ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Good morning, and welcome to the Private Investigators Licensing Board. I'd like to call the meeting to order.

Kevin, or Director Ingram, would you please conduct roll call.

MR. INGRAM: Yes, thank you. So Board Member Tammy Nixon, Acting Chair?

ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Here.

MR. INGRAM: Board Member Rick Brown?

BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Here.

MR. INGRAM: Board Member Katherine Cortez?

BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Here.

MR. INGRAM: Board Member Robert Gronauer?

BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Here.

MR. INGRAM: Okay. Additionally, we have with us this morning our legal counsel, Mr. Michael Detmer; Board staff: Lori Irizarry, Chief of Operations; Vincent Saladino, Supervisory Investigator; Shelly Lancaster, Investigator and Licensing Specialist; Zach Swarthout, Investigator and Auditor. And in the northern office we have Investigator Jordan Jones and our Financial Specialist, Mary Klemme. Today with us as our court reporter is Shannon Taylor.

1 If there's someone typing right now, could you
2 please place your microphone on mute. Thank you.

3 We do have a quorum.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

5 So we'll go ahead and open to public comment.
6 This is the section, this is the time of the meeting
7 that if we have any public comments. Members of the
8 general public may comment on matters appearing on the
9 agenda and may bring up matters not appearing on the
10 agenda to the attention of the Board. The Board may
11 discuss the matters not appearing on the agenda but may
12 not act on the matters at this meeting. If the Board
13 desires, the matters may be placed into the future
14 agenda for action.

15 At this time, are there any public comments
16 from the south?

17 Okay. Any public comments from the north?

18 Okay. So, I guess, there's no public comments
19 at this time.

20 Director Ingram, would you please, would you
21 and your team members please go over announcements and
22 reports.

23 MR. INGRAM: The first announcement I'd like to
24 make is we're still having a huge concern with
25 fingerprint results, the delay. Right now, we were

1 estimating 12 to 13 weeks on fingerprint results coming
2 in from the criminal repository. As of yesterday, we
3 had some 16 weeks out, so.

4 So we're kind of at a loss. There's a few
5 individuals on the agenda today that we may or may not
6 have fingerprints for. As soon as we pick up this
7 morning's mail, we'll know more.

8 But that is a huge concern. I've reached out
9 to the Director of DPS, George Togliatti, to see if
10 there's something that we can do as an agency to help
11 expedite the process. And I don't have an update,
12 again, at this time.

13 (There was a discussion with the Reporter
14 regarding everyone speaking up during the meeting.)

15 MR. INGRAM: So, in addition to that, our
16 financial report, as provided to the Board, you know, if
17 you have any question on the financial report, I'd be
18 happy to answer them. I will tell you that for the
19 first time in the eight years I've been here, we're
20 running about just over five months of financials in our
21 reserves. By statute, all boards and commissions are
22 supposed to run at about six months. Most are not able
23 to do that. And during the LCB audit in 2019, we were
24 running about three and a half months. So we're doing
25 pretty well on building our reserves in the statutory

1 requirements. And I feel pretty confident that that
2 will continue to build.

3 At this time, I'd like to ask Lori Irizarry,
4 our Chief of Operations, to go over our statistics.

5 MS. IRIZARRY: Hi, good morning. I'm going to
6 go over the statistics that are on the website. If you
7 go to our website, click on the March 2nd Board meeting
8 on attachments. This is what I'm going to speak about,
9 and each of you have one here today.

10 So the March Board meeting is where I compare
11 the quarter in the past as well as the years past. So
12 for last quarter, on the first page, page 1 of 3, first
13 initially, at this past Board meeting, we had 48 people
14 that had applied. Out of the 48, 38 of them are on the
15 agenda today. Five were postponed, and five were
16 withdrawn. The main reason for the postponements were
17 they didn't meet the qualifications, or the application
18 was incomplete. So that's why they're not before you
19 today at the Board hearing.

20 Right below that, work card applications. So
21 this past quarter there was 1,814 work cards processed
22 from December 1st until yesterday. 187 of those are
23 still pending. The main reason for the pending is
24 because we're still missing information from the
25 individual. Fingerprints, photo ID, something is

1 missing from their application that we can't get them a
2 provisional work card. And right now, the investigators
3 are approximately one week out on reviewing to make
4 people provisional.

5 Like Kevin had spoke about, the criminal
6 repository is taking approximately 10 to 12 weeks. So
7 that has extended three weeks from the last time I gave
8 you statistics. So this time, there's 1,243 people
9 still in provisional, and that's from the 1,814. So
10 only about 600 people in the last quarter were we able
11 to make active, because many fingerprints are still
12 missing. To compare this to the last quarter
13 statistics, that was only a decrease of about 270 work
14 cards total. So it wasn't a big number since the last
15 quarter.

16 On the next page, this is a breakdown of the
17 complaints and investigations. These are complaints and
18 investigations that we have received or opened up from
19 December 2020 to yesterday. The majority of them,
20 you'll see, are in the private patrolman section, a
21 total of 12, ranging anywhere from complaints or
22 investigations opened up regarding professionalism,
23 unlicensed activity, people working, individuals,
24 without an active work card. There were no complaints
25 or investigations opened up for polygraph, process

1 server or CFI.

2 The next category that was most investigated
3 were work cards. We received complaints regarding
4 people that were violating Chapter 648, so individuals
5 working without a proper work card, not having their
6 firearms up-to-date, things like that. There's a total
7 of six work card investigations that we had opened up.

8 Out of all the investigations, right now,
9 there's only about nine pending. So the majority of
10 them have been closed, an audit has been started, or a
11 citation has been issued.

12 The third page, this is a breakdown of the
13 violations that were issued to license holders. So
14 about, there has been a total of five individual
15 licensees that received fines, for a total dollar amount
16 of \$1,275, which \$1,100 of that has been paid. The
17 majority of that dollar amount came from people working
18 without their firearms qualifications up-to-date. There
19 are two individuals, which was a total of \$1,000. That
20 fine has been paid and has been rectified. They have
21 either a conflict with their firearms requalifications
22 or they were removed from their armed post.

23 Right below that is unlicensed activity. There
24 were four citations issued for unlicensed activity and
25 one cease and desist which did not accrue a dollar

1 amount. All four citations were issued to a private
2 patrolman company or companies. Two of them were for
3 first-time offenders, which holds a dollar amount of
4 \$2,500. One was for a second-time offender, which was a
5 \$5,000 citation. And one was with a third-time
6 offender, which was a \$10,000 citation. Which is a
7 total of \$20,000. Only \$5,000 of that has been paid.
8 The other \$15,000 is either because it's pending, they
9 still have 30 days to appeal the decision or it will be
10 an appealed citation.

11 Now, the next page talks about 2020 as a whole.
12 So, as we know, 2020 was much different than in years
13 past. But last year, there were four, I'm sorry, 344
14 individuals that had applied to get a license. 279 of
15 those were agendized and placed on the Board. So the
16 Board was able to hear 279 of those. There were 9,966
17 work cards that we received. There were a total of 25
18 unlicensed activity citations issued, for a dollar
19 amount of \$81,250. That does not include cease and
20 desist or citations which were possibly waived.

21 And violations issued to licensees, the dollar
22 amount there, I do apologize, is incorrect. That was
23 last year's statistics. But all the stats are correct.
24 So if you add them all up together, there were 283
25 individual notice of violations issued to licensees, for

1 a dollar amount of \$14,325. The majority of the
2 citations were issued for people not properly listed on
3 the roster, which is a \$25 amount, which is a total of
4 \$5,575.

5 Right below that is a comparison of 2018, 2019
6 and 2020. So I just broke it down by Board hearings,
7 every time that someone went before you at a Board
8 hearing. If you notice, June of 2020 is left blank
9 because we didn't have a June 2020 Board hearing. It
10 was moved to September. That's why the September number
11 is so large, of 108 in September of 2020. But if you
12 look, for 2019 to 2020, it's only an additional four
13 people that we took on in 2020. So it wasn't really
14 that much of an increase. For 2020, being such a unique
15 year, that's pretty good, individuals before the Board
16 was pretty similar to the year before.

17 On the next page, which is the last page, work
18 cards. So this is where we're going to notice the
19 biggest difference, because in 2018 we had 9,800 work
20 cards that had applied. 2019, 11,021. And 2020, that
21 number is very similar to 2018, which is 9,966
22 individuals. That is a little over 10 percent decrease.
23 2020 was a little over 10 percent decrease than 2019.

24 As you know, a lot of events didn't take place
25 last year. So EDC didn't happen. Allegiant Stadium was

1 halted. Life is Beautiful, that usually happens, was
2 another event that we do a lot of work cards for, in
3 September, was cancelled.

4 If you look at the graph below, I broke it down
5 by months. The two biggest months are going to be
6 April. April, usually ever year, we do over a thousand
7 work cards. Last year we did -- I'm sorry. 2019, we
8 did almost 1,600 work cards. But in 2020, we did less
9 than 600. And in June. June also was a huge influx.
10 We realized the influx was because Allegiant Stadium was
11 still planning on doing events, so we had a lot of
12 individuals applying for Allegiant Stadium. So that's
13 why. We may have not had as many as April, but June it
14 picked back up. And we're actually very similar to
15 2018. If you compare month by month, between '18 and
16 2020, it's very similar.

17 And the last statistic here is unlicensed
18 activity between the years. In 2020, we had gone down
19 about 37 percent in fines from the year past and
20 44 percent decrease in citations. So in 2019, we've had
21 45 citations. In 2020, we've only had 25. Not as many
22 individuals working would be the reason why there's not
23 as much activity going on. But we're still having
24 increase in -- I'm sorry. We're still having unlicensed
25 activity, so we're still issuing the fines and retaining

1 the citations. It's just a decrease in 2019. Most of
2 our stats, I was noticing, are very similar to 2018, a
3 more average year of what we normally do.

4 That's all I have. Thank you.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any
6 questions?

7 Okay. This section, we will move into --
8 Director Ingram, do you need to do roll call for the
9 attendees?

10 MR. INGRAM: Item number 4, we need to approve
11 the transcription first.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Oh, I'm sorry.
13 Okay. So item number 4, we need to approve the
14 transcripts for the last meeting.

15 So, Board, are there any questions or concerns
16 for the actual transcripts? That would be for the
17 December 8th, 2020.

18 MR. INGRAM: Madam Chair.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

20 MR. INGRAM: Kevin Ingram, for the record. We
21 did find an error on page 2, which was just the
22 individuals that were in attendance. I spoke with
23 Shannon Taylor, and she's already corrected that to show
24 that Shelly Lancaster was, in fact, present for that
25 meeting, and that Paul Maxwell was, in fact, absent.

1 And that correction has been made. Thank you.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: With that being
3 said, I'll move for a motion.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
5 Cortez. I'd motion to approve with the amendment.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion.
7 Do we have a second?

8 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown.
9 Second.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: All in favor?
11 (Board members said "aye.")

12 MR. INGRAM: Item 5. Anyone that's currently
13 on the call, I'm going to ask that at this time you be
14 sworn in. I do want to remind everybody, now that we're
15 15 minutes into the meeting, those of you that are on
16 the call, please leave your phones on mute until called
17 upon. And try to speak slowly and clearly so that our
18 court reporter can pick up your testimony when you're
19 speaking to the Board. Once you're done speaking, I
20 would ask that you mute your phones again. And at the
21 first time that you speak, if you will speak your full
22 name, and then, when replying again, just state your
23 last name, so we can get that clear on the transcript.

24 Mr. Detmer, would you like to swear everyone in
25 for us, please.

1 MR. DETMER: It would be my pleasure. Mike
2 Detmer, for the record.

3 For any and all those who are going to testify,
4 if you could please raise your right hand. Do you
5 hereby swear or affirm to tell the truth, the whole
6 truth, and nothing but the truth?

7 (Applicants and witnesses present were
8 sworn/affirmed.)

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So a matter of
10 housekeeping, while your phones are muted, when you are
11 called, could you please announce your name and then
12 note that you understand that you're under oath. Thank
13 you.

14 Okay. So I would like to call, or entertain a
15 motion for a block vote.

16 MR. INGRAM: Madam Chair.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Yes.

18 MR. INGRAM: If I could, could I go ahead and
19 take roll call of the individuals that should be on the
20 call with us?

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: M-hm (affirmative).

22 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

23 Kevin Ingram, for the record. As I call your
24 name, just go ahead and respond that you're present.
25 And then, again, why don't you go ahead and let us know

1 that you understand you are under oath.

2 Humberto Bobadillo-Tellez?

3 MR. BOBADILLO: Yes, this is Umberto Bobadillo.

4 MR. INGRAM: And you understand you're under
5 oath?

6 MR. BOBADILLO: Yes, I am.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

8 Jeffrey Cooley?

9 MR. COOLEY: Yes, I'm here, and I understand
10 I'm under oath.

11 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

12 Nathan Morgenstein?

13 MR. MORGENSTEIN: This is Nathan Morgenstein.
14 And, yes, I am testifying under oath.

15 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

16 Mark Hoyt?

17 MR. HOYT: This is Mark Hoyt, and I understand
18 I'm under oath.

19 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

20 Savannah Miele? Savannah Miele? Savannah, if
21 you're on the phone, you may be on mute.

22 Joshua Healea?

23 MR. HEALEA: Joshua Healea, present, and I
24 understand I'm under oath.

25 MR. INGRAM: Glen Cozart?

1 MR. COZART: I'm Glen Cozart. I am present,
2 and I understand I'm under oath. Thank you.

3 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

4 Carl Toth?

5 MR. TOTH: This is Carl Toth, and I understand
6 I'm under oath.

7 MR. INGRAM: Thank you, Carl.

8 Joseph Bause?

9 JUAN: Hi. My name's Juan. How are you doing?

10 MR. INGRAM: Joseph Bause?

11 UNIDENTIFIED MAN: I'm doing well, thank you.
12 How can we help you?

13 MR. BAUSE: Joseph Bause. I understand I'm
14 under oath.

15 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

16 Sean Wilson?

17 MR. WILSON: This is Sean Wilson. I understand
18 I'm under oath.

19 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

20 Gale Craythorn?

21 MR. CRAYTHORN: This is Gale Craythorn. I
22 understand that I'm under oath.

23 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

24 Mitchel Leavitt?

25 MR. LEAVITT: This is Mitchel Leavitt. I

1 understand that I'm under oath.

2 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

3 Mark Malone?

4 MR. MALONE: This is Mark Malone. I understand
5 I'm under oath.

6 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

7 John Reilly?

8 MR. REILLY: This is John Reilly. I understand
9 I am under oath.

10 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

11 Joel Logan?

12 MR. LOGAN: This is Joel Logan, and I
13 understand I'm under oath.

14 MR. INGRAM: Okay. And one more time, Savannah
15 Miele?

16 Okay. Make note of that, and if she logs in a
17 little later, make sure before we take it up.

18 Thank you, ma'am.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So now I'll go ahead
20 and entertain a motion for a block vote.

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
22 Brown. I move that we pass --

23 MR. DETMER: I'm sorry. Mike Detmer, for the
24 record. I'm sorry to now to interject. Before the
25 motion is made and entertained, I just wanted to clarify

1 if there were any items among the block vote that had to
2 be removed prior to the motion being approved for the
3 block.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Got it. Okay. Yes.
5 I have two that I need to remove. The first one is
6 number 10. The second one is number 13. While I don't
7 know the individuals, they are acting on the part, on
8 behalf of Allied Universal. And so I need to remove
9 myself.

10 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
11 Brown. I approve that we pass the consent items minus
12 numbers 10 and 13.

13 MR. INGRAM: For clarification, that would be
14 items number 7, 8, 9, 11, 12, 14 and 15.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
16 I have a second?

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
18 Cortez. I will second the motion.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: All in favor, say
20 "aye."

21 (Board members said "aye.")

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: All opposed?

23 Okay. The block vote passes unanimously.

24 To number 10, do I have a motion on number 10?

25 MR. INGRAM: And 13.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: And 13? Okay.

2 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
3 Brown. I move that we approve the items 10 and 13.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
5 I have a second?

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
7 Cortez. I second the motion. I mean I second to
8 approve.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So I have a motion.
10 I have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

11 (Board members said "aye.")

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: All opposed? Or, I
13 abstain. Board Member Nixon abstains.

14 MR. DETMER: Chair, does that motion pass?

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Oh. The motion
16 passes. Thank you.

17 Okay. So then, I guess, did we want to
18 announce that those folks, in case they were on the
19 line, don't need to stay?

20 MR. INGRAM: Yeah, we can.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

22 MR. INGRAM: So anyone on the call right now
23 for agenda items 7 through 15, you do not have to stay
24 on the phone if you do not wish. However, you're
25 welcome to go ahead and listen in to the rest of the

1 meeting.

2 Madam Chair, if I could just make one more
3 announcement that I provide during the role call.

4 Do we have any public members on the call? If
5 we do, if you could identify yourselves, please?

6 Members of the public.

7 MR. FLORENCE: Douglas Florence.

8 MR. INGRAM: I'm sorry. Who?

9 MR. FLORENCE: Douglas Florence.

10 MR. INGRAM: Tom.

11 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Douglas.

12 MR. INGRAM: Oh, Douglas Florence?

13 MR. FLORENCE: Yes, sir.

14 MR. INGRAM: Thanks, Douglas.

15 MR. FLORENCE: Have a good day.

16 MR. INGRAM: Do we have any other public on the
17 line with us today?

18 MR. GIRARD: Chair, are you asking for a
19 particular agenda item or in general?

20 MR. INGRAM: No, just in general, do we have
21 anybody in the public that's attending the meeting today
22 just to listen in?

23 MR. GIRARD: Yeah. Jon Girard, Elite
24 Investigations. 873 is my license number. And I've
25 been sworn in.

1 MR. INGRAM: Thanks, Jon.

2 MR. TAYLOR: John Taylor, Allied Consulting &
3 Security, 2050, have been sworn in.

4 MR. INGRAM: Just -- now, are you on the
5 agenda?

6 MR. TAYLOR: John Taylor? Yeah, item number
7 10. I didn't quite understand.

8 MR. INGRAM: Okay. I'm just calling for
9 members of the public that are listening in to our
10 meeting right now. Besides Mr. Douglas Florence and
11 Mr. Jon Girard. Are there other members of the public
12 not on the agenda?

13 MR. ALVAREZ: Good morning. John Alvarez with
14 Protective Force International, 2687.

15 MR. INGRAM: Thank you, John.

16 Any other members of the public?

17 MS. KNIGHT: Jennifer Knight with True
18 Investigations, license number 1960.

19 MR. INGRAM: Thank you, Jennifer.

20 Any other members of the public?

21 MR. FLORENCE: Kevin, this is Douglas again. I
22 didn't list that I'm a license in abeyance, 1672.

23 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

24 Last call for members of the public.

25 MR. ZANE: Mark Zane.

1 MR. INGRAM: Thank you, Mark.

2 Anyone else?

3 Thank you, Madam Chair.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So this moves
5 us to agenda item number 16. Mr. Humberto Bobadilla?

6 MR. BOBADILLA: Yes, here I am.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir. So
8 could you please tell us a little bit with yourself and
9 what you're in front of the Board for.

10 MR. BOBADILLA: I'm sorry. I couldn't hear
11 you.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Could you tell us a
13 little bit about yourself and why you're in front of the
14 Board.

15 MR. BOBADILLA: Okay. I am a dog trainer. I
16 have my own company. And I am in front of the Board
17 because I want to change the name of my business. The
18 business used to be Nuevo Pacto, LLC. And I want to
19 change it to Las Vegas K9 Training LLC.

20 Unfortunately, I didn't notify PILB about the
21 change, and I was running the business like as Las Vegas
22 K9 Training LLC instead of Nuevo Pacto, LLC, without
23 notifying you.

24 So then in the audit that I had from you, they
25 find out this issue. So then I took care of it,

1 including Nuevo and all the issues that I have in the
2 administration of my business. And which I took care of
3 them. And now I am requesting the change of the name.

4 I changed the name because it was, the name was
5 Nuevo Pacto, LLC in the license, but I was doing
6 business as Las Vegas K9 Training. So it didn't make
7 sense for me to keep it like that, So then I changed
8 the LLC for Las Vegas K9 Training LLC just as doing
9 business as Las Vegas K9 Training. So that's why I need
10 the change. That's why I'm here in front of the Board.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.

