            MR. INGRAM: The first announcement I'd like to
23
   make is we're still having a huge concern with
24
    fingerprint results, the delay. Right now, we were
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estimating 12 to 13 weeks on fingerprint results coming 1 2 in from the criminal repository. As of yesterday, we had some 16 weeks out, so. 3 So we're kind of at a loss. There's a few 4 individuals on the agenda today that we may or may not 5 have fingerprints for. As soon as we pick up this 6 7 morning's mail, we'll know more. But that is a huge concern. I've reached out 8 to the Director of DPS, George Togliatti, to see if 9 there's something that we can do as an agency to help 10 expedite the process. And I don't have an update, 11 again, at this time. 12 13 (There was a discussion with the Reporter regarding everyone speaking up during the meeting.) 14 So, in addition to that, our 15 MR. INGRAM: financial report, as provided to the Board, you know, if 16 you have any question on the financial report, I'd be 17 happy to answer them. I will tell you that for the 18 first time in the eight years I've been here, we're 19 20 running about just over five months of financials in our 21 reserves. By statute, all boards and commissions are supposed to run at about six months. Most are not able 22 to do that. And during the LCB audit in 2019, we were 23 running about three and a half months. So we're doing 24 pretty well on building our reserves in the statutory 2.5

1 requirements. And I feel pretty confident that that 2 will continue to build.

At this time, I'd like to ask Lori Irizarry, our Chief of Operations, to go over our statistics.

MS. IRIZARRY: Hi, good morning. I'm going to go over the statistics that are on the website. If you go to our website, click on the March 2nd Board meeting on attachments. This is what I'm going to speak about, and each of you have one here today.

the quarter in the past as well as the years past. So for last quarter, on the first page, page 1 of 3, first initially, at this past Board meeting, we had 48 people that had applied. Out of the 48, 38 of them are on the agenda today. Five were postponed, and five were withdrawn. The main reason for the postponements were they didn't meet the qualifications, or the application was incomplete. So that's why they're not before you today at the Board hearing.

Right below that, work card applications. So this past quarter there was 1,814 work cards processed from December 1st until yesterday. 187 of those are still pending. The main reason for the pending is because we're still missing information from the individual. Fingerprints, photo ID, something is

missing from their application that we can't get them a provisional work card. And right now, the investigators are approximately one week out on reviewing to make 3 people provisional. 5

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Like Kevin had spoke about, the criminal repository is taking approximately 10 to 12 weeks. So that has extended three weeks from the last time I gave you statistics. So this time, there's 1,243 people still in provisional, and that's from the 1,814. So only about 600 people in the last quarter were we able to make active, because many fingerprints are still missing. To compare this to the last quarter statistics, that was only a decrease of about 270 work cards total. So it wasn't a big number since the last quarter.

On the next page, this is a breakdown of the complaints and investigations. These are complaints and investigations that we have received or opened up from December 2020 to yesterday. The majority of them, you'll see, are in the private patrolman section, a total of 12, ranging anywhere from complaints or investigations opened up regarding professionalism, unlicensed activity, people working, individuals, without an active work card. There were no complaints or investigations opened up for polygraph, process

1 | server or CFI.

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The next category that was most investigated were work cards. We received complaints regarding people that were violating Chapter 648, so individuals working without a proper work card, not having their firearms up-to-date, things like that. There's a total of six work card investigations that we had opened up.

Out of all the investigations, right now, there's only about nine pending. So the majority of them have been closed, an audit has been started, or a citation has been issued.

The third page, this is a breakdown of the violations that were issued to license holders. So about, there has been a total of five individual licensees that received fines, for a total dollar amount of \$1,275, which \$1,100 of that has been paid. The majority of that dollar amount came from people working without their firearms qualifications up-to-date. There are two individuals, which was a total of \$1,000. That fine has been paid and has been rectified. They have either a conflict with their firearms requalifications or they were removed from their armed post.

Right below that is unlicensed activity. There were four citations issued for unlicensed activity and one cease and desist which did not accrue a dollar

    first-time offenders, which holds a dollar amount of

    $2,500. One was for a second-time offender, which was a

    $5,000 citation. And one was with a third-time
 5
    offender, which was a $10,000 citation. Which is a

    total of $20,000. Only $5,000 of that has been paid.
    The other $15,000 is either because it's pending, they

            Now, the next page talks about 2020 as a whole.
11
    So, as we know, 2020 was much different than in years
12
13
   past. But last year, there were four, I'm sorry, 344
    individuals that had applied to get a license. 279 of
14
    those were agendized and placed on the Board.

