2 PROCEEDINGS

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4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We'll go ahead and get
5 started and call the meeting to order.

6 Executive Director, if you could do roll
7 call, please.

8 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Good
9 morning. Welcome to the Private Investigator
10 Licensing Board quarterly Board meeting.

11 Director Saladino, for the record.
12 S-a-l-a-d-i-n-o.

13 Roll call, Chair Nixon.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Here.

15 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Board Member
16 Bezick.

17 Board Member Brown.

18 THE REPORTER: Did he respond?

19 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Here.

20 Are you not hearing us now?

21 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: We didn't
22 hear Bezick.

23 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Here. Got me?

24 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Board Member
25 Cortez.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Here.

2 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: All right.
3 Chair, we do have a quorum.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

5 This section is for public comment.

6 Members of the general public may make comment on
7 matters appearing on the agenda, and may bring up
8 matters not appearing on the agenda to the attention
9 of the Board. The Board may discuss the matters not
10 appearing on the agenda, but may not act on the
11 matters at this meeting. If the Board desires, the
12 matters may be placed on a future agenda for public
13 action.

14 Public comments may be limited to five
15 minutes per person at the discretion of the Chair,
16 but will not be restricted according to viewpoint.

17 Are there any -- is there any public
18 comment up north?

19 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: None up here.

20 THE REPORTER: Who was that, and if they
21 can speak up.

22 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: You need me to speak
23 up?

24 THE REPORTER: A little bit, please. This
25 is the court reporter.

1 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: I've got a volume
2 button here. I don't know if this -- does this help
3 at all? The volume button.

4 THE REPORTER: Not a ton, but it helped a
5 little.

6 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: They just changed the
7 camera on us. Maybe that was it. Can you hear me
8 now?

9 THE REPORTER: Yeah.

10 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Better?

11 THE REPORTER: A little.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So no public
13 comment up north. Is there any public comment down
14 south?

15 Seeing there's no public comment, we'll
16 move to the next section.

17 Board Executive Director, announcements,
18 reports, and updates.

19 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Thank you,
20 Madam Chair. I provided the Board members with the
21 quarterly financials. Is there any questions I can
22 answer for those?

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: None at this time.

24 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: All right.
25 And then a quick update before we get into

1 the stats. Our data base had just underwent an
2 update. So with the update, we realized we had some
3 challenges between our external links and our
4 internal links.

5 So currently, the online application
6 process has been shut down. The database was
7 reoccurring our numbers. And if you guys are used
8 to our work card process, you know work card numbers
9 are usually unique to the individual. And having
10 multiple of the same has been an issue.

11 Currently, our staff is working with the
12 database providers to fix this. I'm hopeful
13 that hopefully by the end of today it should be back
14 up and running, if not, you know, first thing
15 tomorrow. But I want you to know we are working on
16 it and, you know, trying to get on top of it.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

18 And I'd say, you know, guys, if you had
19 any problems with your license numbers, I know this
20 is a big renewal season, too, for the licensees. So
21 if you have any hiccups or problems, please contact
22 the office, the PILB office. They'll certainly
23 help.

24 But they've been working very diligently
25 to try to work through that. So we appreciate all

1 that. We know it's a little crazy. We appreciate
2 that hard work.

3 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Investigator
4 Swarthout, would you like to give us an overview on
5 the stats?

6 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Investigator
7 Swarthout. So, for March 2023 for licensing, we had
8 43 total applications. 28 were approved, 15 were
9 either withdrawn or denied. Compared to March
10 2024's Board meeting. We had 38 applications, 23
11 approved, and 15 that were withdrawn or denied.

12 Our work card applications. Just a quick
13 overview on those. For 2023 for the first quarter,
14 we processed 3,278. Of that, 200 -- or 2,925 are
15 active, 184 were withdrawn, 169 were denied. This
16 year, for the same time period, we processed 4,053
17 applications. 3,478 are active, 93 are still
18 provisional, 230 were withdrawn, and there's 252
19 that were denied.

20 The reason for the spike is, as everyone
21 knows, in February we had the Super Bowl. So
22 January is our biggest spike month out of this
23 quarter. So everyone who was still trying to get a
24 card for working the Super Bowl was still applying.

25 The 93 that are still provisional, there's

1 a couple different factors that go into that. Some
2 of them, resubmitting of fingerprints and database
3 issues now that are coming up with it.

4 Complaints, investigations. We had 31
5 total. 28 of them are closed, three of them are
6 still open.

7 The biggest spike we saw on this one is
8 this past first quarter we saw a giant spike in
9 complaints on work card holders. Of them, out of
10 the 16, six of them were able to be revoked under
11 the NAC that put them back in a provisional status.
12 Three of them will be appearing later today.

13 We've been working more with other
14 agencies, including Nevada DMV, California DMV, NTA,
15 LVMPD, HPD, Nye County Sheriff's Office, and the
16 Nevada Labor Board.

17 Unlicensed activity citations. For the
18 first quarter of 2023 we had 14 that were on PPO.
19 For the first quarter of 2024 we had 22 that were
20 issued out on PPO.

21 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Thank you,
22 Investigator Swarthout.

23 Agenda Item No. 4.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Review and approve
25 transcripts from March 13-14, 2024 Board meeting,

1 and discuss April 17 -- and April 17 workshop for
2 possible action.

3 Has everybody reviewed the transcripts and
4 the workshop? Are there any discussion points?

5 Seeing there's no discussion points, open
6 to motion.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
8 Cortez motioning to approve Board meeting scheduled
9 March 13th and 14th, 2024; and also for the workshop
10 scheduled on April 17th, 2024, motioning to approve
11 as written.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
13 we have a second?

14 THE REPORTER: I didn't hear that.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board Member Bezick, I
16 don't know if you have the volume button as well,
17 but we can barely hear you.

18 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick second.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: A little better.
20 Thank you.

21 So we have a motion and we have a second.
22 All in favor say I.

23 (All present Board members voted aye.)

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

25 Counsel Harris, would you mind swearing in

1 applicants and witnesses?

2 DAG HARRIS: So everyone in the audience,
3 either in the south or in the north, if you're on
4 the agenda or if you plan on testifying for any
5 agenda item, please stand and raise your right hand.

6
7 AUDIENCE MEMBERS,
8 having been duly sworn,
9 testified as follows:

10

11 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Madam Chair? Madam
12 Chair?

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes.

14 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: We just had another
15 member of the public walk in right as swearing in
16 was ending, so we may need to have another person
17 sworn in.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

19 DAG HARRIS: DAG Harris, for the record.

20 If that member of the public in the north
21 can please stand and raise their right hand.

22 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Do you plan on
23 testifying today?

24 He's standing and raising his right hand.

25 He's off to the side. I'm sorry.

1 AUDIENCE MEMBER,
2 having been duly sworn,
3 testified as follows:

4
5 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you, Counsel.

6 DAG HARRIS: Thank you.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The next agenda items
8 are the consent for potential block votes 6 through
9 13 is what is originally noted on the agenda.
10 However, we do have fingerprints for a contingent
11 item for No. 14.

12 And to verify, Investigator Swarthout, did
13 14 -- or, I'm sorry, Diaz. Did the fingerprints
14 come back clear?

15 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: (Indiscernible.)

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We can't hear you at
17 all, Investigator Diaz.

18 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: Investigator Diaz, for
19 the record.

20 Yes, they did.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, thank you.

22 So we have a potential block vote for
23 consent -- or consent items 6 through 14. I'll
24 entertain a motion.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Madam Chair, this is

1 Board Member Cortez. I'd like to place some
2 information on the record regarding Agenda Item
3 No. 6 for potential block vote.

4 Mr. Rafalovich and I have attended the
5 same POST academy back in 2000, and we briefly
6 worked for the same department. I have not had any
7 interactions with Mr. Rafalovich in over two
8 decades, freeing me from any conflict of interest
9 when casting my vote.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

11 That's noted. So I'll entertain a motion
12 for contingent items 6 through 14.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
14 Cortez motioning to approve consent items for block
15 vote Nos. 6 through 14.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
17 motion. Do we have a second?

18 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown
19 seconds.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
21 have a second. All in favor say aye.

22 (All present Board members voted aye.)

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

24 Okay. So, what that means is, if you were
25 party of the Agenda Items 6 through 14, you have

1 been approved and you are welcome to leave the
2 meeting. Unless you want to be entertained by us.
3 But otherwise, you're more than welcome to leave the
4 meeting. The PILB office will contact you later for
5 further instructions for your license.

6 We are now on Agenda Item No. 15, Savage
7 III, Inc., applying for a new corporate private
8 patrol license. Mr. Robert Smith and Mr. Lorenzo
9 Savage, if you could -- and Burke Ewers, if you
10 could please come to the front. I'm sorry if I
11 mispronounced your name.

12 Good morning, gentlemen.

13 MR. SAVAGE: Good morning.

14 MR. SMITH: Good morning.

15 MR. EWERS: Good morning.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, please tell us a
17 little bit about your business and the intentions
18 with the license.

19 MR. SAVAGE: I'll go first.

20 I'm Lorenzo. Good morning. I'm Lorenzo
21 Robert Savage III, and the I have had a long career
22 in law enforcement from local police, then
23 transitioning to the U.S. --

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yeah, you're going to
25 have to hit that button.

1 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Why don't
2 you sit.

3 MR. SAVAGE: Good morning. Is that
4 better?

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes.

6 MR. SAVAGE: Thank you.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Can you hear up north?
8 Okay. We got a thumbs up.

9 MR. SAVAGE: Thank you, ma'am.

10 I've had a career in law enforcement,
11 starting with local law enforcement in the State of
12 Virginia, Fairfax County Police Department. And
13 then I transitioned to the Secret Service. Had a
14 25-year career in the Secret Service.

15 I'm proud to say that I served this
16 community in Las Vegas back in August of 2007 until
17 August of 2010 as the Assistant Special Agent in
18 Charge of the Las Vegas field office of the Secret
19 Service.

20 I went on and retired as a Special Agent
21 in Charge of the Los Angeles field office and the
22 U.S. Secret Service after having served on the
23 presidential protective division when President
24 George W. Bush was in office.

25 After retiring from the Secret Service, I

1 started my career in the private security world as a
2 CEO of a security firm in L.A. for about four years.
3 That gave me my background, transitioning from
4 public service to private security, and
5 understanding, you know, the differences there.

6 After about four years, I cofounded Savage
7 III, Incorporated with my business partner here,
8 Burke Ewers. He and I had had a long relationship.
9 Our children got to know each other playing little
10 league. And we have been successfully running that
11 business. Also finalizing our license in the State
12 of Ohio and the State of Texas.

13 During my previous company, I had a
14 relationship with Robert Smith. And Robert was
15 doing security work here in Nevada and also in
16 California. And as we started to explore getting
17 our license here in Nevada, Robert reached out and
18 let me know that he was -- he was at a point in time
19 that after running his business, that he was
20 thinking about putting his license in abeyance.

21 And so then we realized that it could be a
22 good opportunity for us to partner together, and so
23 we entered into a business partnership. And our
24 plan was to have Robert be our Qualifying Agent here
25 in the State of Nevada and expand our Savage III

1 business here in the state.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
3 questions for any of the gentlemen?

4 Hearing -- so I only have the one
5 question. It seems like you're still in a civil
6 case against District Court. Is against a former
7 employer?

8 MR. SAVAGE: Which one, ma'am? I have a
9 couple of -- civil litigation.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: There's one, Psaila
11 versus Girardi.

12 MR. SAVAGE: Psaila versus Girardi, yes,
13 ma'am.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So are you -- you have
15 civil litigations against them?

16 MR. SAVAGE: No, ma'am. That's a case
17 that's been filed by Psaila against Girardi and
18 three Secret Service agents. And so in my role as a
19 Special Agent in Charge of the Los Angeles field
20 office, I was named as a defendant in that case.
21 It's a civil case.

22 On May 14 of 2024, and I believe I
23 forwarded that ruling, Judge Fitzgerald granted a
24 motion to dismiss that case then. And so he did
25 grant the plaintiffs an opportunity to amend their

1 complaint, and so I believe they still have time to
2 do that.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So this is a
4 case currently ongoing in District Court as of the
5 writing of the report. So that has nothing do with
6 him, though.

7 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Director
8 Saladino, for the record.

9 When Investigator Jessie Dumas in the
10 north did the investigation, you could see that the
11 U.S. attorney represented Mr. Savage. So to us,
12 that shows that he was not at fault in his role with
13 the Secret Service. And then we did receive the
14 documentation that shows that the judge did issue an
15 order to dismiss.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you for
17 that.

18 Are there any further questions from the
19 Board? Are there any further questions from the
20 Board?

21 Okay. Hearing there are no further
22 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

23 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
24 Brown. I move that we grant the new corporate
25 license for Savage III, Incorporated, approving

1 Mr. Robert Smith to get his individual license,
2 which will be placed in abeyance so he may become
3 the Qualifying Agent.

4 Also move that we approve Lorenzo Savage
5 and Burke Ewers to be corporate officers, subject to
6 all statutory and regulatory requirements.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
8 motion. Do we have a second?

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
10 Cortez, motion -- go ahead, Bezick.

11 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
13 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

14 (All present Board members voted aye.)

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

16 Congratulations, gentlemen. Good luck to
17 you.

18 MR. SAVAGE: Thank you.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Shield Security
20 Consultant and Protection Services, LLC. Do we have
21 Gregory Sanchez? Gregory Sanchez Rodriguez? Grant
22 Burns? And Mark Oliver?

23 Good morning, gentlemen. You might have
24 to sit down, just so that we can hear you better.

25 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: We only have two

1 chairs for people. So, I guess, switch off a little
2 bit, depending on who's going to speak.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So gentlemen,
4 please tell us a little bit about yourself and the
5 intentions with the license.

6 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Good morning. My name is
7 Greg Rodriguez. I'm a retired detective from LAPD
8 for 35 years, 17 of that was with the
9 (indiscernible).

10 THE REPORTER: Sir. Sir. Wait. I need
11 you to please speak up and slow down because it's
12 difficult to hear you.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a court
14 reporter, so you have to slow it down a little bit.
15 And speak up a little bit.

16 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Is that better?

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes, sir.

18 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Thank you, ma'am.

19 Okay, here we go. My last name is
20 Rodriguez, first name is Gregory. I'm a retired
21 detective from LAPD with 35 years on the job. I did
22 17 years with the FBI L.A. field office.

23 After retirement, my brother and I decided
24 to get involved in private security here in Vegas,
25 so we did that; got my license. And after about

1 five years, I was approached by Mr. Burns at Shield
2 Security, asking me if I was interested in assisting
3 them in establishing security work out here.
4 Required me that I put my license in abeyance. And
5 so we decided to do that.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And that's
7 fine. Does anybody else want to speak?

8 MR. BURNS: My name is Grant Burns. I'm
9 the co-CEO of Shield Security. Former Detroit
10 police officer. Worked law enforcement in the state
11 of Georgia as well. Me and my business partner,
12 Mark Oliver here, worked executive protection for
13 the mayor and the chief of police in the city of
14 Detroit.

15 We started our company doing executive
16 protection for Amazon Prime, Apple TV, actors,
17 political campaigns, and things of that nature.

18 At some point in time, somebody asked us
19 if we would do security guard services for a
20 neighborhood. We decided to go down that route, and
21 we've expanded into multiple states rapidly.

22 We are one of the largest security
23 employers in Detroit, and we've expanded into Ohio,
24 Indiana, we're also moving into other states in the
25 midwest. And now we're looking to continue our push

1 west through the country.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Are there any
3 questions from the Board?

4 Seeing there's no questions from the
5 Board, I'll entertain a motion.

6 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Madam Chair?

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes.

8 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: I'm sorry, one of the
9 other -- one of the other applicants would like to
10 speak.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

12 MR. OLIVER: Yes. My name is Mark Oliver.
13 Co-CEO with Grant Burns. Show security. 23 years
14 of law enforcement with Detroit Police Department
15 serving the various capacities for mayoral
16 administrations and chief of police (indiscernible).

17 THE REPORTER: Can you repeat that?

18 I can't understand him.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, the court
20 reporter -- the reporter is having a hard time
21 understanding you. You might be a little too close
22 to the mike.

23 MR. OLIVER: Too close? Is that better?

24 Okay.

25 Yeah. As my business partner stated,

1 we're expanding. We're in Ohio, Indiana, and
2 Michigan. And we are one of the fastest growing
3 companies, security companies. With our law
4 enforcement background, we are putting that toward
5 the industry to streamline that in our state and
6 other states.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

8 Board, are there any questions? Okay.
9 Hearing there's no questions, I'll entertain a
10 motion.

11 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
12 Brown. I move that we grant Shield Security
13 Consultant Protective Services, LLC their new
14 corporate private patrol officer license, and
15 approve Gregory Rodriguez to have his individual
16 license placed in abeyance so he can become
17 Qualifying Agent. I also move that we approve Grant
18 Burns and Mark Oliver as members of the corporation,
19 subject to all statutory and regulatory
20 requirements.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
22 motion. Do we have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick. I
24 second.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we

1 have a second. All in favor say aye.

2 (All present Board members voted aye.)

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

4 Congratulations, gentlemen. Good luck to
5 you.

6 MR. OLIVER: Thank you.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. The next Agenda
8 Item, 17, Kingpin K9, LLC.

9 Do we have Andrew Wickerham?

10 MR. WICKERHAM: Yes, ma'am.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good morning. You're
12 going to have to come on up.

13 Thank you for coming. Please tell us a
14 little bit about yourself and the intentions of your
15 license.

16 MR. WICKERHAM: Good morning, Board
17 members. My name is Andrew Wickerham. And I've --
18 a little bit about my background. Was Marine Corps
19 from '99 to 2007. And then I went to work for
20 Department of Energy for another five years after
21 that, and then the state department.

22 And then I currently went to work for DILB
23 as a CFI in 2013. And then I recently acquired my
24 PPO in 2019, and that's where I received a 2699.
25 And then I recently received my K9 license back in

1 2021.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

3 MR. SILVERMAN: Good morning. My name is
4 Kevin Silverman. A little bit about my background.
5 It is, I spent nine years in U.S. Army, Special Ops,
6 doing various missions, combat patrols, executive
7 protection, private security, deployments, worked
8 with K9s. So I'm kind of the head of the K9 side of
9 this. I train explosive and narcotic detection
10 dogs.

11 Little bit about our company is, we pride
12 ourself in providing more quality, more intimate
13 service than some of the corporate entities out
14 there.

15 A unique thing that we also do with our
16 K9s is, we try to repurpose K9s. So we've got a few
17 out of the pound, gave them a job, put them to work,
18 give them a purpose. We provide sweeps, protection,
19 preventative -- basically whatever the client's
20 looking for.

21 So we do currently have nine explosive
22 detection dogs, we have two narcotic detection dogs,
23 and then we have four that are in training. We call
24 them pre-dogs.

25 To my right is my brother-in-law and

1 business partner, Kenneth Camarena. He's been
2 training with me since 2021. So I've been teaching
3 him all aspects of K9 training, K9 handling.

4 I met Andrew, and despite him being a
5 Marine, we get along pretty well. We've really
6 started building something unique and different
7 here, and we're excited to be able to get out there
8 and showcase it for everybody.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: First, thank you for
10 your service.

11 MR. SILVERMAN: Thank you.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there
13 any -- did you want to speak?

14 MR. CAMARENA: Well, as Kevin said, I'm
15 Kenneth Camarena, and I've been working or training
16 with Kevin since September. And he's just been
17 teaching me everything about dogs, training,
18 obedience, the explosive aspect of everything. So,
19 yeah.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations.

21 Board, are there any questions for the
22 gentlemen?

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
24 Cortez. I do have a question.

25 Good morning, gentlemen. Kevin, what's

1 the status of the collection cases?

2 MR. SILVERMAN: I submitted a form to
3 Ms. Blackmore for the investigating. It is
4 currently under dispute. I have a company that I've
5 hired to take care of all that.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So you are currently
7 disputing the charges?

8 MR. SILVERMAN: Yes.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Then the second
10 question is, your 2016 case. Give me a brief
11 background as to what occurred.

12 MR. SILVERMAN: I was a manager for a
13 company that I tried to implement a checklist
14 procedure into this company, because they had a
15 warehouse full of material that there was no
16 checklist. Anybody could go in there and sign out
17 any material that they wanted and there was no
18 supervisor.

19 Materials ended up going missing. My
20 checklist, my -- my presentation wasn't approved, I
21 guess. Materials ended up going missing. They were
22 being used for private jobs. And as the supervisor,
23 it fell on me, so I had no way to dispute that those
24 materials were not taken by people. So I did my --
25 my punishment, I paid my restitution that I -- my

1 opinion shouldn't have had to pay, but I couldn't
2 prove myself innocent at the point.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: How long did you do
4 probation for.

5 MR. SILVERMAN: One year.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Was it completed
7 successfully?

8 MR. SILVERMAN: Yes, ma'am.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you. No
10 further questions.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Other Board members,
12 are there any questions? Any further questions from
13 the Board?

14 Hearing there are no further questions,
15 I'll entertain a motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is is Board
17 Member Cortez motioning to approve Kingpin K9, LLC a
18 new corporate private patrol officer and dog handler
19 license. Also approving Andrew L. Wickerham,
20 License No. 2699, be placed -- his license be placed
21 in abeyance so that he may become the Qualifying
22 Agent. Members to be approved are Kevin M.
23 Silverman and Kenneth E. Camarena, all subject to
24 statutory and regulatory requirements.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a

1 motion. Do we have a second?

2 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown
3 seconds.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
5 have a second. All in favor say aye.

6 (All present Board members voted aye.)

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

8 Congratulations, guys. Good luck, and
9 thank you, again, for your service.

10 MR. WICKERHAM: Thank you.

11 MR. SILVERMAN: Thank you.

12 MR. CAMARENA: Thank you.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 18,
14 corporate officer, Trident Solutions. Do we have...

15 MR. SELLITTI: Saverio Sellitti.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

17 If you guys could, when you make your
18 description of your company, could you just give
19 your name since I'm going to butcher it any way we
20 do this? Thank you.

21 Gentlemen, please tell us a little bit
22 about yourselves and your intentions with the
23 license.

24 MR. STILL: Good morning. I'm Jeff Still,
25 S-t-i-l-l, The CEO of Trident. I have -- I retired

1 as a Navy Seal after 22 years of service.

2 We started Trident just about seven years
3 ago. We are in -- licensed in Alabama, Washington,
4 California, Colorado, Texas. We do guard services.

5 I'll turn it over to...

6 MR. SELLITTI: Good morning, everyone. My
7 name is Saverio Sellitti. I go by Sonny. Pleasure
8 to meet everyone.

9 Same as Jeff, we were both -- all three of
10 us, actually, served together in the Seal Team. I
11 did 24 years. We were all at the Special Warfare
12 Development --

13 THE REPORTER: Can you slow down, please?

14 MR. SELLITTI: Sorry.

15 THE REPORTER: Thank you.

16 MR. SELLITTI: We were all in Naval
17 Special Warfare Development Group, in the same
18 squadron together. Decided to start Trident
19 Security around 2017 when I retired. And, yeah,
20 what Jeff said we do, regular guard service work and
21 we also do executive protection and things along
22 those lines.

23 MR. ST. CLAIR: Good morning. I'm Chris
24 St. Clair. I also was in the Seal Teams with both
25 of my partners here. I did 27 years. Last 17 years

1 I was -- we were all at Seal Team 6. We got out in
2 20- -- around 2016, 2017. And what better to do
3 than to start up a security company?

4 So we relied upon everything we've done in
5 our past careers, and we've been doing quite well
6 ever since. Retired in 2016. So, thank you.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: No stress in security
8 companies. Thank you, too, for your service. I
9 appreciate that.

10 Are there any questions from the Board?

11 Hearing there are no questions, I'll
12 entertain a motion.

13 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
14 Brown. I move that we approve Trident Service
15 Solutions, Incorporated for their corporate -- I'm
16 sorry, let's see. Corporate officer status for
17 Saverio M. Sellitti, Christopher T. St. Clair, and
18 Jeffrey B. Still. This is subject to all statutory
19 and regulatory requirements.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
21 motion. Do we have a second?

22 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
24 have a second. All in favor say aye.

25 (All present Board members voted aye.)

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.
2 Good luck to you, gentlemen. Thank you.

3 MR. STILL: Thank you.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: General -- private
5 investigator licenses. Agenda Item No. 19, James
6 Carpenter.

7 MR. CARPENTER: Good morning.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Morning.

9 MR. CARPENTER: May I sit?

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes, please. And are
11 any of your partners here? Steven Powell?

12 MR. CARPENTER: I don't think so.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: And Brian Brunett.

14 MR. CARPENTER: I don't think so.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

16 MR. CARPENTER: I've never actually met
17 them, so I wouldn't know what they look like.

18 Thank you.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good morning. Tell us
20 a little bit about yourself and your intentions with
21 the license.

22 MR. CARPENTER: I am James Carpenter. I'm
23 born and raised -- born here in Las Vegas. Been
24 here since 1963. Graduated Las Vegas High School
25 '81. And in '85 I joined the United States Marine

1 Corps, where I spent six years and got my first
2 honorable discharge there in '92. I also was in
3 Desert Shield and Desert Storm.

4 In '95, after retirement, I got into -- I
5 was hired by the Clark County Fire Department, where
6 I served as a fireman and paramedic, and for the
7 last eight years was a fire investigator for them.
8 So that would be from '95 to 2020.

9 In the meantime, while working that, I
10 reenlisted in the Marine Corps in 2003, went to Iraq
11 in 2006 and 2007. 2007 I was shot in the abdomen,
12 so they evacuated me back to -- back here to Vegas.
13 After I healed I went back to the Clark County Fire
14 Department and continued that.

15 While I was doing that, I also joined
16 the -- was hired and completed the police academy
17 for the Boulder City Police Department out in
18 Boulder City. Worked off and on as a part-time
19 patrol officer for them.

20 Then I switched over to the courts, where
21 I was a marshall for Judge Miller out there. And
22 then after a few years, Clark County Fire
23 Investigations got so busy that I had to resign from
24 there.

25 And then 2020, after resigning from -- or

1 retiring from Clark County Fire Department, I went
2 back to Boulder City and they hired me as a
3 part-time police officer for the courts -- or for
4 the police officer -- the police department. And
5 that's where I've been.

6 So then in 2023, EFI Global, which is an
7 investigation and engineering company, but they work
8 for Sedgwick. It's a big global company. And I'm a
9 fire investigator for them.

10 And then they asked me -- because our
11 Qualified Agent is up in northern Nevada right now.
12 And I guess he's retiring, so they asked me to be
13 it. So I spent the last year getting all this
14 paperwork together so I can be the Qualified Agent
15 for EFI Global.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Fantastic. Same,
17 thank you for your service, sir.

18 Board, are there any questions for
19 Mr. Carpenter?

20 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: No, Madam Chair.
21 This is Board Member Brown.

22 For the record, I do have a question for
23 Investigator Cuevas.

24 Have the fingerprints come back for
25 Mr. Powell and Mr. Brunett?

1 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Investigator
2 Cuevas, for the record.

3 Yes, they both came back as negative; no
4 positive hits.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
6 further questions?