12 Board members, are there any questions?

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer.
14 This is for the investigator, Investigator Swarthout.
15 In here, one of the things on here is that he decided to
16 change his name without advising the Board, the PILB.
17 The company employed an individual that's not registered
18 with our agency. One at a time.

19 (The Reporter indicated an inability to hear.)

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Investigator Swarthout,
21 again, I'll just ask each one of these at a time.
22 There's like five different violations.

23 The company employed an individual who is not
24 registered with our agency?

25 MR. SWARTHOUT: Investigator Swarthout. Yes,

1 he did correct that.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. The company had
3 no employee records or files?

4 MR. SWARTHOUT: He has corrected that, and he
5 currently had no employees working for him.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'll reask the
7 question, then. The company had no employee records or
8 files?

9 MR. SWARTHOUT: So he has corrected that. He
10 currently had no employees working for him.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: The company was saying
12 one employee on a 1099 as an independent contract even
13 though she had a registered work card. So we don't have
14 to worry about that, because he has no employees?

15 MR. SWARTHOUT: Correct.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. The company was
17 not reporting employee wages to the Nevada Employment
18 Security Division?

19 MR. SWARTHOUT: Correct. That has been
20 corrected, of course, with no employees working for him.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. I have no
22 more questions.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
24 questions?

25 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member

1 Brown. Have the fines all been paid for any citations?

2 MR. SWARTHOUT: Yes, they have.

3 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any
5 further questions?

6 I'll entertain a motion on item number 16.

7 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
8 Brown. I'd move that we approve the corporate name
9 change from Nuevo Pacto to Las Vegas K9 Training LLC.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
11 I have a second?

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer.
13 I'll second.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
15 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

16 (Board members said "aye.")

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: None opposed. Your
18 motion passes unanimously. Thank you, Mr. Humberto.
19 Congratulations.

20 MR. BOBADILLA: Thank you very much, all of the
21 Board members, and have a great day.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

23 So that takes us to item number 17, Jeffrey
24 Cooley.

25 MR. INGRAM: At this time, Madam Chair, we did

1 not receive fingerprints on item number 17, 19, 23.
2 They're on the call today and hoping that when we get
3 our mail this morning that they have some fingerprints
4 in. So if we could trail items 17, 19 and 23, that will
5 give my Board staff time to review the mail this
6 morning.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Do we want to
8 ask them if they understand?

9 MR. INGRAM: We've already sent two of them
10 out.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Perfect.

12 Okay. Mr. Cooley, we're going to pass by you
13 real quick and move on to Nathan, item number 18, Nathan
14 Morgenstein.

15 MR. MORGENSTEIN: Ma'am, that's Morgenstein.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Morgenstein. Thank
17 you. So, sir, please tell us why you are here and what
18 you plan to do with your license.

19 MR. MORGENSTEIN: Certainly. So I'm before the
20 Board this morning for a private investigator license
21 approval. I'm a licensed P.I. in California and have
22 been since 2009, been on the job since 2003 in Inyo
23 County, which is California. And I intend, I intend on
24 getting my license and working as a public defender
25 investigator in Elko County, assuming that that's an

1 option available to me at some point. Otherwise, you
2 know, I'll be available to do any sort of private work
3 as well.

4 A little background on my -- you know, I've
5 been married for 28 years. I have five children. I've
6 been in Inyo County for almost 30 years now. Let's see.
7 What else? That's all I can think of for now.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you,
9 sir.

10 Board, is there any questions for
11 Mr. Morgenstein?

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
13 Cortez. Mr. Morgenstein, I see that there are possible
14 outstanding medical bills.

15 MR. MORGENSTEIN: Yes. I did speak to
16 Investigator Jones about this. I'm in the process of
17 trying to wrap those up, but I regrettably have not
18 finalized that just yet. I know there's about, I want
19 to say there's three different ones totaling in the
20 neighborhood of six or seven hundred dollars. There is
21 a credit card bill as well that is, has a payment
22 arrangement in place. But those are the only ones I'm
23 aware of.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. I have no further
25 questions. Thank you.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
2 Saladino, do we know if he is in a payment arrangement
3 with these different debts?

4 MR. SALADINO: Investigator Saladino. For the
5 Capital One, he did provide the statement showing that
6 he's in a payment plan for that one. The medical bills,
7 from what I understand from speaking to him, his wife
8 and himself are working out, you know, making sure it
9 was -- we're getting the bills and stuff. And, I guess,
10 she had some medical issues. So they're in the process
11 of working those.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Are there any
13 other questions?

14 Okay. If there's no other questions, I'll take
15 a motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
17 Cortez. I motion to approve the license that's being
18 requested.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Do we have a
20 second?

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
22 Brown. I will second.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. I have a
24 motion. I have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

25 (Board members said "aye.")

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: All opposed?

2 It passes unanimously. Congratulations,
3 Mr. Morgenstein, and good luck to you.

4 MR. MORGENSTEIN: Thank you very much, ladies
5 and gentlemen. Have a great day.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Item number
7 19 will be trailed till later.

8 Item number 20.

9 MR. INGRAM: Ms. Miele, are you on the call?
10 Savannah Miele?

11 Madam Chair, Ms. Savannah Miele was noticed and
12 had confirmed she'd be attending today. I don't know if
13 you want to trail this.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Well, since we're
15 trailing the other ones, let's go ahead and trail this
16 one until the end. And if she doesn't show, then.

17 Okay. Item number 21. Mr. Joshua Healea?

18 MR. HEALEA: Present.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Sir, please tell us
20 a little bit about yourself and what you're planning on
21 with your license, please.

22 MR. HEALEA: Hi, everyone. Good morning.
23 Thank you for considering my application. I'm going out
24 for a canine handler license. I am a Nevada Category I
25 POST-certified officer with Silver State Law Enforcement

1 Academy. I was also the class sergeant valedictorian.
2 I'm currently a first sergeant with IGS, Integrity
3 Global Security, for over two years. I have five
4 facilities and over 55 employees. I have an exemplary
5 credit, criminal and work history.

6 And what I want to do with my license is just
7 run a canine through IGS. And our first objective would
8 be to, we're doing marijuana detection for theft for
9 employees.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any
11 questions for Mr. Healy?

12 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
13 Brown. I have a question for Investigator -- Swarthout.
14 Sorry. It's listed that the fingerprints hadn't been
15 received. Have they been received at this time?

16 MR. SWARTHOUT: Investigator Swarthout. They
17 have been received, and they were clear.

18 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Sir, you have here
20 on October 23rd, the background has determined that you
21 were working for IGS as a canine handler, and you were
22 doing so without that license. Can you tell us a little
23 bit about that?

24 MR. HEALEA: Yeah, absolutely. First, I just
25 want to apologize for the mistake that Integrity Global

1 made in reference. When we first got our canine, the
2 Planet 13 director of corporate security, Richard Henry,
3 told us it was okay to train the canine on property. So
4 we would bring him in for training only. But after we
5 were informed of that, we did not have the canine on
6 property and we completely complied with that.

7 Also, Director Richard Henry did call PILB and
8 reached out to them to let them know that there was no
9 compensation for the canine or myself or the company
10 whatsoever.

11 So, again, I just want to apologize. And we
12 should have contacted you guys to ask if it was okay to
13 train the canine on property. So, again, I apologize.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
15 questions?

16 Investigator Swarthout, did we find out whether
17 or not that was training, or was he actually working?

18 MR. SWARTHOUT: I never heard from Richard
19 Henry on whether they were receiving compensation or
20 anything in regards to that.

21 MR. HEALEA: And who was that speaking? I'm
22 sorry.

23 MR. SWARTHOUT: Investigator Swarthout.

24 MR. HEALEA: Okay. Just, so, be advised that
25 Director Richard Henry did reach out, and he actually

1 spoke to Executive Director Kevin Ingram.

2 MR. INGRAM: Madam Chair, I spoke with
3 Mr. Henry, but I do not recall a conversation where he
4 said that -- I remember speaking with the director of
5 Planet 13, Mr. Henry. I don't recall having a specific
6 conversation about whether the dog was being
7 compensated, which really was kind of moot. When
8 Investigator Swarthout went on property, the security
9 officer was there with the dog. And they gave
10 Investigator Swarthout a tour of the facility, bringing
11 the dog along with them. So I mean whether the dog was
12 in training or not, the perception was that the dog was
13 working.

14 Thank you.

15 MR. HEALEA: Yeah, understood, and that, again,
16 that's just what I was told by Mr. Henry. And that's
17 all. And, again, apologize. And I was only training,
18 and I was never compensated whatsoever.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: And so, Investigator
20 Swarthout, it says here, too, that the company was
21 advertising canine services on the company Facebook
22 page?

23 MR. SWARTHOUT: Yes, they were. And that has
24 been taken down.

25 MR. HEALEA: Can I comment on that as well?

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Sure.

2 MR. HEALEA: You know, in reference to the
3 advertising, I spoke with the owners, Michael Haley and
4 Kyle Hardy. They just stated they were overzealous on
5 their post. And they apologized. And I apologized as
6 well. They immediately took down the post. They paid
7 the \$2,500 fine within three days and apologized.

8 They've held their license with you guys for
9 over 10 years and they've never had any violations or
10 fines. So I can assure you that the owners and myself,
11 we're rule followers and law enforcement professionals,
12 and we're going to continue to follow your rules exactly
13 as outlined from here on out.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
15 questions?

16 If there's no other questions, I'll entertain a
17 motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
19 Brown. I move that we approve the item as listed.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
21 Cortez. I'll second the motion to approve the licensing
22 request.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion, and
24 I have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

25 (Board members said "aye.")

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: The motion passes
2 unanimately. Mr. Healea, congratulations, and please
3 continue to follow the rules.

4 MR. HEALEA: Absolutely. Thank you guys so
5 much.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So item number 22,
7 Mr. Cozart.

8 MR. COZART: Yes, ma'am.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Please tell
10 us a little bit about yourself and what you intend to do
11 with the license.

12 MR. COZART: Good morning, Board members and
13 staff. My name is Glen Cozart. I understand I'm under
14 oath.

15 I currently am a qualified manager, private
16 investigator and private patrol operator in California,
17 as well as I have a registered, a guard registration in
18 California. I have been approved for global sentry
19 reentry program by the Department of Homeland Security.
20 And I also currently have an unarmed registered employee
21 guard card from PILB.

22 The reason I need a license, not only to follow
23 all your rules, is because some of my VIP clients that
24 are in California plan to travel to Nevada. I don't
25 plan on doing constant employment in Nevada. But when I

1 am in the state with my clients, I will personally be
2 there as they travel in and out of the state.

3 If you have any questions for me, I'm -- I
4 appreciate being in front of you, and I can take them.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any
6 questions for Mr. Cozart?

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes. This is Board
8 Member Gronauer. Good morning, Mr. Cozart.

9 MR. COZART: Good morning, sir.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. I see that
11 you were employed by the LAPD. Was that the sheriff's
12 office or P.D.?

13 MR. COZART: L.A. County Sheriff's Department,
14 sir.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. You spent
16 13 years there.

17 MR. COZART: Yes.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What was your duties in
19 LAPD?

20 MR. COZART: L.A. County Sheriff, sir.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I'm sorry.

22 MR. COZART: I did five -- that's okay. I did
23 five years in custody at the Hall of Justice Jail,
24 where, and then during that time, I received my
25 bachelor's degree from Cal Poly Pomona, while working

1 graveyard shift as the deputy sheriff in custody. In
2 1997, I went out to patrol, and that's where I spent the
3 remainder of my career as a -- I got off training in six
4 months. I was promoted to training officer after 18
5 months at the station. And that's where I finished my
6 career.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I have the dates as
8 June 1st, '82 to March 16th, '94. That's 12 years,
9 almost 12 years. Why did you leave the LAPD, Sheriff's
10 Office?

11 MR. COZART: I was accused of a crime while I
12 was a sworn deputy sheriff, as I was a training officer.
13 And I would like to tell the Board members, that was
14 about 26 years ago. And as I sit here today, I've never
15 actually been questioned about that. I was never given
16 the opportunity. I fought as hard as I could for three
17 and a half years, with a public defender. And after
18 that time, having another trainee deputy sheriff saying
19 that I did something wrong was pretty hard to argue
20 against. But after three and a half years, I was pretty
21 spent emotionally, physically and financially.

22 And I was offered a probationary sentence. And
23 during that climate at the time, I don't know how old
24 you gentlemen are, and ladies, but it was post Rodney
25 King and the riots, and the climate for police officers

1 wasn't that good. One of the decisions I have to live
2 with daily, even after 26 years, is accepting that
3 no-contest plea and the probationary sentence and losing
4 the best job I ever had.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Board Member
6 Gronauer again. I have some difficulties with it,
7 because I was a police officer at the same time period
8 you're talking about. And it was tough times. I get
9 that. I just have some difficulties with short-term.
10 And, also, they give you the opportunity to resign,
11 then?

12 MR. COZART: They didn't, I don't know if they
13 gave me the opportunity, sir. That's just what I chose
14 to do.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Part of taking
16 the plea agreement on this here, all right, what I'm
17 getting at, usually in policing, especially in them
18 days, it was either we could fire you or you can resign.
19 And I was just trying to get to where were you in that,
20 or that wasn't part of it?

21 MR. COZART: That wasn't part of it, sir. I
22 just decided one day to go do that. I felt like I was
23 in a no-win situation no matter how I felt about the
24 charges against me. And after that long period of time,
25 I was just going to, trying to close the door, myself

1 personally. And that's why I chose. No one ever came
2 to me and said, "We're going to fire you." I'm sure
3 they would have, though, sir. I'm not, I'm not trying
4 to imply anything. But at that time, I decided, well,
5 I'm just going to, I'm just going to resign, and I'm
6 going to move on, there's nothing I can do.

7 I've never, since that -- you probably have
8 more questions, and that's fine. But since that date, I
9 mean it takes a very, very good person to become a
10 deputy sheriff. I am a very good person. I've never
11 been in any other trouble. But once, there's nothing
12 worse than having your credibility questioned. It's
13 very, very hard to regain your integrity. And that's
14 what I've been trying to do over the last 30 years.

15 And my last statement, I guess, in response to
16 that would be the same thing I told the Department of
17 Homeland Security and California licensing board, BSIS,
18 that if I am given a chance, I will never let you down.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. Thank you
20 for that. This is still Board Member Gronauer. If you
21 are granted on this appeal, what do you plan on doing
22 with it in Nevada?

23 MR. COZART: The only thing I'm going to be
24 doing, sir, is traveling in and out of the state with
25 clients, personally. So I will be -- usually, we call

1 it a security driver. Obviously, I'm unarmed. But I've
2 been doing this for a long time with the same company.
3 They've moved me all the way up to the very top, and
4 they put me in charge of CEOs across the nation, foreign
5 dignitaries of small children. I'm trusted with
6 everybody. And that's what I will do. I just don't
7 want to do anything against the rules. That's why I got
8 my work card. And, periodically, I plan, with some new
9 contracts, that, hopefully, are going to go well, I plan
10 on traveling to the state for a short period of time,
11 maybe two weeks at the most, and then back to
12 California.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. No more
14 questions from me.

15 MR. COZART: I appreciate your time, sir.

16 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
17 Brown. I have a question for you, sir.

18 MR. COZART: Yes, sir.

19 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: The information we have
20 shows that you were charged by the Superior Court of
21 Los Angeles for perjury.

22 MR. COZART: Correct.

23 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Has that conviction
24 created a Brady issue for you with California?

25 MR. COZART: Not that I know of, sir. The

1 reason I am a licensed private investigator in
2 California and have been a private patrol operator and
3 guard registrant is because of I obtained my certificate
4 of rehabilitation from my local board.

5 And actually, I should have mentioned, my --
6 I've been investigated by the Board of Prison Terms.
7 Even though I was never in jail or prison, and I
8 received probation, my pardon, I applied for a pardon,
9 and my pardon was approved by the Board of Prison Terms
10 in California in 2012. And it's been, every time
11 there's a new governor, I have to resubmit. But my
12 pardon sits in the Governor's Office. But it hasn't
13 been signed. And it's my life goal probably to have my
14 pardon signed.

15 But that's where I am today.

16 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Thank you,
17 Mr. Cozart.

18 MR. COZART: Thank you, sir.

19 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: No further questions.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
21 questions?

22 If there's no other questions, I'll entertain a
23 motion.

24 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
25 Brown. I move that we approve Mr. Cozart's application

1 for a private patrolman license.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
3 I have a second?

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez. I
5 will second the motion for approval.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion, and
7 I have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

8 (Board members said "aye.")

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: All opposed?

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No. This is Gronauer.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: The motion passes
12 three to one. Congratulations, Mr. Cozart. Please
13 don't let us down.

14 MR. COZART: Thank you very much. Thank you
15 very, very much. You have no idea how much it means to
16 me. And the one that did oppose, I appreciate your
17 point of view, and I'm always open for a face-to-face or
18 any other meetings you'd like to have with me, sir. I
19 hope you have all a good day.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

21 So we're trailing item number 23, waiting for
22 fingerprints.

23 That'll take us to item number 24, Pono
24 Security. Mr. Bause, are with you us?

25 MR. BAUSE: Yes, ma'am. I have been sworn in.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So please tell us a
2 little bit about yourself and what you intend to do with
3 the license.

4 MR. BAUSE: I have been in the security
5 industry since 2001, both in Georgia, here in Las Vegas.
6 Currently, I'm a corporate training manager for S.A.S.
7 Services, which provides ground support service for
8 airlines. And, upon approval, I'd become the qualifying
9 agent for Pono Security, who is looking to be a new
10 security company in the state of Nevada.

11 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Bause, this is Kevin Ingram,
12 for the record. Do you have your phone on speaker
13 phone?

14 MR. BAUSE: I'm on a headset, but I can change
15 that, sir. Hold on one second.

16 MR. INGRAM: Thank you. You're cutting out a
17 little bit on us.

18 MR. BAUSE: Okay. There you go, sir, I've
19 turned it off.

20 MR. INGRAM: That is much better. Thank you,
21 sir.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: And I forgot to ask,
23 is Mr. Wilson with you as well or on the line?

24 MR. WILSON: Yes, ma'am, I'm here.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And you're

1 under oath, sir?

2 MR. WILSON: Yes, ma'am.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So,
4 Mr. Wilson, what part do you play in this?

5 MR. WILSON: I'm the owner.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Okay. Are
7 there any questions?

8 MR. WILSON: Any questions that we have, ma'am?

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: No, sir, for the
10 Board. Sorry.

11 MR. WILSON: Yes, ma'am.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. If there's no
13 questions from the Board, I do have a question.
14 Mr. Bause, it seems here that you have, you know, a
15 Chapter 13 and then federal charge-offs. Have all of
16 those been taken care of and the paperwork been provided
17 to Mr. Maxwell?

18 MR. BAUSE: Yes, ma'am. All the paperwork was
19 provided to Investigator Maxwell. And for my
20 charge-offs, I am currently in an agreement with
21 Rockwell Industries as a payment plan. And I am
22 26 percent complete with paying back all the creditors.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Fantastic.
24 Thank you.

25 And then, Mr. Wilson, I see the same here. You

1 have a couple of tax liens here. Have those been taken
2 care of, and has the paperwork been provided to
3 Investigator Maxwell?

4 MR. WILSON: Yes, ma'am. They have been taken
5 care of.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Are there any
7 other questions?

8 Okay. If there's no other questions, I will
9 entertain a motion.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
11 Cortez. I am motioning that we grant Mr. Bause for an
12 individual private patrolman license.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Do we need the --

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm sorry. We are also
15 going, motioning to also approve Sean G. Wilson as the
16 member.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. I have a
18 motion. I have a second. Or do I have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
20 Brown. I second.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
22 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

23 (Board members said "aye.")

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations,
25 gentlemen. It passed. Congratulations. Have a great

1 day.

2 MR. BAUSE: Thank you ma'am.

3 MR. WILSON: I have one quick question.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Sure.

5 MR. WILSON: Can you give me an idea of how
6 long it'll be before we can start doing business? We
7 have quite a few calls coming in in regards.

