternoon, sir.

13 MR. THURSTON: Good afternoon.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Cuevas,
15 could you tell us why we're here?

16 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes.

17 Mr. Thurston was denied for his felony
18 conviction that he did not disclose from 1998 out of
19 California for conspire to commit robbery; possess a
20 firearm by felon; and possess, manufacture, or sell
21 weapon. He was sentenced to 19 years in prison.

22 He also has a 1992 -- a felony from
23 California for petty theft with prior, where he was
24 sentenced to three years prison and a fine.

25 He was made provisional and was added to

1 company roster for Custom Security Guard & Patrol,
2 LLC. And he wishes to appeal.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
4 questions for Mr. Thurston?

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good afternoon,
6 Mr. Thurston.

7 MR. THURSTON: Good afternoon, sir.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Can you tell me
9 why you did not disclose your arrest record?

10 MR. THURSTON: I just moved out here about
11 2019 from California. And they have taken (sic) my
12 record -- my record was sealed a while back, so I
13 never disclose anything because I thought I was
14 straight because I was working out at Sunset Park.
15 I been working out there since I been out here. So
16 I didn't know to put it down.

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Did you fill out
18 the application yourself?

19 MR. THURSTON: Yes.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Did you see on the
21 one page where it had a big red stop sign that tells
22 you to list all arrests?

23 MR. THURSTON: No, I didn't, sir. That's
24 why I went back and got the paperwork and came back
25 in to show that I had all these convictions.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
3 for the Board?

4 What do you do now?

5 MR. THURSTON: I work for Healthcare
6 Service Group in Horizon Hospital. I work with the
7 convalescent homes. And I was -- the job, when I
8 had this job as well, they the one told me I had a
9 green dot by my name and I was wondering why.
10 Because I don't do anything no more. I really out
11 of the way for it. That's why I moved to Vegas. To
12 leave my past behind.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got you. Thank you.
14 If there's no further questions for the
15 Board, I'll entertain a motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer.
17 Make a motion to deny the appeal based on
18 fail to disclose.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
20 we have a second?

21 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
23 have a second. All in favor say aye.

24 (All present Board members voted aye.)

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

1 So, unfortunately, because you didn't
2 disclose we have to remain consistent. You know,
3 we've had quite a few people who have -- you know,
4 it's been a long time ago, it's unfortunate.
5 Because if it was just on your application it
6 probably wouldn't be an issue.

7 MR. THURSTON: But excuse me, can I say
8 one thing?

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sure.

10 MR. THURSTON: Because the guy I had -- I
11 had talked to the person that gave me the card.
12 Someone gave me a call and asked me a question. I
13 told them yes, and they was, like, okay. And they
14 had me working -- I was working the job for so
15 many -- I mean, for so many months. So I'm just
16 trying to figure out -- I said yes because I didn't
17 see -- like I said, I don't even think I wrote
18 anything down.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: It would come up on
20 your fingerprints, sir. So when they ran your
21 fingerprints, that's when they found it.

22 Is that correct?

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Here's the other
24 issue, sir. You failed to disclose your
25 convictions. And here on page 5 of the

1 application -- hang on one second. On page 5 of the
2 application, it actually -- this is the red stop
3 sign that we're talking about.

4 MR. THURSTON: I didn't --

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Right. So
6 unfortunately, you skipped page 5. And on page 6,
7 that -- that's where it goes into it. It's why we
8 tell applicants to go nice and slow. That page that
9 I just showed you, it's literally one full page of
10 it. So you can't get past it without looking at it.
11 And it lists clearly, list all charges, even if
12 dismissed, expunged, denied, whatever the case may
13 be. It's a technicality.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Just a comment,
15 sir.

16 This is Gronauer.

17 We would rather you be working and have a
18 work card. However, as we told so many times
19 previously, that if you don't follow rules and
20 disclose your arrest, we can't make an exception.

21 MR. THURSTON: This -- this --

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you.