7 Hearing there are no further questions,
8 I'll entertain a motion.

9 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick. I
10 move that we grant Mr. Carpenter an individual
11 private investigator's license, and that license be
12 placed in abeyance so he may become the Qualifying
13 Agent for EFI Global. Also, that corporate officers
14 be approved, Steven T. Powell and Brian J. Brunett,
15 subject to all statutory and regulatory
16 requirements.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
18 we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
20 Brown. I'll second.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion,
22 we have a second. All in favor say aye.

23 (All present Board members voted aye.)

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

25 Congratulations and good luck to you.

1 Thank you for your service.

2 MR. CARPENTER: Thank you, very much.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: For all of your
4 service.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yeah.

6 Agenda Item No. 20, iUnited.

7 So, Agenda Item No. 20 postponed, just for
8 the record.

9 Agenda Item No. 21, Interpoint
10 Investigative Services, LLC.

11 Do we have Lisa Ribacoff?

12 Good morning.

13 MS. RIBACOFF: Good morning.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Please tell us a
15 little bit about yourself and intentions with the
16 license.

17 MS. RIBACOFF: Hi, good morning.

18 My name is Lisa Ribacoff. I am a
19 polygraph examiner that's just relocated from
20 New York to Vegas approximately three weeks ago.
21 Loving the weather completely right now. Bad time
22 to move.

23 I've been an examiner now for 13 years
24 based out of offices in New York, Connecticut, and
25 Florida. As I mentioned, I did relocate, which is

1 the purpose of receiving a license.

2 I'm currently an instructor for the
3 polygraph, in addition to also serving on two out of
4 the three international boards that do regulate the
5 polygraph industry --

6 THE REPORTER: Slow down, please.

7 MS. RIBACOFF: Sure.

8 As I mentioned, I'm an instructor. As
9 well as, I sit on the Board of Directors for the
10 American Polygraph Association and the National
11 Polygraph Association, which are two out of the
12 three regulatory agencies that oversee the polygraph
13 industry.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

15 Board, are there any questions for
16 Ms. Ribacoff?

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
18 Cortez.

19 Question about the Supreme Court case. It
20 was set for trial on March 1st. What's the status
21 of that case?

22 MS. RIBACOFF: So, the status of that case
23 is that filed on March 29, 2023, which I did declare
24 in my application. I was actually removed as a
25 party to the action. In addition to the other

1 family members of the entity, due to the fact the
2 litigation stems from a family business that was not
3 operating in a capacity of a polygraph firm.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do you happen to
5 have court minutes regarding the March 1st hearing?

6 MS. RIBACOFF: No, I do not, given the
7 fact that I was removed from the action in 2023.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, according to my
9 notes, you're still being listed as an applicant --
10 as a defendant on that particular case. That's why
11 I was asking for --

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Can we ask Swarthout?

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Sure.

14 Investigator Swarthout, could you give me
15 the update on the third case? We're -- I'm talking
16 about the Nassau County Supreme Court case.

17 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Investigator
18 Swarthout, for the record.

19 So, after the report was finalized, she
20 did provide the document showing that she was
21 removed and her family and the company were removed.
22 They're only moving forward on the other individuals
23 that were in the case.

24 MS. RIBACOFF: If I could further clarify?
25 There were multiple cases of litigation.

1 Those actions were merged into one action, which is
2 why it does apparently -- it comes across as if it
3 was currently active. I do have copies of the
4 motion to dismiss, if anyone does want a copy of
5 that. But it was declared, at the time of when my
6 application was filed, that I was removed at that
7 time.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

9 MS. RIBACOFF: No problem.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Just to clarify,
11 removed from all of them, then, since they were put
12 into one?

13 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yes.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

15 Board, any further questions?

16 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Yes, this is Board
17 Member Brown, for the record.

18 Ms. Ribacoff and I have spoken on the
19 phone several times during her process of obtaining
20 her license. Just general questions about how to go
21 about it, things of that nature. And we have run
22 across each other at national conferences in the
23 past, but I believe that I can vote impartially on
24 this.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

1 Are there any further questions from the
2 Board?

3 Hearing there are no questions, I'll
4 entertain a motion.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
6 motioning to approve Interpoint Investigative
7 Services, LLC a new corporate polygraph examiner
8 license. Ms. Lisa L. Ribacoff, approved for
9 individual polygraph examiner license, and that it
10 be placed in abeyance so she may become the
11 Qualifying Agent member. Also to be approved is
12 Lisa J. Ribacoff. All subject to statutory and
13 regulatory requirements.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
15 we have a second?

16 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
18 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

19 (All present Board members voted aye.)

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

21 Congratulations and good luck to you.

22 MS. RIBACOFF: Thank you.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 22.

24 We're going to try this, and I apologize in advance.

25 Mr. Couho?

1 MR. COUHO: Couho.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Couho, okay. Good
3 morning, sir.

4 MR. COUHO: Good morning.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Please tell us a
6 little bit about yourself and your intentions with
7 your license.

8 MR. COUHO: Yes.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You're going to have
10 to push the button.

11 MR. COUHO: Yes, good morning. My name is
12 Hermenegildo Couho. I start to be a security
13 officer in 1985. I work in Los Angeles from 1985 to
14 1990. After 8,000 hours of being a security
15 officer, I decide to take my examination for having
16 my own private security company. And I took my test
17 with Bureau of Security and Investigation Services
18 back in 1990.

19 I've been a security -- I've been a
20 private patrol operator since 1990 to the present
21 time. Working for C&C Security Patrol Services. In
22 2017 I opened up another security guard company, the
23 name of Armed Force Security. Just to make a
24 division of unarmed company, C&C Security Patrol,
25 and having an armed company with Armed Force

1 Security.

2 And that's pretty much my background.

3 I've been in the security industry for almost 39
4 years. And I would love to have a company in Vegas.

5 Thank you.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So that I'm clear, do
7 you own the company in California?

8 MR. COUHO: Yes, I do own the company in
9 California.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. I think your --
11 team, were you able to hear that, that he does own
12 the company in California? Okay.

13 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Yes, Madam Chair.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
15 questions?

16 Hearing there are no questions --

17 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Brown -- this
18 is Board Member Brown, for the record.

19 Mr. Couho, just want to check. You own
20 companies in California. You say you'd like to have
21 a company here in Nevada, but you've only applied
22 for an individual license. Do you plan to open a
23 company here or just work singularly?

24 MR. COUHO: I'm planning to move in
25 Las Vegas. If I get approved, I get a license from

1 the State of Nevada. I'm planning to move here in
2 Nevada and live here in Nevada.

3 Back in California, I have two corporate
4 of the company that they getting the qualifying
5 license with Bureau of Security.

6 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Are you
7 eventually planning on establishing a company here
8 in Nevada?

9 MR. COUHO: Yes, sir.

10 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Thank you.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Are there any further
12 questions from the Board?

13 I would suggest to you as you're going
14 through that process to start a company in
15 Las Vegas, work with the licensing board. They will
16 help you with that process, okay, so you don't get
17 caught up in...

18 Hearing there are no further questions,
19 I'll entertain a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick. I
21 move that we grant Mr. Couho an individual private
22 patrol officer's license, subject to all statutory
23 and regulatory requirements.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
25 we have a second?

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
2 Cortez seconding the motion.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
4 have a second. All in favor say aye.

5 (All present Board members voted aye.)

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.
7 Congratulations, sir. Good luck to you.

8 MR. COUHO: Thank you.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 23,
10 Vance Campbell.

11 Morning, Mr. Campbell.

12 MR. CAMPBELL: Good morning.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Please tell us a
14 little bit about yourself and the intentions with
15 the license.

16 MR. CAMPBELL: My name is Vance Campbell.
17 I spent four years in the United States Marine
18 Corps. After the Marines, I got out and got in the
19 private security sector overseas, where I spent a
20 year in Iraq and two years in Israel.

21 When my first daughter was born, I
22 temporarily decided to change career paths. I got
23 back into school, picked up another job. And once
24 we decided to move back out here to Vegas, I got
25 hired on with the current company that I'm in,

1 called Salient Operations Group, where we do
2 corporate security and close protection for the
3 Raiders and the Aces.

4 Basically, the classes I'm applying for
5 right now is just to become a QA for our sister
6 company (indiscernible).

7 THE REPORTER: Sister company?

8 MR. CAMPBELL: Stratton.

9 THE REPORTER: Thank you.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
11 there any questions for Mr. Campbell?

12 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
13 Brown, for the record.

14 Mr. Campbell, based on something you just
15 said, you're going to be the keyway (ph) for the new
16 company. Are you going to be the Qualifying Agent
17 for them?

18 MR. CAMPBELL: Yes, sir. Yes, sir. It's
19 currently being held by someone else, but we're in
20 the process of switching out.

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. That's -- you
22 didn't apply for that. I just wanted to make sure I
23 understood that. Thank you.

24 MR. CAMPBELL: Yes, sir.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are

1 there any further questions?

2 Hearing there are no further questions,
3 I'll entertain a motion.

4 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
5 Brown. I move that we grant Vance M. Campbell his
6 individual private patrol officer license, subject
7 to all statutory and regulatory requirements.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
9 motion. Do we have a second?

10 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
12 have a second. All in favor say aye.

13 (All present Board members voted aye.)

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

15 Congratulations. Good luck to you. And
16 thank you for your service, by the way.

17 So, Agenda Item No. 24, it's Shaw. It's a
18 very difficult name, so I don't want to get it
19 wrong. He's up north.

20 Sir, can you please tell us a little bit
21 about your business and the intentions with the
22 license? And then slowly spell out your name and
23 pronounce it.

24 We can't hear you, sir. You have to push
25 the button.

1 MR. AMIRGHASSEMKHANY: Can you hear me
2 now?

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes.

4 MR. AMIRGHASSEMKHANY: Is that better?
5 Okay.

6 Hi, everyone. My first name is Shahriar,
7 S-h-a-h-r-i-a-r. Last name is Amirghassemkhany,
8 that's spelled A-m-i-r-g-h-a-s-s-e-m-k-h-a-n-y. I
9 go by Shaw; that's my nickname. It's also the name
10 of the company.

11 I started my company back in 2000. As a
12 student at UC Berkeley, I started doing student
13 events and got my license providing security for all
14 the student events. We have -- our specialty is
15 special events. We also do (indiscernible).

16 THE REPORTER: Also do?

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Brick and mortar.

18 MR. AMIRGHASSEMKHANY: Also do brick and
19 mortar. Building security as well.

20 Over the last 25 years I've become an
21 expert in California as -- or as events go, and a
22 lot of our clients that do trade shows and
23 conferences in the Bay area and southern California
24 have asked us to start providing the same services
25 in Nevada, specifically Las Vegas. So we had an

1 opportunity to apply for our license here and expand
2 our business to Nevada.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
4 there any questions for Mr. Shaw? Sorry.

5 MR. AMIRGHASSEMKHANY: Shaw is great.

6 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
7 Brown, for the record.

8 Shaw, if I can call you that.

9 MR. AMIRGHASSEMKHANY: Please.

10 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: There's some issues
11 with some tax liens over the years.

12 MR. AMIRGHASSEMKHANY: Yes.

13 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: I'm just kind of
14 wondering, you owned your business and been in
15 business for 20 years, but you don't have the funds
16 to pay those off?

17 MR. AMIRGHASSEMKHANY: No. Different
18 business. I was also involved with two different
19 restaurant groups. I was a partner in them from
20 2007 to 2015. The tax matters were in regards to
21 that. We are in process of an offer and compromise,
22 and those liens are in noncollect status right now.

23 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay, thank you.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Are there any further
25 questions for Mr. Shaw?

1 I have one for counsel. Since that is
2 another business, would that affect -- I mean, like,
3 if they came -- they made a judgment to collect,
4 could they collect on both businesses?

5 DAG HARRIS: I would have to receive
6 additional information on the matter. I know that
7 he mentioned on his -- well, during the
8 investigation, it mentions that -- that the
9 applicant did provide documentation from the IRS to
10 show an offer and compromise.

11 The only lingering question I have to that
12 is whether or not that was accepted or did we
13 receive any type of documentation confirming that
14 that's no longer his financial responsibility.

15 I think if that's been addressed, then the
16 Board has freedom or leave to vote how it sees fit
17 on that. So long as that's addressed.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Diaz, do
19 you have any of that paperwork?

20 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: Investigator Diaz, for
21 the record.

22 Yes, I do have the paperwork from the IRS.
23 It just states that the offer and compromise does
24 show that he does not have to pay these specific --
25 all these tax liens and judgments that we found.

1 Those he does not have to pay because of financial
2 hardships. It was a full document, but going
3 through it with myself and Vincent Saladino, that's
4 all we got from it.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, it seems like it
6 was approved by the IRS, then. Thank you for that.

7 Board, are there any further questions?

8 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
9 Brown, for the record.

10 I just want to make sure that that
11 satisfies Counsel Harris, her concern.

12 DAG HARRIS: Yes. Given that that's not
13 an outstanding financial responsibility that he has,
14 you know, the Board has freedom, based on everything
15 else on this application, as to how it wants to
16 vote. But that does address my concerns, at least,
17 on his background.

18 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you, Counsel.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, if there's no
20 further questions, I'll entertain a motion.

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
22 Brown. Let me give this a shot.

23 I move that we approve Shaw Security
24 Management for a new corporate private patrol
25 officer license, and approve Shahriar

1 Amirghassemkhany for his individual private patrol
2 officer license, which would be placed in abeyance
3 so he may become a Qualifying Agent.

4 Mr. Amirghassemkhany, is also, as a
5 corporate officer, subject to all statutory and
6 regulatory requirements.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good job.

8 We have a motion. Do we have a second?

9 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
11 have a second. All in favor say aye.

12 (All present Board members voted aye.)

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes. Thank
14 you, Mr. Shaw, and good luck to you.

15 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This new facility
16 that we're in up here, our buttons are a little
17 touchy. If you happen to hover your finger too
18 close it turns it off. So we're still learning.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: No problem.

20 Agenda Item No. 25, ADC LTD.

21 MR. CORDOVA: Good morning.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Please tell us a
23 little bit about yourselves and intentions with the
24 license here in Nevada.

25 MR. CORDOVA: Good morning, everybody.

1 Thanks for having us here today. My name is Arthur
2 Jerome Cordova. I go by Jerome. We're ADC,
3 Limited. We're out of (indiscernible) New Mexico.

4 THE REPORTER: Can you please slow down?

5 MR. CORDOVA: Yes. Sorry about that.

6 We're out of Albuquerque, New Mexico.

7 We're a federal contractor providing federal
8 security services for the FAA. We've covered their
9 central region from Houston up to Detroit, and then
10 we've covered the East Coast from Puerto Rico all
11 the way up to Massachusetts.

12 They've asked us to expand into the West
13 Coast, and Las Vegas is one of the sites that is
14 within that contract. And so we're here doing our
15 part to be properly licensed in Nevada to provide
16 the services for the FAA.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

18 MR. CORDOVA: We are a family-owned
19 business, though. Brother, two sisters.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got you.

21 MS. A. CORDOVA: Guess who's the oldest.

22 MS. CORDOVA: Little brother, by the way.

23 MS. A. CORDOVA-BUSICK: And I'm Armanda,
24 and it's A-r-m-a-n-d-a, it's a little different,
25 Cordova-Busick. I am president and CEO.

1 And we've been doing business -- in
2 business as a family for 39 years now. And it's
3 grown, so we're actually now classified on the
4 federal side as a large business. And we're really
5 anxious to be able to expand. Looking to provide
6 services, as Jerome mentioned, on the west coast,
7 and this is considered part of the west coast here
8 in Nevada. So we would really appreciate your
9 support in allowing us to expand here.

10 MS. J. CORDOVA-ROMERO: I'm Judy
11 Cordova-Romero. It' a pleasure to be here. I'm
12 also one of the board members and owners of the
13 company. Been with ADC for almost 18 years. And we
14 are, as we said, anxious to continue to grow our
15 company. We've had very successful opportunities
16 across the country in several different states, and
17 now we would like to be here in Nevada.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
19 there any questions?

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
21 Cortez.

22 Good morning. The employee that
23 unfortunately resulted the company receiving a
24 violation. What happened with that employee?

25 MR. CORDOVA: That was in 2016. We had an

1 officer -- we had one of our receptionists -- let me
2 start from the beginning.

3 State of New Mexico --

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Hang on one second.
5 Did you say 2016?

6 MR. CORDOVA: I believe it was 2016 or
7 2019.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: 2019.

9 MR. CORDOVA: 2019. Sorry about that.

10 Prior to that, the company owned the
11 security guard cards. So our practice was, we had a
12 working relationship with the state, and we would
13 call and verify the status of the current cards and
14 where they were at.

15 Our receptionist reached out to the state,
16 was asking for status of two cards for certain
17 officers that were in the process.

18 The charge was, is the receptionist
19 identified herself as the guard. And she denied it.
20 So we went to the hearing, we paid the fine to --
21 because we didn't have proof whether she did or
22 didn't. She was removed from the position, and we
23 paid the fine to the state and continued doing
24 business.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood. Thank

1 you, so much.

2 MR. CORDOVA: Thank you.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any other Board
4 questions?

5 Hearing there are no further Board
6 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
8 Cortez motioning to approve ADC LTD NM, a new
9 corporate private patrol officer license.
10 Mr. Arturo J. Cordova approved for an individual
11 private patrol license, and that it be placed in
12 abeyance so that he may become the Qualifying Agent.
13 Corporate officers to be approved are Arthur J.
14 Cordova, Armanda B. Cordova-Busick, and Judy A.
15 Cordova-Romero. All subject to statutory and
16 regulatory requirements.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
18 we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
21 have a second. All in favor say aye.

22 (All present Board members voted aye.)

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

24 Congratulations, guys. Good luck to you.

25 MR. CORDOVA: Thank you. We appreciate

1 it.

2 MS. A. CORDOVA-BUSICK: Thank you, so
3 much. Appreciate your time.

4 MR. CORDOVA: Thank you.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 26,
6 James Crowell.

7 MR. CROWELL: Good morning.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good morning. You can
9 have a seat. Good morning, sir. Please tell us a
10 little bit about yourself and intentions with the
11 license.

12 MR. CROWELL: So, my name is James
13 Franklin Crowell. I am currently the vice-president
14 for Blackstone Consulting, Inc. out of Los Angeles,
15 California.

16 My background is, I'm a retired Special
17 Agent from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and
18 Firearms, where I served just a little over 28
19 years. Prior to that, I was a police officer in and
20 for the city of Stockton, California. Prior to that
21 I was in the Air Force.

22 Purpose of my application is to replace
23 our prior Qualified Agent, Brad Murray, who was the
24 overseer for the Beach Cities Protection and
25 Investigation Services. Brad gave us notice. And

1 since it ultimately fell on me, I made the
2 application to become that Qualified Agent.
3 Blackstone Consulting owns Beach Cities Private
4 Protection, as well as a company called Blue Nite
5 (ph) Protection.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And you said
7 you're out of California. Will you be local, then?

8 MR. CROWELL: I have a residence here.
9 And part of the requirement is that I will be here
10 to oversee the activities here moving forward.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you.

12 MR. CROWELL: Yes, ma'am.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
14 further questions?

15 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
16 Brown, for the record.

17 Mr. Crowell, I just want to clarify.
18 There was a citation for unlicensed activity with
19 Blackstone Consulting. But was that actually Beach
20 City (sic)? Because I've seen in our investigator's
21 notes that Beach City paid a citation.

22 MR. CROWELL: So, Blackstone is the parent
23 company of both Beach Cities and Blue Nite. The
24 citation, I believe, was issued to Blackstone
25 Consulting.

1 And in all honesty, we didn't think we
2 were operating outside the scope of the license.
3 But unfortunately, that wasn't the finding. And I
4 then authorized the payment of the fine in
5 relationship to that citation.

6 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you, sir.

7 MR. CROWELL: Yes, sir.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Question, Investigator
9 Blackmore. What was the violation?

10 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes.

11 Investigator Blackmore, for the record.

12 The violation was for Blackstone
13 Consulting doing business with the Apple stores
14 earlier this year in March.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So did they have a
16 license at that time?

17 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: No. So they were
18 operating as Blackstone Consulting. They're not
19 licensed with us at all.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Is Beach -- the
21 other companies, they are?

22 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Correct. So
23 Blackstone Consulting is a parent company of Beach
24 City. So Blackstone owns Beach City.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: But Beach City did

1 have a license?

2 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Correct. Beach
3 City has a license with us.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got it.

5 Any further questions from the Board?

6 Okay. Hearing there are no further
7 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
9 Cortez.

10 I do have one last question, my apologies.
11 What's the status for the filing of the d/b/a?

12 MR. CROWELL: So, it has been filed.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: For -- give me the
14 breakdown. It's been filed as who doing what?

15 MR. CROWELL: It is my understanding from
16 our registered agent that the d/b/a was filed with
17 Blackstone Protective Services, slash, Beach Cities,
18 doing business as Blackstone Consulting, Inc.

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Got it. Thank you,
20 very much.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Does that cover
22 everybody, then?

23 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Investigator
24 Blackmore, for the record.

25 So, I did receive a copy of the d/b/a

1 yesterday. We are going to end up talking about it
2 a little bit afterwards to see how they want to
3 proceed as a business here in Nevada. Because that
4 depends on whether, you know, they want to pay their
5 employees as Blackstone or Beach City. That depends
6 on how they process forward, the d/b/a or a trade
7 name.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: But this license
9 today -- will this license today cover all of them
10 or no?

11 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: It wouldn't cover
12 all of them, it would just be for Beach City.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So we're moving
14 forward with what's written on the agenda, not with
15 what's given with the new information provided
16 today.

17 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Correct. He is
18 aware that in case he does decide to change
19 anything, he'll do a corporate office -- sorry, a
20 change of status application.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood. Thank
22 you.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got it. Okay.

24 Any further questions? Hearing there are
25 no further questions, I'll entertain a motion.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
2 Cortez motioning to approve Mr. James F. Crowell an
3 individual private patrol officer license, and that
4 it be placed in abeyance so that he may become the
5 Qualifying Agent for Beach City Investigation and
6 Protective Service, Inc., license No. 2122. All
7 subject to statutory and regulatory requirements.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
9 motion. Do we have a second?

10 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
12 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

13 (All present Board members voted aye.)

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, the Motion passes.
15 Congratulations, sir.

16 MR. CROWELL: Can I say something, ma'am?

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sure.

18 MR. CROWELL: On behalf of Blackstone
19 Consulting, and my -- and me personally, we would
20 have never intentionally violated any law or
21 regulation. And because of that, I'd like to offer
22 my sincere apologies for us operating as a business
23 without a license.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We appreciate that,
25 sir. Thank you.

1 MR. CROWELL: Thank you.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

3 Oh, did I say motion approved? I'm
4 getting looks.

5 THE REPORTER: I don't think so.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So, motion
7 approved. Congratulations again. Thank you.

8 THE REPORTER: Actually, you had. I just
9 didn't see it on my screen.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Just covering our
11 bases.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. The next agenda
13 item is Agenda Item No. 27, BTA, LLC.

14 Just to start off with -- please come up
15 front. We did receive the fingerprints for
16 everyone, so we can move forward. And we have
17 William Roshak and Tetiana -- sorry.

18 MS. LUZHANSKA: Luzhanska.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Luzhanska, okay.

20 Please tell us a little bit about
21 yourselves and the intentions with the license.

22 MR. ROSHAK: My name is Bill Roshak. I
23 spent 22 years with Las Vegas Metropolitan Police
24 Department. 15 of that was undercover, working on a
25 surveillance squad for Homeland Security and

1 intelligence.

2 Since retiring, I also did some work for
3 several of the other private security companies
4 around town. During that time, one of the owners
5 talked to me about K9 handling.

6 Since 2020, I've been working with -- also
7 working with Mel English with Makor K9. And part of
8 my intention was to also have the K9 handler
9 license.

10 Unfortunately, during the licensing, or
11 the testing period, my dog was still a little green.
12 She didn't pass at that time, so I look forward to
13 being able to get her a little more seasoned, or
14 more seasoned for a different test. At the time,
15 the only thing that was available was explosive. So
16 whenever that is available again I would test for
17 that again as well.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

19 MS. LUZHANSKA: Morning. My name is
20 Tetiana Luzhanska, and I'm just a managing member of
21 the company.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

23 Board, are there any questions?

24 Just to confirm, it is on the paperwork,
25 but everything from the court case has been

1 dismissed and taken care of?

2 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Investigator
3 Cuevas, for the record.

4 Yes, I have a copy of the dismissal of the
5 civil suit.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any questions for the
7 Board?

8 Hearing there's no questions, I'll
9 entertain a motion.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
11 Cortez motioning to approve BTA LLC a new corporate
12 patrol -- private patrol officer and private
13 investigator license. Mr. William G. Roshak
14 approving -- to be approved for an individual
15 private patrol officer and individual private
16 investigator license. And that the license be
17 placed in abeyance so that he may become the
18 Qualifying Agent. Member to be -- members to be
19 approved are William G. Roshak and Tetiana
20 Luzhanska, both subject to statutory and regulatory
21 requirements.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
23 we have a second?

24 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
25 Brown. I'll second.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We'll start with
2 Agenda -- let's -- since we're going into a new
3 agenda category, we're going to take a quick
4 ten-minute break. Thanks, guys. We'll be right
5 back.

6 (Off record.)

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Is there anybody that
8 needs to get sworn in or -- actually, when you come
9 in and sit down for your portion, could you please
10 just let us know that you've been sworn in? I think
11 that's probably the best way.

12 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Are you here for the
13 Private Investigator Licensing Board? Are you on
14 our agenda?

15 Madam Chair, we have one member of the
16 audience up here that's just walked in and needs to
17 be sworn in.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Are there any other
19 members of the chair that need to be sworn in -- or
20 any other members that need to be sworn in? If you
21 weren't here earlier and sworn in and you're going
22 to testify or come up and talk to your work card,
23 you need to get sworn in. We have one down here,
24 too.

25 Counsel Harris, can we do that again?

1 Please stand, sir. Up north, we can't see you, but
2 if you can please stand.

3 DAG HARRIS: For both the south and north,
4 please stand and raise your right hand.

5

6 AUDIENCE MEMBERS,
7 having been duly sworn,
8 testified as follows:

9

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We'll start with
11 Agenda Item No. 28, Woodrow Trice. Hello, sir.

12 Investigator Dumas, could you please
13 please tell us why we're here for Mr. Trice.

14 MS. DUMAS: Good morning. Investigator
15 Dumas, for the record.

16 The applicant was denied due to the
17 assault with deadly weapon charge, along with
18 numerous drug possession charges. One being a
19 confirmed felon.

20 THE REPORTER: Confirmed felon? Wait,
21 wait.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: She couldn't hear you.
23 Confirmed felon by what?

24 MS. DUMAS: The confirmed felony by
25 fingerprint results. The applicant only disclosed a

1 couple of the charges and was denied. He submitted
2 a written appeal. Was not made provisional, and is
3 here to appeal.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

5 So, one quick question. Was he just,
6 like, denied when he admitted to the felony and then
7 didn't put down the other charges just based off of
8 the denial? Or were they omitted from the
9 application?

10 MS. DUMAS: He disclosed a misdemeanor
11 charge.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
13 questions for Mr. Trice?

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board member
15 Cortez.