8 MS. LANCASTER: Investigator Lancaster. I will
9 email you tomorrow with the next steps to obtain your
10 license.

11 MR. WILSON: Okay. Yes, ma'am.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

13 MR. WILSON: Thank you all.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Next, agenda
15 item number 25. Is Gale Craythorn, are you on the line?

16 MR. CRAYTHORN: This is Gale Craythorn. I have
17 been sworn.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.

19 MR. CRAYTHORN: And I am under oath.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.
21 Please tell us a little bit about yourself and what you
22 intend to do with your license.

23 MR. CRAYTHORN: Yes, ma'am. I am a 20-year
24 veteran of the United States Air Force serving in the
25 law enforcement canine capacity. Myself and my partners

1 are starting a new security company here in Nevada. And
2 we will just be, at this time, unarmed security, hoping
3 to build our business.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And,
5 Mr. Leavitt, are you on the line?

6 MR. LEAVITT: This is Mitch Leavitt, and I am
7 sworn in.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And,
9 Mr. Malone, are you on the line?

10 MR. MALONE: I am. This is Mark Malone, and I
11 have been sworn in.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So if I could
13 just clarify. Do we have the fingerprints for
14 Mr. Leavitt?

15 MR. LEAVITT: I had to do them twice, if you're
16 asking me. And, I think, they're all done now.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Please hold, sir.
18 Thank you.

19 MS. LANCASTER: Investigator Lancaster. His
20 fingerprints were rejected, so he had to get them
21 redone. That will take some time.

22 MR. SALADINO: Investigator Saladino. The
23 Nevada Department of Public Safety sent us a letter on
24 January 26th, 2021 stating that they had been rejected.

25 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member

1 Brown. For Investigator Saladino, are we still awaiting
2 the next set to come?

3 MR. SALADINO: Correct. We're waiting for them
4 to get us the report.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Board Member
6 Gronauer. I had the same problem, I go get my
7 fingerprints, they're just worn down. And they're worn
8 down. And it has to do with how you worked or your age.
9 Obviously, being my age, I don't work. But, anyway,
10 they get worn down. It's very difficult, the way they
11 do fingerprints nowadays, to have them done. I really
12 don't even have a problem with what happened here,
13 because they rejected me because of that reason, from my
14 understanding.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. I mean
16 typically we hold for fingerprints.

17 Okay. So let me just ask. Mr. Malone, on
18 your -- it looks like you had a civil judgment release
19 from Clark County District Court of Nevada.

20 MR. MALONE: Correct. And that has been
21 satisfied.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Do we have
23 all the proof, Mr. Maxwell, that that has been taken
24 care of?

25 MR. SALADINO: Investigator Saladino, for the

1 record. We do have the court documents showing that
2 it's been satisfied.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Board Member
5 Gronauer. Can I ask a question of our attorney,
6 Mr. Detmer?

7 MR. DETMER: Please.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. I don't
9 even know how to phrase the question, because it's about
10 the fingerprints.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I may be able to.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Somebody answer.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So, I think, what we
14 are able to do is approve everybody else except for
15 Mr. Leavitt, and then have him come back at a later
16 date.

17 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record. That
18 would be my understanding. It's been my --

19 Shannon, did you hear that, or should I go back
20 and repeat?

21 (The Reporter indicated what she heard.)

22 MS. DETMER: And that was the gist of it, yes.
23 My understanding is the Board's precedent is when
24 fingerprints have not been received, that they be
25 continued to a later date when they can be processed.

1 If not, it's -- and maybe I'm looking too far into it.
2 It's almost an incomplete application without those
3 fingerprints. So my understanding is that, based on the
4 regulations, you can approve the remainder, with the
5 exception of the one, and bring it back on a later date.
6 With that, I submit.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I'm good.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
9 Cortez. I motion to postpone Mr. Mitchel Leavitt as a
10 member, at a further time, due to his, the discussed
11 fingerprints. I'm motioning just for his postponement.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So I have a
13 motion. Do I have a second?

14 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown. I
15 second.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: All in favor, say
17 "aye."

18 (Board members said "aye.")

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is also Board Member
20 Cortez. I am motioning to approve Mr. Craythorn as an
21 individual private patrolman license, in addition to the
22 members requesting Mr. Craythorn, Mr. Malone and
23 Mr. Reilly.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
25 I have a second?

1 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown. I'll
2 second.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. I have a
4 motion. I have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

5 (Board members said "aye.")

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So,
7 gentlemen, we did approve everybody except for
8 Mr. Leavitt to move forward with the licensing.
9 Mr. Leavitt, you will have to return your fingerprints
10 here.

11 MR. LEAVITT: I understand. I redid them. I
12 am 70 years old. And my first ones on the electronic
13 machine didn't take. I went down and did it old school.
14 But I have had a background check when we got a Nevada
15 limousine license from the NTA. So I know that they
16 work. It's just we did it old school back then, and the
17 electronic ones must not have taken my prints.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Understood, sir.

19 MR. INGRAM: So we'll be in contact with you,
20 Mr. Leavitt. Board staff will be in contact with you
21 regarding your fingerprints. We'll get you scheduled
22 for the meeting of the scheduled Board meeting. Okay?

23 MR. LEAVITT: Thank you very much.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.
25 Have a great day.

1 MR. LEAVITT: You bet. Bye.

2 MR. CRAYTHORN: Thanks.

3 MR. MALONE: Thank you.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Then we move
5 to item number 26. Mr. Logan, are you on the line?

6 MR. LOGAN: Yes, I am. This is Joel Logan.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Great. Why don't
8 you tell us a little bit about yourself and what you
9 intend to do with your license.

10 MR. LOGAN: Okay. I'm a former deputy sheriff
11 and police officer with about a little over 10 years of
12 experience through the state of California and Arizona,
13 as well as a former government contractor through
14 Bigelow Aerospace Advanced Space Studies. If approved,
15 my intention is to become the qualifying agent for
16 Reliance Security, for the private patrolman and
17 processor, process server license.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Are there any
19 questions?

20 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
21 Brown. I have a question for Investigator Saladino.

22 (The Reporter indicated an inability to hear.)

23 MR. INGRAM: Yeah, Shannon, the two remotes
24 have died, so we're working on central. So if could
25 just all talk towards this direction.

1 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This, again, is Board
2 Member Brown. I have a question for Investigator
3 Saladino. Reliance Security had an outstanding
4 citation. Has that been paid?

5 MR. SALADINO: Correct. Investigator Saladino.
6 That citation has been paid, and I do have the
7 confirmation number that the payment was made.

8 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer.
10 Mr. Logan.

11 MR. LOGAN: Yes, sir.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Good morning to you,
13 sir.

14 MR. LOGAN: Good morning.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: It seems that you were
16 employed by a minimum of three police departments for a
17 very short amount of time. Can you explain what
18 happened with all that?

19 MR. LOGAN: Yeah, absolutely. Initially, I
20 went through the San Bernardino Sheriff's Academy.
21 That's the part of California where I grew up. After
22 the academy, I put myself through the academy, and the
23 first agency that hired me was the Monterey County
24 Sheriff's Department located up in central California.
25 So, of course, I took the job. I went up there. I

1 worked in the jails for a little over two years, I
2 believe. My intention, as I was working there, was to
3 eventually transfer back down to San Bernardino Police
4 Department. I had several friends that worked there. I
5 was a fan of the police department. And definitely
6 more, more opportunities and more of a speed of a law
7 enforcement agency that I wanted to work for.

8 So after about two and a half years, I got
9 hired, and I just lateraled down to the San Bernardino
10 Police Department. I worked there for, oh, gosh,
11 approximately five and a half, or five, yeah, a little
12 over five and a half years.

13 And for no reason other than to get to a
14 different pace of being a police officer, I moved to the
15 Lake Havasu City Police Department where I believed I
16 was going to spend the rest of my time and, you know,
17 retire after 20 or so years.

18 But several years into that, I was kind of
19 headhunted, recruited by a government contractor called
20 ABS, that after about two years of them pursuing me, the
21 opportunities that they gave me and the pay as well, I
22 really couldn't pass up, and made the change. And
23 that's what then ended my career. Everything was left
24 on good terms and no issues.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer again.

1 Where do you reside now, sir?

2 MR. LOGAN: Where do I reside? In Las Vegas.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Did you work in
4 Nevada with a California --

5 MR. LOGAN: No.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: -- driver's license?

7 MR. LOGAN: I couldn't hear you. You cut off.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Did you work in Nevada
9 with a California driver's license?

10 MR. LOGAN: Did I work in Nevada with a
11 California driver's license? I'm not sure I know what
12 you mean. But I didn't work as a police officer in
13 Nevada.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Oh, but you weren't
15 working in Nevada. Do you have a Nevada driver's
16 license?

17 MR. LOGAN: Yes.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have one now?

19 MR. LOGAN: Yes.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Thank you.

21 MR. LOGAN: Yeah, you're welcome.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
23 questions?

24 Okay. So, Investigator Saladino, I see here
25 under the financial, he had quite a few state tax liens.

1 Have these all been taken care of, or is he in payment
2 arrangements?

3 MR. LOGAN: Yes, they are. They've been paid.
4 And, well, actually, I should say, some of them, one of
5 them was paid. I don't have the information in front of
6 me. And the other ones were corrected. The State of
7 California, the Franchise Tax Board, put a lien on me.
8 They believed that, for reasons that myself and my CPA
9 could not determine, they believed that I was still
10 living in California and working in California, although
11 my jobs, you know, clearly stated that I'd moved to
12 Arizona and then -- I moved to California, I'm sorry,
13 then back to Nevada. And, you know, I worked in Nevada.
14 So that was cleared up, because I wasn't working in
15 California. Therefore, I didn't need to pay the taxes.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Sir, thank
17 you.

18 Investigator Saladino, do you have the
19 paperwork for it?

20 MR. SALADINO: Correct.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Yes. Thank you.

22 Okay. All right. Are there any other
23 questions?

24 Okay. I'll entertain a motion.

25 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member

1 Brown. I move that we approve Mr. Logan's private
2 patrolman and process server licenses and, also,
3 corporate officer status and placing his individual
4 license in abeyance so that he may become the qualifying
5 agent for Reliance Security.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

7 I have a motion. Do I have a second?

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
9 Cortez. I'll second the motion.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
11 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

12 (Board members said "aye.")

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: That passes
14 unanimously. Thank you, Mr. Logan, and have a great
15 day. Congratulations.

16 MR. LOGAN: Great. Thank you. Thank you. I
17 appreciate it.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So now we'll
19 go back to item number 20.

20 MR. INGRAM: Is Savannah Miele on the call?

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So let's move
22 on. So we are going to move -- oh, go ahead.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Can I make a motion?

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Yes. I'm open for a
25 motion, please.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. I make a motion
2 that we deny the appeal of Ms. Savannah M. Miele, who's
3 applying for a private investigator license. And if
4 approved, she's requesting that her individual private
5 license be placed in abeyance so that she may become the
6 qualifying agent for CoventBridge (USA), Incorporated,
7 license number 1187.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
9 Cortez. I second the motion.

10 MR. DETMER: I truly apologize. If I'm
11 understanding correctly, that was motion was made to
12 deny the appeal of the licensure?

13 MR. INGRAM: No, he was denying the licensure.
14 We called for her again. It was trailed.

15 MR. DETMER: I thought the motion was made to
16 deny the appeal.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: It's just to deny.

18 MR. DETMER: I sincerely apologize for the
19 interruption.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So Board Member Gronauer
21 made the motion.

22 MR. INGRAM: That's right.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And I will second. This
24 is Board Member Cortez seconding the motion to deny.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion.

1 We have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

2 (Board members said "aye.")

3 MR. INGRAM: Okay. Did you want to take a
4 break before we go, then, to the appeals?

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So we have a couple
6 still trailed. Do we need to wait to get the
7 fingerprints back?

8 MR. INGRAM: Yes. We've got about six weeks to
9 get the fingerprints back. So that's where we're at.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

11 MR. INGRAM: Okay. So it looks like we could
12 move forward with Mr. Mark Hoyt.

13 MR. HOYT: Good morning, Board. I am under
14 oath. This is Mark Hoyt.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Could you
16 hang on. Hang on one second, sir. We need to gather
17 ourselves.

18 So did we, we did get the fingerprints?

19 MR. INGRAM: Shannon, for the record, this is
20 Kevin. We received the fingerprint results back for
21 item number 19 on the agenda, Mark Hoyt, and the Board's
22 going to proceed with hearing his license request.

23 There's someone on the call that needs to mute
24 their microphone until asked to speak, please.

25 MR. INGRAM: Shannon, are you --

1 MR. HOYT: Is this better?

2 MR. INGRAM: Yes.

3 MR. HOYT: Okay. Sorry about that.

4 MR. INGRAM: Hold on just a second, Mr. Hoyt.

5 MR. HOYT: Okay.

6 MR. INGRAM: Shannon, did you catch that?

7 THE REPORTER: That you received the
8 fingerprints back?

9 MR. INGRAM: Right, and we're going to move
10 forward with item number 19 at this time.

11 THE REPORTER: Yes, I did. Thank you.

12 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Mr. Hoyt,
14 please tell us a little bit about yourself and what you
15 intend to do with your license.

16 MR. HOYT: Okay. I'm currently an active
17 member in the North Las Vegas Police Department. I'm a
18 detective assigned to the Special Victims Unit, have
19 been since 2008. Recently assigned over to, in fact,
20 that's five or six years, to the Internet Crimes Against
21 Children and Human Trafficking Task Force. Prior to
22 starting at the North Las Vegas Police Department, I was
23 a Las Vegas Metro corrections officer. And I left there
24 just because I wanted to go to the street. Prior to
25 that, I was in the Air Force for eight years.

1 I am eligible for retirement in July of this
2 year. So what my plan is, is to get my P.I. license,
3 put it in abeyance for a little time, until I can retire
4 and start working as a P.I.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any
6 questions from the Board?

7 Okay. I'll entertain a motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
9 Cortez. I am motioning to approve Mr. Hoyt for an
10 individual private investigator license. If approved,
11 he is requesting that his individual license be placed
12 in abeyance so that we may become the qualifying agent.
13 Member to be approved is Mark M. Hoyt.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
15 I have a second?

16 MR. INGRAM: Excuse me, Madam Chair. He's
17 applying for private investigator and, also --

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: That's right.

19 MR. INGRAM: Private investigator.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: QA. Motioning to approve
21 the request.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. I have a
23 motion. Do I have a second?

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. I'll second.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Motion and a second.

1 All in favor, say "aye."

2 (Board members said "aye.")

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations,
4 Mr. Hoyt. It passes unanimously.

5 MR. HOYT: Thank you. Thank you, Board.
6 Appreciate it. Thank you again.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Now 23?

8 (There was a discussion off the record.)

9 MR. INGRAM: Shannon, for the record, this is
10 Kevin Ingram. I was just telling Madam Chair that --

11 Anyone that's on the call currently, you need
12 to mute your phone until called upon. We are hearing
13 everything going on in your background. Thank you.

14 THE REPORTER: Thank you.

15 MR. INGRAM: Okay. So those of you on the call
16 right now, we've gone through all of the fingerprints
17 that were received in our office this morning. And,
18 unfortunately, Mr. Hoyt's were the only ones in that
19 group.

20 So, Mr. Cooley, we're not going to be able to
21 move forward with your hearing today. We will notify
22 you as soon as we get your fingerprints and get you
23 scheduled for the next regularly scheduled Board
24 meeting.

25 Along with Mr. Toth, we will not be able to

1 move forward with your hearing today. Board staff will
2 notify you as soon as we receive the fingerprints.

3 And so is that it? Anybody, that's it?

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Yes, that's it.

5 MR. INGRAM: So, Mr. Toth and Mr. Cooley and
6 Mr. Leavitt, we will be in touch with you. You do not
7 need to remain on the call today. Thank you.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So at this time,
9 we'll take a quick 15 minutes. Okay. Take a quick
10 15-minute break. We'll be back on line at 10:40.

11 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief of Operations Lori
12 Irizarry. We told work card holders to call in at
13 11:30.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Oh.

15 MR. INGRAM: Okay.

16 MS. IRIZARRY: So that's the next time.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Maybe a longer break.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So I correct. We
20 will be back on line at 11:30.

21 * * * * *

22 (A break was taken, 10:24 to 11:30 a.m.)

23 * * * * *

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Good morning, and
25 welcome back to the PILB first quarter meeting.

1 And, Kevin, are you on?

2 MR. INGRAM: Shannon Taylor?

3 THE REPORTER: Yes, I'm here. Thank you.

4 MR. INGRAM: Thank you, Shannon.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So I'd like
6 to bring the meeting to order. And we'll start off with
7 agenda item number 27.

8 First, though, Board counsel, could you please
9 swear everybody in.

10 MR. DETMER: It would be my pleasure.

11 For all those who are about to testify, please
12 raise your right hand. Do you hereby swear or affirm to
13 tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the
14 truth?

15 (All applicants and witnesses present were
16 sworn/affirmed.)

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So when we call your
18 number or your name, please join the call, and then
19 please let us know that you understand that you're under
20 oath. Okay?

21 So we'll go ahead and get started. Is Angelina
22 Groom on the line? Angelina Groom?

23 Okay. We'll trail that till the end and see if
24 she joins us.

25 Moving on to agenda item 28, Joseph Robinson?

1 MR. ROBINSON: Yes, I'm here.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you,
3 Mr. Robinson. Are you aware you're under oath?

4 MR. ROBINSON: Yes, ma'am.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Sir, could
6 you tell us a little bit about yourself.

7 MR. ROBINSON: Well, I've been doing, being a
8 life coach and doing brand ambassadoring and teaching
9 people about the direct impacts of their decisions and
10 the importance of their decisions through my life
11 journey.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
13 there any questions?

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
15 Cortez. I have a question for Investigator Jones.

16 MR. JONES: Yes, this is Investigator Jones.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did we -- or I'm sorry.
18 This might have already been addressed. Did we receive
19 back his fingerprints?

20 MR. JONES: Yes. Yes, we got the -- I'm sorry.
21 This is Investigator Jones. We got the fingerprints
22 back last week.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And I'm sorry. I didn't
24 hear the last. Did we get a hit, is it cleared?

25 MR. JONES: There was one additional arrest

1 that was not on the initial report that you have in
2 front of you. February 12th of 1991, out of California,
3 the applicant was arrested for carrying a weapon in the
4 vehicle and having a firearm in a public place. This
5 was dismissed.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And what was the
7 disposition? I didn't hear the last part.

8 MR. JONES: Investigator Jones. This was
9 dismissed.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Oh, it was dismissed.

11 This question is now for -- this is Board
12 Member Cortez again. Question for Mr. Robinson. Could
13 you give me some history on your criminal background. I
14 see, well, now I know of the 1991 incident. I see the
15 1995 incident of carrying a firearm in a public place.
16 So that would make it, I believe, a second offense,
17 based on what I just heard. And then a DUI. So can I
18 get some information about the weapons charges? What's
19 going on with that?

20 MR. ROBINSON: Well, due to my childhood
21 mistakes, I had some, I had carried some problems with
22 the organization out there. And those, those charges,
23 without getting into the details, there was charges. I
24 was arrested, but they didn't -- they didn't find no
25 weapons on me actually. I was arrested for those

1 weapons, but those weapons was someone else's weapons.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Are we speaking about the
3 1991 or the 1995 incident?

4 MR. ROBINSON: I'm talking about both of them,
5 to my knowledge. They both, both of them.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Officer Jones, is it my
7 understanding that the 1995, the outcome was guilty?

8 MR. JONES: Yes. This was later dismissed
9 under 1203.4. But as the Board knows, we don't
10 recognize that, and that's why he was denied.

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. So just for
12 clarification, Mr. Robinson, you're indicating to me
13 that those, that it did not occur, that those charges
14 were dismissed, or is that what I understood?

15 MR. ROBINSON: The charges was dismissed based
16 on the fact that they had, that those weapons wasn't
17 actually mine.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay.

19 MR. ROBINSON: As far as my knowledge.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Investigator
21 Jones, is it my understanding that the court documents
22 or the disposition court documents were not provided?
23 Or did you get those, were those obtained, by any
24 chance?

25 MR. JONES: I do not have court documents for

1 the firearms charges. However, I do have one for the
2 DUI. I do have the fingerprint report, as I stated
3 previously, which do show both firearms were dismissed.
4 However, the 1995 one was under California Penal Code
5 1203.4.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. So we have court
7 documents for 2004, no court documents for the '95,
8 Correct?