23 MR. THURSTON: Okay. I understand. What
24 I'm -- what I'm trying to explain is this goes
25 like -- when I moved here, I didn't know -- because,

1 like, out here I'm from, it's, like, seven years
2 prior to that.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir --

4 MR. THURSTON: I didn't see that --

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, I understand. I
6 understand. And you not seeing it is, again, like
7 you not understanding the law and breaking it,
8 right? You didn't break the law, but you still have
9 to understand it when you're in a different state,
10 right? So unfortunately, at this point we can't
11 make any other decision.

12 MR. THURSTON: Yes, ma'am. I understand.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: But what I would tell
14 you, just like you saw some other people come up
15 earlier. The gentleman was a Marine. He served his
16 country proudly. He made some mistakes and he ended
17 up not being able to get his guard card the first
18 time, or his work card. He came back, you know?
19 And when you come back, make sure you work with the
20 office. They'll help you fill out your application.
21 They'll help you with your arrests if there's
22 anything, and then you can come back and see us.

23 MR. THURSTON: That's what happened. The
24 lady at the office helped me fill the application
25 out. But I didn't see that part, so she's, like, do

1 this and I did that. And that's what I did. And I
2 came and then I did everything.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, I understand.
4 But at the end of the day, your fingerprints is what
5 disclosed or let us know that you had arrests. You
6 did not. So that's the bottom line, okay?

7 Please feel free to come back and see us
8 in one year. We would -- we love to see people come
9 back.

10 MR. THURSTON: All right.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck
12 to you, sir.

13 Agenda Item No. 70, Patrick Sweeney.

14 Agenda Item No. 71, Ebony Danford.

15 Ma'am, were you here earlier when they
16 swore everybody in?

17 MS. DANFORD: No.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Was anybody else not
19 here? Does anybody else need to be sworn in?

20 Counsel Harris will swear you in.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Cuevas,
2 could you tell us why we're here for Ms. Danford?

3 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Ms. Danford
4 was denied for her listed felony conviction from
5 1993 from New Jersey for conspiracy with intent to
6 distribute. She was sentenced to one year probation
7 and community service.

8 She also has a 1995 felony from Nevada for
9 fugitive from justice which was dismissed, which was
10 in correlation to the 1993 from New Jersey.

11 She does have a misdemeanor from 2011 from
12 Nevada for possession of drug not introduced into
13 commerce, where she was sentenced to community
14 service and drug counseling.

15 She did disclose all arrests, was aware
16 she'd be denied, and is now here to appeal.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any questions
18 for Ms. Danford? Hearing there are no questions,
19 I'll entertain a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
21 Cortez.

22 I am going to motion to grant
23 Mrs. Danford's appeal based on full disclosure, time
24 and distance.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do

1 we have a second?

2 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
4 have a second. All in favor say aye.

5 (All present Board members voted aye.)

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, the motion passes.
7 You will get your work card. The office will call
8 you with next steps, okay?

9 MS. DANFORD: Thank you.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck
11 to you.

12 Agenda Item No. 72, Derrick Dishmon.

13 Trail that.

14 Agenda Item No. 74 Wilbert Davis.

15 Agenda Item No. 75, Trevas Dixon.

16 Agenda Item No. 76, Gregory Carmichael.

17 Good afternoon.

18 MR. CARMICHAEL: Good afternoon.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
20 Blackmore, could you tell us about Mr. Carmichael
21 and why we're here?

22 THE WITNESS: Yes. Investigator
23 Blackmore, for the record.

24 Applicant was denied due to having a
25 felony conviction. I have him as he didn't disclose

1 as well, so it's a 2010, it's out of New York. It's
2 contempt, first degree, violate order of protection.
3 He did five years' probation and then six month
4 protection order term for that. Applicant did not
5 disclose.

6 There was a 2014 disorderly conduct, no
7 disposition listed. Applicant did not disclose.

8 He has a 2011 criminal contempt, no
9 disposition was listed. Applicant did not disclose.

10 Also in 2011 he also had a criminal
11 contempt, first degree, five years probation.

12 As well as a 2010 stalking, trespass, or
13 aggravated harassment. This was in conjunction with
14 that 2010 arrest. It was not disclosed.

15 He was made provisional, but he was not
16 added to any roster. Applicant wishes to appeal.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
18 questions for Mr. Carmichael?

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
20 Cortez.