16 Hi, Mr. Trice. Could you tell me -- could
17 you tell us why you failed to disclose all of your
18 criminal history?

19 MR. TRICE: Tell you why I?

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Failed to disclose
21 any of your criminal history. Well, you disclosed
22 one of them. But then you have a list of criminal
23 background -- like, a criminal background.

24 MR. TRICE: I disclosed -- they asked for
25 the two felonies. Hit this. They asked for the two

1 felonies. That was all -- and that's what I
2 disclosed. The two felonies 25 years ago

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you have any
4 assistance filling out your application?

5 MR. TRICE: Did I have assistance?

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Uh-huh.

7 MR. TRICE: No.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you happen to
9 read the entire packet of the application?

10 MR. TRICE: I may not -- I may have missed
11 something. But if they asked for more than that,
12 that was all I saw, was the two felonies.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Right. So, on --
14 did you do it online or did you do a paper one?

15 MR. TRICE: I came in. I didn't do it
16 online.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. So, on the
18 application, there is a specific page with a stop
19 sign. And it specifically lists what it is that you
20 have to list for your criminal history. And on
21 there, it lists, even if it's been dismissed or if
22 it's a misdemeanor or whatever -- or the case is
23 still pending, you had to list everything. Not just
24 your felonies.

25 MR. TRICE: I thought you said --

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That's why I had
2 asked you if you had read the application nice and
3 slow, just to see that. But it sounds like you
4 might have missed that page.

5 No further questions. Thank you.

6 MR. TRICE: I thought they just said --
7 just asked for the felonies.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Can I get some
9 clarification? Because I think some of the
10 misdemeanors or one of the misdemeanors and two of
11 the felonies were listed. Are there more?

12 MR. TRICE: Misdemeanors.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Hang on, sir.

14 MS. DUMAS: The felony assault with a
15 deadly weapon towards a peace officer was not
16 disclosed. Neither was the felony for transfer of
17 selling narcotics or controlled substance. Only the
18 misdemeanor charge for which he was convicted.

19 MR. TRICE: I've only had two
20 misdemeanors.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, hang on, hang
22 on. Let's work through this, okay?

23 So, the felony was not disclosed? Or the
24 two felonies were disclosed?

25 MS. DUMAS: Neither felonies were

1 disclosed.

2 MR. TRICE: She's saying no felonies?

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Hang on, hang on.

4 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Madam Chair, this is
5 Board Member Brown. I think I may be able to
6 clarify, in talking to Investigator Dumas.

7 In the initial application he did not
8 disclose three felonies but did disclose a
9 misdemeanor. Once the investigator contacted him,
10 he then disclosed felonies.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got it, okay.

12 So was he -- but he wasn't given a
13 provisional card because of the misdemeanor?
14 Because on here it says he wasn't given a
15 provisional because of the felonies.

16 MS. DUMAS: Correct. He was never issued
17 a provisional.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Are there any further
19 questions from the Board?

20 If there's no further questions, I'll
21 entertain a motion.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
23 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial based on
24 failure to disclose the entire criminal history.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a

1 motion. Do we have a second?

2 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
3 Brown, second.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
5 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

6 (All present Board members voted aye.)

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Hang on.

8 I'm sorry, we couldn't hear you,
9 gentlemen.

10 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown,
11 aye.

12 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick, aye.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

14 Sir, I understand that you -- once you
15 were contacted you disclosed your other information,
16 okay? I understand that.

17 The problem is, when you're in the
18 actual -- when you're submitting it for the very
19 first time, when you hand it in, it has to have --
20 you have to give all of your arrests. And it very
21 clearly states in the application, it doesn't matter
22 if you were convicted or not, if you were arrested,
23 you need to submit that in your application. You
24 did not do that. That's a mistake and we understand
25 that. But our precedence, what we've done every

1 single time is, if you have not disclosed it, then
2 we have to deny it, okay?

3 But, you can come back to us in one year
4 and disclose all of that information and this should
5 not be a problem. We hope to see you in one year.
6 But please thoroughly read through the application
7 and submit everything within -- that you have been
8 arrested for, okay?

9 MR. TRICE: Yes, ma'am.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: All right. Thank you,
11 sir. Have a good day.

12 Agenda Item No. 29, Jordan
13 Ramirez-Hernandez.

14 Good morning, sir.

15 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: Good morning.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Dumas,
17 please tell us why we're here for Mr. Hernandez.

18 MS. DUMAS: The applicant was denied for
19 his unlawful discharge of firearm charge from 2018.
20 The applicant only disclosed the firearm arrest, was
21 denied. He submitted an appeal in writing. Was not
22 made provisional, and is here to appeal today.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
24 there any questions for Mr. Hernandez?

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member

1 Cortez.

2 How are you doing, Mr. Ramirez-Hernandez?

3 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: Good.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Talk to me about the
5 2018. What were the circumstances of the unlawful
6 discharge?

7 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: Basically, I
8 was -- I was charged with just firing a armed
9 weapon, endangering a person.

10 I was just trying to obtain a firearm, and
11 that was the only way I thought I could gain
12 experience by shooting at that range. I thought it
13 was free. I didn't have enough money to -- to go
14 inside a shooting range. And that's about it.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm a visual
16 individual, okay? So I need to hear the story,
17 like, how it occurred.

18 So you went to a fire range?

19 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: Yeah.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And you -- so, did
21 you pay for the admission and you went behind? Did
22 this happen before hours? After hours?

23 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: It was on Sloan
24 and it was for free.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: It was what?

1 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: It was for free.
2 It was on Sloan, right there by the freeway. The
3 officer that pulled me -- stopped me and told me
4 that I was not in the -- in the line. But when I
5 passed him, I passed through a sign that said with
6 this -- with this area it's okay to shoot there.
7 But I guess in his eyes I didn't -- I didn't pass
8 the legal limit.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm going to need a
10 little bit of clarification.

11 So you left the fire range and then you
12 got pulled over?

13 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: Yeah.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So an officer
15 followed you from --

16 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: Yeah, yeah. He
17 waited until I got out of the area to stop me.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Investigator Dumas,
19 do we happen to have the police report for that
20 incident?

21 INVESTIGATOR DUMAS: I was unable to
22 obtain a police report. This was out of
23 Goodsprings.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do we have court
25 minutes regarding the 2018 case?

1 MS. DUMAS: Yes, I have court minutes for
2 that.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board indulgence.

4 (Off record.)

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Investigator Dumas,
6 what was the location of the incident and time?

7 MS. DUMAS: The only thing that the
8 minutes mention or that -- is that his charge was
9 the discharge of a firearm or other weapon where
10 person might be endangered.

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: There's no verbiage
12 regarding outdoor, indoor, dwelling?

13 MS. DUMAS: Correct. It does list a
14 victim, which was a witness. He or she was paid
15 restitution by the applicant.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, if I'm
17 understanding correctly, the story.

18 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: Yes, ma'am.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You saw someone who
20 had a weapon. You wanted to gain weapons
21 experience. You took the weapon from them, and went
22 to go shoot and you were caught?

23 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: No. Not at all.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

25 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: I was just trying

1 to practice because I was trying to elevate where I
2 worked at. As security, I wanted to get the
3 firearm -- the guard card firearm. So I was trying
4 to practice. And I didn't have enough funds to
5 actually pay for a shooting range. So one of my
6 friends recommended me go to that range where it was
7 for free. Which was on Sloan.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: And you were outside
9 of the range when you were picked up.

10 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: Yeah, I was
11 outside of the range.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And then who is
13 the victim? How are they involved in this?

14 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: I don't remember
15 who it was. It was -- it was an officer. He said
16 that the bullet, when I was practicing it ricocheted
17 on his car. In my eyes, I didn't believe that
18 happened. But because there was other cars and it
19 only hit his. He said that only hit his, but there
20 was a lot of cars behind me, and none of them --
21 none of them got hit. Only his.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So when you were
23 shooting, there was a claim -- because you were
24 outside of the range, there was a claim that your
25 bullet ricocheted and hit someone's personal

1 vehicle.

2 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: Yeah.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got it.

4 Does that help?

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Yes, but no.

6 DAG HARRIS: DAG Harris, for the record.

7 Just wanted to ask a question for

8 Investigator Dumas.

9 The minutes that you're reviewing, are
10 those the sentencing minutes?

11 INVESTIGATOR DUMAS: Yes. This is the
12 disposition for his 2018 case.

13 DAG HARRIS: Okay. And by any chance, do
14 the minutes reflect that he entered into a guilty
15 plea agreement? If it doesn't say, that's fine. I
16 mean, I just need to know.

17 MS. DUMAS: They do say he was sentenced
18 to 90 days along with the restitution.

19 DAG HARRIS: Okay. So it only speaks as
20 to only the disposition. You don't have any other
21 minutes of any other related hearings.

22 MS. DUMAS: Correct.

23 DAG HARRIS: Okay, thank you.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
25 Cortez.

1 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
2 Brown. I'm sorry, this is Board Member Brown.

3 I have a bigger issue, which is the
4 failure to disclose a 2011 felony robbery in the
5 first degree. Although the gentleman was a juvenile
6 at the time, he failed to disclose it.

7 I know Board Member Cortez is more
8 familiar with the verbiage on that page, but does it
9 list juvenile offenses, also?

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Brown,
11 are you referring to the application, as far as what
12 gets listed and what doesn't get listed?

13 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Correct. I don't
14 remember off the top of my head if it lists juvenile
15 convictions.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, I have it pulled
17 up here. That's exactly what I was looking for as
18 well. What it says, it's the first bullet point,
19 list all charges regardless of how long ago the
20 incident occurred, even if -- the second bullet
21 point, even if they occurred in a different state.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: But it doesn't mention
23 juvenile?

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That would cover --
25 list all charges, regardless of how long ago the

1 incident occurred. Period.

2 DAG HARRIS: DAG Harris, for the record.

3 Just as a reminder to the Board for its
4 past precedent, applicants are still expected to
5 list all law enforcement contact: Arrests,
6 convictions, even if they were minors. That could
7 be a special note on the application, but they are
8 still expected to list it. And you've had prior
9 applicants would have been denied for failure to
10 disclose items that occurred when they were minors.

11 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
12 Brown, for the record.

13 Thank you, ladies, for the clarification.

14 Therefore, Mr. Ramirez-Hernandez, why did
15 you fail to list that felony robbery charge?

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You have to push the
17 button.

18 MR. RAMIREZ-HERNANDEZ: To be sincere, I
19 totally forgot about that.

20 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay, thank you.
21 Nothing further.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions?
23 Are there any further questions?

24 Hearing there are no further questions,
25 I'll entertain a motion.

1 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
2 Brown.

3 I move that we uphold the denial for
4 Jordan Ramirez-Hernandez based on failure to
5 disclose felony charges.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
7 we have a second?

8 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
10 have a second. All in favor say aye.

11 (All present Board members voted aye.)

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So the motion passes.

13 Sir, you will not get your work card
14 today. But you do have an opportunity to come in in
15 a year and reapply. Just make sure that you list
16 all the things that we questioned. Thank you, sir.
17 Have a good day.

18 Agenda Item No. 30, Glenn Ford.

19 Good morning.

20 MR. FORD: Morning.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Just to confirm
22 because you're a little bit behind the pole for me,
23 did you -- were you sworn in?

24 MR. FORD: Yes.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Awesome, thank

1 you.

2 Investigator Dumas, could you please tell
3 us why we're here for Mr. Ford?

4 MS. DUMAS: The applicant was denied due
5 to the weapons charge from 2022. He submitted a
6 written appeal, was not made provisional, and is
7 here to appeal today.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Board, any
9 questions for Mr. Ford?

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
11 Cortez. I do have a question for Investigator
12 Dumas.

13 What's the status of the court case?

14 While you're looking that up, Mr. Ford,
15 why did you fail to disclose the remainder contact
16 with law enforcement criminal history?

17 MR. FORD: Actually -- because -- actually
18 happened, when I was, I guess, arrested for it, it
19 wasn't -- it wasn't my firearm, you know? And I was
20 only arrested, I wasn't charged. I was only...

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Hang on. You
22 misunderstood my question.

23 Why did you fail to disclose the other law
24 enforcement history -- contact with law enforcement?
25 You have a 1996 case, '97 case, '98 case, and a 2000

1 case.

2 MR. FORD: '96? I don't know. I forgot
3 about that. I forgot about those ones. But all the
4 other ones I submitted. And the -- when I talked to
5 the POB lady that told me about it, I didn't know.
6 So I printed up all of my information that I needed
7 so I can bring it in so I didn't forget anything. I
8 could have everything in -- in writing. I have all
9 my stuff here.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Perfect. Okay.
11 Thank you.

12 Do you have an update, Investigator Dumas?

13 MS. DUMAS: The case is out of Riverside.
14 Investigator Swarthout and I sent the applicant an
15 e-mail to provide us with court documents. He never
16 submitted them. I was unable to obtain those as
17 well. It does cost us money. Which is why I asked
18 the applicant to get those for me. And I haven't
19 received anything to date.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood, thank
21 you.

22 Mr. Ford, what's the status of your case?

23 MR. FORD: I don't have it. I don't have
24 it. I don't have any open cases.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So the one count of

1 CCW and a weapon, you're not pending court?

2 MR. FORD: No. I wasn't -- I was never
3 charged -- I was never charged with it, and I never
4 been with no court date, no anything.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do you recall any
6 kind of law enforcement contact sometime in January
7 2 years ago?

8 MR. FORD: Yes.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: What happened?

10 MR. FORD: Okay. Actually, me and my
11 girlfriend was headed to California. I had just
12 picked her up from work.

13 And it was, like, soon as we got off the
14 freeway we got pulled over for tinted windows. And
15 it was actually her firearm. But since I was -- I
16 was the owner of the vehicle, they arrested both of
17 us. And it wasn't my firearm, it wasn't in my
18 possession. It was just -- it was just in my car.

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you go to court?

20 MR. FORD: No. I didn't have a court --
21 or nothing. I had bail -- we bailed out. I didn't
22 have anything. But I had hired a lawyer because --
23 just because of it. And the lawyer is the one who
24 told me -- did everything. They threw it out.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So there was a court

1 case.

2 MR. FORD: Not from -- from my
3 understanding when I talked to the lawyer, he said
4 no. They dropped the charges. So there was no
5 court date.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So in order for
7 someone to drop the charges, or the DA to drop the
8 charges, there has to be a court hearing. Or the
9 case doesn't even go to court. But it doesn't sound
10 like we know exactly what the status is.

11 MR. FORD: Yeah.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: No further
13 questions. Thank you.

14 MR. FORD: Yeah.

15 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
16 Brown.

17 Mr. Ford, I have a question for you.

18 MR. FORD: Yes.

19 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Do you -- you applied
20 with us in August two years ago, correct?

21 MR. FORD: Yes.

22 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: And you were denied
23 at that time?

24 MR. FORD: I believe so.

25 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. I'm pretty

1 sure our investigators at that time told you why you
2 were denied and that if you applied again, you
3 needed to disclose everything.

4 On the information that we have, I show
5 seven charges, and you only admitted -- or listed
6 the most recent one in 2022. I would believe in
7 2022 when you applied, our investigators told you
8 that you had to list all those previous charges.
9 And you failed to do that. Can you tell me why you
10 failed to do that?

11 MR. FORD: Actually, I didn't -- I didn't
12 remember -- or I wasn't privy to all of them. And
13 when I was -- when I was told again, just so I
14 wouldn't make any mistakes on any of them, I had my
15 lawyer look it up for me and he sent me the e-mail.
16 So I printed them out.

17 And I had missed -- I had missed a couple
18 of, I guess, investigator's phone calls or e-mails.
19 So she called me when I was at work. And I was,
20 like -- so I made sure that I had printed everything
21 out, so once I come for the hearing I can add
22 everything so I won't miss anything. So I do have
23 everything with me now. Got it. I wasn't able to
24 e-mail it to her in time. But I did bring it with
25 me today.

1 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Thank you,
2 sir.

3 Nothing further.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
5 questions?

6 Hearing there are no further questions,
7 I'll entertain a motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board
9 Member --

10 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: (Indiscernible.)

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Go ahead,
12 Mr. Bezick.

13 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick. I
14 move for a denial based on nondisclosure of full
15 arrest record.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
17 we have a second?

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
19 Cortez seconding the motion. Also noting that we
20 have a 2022 case, time and distance.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
22 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

23 (All present Board members voted aye.)

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

25 So, you have your printout now. Please --

1 you have an opportunity to apply again in a year.
2 Please use that printout. And if there's any other
3 issues or any other interactions with law
4 enforcement, please make sure that you have that
5 information as well. You have to put down
6 everything. So all the stuff that's listed on your
7 current application, hopefully you have a copy of
8 that, you'll need to list that and anything that you
9 have there.

10 If you have any questions, the office is
11 willing to help you. So please sit down with them,
12 ask to have an appointment and get that support,
13 okay?

14 MR. FORD: Okay.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: All right, thank you.

16 MR. FORD: Thank you.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Take care.

18 Agenda Item No. 31, Julio Gonzalez.

19 MR. GONZALEZ: Morning, everybody.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good morning.

21 Investigator Dumas, could you please tell
22 us why we're here for Mr. Gonzalez?

23 MS. DUMAS: The applicant was denied due
24 to him listing a strong arm robbery offense on his
25 application. He submitted a written appeal, was not

1 made provisional, and is here to appeal today.

2 The applicant's fingerprints only show a
3 2009 traffic arrest, so I wasn't able to see an
4 outcome or disposition from the strong armed
5 robbery.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And to be
7 clear, that was in 1985?

8 MS. DUMAS: According to the applicant,
9 yes, 1985.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. But then
11 nothing -- nothing came back on the prints
12 showing -- it was just an arrest.

13 MS. DUMAS: Correct.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. It was
15 listed --

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
17 Cortez.

18 Investigator Dumas, just for
19 clarification, in the summary, we have the
20 fingerprints showing a 2009 traffic arrest. That
21 that was not disclosed. Is that how I'm reading
22 this correctly?

23 MS. DUMAS: That's correct. The severity
24 of that is unknown.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Mr. Gonzalez, could

1 you -- what happened in 2009? What's the traffic
2 arrest about?

3 MR. GONZALEZ: I'm from Chicago; Chicago,
4 Illinois, and they stopped me for tinted windows.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: What was the
6 disposition? What happened?

7 MR. GONZALEZ: They stopped me for tinted
8 windows. And then that's when I found out that
9 because of tickets, my license was suspended. So I
10 got all that straightened out as soon as I knew what
11 was going on.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you have to pay
13 a fine?

14 MR. FORD: Yes, I did pay a fine.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Any jail time?

16 MR. GONZALEZ: No.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Is there a reason
18 why you didn't list that?

19 MR. GONZALEZ: I -- it was -- I didn't
20 think it was a felony or -- I was never told it was
21 a felony or a misdemeanor or anything like that.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay, understood.
23 Fair enough. Thank you.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
25 questions for Mr. Gonzalez?

1 Hearing there are no further questions

2 I'll entertain a motion.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
4 Cortez.

5 I am going to motion to approve
6 Mr. Gonzalez's appeal granting him the work card.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion.
8 Do we have a second?

9 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
10 Brown.

11 I'll second. Also, on the traffic arrest,
12 that may have been an infraction is why it's not
13 showing up. Even though it was an arrest, it may
14 have been served as an infraction. So I second the
15 motion to grant the appeal based on disclosure of
16 his felony.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you for the
18 clarification.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion,
20 we have a second. All in favor say aye.

21 (All present Board members voted aye.)

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

23 So the office will contact you for next
24 steps to get your work card, okay?

25 MR. GONZALEZ: Thank you. God bless you,

1 guys. Have a blessed day.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 32,
3 Darnell Coleman.

4 By the way, for the record while
5 Mr. Darnell is coming up, Investigator Dumas, I know
6 this is your first meeting. You're doing a
7 fantastic job. So thank you.

8 Could you please tell us, Investigator
9 Dumas, why we're here for Mr. Coleman?

10 MS. DUMAS: The applicant was denied for
11 multiple felonies in both California and Nevada.
12 Most recently having been in the Nevada State Prison
13 system. He didn't disclose all arrests. Applicant
14 is aware of the denial that happened at the time of
15 application. He submitted a written appeal. He was
16 not made provisional and is here to appeal today.

17 The undisclosed arrests were found on his
18 fingerprint results. The applicant applied back in
19 February of 2010, was denied for felony convictions,
20 and he did not appeal at that time.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
22 Cortez.

23 Investigator Dumas, did you say that he
24 did or did not disclose?

25 MS. DUMAS: He did not disclose all of

1 them.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Are there any
4 questions for Mr. Coleman?

5 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
6 Brown.

7 Mr. Coleman, why did you fail to disclose
8 two of your charges?

9 MR. COLEMAN: Mr. Brown, to be frank with
10 you, I have a lot of charges. I tried to remember
11 the most -- worst charges. If I didn't put
12 something down there, it was because it slipped my
13 mind. And, yeah, that's -- I listed all of the big
14 charges. Maybe a traffic stop or a -- if I can
15 think about it, maybe a grand larceny that I didn't
16 put on there.

17 But I tried to put all of the -- I even
18 had another separate piece of paper to write down
19 the rest of my charges. Because the lady at the
20 office told me that I need to write down everything
21 that I can remember. So everything that I can
22 remember, I wrote down, sir.

23 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Sir, just as a matter
24 of fact, there's a 2012 felony abuse, neglect, or
25 endanger of a child that you failed to list.

1 As a former child abuse investigator, I
2 find that to be a serious one. I think you could
3 have remembered that one maybe.

4 MR. COLEMAN: I honestly thought I put
5 that down there, sir. That was a court case with my
6 daughter. And I thought -- I believed I put that
7 down there. If I didn't, that was an honest mistake
8 and I accept the consequences.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you for that.
10 Just -- I forgot to ask when you sat down, you have
11 been sworn in, right?

12 MR. COLEMAN: Yes.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. I see people
14 coming in. Okay.

15 Board, are there any further questions for
16 Mr. Coleman?

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
18 Cortez.

19 Mr. Coleman, what was your release date?

20 MR. COLEMAN: For that -- I was --

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: For the 2018 case.

22 MR. COLEMAN: Can you --

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: The three counts of
24 possession to sell Schedules I and II.

25 MR. COLEMAN: I've been out of prison for

1 five years now.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. So five
3 years.

4 MR. COLEMAN: Yes, ma'am.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
7 from the Board?

8 Hearing there are no further questions,
9 I'll entertain a motion.

10 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick. I
11 move we uphold the denial based on nondisclosure of
12 the full arrest record.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
14 we have a second?

15 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
16 Brown. I'll second.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
18 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

19 (All present Board members voted aye.)

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Have a
21 great day.

22 Motion passes.

23 Agenda Item No. 33, Aaron Hendrix.

24 Mr. Hendrix. Good morning, sir. Morning
25 still.

1 MR. HENDRIX: Good morning.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Dumas, do
3 you want to tell us why we're here for Mr. Hendrix?

4 MS. DUMAS: Applicant was denied due to
5 the prohibited person with firearm charge. The
6 applicant is currently on Nevada Parole & Probation
7 supervision since July 25th, 2022, with an end
8 expiration date of April 21st, 2027 for his robbery
9 and burglary with deadly weapon charges.

10 He submitted a written appeal, was not
11 made provisional, and is here to appeal today.

12 I found two cases out of San Bernardino
13 Superior Court. The charges match up with arrests
14 on the applicant's fingerprints, which he was not
15 found guilty by reason of insanity and was committed
16 to a mental health facility.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
18 there any questions for Mr. Hendrix?

19 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
20 Brown.

21 Mr. Hendrix, a question we've been asking
22 everybody so far. Why did you fail to disclose your
23 felonies?

24 MR. HENDRIX: The felonies for the -- in
25 San Bernardino? I put all my felonies on there.

1 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Well, Mr. Hendrix, I
2 show, on the paperwork that I have, eight felony
3 charges. None of them were -- show that you
4 disclosed them going back to 1996.

5 MR. HENDRIX: When I filled out, I put all
6 the felonies all the way from when I was younger on
7 there.

8 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Thank you.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
10 for Mr. Hendrix?

11 MR. HENDRIX: Yes. Tell me what you --

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, it's the Board.

13 MR. HENDRIX: Sorry.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
15 Cortez.

16 Mr. Hendrix, I want to confirm your
17 answer. You said you did disclose all of your
18 felonies?

19 MR. HENDRIX: Yes.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, unfortunately,
21 our investigator has her notes that you have
22 disclosed none of your felonies. So that's why both
23 myself and Board Member Brown were asking what that
24 situation was.

25 Then I also just want to confirm, you are

1 actively on probation or parole?

2 MR. HENDRIX: Parole.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Due to expire
4 in 2027?

5 MR. HENDRIX: 2025. Don't make it '27.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: All right.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, did you disclose
8 those when the investigator called you and talked to
9 you about your record?

10 MR. HENDRIX: When I went to fill out --
11 for the PI, I disclosed. When I went up there to be
12 a security guard, I disclosed it then.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you just say
14 kiddy guard?

15 MR. HENDRIX: No. I said security guard.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I heard kiddy guard.
17 Got it, thank you.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Are there any further
19 questions from the Board?

20 Hearing there are no further questions,
21 I'll entertain a motion.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
23 Cortez, motioning to uphold the denial based on
24 failure to disclose. And we have an active case
25 with probation -- or parole due to term April 21st

1 of 2027.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
3 we have a second?

4 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
5 Brown.

6 I'll second.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
8 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

9 (All present Board members voted aye.)

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

11 So, sir, unfortunately, at this time you
12 won't be able to get your work card. You -- I think
13 probably your best bet is to wait until your parole
14 is completed and you have that documentation. You
15 can take that documentation, as well as your current
16 application. And where it has listed all of your
17 incidences with law enforcement to help support you
18 through your next application, okay?

19 MR. HENDRIX: Okay.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, very much.
21 You have a great day.

22 MR. HENDRIX: You as well.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 34,
24 Drake Owens.

25 MR. OWENS: Good morning, sir.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good morning.

2 MR. OWENS: Good morning, ladies and
3 gentlemen.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Dumas,
5 could you please tell us why we're here for
6 Mr. Owens?

7 MS. DUMAS: Applicant was denied due to
8 the felony convictions, which he served prison
9 sentences for in Kent and Oakland counties in
10 Michigan.

11 Applicant only disclosed a couple of the
12 charges and was denied. He submitted a written
13 appeal, was not made provisional, and is here to
14 appeal today.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
16 there any questions for Mr. Owens?

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
18 Cortez.

19 Good morning.

20 MR. OWENS: Good morning.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Mr. Owens, why did
22 we fail to disclose all of the history?

23 MR. OWENS: I called the courts, the
24 record department. And when I tried to get the
25 dates and years I couldn't find them. They couldn't

1 find them for me. A lot of them -- Michigan has
2 expunged a lot of records. So a lot of them I could
3 not reach. I called Kent, Oakland, and Wayne
4 County. And they couldn't give me no answers, no
5 dates or anything. So therefore, I put down what I
6 could.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood. Thank
8 you.

9 MR. OWENS: You're welcome.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
11 for the Board?

12 Hearing there are no further questions,
13 I'll entertain a motion.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
15 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial based on full
16 disclosure of previous criminal history.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion.
18 Do we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion,
21 we have a second. All in favor say aye.