9 MR. JONES: That is correct.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. That concludes all
11 my questions. Thanks. Thank you.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So, Mr. Robinson,
13 can I ask why you didn't disclose the 1991 arrest?

14 MR. ROBINSON: To my knowledge, I thought that
15 the charges was all -- it was three charges all in one.
16 I didn't even know nothing about the -- a '91 arrest, to
17 be honest with you. And, then, to speak on the DUI,
18 that was dropped down to a reckless driving, as far as
19 my knowledge as well.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
21 Cortez. I need clarification. Did you indicate that
22 1991, you were not aware of that arrest, therefore you
23 did not disclose it on the application?

24 MR. ROBINSON: No, I put what I -- as far as my
25 knowledge, I put what was on there, the '95. And on the

1 '95, from my records that I have, 'cause I have got this
2 expunged, it had two charges on there. So I thought
3 that was all the charges, I thought it was three charges
4 or one charge in three different.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Let me clarify my
6 question. Are you aware that there was a legal action
7 against you in 1991; do you recall of an arrest or a
8 citation?

9 MR. ROBINSON: Yes.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Is there a reason
11 why you did not disclose that?

12 MR. ROBINSON: I thought it was on there, on
13 the '95 charge, I thought it was on there at the same
14 penal code as -- there was two different penal codes on
15 this one charge. And from my, from my knowledge, that
16 those charges was all in one arrest.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And the 1991 occurred in
18 California, correct?

19 MR. ROBINSON: Yes, ma'am.

20 MR. ROBINSON: Okay. Now I understand. All
21 right. Thank you.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
23 other questions?

24 Investigator Jones, so the '91, just so I
25 understand, is that one's just an arrest and it was not

1 disclosed?

2 MR. JONES: Correct. And, additionally, this
3 was dismissed, not under 1203.4, was not specified in
4 the fingerprints, and they stated dismissed.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Okay. And so
6 I'm not sure I understand why he thinks that '91 and '95
7 are the same arrest, or the same action, I guess.

8 MR. JONES: Investigator Jones. I'm not sure,
9 either. They're showing up as separate events, but I'm
10 going to double-check the incident number right now.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Are there any
12 other questions while he checks that?

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Mr. Robinson, this is
14 Board Member Cortez. It was my understanding that you
15 were under the impression that the 1991 and then the
16 four years later 1995 event were tied together based on
17 California Penal Code?

18 MR. ROBINSON: Yes.

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Thank you.

20 MR. JONES: Yes, this is Investigator Jones.
21 They have different arrest case numbers for the '91 and
22 the '95 arrests.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Investigators Jones, this
24 is Board Member Cortez. Is the California Penal Code
25 that Mr. Robinson is referring back to, is that, are

1 those correct statements, or was there a
2 misunderstanding on his part?

3 MR. JONES: I believe, that would be a
4 misunderstanding on his part.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Thank you.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: If there are no
7 further questions, I'll entertain a motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
9 Brown. I move that we grant the appeal for
10 Mr. Robinson's work card registration.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
12 I have a second?

13 I'll call again. I have a motion. Do I have a
14 second?

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
16 Cortez. I'll second the motion to approve.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. I have a
18 motion. I have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

19 MR. INGRAM: Just for the record, normally,
20 when we're making a decision on a denial for an appeal,
21 we state for the record the reason for the motion.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Oh, okay.

23 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown. I'd
24 like to provide clarification to my motion to grant the
25 appeal for time and distance. This happened a number of

1 years ago.

2 (The Reporter indicated an inability to hear.)

3 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. This is Board
4 Member Brown. I'd like to clarify my motion to grant
5 the appeal due to time and distance from the offenses
6 listed.

7 THE REPORTER: Thank you very much.

8 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: You're welcome.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez.
10 Second the motion.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
12 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

13 (Board members said "aye.")

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Mr. Robinson,
15 your license has been approved. Someone from the PILB
16 will reach out to you for next steps. Okay?

17 MR. ROBINSON: Thank you. Thank you very much.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: You're very welcome,
19 sir.

20 No on 29. So item number 29, we don't have
21 fingerprints for.

22 So we're going to move on to item number 30.
23 Juan Smith, are you on the line? Mr. Smith, are you on
24 the line?

25 Okay. We'll trail that one.

1 Item number 31, we don't have the fingerprints
2 on as well. So we're going to trail that one.

3 Item number 32 is the same, we do not have the
4 fingerprints on.

5 So item number 33. Steven Bernard, are you on
6 the line, sir?

7 MR. BERNARD: Yes, ma'am.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Do you
9 understand you're under oath, sir?

10 MR. BERNARD: Yes, ma'am.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Tell us a
12 little bit about yourself, please.

13 MR. BERNARD: Well, I'm 48 years old. I'm a
14 father of five. And I'm just, you know, trying to get
15 by and work. And getting granted for this card will
16 help me with full-time employment.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any Board
18 questions?

19 MR. BERNARD: No, ma'am.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
21 Cortez. Mr. Bernard, what's your employment, what are
22 you doing today? Tell me what you're doing.

23 MR. BERNARD: Right now, I'm just trying to
24 hustle any side jobs with friends, like doing windows
25 and carpets and stuff like that, just to try to get by.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And how long have you
2 been doing that for?

3 MR. BERNARD: I've been doing it on and off for
4 eight years. And I've been working like through
5 agencies like the long-term, long-term assignments.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. I think that
7 about, what, 27 years ago, there was an incident where
8 there was a theft by deception. Could you give me a
9 little bit of details and background as to that
10 incident.

11 MR. BERNARD: Well, I met a girl in California.
12 And she was living in Utah, flew me out there to go see
13 her. We were out shopping in a mall. And her friend
14 had found a checkbook. And from there, they started
15 going to stores and writing checks.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Investigator Maxwell, I'm
17 assuming. Or I'm sorry. Are all of these statements
18 made current and up-to-date?

19 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief of Operations Lori
20 Irizarry taking Mr. Maxwell's cases. Yes, that is
21 correct. Mr. Bernard had listed the 1994 felony offense
22 out of Utah. And that was the only charge that came up
23 for arrests that came up on his fingerprint report.

24 (The Reporter asked Ms. Irizarry to repeat.)

25 MS. IRIZARRY: Certainly. I am taking

1 Mr. Maxwell's work card cases. And for Mr. Bernard, he
2 did list the 1994 felony offense out of Utah. And that
3 was the only offense and arrest that came back on his
4 fingerprint report.

5 THE REPORTER: Thank you.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Mr. Bernard, this is
7 Board Member Cortez. I have a question. The girlfriend
8 involved in the incident years ago, is, by any chance,
9 is she the mother of one of your children?

10 MR. BERNARD: Absolutely not. Absolutely not.
11 After that incident, I had never seen her again.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Thank you, sir.

13 MR. BERNARD: You're welcome.

14 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Mr. Bernard, this is Board
15 Member Brown. I would just like a little bit of
16 confirmation. You said that the ladies that you were
17 with were writing checks. Were you involved in that,
18 also?

19 MR. BERNARD: Not of actually writing the
20 checks, but trying to get some clothes, yes.

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. I just wanted to
22 make sure, because it looks like you did some time in
23 prison. The way you explained it, it was nothing other
24 than being in the wrong place, wrong time.

25 MR. BERNARD: No. I was in the wrong place,

1 wrong time. I didn't do any time in prison. I did like
2 60 some odd days in county jail.

3 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Thank you,
4 Mr. Bernard.

5 MR. BERNARD: You're welcome.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Madam Chief Irizarry, I
7 have a follow-up question. Mr. Bernard is indicating
8 that he did -- I'm sorry. Count. 60 days? Okay.

9 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief of Operations Lori
10 Irizarry. When the report was written by Mr. Maxwell,
11 we did not have the full fingerprint report, and that is
12 what was listed on the application. But what --
13 Mr. Bernard is correct. The original charge was a
14 forgery, which was dismissed without prejudice. He pled
15 to the lesser offense, theft by deception, convicted.
16 The prison sentence was suspended. He paid restitution
17 and did approximately 63 days jail time.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

19 MS. IRIZARRY: You're welcome.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
21 there any other questions?

22 Okay. I'll entertain a motion.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
24 Cortez. I will motion to approve the work card for
25 Mr. Bernard.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
2 I have a second?

3 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown. I'll
4 second.

5 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record. We
6 are including the basis for the motion.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: The motion being by the
8 statements made by the applicant regarding my questions.

9 (The Reporter indicated an inability to hear.)

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So this is Board Member
11 Cortez. I am approving, I am granting the appeal for
12 Mr. Bernard for the time and distance of the occurrence
13 stated on his application.

14 THE REPORTER: Thank you.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You're welcome.

16 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
17 Brown. Oh, I'm sorry. You have to say it first. You
18 said it once, but I'm sorry. Go ahead.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion.
20 Do we have a second?

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown. I
22 second the motion to grant the appeal.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion.
24 We have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

25 (Board members said "aye.")

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Mr. Bernard, your
2 work card has been approved. And the licensing Board
3 will reach out to you for next steps.

4 MR. BERNARD: Thank you very much. I
5 appreciate it.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: You're very welcome,
7 sir. Congratulations.

8 MR. BERNARD: Thank you.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Do we go to item 34?
10 Okay. So we're now at item number 34. Terrill Evans,
11 are you online?

12 MR. EVANS: Yes, I am.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Are you aware
14 you are under oath, sir?

15 MR. EVANS: Yes, I am.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you.
17 Tell us a little bit about yourself.

18 MR. EVANS: Actually, I just, this past
19 January, I just turned 42 years old. I am a father of
20 three. And I just, I just try to, just try to get by
21 and just try to work and do the things that I can to
22 provide for my kids.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And am I to
24 understand you were given a provisional card?

25 MR. EVANS: I'm sorry?

1 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. Yes, he -- or,
2 no, he was not. He is renewing his work card. So he
3 had a work card prior to this that expired in June 2020.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Are there any
5 questions?

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yes. Board Member
7 Gronauer. Mr. Evans, explain what happened there in
8 this here case in 2016, attempting to resist a public
9 officer with a firearm.

10 MR. EVANS: Okay. It was an incident that
11 happened. Me and my son's mom, we was coming from the
12 store. We was on the bus. And he was being very
13 disrespectful. He didn't know that we was together. He
14 was being very disrespectful. And when we got off the
15 bus, then he just started being very, very, very
16 disrespectful. But I didn't -- I said, "Look," I say,
17 and I told him, I said, "She's with me. That's my kid's
18 mom." And right there everything escalated, but I did
19 not even -- I had my firearm on me. So. But we just
20 continued to walk. And, I guess, he -- he seen my
21 firearm on me. So he went. I don't know what happened,
22 but as we was walking through the complex, then that's
23 when, that's when the Metro, they pulled on up. And I
24 just put my hands on up. And they felt my firearm on
25 me.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Madam,
2 everything to do with investigations, do you have a
3 police report on this?

4 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief of Operations Irizarry.
5 Yes, we do.

6 MR. EVANS: So I mean, but, so, so I mean after
7 the --

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Sir. Sir, please
9 hang on. We're asking the investigator some questions.
10 Please hold.

11 MR. EVANS: Okay. I'm sorry.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Ms. Irizarry, can you
13 go ahead and just give me the gist of this here report?

14 MS. IRIZARRY: Certainly. So. Chief Irizarry.
15 I do have the police report from the event. It's not
16 quite as Mr. Evans has explained. It appears that he
17 had threatened another male.

18 I'm going to read from the police report: He
19 threatened another male with a firearm and left a gas
20 station walking towards an apartment complex. While at
21 the apartment complex, the police tried to stop him as
22 he's holding his son. He refused to listen to commands
23 and kept walking. After several more attempts, he
24 finally puts down his son, and he reaches his hands near
25 his -- I'm reading from the report. He reaches his

1 hands in his hip and waistline and where the gun was
2 held. Then he backpedaled away from the officers, at
3 which time they drew weapons on him. And they saw the
4 firearm in his waist belt and holstered on his hip. The
5 subject had his hands on his firearm, and officers drew
6 their weapon and gave several more attempts. At that
7 time, he surrendered, got to his knees, and held his
8 hands above his head, where they confiscated the
9 9 millimeter.

10 During the arrest, they stated, Evans is not a
11 convicted felon but has multiple prior felony charges
12 out of Chicago for possession of cocaine, dangerous
13 drugs, assault, as well as multiple domestic batteries.
14 At that time, he was arrested and taken down to be
15 booked.

16 And then you have your report. I do have his
17 fingerprint report on his other arrests that did come
18 up.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Can I ask a
20 question? Were those other arrests -- so Board Member
21 Nixon. Were those other arrests brought up in his
22 initial application for a work card?

23 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. No, they were
24 not. When his fingerprints came back -- Chief Irizarry.
25 To answer your question, Ms. Nixon, the arrest out of

1 Chicago, as well as other offenses in Las Vegas, were
2 not listed on his application.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So, I guess, my
4 question is he had his work card originally, and that
5 didn't come up on the original application or
6 fingerprint run?

7 MS. IRIZARRY: That's incorrect. They did come
8 up on his prior. The police report says he was not a
9 convicted felon out of Chicago. He was never convicted
10 of his charges in Chicago. To elaborate, in 1996 and
11 1997, in Chicago, the charge was originally a felony,
12 mob action, use of force, which was dismissed,
13 possessing 15 or more grams, which was reduced to a
14 misdemeanor offense. In 2001, Chicago, domestic
15 battery, the disposition was unknown. Those were the
16 original charges out of Chicago.

17 In 2004, he had a DUI in Las Vegas, guilty,
18 misdemeanor. 2008, DUI, guilty at trial, misdemeanor,
19 he had to pay a fine, out of Las Vegas.

20 All those charges were documented on his first
21 work card, but none of them were felonies. So he was
22 able to get the work card.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So, then --
24 okay. Are there any other questions?

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Board Member

1 Gronauer. Mr. Evans, when did you get released from
2 CCDC?

3 MR. EVANS: I was released on June the 22nd,
4 2018.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What have you been
6 doing since then?

7 MR. EVANS: Actually, I've been -- actually
8 my -- I actually have went back to work, just for the
9 time being, up until last year, right before the
10 pandemic, and my guard had actually, it expired. And so
11 ever since then, I haven't been doing anything. I've
12 been looking for work, trying to do anything that I can
13 just to support, try to help support my kids.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. Thank you,
15 sir.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a question.
17 This is Board Member Nixon. You said you've gone back
18 to work. Was that as a security officer? Sir?

19 MR. EVANS: Yeah, I'm sorry. I couldn't hear
20 you.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So when you said
22 you'd gone back to work after you got out of jail, was
23 that as a security officer?

24 MR. EVANS: Yes. But then I didn't, I didn't
25 know that if my guard card or anything, but the job is

1 still, they let me continue to work for a little bit.
2 And actually, I was a part of Hope for Prisoners down
3 here in Las Vegas, Nevada. So I completed that course
4 and tried to better myself and to move forward.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIRMAN NIXON: Okay.

6 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
7 Brown. Question for Chief Irizarry. Does the report
8 from 2016 indicate anything about him being in uniform
9 or having a concealed carry permit if he wasn't in
10 uniform?

11 MR. EVANS: I appreciate it. Well, no,
12 actually --

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Sir, the question is
14 for the investigator. Sir, please hold. The question
15 was for the investigator.

16 MR. EVANS: Oh, I'm sorry.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: No problem.

18 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. It did not. It
19 states he was wearing plainclothes, nothing indicating a
20 security uniform, and that he was arrested for carrying
21 a concealed firearm, I'm sorry, a concealed weapon
22 firearm without a permit.

23 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any
25 further questions?

1 If no further questions, I'll entertain a
2 motion.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer.
4 I make the motion to uphold the denial.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
6 I have a second?

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
8 Cortez. I will second.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
10 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

11 (Board members said "aye.")

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So, sir,
13 unfortunately, at this time we're not able to approve
14 your appeal. So you still do not have a work card. If
15 you have any questions, please feel free to call the
16 PILB office.

17 MR. EVANS: Okay. So I was denied?

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: That's correct, yes.

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez.
20 That's correct.

21 My question is if I'm able to make a suggestion
22 to Mr. Evans in the event he wants to apply again, or if
23 I --

24 MR. EVANS: I do have a question. I mean I do
25 have a question.

1 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Evans, please hold.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Go ahead, Mr. Evans.
3 What's your question?

4 MR. EVANS: Well, okay. I understand that I
5 was, okay, pretty much I was in the wrong. You know, I
6 mean I do understand that. But I served my time. I did
7 my time that was -- I did my time in jail and
8 incarcerated. And they said that that is not going to
9 be a felony or anything. So I was like, okay, well, let
10 me apply, reapply. I know I was in the wrong.

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Let me. Just a
12 second, sir. Let me stop you there. The decision has
13 been to uphold the appeal. At this time, you know, I
14 heard you should go ahead and try again and just be as
15 forthcoming as you possibly can.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So, sir, the reason
17 that your work card was denied was because of time and
18 distance. You know, your incident just happened pretty
19 recently, and you don't have enough time and distance
20 from the time of the incident. We encourage you to
21 reapply again in a year and do the same thing you did
22 this time, disclose all of your arrests, and then it
23 will be reconsidered.

24 MR. EVANS: Okay. But this, my last arrest was
25 four years ago.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I understand, sir.

2 Thank you.

3 MR. EVANS: Okay. Can I get my money back?

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: No, sir.

5 MR. EVANS: So I can't get my money back,
6 neither?

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: No, sir. And we
8 have to move forward. Thank you.

9 MR. EVANS: That's bullshit.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Have a wonderful
11 day, sir.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Right there. Right
13 there.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So is this where we
15 take a recess, or do we, can we move on?

16 MR. IRIZARRY: There's one more.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

18 MS. IRIZARRY: Andre Cooper.

19 MS. READUS: Number 45 is on, too.

20 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. There was one
21 more, Andre Cooper, number 44, that was supposed to
22 called in at 11:30, but we do not have his prints.

23 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Cooper, are you on the call
24 right now, Andre Cooper?

25 MS. READUS: Number 45 is on the phone.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Ma'am, please hold.

2 MS. READUS: All right.

3 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Andre Cooper, are you on the
4 phone right now?

5 All right. For those of you that are currently
6 on the phone, be please keep your phones muted until we
7 call your name, so that we can stay on track without
8 interruptions.

9 MS. READUS: What about in regards to the
10 email?

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Ma'am, please hold.

12 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. They may be on
13 the phone call now. We advised them to call a little
14 early. But they technically are not supposed to call in
15 until 12:30.

16 (There was a discussion off the record.)

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So right now,
18 if you're not on the line, we'll trail you for later,
19 but we're going to see who's on the line. So. And
20 we'll have to reswear you in. So let me take a roll
21 call first. Okay.

22 MR. INGRAM: Okay. So if you're on the phone
23 right now, please respond that you're on the phone.
24 Dametrius Ford? Dametrius Ford?

25 MR. FORD: I'm here, Dametrius Ford.

1 MR. INGRAM: Okay. Great.

2 (There was a discussion off the record.)

3 MR. INGRAM: All right. So let me go ahead and
4 move on and see who also on the call. We have, do we
5 have Jason Lee on the phone? Jason Lee?

6 Marlowe Madden? Marlowe Madden?

7 Sixto Morales? Sixto Morales?

8 Nicholas Patton?

9 MR. PATTON: Here.

10 MR. INGRAM: Okay. Stand by.

11 Evelyn Vandernick? Evelyn Vandernick?

12 Scott Williams? Scott Williams?

13 Lee Johnson? Lee Johnson?

14 Sidney Moore? Sidney Moore?

15 Tanya Readus? Tanya Readus?

16 MS. READUS: Yes, I'm on the phone.

17 MR. INGRAM: Okay. All right. Stand by.

18 So, Mr. Detmer, we're swearing in Dametrius
19 Ford. We have Nicholas Patton. We have Tonya Readus.

20 MR. DETMER: And for the record, Mike Detmer.
21 For those who are about to testify, can you raise your
22 right hand? Do you hereby swear or affirm to tell the
23 truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth?