21 Mr. Carmichael, why did you fail to report
22 any convictions?

23 MR. CARMICHAEL: Just simply because I had
24 a guard card in California and they didn't make me
25 disclose it because of the amount of time.

1 I don't want to make it sound like I don't
2 take accountability for my actions, because I do.
3 And I missed my job and I thought that this period
4 of time would have cleared this. But unfortunately
5 it hasn't. I am working with an attorney to get it
6 disclosed.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I do want to make
8 sure that you understand that you do need to
9 disclose it. Even though you have legal counsel,
10 the application clearly states you have to disclose
11 all convictions, no matter what the disposition or
12 the status of the actual case is.

13 MR. CARMICHAEL: I understand that now.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay, all right.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
16 for Mr. Carmichael? Hearing there are no further
17 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
19 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial based on no
20 disclosure of criminal history.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
22 motion. Do we have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
25 have a second. All in favor say aye.

1 (All present Board members voted aye.)

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, the motion passes.
3 You can come back and see us in one year. The
4 office will help you with your application and your
5 information. Thank you.

6 Agenda Item No. 77, David Cox.

7 Agenda Item No. 78, Destiny Harris.

8 Sir, what's your name.

9 MR. THOMAS: Telvin Thomas.

10 DAG HARRIS: Last one.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, why don't you
12 just come on up.

13 MR. THOMAS: In all fairness, I did list
14 in my documents part of my petition, I have to say
15 as soon as got so many times, I thought I did list
16 it this time.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So Investigator
18 Swarthout, tell us why we're here for Mr. Thomas.

19 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
20 previously denied for a felony conviction before the
21 Board at the -- and it was upheld at the 12-8-2020
22 Board meeting.

23 The applicant has had all of his arrest
24 history in Nevada sealed and did provide the court
25 documents for it. The applicant's fingerprints did

1 come back positive. Nothing listed in Nevada, but
2 did list a May 29, 2021 arrest out of Arizona for
3 disorderly conduct, disorderly conduct fighting,
4 both were dismissed.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: This was out of
6 Arizona?

7 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: That is correct.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Madam Chair, may I
9 ask a question?

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any questions for the
11 Board?

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
13 Cortez.

14 How are you doing, Mr. Thomas?

15 MR. THOMAS: How's it going?

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Talk to me -- you
17 answered -- there was a question on the application
18 in which it asks about investigation, discipline,
19 denial of the Board, Board whatnot.

20 You indicated your response was false
21 imprisonment by police genocide. Can you explain
22 that to me?

23 MR. THOMAS: I don't remember that part of
24 the application.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, page -- there's

1 a question, and then -- it's actually No. 3. It
2 asks if you've ever been investigated, disciplined,
3 or denied by a Board -- by this Board or in any
4 other state. Your response was false imprisonment
5 by police genocide.

6 MR. THOMAS: Oh, they -- I got 46 (ph)
7 false imprisonment. I just be walking down the
8 street --

9 THE REPORTER: Excuse me. Can you slow
10 down, please, sir?

11 MR. THOMAS: Just get arrested and just
12 be, like, I'm right across the street from my house.
13 Just -- I'm not doing anything. Just -- that's
14 that. That was the life I was living. Just
15 literally going to jail just for walking out my
16 door. No cause. Cops just feel like they had a
17 reliable arrest and it was just really harassment.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Talk --

19 MR. THOMAS: I wasn't from this city. I
20 wasn't born in this city.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood. So talk
22 to me about the impersonation of a public officer
23 back in 2022.

24 MR. THOMAS: Well, I was at a job site and
25 I was contracted to be there. And they didn't want

1 to pay me. So they decided to call the police and
2 say I was trespassing. And say that I pulled a
3 badge on them. And I was, like, well, you guys call
4 the police for no reason. And since I don't own a
5 badge, tell them it's not a real badge. They be,
6 like, whatever. They, like, we're calling the
7 police. Get off our job site. Really weird right
8 now.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So you did pull out
10 a badge.

11 MR. THOMAS: I didn't badge them, though.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Was a badge
13 presented?