22 (All present Board members voted aye.)

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, sir, same thing
24 I've been telling other folks, is that you have an
25 opportunity to apply again in one year. And now you

1 have all of your criminal history and the dates.

2 MR. OWENS: I wrote down what they gave
3 me. I put it on paper. And also explained to -- on
4 the application that I couldn't get answers,
5 questions of the dates, because it was over 30 years
6 ago. So therefore, I couldn't do the research if I
7 couldn't -- if the courts didn't give them to me or
8 the record department didn't give it to me, how do I
9 find anything out?

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
11 Cortez.

12 So here's my suggestion to you. You don't
13 have to be so specific on the dates. We totally get
14 it. And as we age, I don't remember what I had for
15 breakfast yesterday. So I completely get that. But
16 if you put down something. We all remember if we
17 got in handcuffs, if we did a day, if we sat in jail
18 for a few minutes. We do remember that.

19 MR. OWENS: Yes.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That's all we ask.
21 We ask that you at least disclose it. If you're off
22 by a day, at least you disclosed it.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Or a couple of years
24 even.

25 MR. OWENS: I couldn't find out anything

1 at the time. And I still call -- I still couldn't
2 get no answers to the question.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: But you have the
4 answers now. They ran your fingerprints in your
5 application that's been turned in, and you can work
6 with the office to get that information.

7 MR. OWENS: Yes.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: They have all of that
9 information for you now. So you have an opportunity
10 next time you fill it out --

11 MR. OWENS: So I need to call the office
12 to find out the information?

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes. They'll help
14 you, okay? They're a great group. So just work
15 with them and they'll help you, okay?

16 MR. OWENS: All right. Thank you.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir. Good
18 luck to you.

19 So we have Agenda Item No. 35, they
20 withdrew.

21 So, we'll move on to Agenda Item No. 36,
22 Gordon Phillips.

23 Sir, since there's been people walking in
24 going forward, I'm going to ask, have you been sworn
25 in?

1 MR. PHILLIPS: Yes.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

3 Investigator Dumas, could you tell us why
4 we're here for Mr. Phillips?

5 MS. DUMAS: The applicant was denied due
6 to the two felony charges from 2018. He submitted a
7 written appeal, was not made provisional, and is
8 here to appeal today.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there
10 questions for Mr. Phillips?

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
12 Cortez.

13 Good morning, Mr. Phillips.

14 MR. PHILLIPS: Good morning.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: What's the status of
16 probation?

17 MR. PHILLIPS: All completed.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Positive
19 termination?

20 MR. PHILLIPS: (The witness moved his head
21 up and down.)

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Investigator Dumas,
23 do we have any status --

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Wait.

25 THE REPORTER: He nodded.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, you have to speak
2 up because she's taking it down.

3 MR. PHILLIPS: All complete. Completed
4 probation.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Investigator Dumas,
6 do we have any confirmation on that?

7 MS. DUMAS: Confirmed by his fingerprint
8 results.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
11 for Mr. Phillips?

12 Hearing there's no further questions, I'll
13 entertain a motion.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
15 Cortez motioning to grant Mr. Phillips his appeal
16 and grant him the work card.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
18 motion. Do we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown.
20 I'll second.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
22 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

23 (All present Board members voted aye.)

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, the motion passes.
25 You will get your work card. The office

1 will contact you and tell you next steps, okay?

2 MR. PHILLIPS: Thank you, guys. Have a
3 good day.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: All right, thank you.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 37.

6 Can I ask where we're at on the schedule?

7 MR. JONES: Good morning.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Morning. I'm going to
9 ask, if there's anybody that's -- because there's
10 people walking in. If there's anybody that's walked
11 in, should we go ahead and do another --

12 DAG HARRIS: Yeah.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: If there's anybody
14 that's just recently walked in and you plan to
15 testify today, could you please stand and get sworn
16 in?

17 DAG HARRIS: That includes in the north as
18 well. Please stand and raise your right hand if you
19 just walked in.

20
21 AUDIENCE MEMBERS,
22 having been duly sworn,
23 testified as follows:

24

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, Mr. Jones.

1 Investigator Dumas, could you please tell
2 us why we're here for Mr. Jones?

3 MS. DUMAS: The applicant was denied due
4 to the possession of controlled substances charges.
5 Applicant only disclosed a couple of these charges
6 and was denied. He submitted a written appeal, was
7 not made provisional, and is here to appeal today.

8 The applicant's convicted persons
9 registration, NRS 179C, does not seem to match his
10 current address on the application. And it's not up
11 to date.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I'm sorry, he has to
13 register for something and he's not up to date?

14 INVESTIGATOR DUMAS: Correct.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
16 there any questions for Mr. Jones?

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
18 Cortez.

19 Mr. Jones, were you aware that your
20 address is not current?

21 MR. JONES: No, I'm aware. I got it right
22 here on my neck, 1930. Yes, 1930 Joyful Street,
23 Las Vegas 89115.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So I just -- you
25 may -- I don't know who you need to follow up with,

1 but you might need to follow up with the appropriate
2 individuals that apparently -- whatever registration
3 you need to adhere to, the addresses do not match.
4 So I just want to let you know on that.

5 My next question to you is, is there a
6 reason why -- or what was the reason why you failed
7 to disclose your entire criminal history?

8 MR. JONES: I did. I tried to explain
9 everything, you know, from far back, from '80- -- I
10 believe it was '85, '86. I did -- you know, I
11 did -- did prison time the first time on prison.
12 And all the way up until I got out, 2002. And I
13 ain't been in trouble. I got off parole in 2003. I
14 ain't been in trouble with the law. Just speeding
15 ticket for truck driving. That's about it.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood.

17 So unfortunately, the investigation
18 revealed that all of two arrests were made -- or
19 arrests were disclosed. The rest were not. And we
20 do have two pages' worth. So that's why I was
21 asking what all you disclosed.

22 No further questions. Thank you.

23 MR. JONES: Thank you.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
25 questions?

1 Hearing there are no further questions,
2 I'll entertain a motion.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
4 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial based on
5 failure to disclose a full history, criminal
6 history.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
8 motion. Do we have a second?

9 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown.
10 I'll second.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
12 have a second. All in favor say aye.

13 (All present Board members voted aye.)

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, same thing I told
15 the other folks. You have an opportunity --

16 MR. JONES: All right.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Have a
18 wonderful day.

19 MR. JONES: You're welcome. I'll go back
20 to California.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Have a great day.

22 Next agenda item is Agenda Item No. 38.

23 King Paul -- I can't --

24 MR. AITOFELE: Aitofele.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Aitofele, thank you.

1 MR. AITOFELE: Good morning, everyone.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good morning.

3 Okay. Investigator Dumas, could you
4 please tell us why we're here for Mr. Aitofele?

5 INVESTIGATOR DUMAS: The applicant
6 disclosed his felony arrests, along with his
7 conviction at the time that he applied. The
8 applicant is here to appeal.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
10 questions?

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
12 Cortez, Mr. Aitofele?

13 MR. AITOFELE: Aitofele.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Aitofele. What were
15 the circumstances behind the 2008 case, the robbery
16 involving the firearm?

17 MR. AITOFELE: So, it was a second degree
18 robbery back in 2008. In Anaheim, California. Just
19 robbed a couple guys on the street. Back in -- you
20 know, it was my stupid days. So, yeah, just trying
21 to -- you know, I got a family of my own now, and
22 trying to work righteously.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I appreciate the
24 honesty. Thank you.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any

1 further questions for Mr. Aitofele?

2 Hearing there are no further questions,
3 I'll entertain a motion.

4 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick. I move to
5 grant the work card based on full disclosure of
6 arrest history.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
8 motion. Do we have a second?

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
10 Cortez.

11 I'll second that motion.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
13 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

14 (All present Board members voted aye.)

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

16 You'll get your work card. These folks
17 will call you and tell you next steps, okay?

18 MR. AITOFELE: Thank you, guys.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations. Good
20 luck to you.

21 Agenda Item No. 39, Timothy Lee.

22 Looks like we don't have Timothy Lee, so
23 we'll trail that.

24 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Madam Chair? Mr. Lee
25 is up here in the north. I'm sorry, we didn't hear

1 you call his name.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, thank you.

3 Good morning, Mr. -- or good morning
4 still, Mr. Lee.

5 Investigator Cuevas, could you please tell
6 us why we're here for Mr. Lee.

7 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Investigator
8 Cuevas, for the record.

9 So the applicant was denied for his 1982
10 felony convictions. The applicant did disclose all
11 arrests and was not made provisional. He is here to
12 appeal today.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

14 Board, any questions for Mr. Lee?

15 Hearing there are no questions, I'll
16 entertain a motion.

17 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
18 Brown.

19 I move that we grant Mr. Lee's appeal so
20 he can get his work card.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
22 motion. Do we have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
25 have a second. All in favor say aye.

1 (All present Board members voted aye.)

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

3 Congratulations, sir, and good luck to you. The
4 office will contact you for next steps.

5 Agenda Item No. 40, Patrick Sweeney.

6 Good morning, Mr. Sweeney.

7 MR. SWEENEY: Good morning. I've been
8 sworn.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

10 Investigator Cuevas, could you please tell
11 us why we're here for Mr. Sweeney?

12 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes. The
13 applicant was denied for his disclosed 2003 felony
14 conviction. He was not made provisional, and was
15 aware of the denial and is here to appeal.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

17 Board, any questions for Mr. Sweeney?

18 Hearing there are no questions, I'll
19 entertain a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
21 Cortez motioning to grant Mr. Sweeney's appeal based
22 on full disclosure.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
24 we have a second?

25 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
2 have a second. All in favor say aye.

3 (All present Board members voted aye.)

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

5 Congratulations, sir. You'll get your
6 work card, and the office will help you and they'll
7 call you for next steps, okay?

8 MR. SWEENEY: Thank you, so much. I won't
9 let you down.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Appreciate you. Thank
11 you.

12 Agenda Item No. 41, Leon Billups.

13 Good morning, sir.

14 MR. BILLUPS: Good morning. Can I sit?

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes, please.

16 Have you been sworn in?

17 MR. BILLUPS: Yes.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Cuevas,
19 could you please tell us why we're here for
20 Mr. Billups?

21 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes. The
22 applicant was denied for failure to disclose. He
23 was made provisional and was on the roster for
24 Universal Protection Group. The fingerprint report
25 does not list a disposition or severity for the

1 charges.

2 I did contact Mr. Billups for court
3 documents, but he was not able to obtain them.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Are there any
5 questions for Mr. Billups?

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
7 Cortez.

8 Mr. Billups, do you happen to have court
9 documents today?

10 MR. BILLUPS: I have them on my phone.
11 But they're -- it was -- they sent me a text saying
12 that they couldn't find any documents on me since it
13 had been so long. And it would cost me a lot of
14 money for them to do further.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And it was an e-mail
16 that was sent to you?

17 MR. BILLUPS: Yes.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And did you happen
19 to forward that on over to the investigator?

20 MR. BILLUPS: No.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: No worries.

22 Second question: Is there a reason why
23 you failed to disclose the 1980 case?

24 MR. BILLUPS: Well, I had put so many
25 applications in for different other agencies that

1 asked for a background check. And I received my
2 government secret clearance, and I been working on
3 government installations and I work on Navy ships
4 and military sealift command, which is the Navy,
5 branch of the Navy ships. And I didn't think that
6 little stop, that -- it was necessary.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, I'm glad you
8 said the word stop. And the reason why, is that --
9 and I'm going to show you because I wasn't able to
10 show it before.

11 On the application, there is an actual
12 page, one page, fully dedicated, and it looks
13 exactly like that. And on that page it has bullet
14 points that you are to list all charges regardless
15 of how long the incident occurred, what state it
16 occurred in, what the disposition is, whether or not
17 you were placed in handcuffs, and whether or not you
18 were expunged, dismissed, denied, or even if it fell
19 under the California PC 1203.4 code. That's why I
20 was asking.

21 MR. BILLUPS: Yeah.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Perhaps you
23 overlooked that page.

24 MR. BILLUPS: Yes, I did overlook that
25 page.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And that's
2 understandable. Thank you.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
4 questions for Mr. Billups?

5 Hearing there are no further questions,
6 I'll entertain a motion.

7 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
8 Brown. I move that we uphold the denial based on
9 failure to disclose.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
11 motion. Do we have a second?

12 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
14 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

15 (All present Board members voted aye.)

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, you're not going
17 to get your work card today. And it's -- you know,
18 we want to put you to work, so it's unfortunate that
19 you didn't read through the application and stop and
20 list that -- that case. Even if you don't know the
21 exact dates or times, if you list that you have
22 something, you know, then we're able to work with
23 that, right? Because at least you tried.

24 Unfortunately, at this time we can't move
25 forward because of that. You can apply again in one

1 year, and you have the information now so you're
2 able to document that on your -- on your
3 application.

4 MR. BILLUPS: That information that they
5 sent me was -- it was no charges on it. It was
6 just -- they stopped me, and just a routine check
7 saying I looked like somebody they were looking for.
8 And that's why -- the whole thing derived from.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yeah. And
10 unfortunately, you know, you didn't get that
11 information to the Board or to the office? Did you
12 get that to them?

13 MR. BILLUPS: I sent some information in.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You didn't send your
15 e-mail in.

16 MR. BILLUPS: The e-mail I didn't send it
17 in. I got it on my phone here.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So you needed
19 to get it in before this hearing.

20 MR. BILLUPS: Okay.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay? So, again,
22 you're more than welcome to apply again in a year
23 and submit all of that information, as well as this
24 here, okay?

25 MR. BILLUPS: Okay.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Good luck to
2 you, sir.

3 Agenda Item No. 42, Daniel Sundell. Is
4 there a Mr. Sundell? We'll go ahead and trail that.

5 Agenda Item No. 43, Devohn Howard-Dublin.
6 Is there a Mr. Dublin? Okay, we'll trail.

7 Agenda Item No. 44, Quintin Brazier.
8 Okay, we'll trail.

9 Agenda Item No. 45, Edward Guy.

10 Good morning, sir.

11 MR. GUY: Good morning to you all.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Cuevas,
13 could you tell us why we're here for Mr. Brazier
14 (sic)?

15 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: For Edward
16 Guy?

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes, Mr. Guy. Sorry.

18 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: The applicant
19 was denied for failure to disclose several out of
20 state arrests going back from 1980 all the way until
21 2012. He was not made provisional and he wishes to
22 appeal today.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So that I'm clear, did
24 he list all of the arrests?

25 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: No. None of

1 them were listed.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: None. Okay, thank
3 you.

4 Sir, have you been sworn in?

5 MR. GUY: Yup.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
7 questions for Mr. Guy?

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
9 Cortez.

10 Mr. Guy, good after- -- good morning
11 still. Why did we fail to disclose your criminal
12 history?

13 MR. GUY: I came here in Nevada in May of
14 2021.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Hang on one second.
16 Can you guys hear? No. You have to push the
17 button, sir. There you go.

18 MR. GUY: I came here in 2021 from the
19 State of Minnesota. And I thought that you wanted
20 me to list to him criminal history that I had in
21 this state. I mean, I've lived in maybe six states
22 in the U.S. now. And I've never had a felony. I
23 never had a convicted misdemeanor. And so why would
24 I remember every time I got arrested and it was
25 dismissed? So I don't -- I don't remember all that.

1 All I know is, I've lived pretty much a
2 perfect life. I haven't had no felonies. I come
3 here. I got robbed by the police. I know we all
4 want to think is a perfect world. They robbed me,
5 they put a trespassing charge on me for absolutely
6 no reason.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir --

8 MR. GUY: Other than --

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, we're trying to
10 determine why you didn't list your arrests.

11 MR. GUY: I just explained that to you,
12 ma'am. I never been convicted of anything except
13 the DWI in another state. I was -- I was thinking
14 you wanted the history of your state, not every
15 state I've lived in.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So, sir --

17 MR. GUY: I have no --

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, thank you. Thank
19 you, okay?

20 If you had gone through the application
21 thoroughly, it states very clearly to stop and list
22 all convictions and/or arrests, all of them. It
23 doesn't say --

24 MR. GUY: Well, that would be
25 impossible --

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir --

2 MR. GUY: -- for me.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Well, then, that seems
4 like a personal problem to me, okay? Thank you.

5 Board, are there any further questions?

6 MR. GUY: I mean, that's why you deny me,
7 right? Because I didn't list --

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir -- sir, we're not
9 done yet.

10 MR. GUY: I just want to know why you are
11 denying me my card. Because I got arrested?

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I have not denied you
13 yet, nor has the Board. But stand by.

14 MR. GUY: I am.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
16 questions for Mr. Guy?

17 Hearing there are no further questions,
18 I'll entertain a motion.

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
20 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial based on
21 failure to disclose numerous convictions.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
23 motion. Do we have a second?

24 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Brown seconds.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a

1 motion, we have a second. All until favor say aye.

2 (All present Board members voted aye.)

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Now you've been
4 denied. Thank you. Have a great day.

5 MR. GUY: Okay, well...

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, we're done.
7 Thank you.

8 MR. GUY: Can I have the same -- you're
9 not going to tell me how I can get these records
10 like you told everyone else and come back next year.
11 That's --

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Well, you have
13 an opportunity in one year to come back and apply.
14 You have all of the information now. Feel free to
15 utilize the office to do so. But I would suggest
16 that you have a much better attitude to do that.

17 Thank you, sir. Have a wonderful day.

18 MR. GUY: All right, ma'am. My attitude
19 isn't bad. Everything I told you happened. I was
20 stopped and robbed by police, all my ID taken (sic)
21 and a trespass put on.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir. Have
23 a wonderful day.

24 MR. GUY: I don't have no felonies, I
25 haven't committed any crimes I've been convicted of.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir. Have
2 a wonderful day.

3 MR. GUY: All right. You, too. That
4 makes no sense. I'm not even a criminal. Have a
5 good day.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 46,
7 Charles Moshman.

8 MR. MOSHMAN: Moshman.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.
10 And just to be clear, you have been sworn
11 in?

12 MR. MOSHMAN: Yes.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, thank you.

14 Investigator Cuevas, could you please tell
15 us why we're here for Mr. Moshman?

16 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes. So, the
17 applicant was denied for his disclosed 1996 felony
18 conviction from New York. He disclosed all arrests,
19 was not made provisional, and is here to appeal.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any questions
21 for Mr. Moshman?

22 Hearing there are no questions, I'll
23 entertain a motion.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
25 motioning to approve Mr. Moshman's appeal for the

1 registration card.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
3 motion. Do we have a second?

4 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And just to be
6 clear, this is based off the fact that we actually
7 did disclose all arrests. Okay.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez,
9 motion based on full disclosure and well over time
10 and distance. It's a 1996 case.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Hearing no
12 further -- or we have a motion. All in favor,
13 please say aye.

14 (All present Board members voted aye.)

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

16 Sir, you will be granted your work card.
17 The office will contact you for next steps. Thank
18 you, very much.

19 Agenda Item No. 47, Raymond Hutson.

20 Good morning, sir.

21 MR. HUTSON: Good morning, ma'am.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Cuevas,
23 could you tell us why we're here for Mr. Hutson?

24 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes. So the
25 applicant was denied for his 2011 misdemeanor

1 manufacturer, possess, dangerous weapon. The
2 applicant unfortunately did not disclose the arrest
3 on his application. He was made provisional and was
4 on the roster for Staff Pro, Incorporated, and he
5 wishes to appeal today.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
7 there any questions for Mr. Hutson?

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
9 Cortez.

10 Mr. Hutson, why did you fail to disclose
11 the 2011 case?

12 MR. HUTSON: I just forgot to put it on
13 the paperwork. I was getting ready to write it, but
14 skipped that to finish the other one then go back on
15 it.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood. Thank
17 you for the honesty on that.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
19 questions?

20 Hearing there are no further questions,
21 I'll entertain a motion.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
23 Cortez motioning --

24 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: -- Brown. I move
25 that we uphold --

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Go ahead, Mr. Brown.

2 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: I move that we uphold
3 the denial for Raymond Hutson based on failure to
4 disclose.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
6 Cortez seconding that motion.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
8 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

9 (All present Board members voted aye.)

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Unfortunately, we're
11 not going to be able to approve your request.

12 But again, just like with everybody else,
13 you have an opportunity to apply again in one year.
14 You have your information. So good luck to you,
15 sir.

16 MR. HUTSON: Okay.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 48
18 Juan Carter. Oh, sorry. He -- that actually is
19 postponed.

20 Agenda Item No. 49, we have Frank
21 Paratore. Is he up north?

22 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: No, ma'am.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We'll go ahead and
24 trail that.

25 Agenda Item No. 50, Larry Glaze.

1 Good morning, sir.

2 MR. GLAZE: Good morning.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Just for
4 clarification, have you been sworn in, sir?

5 MR. GLAZE: Yes.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Thank you.

7 Investigator Cuevas, could you please tell
8 us why we're here for Mr. Paratore (sic)?

9 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes. So the
10 applicant was denied for his listed felony and
11 weapons convictions. He did disclose all arrests
12 and was not made provisional. The applicant was
13 previously denied in 2022 for failure to disclose.
14 And his denial was upheld at the March 2022 Board
15 meeting. He's here now reapplying with full
16 disclosure.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any questions
18 for Mr. Paratore? Glaze. Sorry.

19 Are there any further questions for
20 Mr. Glaze?

21 Hearing there are no questions, I'll
22 entertain a motion.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
24 Cortez.

25 Mr. Glaze, welcome back. Thank you for

1 doing exactly what we asked.

2 MR. GLAZE: Thank you. God bless you.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: With that said, I am
4 going to motion to grant Mr. Glaze's appeal based on
5 full disclosure.

6 MR. GLAZE: Thank you, so much.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
8 we have a second?

9 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
11 have a second. All in favor say aye.

12 (All present Board members voted aye.)

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

14 Congratulations, and thank you, so much,
15 for coming back.

16 MR. GLAZE: Thank you, so much. God bless
17 you.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The office will
19 contact you.

20 MR. GLAZE: Thank you, so much.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 51,
22 Talani?

23 MR. FUIMAONO: Fuimaono.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: One more time.

25 MR. FUIMAONO: Fuimaono.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I'm so sorry.

2 MR. FUIMAONO: It's fine.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Cuevas,
4 could you tell why we're here?

5 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes. So, the
6 applicant was denied for his disclosed felony and
7 weapons convictions. He was not made provisional
8 and is here to appeal.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
10 there any questions for Mr. Fuimaono?

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
12 Cortez. I do have a question.

13 Hi. How long have you been in Nevada?

14 MR. FUIMAONO: I've been in Nevada for
15 three or four months.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Three or four
17 months. And do we have a job lined up, potential?

18 MR. FUIMAONO: Potential, yes. A few
19 potentials, actually.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Like what?

21 MR. FUIMAONO: There's the man that just
22 left, Aitofele, he has his own security company.
23 And he was waiting for me to get my card and he was
24 going to hire me as well. And not only that, I've
25 been working for Express Temp Services. I've been

1 working there weekly, like, now.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Any intention of
3 applying for guard with firearm?

4 MR. FUIMAONO: No.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Because I
6 want you to consider, just keep in mind of your
7 background. That's why I'm asking.

8 MR. FUIMAONO: Yeah, I'm very aware of
9 that. I wasn't even considering that.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Perfect.

11 No further questions. Thank you.

12 MR. FUIMAONO: You're welcome.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
14 further questions? Any further questions?

15 Hearing there are no further questions,
16 we'll entertain a motion.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
18 motioning to approve Mr. Fuimaono.

19 MR. FUIMAONO: Yes, ma'am.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: In his appeal.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
22 we have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
25 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

1 (All present Board members voted aye.)

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

3 So, you will get your work card. But I do
4 have to caution you, and please talk to your friend.
5 Because he has his work card, or because you have
6 this work card, that doesn't allow you to have your
7 own business as a security company.

8 MR. FUIMAONO: All right, okay.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: They have to go
10 through a different process. So make sure that he's
11 not doing his own business and you're not joining
12 him. Because both of you all would be in trouble.

13 MR. FUIMAONO: I shouldn't even have
14 mentioned that.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Just talk to him,
16 though.

17 MR. FUIMAONO: Oh, it's good, though. So
18 I can inform him.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: There you go. So come
20 and see these guys in the office and they'll help
21 you through that process. Because it's -- we would
22 love to see you have your own company, right? But
23 make sure you do it the right way. This card does
24 not give you that access, okay?

25 MR. FUIMAONO: I appreciate it. You guys

1 have a great day.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You too.

3 Congratulations.

4 Agenda Item No. 52, Adnan Maswadeh.

5 Good morning, sir.

6 MR. MASWADEH: Good morning.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I just want to

8 clarify, you have been sworn in.

9 MR. MASWADEH: Yes, I've been sworn in.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

11 Investigate Cuevas, could you tell us why

12 we're here?

13 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes. So the
14 applicant was denied for his undisclosed 1996 weapon
15 conviction from California. He was made provisional
16 but was not added to a company roster.

17 When in contact with the applicant, he did
18 provide court documents to show the case was
19 dismissed under California Penal Code 1203.4 in June
20 of 2015.

21 While speaking with him, he did explain to
22 me that he was under the impression because it was
23 dismissed or -- for that PC in California he didn't
24 have to disclose it on our application.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are

1 there any questions for Mr. Maswadeh?

2 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
3 Brown.

4 Mr. Maswadeh, based on what the
5 investigator just said, it sounds like you missed
6 the page in our application that says stop.
7 Disclose every contact, every arrest, even if it was
8 reduced or dismissed by California PC 1203.4. Did
9 you miss that?

10 MR. MASWADEH: She told me we threw the
11 case from the file. So I assumed that there's no
12 case.

13 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Well,
14 unfortunately there is a case. So you're going to
15 have to disclose that if you apply again if you're
16 denied today.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
18 further questions?

19 Hearing there are no further questions,
20 I'll entertain a motion.

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
22 Brown.

23 I move that we uphold the denial for Adnan
24 Maswadeh's registration based on failure to
25 disclose.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
2 motion. Do we have a second?

3 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
5 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

6 (All present Board members voted aye.)

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

8 Sir, unfortunately, at this time we will
9 not be granting your work card. You do have an
10 opportunity to work with the office in one year to
11 reapply, and now you have your information and
12 understand our disclosure requirements. Thank you.
13 Good luck to you.

14 Agenda Item No. 53, Charles Watson.

15 Good morning, Mr. Watson. Have you been
16 sworn in?

17 MR. WATSON: Yes, ma'am.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Cuevas,
19 could you please tell us why we're here for
20 Mr. Watson?

21 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes. The
22 applicant was denied for his listed felony and
23 weapons convictions from 1970s and 1980. He was not
24 made provisional and is here to appeal.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, just to be clear,

1 everything was listed?

2 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes,
3 everything was listed and disclosed.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, thank you.
5 Board, are there any questions for
6 Mr. Watson?

7 Hearing there's no questions, I'll
8 entertain a motion.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
10 Cortez motioning to approve Mr. Watson's appeal.
11 And also want to note for the record, this is why it
12 makes it very difficult when we have to deny when
13 you don't list your criminal history. We have a
14 gentleman who's listed a criminal history from the
15 1970s.

