- 19 Good morning, everyone. Again, this is
- 20 the section for public comment. Members of the
- 21 general public may comment on matters appearing on
- 22 the agenda and may bring up matters not appearing on
- 23 the agenda to the attention of the Board. The Board
- 24 may discuss matters not appearing on the agenda, but
- 25 may not act on the matters in this meeting. If the



Page 6 1 Board desires, the matter may be placed into a 2 future agenda for action. 3 Public comments will be limited to five 4 minutes per person at the discretion of the 5 chairman, but will not be restricted according to 6 viewpoint. 7 Is there any comment from the south? 8 Good morning. 9 MR. ZANE: Good morning. This on? Good morning, Madam Chair. My name is 10 11 Mark Zane. I'm appearing here today as the 12 secretary of the Nevada -- let's see, who am I today? The Nevada Association of Professional 13 14 Investigators. 15 And I wanted to make a comment with regard 16 to matters that appear on the agenda today, just in case there's some calendar conflict or some issue 17 18 that needs to be resolved prior to that event or 19 whatever the case might be. The comment that I'm here to offer is with 20 21 regard to the general business associated with 22 Agenda No. 116, the final interview of candidates 23 for executive director position. 24 We had some questions with regard to the 25 process, that -- for the most part, it's pretty

The question arises in the review 2 and the grading process of the applicants in total that was conducted on August 17th. 3 4 I reached out to Director Ingram with regard to the questions and clarification. And he 5 had indicated that the answer may lie within the 6 minutes that would be -- would have been taken at 7 8 that meeting. 9 However, given the statute and the open 10 meeting law and the time parameters associated with 11 the calendar of August 17th to present, the statute 12 doesn't provide for those minutes to be made 13 available as of now. So -- because of the time element and the time limit hasn't run. 14 15 So, therefore, we had -- the association 16 had a person at the meeting, but she didn't stay very long and she didn't guite understand the 17 18 process. And so the only way for us to know 19 verifiably what occurred and what went on would be 20 to look at the record that was accommodated. 21 without us being able to do that, it leaves this 22 question about the review and the grading process 23 that whittled this down to however many applications 24 were received, and then however many applications

were forwarded to the body for consideration today.

- 1 So we're -- we -- for lack of a better
- 2 term, I mean, we don't want to interject ourselves
- 3 and make -- cast any aspersions at anything as
- 4 untoward or -- you know, there's nothing like that.
- 5 It's just the fact that we do have that question
- 6 about how those applications were whittled down to
- 7 the ones that are being considered today.
- 8 And I do understand that in the agenda,
- 9 you don't have to make any decisions today. You can
- 10 change your mind, do whatever you want to do because
- 11 this is not a position in classified service of the
- 12 state. So therefore, several HR issues don't apply.
- So, you know, we don't -- understand that.

- 1 So, I've provided the financials, closing
- 2 statements to the Board. If the Board has any
- 3 questions, I'd be happy to do my best to answer
- 4 those for you.
- 5 You can see that we came out in the
- 6 positive and on track for consistency through this
- 7 next fiscal year.
- 8 Are there any questions?
- 9 Moving on to the next report. I have some
- 10 statistics that have been handed out to the Board.
- 11 These are quarterly statistics. And please forgive
- me, I had an investigator prepare and provide these,
- 13 so I'll do the best I can here.
- 14 Looking at the licensing applications for
- the June 2023 board meeting, which were reviewed and
- approved, we had 32 total applicants. We had 23 of
- those applicants approved, nine withdrawn or denied.
- 18 One of those for the withdrawal or denial did not
- 19 meet the minimum qualifications so therefore could
- 20 not move forward during the background. Two of them
- 21 postponed and are actually on our agenda today. Two
- 22 at that meeting were actually denied by the Board,
- and four were withdrawn.
- A lot of times with the withdrawals, what
- will happen is, a person will apply for the position