14 MR. THOMAS: I had a badge, yes.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: On your person --

16 MR. THOMAS: It was my own badge. It was
17 right after Halloween time.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That was a badge
19 that that company gave to you, or it was just a
20 badge --

21 MR. THOMAS: No, it was mine. I
22 personally bought that. I was contracting my own
23 jobs. I was trying to figure out how to do my own
24 business in my own city with my own contracts. But
25 I was working for a company. And the company just

1 went crazy on me because they didn't want to pay.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That company was in
3 what state?

4 MR. THOMAS: It was PeopleReady on Main
5 Street.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So here in Nevada.

7 MR. THOMAS: Yeah, it's a temp agency.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Here in Nevada, a
9 company gave you what appears to be a law
10 enforcement looking badge.

11 MR. THOMAS: It was mine.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: No --

13 MR. THOMAS: I ordered it off of Wish.

14 THE REPORTER: Excuse me.

15 MR. THOMAS: Yeah, because I had
16 harassment from the police. The police was
17 literally --

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Hang on, hang on.

19 MR. THOMAS: -- violate the law for no
20 reason.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You purchased your
22 own personal badge.

23 MR. THOMAS: Yes.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That's not
25 trespassing. When I -- when you pull out a badge,

1 you are now acting as if you have some kind of law
2 enforcement or security kind of status.

3 You just indicated that was your own
4 personal badge that you bought. Doesn't matter
5 where. That's where you got the charge of
6 impersonating public official.

7 MR. THOMAS: But I didn't do it, though.
8 That's what I'm telling you. They just want to make
9 it up -- they wanted to make up a story on me.
10 That's --

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Based off what you
12 just told me, and having been --

13 MR. THOMAS: I'm --

14 THE REPORTER: Excuse me.

15 MR. THOMAS: -- badge.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Hang on, sir.

17 Based off what you just told me --

18 MR. THOMAS: I can't survive.

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Would you like me to
20 finish or did you want to just continue speaking?

21 MR. THOMAS: Sorry.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Based off your
23 testimony, you gave me a visual of you did exactly
24 impersonate a public officer. You took out a badge
25 that did not belong to any kind of law enforcement

1 agency. You purchased that separately.

2 So when you pull it out to any citizen,
3 they're going to assume that you are employed with a
4 law enforcement agency. That, in fact, you were
5 not. So there is the impersonation part.

6 Are we in agreement with that part? I
7 understand you think that it was unfair. But I'm
8 just making sure that we both understand what the
9 definitions are. That make sense?

10 MR. THOMAS: No. Because I don't think
11 you understand that it was not a real situation.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay, understood.

13 MR. THOMAS: You get what I'm saying? I'm
14 not -- I'm not alleging to be a police officer or
15 anything of that nature. I was stating a principle
16 in my life at that time. And that -- it's sealed,
17 it's cleared, but I was not presenting myself -- I
18 had no gun. I had no -- a police officer has a gun
19 to defend hisself (sic). That's why I'm so scared
20 of them, because they got guns. We got --

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, real quick. This
22 isn't a court of law. We --

23 MR. THOMAS: I understand. But that -- it
24 hurt --

25 THE REPORTER: Excuse me --

1 MR. THOMAS: -- my little sister's a
2 second lieutenant and I would never try to be
3 something that would defamate (sic) her character.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, at the end of the
5 day, we're just here to determine whether or not
6 we're going to authorize getting you a work card.

7 So at this point, are there any more
8 questions for the Board? Hearing there are no
9 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
11 Cortez.

12 I am going to motion to uphold the denial
13 based off of time and distance with recent contact
14 with law enforcement. We have a 2022 and 2021 and
15 2020.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
17 motion. Do we have a second?

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer, second.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
20 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

21 (All present Board members voted aye.)

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, two things.

23 One, you need a little time and distance
24 between the contact with you and the police. I'm
25 sorry, but this not a conversation any more.

1 We are more than willing to come back and
2 reapply. But at the end of the day, for us, because
3 a security officer is someone who's upholding
4 regulations and sometimes even laws, and discipline,
5 we need to make sure that you understand what that
6 means.

7 And so at this point, I don't think any of
8 us have confidence that you do. We're not here
9 to -- you got your cases going on, that's something
10 completely different than what we're doing.