16 With that said, I am going to motion to
17 approve the appeal.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
19 motion. Do we have a second?

20 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
22 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

23 (All present Board members voted aye.)

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Again, thank you, so
25 much, for listing all of your information. That

1 certainly helps us approve. We always want to see
2 people go back to work. Your request has been
3 granted. The office will contact you for next
4 steps, okay?

5 MR. WATSON: Thank you, very much.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Have a
7 great day.

8 Agenda Item No. 54, Franky Abell.
9 Mr. Abell? We'll trail that.

10 Agenda Item No. 55, Randall
11 Sanchez-Rouelo.

12 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: He's here in the
13 north, Madam Chair, making his way up.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, thank you.
15 Good morning, Mr. Rouelo.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Sanchez-Rouelo.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sanchez-Rouelo. Good
18 morning.

19 Investigator Cuevas, could you please tell
20 us why we're here for Mr. Sanchez-Rouelo?

21 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes. The
22 applicant was denied for his felony conviction from
23 2003. He did not disclose any of his arrests and
24 was not made provisional. The applicant wishes to
25 appeal.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
2 there any questions for Mr. Sanchez-Rouelo?

3 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Yeah, this is
4 Bezick.

5 Sir, why did you not list your arrests?

6 THE REPORTER: Is he speaking?

7 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: So, I have to -- I
8 did list it on my arrest. And, also, I did remember
9 actually asking for forgiveness about my actually
10 convictions. I added years. And I submitted on
11 that, those documents to the -- to Vegas. To
12 Adriana Cuevas.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So --

14 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: That's what I --

15 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: So, he did not
16 initially disclose on his application. After he was
17 denied and received the denial letter is when he
18 reached out to list all his arrests. But they were
19 not listed on his application.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, to be clear, so he
21 did an application, they ran his fingerprints, his
22 fingerprints came up, got the denial letter, and
23 then he sent in his information.

24 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Correct.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir -- any further

1 questions for the Board?

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
3 Cortez. Mr. Sanchez-Rouelo, why did you fail to
4 disclose prior to the denial letter?

5 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: I actually wrote a
6 letter to the PILB. And I sent it to Cuevas.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Before or after the
8 denial?

9 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: I don't remember --
10 after the -- after the denial. Then I sent it in.
11 Sorry.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That's okay. We're
13 clear that you sent the letter after the denial.
14 That was my question.

15 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: Yes.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

17 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: And I did list it.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
19 further questions?

20 Hearing there's no further questions, I'll
21 entertain a motion.

22 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick
23 making the denial based on failure to list the
24 arrest record.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a

1 motion. Do we have a second?

2 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
3 Brown.

4 I'll second.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion,
6 we have a second. All in favor say aye.

7 (All present Board members voted aye.)

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, the issue is,
9 just so you understand, is that you did disclose it,
10 but it's after your fingerprints were run and we
11 found it. So, when you initially submitted your
12 application, that's when you needed to note that you
13 had arrests. Does that make sense?

14 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: (The witness moved
15 his head up and down.)

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Because you did
17 not initially disclose or tell us all of your
18 arrests, that's when it became an issue that you
19 didn't give us all the information and you were
20 denied. Correct?

21 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: Okay.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, now you have the
23 information. And if you work with the office, you
24 can apply again in one year and they will help you
25 through the application process, okay?

1 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: So how would I do
2 that, if you don't mind me asking, though? Can you
3 explain to me how would I do that, though? How
4 would I be able to...

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You can --

6 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: Ask for --

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You can reapply in one
8 year. You would start all over again in one year.

9 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: Okay.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay?

11 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: All right.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.

13 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: Okay.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you.

15 MR. SANCHEZ-ROUELO: Thank you.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 56,
17 Anna Abreo.

18 Good morning, ma'am.

19 MS. ABREO: Morning.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Cuevas,
21 could you tell us why we're here for Ms. Abreo?

22 INVESTIGATOR CUEVAS MANZO: Yes. The
23 applicant was denied for failure to disclose her
24 arrest history and felony conviction. The applicant
25 was made provisional and was on the roster for

1 Universal Protection Service.

2 She did, after being denied, provide me
3 with court documents for all of the arrests that
4 were listed on the fingerprint report. And she's
5 here to appeal today.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
7 questions for Ms. Abreo?

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
9 Cortez.

10 Ms. Abreo, why did you fail to disclose
11 your criminal history until after the denial letter?

12 MS. ABREO: Well, out of due respect, you
13 know, I was taking a test. And I was -- I had to go
14 use the restroom. So when I went to go use it, I
15 was doing it in my car, in which I did explain it to
16 Mrs. Cuevas that I had thought I had done that.
17 Apparently I didn't do it.

18 So when I had gotten a call and an e-mail
19 from Allied, because I was working with them, they
20 told me that my job was to be terminated. I'm,
21 like, what happened?

22 So I had to give Mrs. Cuevas a call, in
23 which I did. When I contacted her, she filled me in
24 on the situation. And I told her, I thought I did
25 that. And she says, no, I didn't. So I asked her

1 the years in which I got all the contacts. I did
2 show her it, and I do have all the dismissals in
3 which I thought everything was expunged. So it's
4 all right here.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board --

6 MS. ABREO: And, you know, too, by me
7 working with other jobs with my fingerprints,
8 everything I went through, I did it for family
9 assistance. And I guess this one was totally
10 different. So I really love this job. And I
11 explained it to her, too. I love working with them.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
13 questions for Ms. Abreo?

14 Okay. Hearing there are no further
15 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: There is Board Member
17 Brown. I move that we uphold the denial for Anna
18 Abreo's registration for work card based on failure
19 to disclose.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
21 motion. Do we have a second?

22 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
24 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

25 (All present Board members voted aye.)

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

2 Unfortunately, at this time we will not be
3 able to grant you a work card. Same as everyone
4 else. You have the information now. Please make
5 sure when you come back, you have an opportunity in
6 one year to come back and reapply, put in all the
7 information and we'll be able to move forward.

8 MS. ABREO: So when will that one year be,
9 as of today?

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: One year from today,
11 yes, ma'am.

12 MS. ABREO: Okay, that's fine. Thank you.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, so much.
14 Good luck to you.

15 Agenda Item No. 57. Sharia Austin.
16 Ms. Austin? Anything up north? We'll trail that
17 item.

18 And it looks like Agenda Item No. 58,
19 James Pendleton, was postponed.

20 We have Agenda Item No. 59, Daveon
21 Patterson. Daveon Patterson? We'll go ahead and
22 trail that.

23 Then Agenda Item No. 60, Tamara Johnson
24 has been withdrew -- withdrawn.

25 What we're going to do right now is go

1 back to the items that we trailed at the beginning
2 of this page, and then we'll take a quick ten-minute
3 break and then continue on.

4 So I have Agenda Item Nos. 42, 43, 44,
5 maybe 46? 49, 54. Anything on the previous pages?

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: 57 and 59.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Nothing on the
8 previous pages?

9 Okay. So, Agenda Item No. 42, Daniel
10 Sundell. Okay.

11 Agenda Item No. 43, Devohn Howard-Dublin.

12 Agenda Item No. 44, Quintin Brazier.

13 Agenda Item No. 49, Frank Paratore.

14 Agenda Item No. 54, Franky Abell.

15 Agenda Item No. 57, Sharia Austin.

16 Agenda Item No. 59, Daveon Patterson.

17 Okay. Those agenda items that were
18 trailed earlier and that I just called out were
19 supposed to be here at 10:00 a.m. Since they are
20 not here in the audience I will entertain a motion.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
22 motioning to uphold the denial based on the no-call,
23 no-show of -- they were supposed to be here at 10:00
24 a.m. It is now 12:00 p.m. And that's for Agenda
25 Item Nos. 42, 43, 44, 49, 54, 57, and 59.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
2 we have a second?

3 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
5 have a second. All in favor say aye.

6 (All present Board members voted aye.)

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

8 And we will go now for a ten-minute break.
9 It's now a little after 12:00. Come back at
10 12:10-ish.

11 (Off record.)

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We will start with --
13 actually, I see some people came in, so if you
14 weren't here for the earlier sessions and sworn in,
15 could you please stand and we'll have Counsel Harris
16 swear you in.

17 Is there anyone up north?

18 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: We have two up north.

19 And you need to move over this way so
20 we -- so they can see you in the camera down there.

21

22 AUDIENCE MEMBERS,
23 having been duly sworn,
24 testified as follows:

25 ...

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, very much.
2 We're now at Agenda Item No. 61, Bryan
3 White.

4 Are you with us? Up north, no?

5 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Yes.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Is Mr. White up north?

7 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Mr. White is
8 (indiscernible) in the north. He is not here. Not
9 present.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, we're going to
11 trail.

12 Agenda Item No. 62, Antoinette Pettway.
13 Pettway.

14 Good afternoon.

15 MS. PETTWAY: Good afternoon.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, Investigator Diaz,
17 could you please tell us why we're here for
18 Ms. Pettway?

19 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: Investigate Diaz, for
20 the record.

21 The applicant was denied for a felony
22 assault with intent to cause great bodily harm, less
23 than murder conviction out of Oakland, Mississippi
24 in 2008. The applicant was sentenced to three years
25 prison.

1 The applicant also has a child abuse,
2 second degree felony conviction in May 1st of 2008
3 and was sentenced to one year in prison.

4 This arrest was disclosed. It is the same
5 case, just an additional charge. She did disclose
6 the arrest and submitted a written letter of appeal.
7 She was not made provisional, and is here to appeal
8 today.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: This is Ms. Pettway.

10 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: Correct, ma'am.

11 MS. PETTWAY: It's Michigan. He said
12 Mississippi.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, okay. All
14 right.

15 So let the record reflect it's supposed to
16 be Michigan, not Mississippi. Okay.

17 So, just to be clear, everything was
18 disclosed?

19 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: Yes, ma'am.

20 Everything was disclosed.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, thank you.

22 Board, are there any questions for Ms. --
23 is it Pettway?

24 MS. PETTWAY: Pettway.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Pettway.

1 Hearing there are no questions, I'll
2 entertain a motion.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
4 Cortez motioning to approve Ms. Pettway's appeal for
5 her registration card.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
7 we have a second?

8 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
9 Brown.

10 I'll second.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion,
12 we have a second for -- all in favor say aye.

13 (All present Board members voted aye.)

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations. Your
15 work card will be issued. The office will contact
16 you for next steps, okay?

17 MS. PETTWAY: Thank you.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

19 Agenda Item No. 63, Kiambi...

20 MR. AJANAKU: Kiambi.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Kiambi. Okay. What's
22 the last name?

23 MR. AJANAKU: Ajanaku.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Ajanaku. Good
25 afternoon, Mr. Ajanaku.

1 MR. AJANAKU: How you all doing?

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good.

3 Investigator Diaz, could you tell us why
4 we're here for Mr. Ajanaku?

5 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: The applicant was
6 denied for a felony buy, slash, possess, slash,
7 receive stolen property conviction out of Las Vegas,
8 Nevada in 2015. He was sentenced to 36 months'
9 probation.

10 The applicant also has a 2021 misdemeanor
11 conviction for a DUI, and was sentenced to 30 days
12 in jail. This arrest was disclosed.

13 The applicant also has a 2013 felony
14 conviction for attempted larceny from a person and
15 was sentenced to five years' probation. This arrest
16 was disclosed.

17 The applicant did disclose all arrests and
18 submitted a written letter of appeal. He was not
19 made provisional, and is here to appeal today.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

21 Board, are there any questions for
22 Mr. Ajanaku?

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
24 Cortez.

25 Good afternoon, Mr. Ajanaku. How are you?

1 MR. AJANAKU: I'm good. How you doing?

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm wonderful,
3 thanks.

4 Talk to me about that DUI in 2021. What
5 was the substance?

6 MR. AJANAKU: It was alcohol. But, I do
7 promote in the city. And, like, I was kind of
8 tired. But then I kind of fell asleep behind the
9 wheel. So it was kind of like my mistake. And I
10 knew I was drinking, so I didn't really want to kind
11 of go through the process of, like, trying to play
12 it cool, so I just kind of -- just took the charge,
13 because I knew. And then it gave me a sign that I
14 need to kind of slow down on, like, what I was
15 doing. And just, you know, get out of the way.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm gathering my
17 thoughts. Give me a second.

18 MR. AJANAKU: Yes, ma'am.

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you say you are
20 into promotions?

21 MR. AJANAKU: Yeah. So I've been doing,
22 like --

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay, hang on, hang
24 on.

25 MR. AJANAKU: Okay.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, did you finish
2 work and then you started drinking, or you were
3 drinking on the job, carried over, fell asleep?

4 MR. AJANAKU: Well, so, pretty much the
5 way it works, like -- it's, like, local lounge
6 promoter. So I promoted a few type of lounge
7 (indiscernible).

8 THE REPORTER: A few what lounges?

9 MR. AJANAKU: Ma'am?

10 THE REPORTER: A few what lounges?

11 MR. AJANAKU: Like, local lounges. Like,
12 places that's really popular with the -- within the
13 community.

14 And I am -- I am, like, a personality in a
15 party. And sometimes I could get a little, you
16 know, carried away. And I kind of played myself
17 that night and I shouldn't have. Like I said, I
18 didn't want to kind of go through the motion of kind
19 of trying to play the system. Because I knew I
20 just -- I need to just -- I had to slow down with
21 that. So it just kind of gave me a sign to just,
22 you know, do things differently.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So I do have -- I
24 need clarification.

25 You indicated that you fell asleep behind

1 the wheel. So were you asleep or how did you get
2 pulled over?

3 MR. AJANAKU: Oh, I had shut my eyes at
4 the light and -- it was kind of like a deep five,
5 ten minutes. Deep two minutes maybe. And before
6 you know it, the officer -- because he was sitting
7 next to me. He say he seen me when I did it. And
8 so he beated on the window, and I felt like
9 everything just kind of went away then.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Sobered up at that
11 moment?

12 MR. AJANAKU: Yeah, yeah. I was, like --
13 you know, I didn't try to do it. But...

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

15 MR. AJANAKU: Yes, ma'am.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
17 for the Board?

18 Okay. Hearing there are no further
19 questions, I'll entertain a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
21 Brown. I move that we grant the appeal for Kiambi
22 Ajanaku so that he may get his work card based on
23 full disclosure.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
25 motion. Do we have a second?

1 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
3 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

4 (All present Board members voted aye.)

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, very much,
6 for --

7 MR. AJANAKU: Thank you all.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: -- your full
9 disclosure, okay?

10 MR. AJANAKU: Thank you all.

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Madam Chair, if --
12 I'd like to say one more thing.

13 I just want to caution you. Be very
14 careful with what we just gave you, okay? You have
15 the ability to go do security work.

16 MR. AJANAKU: Yes, ma'am.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: However, I am
18 concerned that while you were doing a specific job
19 you partook in that job. And from what it sounds
20 like, you partook a little too much from that job.

21 MR. AJANAKU: No, but I'm not going to
22 be --

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Hang on one second.
24 Hang on one second.

25 Don't place yourself in a situation where

1 you're going to lose your livelihood.

2 MR. AJANAKU: Yes, ma'am.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Am I making myself
4 pretty clear?

5 MR. AJANAKU: Very.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: All right. Good
7 luck with that.

8 MR. AJANAKU: Thank you. You all have a
9 good one.

10 I just wait for them to call?

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: They'll give you a
12 call and let you know next steps, okay? Thank you.
13 Have a good day.

14 Agenda Item No. 64, Mario Brown.

15 MR. BROWN: Yes.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good afternoon,
17 Mr. Brown.

18 MR. BROWN: Good afternoon.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator Diaz,
20 could you tell us why we're here for Mr. Brown?

21 INVESTIGATOR DIAZ: The applicant was
22 denied for a felony attempted murder, slash, intent
23 to kill, slash, injure conviction out of Chicago,
24 Illinois in 1998. The applicant was sentenced to
25 ten years in prison.

1 This arrest was disclosed, and the
2 applicant disclosed it as an aggravated battery with
3 a weapon.

4 The applicant also has a 1994 felony
5 conviction for unlawful use of a weapon by a felon,
6 and was sentenced to two years in prison. This
7 arrest was disclosed.

8 The applicant also has a 1993 felony
9 conviction for possession of a controlled substance,
10 slash, unlawful use of a weapon. He was sentenced
11 to four years probation and rehabilitative boot
12 camp.

13 He did disclose all arrests and was aware
14 he would be denied and submitted a written letter of
15 appeal at the time of applying. He was not made
16 provisional, and is here to appeal today.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
18 questions for Mr. Brown?

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
20 Cortez.

21 Mr. Brown, how long have you been in
22 Nevada?

23 MR. BROWN: Five months.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: What are your plans
25 if you were to get granted a card?

1 MR. BROWN: Well, I currently have two
2 jobs. I just started applying for all different
3 kind of jobs, and I saw with a lot of hotels and
4 other places you could also do security. So I was
5 going to try to use that as a part-time job, also.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

7 MR. BROWN: All of my convictions, over 20
8 years ago.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
10 further questions?

11 If there are no further questions, I'll
12 entertain a motion.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
14 Cortez motioning to approve Mr. Brown's appeal and
15 granting him the work card based on full disclosure
16 of his criminal history.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
18 motion. Do we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion,
21 we have a second. All in favor say aye.

22 (All present Board members voted aye.)

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

24 Thank you for being transparent and
25 putting everything down there. Good luck to you.

1 And if you -- the Board will contact -- or the
2 office will contact you for next steps, okay?

3 MR. BROWN: Thank you.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations.

5 Agenda Item No. 65, they've withdrawn.

6 Agenda Item No. 66, Stefon Morgan.

7 We'll trail that.

8 Agenda Item No. 67, Rahsann Payne.

9 MR. PAYNE: Right here.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Rahsann. Okay. Good
11 afternoon.

12 MR. PAYNE: Good afternoon.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Have you been sworn
14 in, sir?

15 MR. PAYNE: Yeah, I stood up.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yeah, no problem.

17 There's just folks walking in; I want to make sure.
18 Okay.

19 Investigator Blackmore, could you please
20 tell us why we're here for Mr. Payne?

21 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes. Mr. Payne
22 was denied for his disclosed felony convictions.
23 Applicant was not made provisional or added to a
24 roster. The fingerprint results came back. He did
25 have some other arrests that were not disclosed.

1 And the applicant wishes to appeal.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
3 there any questions for Mr. Payne?

4 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
5 Brown.

6 Mr. Payne, why did you fail to disclose
7 some of your arrests?

8 MR. PAYNE: To be honest with you, sir --
9 sorry. To be honest with you, sir, I didn't know
10 about some of the other stuff, to be honest with
11 you. I mean, the ones that I went to prison for is
12 the ones that I put down. Just getting arrested and
13 bonded out, I didn't put them down. But a lot of
14 the stuff that I put down were the ones I went to
15 prison for.

16 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. There is one
17 listed here for 2007 that says that you did five
18 years in prison for that it says that you didn't
19 disclose it. Child abuse with intent to cause harm.

20 MR. PAYNE: I did put -- I put 2006 on the
21 paper, that it was child abuse. On the paper when I
22 did my application.

23 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: I see a different
24 conviction in 2006 for fourth degree sexual assault.

25 MR. PAYNE: That was -- is the same case.

1 It was the same case. It wasn't no different.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
3 Blackmore, was this -- what do they call it,
4 stacked?

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: It wasn't.
6 Concurrent.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Concurrent?
8 While she's looking that up, Board, are
9 there any further questions?

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
11 Cortez. Mr. Morgan (sic), the 2007 robbery case.
12 This we do not have that you disclosed. Is there a
13 reason for that one?

14 MR. PAYNE: I don't know anything about a
15 2007 robbery case.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You're not on --

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm sorry, wrong
18 case. That's why you don't know anything about it.
19 My apologies.

20 MR. PAYNE: That's all right. The 2006
21 fourth degree sexual assault. So, basically, it
22 was -- it was basically -- it was -- it was --

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, you're good.
24 Hang on one second. Let us just make sure.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You disclosed that

1 one, that case. The case that was in question was
2 the 2007, the child abuse intentionally causing harm
3 case. And that was five years in prison. That was
4 not disclosed.

5 MR. PAYNE: That was -- that was -- that
6 was the same case as the 2006. And I was just going
7 to explain that.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, the 2006 and the
9 2007, so they're a year apart. Okay, just so FYI on
10 that, if you're saying that they're the same.

11 MR. PAYNE: Yes.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: The 2006 case
13 occurred July of '06, okay? And then July of 2007
14 is the child abuse case. So there's two cases.

15 This is Board Member Cortez. Investigator
16 Blackmore, is there a typo in No. 2? So we have
17 disclosed, no. But then there's a note that
18 indicates the applicant disclosed the arrest.

19 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Let me go ahead
20 and double check that one.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Hang on one second.
22 Let us look through the paperwork.

23 MR. PAYNE: No problem.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Because I'm showing on
25 mine on the notes that everything was -- everything

1 has been disclosed.

2 MR. PAYNE: I disclosed everything when I
3 went and applied.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Hang on.

5 MR. PAYNE: I was denied --

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Hang on one second.
7 I'm showing everything's disclosed.

8 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: That might have
9 been a mistake on my end.

10 So the 2006 incident, that one was
11 disclosed. But the 2007 was not disclosed.

12 MR. PAYNE: If I may have an opportunity
13 to explain this typo, what's going on.

14 So, in 2006, it was my cousin's birthday.
15 Some friends, we went to a bar, whatever the case
16 may be. And we had a little after party.

17 The fourth degree sexual assault, she was
18 in a bar. Come to find out she was 17 years old.
19 She got in trouble with her mom because she was --
20 she snuck out of the house, whatever the case may
21 have been.

22 But I don't know what this child abuse is.
23 And I believe that -- 2007 case, this has got to be
24 connected with the 2006. It has nothing -- I don't
25 know about no 2007. Everything was in 2006.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
2 Cortez.

3 Do you recall doing any time in prison for
4 a child abuse case?

5 MR. PAYNE: No. Everything was connected.
6 So, because they couldn't -- I guess in Wisconsin,
7 they wanted to make the case a severity. They
8 couldn't afford to read sexual assault as a
9 misdemeanor. So, because the child, or she was 17
10 years old, considered a child, I don't really know.

11 So, what the state's attorney did was, he
12 asked the judge if he can make this case to be a
13 felony. So it couldn't be, like -- I couldn't go
14 and have it -- after a few years, have it
15 disclosed -- or I'm sorry, have it expunged or
16 whatever, once the case was over with.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And Investigator
18 Blackmore, do we have any court documents,
19 disposition, indicating that the 2006 and the
20 2007 -- it sounds like there was some possible
21 negotiations going on. Where cases were -- or
22 charges were being negotiated.

23 My concern is, that there's a year of
24 difference. There's --

25 MR. PAYNE: I mean, I would have dis- --

1 if I disclosed -- I would have disclosed everything.
2 Had I known -- I didn't know nothing about no 2007
3 child abuse. I know they didn't set in on my --

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Hang on one second.

5 I guess why I'm a little confused, because
6 you had to go to court for all of this. You got
7 sentenced to prison. So, in your court papers, it
8 should have stated --

9 MR. PAYNE: Actually --

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Hang on one second.

11 So, when you got sentenced to the
12 five-year prison, or even in the conviction for the
13 2006 case, there's your charge for the 2006 case.
14 But somewhere along the line within a year you
15 picked up another charge.

16 Let me ask you a question. In 2006, did
17 you go to prison that year for the sexual assault
18 case?

19 MR. PAYNE: No.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Then this is
21 where I'm thinking. So while you're waiting --

22 MR. PAYNE: I didn't go to prison at all
23 for this case -- for this charge. I never went to
24 prison for it.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Forget that charge.

1 What about the child abuse charge? Did you go to
2 prison for that?

3 MR. PAYNE: I didn't go to prison for
4 that, neither. It's part of the 2006 charge. I
5 didn't go to separate trials. I went to one trial.
6 Like I said, the state's --

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Right. Hang on.
8 Did you go to prison?

9 MR. PAYNE: No. I got a five-year stay
10 sentence. I did two years -- I did two years
11 probation for the State of Wisconsin. I did not go
12 to prison for that. It was a five-year sentence
13 stayed. I didn't go to prison. It was probation.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: There it is. That's
15 what I needed to hear.

16 Do we have court papers verifying all of
17 that?

18 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: So, looks like
19 this was filed in 2006. It was originally the
20 fourth degree assault, and then looks like later
21 that year they added the child abuse charge to that
22 case.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: It was that case
24 that sent him to prison, I believe. Is that right?
25 It sounds like what it is -- because it's a higher

1 charge. So that's the one that got you --

2 MR. PAYNE: I didn't --

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That got you --

4 MR. PAYNE: I got probation --

5 THE REPORTER: Excuse me. Please stop
6 interrupting.

7 MR. PAYNE: Just trying to correct.

8 That's all. I wasn't trying to interrupt nobody.
9 I'm sorry.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Hang on.

11 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Correct. So, on
12 the 2006, it does say that he was sentenced to two
13 years prison, and then he did probation for three
14 years after that.

15 In regard to the 2007 incident, he was
16 intook (sic) the day before that charge showed up on
17 his -- the fingerprint report.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm sorry, he did
19 what?

20 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: He was -- so the
21 date on the fingerprint report shows that he was
22 intaked (sic) by the prison on 7-15-2007.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. So that's
24 what occurred. There was negotiations going on, and
25 then this case is what got you the prison term, but

1 you did out of custody.

2 MR. PAYNE: Correct.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That was per the
4 negotiations, is basically what I'm understanding.
5 Okay, understood. I can see why he would not
6 disclose that.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, can you say that
8 for the record?

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
10 Cortez, for the record.

11 Based on the disclosure, yes, disclosed;
12 no, not disclosed. Understanding everything about
13 the cases of the 2006 and 2007, it makes sense why
14 it would be an error, if there was an error on the
15 actual disclosure. There is confusion. Obviously
16 we had to discuss it. So I'm not sure I'm okay
17 holding that against Mr. Payne. Because he
18 understood it as one case.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
20 other questions?

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
22 Brown.

23 Madam Chair, point of order, there's a
24 second page attached to Mr. Payne's records where
25 there are 14 arrests in various degrees from unknown

1 to misdemeanor to felony, including three sex
2 offenders charges, failing to register in two
3 different states, that were not disclosed. 14 other
4 charges not disclosed.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

6 MR. PAYNE: To say something to that
7 degree, sir. I'm not a sex offender. I was never
8 ordered to go into the sex offender registry or be
9 subject to going to the sheriff's office and
10 notifying where I stay at.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Are you registered
12 here?

13 MR. PAYNE: No. I don't -- I was -- I
14 don't -- I was never charged as a sex offender. I
15 mean, I work for a security company as we speak
16 right now. So, with that security --

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
18 Cortez.

19 Follow-up question. Why did you fail to
20 disclose any of the rest dating from 1997 all the
21 way through 2009?

22 MR. PAYNE: As I said earlier, I put all
23 the arrests that sent me to prison. That was --
24 most of the time was, like, a teenager. In '97 I
25 was in my teenage years. It was a lot of stuff

1 going on. It was stuff I didn't remember. But the
2 ones that I did disclose were the ones that I went
3 to prison for. The ones that -- immediate -- would
4 be a denial of anything for me. So I -- you know,
5 like I said, I had few arrests for little minute
6 stuff, you know. But the ones that sent me to
7 prison was the ones that was more important to me to
8 disclose to the -- to the PILB commission.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

10 Board, are there any further questions?

11 Hearing there are no further questions,
12 I'll entertain a motion.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
14 Cortez. I'm going to motion to uphold the denial
15 for Mr. Payne's registration card based off of
16 failure to disclose a number of criminal history
17 convictions.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
19 motion. Do with have a second?