   Board was able to hear 279 of those. There were 9,966
16
   work cards that we received. There were a total of 25
17
   unlicensed activity citations issued, for a dollar
18
   amount of $81,250. That does not include cease and
19

   desist or citations which were possibly waived.

            And violations issued to licensees, the dollar
    amount there, I do apologize, is incorrect.
22
    last year's statistics. But all the stats are correct.
23
    So if you add them all up together, there were 283
24
    individual notice of violations issued to licensees, for
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a dollar amount of \$14,325. The majority of the 1 citations were issued for people not properly listed on 2 the roster, which is a \$25 amount, which is a total of 3 \$5,575. Right below that is a comparison of 2018, 2019 5 and 2020. So I just broke it down by Board hearings, 6 7 every time that someone went before you at a Board hearing. If you notice, June of 2020 is left blank 8 because we didn't have a June 2020 Board hearing. It 9 was moved to September. That's why the September number 10 is so large, of 108 in September of 2020. But if you 11 look, for 2019 to 2020, it's only an additional four 12 13 people that we took on in 2020. So it wasn't really that much of an increase. For 2020, being such a unique 14 year, that's pretty good, individuals before the Board 15 was pretty similar to the year before. 16 On the next page, which is the last page, work 17 So this is where we're going to notice the 18 biggest difference, because in 2018 we had 9,800 work 19 20 cards that had applied. 2019, 11,021. And 2020, that 21 number is very similar to 2018, which is 9,966 individuals. That is a little over 10 percent decrease. 22 2020 was a little over 10 percent decrease than 2019. 23 As you know, a lot of events didn't take place 24 2.5 last year. So EDC didn't happen. Allegiant Stadium was

Life is Beautiful, that usually happens, was 1 halted. another event that we do a lot of work cards for, in 2 September, was cancelled. 3 If you look at the graph below, I broke it down 4 by months. The two biggest months are going to be 5 April, usually ever year, we do over a thousand 6 7 work cards. Last year we did -- I'm sorry. 2019, we did almost 1,600 work cards. But in 2020, we did less 8 than 600. And in June. June also was a huge influx. 9 We realized the influx was because Allegiant Stadium was 10 still planning on doing events, so we had a lot of 11 individuals applying for Allegiant Stadium. So that's 12 13 why. We may have not had as many as April, but June it picked back up. And we're actually very similar to 14 15 If you compare month by month, between '18 and 2020, it's very similar. 16 And the last statistic here is unlicensed 17 activity between the years. In 2020, we had gone down 18 about 37 percent in fines from the year past and 19 20 44 percent decrease in citations. So in 2019, we've had 45 citations. In 2020, we've only had 25. Not as many 21 individuals working would be the reason why there's not 22 as much activity going on. But we're still having 23 increase in -- I'm sorry. We're still having unlicensed 24 activity, so we're still issuing the fines and retaining 2.5

the citations. It's just a decrease in 2019. 1 Most of our stats, I was noticing, are very similar to 2018, a 2 more average year of what we normally do. 3 That's all I have. Thank vou. 4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any 5 questions? 6 7 Okay. This section, we will move into --Director Ingram, do you need to do roll call for the 8 attendees? 9 MR. I was promoted to training officer after 18 4 months at the station. And that's where I finished my 5 career. 6 7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I have the dates as June 1st, '82 to March 16th, '94. That's 12 years, 8 almost 12 years. Why did you leave the LAPD, Sheriff's 9 Office? 10 MR. COZART: I was accused of a crime while I 11 was a sworn deputy sheriff, as I was a training officer. 12 13 And I would like to tell the Board members, that was about 26 years ago. And as I sit here today, I've never 14 15 actually been questioned about that. I was never given the opportunity. I fought as hard as I could for three 16 and a half years, with a public defender. And after 17 that time, having another trainee deputy sheriff saying 18 that I did something wrong was pretty hard to argue 19 20 against. But after three and a half years, I was pretty 21 spent emotionally, physically and financially. And I was offered a probationary sentence. 22 during that climate at the time, I don't know how old 23 you gentlemen are, and ladies, but it was post Rodney 24 King and the riots, and the climate for police officers 2.5