- 1 to represent a company, and maybe the relationship
- 2 has changed so they don't move forward.
- 3 Or in some instances, the companies find
- 4 out some additional laws and regs that are required,
- 5 such as city and county business licensing, and they
- 6 choose to withdraw at this time.
- 7 Other individuals might simply be that as
- 8 we were going through the background, they decided
- 9 not to move forward for fear of information coming
- 10 out at the Board.
- 11 The next item is the license applications
- for the June 2022 board meeting, so just a
- 13 comparison here. So a year ago there were 41
- applied, 36 that were approved, five that were
- 15 withdrawn, two did not meet the MQs, and one decided
- 16 not to proceed. So there's only a bit of a downtick
- for this quarter versus last year, but not
- 18 significant.
- 19 On the next page we have the 2022-2023
- 20 work card comparisons. I won't go through every
- 21 month, I'll just go over the totals, unless you'd
- 22 like me to cover the months.
- So, for the 2022 quarter, we had received
- 24 3,943 applications to 2023's 3,217. Of the 2022,
- 25 3187 were approved, 555 were withdrawn, and 111 were



- denied. For the same quarter this year, we had
- 2 2,770 that were made active, there's still 36 that
- 3 are in provisional. DPS had a glitch and had to
- 4 resubmit all 36 of these fingerprints to the
- 5 criminal repository. So we're just waiting on those
- 6 results. We had 239 that were withdrawn, so that's
- 7 a significant decrease. But we did have 172 that
- 8 were actually denied.
- 9 Going into our complaints and
- 10 investigations for the quarter. 2023 we received a
- 11 total of 14 complaints. Eight of those have been
- 12 closed and no violations were issued on complaints
- 13 against a licensee. They were all found to be
- 14 unfounded or outside of our jurisdiction.
- 15 And -- looks like that was a typo. My
- 16 apologies. Because down below he's got the
- 17 breakdown. One -- five companies were issued
- 18 violations. One was working an employee out of
- 19 firearms quals, one was an employee not on the
- 20 roster, and four were advertisements missing a
- 21 license number. So it looks like we did have six
- 22 violations issued.
- 23 Unlicensed activity citations for the
- 24 quarter. Comparison 2022, '23, we had a -- for 2022
- 25 we had four issued. For 2023 we had five issued.



Page 13 1 Four of them were PPO in 2022, five of them were PPO in 2023. 2 Does the Board have any questions on the 3 statistics? 4 5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: No questions. 6 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR INGRAM: Okay. - 6 me maneuver and comply with the complexity of doing
- 7 business in the United States. And I know it's a
- 8 little easier to do business here in Nevada, but in
- 9 California it's very challenging. Particularly when
- 10 you have a business that employs a lot of people,
- 11 which we do. Basically, selling labor is what we
- 12 do.

MARTINEZ: That's correct. 6 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Well, it seems 7 like you had several difficult years from 2010 on. 8 MR. MARTINEZ: Yes, sir. 9 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: And it seems to be the same thing. Ι 23 also applied for the ERC program, which is the 24 Employment Retention Program. I was awarded 25 \$350,000 last month, and we've since paid off quite

- 1 a bit of the tax issue.
- 2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: But I guess, you
- 3 know -- Board, my indulgence, why weren't you paying
- 4 them as they came up? Because this is 1991, 1992,
- 5 1994, 1995, 2010, 2011, 2011. It's an ongoing
- 6 thing. This --
- 7 MR. MARTINEZ: Right.
- 8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: -- isn't a Covid, ERC
- 9 issue.
- 10 MR. MARTINEZ: Sure, sure. Back then it

- 5 important part of the business. So not taking care
- of the taxes, I'm just having a difficult time with
- 7 this, just letting you know that right now.
- 8 MR. MARTINEZ: I understand what you're
- 9 saying. But in my defense, for the last seven years
- there's been absolutely no issues with any current
- 11 tax. That's all been paid on time like clockwork
- 12 for the last seven years, since I've been growing.
- BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: I understand that.
- But also, we're at the point, without getting
- 15 argumentative on this, just -- I'm trying to make a
- point on this here, is that you're not all done.
- 17 Because you just said you got a letter from your
- 18 attorney that it's in negotiations.
- 19 MR. MARTINEZ: Yeah.
- 20 BOARD MEMBER GRONAUER: Negotiation is a
- 21 lot different than having it all done.
- MR. MARTINEZ: Yes, sir. That was back
- last year, beginning of last -- well, I'd say it was
- about March of last year is when he was in the

- 1 already submitted checks. And I can show you
- 2 evidence that I've received \$350,000 that we're

- 1 responded by telling him he already knows.
- 2 The security officer says that the
- 3 applicant had been harassing him and bullying him,
- 4 but did not report it previously as he had no
- 5 witnesses and that he was scared that the applicant
- 6 would retaliate on him if he got fired.
- 7 On June 28th, 2023, the applicant's
- 8 registered work card was denied pursuant to Nevada