20 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
22 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

23 (All present Board members voted aye.)

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Motion passes.

25 Unfortunately, sir, at this time we won't be able to

1 do your guard card. But you have an opportunity to
2 come back in one year. You have all the
3 information. So please make sure that you note all
4 of it on your application.

5 MR. PAYNE: Sure thing.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

7 MR. PAYNE: Thank you.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you.

9 Agenda Item No. 68, Hill, Tommy Hill.

10 MR. HILL: Hello.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good afternoon, sir.

12 Just to clarify, you were sworn in?

13 MR. PAYNE: Yes.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, thank you.

15 Investigator Blackmore, why are we here
16 for Mr. Hill?

17 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: So, Mr. Hill was
18 denied for a failure to disclose his arrest history,
19 which is -- includes some weapons and felony
20 convictions. Applicant was made provisional. He
21 was added on to Contemporary Services Corporation's
22 roster. Applicant does wish to appeal. There is an
23 Excel attached for additional arrests.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
25 there any questions for Mr. Hill?

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
2 Cortez.

3 Mr. Hill, why did you fail to disclose
4 your criminal history?

5 MR. HILL: Am I on?

6 Oh, I wasn't trying to disclose it. It
7 was an honest mistake. I put some on there. But I
8 thought -- because in California, you go back seven
9 years. So I thought that it goes for Nevada. I've
10 been here since October. So --

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did someone help you
12 write the -- or do the application?

13 MR. HILL: No.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you go slow on
15 the application?

16 MR. HILL: Well, I did it at the Raiders
17 stadium. And it was, you know --

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you see that
19 page?

20 MR. HILL: I seen that page.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So it's on page 5 of
22 the actual packet. And that page says to list all
23 charges, regardless of how long the incident,
24 whether it occurred -- regardless whether it
25 occurred in another state, another county. Even if

1 it was in California PC 1203.4. Okay. Thank you.

2 MR. HILL: For the record, I also work for
3 Excalibur. I've been there since I got here. So,
4 you know, with me, getting through and then seeing
5 me go through orientation, me graduating and
6 everything, I thought I was okay.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: It's a different
8 license. So, unfortunately, theirs isn't as strict
9 as ours is.

10 MR. HILL: I got you.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
12 further questions for Mr. Hill?

13 Hearing there are no further questions,
14 I'll entertain a motion.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
16 motioning to uphold the denial based on failure to
17 disclose criminal history.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
19 we have a second?

20 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown,
21 second.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
23 have a second. All in favor say aye.

24 (All present Board members voted aye.)

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

1 Unfortunately, at this time we won't be
2 able to give you your work card. However, you have
3 an opportunity to return in one year.

4 MR. HILL: All right. Thank you.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck
6 to you.

7 Agenda Item No. 69, Abraham Wright. Is
8 Mr. Wright here?

9 Good morning, sir.

10 MR. WRIGHT: Good afternoon.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yeah, good afternoon.
12 Thank you.

13 Investigator Blackmore, could you tell us
14 why we're here for Mr. Wright?

15 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes. So
16 Mr. Wright was denied for -- for his
17 (indiscernible).

18 THE REPORTER: For his -- I'm sorry, for
19 his what?

20 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: His 2010 felony
21 and 2006 weapons conviction. He disclosed most of
22 his arrests except for one. He was not made
23 provisional or added to the roster. The applicant
24 does wish to appeal.

25 There is one case I do want to make a note

1 of for 2022 theft. Right now, that case is still
2 currently active and the applicant is paying
3 restitution towards that case.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
5 questions for Mr. Wright?

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
7 Cortez.

8 Mr. Wright, what was the amount of
9 restitution?

10 MR. WRIGHT: I believe 2500.

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: 2500?

12 MR. WRIGHT: Yeah.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Are you on a payment
14 plan?

15 MR. WRIGHT: I pay 50 to 100 every court
16 date.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And you're current
18 on your payments?

19 MR. WRIGHT: Yes, ma'am.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: What's your next
21 court date?

22 MR. WRIGHT: July 6.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Of this year?

24 MR. WRIGHT: Yes.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: When do you expect

1 to be done with those payments?

2 MR. WRIGHT: I set a goal for, like,
3 October, November.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Of this year?

5 MR. WRIGHT: I'm working -- I do temp, I
6 do two part-times. So I'm trying to -- it's at 1400
7 right now. So it's -- it's close. I'm trying right
8 now.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Very good.
10 Thank you.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Quick question. Which
12 one was not disclosed, Investigator Blackmore?

13 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: The rest that was
14 not disclosed was a 2006 misdemeanor from the State
15 of California for grant theft. And it says on the
16 report that he did 24 months' probation and 69 days
17 in jail.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Got you.

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
20 Cortez.

21 Mr. Wright, did you forget to list that
22 one?

23 MR. WRIGHT: Well, I was listing the rest
24 of it, I was going from the top all the way down. I
25 believe I ran out of spots. I believe on the

1 line -- I'm not sure. But, yes, I did forget -- I
2 did know about that -- I think that was a Culver
3 City one, but I believe I forgot that one, on the
4 line.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
7 further questions for Mr. Wright?

8 Hearing there are no further questions,
9 I'll entertain a motion.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
11 Cortez.

12 I'm going to motion to uphold the denial.
13 Reason being is that we have an active case, owing
14 outstanding restitution, and that's time and
15 distance. It's a 2022 case. And also for failure
16 to disclose complete criminal history. And there
17 was a case missing out of 2006.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
19 we have a second?

20 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
22 have a second. All in favor say aye.

23 (All present Board members voted aye.)

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So the motion passes.
25 You won't get your work card, but again,

1 you have an opportunity to come back in one year.
2 You have all of this -- or they have all this
3 information so they'll be able to help support you
4 when you come back to fill out your application. We
5 really look forward to seeing all of you guys that
6 we deny return. So, thank you.

7 MR. WRIGHT: Thank you.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Mr. Wright, bring
10 your receipt that the restitution is paid in full.
11 Make sure you get one from court.

12 MR. WRIGHT: Okay.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: If you planned on
14 returning to apply again in a year.

15 MR. WRIGHT: Okay. Even though it's
16 closed?

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: If you can get
18 anything from the court saying that the case is
19 completely closed, zero restitution owed, please
20 bring that and provide that to the investigator,
21 should you choose to apply again in a year.

22 MR. WRIGHT: Thank you.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck.

24 Agenda Item No. 70, John Harrison. Is
25 Mr. Harrison up north?

1 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Mr. Harrison is up
2 north.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

4 Investigator Blackmore, could you let us
5 know why we're here for Mr. Harrison?

6 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: So, Mr. Harrison
7 was denied for failing to disclose his arrest
8 history. He was made provisional and added on to
9 ESI Security Services roster. Applicant does wish
10 to appeal.

11 I do want to note that the 2017, the
12 trespass which was brought down to misdemeanor,
13 originally started out as a felony, burglary of
14 occupied dwelling unarmed.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
16 questions for Mr. Harrison?

17 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
18 Brown.

19 Mr. Harrison, why did you fail to disclose
20 your arrest?

21 MR. HARRISON: I want to apologize for not
22 putting my criminal history on my application. The
23 reason being is because I have done similar
24 applications, such as my California guard card. And
25 my cc on the application, I have gotten approved.

1 And each application, doing my PILB application, I
2 recently moved to this state. I didn't know much
3 about the state or the application. I should have
4 called someone to expound more, if I should have
5 stated my juvenile records and my trespass.

6 I'm currently working for the U.S.
7 Department of Labor at Sierra Nevada Job Corps. I
8 am a safety officer and a recreational advisor. The
9 reason why I applied for my PILB card is so I can
10 grow more in security.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.

12 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you,
13 Mr. Harrison. I appreciate your explanation.

14 There is, on our application, if you are
15 denied today when you go through it there's a page
16 that has a red stop sign on it. And it tells you,
17 list every arrest whether it's been dismissed,
18 whether you've been told you don't have to list it,
19 whether it's juvenile, whether it was in California
20 or not. List every single arrest.

21 MR. HARRISON: Yes, sir.

22 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: I really appreciate
23 your explanation. Thank you for that.

24 MR. HARRISON: Thank you.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any

1 further questions for Mr. Harrison?

2 Hearing there are no further questions,
3 I'll entertain a motion.

4 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
5 Brown.

6 I move that we uphold the denial of
7 Mr. Harrison's registration for work card based on
8 failure to disclose.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
10 motion. Do we have a second?

11 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
13 have a second. All in favor say aye.

14 (All present Board members voted aye.)

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Mr. Harrison, you do
16 have an opportunity to come back to us in a year.
17 You will have your application. And please feel
18 free to go down to the office and get support in
19 filling out that application. They are here and
20 very welcoming to helping you fill that out
21 properly. I really encourage you to continue your
22 path with the Job Corps and including that program,
23 and come in to see us again in one year. Thank you.
24 Have a good day.

25 MR. HARRISON: You, too.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 71,
2 Dion Lowery.

3 Good afternoon, sir.

4 MR. LOWERY: Good afternoon.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Can I ask, have you
6 been sworn in?

7 MR. LOWERY: Yes.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay, thank you.

9 Investigator Blackmore, why are we here
10 for Mr. Lowery?

11 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes. Mr. Lowery
12 was denied for his disclosed arrest history, which
13 includes multiple weapons convictions. The report
14 has been updated. We did receive his fingerprinting
15 results back and everything does match up.

16 He was not made provisional and not added
17 to a roster, and he wishes to appeal at this time.

18 I just also want to make a note that he
19 was previously denied at the June 2022 Board
20 meeting, and that denial was upheld.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
22 there any questions for Mr. Lowery?

23 Sir, I really want to commend you for
24 coming back and filling out the application
25 properly. We really do appreciate that.

1 If there's no further questions for the
2 Board, I'll entertain a motion.

3 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

4 I move to grant the work card based on
5 full disclosure of arrest history.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, we have a motion.
7 Do we have a second?

8 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown,
9 I'll second.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
11 have a second. All in favor say aye.

12 (All present Board members voted aye.)

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations, sir.
14 You'll get your work card. The office will work to
15 get you your next steps, okay?

16 MR. LOWERY: Thank you.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, again, for
18 coming back. Thank you. Have a good day.

19 MR. LOWERY: Thank you.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 72,
21 James Taron (sic).

22 MR. JAMES: Hello.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good afternoon, sir.

24 MR. JAMES: Good afternoon.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator

1 Blackmore, could you tell us why we're here for
2 Mr. Taron?

3 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes. Mr. James
4 was denied for his 2008 weapons conviction and
5 failure to disclose. Applicant was not made
6 provisional or added to a roster.

7 This is his second time applying. He was
8 initially denied in 2016. The report has been
9 updated since then. There was an April 17th arrest
10 of this year for a failure to appear warrant, which
11 started as a citation. That led to an arrest where
12 he pled guilty to statement to obstruct a public
13 officer.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
15 questions for Mr. Taron?

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
17 Cortez.

18 Mr. James, did you -- this -- round two of
19 you applying again?

20 MR. JAMES: Yes.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: When you got denied
22 the last time, did you contact the PILB Board and
23 ask them about your criminal history?

24 MR. JAMES: Yes, I was in (indiscernible).

25 THE REPORTER: You were in? Sir, you were

1 in? What did you say?

2 MR. JAMES: Oh, yes. I was contacting
3 them and e-mailing to them, but I never did get
4 anything back until, like, maybe 2018, 2016. And
5 then I just took it upon myself to go apply again.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. And the
7 reason why I'm asking you this is because generally
8 speaking, when somebody comes back and reapplies,
9 they already have a list of the criminal history
10 that they got denied for the first time.

11 MR. JAMES: And I didn't even know the
12 criminal history you had got denied.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: No, no, no. It's
14 not that you got denied because of the -- you got
15 denied because you failed to disclose the criminal
16 history. So now, seeing you again, I'm a little
17 disappointed that once again, you failed to disclose
18 all of your criminal history, already having it.

19 MR. JAMES: Well, the first time -- the
20 first time I had some juvenile stuff, and I didn't
21 even know that that was to even come up. Because I
22 took previous jobs I had background -- extensive
23 background checks and that never came up. So when
24 they e-mailed me and told me that that came up,
25 like, wow, okay. 2010 or wherever it came from.

1 But the second time, she was just
2 mentioning about the April stuff. I don't even
3 know -- it was so new to me that I didn't even
4 realize that I had to mention it, either.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Can I ask you a quick
7 question, Investigator Blackmore?

8 I don't see that on the actual
9 application.

10 MR. JAMES: Because I didn't get convicted
11 or anything --

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, hang on, hang on.
13 Is that because it's so new it wasn't on
14 here?

15 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: It's because the
16 background report was done, finished, and -- sorry.
17 It was finished in May, and then, of course, before
18 we come to the Board meeting we always review and
19 see if anything new does change and then we update
20 you as needed.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got you.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Investigator
23 Blackmore, that failure to -- that failure to appear
24 was for which charge?

25 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: So, it was a

1 citation that was issued back out in 2023 that went
2 into a warrant status and then it was picked up as
3 an arrest April 18th and he pled nolo to it.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Do we know what the
5 citation was originally? For the 2023.

6 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: They're saying
7 false statement to obstruct public officer.

8 MR. JAMES: I can explain on that if you
9 guys would like.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Actually, I would
11 like to know, what was your law enforcement contact
12 in 2023.

13 MR. JAMES: Right now I'm living in
14 transient housing with her because I have custody of
15 her. And I was trying to let her mom come see her.
16 And her mom brought some stuff that wasn't supposed
17 to be around the area. And I was trying to help the
18 mom out.

19 And the officer was trying to be, you
20 know, a mean person that day. So he just said --
21 we're all standing at -- at that moment that was a
22 crime scene. And I just took a step over to talk to
23 the supervisor that -- what was going on. He just
24 grabbed me up. Gave me a ticket and everything.
25 And that was it.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay, thank you.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: What's your plans with
3 this license? Have you -- do you have job
4 opportunities lined up?

5 MR. JAMES: Right now I don't have job
6 opportunities lined up. I don't have job
7 opportunities lined up because this is the job that
8 I really want, focusing on my career. I'm a
9 professional boxer right now, and this is the job
10 that I need to continue that.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
12 for the Board?

13 So just to be clear. This is Mr. James'
14 second application with us. And in the second
15 application, the arrests that he has were not
16 disclosed.

17 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: So, he was
18 initially denied in 2016 for his weapons conviction.
19 He did list that one down on this application. But
20 there was a -- three other arrests that weren't
21 disclosed.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And then this
23 most recent interaction with law enforcement.

24 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Correct.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Again, if

1 there's no further questions, I'll entertain a
2 motion.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
4 Cortez.

5 Motioning to uphold the denial based on
6 failure to disclose the criminal history and recent
7 law enforcement contact, 2023 case.

8 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Correct. Started
9 in July of 2020.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

11 MR. JAMES: Can I speak?

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: No, hang on.

13 So, we have a motion. Do we have a
14 second?

15 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown,
16 second.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
18 have a second. All in favor say aye.

19 (All present Board members voted aye.)

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, unfortunately we
21 have to deny your work card. And I'll tell you, it
22 does -- I see that you're trying, you know, and I
23 see you have a beautiful daughter and we would love
24 to put you to work. So, you know, please reapply in
25 one year. Go to the office, though, and sit down --

1 MR. JAMES: 2025?

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I'm sorry?

3 MR. JAMES: Did you say one year, 2025?

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yes, sir.

5 So go to the office, sit down with them,
6 and work to get all of this information in and
7 accurate, okay? Because they will help you. And we
8 want to put you to work. Once you put that in,
9 you'll come back before the Board again. You saw we
10 granted some other people, because they came back,
11 we were able to grant their work cards, okay?

12 So please come back, please continue on
13 the path that you're on, because it seems like
14 you're trying to do the right thing. But at this
15 time, because of so many nondisclosures, we're not
16 able to issue that card right now, okay?

17 MR. JAMES: Thank you.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We look forward
19 to seeing you. Good luck to you, sir.

20 Agenda Item No. 73, Marvin Wallace. Is
21 there a Mr. Wallace? We'll trail 73.

22 Agenda Item No. 74, Michael Armstrong.

23 Agenda Item No. 75, Nicole Collier.

24 Investigator Blackmore, can you tell us
25 why we're here for Ms. Collier?

1 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes. Ms. Collier
2 was denied for her disclosed felony conviction.
3 Applicant was not made provisional or added to a
4 roster. Upon receiving the federal background check
5 report back, there were a few additional arrests
6 that were not initially disclosed. And the
7 applicant wishes to appeal.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
9 there any questions for Ms. Collier?

10 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
11 Brown.

12 Ms. Collier, why did you fail to disclose
13 some of your arrests?

14 MS. COLLIER: To be honest, I really
15 thought that I did. But if I didn't, I'm sorry.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
17 further questions?

18 Hearing there's no further questions, I'll
19 entertain a motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.
21 Uphold the denial based on failure to
22 fully disclose arrest history.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
24 motion. Do we have a second?

25 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown

1 will second.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
3 have a second. All in favor say aye.

4 (All present Board members voted aye.)

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

6 Unfortunately, ma'am, we will not be able
7 to issue the work card. But it's all here now, as
8 long as you don't have any other interactions with
9 law you should be fine.

10 As far as going to the PILB, they'll help
11 you with your application. They'll help support the
12 information that you need, okay?

13 MS. COLLIER: Okay, thank you.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck
15 to you.

16 I think at this point, if you don't mind,
17 it's 1:00. I'm going to take a quick ten-minute
18 break and we'll be back at 1:10. Thank you.

19 (Off record.)

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Since we're starting
21 fresh after a break, just in case anybody walked in
22 while we were on break, Counsel Harris, would you
23 mind swearing anybody in?

24 So if you weren't here in the earlier
25 sessions this morning or this afternoon, we're going

1 to have you stand and get sworn in.

2

AUDIENCE MEMBERS,

4

having been duly sworn,

5

testified as follows:

6

7

MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, very much.

8

Do we want to start our trail items or do

9

we want to finish out this page? We'll go ahead and

10

finish out the page.

11

We're on Agenda Item No. 76, Joseph

12

McNally. Good morning -- or afternoon.

13

Investigator Blackmore, could you tell us

14

why we're here for Mr. McNally?

15

Please have a seat, sir

16

INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes. So

17

Mr. McNally was denied due to failure to disclose

18

his arrest history. Applicant was never made

19

provisional or added to a roster. He does wish to

20

appeal. I did include a Excel sheet for some

21

additional arrests as well.

22

MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any

23

questions for Mr. McNally?

24

BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member

25

Cortez.

1 Mr. McNally, why did you fail to disclose
2 any arrest history?

3 MR. McNALLY: I don't understand. Can my
4 brother come up here and talk for me?

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I would -- this is
6 Board Member Cortez.

7 I would prefer to hear from you. My
8 question was, you have to list your criminal history
9 on your application.

10 MR. McNALLY: Oh, yeah, I did all that. I
11 got all that right here.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You have that with
13 you?

14 MR. McNALLY: Yeah.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do you recall
16 listing it on your application?

17 MR. McNALLY: No. I didn't understand all
18 of it. I have a learning disability.

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. So, you said
20 you had a brother who's here to help you?

21 MR. McNALLY: Yes, ma'am.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. So, the
23 next -- if you have to apply again, I want you to
24 ask your brother to help you out with all of that,
25 okay?

1 MR. McNALLY: Okay.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: If your brother's
3 unavailable, there's a PILB office that will be more
4 than willing to help you fill out your application.
5 Because my original question was, how come you
6 failed to give us a list of the criminal history?

7 MR. McNALLY: Oh, I didn't -- I didn't
8 know I had to do all that.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood. Okay,
10 thank you.

11 MR. McNALLY: Okay.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
13 questions?

14 Hearing there are no further questions,
15 I'll entertain a motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
17 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial for
18 Mr. McNally's registration card, based on the
19 failure to disclose the criminal history.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
21 we have a second?

22 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown.
23 I'll second.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion,
25 we have a second. All in favor say aye.

1 (All present Board members voted aye.)

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, unfortunately,
3 because you did not note all of your arrests we will
4 not be able to give you your work card, okay? But
5 you can come back in one year and reapply.

6 Please, you have your paperwork. The
7 office will also help you fill out your application,
8 okay? And then it sounds like you have a really
9 great brother back there that's willing to help you
10 as well, okay?

11 MR. McNALLY: Yeah.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We do want to see you
13 again, so please come back and fill out your
14 application, reapply, okay?

15 MR. McNALLY: Yeah.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir.
17 Agenda Item No. 77, Miiko Farris.
18 Good afternoon.

19 MS. FARRIS: Good afternoon.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
21 Blackmore, could you tell us why we're here for
22 Ms. Farris?

23 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes. Ms. Farris
24 was denied for her 2001 felony conviction. She did
25 disclose that and another arrest on her initial

1 application. There was one arrest that wasn't
2 disclosed, which was just a failure to appear
3 warrant.

4 The applicant never -- we never gave her a
5 provisional or added her to a roster. She did
6 provide court documents regarding the 2001 felony.
7 It was dismissed under 1203.4 in California. She
8 does wish to appeal.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any questions
10 for Ms. Farris?

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
12 Cortez.

13 Ms. Farris, what's the status of your
14 warrant? Do you even know your status?

15 MS. FARRIS: No. I didn't even know I had
16 a warrant. I'm sorry.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, there's a
18 failure to appear warrant out of California.

19 MS. FARRIS: Right now?

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I don't know the
21 current status. But based off the disclosure of
22 your criminal history, that actually came up on the
23 fingerprints. The investigator will have more
24 information.

25 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: So, in regards to

1 the warrant, it's saying it's from 2006 out of San
2 Bernardino, California. I tried searching San
3 Bernardino, California and nothing did pop up for
4 that.

5 MS. FARRIS: I didn't know anything about
6 that.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: The warrant was
8 based off which charge?

9 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: It was just a
10 (indiscernible), failure to appear pay fine. Looks
11 like it was civil.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Oh, so it's a civil
13 case.

14 Do you recall any kind of case, ongoing
15 case, with -- so it's not going to a criminal court,
16 so it's a civil case. Do you recall anything that
17 occurred with --

18 MS. FARRIS: No.

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: -- a friend a
20 neighbor?

21 MS. FARRIS: No. I don't. That's why I
22 didn't -- I didn't know anything about that.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I mean, hey, if we
24 can't find it.

25 MS. FARRIS: Okay.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: It is civil?

2 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Per the
3 fingerprints, yes.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Are there any
5 further questions from the Board?

6 Hearing there are no further questions,
7 I'll entertain a motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
9 Cortez motioning to -- to grant the appeal. Based
10 off disclosure of criminal history.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion.
12 Do we have a second?

13 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
15 have a second. All in favor say aye.

16 (All present Board members voted aye.)

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, we will be able to
18 grant you your work card. Because the thing that
19 the -- the warrant or whatever that is for a civil
20 case. But I would look into that, see if you can
21 find it just so it's not on your record.

22 MS. FARRIS: Yeah, okay.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So the office will get
24 in touch with you for next steps, okay?

25 MS. FARRIS: Okay. So I have to wait

1 before I start doing security?

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yeah. You have to get
3 your card. They'll contact you, okay?

4 MS. FARRIS: Okay, thank you.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, good luck.
6 Agenda Item No. 78, Damian McKinney.

7 Good afternoon, sir.

8 MR. McKINNEY: Good afternoon.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You've been sworn in?
10 I think I've seen you here for a while.

11 MR. McKINNEY: Yes, I have.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
13 Blackmore, why are we here for Mr. McKinney?

14 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes.

15 Mr. McKinney denied for his felony conviction and
16 failure to disclose.

17 Applicant was provisional and added to
18 Special Operations Associates of Nevada and Avalon
19 Security's roster. The applicant does wish to
20 appeal.

21 I do want to make a note that he was
22 previously denied in 2018, but he never moved
23 forward with the appeal process.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
25 questions for Mr. McKinney?

1 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
2 Brown.

3 Mr. McKinney, because you didn't appeal
4 your previous attempt to get a work card you were --
5 were you ever told that you needed to disclose these
6 the next time you appeared in front of us?

7 MR. MCKINNEY: Basically, what happened
8 was, in 2018 I was denied. And there was some
9 issues that came up. And I was in touch with the
10 investigator, where I had to get some information
11 from different courts. Like, one paper I got was
12 from federal court. I had a felony conviction that
13 was set aside.

14 And then there was some other things. I
15 had an attorney in California working with, but then
16 I ended up leaving Nevada for a couple of years.
17 And I recently came back to Nevada within maybe the
18 last couple years and I just tried to reapply.

19 The second time I reapplied, and I'm just
20 going to be honest with you, I knew that I had
21 something over my head, but I knew that it wasn't
22 going to show. I knew that I would have 90 days to
23 work. And I needed a job real bad. So, I worked my
24 90 days, and I knew that it was eventually going to
25 be denied.

1 I also wanted to mention that, man, I did
2 not know that the Board was this compassionate as it
3 is. If I would have known that people that disclose
4 their felony records would still get a second
5 chance, something would have never done.

6 I just felt that after that 90 days I
7 could never work security again. That was it, you
8 know, for Nevada. And, you know, hopefully I have
9 an opportunity to do it a year from now.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. I appreciate
11 that honesty.

12 Board, are there any further questions?

13 Hearing there are no further questions,
14 I'll entertain a motion.

15 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
16 Brown.

17 I move that we uphold the denial of
18 Mr. McKinney's registration for work card based on
19 failure to disclose.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
21 motion. Do we have a second?

22 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
24 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

25 (All present Board members voted aye.)

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, as you know, your
2 card is going to be denied. But, again, you
3 heard -- you sat here for some time. We do want to
4 put people to work. That is really our goal. So
5 please reapply and disclose all of the information
6 and you'll have another opportunity to come and see
7 us.

8 MR. MCKINNEY: I sure will. See you next
9 year.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck
11 to you.

12 MR. MCKINNEY: Thank you.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 79,
14 Veronica Eddings.

15 Good afternoon, ma'am.

16 MS. EDDINGS: Good afternoon.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
18 Blackmore, why are we here for Ms. Eddings?

19 MS. EDDINGS: Eddings.

20 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Ms. Eddings was
21 denied for failure to disclose her arrest history.
22 She was made provisional but not added to a roster.

23 I do want to make a note that she did
24 provide court documents after she had been denied.
25 Some of the charges were actually dismissed and

1 there was only one that resulted in an actual
2 conviction.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
4 there any questions for Ms. Eddings?

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
6 Cortez.

7 Ms. Eddings, why did you fail to disclose
8 your criminal history?

9 MS. EDDINGS: Well, I filled out the
10 application up in the office. I did put it on -- I
11 took the papers apart to correct it, and I turned it
12 all in to (indiscernible).

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay.