11 You have an opportunity to come back in a
12 year. The office will help you. I think they did
13 this time, to help submit your application when you
14 come before the Board again. Thank you, and good
15 luck to you.

16 MR. THOMAS: What (indiscernible) sucks.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I'm sorry?

18 MR. THOMAS: You got to know the
19 definition of police officer. It's two definitions.
20 People never look at terminologies.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Have a great day, sir.

22 MR. THOMAS: I don't need to pass the bar.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Thank you.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: There's a next group
25 coming in.

1 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: In 30
2 minutes.

3 (Off record.)

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Everybody, it's now
5 2:30, or 2:29, so we'll go ahead and get started.

6 We had a couple agenda items that we
7 trailed the last session. Those were Agenda Item
8 No. 67, Matthew Weston who is not in the audience.

9 68, Tiffany Scott, who is not in the
10 audience.

11 72, Derrick Dishmon. Again, not in the
12 audience.

13 And then 75, Trevas Dixon. Trevas Dixon,
14 again, not in the audience.

15 So at this time I'll take a motion on
16 those items.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
18 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial for said
19 agenda items based off no call, no show. It is now
20 2:30 p.m., they were advised to be here at 1:30 p.m.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
22 motion. Do we have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
25 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

1 (All present Board members voted aye.)

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

3 The next Agenda Item was Agenda Item

4 No. 77, David Cox. Are you here, sir?

5 MR. COX: Yes.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Have you been sworn

7 in?

8 MR. COX: No.

9

10 DAVID COX,
11 having been duly sworn
12 testified as follows:

13

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: This is No. 77.

15 Investigator Blackmore, could you tell us
16 why we're here for Mr. Cox?

17 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes.

18 Investigator Blackmore, for the record.

19 So Mr. Cox was denied due to failure to
20 disclose, as well as having a weapons conviction.

21 It was in 2001 out of California.

22 Possessed, sale, switchblade knife. 12 months
23 probation and two days jail.

24 He also has a 2011 misdemeanor for DUI.

25 It was three years probation and 35 days' jail.

1 And then in 2005 he had a reckless
2 negligent watercraft use. 18 months probation as
3 well as a fine was imposed. This was in conjunction
4 with a DUI, but the DUI was dismissed.

5 He has a 1996 arrest for DUI warrant.
6 That was dismissed.

7 As well as a 1994 domestic violence
8 conviction. 94 days suspended sentence, as well as
9 a \$1,000 fine.

10 Applicant was made provisional, but he was
11 never added to the roster, and he was -- wishes to
12 appeal.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
14 questions for Mr. Cox?

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
16 Cortez.

17 Mr. Cox, why did you fail to disclose your
18 convictions?

19 MR. THOMAS: What do you mean?

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: All of your criminal
21 history, they were needing -- they needed to be
22 disclosed and you failed to disclose the majority of
23 them.

24 MR. COX: I didn't know how to do it. I
25 didn't know it really needed to be done until I

1 started working for Allied.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Do you know what
3 "disclosed" means?

4 MR. COX: Not really.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, on the application
6 for your license, you needed to put down all of your
7 arrests and convictions.

8 MR. COX: Okay.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: And you didn't do
10 that.

11 MR. COX: Okay.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So that's what we're
13 talking about when we say disclosed.

14 MR. COX: Okay. I needed to provide that
15 to the DMV basically?

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: No, to the PILB.

17 MR. COX: Okay.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And you didn't
19 do that. Did you see on the application where it
20 said stop, list all your arrests, convictions? You
21 didn't see that?

22 MR. COX: I did not see that or I would
23 have filled it out.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm going to show
25 you, just so you know. In the event you do need to

1 fill it out again -- you can stay right there. But
2 there is -- did you do it online or with the paper
3 packet?

4 MR. COX: I believe I did it on -- with
5 the paper packet.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, in that paper
7 packet, you're going to see this exact page, and
8 there's a big red stop sign. And in that stop sign,
9 underneath it says that you're going to be asked
10 about your arrest history, and you needed to list
11 all of it.

