The applicant was made provisional, 18 as the charge did not show up on the initial background. 19 20 It was found on the fingerprint report. The applicant 21 did not disclose the arrest. BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Mr. Stanley, would you 22 explain to us what the circumstances were of the arrest 23 24 and why you did not disclose? MR. STANLEY: Yes. The disclosure of the 25

1 incident that happened, it was a mistake. I went 2 through all the process, and I went down to court, and 3 they told me to plead nolo. I pleaded to the charge 4 because of what the judge had asked me to do. She told 5 me that because of it was an incident between my wife 6 and me, and she dropped all charges. It was through a 7 divisional court of Maple Heights.

And when it went through and they found that my 8 wife had dropped the charges on it because it was a 9 mistake, I went down. The state picked it up. I went 10 down to find out exactly what was going on. And I found 11 out that I had a case against me. I went there, and I 12 13 took all the circumstances and brought all information that was needed for that situation. I was working as a 14 chef and working with a security company. 15 And I disclosed all of that to them. They looked into it and 16 they found out that my wife had said these things, but 17 the court had found out that it was not true and wanted 18 the disclosure of putting on the application. It was 19 20 expunged.

I'm a new resident here in Nevada. Basically, what I did in 2003 -- I obtained a CCW license through the State of Ohio in 2014. So I've been carrying. Also, when I got to Nevada, I also received the temporary marijuana card. Because I'm working with an

investigational security firm called Bulwerks. That is 1 the employer that would be employing me if I can get a 2 work card. 3 Also, with that, also, with that situation, 4 basically, it happened. Like I said, me and my wife, we 5 separated during that time and everything. But I took 6 7 care of everything. I've never been in trouble again. Basically, what I'm asking for is to get a 8 chance to work in the state of Nevada. If there's 9 anymore questions, I can answer any questions that you 10 would like me to answer. 11 BOARD CHAIRMAN NADEAU: Thank you. 12 Are there any questions of the Board? Board 13 14 Member Flynn? BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Yes. Mr. Stanley? 15 MR. STANLEY: Yes. 16 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: Why did you not disclose 17 this on your application? I understand what you 18 explained in terms of what happened --19 20 MR. STANLEY: Okay. 21 BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: -- in terms of the charges, with your domestic situation, all that. 22 I'm more concerned about why you did not disclose this --23 24 MR. STANLEY: Okay. BOARD MEMBER FLYNN: -- knowing, because you've 25

1 got excellent recall about what happened, so you know 2 what happened to you.

An expungement is different from a dismissal under a statute such as 1203.4. If it were truly expunged, that means it's actually removed.

I do -- I'm not aware of Ohio statutes 12 13 regarding that type thing. Ohio may have statutes similar to California's 1203.4. Many states do. 14 I know 15 the California statutes does not expunge. Expunge would be to truly remove it. It is dismissed, but it does not 16 make a legal nullity. The statute, the California 17 statute actually specifically says you're not removed 18 from the obligation to report it on any applications Ι 19 20 do -- I don't know what Ohio statutes say.

21 But I would suggest that the Board be clear in 22 what language they're looking for in the documentation. 23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Just a questions here. 24 Okay. Where do you live now? 25 MR. STANLEY: I live here in North Las Vegas.

It's a problem that they're having with the application and payment 8 that is different from the problem we had with the 9 license renewals. But we should have that hammered out 10 by the end of this week. 11

And I have some beta testers, a few licensees that have been managing their rosters online, adding and deleting employees. It seem to be working fairly well. A couple of little, minor bumps there we're trying to iron out now. But should be, hopefully, operational within the next couple weeks.

So if you haven't gotten on the new website, get on there, play around with it a little bit. I think, you will find it a lot more favorable than what we had before. And I'd be happy to answer any questions.

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MS.