24 MS. READUS: Yes.

25 MR. FORD: Yes.

1 MR. PATTON: Yes.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we're now
3 on item number 35, Dametrius Ford?

4 MR. FORD: Yes.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Do you
6 understand, sir, that you're under oath? Do you
7 understand, sir, that you're under oath?

8 MR. FORD: Yes.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Tell us
10 a little bit about yourself.

11 MR. FORD: Well, right now, I am working. I've
12 been working for the last, I guess, about several years.
13 I was working in Los Angeles, California, well, actually
14 in Santa Monica at Hotel Carmel for about a year and a
15 half right before the coronavirus. And I was working
16 some other places after the incident. I moved to
17 Las Vegas. And I just got myself together. And I was
18 just taking care of some other things I had to take care
19 of with my license, to get my license back. And I got
20 it back. I paid some debts in California. And I did
21 some community service.

22 I've been working. I have been just trying to
23 get myself stable. And right now, I moved back to
24 Las Vegas recently, and I just got a job. And I have a
25 family. I have kids. I just had a newborn, eight-month

1 old. Her name's Anyla. And I've just been taking care
2 of my family and going to work every day. And I'm just
3 interested in being a security guard for the state of
4 Nevada. So I'm trying to pursue and qualify to be a
5 guard. And like I said, I was, I've been working every
6 day except for Saturday and Sunday. And, you know, I'm
7 just barely making it. But I'm trying to get more
8 income and try to find other ways to make an honest
9 living.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.
11 Congratulations on the newborn.

12 MR. FORD: Thank you.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any
14 questions from the Board?

15 MR. FORD: No, well --

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: No, sir. Hang on.
17 These are questions for the Board, from the Board to
18 you.

19 MR. FORD: Okay. Thank you.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
21 Cortez. Mr. Ford, question. I heard you're working and
22 working nights. I didn't hear what exactly that you
23 did.

24 MR. FORD: I am actually working for Polar
25 Shades, and they just produce shades for like different

1 various people or companies. And right now, I'm just
2 like in the production. We make the shades and pack
3 them. I'm doing the packing and the wrapping. I was at
4 first kind of like learning how to manufacture the
5 shades and just put them together. But now they have me
6 in shipping, so I'm just basically wrapping and
7 shipping.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And when you say shades,
9 explain to me what shades are.

10 MR. FORD: Shades are like shades for the
11 interior and the exterior of a house or a business.
12 They're to block the sun, from having too much sunlight
13 inside your house.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay.

15 MR. FORD: Or for a business or place of
16 business.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. And I also wanted
18 to get some clarification. Did you indicate that you'd
19 gotten into some trouble in Santa Monica, or were you
20 referring to the incident in Nevada?

21 MR. FORD: The incident in Nevada seven years
22 ago, seven, eight years ago. Yeah, that was it. After
23 that, I went back to California, because I was just
24 shook up myself from the incident. And I just got
25 myself together. Because I didn't have my license at

1 the time, either, while I was staying here. I had to go
2 back and finish paying on some old tickets and various
3 tickets, and I had just to take care of it. That's what
4 I did. I went back out there, and I took care of it,
5 and I got my license back. And I had to do community
6 service and deal with several courts in California
7 because of tickets I had when I was growing up and
8 getting minor, small tickets. And I took care of all
9 that stuff.

10 And now I have my license. I feel like I got
11 past them steps. And I'm just trying to pursue for what
12 I was already really trying to pursue for.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Can I get a quick
14 background synopsis as to what occurred?

15 MR. FORD: Well, I got in an incident where I
16 was like -- it was a person that I didn't really know
17 had tried to attempt to, you know, like shoot, shoot at
18 me. Or like basically it was someone that was messing
19 with me and my family. And it was like I don't know the
20 person, I don't know who the people were. I was just
21 really defending myself, and it happened to happen that
22 way. And I had to go to -- I was in custody. And, you
23 know, it was just, didn't look like I was defending
24 myself. And that's what had happened. But I couldn't
25 explain those matters, because the other person

1 didn't -- was like away, got away with the incident.
2 They -- whatever happened. I didn't run from the
3 incident. I was, I was already in the incident, and I
4 just had to explain and do what I had to do pertaining
5 to what the evidence was.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Thank you. I have
7 a follow-up question for Madam Irizarry.

8 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Sorry. Chief
10 Irizarry, could I get a synopsis of the police report?

11 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. In the
12 fingerprint report -- we did not receive a police
13 report -- Mr. Ford did not disclose the initial arrest
14 on his application. It came up on when we did his
15 SCOPE. After he was denied, he has provided court
16 documentation and did notify the investigator and list
17 it after the fact.

18 But the court documentation showed that it was
19 three charges. Assault with a deadly weapon, felony.
20 That was dismissed. Discharging gun with -- I'm sorry.
21 Discharging gun or other weapon where a person might be
22 in danger, gross misdemeanor, dismissed. He pled guilty
23 to aiming a gun at a person, gross misdemeanor.

24 MR. FORD: Yes.

25 MS. IRIZARRY: The only other offenses that

1 came up on his fingerprint report were traffic offenses,
2 which, I believe, Mr. Ford was trying to explain. He
3 had some traffic offenses that he had. He was going
4 back and forth. It looked as though there was only two
5 tickets about 10 years ago that he was paying on. But
6 other than that, those are the only other charge, that's
7 the only charge that showed up on his fingerprint
8 report.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
10 Cortez with a follow-up, a question. I'm assuming that
11 the -- there were some negotiations?

12 MS. IRIZARRY: I wouldn't know that answer.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: In the court documents.

14 MS. IRIZARRY: It just said they were
15 dismissed, and he pled guilty to the third.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Board Member
17 Cortez. Going back to Mr. Ford, is there a reason why
18 you failed to disclose until after the findings, or
19 could you give me a reason why you failed to disclose?

20 MR. FORD: Disclose? I don't understand that
21 question.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Why didn't you put
23 it on your application? This is Board Member Nixon.

24 MR. FORD: What did I put on my application?

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Why did you not put

1 the arrest and conviction on your application?

2 MR. FORD: You know what, I was just not, I
3 just didn't put it down. It's my mistake.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
5 questions?

6 Oh, Madam.

7 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. I wanted to
8 point out, Mr. Ford did have a prior work card, which
9 was issued in January 2015, expired in January 2020.
10 His listed employment ended in June of 2019. He was
11 working for approximately eight to 10 licensees during
12 the time that he had his work card prior to this. But I
13 do not show him working with a work card since June 26,
14 2019.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
16 questions?

17 MR. FORD: No.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: If there's no other
19 question, I'll entertain a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer.
21 I make a motion to uphold the denial. Time, distance
22 and the severity of the offense.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
24 Cortez. I second the motion to uphold the denial.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion.

1 We have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

2 (Board members said "aye.")

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So I'm sorry, sir,
4 but at this time we did not approve your work card. So
5 you could reach out to the PILB office for next steps.
6 We did not grant you the word card.

7 MR. FORD: Okay. Thank you.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: You're very welcome,
9 sir.

10 Mr. Patton, are you still on the line?

11 MR. PATTON: Yes, ma'am, I'm here.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you.

13 Are you aware you're under oath, sir?

14 MR. PATTON: Yes, ma'am, I am.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you.

16 Tell us a little bit about yourself.

17 MR. PATTON: My name is Nicholas Patton. I
18 have four daughters. I'm a good husband, hard-working
19 person, go to work. I love working with people, love
20 meeting new people, love taking care of people. I've
21 been doing security for like 10 years. And I just feel
22 like, you know, it's kind of my passion or whatever, you
23 know, look after people and take care of people,
24 whatever.

25 So I'm just out trying to get my card, you

1 know, so I can make some more things happen, in the
2 security field.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.

4 Are there any questions from the Board?

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
6 Cortez for -- I like Madam.

7 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do we have the
9 fingerprint result? I don't know if we got those back.
10 This is Board Member Cortez asking Chief Irizarry
11 whether or not the fingerprints came back clear.

12 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. Mr. Patton, at
13 the time that you guys received your report, we did not
14 get the fingerprints back. Since then, we have them
15 back. The offenses that he has listed are what show on
16 the fingerprints.

17 I wanted to point out. This is Mr. Patton's
18 second time before the Board. He was originally denied,
19 and his denial was upheld in December 2019 for
20 nondisclosure. At that time, the minutes show that the
21 Board had asked him to reapply in the year. He did
22 reapply in December of 2020. He has disclosed the event
23 at this time. And only the charges that he listed in
24 2014 and 2019 came back on his fingerprint report.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. This is Board

1 Member Cortez again. Mr. Patton, could you tell me
2 again, and this, I'm sorry for the lack of memory, but
3 could you tell me why you failed to disclose that you
4 were still on probation? I understand you did disclose
5 the incidences, but apparently that there was no mention
6 of probation. The probation, what's the status of that?

7 MR. PATTON: Probation, I didn't know anything
8 about probation. I didn't establish. I put like one or
9 two of them down because they were basically the same,
10 they was the same thing. I had got arrested for the
11 same charge. So that's why I only put like maybe one or
12 two charges the first time a couple years ago.

13 As far as probation, well, they just wanted me
14 to, I just paid a fine. One time I paid a fine.
15 Another time they just, you know, let me sit there for
16 like two hours, and then they released me.

17 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
18 Brown. Question for Mr. Patton. Did you say that
19 you've been working as a security guard for 10 years?

20 MR. PATTON: Yes, sir, I have.

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Where was that?

22 MR. PATTON: In Mississippi.

23 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Not here in Nevada?

24 MR. PATTON: No, I've been working here in
25 Nevada with security for like a year, maybe two years

1 now.

2 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: For who?

3 MR. PATTON: The Marquee, Marquee Tower.

4 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Follow-up question
5 for Chief Irizarry. Would that be working without a
6 work card?

7 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry.

8 MR. PATTON: No, sir, you don't need a PILB. I
9 think, it had to do with gaming, like a gaming
10 registration or something like that.

11 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Sir.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Please hold.

13 MR. PATTON: Oh, I'm sorry.

14 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. On his
15 application, he did list working security here in
16 Las Vegas for the casinos, the Marquee Night Club, which
17 does not require a work card.

18 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Oh, okay. Thank you.
19 Sorry.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
21 questions?

22 So just to be clear, because, I think, you
23 broke up a little, he is not on probation or any other
24 thing right now?

25 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. That's correct.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Board Member
2 Gronauer. Mr. Patton.

3 MR. PATTON: Yes, sir.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: The offense I see in
5 2018, April of 2018, violation of traffic, possession of
6 marijuana with firearm, what is that about?

7 MR. PATTON: I was, I was just on the way to my
8 house. And the police officer already had someone
9 pulled over on the side. So I was passing by them. I'm
10 not speeding, I'm not doing anything. I'm going the
11 speed limit just right. I have tinted windows. My
12 windows was a little tinted. So I'm guessing he wanted
13 to see what was going on, who was in the truck. So he
14 flew out from where he was, drove behind me, drove
15 behind me for a little while, and then he threw his
16 lights on. Okay. Recently, I had smoked, I had smoked
17 some marijuana. So my truck was smelling like
18 marijuana, whatever. So then they asked me to get out
19 of the car. I had, these were my own weapons, I had my
20 own weapons on me. You know, confiscated my weapons,
21 you know, took me to jail.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have a CCW for
23 that weapon?

24 MR. PATTON: No, sir. In Mississippi, I didn't
25 need a CC. I had my own, I had my firearms permit, and

1 I have a security guard permit, was all I needed to have
2 my firearms in Mississippi.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You have a security
4 guard permit to carry your gun?

5 MR. PATTON: The security guard permit was for
6 my work. But I have a firearms permit, also in
7 Mississippi, for my weapon.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. This arrest
9 happened in Mississippi?

10 MR. PATTON: Yes, sir.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. All right.
12 Yeah, I could see, that one's a felony.

13 MR. PATTON: Oh, no, sir. No, sir. It was not
14 a felony. I have no felonies.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. No problem.
16 Thank you, sir.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So was this one --
18 I'm sorry. This is Board Member Nixon. Was this one
19 dropped down to misdemeanor -- so this is Board Member
20 Nixon for Chief. It says on the report, severity,
21 felony. Was this dropped down to a misdemeanor?

22 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. One moment.

23 So for the 2018 offense, it was possession of
24 marijuana with a firearm. The severity is felony.
25 Disposition, it doesn't say it was dropped or reduced.

1 There was another offense with it, a traffic offense,
2 which was a misdemeanor. But it doesn't specifically
3 state this was reduced to a misdemeanor offense. But
4 originally, the severity was a felony, though.

5 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
6 Brown. Question for Mr. Patton.

7 MR. PATTON: Yes, sir.

8 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: You were convicted of a
9 very similar offense four years before in the state of
10 Mississippi?

11 MR. PATTON: Yes, sir.

12 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: And --

13 MR. PATTON: Do you want me to explain?

14 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: No, I think, I've got an
15 explanation here. It's pretty similar. I was wondering
16 why you didn't learn your lesson.

17 MR. PATTON: Well, I learned my lesson, sir.
18 I'm sorry. I'm really not a bad person. But I do some
19 marijuana or whatever. You know, so it was basically
20 the same thing, I had smoked some marijuana much earlier
21 and got pulled over.

22 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. And, sir, have you
23 been granted a concealed carry permit here in Nevada?

24 MR. PATTON: Yes, sir, I took my test. I took
25 my CCW test like a couple month or two ago, but I have

1 not received my card or whatever.

2 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Mr. Patton, this is Board
3 Member Brown again. Where was your Nevada concealed
4 carry permit issued out of, which agency?

5 MR. PATTON: It was issued here. I went to
6 the -- I want to say it's the 702 range, and I took the
7 class there. Yeah, I had to go down to the police
8 station. They wanted to pay some money. And then they
9 told me like a couple months, like some months or so,
10 maybe six months. I can't remember the exact time.

11 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Thank you.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I'm sorry. I'm not,
13 I don't think I'm getting it. This is Board Member
14 Nixon. Do we not have a disposition on the 2018 and
15 2014 convictions? Because it says, per minutes, the
16 applicant stated the disposition was jail time and a
17 fine.

18 MR. PATTON: Well, I had a fine.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Hang on, sir. This
20 is for the investigator.

21 MR. PATTON: Okay. Sorry.

22 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. In 2014, it
23 doesn't specifically state a disposition. It tells the
24 offense, possession of marijuana within a moving vehicle
25 with a firearm, misdemeanor offense. It doesn't say a

1 disposition on that charge.

2 2018, similar charge, a traffic violation,
3 traffic ordinance, as well as a possession of marijuana
4 with firearm, enhancement of penalty for drug charge
5 while in possession of a firearm, felony.

6 Neither 2014 or 2018 doesn't give us a final
7 disposition. And if the Board wants to give me maybe
8 about four minutes, I could run his SCOPE to see if a
9 CCW charge came up.

10 MR. SALADINO: Investigator Saladino, for the
11 record. There is no CCW charge or case on SCOPE. And I
12 do see that his application has been received by
13 Las Vegas Metro. And it's unknown right now if they've
14 issued it or not. I do have a permit number. I could
15 possibly follow up and see if it's been issued or been
16 denied.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: This is Board Member
18 Nixon. I'm just trying to understand. Don't we
19 normally have to get disposition paperwork on any cases
20 before they...

21 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. We request it
22 of them, because what came back on their fingerprints,
23 it's up to them to provide it. This particular case was
24 something that was already denied at the last Board
25 hearing. And they just advised him to list it.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

2 MS. IRIZARRY: So when he contacted
3 Mr. Maxwell, the original investigator, he relisted it
4 to be heard at the Board hearing again. I don't
5 believe, to his understanding, that additional paperwork
6 was requested at that time. So I don't believe
7 Mr. Maxwell requested it of him for this hearing,
8 either.

9 MR. INGRAM: Madam Chair, for the record, Kevin
10 Ingram. In perusing the minutes from the December 2019,
11 2019 Board hearing where he was denied, I don't see
12 anything where it asked him for additional information.
13 His testimony is almost -- where his testimony was in
14 2019, when questions were asked, upheld the denial based
15 on time and distance. And reasoning, Mr. -- at the
16 time, Acting Board Chairman Flynn said not just because
17 of the conviction of the marijuana, but because it was
18 marijuana with the -- with the possession of a firearm
19 with the possession of marijuana.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
21 questions?

22 MR. PATTON: Me?

23 UNIDENTIFIED: Hello?

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Sir, this is the
25 Board. Hang on one second.

1 MR. PATTON: I'm sorry.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
3 other questions?

4 I actually have a question. We didn't ask him
5 for the paperwork.

6 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record. The
7 Board's determination of whether or not to deny or
8 uphold his appeal on the registration would be for
9 competence, character, integrity. Those are just some
10 of the factors. If the Board makes a decision, it would
11 make a decision on the information provided, then the
12 Board can, of course, do so. If not, then the other
13 option is to deny or trail.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
15 Cortez. I would request that we trail the matter. I'm
16 sorry. This is Board Member Cortez motioning to trail
17 Mr. Patton's case to allow him ample time to retrieve
18 his court documentation. I don't know if we can visit
19 this at the next Board meeting.

20 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record. My
21 understanding is that he's not being denied. He's just
22 being trailed, postponed.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Postponed.

24 MR. DETMER: The Board's not making a
25 determination.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Right.

2 MR. DETMER: So the legal effect of a denial
3 wouldn't be in place.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay.

5 MR. DETMER: So if we trail, continue,
6 postpone, trail, whatever the word is, to the next
7 meeting. Or you can go to the end of this session or
8 tomorrow. So it's at the Board's discretion.

9 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member Brown
10 for Investigator Saladino. Do you have information
11 whether or not he's been issued a CCW by Metro?

12 MR. SALADINO: Investigator Saladino, for the
13 record. I believe, that information, I should have it
14 in a couple minutes.

15 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Would that change
16 anybody's mind about trailing it to just later?

17 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well, if we're going to
18 have a discussion -- this is Board Member Gronauer. But
19 if we're going to have a discussion, to me, it's -- you
20 know, I don't know what kind of paperwork we're asking
21 for. That's number one. And how do we direct him what
22 paperwork we're talking about.

23 And then my second part is, this is not much
24 different than the case we just denied prior to this
25 because of severity and time and distance. This is a

1 2018 offense. Four years prior to that was the same
2 offense. There are two different offenses four years
3 apart, and that's only three years from where we are
4 right now.

5 I have a problem trailing. I have a problem
6 doing a lot of things, well, except denying it. But, I
7 think, we have a motion that we're only in the
8 discussion of right now.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Agree, more of a
10 discussion than a motion.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: We're discussing the
12 motion is what I understand.

13 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record.
14 That's how I interpreted this discussion right now.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I'll take a motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: She already has the
17 motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I had a motion. I
19 believe, I -- this is Board Member Cortez. And, I
20 believe, I motioned to trail.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Until when?

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Until the next Board
23 meeting.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
25 I have a second?

1 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
2 Brown. I'll second.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. I
4 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

5 (Board members said "aye.")

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm sorry. This is Board
7 Member Cortez. I am not saying "aye."

8 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record. Just
9 for clarification, there are certain things you don't
10 have to vote on, but you can.

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That's correct, I have
12 the option to either agree or disagree based on my
13 motion.

14 MR. DETMER: Right.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. I don't know
17 where we're at here.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we're two
19 nays.

20 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: We have two nays and two
21 ayes.

22 MR. DETMER: Was there a call for nays?

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: All opposed?

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Nay.

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board member Gronauer.

1 MR. DETMER: So if there is a tie, the motion
2 doesn't pass.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So, sir,
4 unfortunately, at this time, the motion --

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: No. No.

6 MR. DETMER: I'm sorry. The motion to trail
7 didn't pass.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

9 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer for the record. The
10 motion doesn't pass. That doesn't necessarily close the
11 matter. There still has to be a disposition on where to
12 go from here.

13 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So I will
14 entertain another motion.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Board Member
16 Gronauer. I'll make a motion to uphold the denial.
17 It's based on severity of the offense and time and
18 distance.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
20 I have a second?

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: It's Board Member Brown.
22 I will second based on the same reasons given by Board
23 Member Gronauer.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
25 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

1 (Board members said "aye.")

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So I'm sorry.
3 At this time, Mr. Patton, we're unable to approve your
4 work card. Your denial has been upheld. You may
5 reapply in a year.