12 MR. COX: Okay.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Even --

14 MR. COX: I don't have that on the record.
15 I don't know how to find it.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, the good thing
17 is, it's all here for you. So wait for our
18 decision, and then we can give you further
19 information.

20 MR. COX: Perfect. I thought that one
21 thing was -- relating to was the switchblade that I
22 had. And I don't own one, I never will, and I
23 didn't even know it was illegal. I mean, that was
24 23 years ago. So, anyways.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: It doesn't -- that's

1 part of the problem.

2 MR. COX: Got you.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: But the overall issue
4 is that you didn't write down all of the arrests
5 that you've had, the DUIs and all of it.

6 MR. COX: If I would have known to do that
7 I would have done it. And I will do it.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, Board, are there
9 any other questions? Hearing there are no other
10 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board member
12 Cortez.

13 I'm going to motion that we uphold the
14 denial based on no disclosure of your criminal
15 history.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
17 we have a second?

18 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
20 have a second. All in favor say aye.

21 (All present Board members voted aye.)

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, unfortunately, at
23 this time we can't give you your work card.

24 But, sir, you know, you have all your
25 information now. The Board -- the licensing Board

1 can give you a copy of that. You can reapply in one
2 year. After that year, you can come in and go
3 through this again. I know it seems like a long
4 time --

5 MR. COX: I mean, me and my girlfriend are
6 raising the grandkids. Financially, I need to work.
7 But -- and I worked for -- or Allied several events.
8 Even the F1 and it was awesome. But...

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: What I would tell you,
10 this is advice we gave to another gentleman. It
11 worked out well for him. Is you can go to the
12 Gaming Board and get a card with them. Make sure
13 that you take your time, go through the application.
14 But it's different from us, so you can work in a
15 casino or events with them. And then that will get
16 you through until can you get a more steady position
17 going through with this process.

18 MR. COX: I know Allied has all kinds of
19 work. I mean, I work for Manpower and Hatfield
20 (ph), but they don't have much going on.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Try to get your gaming
22 card, going that route. But make sure you take time
23 and go through the application --

24 MR. COX: Where do I go for a gaming card?
25 I've never done it, so I don't know.

1 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: For the
2 gaming card, you have to register with the Nevada
3 Gaming Control Board. I believe you just go online
4 to their website for the --

5 MR. COX: I'll write that down or I'll
6 forget it.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, very much,
8 sir. Again, we hope to see you in a year. Thank
9 you.

10 MR. COX: Can I get a copy of that?

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You have to go when
12 they're open. So tomorrow or the next day.

13 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: I can e-mail you
14 what you need to request from Nevada DPS for that.

15 MR. COX: You called that what? The
16 Gaming Board?

17 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Gaming
18 Control Board. GCB.

19 MR. COX: You all have a great day.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You, too.

21 So, I guess we're going to wait until
22 2:45, give them 10 minutes. And then if -- we're
23 waiting on Agenda Item No. 78, Destiny Harris.
24 That's all.

25 (Off record.)

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: It is now 2:45 and we
2 have one agenda item left. Agenda Item No. 78,
3 Destiny Harris.

4 There is no one in the audience down
5 south.

6 Is there anyone in the audience up north?

7 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: No one in the
8 audience up north.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So that means,
10 then, I think we have a couple of items.

11 Did we ever do the trailed items?

12 DAG HARRIS: Yes. All trailed items
13 through 78.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, then, I'll take a
15 motion for Agenda Item No. 78.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
17 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial based on no
18 call, no show, in addition to failure to disclose
19 any kind of criminal history. And that would be for
20 Item No. 78, Destiny Harris. She was told to be
21 here at 2:30, it is now 2:46 p.m.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
23 motion. Do we have a second?

24 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we

1 have a second. All in favor say aye.

2 (All present Board members voted aye.)

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we're at Agenda
4 Item No. 85, Board comment and future agenda items
5 for possible action. Do we have any Board comment?
6 Okay. Seeing there's no Board comment.

7 Public comment? We don't have any public
8 comment so that makes that kind of easy.

9 Next thing is to adjourn the meeting.
10 It's been a pleasure. Thanks for all your hard
11 work, and we'll see you next time. Thank you.