14 MS. EDDINGS: I was in a hurry. It was
15 lunchtime.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood, thank
17 you.

18 MS. EDDINGS: I understand.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
20 questions?

21 Hearing there are no further questions,
22 I'll entertain a motion.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
24 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial based on
25 failure to disclose criminal history.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
2 motion. Do we have a second?

3 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
5 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

6 (All present Board members voted aye.)

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we will not be able
8 to approve, but please come see us in one year. And
9 you have all the information there, so you'll be
10 able to -- and they will help support you filling
11 that out.

12 MS. EDDINGS: Thank you.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck
14 to you.

15 So Agenda Item No. 80, it's Rebecca
16 Bongiovanni. I may have messed that up.

17 No one up north? We'll trail Agenda Item
18 No. 80.

19 Agenda Item No. 81, Marcell Steward.

20 Good afternoon, sir.

21 MR. STEWARD: Good afternoon.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Just to confirm,
23 you've been sworn in?

24 MR. STEWARD: Yes.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

1 Investigator Blackmore, could you please
2 tell us why we're here for Mr. Steward?

3 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes. Mr. Steward
4 was denied for his disclosed 1995 felony conviction.
5 He was not made provisional or added to a roster.

6 I do want to make a note that it did say
7 he did 18 years in prison. I did have a
8 conversation with Mr. Steward regarding obtaining
9 some parole documentation. He could not provide it
10 to me in time, but he did give me an estimate of
11 2016 is when he got off parole. He does wish to
12 appeal.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So he disclosed
14 and then brought back paperwork, okay.

15 Board, any questions for Mr. Steward?

16 Hearing there are no questions, I'll
17 entertain a motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
19 Cortez motioning to grant Mr. Steward's appeal.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
21 we have a second?

22 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
24 have a second. All in favor say aye.

25 (All present Board members voted aye.)

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, your motion has
2 been approved. You will get your work card. The
3 team will work to -- work with you on next steps,
4 okay?

5 MR. STEWARD: Okay.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, sir. Good
7 luck. Congratulations.

8 Agenda Item No. 82, Rena Joyner.

9 Good afternoon.

10 MS. JOYNER: Good afternoon.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: And you were sworn in,
12 ma'am? Have you been sworn in?

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you take an
14 oath?

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Did you stand up?

16 MS. JOYNER: No.

17

18 AUDIENCE MEMBER,
19 having been duly sworn,
20 testified as follows:

21

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Investigator
23 Blackmore, could you please tell us why we're here
24 for Ms. Joyner?

25 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes. Ms. Joyner

1 was denied for her disclosed felony convictions.
2 Upon receiving the federal background check report
3 back, there is three other arrests that were not
4 disclosed. She was not made provisional or added to
5 a roster. She does wish to appeal.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any questions
7 for Ms. Joyner?

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
9 Cortez.

10 Ms. Joyner, the history that the
11 investigator was talking about are convictions or
12 charges from 2008, 2006, and 1994. My question is:
13 The 1994 case, you did 24 months of probation. Do
14 you recall that time?

15 MS. JOYNER: Okay. Start over?

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Do you -- so,
17 on our report you failed to disclose all of your
18 criminal history. Three of them that you had not
19 disclosed.

20 And they were the 1994, taking the vehicle
21 without the owner consent and you were sentenced to
22 24 months of probation. Do you recall that?

23 MS. JOYNER: No. I never took a vehicle
24 without owner's consent.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you do any

1 probation time?

2 MS. JOYNER: I did probation multiple
3 times.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: But -- so in 1994,
5 what was the probation for, do you recall?

6 MS. JOYNER: Only been on probation for
7 child endangerment and possession of sales.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: The possession
9 charge, that was the 2008; is that pretty much the
10 time frame?

11 MS. JOYNER: Possession of sales was
12 2000- -- yeah, probably 2010. Yeah, 2010.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Investigator
14 Blackmore, I've got the -- I'm looking at the 2008
15 charges, the transporting and the possession.

16 On the No. 3, the no disposition, were
17 these two charges going together? Were they the
18 same case?

19 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yeah, same case.

20 So, originally, started out as a
21 transport, sale of narcotics, controlled substance.
22 And then there was two additional charges, which was
23 the possession or purchase of cocaine, that was
24 dismissed. And then she was convicted of the
25 transport, sale narcotic, controlled substance.

1 States three years' probation and 365 days jail.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. And the 2006
3 case, I note that there's no disposition, but there
4 was no disclosure.

5 I'm going to assume that the 2008 cases,
6 the reason why she failed to disclose No. 3 was
7 because it went along with No. 1, is what I'm going
8 to assume. I have not gotten that from her yet.

9 And I'm sorry, I know I mentioned two
10 different dates.

11 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: They're -- so
12 there's two cases in 2008. So the one that she was
13 convicted of that did the three years' probation,
14 that was in May of 2008. And then there was another
15 arrest in September of that same year for the same
16 charge.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So there are two
18 different. Okay.

19 MS. JOYNER: What charges was them?

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You have a couple
21 here. You did disclose -- or you let us know about
22 two of them. One of them was in 2008, you disclosed
23 your felony possession of controlled substance for
24 sale. So you did tell us about that one.

25 And then you did tell us about the child

1 endangerment one in 2003. So you did -- you did put
2 that on your application.

3 What you failed to put on your application
4 was 2008 in September you had transport, sale
5 narcotics, controlled substance. And it looks like
6 there was -- you were arrested -- well, it looks
7 like you were convicted of it. But it says no
8 disposition.

9 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Correct. So
10 there is no disposition for that September of 2008
11 one.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: If you're convicted,
13 isn't there a disposition?

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: What I -- this is
15 Board Member Cortez.

16 What I have a feeling that occurred is
17 that -- so she got -- there was a charge in May of
18 2008. So she's already been convicted. And then
19 that second charge in September of the same year
20 came in, and there's probably no disposition because
21 it was probably negotiated into the current -- or
22 into the disposition that was already created in
23 May.

24 There should have been a follow-up, either
25 a violation or additional days in jail. But it

1 doesn't appear to -- that that occurred.

2 Either way, there was law enforcement
3 contact made September of 2008 that you failed to
4 disclose. In addition to the other two law
5 enforcement contact. Whether you were in jail,
6 whether you -- it resulted in convictions, whatnot,
7 irrelevant. It's not relevant. You failed to
8 disclose those two, and that's what the argument is
9 about today.

10 MS. JOYNER: Okay. Well, technically, I
11 felt, like, the -- the felonies. Because, like, if
12 you look at my record, I'm constantly -- I was
13 constantly in jail, you know. But, you know, I was
14 young.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You weren't
16 constantly in jail. You got yourself into some
17 situations that you failed to disclose.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
19 further questions for Ms. Joyner?

20 Hearing there are no further questions,
21 I'll entertain a motion.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
23 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial based on full
24 disclosure of all the criminal history.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a

1 motion. Do we have a second?

2 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
4 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

5 (All present Board members voted aye.)

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, because you did
7 not tell us all of the information, all of the
8 different arrests, we're not going to be able to get
9 you your work card today. You do have an
10 opportunity to apply again in one year. We do have
11 the information now, so you can work with the office
12 to make sure that you get that information from
13 them, okay?

14 MS. JOYNER: How do you go about working
15 with them so I can get the information? Like, what
16 do I do exactly?

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Just go into the
18 office. Probably preferable, make an appointment.

19 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Director
20 Saladino, for the record.

21 With your arrest history, all you have to
22 do is come into the office, go to the window, tell
23 them you're reapplying, tell them you were denied at
24 this Board meeting and you do need some help with
25 your arrest history.

1 What the investigator will do is, they're
2 going to cut out the history that we gave to the
3 Board and we're going to present that to you. That
4 way, you can fill that out on the application.
5 You'll have all of it that the Board saw. And any
6 updates that need to be made and we'll get you
7 squared away.

8 MS. JOYNER: Thank you.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: We'll see you next
10 year.

11 MS. JOYNER: Thank you. Have a good day.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Have a good day.

13 Okay. So we're at the end of that page.
14 We're going to go back to the trailed items.

15 Right now I'm showing we trailed Agenda
16 Item No. 61, 66, 73, 74, 80. Does that sound
17 correct?

18 So, this portion of the agenda, they were
19 supposed to be here at noon?

20 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: 11:00 and
21 12:00, correct.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So they were supposed
23 to be here, some at 11:00, some at 12:00. I'm going
24 to call out the names. If you're here now, please
25 let us know.

1 Agenda Item No. 61, Bryan White.
2 Agenda Item No. 66, Stefon Morgan.
3 Agenda Item No. 73, Marvin Wallace.
4 Agenda Item No. 74, Michael Armstrong.
5 Agenda Item No. 80, Rebecca Bongiovanni.

6 Beautiful name.

7 None in the audience? So, since it is
8 past their time and they are not in the audience
9 currently, I will entertain a motion.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
11 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial based on
12 no-call, no-show for Agenda Items No. 61, 66, 73,
13 74, 80. It is now 1:30 p.m. They were told to be
14 here prior to 1:00 p.m.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I have a motion. Do
16 we have a second?

17 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown
18 will second.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So I have a
20 motion, I have a second. All in favor say aye.

21 (All present Board members voted aye.)

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Now, Agenda Item
24 No. 83, Loia Leapai.

25 Did we pronounce your name right? Dual

1 effort here.

2 MR. LEAPAI: Yeah.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You've been sworn in,
4 sir?

5 MR. LEAPAI: Yeah.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: All right.

7 Investigator Blackmore, could you tell us
8 why we're here for Mr. Leapai?

9 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes.

10 So, the applicant was denied for his
11 disclosed felony conviction. The applicant was not
12 made provisional or added to a roster. He did apply
13 back in 2023 and was denied then, but he did not go
14 through the appeal process at that time. He wishes
15 to appeal.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
17 questions for Mr. Leapai?

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
19 Cortez just confirming that you are positively
20 terminated from probation?

21 MR. LEAPAI: Yeah.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: No probation.

23 MR. LEAPAI: I did probation.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: But you are
25 positively terminated. You are not currently on

1 supervision.

2 MR. LEAPAI: No.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Perfect. Thank you.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
5 questions?

6 Seeing there are no further questions,
7 I'll entertain a motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
9 motioning to approval Mr. Leapai's appeal for the
10 registration card.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
12 motion. Do we have a second?

13 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
15 have a second. All in favor say aye.

16 (All present Board members voted aye.)

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations. You
18 will get your work card. The office will contact
19 you for next steps, okay?

20 MR. LEAPAI: Thank you, so much.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck
22 to you.

23 Agenda Item No. 84, Gregory Coliten.

24 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: He's here, Ma'am.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator

1 Blackmore, could you tell us why we're here for
2 Mr. -- is it Coliten?

3 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: I believe so.

4 Yes. So the applicant was denied for his
5 2014 weapon conviction and failure to disclose. The
6 applicant was made provisional but not added to a
7 company roster.

8 I just kind of want to go over the charges
9 for the 2014 arrest. First charge was impersonating
10 a public officer. Second charge was drawing a
11 deadly weapon in a threatening matter. On the first
12 charge he received 18 months probation, six months
13 jail. And the second charge, he did receive one day
14 in jail, and then I do actually have a copy of the
15 police report as well.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
17 there any questions?

18 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Mr. Coliten, why did
19 you not disclose your arrest record?

20 MR. COLITEN: At the time, it was my
21 intent to disclose -- not disclose anything. At the
22 time, there was a lot going on in my life. I was
23 going through a divorce, my father was passing away.
24 Many other things at the time. So it's simply
25 something I had forgotten about.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
3 Cortez. I want a clarification of what you
4 indicated. Did you say that you had no intentions
5 to put your criminal history?

6 MR. COLITEN: I did not have -- I did not
7 have any intentions to hide my -- my history.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood. Thank
9 you.

10 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
11 Brown, for the record.

12 Mr. Coliten, can you explain the 2014
13 charge, impersonating a public officer and drawing a
14 deadly weapon in a threatening matter?

15 MR. COLITEN: Yes, sir. At that
16 particular job I was working commercial property
17 maintenance. I was also doing -- getting into bail
18 enforcement as well.

19 I had done a firearms qualification
20 earlier that day, so I had my sidearm on me at the
21 time. And I had to go to a property to have some
22 cars removed from the property for illegal sales and
23 towing on the property.

24 A fight had broken out on the property. I
25 went to intervene because that particular area

1 already had a bad enough reputation. If it gets any
2 worse, how long am I going to have a job kind of a
3 thing.

4 In the process, somebody saw that I had a
5 sidearm on me and things went from one end to the
6 other.

7 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Did you identify
8 yourself as an officer?

9 MR. COLITEN: No, sir, I did not. The
10 problem was that the attorney that I hired did
11 literally nothing for me, so I had no choice but to
12 plead guilty.

13 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Thank you.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: And you said during
15 that time you were -- why did you have a weapon on
16 you? You were coming out of a class or something
17 like that?

18 MR. COLITEN: I was -- I was doing a
19 firearms training at the time. So I had just
20 come -- come from a shooting range. So I had a work
21 shirt on me at the time, so I just threw that on and
22 went immediately to work.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

24 MR. COLITEN: If I may add, since that
25 whole time has transpired, I have made a lot of

1 leaps and bounds in my life. I'm now a CCW
2 instructor up here in Washoe County. Also, a range
3 safety --

4 THE REPORTER: Sir. Sir. Stop.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, you have to slow
6 down.

7 THE REPORTER: You said also range
8 something.

9 MR. COLITEN: Range safety officer. I
10 brought certificates with me if the Board wanted to
11 see them to validate whether or not that was true
12 and correct.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
14 Blackmore, what does the police say about the 2014
15 event?

16 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes. So I
17 basically did a summary of it as well.

18 The event took place on September 14th in
19 Reno, Nevada. The applicant was in a Dollar Tree
20 when an altercation between two females ensued
21 outside the store. The applicant intervened in the
22 altercation by identifying as a police officer and
23 drawing his firearm. He gave them verbal commands
24 to get on the ground.

25 When asked for police identification by

1 several witnesses he refused to provide it. The
2 only identification that he provided to one of the
3 witnesses was his military ID.

4 Upon further investigation by the law
5 enforcement on the scene, that the witnesses all had
6 corroborating statements regarding the interaction
7 that took place.

8 Per the report, two of the witness
9 statements did state that one of the females was
10 held at gunpoint.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
12 further questions?

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
14 Cortez.

15 Mr. Coliten, I'm going to reask that
16 question. Did you -- at any time, did you present
17 yourself or label yourself as any kind of law
18 enforcement officer?

19 MR. COLITEN: No, ma'am.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So the statements of
21 the witnesses are all incorrect?

22 MR. COLITEN: Correct. Yes, ma'am.

23 BOARD MEMBER COLITEN: Your weapon was
24 never drawn towards anyone.

25 MR. COLITEN: No, ma'am.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood. Thank
2 you.

3 MR. COLITEN: No, ma'am.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Any further
5 questions from the Board?

6 Hearing no further questions, I'll
7 entertain a motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board --

9 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
10 Brown.

11 I appreciate the steps you've taken in
12 your life, and I understand it was a difficult point
13 for you at the time. You've gone through some
14 difficult challenges that caused you to forget to
15 add these.

16 But unfortunately, based on the failure to
17 disclose, I'm going to move that we uphold the
18 denial of your registration for work card.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
20 motion. Do we have a second?

21 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
23 have a second. All in favor say aye.

24 (All present Board members voted aye.)

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

1 Sir, as we instructed other applicants,
2 you do have an opportunity to try again in one year
3 to reapply. Please make sure that you note all of
4 the information, all of your arrests or contacts
5 with law enforcement on that application.

6 And if you would like to go into the
7 office up in northern Nevada, you are more than
8 welcome to, and they will help support your filling
9 out the application. Thank you, sir.

10 Agenda Item No. 85, Mark Tilmon.

11 Is there anybody up north?

12 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: No, ma'am.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we'll trail
14 85.

15 Agenda Item No. 86, was postponed.

16 Agenda Item No. 87, Robert Tapia. No one
17 up north; we'll trail.

18 Agenda Item No. 88, Alfred Pittman.

19 Good afternoon, sir.

20 MR. PITTMAN: Good afternoon.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
22 Blackmore, could you tell us why we're here for
23 Mr. Pittman?

24 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes. Mr. Pittman
25 was denied for his undisclosed 1995 weapons

1 conviction where he served 36 months probation for
2 that.

3 Additional, on the fingerprint results,
4 that was later dismissed under 1203.4.

5 He was made provisional, but never added
6 to a roster. He wishes to appeal.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any questions
8 for Mr. Pittman?

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Mr. Pittman, good
10 afternoon. This is Board Member Cortez.

11 Why did you fail to disclose the 1995
12 charge?

13 MR. PITTMAN: Mrs. Cortez, boy, you've
14 been on it today, you and Mr. Brown. You all got me
15 nervous.

16 Actually, I've been through this before
17 with Nevada. Very strict on what you -- background
18 checks. I was issued a CCW in 2005. I have
19 multiple CCWs.

20 So, when I was applying for this work
21 permit, I would never omit that. I assumed I did
22 that. When I have my permits to show I would never
23 do that, because any licenses, they also, even if
24 expunged or destroyed, you must list it. So I --
25 not a perfect man. I assumed I did that already. I

1 would not do that on purpose, which I hold licenses
2 for my -- you know. So I know the procedure. And I
3 have my own company in California, so I do know
4 that.

5 I was just applying for this work card so
6 if I come to Nevada or with clients or whatever, I'd
7 be in compliance with you guys if I do anything
8 here.

9 So that's all I can say.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
12 questions?

13 Hearing there are no further questions,
14 I'll entertain a motion.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
16 Cortez.

17 Unfortunately, it is a technicality that
18 we have to stay consistent with. I am going to
19 motion to uphold the denial based on failure to
20 disclose the 1995 charge.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
22 we have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
25 have a second. All in favor say aye.

1 (All present Board members voted aye.)

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So unfortunately, you
3 will not be able to get your work card. But you do
4 have an opportunity to apply in one year. Just list
5 this and -- you know.

6 I will just caution you, because you have
7 a company in California. If you do get a work card
8 here, that does not allow you to work without
9 someone sponsoring you

10 MR. PITTMAN: Here, yeah.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Perfect. As long as
12 you understand that.

13 MR. PITTMAN: Yes, I do.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, very much.
15 Good luck to you, and we hope to see you in a year.

16 MR. PITTMAN: Yeah, you'll see me. Have a
17 blessed one.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.
19 Agenda No. 89, Michael Docanto-Salas.
20 Hello.

21 MR. DOCANTO-SALAS: Hi.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
23 Swarthout, would you please tell us why we're here
24 for Mr. Ducanto-Salas?

25 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Investigator

1 Swarthout, for the record.

2 Mr. Salas was denied due to a felony
3 conviction. You guys might remember him. He
4 appeared before the December Board meeting. He was
5 asked to postpone at the time because he had an
6 ongoing case. That case has since closed. He did
7 disclose all of his arrest history and he's back
8 here to try and get the card.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
10 questions for Mr. Salas?

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
12 Cortez.

13 Good afternoon. Talk to me about the
14 July 2023 situation.

15 MR. DOCANTO-SALAS: July 2023. I was
16 going through a minute difficulty. I was
17 unmedicated. And I did note that in my last appeal
18 here. And I stayed on my medication. Made sure,
19 you know, no more hiccups or anything of that
20 nature.

21 But what had had happened was, I damaged a
22 gentleman's -- well, there were a couple instances
23 that I actually disclosed to you guys. There was
24 one that was damaging windows. That one show?

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'm specifically

1 speaking about the July 2023. I would hate for you
2 to self-incriminate yourself. However, I definitely
3 appreciate the honesty.

4 MR. DOCANTO-SALAS: I already --

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, the 2023 case,
6 injure, tamper with vehicle. The case was actually
7 dismissed. Talk to me about that one.

8 MR. DOCANTO-SALAS: I just -- I believe
9 that one was a --

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Is that the one that
11 you were telling me about where you injured -- or
12 you caused damage to a vehicle?

13 MR. DOCANTO-SALAS: Yeah. I want to
14 say -- because there were two relatively close to
15 each other. And so it's hard for me to
16 differentiate which one you might be...

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did they both happen
18 in 2023?

19 MR. LEAPAI: Yeah.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Tell me what
21 happened.

22 MR. DOCANTO-SALAS: So essentially, like I
23 said, a gentleman had hit my car. I was
24 unmedicated. I destroyed a couple of his windows.
25 And then I had already gotten that absolved, got it

1 dismissed. The secondary one was intentional -- I
2 guess -- well, not intentional, but hitting a car
3 and then driving away.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Are you pending a
5 court date?

6 MR. DOCANTO-SALAS: No, those are already
7 dismissed.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: If I remember
9 correctly, the reason we asked you to postpone was
10 because they were pending.

11 MR. JAMES: Yes.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: And you thought that
13 they would be dismissed.

14 MR. LEAPAI: Yes.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: As we see now, they
16 were dismissed.

17 So we told him to postpone and come back.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay.

19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: May I make a
20 statement on behalf...

21 MR. DOCANTO-SALAS: This is my attorney.

22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I'm not
23 representing him today. Is it okay if I speak?

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I don't need any
25 more.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I think we're good.

2 But, yeah.

3 Board, are there any questions for

4 Mr. Salas?

5 If there's no further questions, we'll
6 entertain a motion.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
8 Cortez motioning to approve Mr. Docanto-Salas'
9 appeal for the registration card based on full
10 disclosure and coming back, doing exactly what we
11 asked him to do.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, we have a motion.
13 Do we have a second?

14 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
16 have a second. All in favor say aye.

17 (All present Board members voted aye.)

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you for coming
19 back and following through and getting it dismissed.
20 They will help you for the next steps.

21 MR. DOCANTO-SALAS: Sweet. Thank you.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you.

23 MR. DOCANTO-SALAS: Absolutely.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 90 was
25 postponed.

1 Agenda Item No. 91, Rajon Collins.

2 Good afternoon, sir.

3 MR. COLLINS: Good afternoon.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Can I ask, have you
5 been sworn in?

6 MR. COLLINS: Yes, ma'am.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

8 Investigator Swarthout, why are we here
9 for Mr. Collins?

10 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
11 denied for a felony conviction and for failure to
12 disclose arrest history.

13 The applicant disclosed a 2007 arrest out
14 of California for attempted grand theft from a
15 person. That was convicted, felony, sentenced to a
16 180 days jail, two years' probation.

17 Our -- the fingerprints also showed a 2022
18 arrest out of California for violating order
19 preventing domestic violence.

20 A 2021 out of California murder charge.
21 The applicant was extradited back to California on
22 that charge.

23 2019, California vandalism. Vandalism is
24 a Wobbler out there. It can be tried as a felony or
25 misdemeanor, depending on how much damage.

1 2019 out of California, threaten criminal
2 intent and terrorize.

3 2018 out of California, vandalism again.

4 2015 out of California, disturbed by loud,
5 unreasonable noise. He was found guilty of that
6 one.

7 2014 out of California, pimping.

8 2009 out of California, corporal injury on
9 spouse, cohabitant that he was also found guilty of.

10 2008 out of California; obstruct, resist
11 public officer. He was found guilty on that one.

12 2007 out of California. Appropriate, loss
13 property. Was found guilty on that one.

14 2005 out of California. Obstruct,
15 et cetera, public officer. Was found guilty on that
16 one.

17 He only disclosed the felony conviction.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
19 questions for Mr. Collins?

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Hi, Mr. Collins.

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
22 Brown.

23 I have a question for Investigator
24 Swarthout first.

25 On the 2021 felony murder arrest, do you

1 have any kind of status from California as to what's
2 going on with that?

3 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: No, I do not.

4 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
6 Cortez.

7 Mr. Collins, two questions. First, why
8 did you fail to disclose the majority of your
9 criminal history?

10 MR. COLLINS: Well, when I was applying
11 and filling out the application, I called my mom,
12 had her get online and get everything that she could
13 get for me so I can put down the proper codes and
14 everything.

15 So I wouldn't spend that type of money on
16 something not, like, believing that I would get you
17 guys all that information that I needed. So I was
18 under the impression that I gave you guys everything
19 that you needed.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Second question.

21 Talk to me about the 2021 murder charge
22 out of California. You were extradited --

23 MR. COLLINS: It wasn't murder. It was --

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Whatever the case
25 is, what's the status?

1 MR. COLLINS: Self defense.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Don't give me the
3 charges. I want to know what the status is. Have
4 you gone to court?

5 MR. COLLINS: I don't have to.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Case was dropped?

7 MR. COLLINS: Yes.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do you have any
9 court papers with you today showing that that case
10 is fully closed?

11 MR. COLLINS: No. They let me out. They
12 expedited (sic) me from out here. Flew me back out
13 to California. I got out to California and talked
14 to the DAs out there and they said self defense.
15 They went to the apartments, got the videos, and
16 they let me out and said have a good life.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. So, then, in
18 2022 there was a violation of your DB orders. Talk
19 to me about that.

20 MR. COLLINS: So, my child's mother, she
21 put -- tried to -- she tried to -- she still doing
22 it to this day. My daughter is 15. She had put a
23 restraining order on me to keep me from going to my
24 kid's school. So I'm doing my diligence. My kid's
25 in California. Even now, I go pop up out there, let

1 me go sit in the kid's class. Because --

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Mr. Collins, do you
3 have an active restraining order?

4 MR. COLLINS: No. And that's what I'm
5 saying is -- so when I don't have one, I go pop up
6 to my kid's school. Like recently. And they called
7 the police. So, like, the -- my baby mother's very
8 vindictive. She -- she know how to utilize the
9 system. Her oldest is 26. She's been dealing with
10 the system, the penal system, so she know her way
11 around the system to get what she wants.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Last thing about
13 that. I want you to learn also how to play that
14 same game. If you already know she's going to go
15 there, then don't add to the problem. Stay away.

16 MR. COLLINS: My kid's --

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You can have a
18 conversation with your kids and have a complete
19 relationship with your children. It's easy. You
20 just don't have to violate a certain order. There
21 are stipulations around the order.

22 But we're not going to go through all that
23 right now. I'm just letting you know there are ways
24 for you to stay out of trouble and help yourself.

25 MR. COLLINS: I hear you. That's why I'm

1 trying to get my card, so I can work and push
2 forward.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Are there any further
5 questions for the Board?

6 Hearing there are no further questions,
7 I'll entertain a motion.

8 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.
9 Denial based on his nondisclosure of criminal
10 history.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion.
12 Do we have a second?

13 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown
14 will second.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion,
16 we have a second. All in favor say aye.

17 (All present Board members voted aye.)

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, motion is upheld.

19 You have an opportunity to come and see us
20 in a year and reapply. You have all this history
21 now, so you don't have to go back and look for it.
22 The office will help --

23 MR. COLLINS: I need that information.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You can get it. That
25 will help you. So if you don't have any other

1 interactions with law enforcement, this should be
2 able to be a roadmap for you to fill out the
3 application, okay?

4 So, we hope to see you in a year. And I
5 would suggest for the court case in California where
6 you were extradited, you try to get some sort of
7 paperwork saying that it's done and completed,
8 because that's going to be a question that continues
9 to come up.