6 MR. PATTON: All right. Thank you.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

8 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. It should be
9 five years, two denials back-to-back.

10 MR. INGRAM: Mr. Patton, are you still there?

11 (There was a discussion off the record.)

12 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. I was just
13 stating to Director Ingram that with two back-to-back
14 denials, that it isn't a year for him to reapply. He
15 has to wait five years. And I will contact Mr. Patton
16 to let him know.

17 MR. INGRAM: So the Board will reach out to him
18 that since it was back-to-back denials, that he'll be
19 able to reapply in five years.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So now we're
21 at agenda item number 45. Ms. Tanya Readus, are you on
22 the line?

23 MS. READUS: Yes, ma'am.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Ms. Readus,
25 are you aware you're on, you're --

1 MS. READUS: Under oath.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: -- under oath?

3 MS. READUS: Yes, ma'am.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you.
5 Please go ahead and tell us a little bit about yourself.

6 MS. READUS: Well, I'm 52, 53 this year. I
7 have seven grown children. My last one just got a full
8 wrap with CSU. He's going, he was going to be at the
9 Big West Conference this year again. Before the
10 government closed down, it was last year. So that's
11 where my main focus has been, we get him through his
12 schooling. So he's the baby of seven.

13 And my sister got the job as the security
14 company, and she was like, "Yeah, go ahead, go and try.
15 They're hiring everybody right now." I went down there
16 and did everything, and my past messed me up, but I did
17 my own application. So I'm just trying to get back in
18 the work field, because.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Got it. Are there
20 any questions from the Board?

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Yes. This is Board Member
22 Brown. Question for Chief Irizarry. It indicates that
23 there were possibly six cases attributed to the
24 applicant, that we did not have a result of the
25 fingerprints. Do we have that now?

1 MS. IRIZARRY: Yes. Chief Irizarry. Yes.

2 Elaborate?

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Yes, please. I'm sorry.

4 MS. IRIZARRY: On your background report that
5 you would have received, this is a unique one, you would
6 notice that there was no actual charges listed on the
7 application. On her application, Ms. Readus marked yes
8 for felony and wrote 2005 San Diego probation, but no
9 further information. Office staff, at the time that she
10 turned in her application on March 30th, did tell her
11 and showed her that she needs to list all arrests and
12 all offenses. She didn't write, didn't know and
13 estimates the time, I'm sorry, how old she would have
14 been at the time of these offenses, or to get court
15 documentation or instructed her to get her SCOPE from
16 Las Vegas Metro for her court documents. She decided to
17 the turn in the application with the information missing
18 instead.

19 When Mr. Maxwell, the previous investigator,
20 had tried contacting Ms. Readus multiple times and
21 indicated that he was denying her for a felony
22 conviction, he did a preliminary search for San Diego
23 courts and noticed that there were six court cases in
24 her name, but the information was only available for
25 purchase. And he advised, he advised her that we are

1 still waiting for the fingerprint report and that the
2 fingerprint report may not list disposition, that she
3 should get the San Diego courts herself. She wrote a
4 letter stating that she did not have the financial means
5 to get the San Diego documents, and still did not
6 elaborate on any of her charges.

7 Since then, the fingerprint report has come
8 back. And I could list the charges that came up on
9 them.

10 1998, I'm sorry, 1988, San Diego, misdemeanor
11 hit and run, severity unknown, for under the influence
12 of a controlled substance, providing false ID,
13 unlawfully taking a vehicle without consent, probation
14 revoked.

15 1990, San Diego, robbery, severity and
16 disposition unknown.

17 1991, San Diego, second-degree burglary,
18 dismissed, plea to another charge, which was theft,
19 which she was convicted of, misdemeanor.

20 Same year, 1991, false impersonation, severity
21 unknown, possessing stolen property, severity unknown,
22 disposition on both unknown.

23 2000, San Diego, conspiracy to commit a crime,
24 three years probation, severity unknown. Dismissed
25 charges on that offense, I'm sorry, that incident were

1 access account information without consent for checking
2 account, dismissed, theft by forgery, dismissed.

3 2006, San Diego, manufacture, sell, possess
4 dangerous weapon, severity unknown, CCW in vehicle of a
5 convicted person, carrying a loaded firearm by a felon,
6 prohibited person with a firearm, conviction, but
7 severity unknown.

8 2011, San Diego, controlled substance
9 paraphernalia, possession of a controlled substance,
10 convicted, severity unknown.

11 2012, San Diego, receiving stolen property,
12 severity unknown, and a possession of stolen vehicle,
13 which was dismissed.

14 2013, San Diego, misdemeanor possession of a
15 controlled substance, guilty, misdemeanor prostitution,
16 guilty, misdemeanor possession of paraphernalia, guilty,
17 all convicted, three years probation, 22 days jail
18 sentence.

19 2014, Los Angeles, prostitution, misdemeanor,
20 disposition unknown.

21 2017, misdemeanor, criminal contempt, out of
22 Las Vegas.

23 2017, dismissed battery, out of Las Vegas.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
25 other questions?

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
2 Cortez. Ms. Vandernick, is there a reason why you
3 failed to disclose this on your application?

4 MS. READUS: I didn't have track of it, the
5 track record she has. I don't keep track of the stuff
6 that she has. But if I'd had it, I'd have put it on my
7 application. Half of it I don't remember. We're going
8 all the way back to '88.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So this is Board Member
10 Cortez again. Is it my understanding that you failed to
11 list it because you did not recall, based off of time, a
12 while ago?

13 MS. READUS: I just don't have the information.
14 Now, she just read all those cases back to you guys. I
15 don't have that information that's written down anywhere
16 to apply for a job. I said, yes, I was convicted. And
17 I thought I did the best I could.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So follow-up question.
19 This is Board Member Cortez.

20 MS. READUS: I thought you guys were the
21 background check people for you to find out that stuff.
22 That's why it isn't on my application.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Thank you, ma'am.
24 I have no further questions.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other

1 questions?

2 Okay. No other questions. I'll entertain a
3 motion.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
5 Cortez. I motion to uphold the denial based on time,
6 severity, lack of information, lack of disclosing
7 criminal history.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
9 we have a second?

10 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown. I'll
11 second.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a second. I
13 have a motion. I have a second. All in favor, say
14 "aye."

15 (Board members said "aye.")

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay.
17 Unfortunately, Mrs. Readus, you were denied, or your
18 denial was upheld. You may reapply in a year. Thank
19 you.

20 So at this point, we're going to go back to the
21 items that we trailed. Do you want to call the roll
22 call?

23 MR. INGRAM: I could do that.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Let's call a
25 roll call and swear in.

1 MR. INGRAM: All right. As I call your name,
2 if you'll just respond, please, for me.

3 Angelina Groom? Angelina Groom?

4 Anybody that's on the call right now, please
5 make sure your phone is muted until we call your name.
6 Thank you.

7 So Juan Smith?

8 MS. READUS: I don't know how you guys expect
9 somebody to get their license if you guys don't give
10 them a second chance. I mean --

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Ma'am, please get
12 off the line.

13 MR. INGRAM: Please put your phone on mute.

14 Okay. We're going to try this again. Angelina
15 Groom, are you on the line?

16 Juan Smith, are you on the line?

17 Jason Lee?

18 MR. LEE: Yes, sir.

19 MR. INGRAM: Okay. Stay on the line, please.

20 Marlowe Madden?

21 MR. MADDEN: Yes, sir.

22 MR. INGRAM: Please stay on the line.

23 MR. MADDEN: Okay.

24 MR. INGRAM: Sixto Morales?

25 MR. MORALES: Yeah, I'm here.

1 MR. INGRAM: Thank you. Please stay on the
2 line.

3 Evelyn Vandernick?

4 MS. VANDERNICK: I'm here.

5 MR. INGRAM: Please stay on the line.

6 Scott Williams?

7 MR. WILLIAMS: Yes, I'm here.

8 MR. INGRAM: Thank you. Please stay on the
9 line.

10 Lee Johnson?

11 MR. JOHNSON: Yes, I'm here.

12 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

13 Sidney Moore?

14 MR. MOORE: I'm here, yes.

15 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

16 Let's see. That's everybody. Okay.

17 Last call for Angelina Groom?

18 Last call for Juan Smith?

19 MR. INGRAM: Okay. Do you want to take action
20 on Groom and Smith, or do you want to trail them to the
21 very end?

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Let's trail them.

23 MR. INGRAM: All right. So that takes us to
24 item number 36, Mr. Jason Lee.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Board counsel, can

1 we have you swear in the new applicants on the line?

2 MR. DETMER: It would be my pleasure.

3 For those who are about to testify, if you
4 could please raise your right hand. Do you hereby swear
5 or affirm to tell the truth, the whole truth, and
6 nothing but the truth?

7 (Applicants were sworn/affirmed.)

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you.

9 Mr. Lee, are you on the line, sir?

10 MR. LEE: Yes.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Can you
12 confirm you're under oath?

13 MR. LEE: Yes, ma'am.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Tell us a
15 little bit about yourself, sir.

16 MR. LEE: Well, ma'am, I am originally from
17 Kalamazoo, Michigan. All the criminal activity that
18 I've ever done have been in Kalamazoo, Michigan. I
19 married and moved to California with my wife. I lived
20 there in California for approximately, maybe 10, 12
21 years. And then we moved two years ago to Las Vegas.

22 I am now in pursuit of a career in criminal
23 justice. I literally just got my associate's in August
24 of last year. I'm trying to get my life back together.
25 I have a family. I literally just took in two children

1 the day before yesterday to foster them until their
2 mother can get her life back on track. In order for me
3 to be able to provide for them, I need to be able to
4 procure a security license to be able to continue my
5 career in the criminal justice field.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.
7 Congratulations.

8 MR. LEE: Thank you, ma'am.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
10 questions?

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer.
12 Good afternoon, Mr. Lee.

13 MR. LEE: You too, sir.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Are you presently
15 employed?

16 MR. LEE: Yes, sir. I employed as an online
17 processor for the PP, PPP loan application. It's a
18 temporary contract through a company for these
19 applications. And I'm looking to -- I'm coming to the
20 near end of that. So I'm looking forward to being able
21 to get into my career line.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. What would
23 you plan on doing? You referenced this application as a
24 license. Do you understand it's not a license, it's a
25 work card to work for a licensee?

1 MR. LEE: Yes. Yes.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. What do you plan
3 on doing, if you get granted the work card, what do you
4 plan on doing?

5 MR. LEE: Becoming a security guard. I'm
6 trying to get into that field. I have my eye on
7 becoming either a manager or supervisor. I have the
8 experience, here again, living in California. I have
9 about four, five years worth of security experience. So
10 I was hoping to bring that over to Las Vegas and be able
11 to use that to the best of my ability.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have any
13 employment lined up?

14 MR. LEE: Not at this time. I would have had a
15 job with Golden Entertainment, but since they went back
16 and looked at my criminal history, I wasn't quite able
17 to get a job with them.

18 I might also add to the Board that me being
19 from Michigan, they are currently in a Clean Slate
20 program, which is allowing all people that have felonies
21 and misdemeanors and have kept their, you know, kept
22 their nose clean for the last eight years, they're
23 allowing them to be able to get their felony cleaned off
24 of their, off their record. And I am in the process and
25 have been in the process of being able to contact legal

1 aid in Michigan to get that taken care of. So it's just
2 a waiting game for me on that end.

3 But, anyhow, I need to get a job. I need to
4 be able to get this card so can be able to secure
5 employment here.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. I'm good. Thank
7 you.

8 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown.
9 Question for Mr. Lee. Mr. Lee, you said you worked in
10 security for a number of years. Do you hold a security
11 card or license in California?

12 MR. LEE: Yes, sir, I did hold one. But since
13 I no longer live in California, I had to let it lapse.

14 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Thank you.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any
16 further questions?

17 If there are no further questions, I'll
18 entertain a motion.

19 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
20 Brown. I make a motion to grant the appeal.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
22 I have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer.
24 I second.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I

1 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

2 (Board members said "aye.")

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations,
4 Mr. Lee. Your work card has been approved. You can
5 reach out to the PILB office for next steps.

6 MR. LEE: Thank you all. I appreciate your
7 time. And have a good day.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: You too, sir. Good
9 luck.

10 MR. LEE: Thank you.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Marlowe
12 Madden, are you on the line?

13 MR. MADDEN: Yes.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Are you aware
15 you're under oath, sir?

16 MR. MADDEN: Yes, ma'am.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Sir,
18 tell us a little bit about yourself.

19 MR. MADDEN: Yes. I'm from Michigan as well.
20 I caught an armed robbery back in 2013. I was a kid. I
21 was a follower. I was everything that you can call me,
22 a coward. I just felt like, you know, I didn't have any
23 other life to go. In the midst of that, I actually went
24 to prison for three years. I came home. I did three
25 years of parole. I passed the parole, came home. I had

1 two children, with three children. In the midst of
2 that, I had to leave them because I got shot. In the
3 midst of that, I had to wait for my brother to --
4 because he had a house for me, a home for me to move
5 into. And I've been healing up, and I feel like I'm to
6 the point of my ability where I'm strong and I'm able to
7 be a security guard. And he have a job for me, too.
8 Just I just got to have my guard card.

9 But other than that, like it's been eight years
10 for me as well. And I'm ready to change my life around
11 and show my worthy, of me being a citizen.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
13 questions?

14 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
15 Brown. For Mr. Marlowe. Or Mr. Madden. I'm sorry.
16 Could you give me a synopsis of your armed robbery,
17 arrest and conviction.

18 MR. MADDEN: Yes. I was actually in the car,
19 and I was in the midst of a hotdog. I just messed a
20 woman's purse. And I emptied the purse right there.
21 And it was like in the heat of the moment. I actually
22 gave the -- basically, threw the purse right out the
23 window. And I did it. It's no -- I'm not taking up for
24 my what I did or on any level. I just, that's what I
25 did. I threw the purse right out the window, but I kept

1 the phone. And when I kept the phone, they had a
2 tracking device on the phone. And that's how they found
3 me with the phone. But other than that, that was the
4 only thing I did.

5 I'm not belittling like the crime or anything
6 like, but that's what I did. On every level, I cry
7 every night about that. You got to own up to your
8 mistakes. And I feel like that was a mistake. I really
9 was like following like. You know, it ain't somebody
10 else like way of saying I have to figure a way to eat.
11 But other than that like, actually like that's not me.
12 But I was a CNA at the time. I really didn't have no
13 reason. I was a certified nurse. I had no reason to do
14 what I did. But I was smoking marijuana. I was
15 gambling. I was doing everything. And I'd sit in the
16 door. I had children. You know, other than that, it
17 was like I was supposed to have been a father. But
18 instead of being a father, being a good person, I was
19 being a follower. I was hanging around people in my
20 neighborhood that was doing everything. I guess, I was
21 a coward. I was doing everything trying to fit in.

22 But now I'm to the point I show my true colors,
23 say who I am. Everybody, in an incident, they
24 actually -- I got shot. You know, I got, well,
25 everything like in the midst of like telling people like

1 who I really am. But in the midst of that, I deserve it
2 all, you know. I'm not crying about my life. But other
3 than that, though, I really want to change. And I just
4 want to change.

5 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Thank you,
6 Mr. Madden.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer.
8 Mr. Madden.

9 MR. MADDEN: Yes.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I heard twice now that
11 you've been shot.

12 MR. MADDEN: Yes.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You were in a group of
14 people? You were being robbed? Explain that a little
15 bit more clear.

16 MR. MADDEN: Actually, I was shot by my father.
17 And I actually, I came out last year, I told everyone I
18 was bisexual. In the midst of that, my dad, he shot me.
19 He said he didn't raise me to be like that. But in the
20 midst of that, though, it was, you know, I took that.
21 And my brother said, "I got a room for you. You know,
22 don't worry about it, brother. You know, don't worry
23 about it, I got you." And he got me out of my
24 situation, and so I can bring my family out here with
25 me. But other than that, I got blackballed out of my

1 family position. And it's just, you know, I just need
2 to make another family. With my family life, as far as
3 my children like, they still accept me. My mother, she
4 still accept me. But as far as like several family
5 members, they don't accept me anymore. So it was I had
6 to leave.

7 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. Since
8 you've been out of prison and off parole, even since
9 you've been out of prison, have you been working?

10 MR. MADDEN: Actually, yes. I work at Auto
11 Zone now.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Is that here in
13 Nevada?

14 MR. MADDEN: Yes.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And how long have you
16 lived in Nevada?

17 MR. MADDEN: I've lived here for eight months
18 now approximately.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Do you have any jobs
20 lined up here if you get a card?

21 MR. MADDEN: Yes, I do. My brother actually
22 have a -- he has an opening for me.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: What does your brother
24 do?

25 MR. MADDEN: He does security. He works with

1 Smith's security.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. You mean like
3 the grocery store type?

4 MR. MADDEN: Yes, but he does security for the
5 lot.

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. All right.
7 Thank you. And, you know, bless your brother for taking
8 you in. That's nice.

9 MR. MADDEN: Yes, I appreciate him all the way.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You got to commend him
11 for that. Thank you.

12 MR. MADDEN: My sisters, too, as well. Because
13 it is not just him, it is my sisters and everybody, like
14 everybody out here, like my mom out here, everybody,
15 like they are rooting for me. You know, they know I'm
16 not a bad person or no devil. It's just, you know,
17 actually, you know, I'm a little too honest. And I'm
18 realizing that. But you mention that, and I do got a
19 past history. And I don't want that to faze me on no
20 level.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Mr. Madden, are you
22 still doing any kind of drugs?

23 MR. MADDEN: I actually smoke marijuana like if
24 I don't have anything else to do on my recreational
25 time. But other than that, I don't do anything.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. Do you ever
2 plan on getting in a program, or have you been in
3 programs?

4 MR. MADDEN: Yes, I have. I was in a substance
5 abuse program. I did a volunteer program for passing
6 out food. But other than that, that's it as far as the
7 volunteering I do, everything.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. No problem.
9 Thank you.

10 MR. MADDEN: Yes.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
12 questions from the Board?

13 If there's no other questions, I'll entertain a
14 motion.

15 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
16 Brown. I move to grant the appeal, based on time and
17 distance from the offense, and Mr. Madden's other trials
18 and tribulations that he's been through and he's coming
19 back strong.

20 MR. MADDEN: Yes.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
22 Cortez. I second the motion to approve the appeal,
23 based on Mr. Madden's forthcoming information.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
25 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

1 (Board members said "aye.")

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Sir,
3 congratulations. Your denial has been overturned. You
4 can reach out to the PILB office, and they'll tell you
5 next steps to get your actual license.

6 MR. MADDEN: Thank you. Thank you. Thank you
7 so much, you guys. I appreciate you guys for the
8 opportunity.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Yes, you are very
10 welcome, sir. Thank you.

11 MR. MADDEN: Okay. Thank you.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So we're on agenda
13 item number 38 now. Mr. Morales, are you on the line?

14 MR. MORALES: Yes, ma'am.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.
16 Tell us a little bit about yourself.

17 MR. MORALES: Well, I'm 43 years old. I from
18 Yuma, Arizona. And I've worked construction pretty much
19 my whole life and done security as well here in
20 Las Vegas and in Laughlin in the past. And, well, just
21 recently with everything that's been going on and a lot
22 of my -- the work I do, because I actually work in
23 natural gas and petroleum, it's been shut down. So I
24 got back into the security business. So right now, I'm
25 working at the Longhorn and as an armed security guard

1 in the casino. But I'm trying to get into the private
2 sector as well, try to like basically broaden my horizon
3 and stuff. And, so.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you,
5 sir.

6 Board, are there any questions?

7 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
8 Brown. Question for Mr. Morales. Why did you fail to
9 disclose two of your charges, one of them being a
10 felony?

11 MR. MORALES: No, I think, I put down -- was it
12 the first time back in -- when I applied?

13 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: The way that I understand
14 it, the first you applied, you were denied.

15 MR. MORALES: Yes.

16 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Because of the weapons
17 charge. But it shows that in 1995, you were arrested
18 for assault. And you did not disclose that. And in
19 1996, you were arrested for dangerous drug violation, a
20 felony. You did not disclose that until you received
21 your denial.