wasn't that good. One of the decisions I have to live 1 with daily, even after 26 years, is accepting that 2 no-contest plea and the probationary sentence and losing 3 the best job I ever had. 4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Board Member 5 Gronauer again. I have some difficulties with it, 6 7 because I was a police officer at the same time period you're talking about. And it was tough times. I get 8 that. I just have some difficulties with short-term. 9 And, also, they give you the opportunity to resign, 10 then? 11 MR. COZART: They didn't, I don't know if they 12 gave me the opportunity, sir. That's just what I chose 13 to do. 14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Part of taking 15 the plea agreement on this here, all right, what I'm 16 getting at, usually in policing, especially in them 17 days, it was either we could fire you or you can resign. 18 And I was just trying to get to where were you in that, 19 20 or that wasn't part of it? 21 MR. COZART: That wasn't part of it, sir. just decided one day to go do that. I felt like I was 22 in a no-win situation no matter how I felt about the 23 24 charges against me. And after that long period of time, I was just going to, trying to close the door, myself 2.5

personally. And that's why I chose. No one ever came 1 2 to me and said, "We're going to fire you." I'm sure they would have, though, sir. I'm not, I'm not trying 3 to imply anything. But at that time, I decided, well, 4 I'm just going to, I'm just going to resign, and I'm 5 going to move on, there's nothing I can do. 6 7 I've never, since that -- you probably have more questions, and that's fine. But since that date, I 8 mean it takes a very, very good person to become a 9 deputy sheriff. I am a very good person. I've never 10 been in any other trouble. But once, there's nothing 11 worse than having your credibility questioned. It's 12 13 very, very hard to regain your integrity. And that's what I've been trying to do over the last 30 years. 14 And my last statement, I quess, in response to 15 that would be the same thing I told the Department of 16 Homeland Security and California licensing board, BSIS, 17 that if I am given a chance, I will never let you down. 18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. Thank you 19 20 for that. This is still Board Member Gronauer. If you 21 are granted on this appeal, what do you plan on doing with it in Nevada? 22 MR. COZART: The only thing I'm going to be 23 doing, sir, is traveling in and out of the state with 24 2.5 clients, personally. So I will be -- usually, we call

it a security driver. Obviously, I'm unarmed. But I've 1 been doing this for a long time with the same company. 2 They've moved me all the way up to the very top, and 3 they put me in charge of CEOs across the nation, foreign 4 dignitaries of small children. I'm trusted with 5 everybody. And that's what I will do. I just don't 6 7 want to do anything against the rules. That's why I got my work card. At that 6 time, he surrendered, got to his knees, and held his 7 hands above his head, where they confiscated the 8 9 millimeter. 9 During the arrest, they stated, Evans is not a 10 convicted felon but has multiple prior felony charges 11 out of Chicago for possession of cocaine, dangerous 12 13 drugs, assault, as well as multiple domestic batteries. At that time, he was arrested and taken down to be 14 15 booked. And then you have your report. I do have his 16 fingerprint report on his other arrests that did come 17 18 up. ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Can I ask a 19 20 question? Were those other arrests -- so Board Member 2.1 Nixon. Were those other arrests brought up in his initial application for a work card? 22 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. No, they were 23 When his fingerprints came back -- Chief Irizarry. 24 To answer your question, Ms. Nixon, the arrest out of 2.5

Chicago, as well as other offenses in Las Vegas, were 1 2 not listed on his application. ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So, I quess, my 3 question is he had his work card originally, and that 4 didn't come up on the original application or 5 fingerprint run? 6 7 MS. IRIZARRY: That's incorrect. They did come up on his prior. The police report says he was not a 8 convicted felon out of Chicago. He was never convicted 9 of his charges in Chicago. To elaborate, in 1996 and 10 1997, in Chicago, the charge was originally a felony, 11 mob action, use of force, which was dismissed, 12 1.3 possessing 15 or more grams, which was reduced to a misdemeanor offense. In 2001, Chicago, domestic 14 15 battery, the disposition was unknown. Those were the original charges out of Chicago. 16 In 2004, he had a DUI in Las Vegas, guilty, 17 misdemeanor. 2008, DUI, quilty at trial, misdemeanor, 18 he had to pay a fine, out of Las Vegas. 19 20 All those charges were documented on his first 21 work card, but none of them were felonies. So he was 22 able to get the work card. ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So, then --23 okay. Are there any other questions? 24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Board Member 25

Gronauer. Mr. Evans, when did you get released from 1 2 CCDC? MR. EVANS: I was released on June the 22nd, 3 2018. 4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What have you been 5 doing since then? 6 MR.