22 MR. MORALES: No, because the first time I --
23 the first time I did it, I was kind of young, and which
24 was back in like two thousand something, or in the '90s.
25 I can't remember. So I kind of, my understanding was a

1 little bit, kind of on the dumber side versus for where
2 my age is at right now. And then what happened back in
3 '95, the assault, I was actually a minor. I wasn't
4 quite 19. So I went ahead and put that down. Which I
5 don't know the mathi'cal part of it right now. Even to
6 this day, I believe, I was actually a minor at the time.
7 So I went ahead and put that down, anything that I've
8 been arrested for.

9 As far as the drug charges, even those, I
10 shouldn't have even had back then. Because at the time,
11 if I remember correctly, I was just shy of my 18th
12 birthday when I was arrested for those. And when I
13 tried to get the motion to suppress the evidence that
14 was found in the house -- because I moved in with my
15 buddy. And his uncle was on probation. His probation
16 officer came looking for him. I left them inside the
17 house. And they found drugs inside the house that were
18 not in my room or anything, but in his room. They ended
19 up, I was the only one that got charged for that. So.

20 I mean I know there's really no excuse for
21 anything or anything like that, but that's the honest
22 truth on that as to why I didn't put it down. Quite
23 honestly, I just -- it's like my way of understanding
24 things were a little bit different from what they are
25 today, you know, as far as disclosing things.

1 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Think, Mr. Morales.
2 Follow-up question for Chief Irizarry. Do you
3 have the fingerprint results back?

4 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. Yes, I do. To
5 elaborate all that Mr. Morales has stated, he
6 self-disclosed the '95, the '96, and the '96 offenses.
7 When his fingerprints came back, none of that came back
8 on his fingerprint report. It's listed on your report
9 because that's something he's reported after the fact.
10 I did check with Arizona, and I was unable to find any
11 of these charges, no counties in Arizona, but he
12 mentioned them on his own as possible. But because he
13 was a juvenile, he may have been charged as a juvenile
14 at the time.

15 The 1998 offense, the reason why he was denied,
16 which was a gross misdemeanor, CCW in a vehicle, that
17 was, it was a CCW in a vehicle, with reckless driving
18 and a DUI. The DUI was dismissed. The reckless driving
19 was dismissed. He was convicted of the CCW in a
20 vehicle. He had 36 months probation. His firearms
21 restrictions were -- he had firearms restrictions that
22 expired in July of 2001. And since then, he has no
23 firearms restrictions since July 2001.

24 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Thank you.

25 MR. MORALES: May I say something?

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Sure.

2 MR. MORALES: Okay. Now, on those, on those
3 charges, yes, I was kind of dumb and, again, extremely
4 stupid. Since then, I have not been in any kind of
5 trouble or anything other than your usual, you know,
6 speeding ticket here and there, you know. Which, again,
7 I know that those aren't good, either. But I have held
8 armed positions while in security since then, too, as
9 well. But I mean what I'm just trying to say is that,
10 you know, I was kind of young, and I was extremely
11 stupid. And, you know, some of the things I did
12 weren't, weren't the smartest. But, you know, I've been
13 clean ever since, so.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you,
15 sir.

16 Board, are there any other questions?

17 Okay. If there's no other questions, I'll
18 entertain a motion.

19 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
20 Brown. I'll move to grant the appeal, based on time and
21 distance from the charges.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
23 I have a second?

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
25 Cortez. I will second the motion to approve.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. I have a
2 motion. I have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

3 (Board members said "aye.")

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay, sir.
5 Congratulations. You have been awarded your work card.
6 Please contact the PILB for next steps.

7 MR. MORALES: Okay, ma'am. So what do I do,
8 call the Las Vegas office?

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Yes. Oh, I'm sorry.
10 I'm getting a -- they will call you tomorrow.

11 MR. MORALES: Okay. All right. Sounds good.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you.

13 MR. MORALES: All right. Thank you. And
14 that's it?

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Yes, sir.

16 MR. MORALES: Okay. All right. Thank you.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

18 Item number, agenda item number 40. Evelyn
19 Vandernick, are you on the line?

20 MS. VANDERNICK: Yes, I am.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, ma'am.
22 Could you please -- or are you aware you're under oath?

23 MS. VANDERNICK: Yes, I do.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Could you
25 please tell us a little bit about yourself.

1 MS. VANDERNICK: Yes. I am 20 years old. This
2 is my first job kind of interview thing. I recently had
3 a kid. I did stillbirth and I lost my son. I'm getting
4 married to a security guard myself. And he has like a
5 thing for security in like storage unit stuff. So it
6 really is a good interest for me to get into. I have a
7 juvenile past. Other than that, I really haven't done
8 much. I'm young. I'm 20. And, yeah.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you.
10 Board, are there any questions?

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer.
12 Can you explain, Mrs. Vandernick, can you please explain
13 what happened here in February 2020, just a little over
14 a year ago, with the CCW?

15 MS. VANDERNICK: I was -- that's for carrying a
16 concealed weapon. It was my fiance's firearm. I had it
17 on me for protection because of the area I live in. But
18 the state has dropped the case after I did my time
19 sentence, and because they said no intent for harmful
20 use. And I just really had it on me as safety. And the
21 security jacket I had on covered it. So, yeah.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Why did you get
23 stopped, or how did that happen?

24 MS. VANDERNICK: Oh, well, I had gotten stopped
25 because I was -- my dad came down for our wedding, and

1 he had like gave it to me as a gift, the car. And I
2 didn't know that he had a warrant under his name. And
3 his left taillight was out. And I was making a
4 left-hand turn. And, but, yeah, so. And, yeah. I was
5 like, ah, why didn't he tell me about that?

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Was this your
7 car or your dad's car?

8 MS. VANDERNICK: He had just gifted it to me.
9 So it was his, still his legally, but it would have been
10 mine.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Was it registered to
12 him at the time?

13 MS. VANDERNICK: Yes, ma'am. I mean yes, sir.
14 Sorry.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Where did you have the
16 weapon?

17 MS. VANDERNICK: It was on -- it was in the
18 holster on my hip.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: This is Board Member
20 Nixon. What do you do now?

21 MS. VANDERNICK: Currently, I have an interest
22 into starting my own business, because I have a
23 managerial and associate's. So like I'm working on
24 getting my business license and working with my husband
25 in his clothing brand. My husband has a job lined up

1 already with me at his company, so when I get approved.
2 But right now, currently, this would be my first like
3 job position.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So in your
5 statement earlier, you said that you had it underneath
6 your security jacket. Was that your jacket?

7 MS. VANDERNICK: No, it was his jacket. He was
8 in jail at the time for traffic tickets. And I was
9 going to see, I was on my way to see him in visitation.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you.

11 MS. VANDERNICK: Yes, ma'am.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
13 Cortez for a question for Chief Irizarry, Madam
14 Irizarry. Am I reading this correctly, that the arrest
15 and conviction was not disclosed?

16 MS. IRIZARRY: Chief Irizarry. Correct, she
17 did not disclose.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you. That's all my
19 questions.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
21 questions?

22 Okay. I'll entertain a motion.

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Gronauer. I'll
24 make a motion to deny the appeal. The reason is for
25 time, distance, severity, and for nondisclosure.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
2 I have a second?

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
4 Cortez. I will second the motion.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
6 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

7 (Board members said "aye.")

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So at this
9 time, Ms. Vandernick, you did not -- or the denial was
10 upheld. Sorry. You may reapply in a year.

11 MS. VANDERNICK: Thank you.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

13 Mr. Williams, are you on the line, Mr. Scott
14 Williams?

15 MR. WILLIAMS: I'm sorry. Yes, I am.

16 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir. Are
17 you aware you're under oath?

18 MR. WILLIAMS: Yes, I am.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Mr. Williams,
20 tell us a little bit about yourself.

21 MR. WILLIAMS: Well, I'm 53 years old. I'm on
22 disability, so just looking for part-time work. The
23 company that wanted to hire me was willing to work with
24 the hours and stuff that I could do. Just changing my
25 life, you know. I found the lord Jesus. And just

1 really working hard and changing my life. I'm finding
2 that it's understandable but sad that my past from 30
3 some years ago is holding me back.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
5 questions for Mr. Williams?

6 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
7 Brown. I do have questions for Mr. Williams.
8 Mr. Williams, what type of security work are you
9 planning to go into?

10 MR. WILLIAMS: Just working for Securitas at
11 certain job sites.

12 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Would that be an armed or
13 unarmed position?

14 MR. WILLIAMS: Unarmed. I have no desire to be
15 armed.

16 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Then, you talked
17 about things from your past 30 years ago being held
18 against you or holding you back. Tell me about the
19 trespassing three years ago.

20 MR. WILLIAMS: Okay. That's kind of a long
21 story, and I'll try to make it short. I was living in
22 an assisted living facility, and one of the other
23 residents had pushed me, which got me angry, and I
24 chased her. There were some staff members there that
25 did not like me because I got them in trouble for

1 sleeping during the night shift, because I was not
2 getting my medication. And just turned out all to be a
3 lie. But the offer that was made up to me was in my
4 better half to plead guilty and not stay in jail and
5 fight it. And even the judge had talked to me about
6 that.

7 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. What was the
8 original charge?

9 MR. WILLIAMS: I'm trying to remember, sir, and
10 I'm sorry. My memory's not the best. I think, there
11 was many charges, and a lot were dropped. I know
12 trespassing was one. And, I think, assault was one.

13 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Thank you,
14 Mr. Williams.

15 Chief Irizarry, can you expand on it?

16 MS. IRIZARRY: Certainly. Chief Irizarry. In
17 2018, the charges were burglary, second-degree burglary
18 attempt, felony, which was dropped. Assault third
19 degree, misdemeanor, that one was reduced. There were
20 two trespassing. Another charge was crimes against a
21 person, four counts. Trespassing a dwelling, felony.
22 It was deferred, then dismissed, and then reduced to a
23 misdemeanor, yeah, misdemeanor trespassing. Assault,
24 knowingly cause injury, misdemeanor, dismissed. Threats
25 against a person, harassment, misdemeanor, dismissed.

1 And then one, two, three, four counts of assault
2 menacing, misdemeanors, all were dismissed.

3 So on all of those charges, the only one he was
4 actually convicted of was the lesser trespassing
5 misdemeanor offense.

6 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you. No further
7 questions.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
9 questions?

10 MR. WILLIAMS: Can I comment on that
11 trespassing, please?

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: No, sir.

13 MR. WILLIAMS: Okay.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any
15 questions from the Board?

16 Okay. If no questions, I'll entertain a
17 motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
19 Brown. I move to deny the appeal, based on time and
20 distance from the incidents, severity of them.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion, and
22 I have -- do I have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Gronauer. Second.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
25 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

1 (Board members said "aye.")

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Sir, your denial has
3 been upheld. You may reapply in a year. Thank you.

4 MR. WILLIAMS: Thank you.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Mr. Lee Johnson, are
6 you on the line, sir?

7 MR. JOHNSON: Yes, ma'am.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Are you
9 aware you are under oath, sir?

10 MR. JOHNSON: Excuse me?

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are you aware you're
12 under oath?

13 MR. JOHNSON: Yes.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Mr. Lee,
15 tell us a little bit about yourself.

16 MR. JOHNSON: I'm 50 years old. I just turned
17 50 January 29th. I've been living in Las Vegas, Nevada
18 for almost, almost two years. I'm down here since
19 July 11, 2019. Worked at Good Will for quite -- start
20 September 19th. And I've been working there since the
21 pandemic, the coronavirus. I've been laid off since
22 last year, March. So I've just been really getting
23 unemployment. And I applied for Avalon Security, where
24 my niece worked at. And she's telling me that they
25 would help me, you know, find me a -- you know, well,

1 she can help me find a job. So I applied. I got
2 denied.

3 So now I'm here at the Board, you know. But
4 with my history, I've been out of jail almost 19 years
5 now. July 2nd of this year it would be 19 years that
6 I've been out. I had a rough life of growing up with my
7 parents, with my mom being on drugs. And so that got me
8 out in the streets to sell drugs to make money for
9 myself, for a living for myself, because I was put out
10 of my house, and I was raised with another family.

11 So I started doing, selling drugs and stuff.
12 Like I got caught up so many times. So I told myself.
13 I went to work. You know, and I've been in jail. And
14 that was a place that I never did like. And when I went
15 to the penitentiary one time, that was my last time.
16 And that's been like almost 19 years ago now. I haven't
17 been back to jail, no time, no, no, no nothing.

18 And I'm out here and trying to change my life.
19 I have 10 kids. I have three sets of twins. I have
20 seven grandbabies. I'm living with my son right now.
21 You know, we're helping each other out. He has three
22 kids. He has a set of twins and his older boy. So we
23 are working things out. So I told him, said we'll apply
24 and, you know, to get your license so we can make a
25 better employment, and might move out, somewhere to

1 live. Because we live in an apartment building. And
2 I'd prefer for me and him to have a better relationship
3 and to raise the kids.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.

5 Board, are there any questions?

6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer.

7 Mr. Johnson.

8 MR. JOHNSON: Yes, sir.

9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Is there a reason that
10 you did not disclose this felony arrest?

11 MR. JOHNSON: No. All of my things that I did,
12 I done my time for it.

13 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Yeah, but on your
14 application, is there a reason why, in your original
15 application, you did not write in there your previous
16 arrest?

17 MR. JOHNSON: I didn't really know the date of
18 the arrest. I just probably knew the year of it. I
19 didn't know the exact date that I went to jail. But I
20 just know probably the year that I went and when I got
21 out, which is probably 2002 or 2003 I went in, and got
22 out maybe 2004 or 2005, within that time. And I felt
23 within that time, when I applied, when I didn't put the
24 exact information on there, I didn't think that it would
25 come back on me like that, because I've been out almost

1 19 years. So I feel that, you know, it was so for my
2 background.

3 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. You know,
4 it's -- I just don't know, quite understand what you
5 mean. You didn't remember? Hold on. Just --
6 Mr. Johnson, it's all right. I'll strike that out
7 there.

8 And, Investigator Saladino, he said he put
9 something down on the application.

10 MR. JOHNSON: On the application, that I put
11 down for --

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Sir, Mr. Johnson, hold
13 on.

14 MR. JOHNSON: Okay.

15 MR. SALADINO: In regards to the applicant's
16 application, he did not disclose on the application.
17 However, once he was denied, he did put that in his
18 appeal letter that he was arrested for a felony selling.

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. Thank you.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
21 Cortez. Mr. Johnson, again, I need some clarification.
22 Why did you fail to disclose it until after the denial?
23 I believe, the application clearly states to list all
24 criminal history. So I'm just kind of curious as to why
25 you still did not list until after it was denied.

1 MR. JOHNSON: I did not, I didn't know. I just
2 filled the application out the best way I can.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay.

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer
5 again. Are you currently employed with Avalon?

6 MR. JOHNSON: Yes, I am. Right now, I'm just
7 laid off. She did not fire me or anything, all due
8 because it was temporary. And once if I get my guard
9 card back, she told me to call her and I'm more than
10 welcome to come back. She said, "Since you've been
11 temporary laid off right now," she told me to draw my
12 unemployment and wait for the license, what I'm doing
13 now, and let her know if I get my license back, then
14 says I'm more than welcome to go back to work with her,
15 her and her husband.

16 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Investigator Saladino,
17 have we had a problem with Avalon Security?

18 MR. SALADINO: Investigator Saladino, for the
19 record. We have not had any issues with Avalon prior,
20 prior to this. However, when the applicant sent in his
21 appeal letter, he put on there that he was working for
22 Avalon. When I reached out to Avalon, there was some
23 confusion with the qualifying agent and his office
24 manager. When I talked to the office manager, she was
25 unaware that she was supposed to keep a roster of

1 employees. I asked her specifically about Mr. Johnson.
2 She said that he is a really good employee. And I told
3 her, you know, "Had we known that he was on your roster,
4 you would have gotten the denial letter stating that his
5 application had been denied., where you're dealing with
6 a roster."

7 So they were unaware, I guess, of how the
8 roster worked. Since then, they have added all their
9 employees onto the roster. So that's been fixed.
10 However, they did receive a violation for not having
11 Mr. Johnson on the roster. And I don't think they're
12 going to have any issues moving forward, now they
13 understand how the roster works and they're able to get
14 into their portal. The office manager, when I asked her
15 about Mr. Johnson, she stated, you know, "While he was
16 in provisional status, he was a really good employee,
17 and, you know, we did just want to lay him off." And at
18 the Board meeting, they're looking forward to having him
19 come back, because he was a good employee while he was
20 working.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: To follow up again,
22 Investigator Saladino, was Avalon issued a citation?
23 Was there a cost involved?

24 MR. SALADINO: Yes. They were issued a
25 violation for not having him disclosed on the roster,

1 which is a \$25 fine.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Did they pay the \$25?

3 MR. SALADINO: It's been issued. We're just
4 waiting for the monies to come in.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: How long ago was it
6 issued?

7 MR. SALADINO: It was issued March 1st. The
8 reason I waited a while to issue it was I wanted to make
9 sure they had gotten in compliance with the rest of the
10 roster before issuing that citation for the roster
11 issues.

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Very well.

13 Mr. Johnson, this is still Board Member
14 Gronauer. I just have a problem with -- this Board,
15 it's always had a history of when you don't disclose,
16 you usually don't get approved. So I'm just letting you
17 know that you have to read this carefully and fill in
18 all the blanks and make sure you know what you're doing
19 all the time. Thank you.

20 MR. JOHNSON: Okay.

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
22 other questions?

23 Okay. At this time, I'll entertain a motion.

24 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Board Member
25 Gronauer. I'll make a motion to deny the appeal of

1 Mr. Lee Johnson. And the main reason is we have a
2 history of nondisclosure for making a denial.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
4 I have a second?

5 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
6 Brown. I will second the motion.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
8 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

9 (Board members said "aye.")

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Mr. Johnson, your
11 denial was upheld. And you may reapply again, sir, in a
12 year.

13 MR. JOHNSON: Okay. Thank you.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Please disclose
15 everything at that time. Thank you.

16 MR. JOHNSON: Bye-bye.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Mr. Moore?

18 MR. MOORE: Yes, I'm here.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir. Are
20 you aware you're under oath?

21 MR. MOORE: Yes, I am.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Please tell
23 us a little bit about yourself.

24 MR. MOORE: Yes. I grew up in Reno, Nevada,
25 went to Reno schools, graduated from Reno High School.

1 I went to work for the Nugget in downtown Reno. I
2 started in 1985. I retired in 2005. I had some very
3 close friends that lived in Oregon. So when I retired,
4 I moved to Oregon and moved to Corvallis, where I had
5 some friends that owned a mobile home park. So I moved
6 in there. I bought a small fifth-wheel. And they asked
7 me if I would work a little bit at night and kind of
8 keep my eye on the trailer park. It was in a mobile
9 home community. So I said, "Fine." I went to the
10 sheriff's office, and I received a carry permit, which
11 lasted, I believe, four years.

12 In the meantime, I'd got in the habit of
13 carrying my pistol with me in a backpack on the front
14 seat, on the floor of the passenger seat.

15 And, anyway, from there, my sister, who lives
16 in Reno, she got breast cancer, and she wanted her big
17 brother to be closer. So I move the back to Reno. And
18 I went to work for Allied Security. And I worked for
19 them for five days. I had a nice job. The people were
20 wonderful. It was great. I got along with everybody.
21 I enjoyed the work. And I was kind of bored because I
22 hadn't worked in about 15 years.

23 So, anyway, then I got a call from my boss at
24 Allied that said that I couldn't receive my police card
25 or my work card because of the weapons charge.

1 So that's who I am up-to-date.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
3 questions?

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer.
5 Mr. Moore, what have you been doing since that time?

6 MR. MOORE: I got a job. I'm working part-time
7 at Safeway up on McCarran.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right.

9 MR. MOORE: I've been working about 15 hours a
10 week.

11 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. This
12 offense, the way I read it, occurred in 2004.

13 MR. MOORE: Yes, sir. It was quite a while
14 ago.

15 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well, yeah. So what
16 have you been doing in the past 17 years?

17 MR. MOORE: Well, for 15 years, I was up in
18 Oregon. I was playing golf and fishing and enjoying my
19 retirement. Then, when my sister got sick, I moved back
20 to Reno.

21 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. No problem.

22 MR. MOORE: She's got breast cancer. And so I
23 try to stay with her as often as I possibly can. The
24 cancer is in remission. So hope to God she stays
25 healthy.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. This is Board
2 Member Gronauer again. What do you plan on doing with a
3 work card here?

4 MR. MOORE: I'd like to go back to work for
5 Allied. They were great to me. I enjoyed the job,
6 worked with some good people. Everything was going fine
7 until the situation with the denial of my work card.

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: So that's why you only
9 worked for them for five days?

10 MR. MOORE: I worked for Allied for about five
11 days, and that's when I was told that my work card was
12 denied. So I had to give all my uniforms back. And I
13 needed a job because I live on Social Security. So what
14 I did was I went to -- I had a chance to work for
15 Safeway. So I figured, in the interim, while I'm
16 waiting to hopefully get my work card, that'll, you
17 know, help keep me afloat.

18 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Absolutely. Thank you,
19 sir.

20 MR. MOORE: You're very welcome.

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
22 Brown. Mr. Moore, you disclosed the DUIs. Why did you
23 fail to disclose the weapons charge of 2004?

24 MR. MOORE: I didn't disclose it. I was
25 arrested on a DUI, and I had my pistol in my backpack,

1 which was on the floor in the front seat of the
2 passenger side of the vehicle.

3 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Thank you. I
4 believe, Investigator Saladino may be able to give me
5 clarification.

6 MR. SALADINO: Investigator Saladino, for the
7 record. The applicant did disclose both of the DUI
8 arrests. When the fingerprint report came back with the
9 2004, he did have a disclosure for the driving under the
10 influence, carrying a loaded firearm in public. But
11 when I talked to the applicant, you know, I said, "You
12 listed these DUIs. What happened with the firearm?"
13 And he said stated, just like he did on the record, that
14 that was in his backpack, it was legally owned at the
15 time. However, because he got pulled over with the DUI,
16 found the firearm in the backpack. He then stated about
17 how he had a custom holster and so forth. Again, it
18 legally owned when he got caught with the DUI.

19 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So did he have --
21 this is Board Member Nixon. Did he have a CCW for
22 Oregon? Or wasn't he in Oregon?

23 MR. SALADINO: That was in California.

24 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: California. Okay.

25 MR. SALADINO: Yeah, it happened in California.

1 I don't know if he had a CCW or not.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So what was the
3 actual charge, then; was it just a DUI, or was it the
4 DUI with a loaded firearm?

5 MR. SALADINO: The actual charge was DUI and
6 then carrying a loaded firearm in a public place.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
8 questions?

9 Okay. If there's no other questions, I'll take
10 a motion.

11 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
12 Brown. I move to grant the appeal.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board --

14 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: I'm sorry. Based on the
15 distance from the conviction.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
17 Cortez. I second the motion to approve.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So I have a
19 motion. I have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

20 (Board members said "aye.")

21 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Sir,
22 Mr. Moore, your work card has been approved. The PILB
23 will contact you with next steps. Congratulations.

24 MR. MOORE: I appreciate it so very much.
25 Thank you to all you folks for your help. Thanks again.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Number 44 we do not
2 have fingerprints on. Is that correct? And we did
3 number 45.

4 (The Reporter indicate an inability to hear.)

5 MR. INGRAM: I was just informing Chair that we
6 could go back to items number 27, Angelina Groom, and
7 number 30, Juan Smith, if they so choose.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we'll go
9 ahead and move to item number 27. Angelina Groom, are
10 you on the line? Calling for Angelina Groom?

11 Okay. With her not being on the line, I'll
12 take a motion.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
14 Cortez. I motion to uphold the denial.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
16 I have a second?

17 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown. I
18 will second.

19 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
20 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

21 (Board members said "aye.")

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And then you
23 said 30. Mr. Smith, Mr. Juan Smith, are you on the
24 line? Calling again for Mr. Smith?

25 Okay. With Mr. Smith not being on the line,

1 I'll entertain a motion.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
3 Cortez. I am motioning to uphold the denial.

4 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
5 I have a second?

6 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: It's Board Member Brown.
7 I'll second the motion.

8 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
9 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

10 (Board members said "aye.")

11 MR. INGRAM: Shannon, for the record, both of
12 the satellite lines went dead again. So we're trying to
13 use the large speaker in the middle of the room. We'll
14 do our best to speak at the microphone. If you have
15 trouble hearing us, please let us know.

16 THE REPORTER: You know I will. Thank you.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So do we want to
18 move, then, to item number 46?

19 Okay. We are at item number 46, Starside
20 Security & Investigation. Is Mr. Robert Coventry and
21 Yvonne Coventry on the line, please?

22 MRS. COVENTRY: Yes, this is Yvonne Coventry.

23 MR. COVENTRY: And Robert Coventry.

24 MR. INGRAM: Have you guys been sworn in?

25 MR. COVENTRY: We have not.

1 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Counsel, could you
2 please swear them in.

3 MR. DETMER: It would be my pleasure. For the
4 record, Mike Detmer.

5 Mr. and Mrs. Coventry, if you could please
6 raise your right hand. Do you hereby swear or affirm to
7 tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the
8 truth?

9 MR. COVENTRY: I do.

10 MRS. COVENTRY: I do.

11 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

12 MR. COVENTRY: We've left for the closed
13 session, please.

14 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record.
15 Madam Chair, if it is the desire to move into a closed
16 session, that has to be done with a motion by a member
17 of the Board and then action to do so.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
19 request for a closed session. I'll entertain a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: This is Board Member
21 Gronauer. I make a motion to go into a closed session
22 at the request of the applicants.

23 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
24 I have a second?

25 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown. I

1 second.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
3 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

4 (Board members said "aye.")

5 MR. INGRAM: So at -- I'm sorry.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: No, I was going to
7 ask you.

8 MR. INGRAM: I was going to say, the motion
9 passed?

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Yeah, oh, the motion
11 passes.

12 MR. INGRAM: So at this time, those of you that
13 have been informed about the closed session, if you'll
14 go ahead and hang up from this call.

15 Those of you that are still on this number,
16 that are not involved in the closed session, please stay
17 on the call. You'll hear some silence for a while. We
18 will come back on the record for the Board to vote on
19 this item. So, again, please stay on the call.

20 Those of you that have been given specific
21 instructions, please go ahead and hang up, and we'll
22 meet you on the other side.

23 MR. DETMER: This is Mike Detmer. As a matter
24 of procedure, I believe that the statute requires that
25 the reason as to the basis for the closed session,

1 unless I'm mistaken, it is for consideration of
2 competence and/or character. Is that is correct, from
3 the Board, as far as the basis to go into closed
4 session?

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: That's correct.

6 MR. DETMER: I thank the Board.

7 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

8 * * * * *

9 (A closed session of the meeting was held, after which
10 the meeting was then opened back up to the public and
11 resumed as follows.)

12 * * * * *

13 MR. INGRAM: Shannon, are you back?

14 THE REPORTER: Yes, I am. Thank you.

15 MR. INGRAM: Mary Klemme, are you back?

16 MS. KLEMME: Present.

17 MR. INGRAM: All right. And Mr. and
18 Mrs. Coventry?

19 MR. COVENTRY: We're here.

20 MRS. COVENTRY: We're here, yes.

21 MR. INGRAM: Thank you.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

23 So we're back on line. I'll entertain a motion
24 on agenda item number 46.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member

1 Cortez. I'm motioning to approve the license being
2 requested by both Mr. and Mrs. Coventry.

3 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
4 I have a second? Okay. Hang on.

5 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record. Just
6 for clarification, the motion is to approve a corporate
7 private investigator and private patrolman license as
8 well as hold the individual private investigator and
9 private patrol licenses in abeyance?

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That is correct.

11 MR. INGRAM: With corporate officers.

12 MR. DETMER: With the corporate officers to be
13 approved, that being Mr. Coventry and Mrs. Coventry?

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That is correct. My
15 apologies.

16 MR. DETMER: It was a long paragraph. I
17 completely understand.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion.
19 Do we have a second?

20 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
21 Brown. I second.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion.
23 We have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

24 (Board members said "aye.")

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: So congratulations,

1 Mr. and Mrs. Coventry. Your motion has been approved
2 unanimately.

3 MR. COVENTRY: Thank you very much.

4 MRS. COVENTRY: Thank you very much.

5 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

6 Now we're on item number 47. Director Ingram
7 for item number 47.

8 MR. INGRAM: Hi, Shannon. For the record,
9 Kevin Ingram.

10 I'm going to read this agenda item so we
11 understand exactly where we're at: Pursuant to NRS
12 648.020, subsection 3, the members of the Board shall
13 elect a Chair of the Board from amongst its members by
14 majority vote. After the election, the Chair shall hold
15 office for a term of two years beginning on July 1st of
16 each year. Board members may nominate candidates to
17 assume the role of Chair to be followed by a vote.
18 Since a vacancy has occurred in the office of the Chair,
19 with the passing of Ray Flynn, the members of the Board
20 shall elect a Chair from amongst its members for the
21 remainder of his term expiring on June 30th, 2022.

22 So this is not a full two-year term. This is
23 for the remainder of Mr. Flynn's term that expires
24 June 30 of 2022.

25 I have two nominations for the position of the

1 Chair, one being that of Acting Chair Tammy Nixon, and
2 that of Board Member Rick Brown.

3 At this time, we can open the voting for this
4 position.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I want to be nominated,
6 then.

7 MR. INGRAM: Are you nominating yourself?

8 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Hell, yeah.

9 MR. INGRAM: I can take more nominations.

10 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: There you go.

11 MR. INGRAM: So now we have a nomination for
12 Robert Gronauer. Do I have any other nominations?

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
14 Cortez. I just want to see if we are motioning, or can
15 I just vote?

16 MR. INGRAM: Oh, you're ready to vote. You
17 don't want me to run through the position?

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: No, that's okay.

19 MR. INGRAM: Okay. So we now have three
20 members that are running for Board Chair. So I'll hold
21 my hand over each person's head. Got a show of hands.

22 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: You know, you didn't
23 ask if either one of them have that kind of time to do
24 that. Or I could do it. And that's the way I look at
25 it. I don't want to put no more pressure on her, if she

1 travels a little more. That's the only way I looked at
2 it, and anything else. You know, and I don't know her
3 position as far as travel or anything else. So that's
4 the reason I just said, well, I'll just put my name in
5 there. So we can do whatever you want. But I took it
6 very serious. I took it very serious. I didn't know if
7 you had an obligation here. So I don't know where they
8 came from. All right.

9 MR. INGRAM: Yes, let's do this. Let's have
10 each of the individuals that are interested in running
11 for the Board go ahead and give us a little overview of
12 why they'd like to be the Chairman of the Board. And
13 we'll hear a little bit from each of the candidates.
14 And then we'll move on to the voting. Does that sound
15 fair?

16 Okay. So why don't you start it off. Did you
17 want to go ahead and add anything else to your
18 statement?

19 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Again, record of
20 experience and involvement in boards, being the past
21 Chairman of the Board the Housing Authority, the
22 Las Vegas Housing Authority, ran a law enforcement
23 agency, and Las Vegas Constable's Office --

24 (The Reporter indicated an inability to hear.)

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: All right. Here's the

1 deal. Okay. And I'm serious. I would take it. Only I
2 was worried about Tammy, and I didn't discuss with you.
3 And I actually didn't know about the nominations.
4 That's the true story. Somewhere I must have missed
5 that one, while I was talking too much last time. So
6 here's the deal.

7 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: I think, you left early
8 last time we met.

9 MR. INGRAM: Well, I sent, I thought, I sent a
10 follow-up email, also.

11 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Oh, okay.

12 MR. INGRAM: But that's okay.

13 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay.

14 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Anyway, and the only
15 thing I'm saying, I had the breadth of experience as far
16 as running a lot of boards. I was the
17 secretary-treasurer for Westcare for ten years. I was
18 on the Nevada senior law enforcement, no, senior law
19 practice where we take care of a lot of seniors. I was
20 the secretary-treasurer for that. I ran a law
21 enforcement agency, being the Constable's Office in
22 Las Vegas. Chairman of the Housing Authority in
23 Las Vegas for four years. I just have a breadth of
24 experience in all these areas.

25 However, I was just worried that some people

1 didn't have the time to go ahead and move forward. I
2 don't challenge anybody's experience. I just challenge
3 the time that's available. And I have the time
4 available, because I have enough people to take care of
5 what I need to take care of.

6 That's it.

7 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
8 Brown. I am one of the newer Board members. I have no
9 experience running the Board. So, I think, it would
10 probably be best for me to withdraw my nomination, my
11 self-nomination. I would like to withdraw my
12 self-nomination. I put my nomination in because I did
13 not know if any of the other Board members were going
14 to. I wanted to make sure we had somebody to run the
15 position, didn't know if anybody else wanted it or not.

16 MR. INGRAM: Sure.

17 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: I'm going to withdraw my
18 self-nomination.

19 MR. INGRAM: Okay. Fair enough.

20 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: My name is Tammy
21 Nixon. I have been on the Board now for two years. I
22 have no board experience when it comes to running an
23 actual board, as you could probably tell during the last
24 two meetings. But definitely I'm interested in the
25 position. I take a great deal of honor about being on

1 the Board, as well as being a part of the industry, and
2 like the idea of being able to influence how we do
3 business as an industry.

4 So that's why it becomes so important to me to
5 be on the Board, and would like to run for the
6 Chairperson.

7 MR. INGRAM: Excellent.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Mr. Ingram, I'm going to
9 be part of the team and just go ahead and change. I'd
10 like to put my name in the hat, if that's okay.

11 MR. INGRAM: Okay.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. So this is Board
13 Member Cortez. While I was just appointed to this Board
14 last year, I do have -- I am a founding board member of
15 Juvenile Probation Officers Association. I was the
16 treasurer and board member for 11, 10, 11 years. I'm
17 very familiar with board meetings. I familiar with
18 Robert's Rules. I could use some brushing up, but I am
19 pretty familiar, and I'm comfortable with running board
20 meetings.

21 MR. INGRAM: Board Counsel Detmer, in reviewing
22 NRS 648.060 -- okay. Shannon, we're going to sidebar
23 here just a minute.

24 (There was a discussion off the record.)

25 MR. DETMER: Okay. Shannon, Mike Detmer for

1 the record. We're back on the record.

2 And just for clarification, this was just a
3 sidebar between counsel and the Executive Director. And
4 with that, I submit.

5 THE REPORTER: Thank you.

6 MR. INGRAM: Okay. So we have three
7 individuals interested in the position of Chair.
8 Normally, we're a five-member Board. We do have one
9 vacancy right now. And in communication with the
10 Governor's Office, it's been quite some time that we've
11 been waiting for this position to be filled.

12 So as the Executive Director, I feel it's in
13 the best interest of the Board to move forward with the
14 election of a Chair, not knowing how much longer we're
15 going to be without a Board member. Okay. So I just
16 want to put that on the record that normally it would be
17 five individuals voting. We're voting with four. Okay.

18 So at this time, we'll take a vote. All those
19 in favor -- and I'll start here with left to right. All
20 those in favor of Board Member Katherine Cortez serving
21 the remainder of the Chair --

22 MR. DETMER: And I'm sorry to interrupt. But,
23 I think, we still have to follow the rules of procedure,
24 that being a motion from somebody on the Board and a
25 second by a somebody there, of the Board as well. I'm

1 not familiar with the procedure if it would be somebody
2 other than a Board can.

3 MR. INGRAM: Okay.

4 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Do you need a motion?

5 MR. INGRAM: So the Chair -- you have to just
6 do a motion?

7 MR. DETMER: Yeah.

8 MR. INGRAM: You actually need to call for the
9 vote.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we're on
11 agenda item number 47. I'm calling for a motion
12 concerning Board Member Cortez, right, for Chairman.

13 MR. DETMER: So, I think, you've done one other
14 election, maybe two, and it was never -- there's never a
15 great way of doing it. So I apologize for not having a
16 set procedure for the Board.

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Shall we do all
18 three?

19 MR. DETMER: No.

20 MR. INGRAM: Because it has to be --

21 MR. DETMER: Right. So, I believe, that we
22 move to the candidate, in which the Chairwoman asked for
23 a motion, and if there is no motion, then we move to the
24 next candidate.

25 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

1 MR. DETMER: Then seconds and then.

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. Why don't we
3 just withdraw? Okay. I'm going to just withdraw.
4 That's it. So basically that's it. Okay? And you all
5 figure it out from there.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: It's the same way.

7 MR. DETMER: I don't know why that would
8 change.

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So based on
10 the most recent, I move for a motion to -- do I say
11 between us two, or?

12 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Make a motion that we
13 vote for a Chairman of the Board.

14 MR. INGRAM: Can she make a motion that they
15 vote for Chairman, if they would be asking for votes,
16 and then the --

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
18 Cortez. I'm going to make things real easy. I am
19 going, therefore, to withdraw, leaving Board Member
20 Nixon for the remaining term.

21 MR. DETMER: Mike Detmer, for the record. If
22 anybody wants to run for Chair, please don't let the
23 confusion of procedure sideline you.

24 (There was discussion off the record.)

25 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Board Member Gronauer.

1 I forgot who I was. Okay. And the motion is that we
2 now have a vote for who's the Chairman of the Board of
3 the PILB to fill until the end of Ray Flynn's term.

4 MR. DETMER: That's where we were.

5 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Okay. And I add in
6 that motion that we allow Tammy Nixon to be the Board
7 Chairman.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And I, Board Member
9 Cortez, will second that motion to allow Board Member
10 Nixon to remain as Chair for the remainder term until
11 June 30 of 2022.

12 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion.
13 We have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

14 (Board members said "aye.")

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations, me.
16 Thank you. Okay.

17 MR. INGRAM: The motion passed.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Oh, the motion
19 passes, for the record. Board Member Nixon has been
20 appointed as Chair.

21 MR. INGRAM: Item number 48.

22 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Item number 48.
23 Board comment and future agenda items, for possible
24 action. Okay. So Board comment and future agenda
25 items. Do we have any?

1 Okay. So next we move to the next item. So
2 the next item is agenda item number 49. This is another
3 opening for public comment.

4 Do we have, from the member of the general
5 public, if you have any comment on any matter appearing
6 on the agenda that you would like, or not on the agenda
7 that you'd like to bring to the attention of the Board?
8 Anybody in the south?

9 MR. WHITFIELD: Yes, I have a comment.

10 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Yes, sir. Could you
11 please identify yourself.

12 MR. WHITFIELD: Yes, my name is William
13 Whitfield, current PPP holder, license number 2407B.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Please go forward,
15 sir.

16 MR. WHITFIELD: I'm sorry?

17 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Please go forward.

18 MR. WHITFIELD: Oh. Yes. Thank you. Thank
19 you. To members of the Board, I would like to just
20 mention that what are the possibility of individuals
21 that are becoming managing members of the company up
22 under the Q and A, could they be under the same
23 background scrutiny as the PPP holder goes through, in
24 order to become a managing member.

25 MR. DETMER: Okay. This is public comment as

1 opposed to --

2 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Can't make a decision.

3 MR. BOARD: I'm sorry?

4 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: We can't make a
5 decision, right?

6 MR. WHITFIELD: No, no, no, no. No, I'm not
7 looking for a decision. I just wanted to insert for the
8 record if that is something that can be discussed at
9 another time.

10 MR. DETMER: This is just for public comment.
11 He provided comment. The Board can't take that into
12 consideration today. But as of now, it's just public
13 comment.

14 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So, sir,
15 unfortunately, we can't answer that question for you. I
16 would refer you to the licensing office.

17 MR. WHITFIELD: Will do. Thank you.

18 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Anyone else down
19 south?

20 Okay. Any public comment from up north?

21 Okay. So no public comment.

22 Do I have a motion to adjourn? That's the end
23 of the agenda.

24 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
25 Brown. I move that we adjourn the meeting.

1 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I want discussion.

2 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
3 I have a second?

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
5 Cortez. I second to adjourn.

6 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. I
7 have a second. All in favor, say "aye."

8 (Board members said "aye.")

9 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Okay. The motion
10 passes. Thank you. We're adjourned. Thank you.

11 MR. INGRAM: Thanks, Shannon. We'll see you
12 tomorrow.

13 THE REPORTER: Yes. Okay. Thank you. Good
14 afternoon, everybody.

15 ACTING BOARD CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.