10 MR. COLLINS: All right.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you, sir.

12 MR. COLLINS: Thank you.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 92,
14 Bruce Willingham.

15 Good afternoon, sir.

16 MR. WILLINGHAM: How you doing?

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good. Just to
18 confirm, you've been sworn in?

19 MR. WILLINGHAM: Yes.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Fantastic.

21 Investigator Swarthout, could you tell us
22 why we're here for Mr. Willingham?

23 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: All right. The
24 applicant was denied for failure to disclose arrest
25 history.

1 On his fingerprints was found a 2018 out
2 of Virginia petit larceny, third offense. That was
3 dismissed.

4 2018 out of Virginia, trespass after
5 forbidden, dismissed.

6 2012 out of Virginia, bad check, less than
7 \$200. He was sentenced to 12 months jail. That
8 time ran concurrent with another case.

9 2011 out of Virginia, petty larceny.
10 Sentenced to 12 months' jail. That's the one that
11 ran concurrent.

12 2002 out of Virginia, petit larceny, which
13 he pled guilty to.

14 The applicant originally didn't disclose
15 on his application, was made provisional. After the
16 denial, he did come in, provide court documents and
17 did disclose his arrest history after the time.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
19 questions for Mr. Willingham?

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
21 Cortez.

22 Mr. Willingham, why did you fail to
23 disclose your criminal history prior to the denial
24 letter?

25 MR. WILLINGHAM: They told me that I

1 did -- it was a -- a felony that was on the record.
2 So (indiscernible).

3 THE REPORTER: Can you repeat that?

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Yeah, I'm sorry.
5 Start over.

6 First, who's "they"?

7 MR. WILLINGHAM: CSE. I was supposed to
8 work for the Super Bowl. Came here. They said --

9 THE REPORTER: Sir, I really need you to
10 slow down.

11 MR. WILLINGHAM: Oh, I'm sorry.

12 They said the FBI did a background check
13 and said a felony was on there. I had to go and
14 prove that it got knocked down to a misdemeanor.
15 And got the office -- okay. You should be good. He
16 said you were denied because on the record it says
17 you have a felony. So, on my application at CSE,
18 there was a Super Bowl hiring event. And I wrote
19 down all of my charges on the application. So, I
20 mean...

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I just want to be
22 clear. You said CSE helped you fill this
23 application out.

24 MR. WILLINGHAM: Yeah.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. So,

1 unfortunately, they failed to tell you that on
2 page 5 there is one sheet that has a big old stop
3 sign on it. And it literally tells you to list all
4 of your convictions, all of your history, whether it
5 was convicted, dismissed, under California penal
6 code, in a different state, next door, yesterday,
7 you were supposed to list it all.

8 So unfortunately, whoever helped you
9 misguided you.

10 MR. WILLINGHAM: No. I'm saying I listed
11 everything on there.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Not according to
13 ours.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I think I know -- so
15 when you say you listed everything, was that on the
16 NFL application, the NFL security application that
17 went to the FBI?

18 MR. WILLINGHAM: No, it was on the piece
19 of paper application that we did at the warehouse
20 that I had to write everything on there. And he
21 said a red flag raised up because I had a felony on
22 my record. And that was the charge they were
23 investigating. And I had to show that got knocked
24 down to a misdemeanor. I was under the impression
25 that I was under the investigation for and being

1 denied -- it was -- that was left off. And I can't
2 do anything about that.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The application -- the
4 paper application that you filled out, was it from
5 the PILB?

6 MR. WILLINGHAM: No, it was for CSC. CSC,
7 and you write down all your charges on there and you
8 turn it in with all your charges on there and you
9 turn it in. It was, like, 200 of us, they escort us
10 through.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yeah. So, did you --
12 did you do this online?

13 MR. WILLINGHAM: No.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So on here it says
15 paper application was done online.

16 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Application that
17 was submitted to us was online.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So I can bet that CSC
19 took that paper and --

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So this is what they
21 failed to show you. On page 5 of the -- of the
22 paper application, there's this one specific page
23 and that's all it shows. It shows one big stop
24 sign. And it lists bullet points on what you need
25 to list, as far as your criminal history.

1 Even on the online application, there's
2 also a section that says, whoa, stop. Don't go any
3 further. List. All your charges, arrests,
4 citations, regardless of how long ago, regardless of
5 the state, regardless whether you were placed in
6 handcuffs, dismissed, expunged, or denied, or even
7 if it was under the California Penal Code 1203.4.

8 So unfortunately, when people end up
9 helping the applicants fill out the applications and
10 they go right by this, they ended up doing you a
11 disfavor. And that's unfortunate for us, because we
12 have to make a decision based on wrong information
13 that was given to you.

14 MR. WILLINGHAM: So, come back in -- come
15 back in --

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Hang on. We're not
17 there yet.

18 MR. WILLINGHAM: Sorry.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. That's the
20 unfortunate part of the group.

21 MR. WILLINGHAM: Really wanted a part-time
22 job, but, I mean...

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: That's not cool for
24 somebody to just go right by a crucial point.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, Board, are there

1 any further questions for Mr. Willingham?

2 Do you still currently work for CSC?

3 MR. WILLINGHAM: No. I had to get a new
4 job at Geotech. I was just trying to get part-time
5 job for F1 for some extra money.

6 Yeah, they just -- they just pushed us
7 through. And so I wrote down everything, and they
8 told me that FBI did an investigation in this
9 felony. If I knew there was something that was
10 disqualified, I just wouldn't -- would have tooked
11 (sic) it and not came. Because I know what the
12 rules are.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, if
14 there's no further questions, I'll entertain a
15 motion.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
17 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial based on
18 failure to disclose criminal history.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
20 we have a second?

21 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
23 have a second. All in favor say aye.

24 (All present Board members voted aye.)

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, again, work with

1 the Board and/or go through the application yourself
2 to make sure that you get everything down properly.
3 But we would like to see you back in one year. Good
4 luck to you.

5 MR. WILLINGHAM: Thank you.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 93,
7 Angel Segura.

8 Good afternoon, sir.

9 MR. SEGURA: Good afternoon.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Have you been sworn
11 in?

12 MR. SEGURA: Yes, ma'am.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

14 Investigator Swarthout, why are we here
15 for Mr. Segura?

16 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
17 denied due to a felony conviction and for failure to
18 disclose arrest history.

19 2011 out of Utah, he did disclose this
20 felony as conspiracy to attempt, possess
21 methamphetamine with attempt to distribute. He was
22 sentenced to 77 months and supervised release for 60
23 months. The original sentence was 96 months, but it
24 was reduced down to the 77 months.

25 The other arrest that wasn't disclosed is

1 a 1989 out of California, aid and abet illegal
2 aliens entry. Couldn't find it on PACER, but the
3 fingerprints do show that he was sentenced to \$1,000
4 fine for it.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
6 questions for Mr. Segura?

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
8 Cortez.

9 Mr. Segura, why did you fail to disclose
10 the 1989 case?

11 MR. SEGURA: To be honest, I sent that
12 information. But what happened, I'm out of
13 Salt Lake City. They had someone that came in to do
14 the application for the Super Bowl. And all he
15 said, disclose everything. And I remember that I
16 put everything on it. The only thing he asked me to
17 send in my copy of my passport and my driver's
18 license, because I have that information with me.
19 But I didn't hear anything else until this hearing.
20 I don't know if I did that -- I mean, I know that I
21 was aware of that. But I just don't remember why,
22 if it wasn't on my application, I don't have no --
23 no explanation why I forgot to put it.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Was there -- who --
25 what was the company that helped you with your

1 application?

2 MR. SEGURA: CSC.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Second question.

5 How long have you been in Nevada?

6 MR. SEGURA: I just flew in this morning.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: He's not from here.

8 MR. SEGURA: I was only trying to get the
9 license because I started my own security company.
10 And I have an opportunity with this company to bring
11 my -- me and my group over here to do security for
12 certain special events.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
14 further questions?

15 No further questions, I'll entertain a
16 motion.

17 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
18 Brown.

19 I move that we uphold the denial of Angel
20 Segura's registration for application for a work
21 card for failure to disclose.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
23 we have a second?

24 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we

1 have a second. All in favor say aye.

2 (All present Board members voted aye.)

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

4 Unfortunately, you're victim to the same
5 as the gentleman before you. By doing that, having
6 the bulk application, you know, through somebody
7 else, they neglected to tell you all the things that
8 you needed to submit on that application.

9 So, you know, you do have an opportunity
10 to come back in one year and reapply. Just make
11 sure that you put everything down on that
12 application. And then once you get that, I did hear
13 you say that you have a security company in Utah?

14 MR. SEGURA: Correct.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So once you get that,
16 you have to be sponsored by a company in order to
17 work within Nevada. Your work card does not give
18 you the opportunity to work by yourself.

19 MR. SEGURA: Yeah, I was aware of that.
20 It was just for the Super Bowl that they wanted me
21 to come up here. That's all.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got you. Okay, all
23 right. Good luck to you, and hopefully we'll see
24 you back in a year. Thank you.

25 Agenda Item No. 94, Ronnie Bratford.

1 Sorry, 94 is withdrawn.

2 Agenda Item No. 95, Karen Armour. Do we
3 have Ms. Armour?

4 Agenda Item No. 96, Markeese Ross.

5 Good afternoon, sir.

6 MR. ROSS: Hello. Good afternoon.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Just have to ask you,
8 have you been sworn in?

9 MR. ROSS: No.

10

11

MARKEESE ROSS,

12

having been duly sworn,

13

testified as follows:

14

15

MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator

16

Swarthout, could you tell us why we're here for

17

Mr. Ross?

18

INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was

19

denied for a felony conviction, conviction of

20

illegal use, possession of a dangerous weapon, and

21

failure to disclose arrest history.

22

2015 out of California, carry concealed

23

dirk or dagger. Sentenced to 188 days jail, three

24

years probation.

25

2007 out of California, felony carjacking.

1 Sentenced to 187 days jail suspended and 36 months'
2 probation. He had two probation violation arrests
3 in that case.

4 2021 out of California, inflict corporal
5 injury to spouse/cohabitant. Looks like it was
6 dismissed. It looks like it was a detention only
7 arrest.

8 2020 out of California, DUI. There was no
9 disposition listed on that case.

10 2020 out of California, possession of
11 controlled substance while armed. There's no
12 disposition on that case.

13 2015 out of California, inflict corporal
14 injury, spouse/cohabitant. This one also appears to
15 only be a detention only.

16 2010 out of California, force, assault,
17 deadly weapon not a firearm, and the second charge
18 was prevent, dissuade witness with the threat of
19 force. That one was dismissed.

20 2009 out of California, another force,
21 assault with a deadly weapon not a firearm. That
22 one was denied.

23 And then 2023 out of Nevada, domestic
24 battery. It was dismissed.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are

1 there any questions for Mr. Ross?

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
3 Cortez.

4 Mr. Ross, why did you fail to disclose any
5 of the arrest history?

6 MR. ROSS: I was unaware -- I was off the
7 California seven years back of actual convictions.
8 So that's what I was really going off of.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Did you read the
10 application slowly?

11 MR. ROSS: I was -- yeah, I obviously made
12 a mistake on my behalf.

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You are aware of
14 what I'm talking about?

15 MR. ROSS: Which part?

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I think you might
17 have been -- I'm not sure if you were here or not
18 before, but on the application, there is a page that
19 asks you to stop --

20 MR. ROSS: Oh, yes. I'm aware of it.
21 Correct.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So even seeing that,
23 you overlooked --

24 MR. ROSS: Yes, ma'am.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Understood. Thank

1 you.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
3 questions for Mr. Ross?

4 Hearing there are no questions I'll
5 entertain a motion.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
7 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial based on
8 failure to disclose any criminal history, in
9 addition to -- we've got cases in 2021 and 2020.
10 Time and distance, a little too close.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
12 we have a second?

13 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
15 have a second. All in favor say aye.

16 (All present Board members voted aye.)

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes.

18 I'm not sure how long you've been here,
19 but we've been telling everybody, if you've not been
20 approved this time, you have an opportunity to try
21 again in one year. They have your arrest history.
22 They'll be able to help you fill out the
23 application, or give you the supporting
24 documentation. As long as there's no further
25 contact with law enforcement.

1 MR. ROSS: Thank you.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you.

3 MR. ROSS: Thank you.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 97,
5 Ariana Martinez-Aros.

6 Investigator Swarthout -- have you been
7 sworn in?

8 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: Yes.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
10 Swarthout, could you tell us why we're here?

11 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
12 denied for failure to disclose arrest history.

13 The applicant has a 2003 out of Arizona
14 arrest for discharge firearm within city limits,
15 carry a deadly weapon. The case appears to be
16 potentially ongoing still. I asked Arizona courts
17 and have been in contact with the applicant dealing
18 with it to try to get something to show the case is
19 closed.

20 The only thing that shows out of Arizona
21 is a case that would have been filed around the same
22 time, that all it lists is not a valid criminal
23 charge. It doesn't list anything else besides that.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
25 questions?

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
2 Cortez.

3 Investigator Swarthout, does it still
4 apply that she failed to disclose this?

5 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: I wrote it down --

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Hang on one second,
7 ma'am. I'm asking the investigator.

8 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yes. And she was
9 made provisional. The company that she was working
10 for was CSC.

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So she did fail to
12 disclose.

13 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yeah.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Ms. Martinez-Aros,
15 what's the status of that case?

16 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: They -- it says not
17 valid criminal charge. But that wasn't the initial
18 charge I was charged with. I was charged with
19 discharging firearm and then they dropped that
20 charge. And then they brought this charge on. But
21 it was already after I had denied -- was denied.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do you happen to
23 have any court papers?

24 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: I don't have nothing.
25 I sent him the list of my -- literally, I went to

1 court for it. They dropped that charge and then
2 they're, like, okay, we're going to press you with
3 possession of a firearm under 21 and deadly weapon.
4 And then I went to court for that and I never got
5 anything. And you look it up --

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do you have a future
7 court date?

8 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: No.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Not even a -- like,
10 a review of the case?

11 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: I have -- they
12 literally -- we went to court and they never got
13 back to me. And then when you look it up, it says
14 not a valid criminal charge.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. But I just
16 want to confirm with you, you did fail to disclose
17 that arrest or contact.

18 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: I wasn't -- I hadn't
19 been charged with that yet.

20 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I didn't ask you if
21 you had been charged. My question was, did you fail
22 to disclose that you had an incident in 2023?

23 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: No, I did.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: On the application
25 you wrote that?

1 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: Yeah, I wrote it down.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, Investigator
3 Swarthout, is this a typo?

4 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The application
5 was submitted online. I have nos in all three
6 boxes.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So, once again, you
8 did disclose?

9 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: I did. I disclosed
10 that I was charged with disarming a firearm.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Did you -- did you
12 fill out a paper application?

13 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: Yeah.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: If you look, it's
15 under CSC again. And she filled it online. She
16 filled in the paper.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Still time and
18 distance.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I get it.

20 Board, are there any further questions?

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Yes. This is Board
22 Member Brown.

23 Just for clarification, what it sounds
24 like to me is these last group of folks are putting
25 their information down on a CSC application. But

1 CSC is not telling them that they need to put this
2 on our application. Is that what I'm understanding?

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Or CSC -- what I'm
4 envisioning is CSC's got a data entry person filling
5 in these online applications for them.

6 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: I never filled out...

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: They're filling it out
8 on paper. And then when you look at the -- how it
9 came in, it came in online.

10 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. So I'm
11 assuming that our Executive Director has been
12 listening to this and he's going to reach out to CSC
13 and say, hey, wait a minute. You've got an issue.
14 Or several issues.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I just want to place
16 on the record that Ms. Martinez-Aros just indicated
17 that she didn't fill out the application, it was
18 them.

19 Is that correct?

20 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: Yeah. I never filled
21 out -- like, a -- they said that they would go ahead
22 and do that for us.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: So once again,
24 unfortunately, we have someone misguiding you guys.
25 And it's falling on the applicant, not even the

1 individual who made the errors.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I don't think they're
3 being misguided. CSC -- can I talk about this?

4 DAG HARRIS: Yeah.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I don't think they're
6 being misguided. I think they're filling it out.
7 Because she said she did fill it out on the paper.
8 CSC is not putting it in correctly, so that they can
9 get the work card provisionally and work for the
10 Super Bowl because they had a number of people that
11 they had to get.

12 Afterwards they get denied, but they got
13 what they needed. They got that Super Bowl filled.
14 Personal opinion maybe. Kind of, sort of.
15 Unfortunate for these guys, because they're stuck in
16 this.

17 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Madam Chair and for
18 Counsel Harris, also, this sort of gives me pause
19 over the decisions that we've made recently, that
20 we're holding something against these folks that
21 they had no idea.

22 Is -- is there any recourse that we can
23 contact these people and say reapply again for a
24 next Board meeting since this doesn't appear to have
25 been their fault, rather than making them wait a

1 year?

2 DAG HARRIS: For the applicant -- for the
3 applicants who specifically use CSC to fill out
4 their applications and they didn't touch those
5 applications, what you can do is renote the
6 agenda -- those agenda items as corrective agenda
7 items at the next Board meeting.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Madam Chair?

9 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Can we reach out and
10 notify the last few candidates that we've had this
11 issue with and say, hey, wait a minute. On further
12 review, we realize this wasn't your fault and we're
13 going to reagendaize these and place them on our next
14 Board meeting?

15 DAG HARRIS: The one thing is, I would be
16 careful with the language. Because you would still
17 have to treat every case on a case-by-case basis.
18 So we're under the assumption with her, but I don't
19 know how it's going to apply for every other
20 applicant.

21 But the idea is, is that if there is a
22 concern with this particular group or company pretty
23 much filling out the application and only seeing the
24 application, and the applicant him- or herself is
25 not involved in the writing of it, what you can do

1 is, have the follow-up meeting at the next upcoming
2 Board meeting to -- renoticing to the public with
3 those particular agenda items, that we will hear
4 them again, and let the Board decide at that
5 hearing.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I have a question,
7 though.

8 DAG HARRIS: Sure.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: If we do that in
10 September, then they have to wait until September
11 and then they can reapply when?

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Or trail the case.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Or can we -- can we
14 actually mention it in our agenda items at the end
15 of this and then call it then? So in September,
16 they would come in for their -- they would reapply
17 now, and then they would come in for their approval
18 in September versus December.

19 DAG HARRIS: It might be easier -- okay.
20 So, the Board can do one of two -- numerous ways.
21 It can have another meeting from now until
22 September. Or, if it works, they'll keep the
23 September date. If we can have at least a
24 confirmation as to what particular agenda items we
25 know are applicable for this concern, the Board can,

1 during this particular meeting, there could be a
2 motion on the floor to revisit the -- to revisit
3 that item and then continue it, I would say, to the
4 September meeting. I would recommend that.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, No. 16, we would,
6 for future agenda items, we would say that we want
7 to continue the applicants that fell under the CSC
8 guidelines. Would that work?

9 DAG HARRIS: That could. But either way,
10 whether you put a motion on the continuance, you
11 still have the option, given the fact that -- and
12 I'm counting the ones prior to her where we had the
13 action, as long as it's renoticed you can revisit
14 that agenda item.

15 So I would say that the more important
16 focus is for the upcoming September -- for the
17 upcoming September date, it's noticed as a
18 corrective item -- as a corrective agenda item. And
19 so any denial or approval would track on that
20 September date instead of today's date.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Madam Chair, I'm
23 willing to revisit those cases when there's one
24 charge that was not listed. But when we have
25 several charges that were not listed, that's a

1 different -- there's a difference between that.

2 DAG HARRIS: Which was why, you know,
3 there was a clarification of, wait a minute, we're
4 willing to revisit, but that doesn't mean that some
5 items might not still reach the same determination.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Correct. And based
7 off of what I'm recalling, this is the only
8 applicant thus far with the one charge that was not
9 listed, and it sounds like it was an inside
10 situation.

11 DAG HARRIS: If I can, just as a
12 recommendation, with this particular agenda item,
13 you can elect to -- you can elect to continue or
14 make a decision, and then at the end of this
15 meeting, once Board staff has an opportunity to
16 review all the agenda items that are in contention
17 that might be subjected to a change based on --
18 based on the additional research that it does, then
19 those items can be renoticed for this September
20 meeting.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, are we able to
22 discuss it?

23 DAG HARRIS: Discuss what exactly?

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The September -- the
25 people that have passed already.

1 DAG HARRIS: Right. So there's already
2 existing action on them. So if you -- as part of,
3 like, a future agenda item, on that agenda, you
4 could discuss any agenda item out of order.

5 So, if this is part of, I believe, Agenda
6 Item No. 116?

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yeah.

8 DAG HARRIS: So, if part of that agenda
9 item, if you're -- if -- basically, if you're giving
10 the recommendation to Board staff to look through
11 all of the prior applicants today to see the ones
12 that were denied who you can confirm on record that
13 they did have CSC complete their application, you
14 can -- you can make that request to Board staff to
15 have those agenda items be renoticed at the
16 September meeting.

17 It is important that it is clarified as an
18 instruction to our ED and the rest of the Board
19 staff, that it's not -- that as part of the
20 corrective action, it could still lead to the same
21 result or it may not lead to the same result. But
22 the Board wants to go back and revisit who exactly
23 fulfilled -- who exactly completed this agenda item
24 and ensure that there wasn't any other law
25 enforcement contact, arrests, et cetera, outside of

1 that that they still didn't disclose.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. And then for
3 this particular agenda item right now, can we
4 continue it? And if we do, what would she have to
5 do, or what's the resolution to that?

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
7 Cortez.

8 So my suggestion is, why don't we move
9 forward with this case, and then we can continue the
10 discussion of the other cases. But with this one,
11 I'd be open for a discussion on whether or not we
12 can trail her to the September Board meeting. That
13 way, it will give ED time to figure out what exactly
14 is going on.

15 Specifically just on this candidate, if
16 she's willing to wait. Is because we do have just
17 the one charge. It's not an additional failed to
18 disclose 85 different charges. It's one charge.
19 Seeing the pattern that's going on. So I am willing
20 to -- and again, if the applicant is willing to
21 postpone her decision only until the September Board
22 meeting, I'd be comfortable with that. Just for
23 this one. We can have discussions on the ones
24 later.

25 DAG HARRIS: Okay. And the idea is, it's

1 ultimately up to what the Board wants to vote and
2 may want to do. I do think it's important that it's
3 noted on the record what is that particular
4 organization's process for inputting the
5 information. So there is the applicant's
6 representation that, hey, I didn't complete this.
7 But we still haven't heard from the other
8 organization as to, oh, no. It could be yes, we
9 complete and we just get -- we just talk verbally
10 and enter. And -- but we don't -- but if they
11 say -- we don't know.

12 They could say, oh, no. We asked them.
13 Please tell us all of your arrests and everything
14 and they told us that's everything I got. Then it's
15 back to the same determination.

16 I think that that critical piece that's
17 missing for the Board's discussion is, what is that
18 input process on the application? How does it
19 happen and what specific -- outside from the
20 questions of the criminal history, the special
21 notations of disclosing all criminal history,
22 including 1203.4, including juvenile, including all
23 of that, are they also mentioning that? Or which
24 ones are they mentioning or not mentioning? That
25 has to be clarified for the Board, I think, prior

1 to -- or during the meeting, addressing those
2 corrective actions.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The Segura guy was the
4 same way. The gentleman Segura is a different --

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: But it was a
6 different group, though, right?

7 DAG HARRIS: I think it might be
8 prudent -- I mean, it's up to the Board ultimately
9 what it decides. But knowing what we are aware of
10 right now, it might be prudent to continue this
11 agenda item as well as all related other agenda
12 items to the September meeting. But it's up to the
13 Board what it wants to do with this particular item
14 right now.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, here are your
16 options.

17 You can tell us that you want to postpone
18 or continue your application. And as you see,
19 there's some issues going on, so we would continue
20 and you would come to see us next meeting, after
21 they're able to investigate what's going on, right?

22 Or, we can make a decision now, and then
23 you're stuck with the outcome, and it might be one
24 year before you're able to reapply.

25 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: I can wait. That's

1 fine.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we don't
3 need a motion on that at all, right? Because she's
4 willing to postpone or continue her...

5 DAG HARRIS: Yeah, that should be fine.
6 We'll treat it like all other prior agenda items
7 that were postponed. It will just be noted on the
8 record that it's a postponed agenda item.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, I would suggest
10 you to make sure that you look for your e-mails and
11 stuff, because the Board or the office may be
12 reaching out to you to ask some more information
13 about the company and what was done and all of that
14 good stuff, okay?

15 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: Sounds good.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Madam Chair, this os
17 Board Member Cortez.

18 Ms. Martinez-Aros, will you please try to
19 find some kind of court paperwork saying that it's
20 all closed out, if you can.

21 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: Yeah. I'll send an
22 e-mail to the courts and see what I can figure out.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, very much.
24 And thanks for your patience while we go through
25 this.

1 MS. MARTINEZ-AROS: Thank you. I
2 appreciate it.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 98,
4 Eugeneia Youngblood.

5 Good afternoon.

6 MS. YOUNGBLOOD: Good afternoon.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
8 Swarthout, tell us why we're here for
9 Ms. Youngblood?

10 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Applicant was
11 denied for felony conviction. 2007 out of
12 California, possess or control substance for sale,
13 cocaine. Sentenced to four years prison. The
14 applicant did receive a 1203.4 dismissal on this
15 case on 10-22-2021.

16 2014 out of California, misdemeanor
17 shoplifting. Sentenced to three years' probation.
18 The applicant also received a 1203.4 dismissal on
19 this case.

20 The applicant was previously denied and
21 upheld at the 2022 Board meeting for failure to
22 disclose arrest history.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
24 questions for Ms. Youngblood?

25 Hearing there are no questions, I'll

1 entertain a motion.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
3 Cortez --

4 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
5 Brown.

6 I move that we grant Eugeneia Youngblood's
7 appeal based on the fact that she disclosed and did
8 what we asked her to do a year ago.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
10 seconding that motion.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
12 have a second. All in favor say aye.

13 (All present Board members voted aye.)

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations. You
15 will get your guard card -- or a work card. The
16 office will contact you for next steps.

17 MS. YOUNGBLOOD: Thank you.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck.

19 Agenda Item No. 99, Charmaine
20 Goodman-Murphy.

21 Hello. Good afternoon.

22 MS. GOODMAN-MURPHY: Good afternoon.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
24 Swarthout, could you tell us why we're here for
25 Ms. Murphy?

1 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
2 denied for a felony conviction and for failure to
3 disclose her arrest history.

4 The applicant has a 1995 arrest out of
5 California for fraud to obtain aid. Sentenced to 50
6 days' jail suspended, 16 months' probation. The
7 applicant was granted 1203.4 dismissal on it on
8 January 25th, 2011.

9 The applicant had multiple probation
10 violations during the time that this case ran, and
11 was on formal probation between 1995 to 2010.

12 She was made provisional and was working
13 for two companies at the time when we got the
14 (indiscernible).

15 THE REPORTER: When you got the?

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Fingerprints back.

17 Board, any questions for Ms. Murphy?

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Good afternoon,
19 Ms. Goodman-Murphy. My name is Board Member Cortez.

20 Why did we fail to disclose the 1995
21 charge?

22 MS. GOODMAN-MURPHY: Pretty much the same
23 issue. Supervisor that was interviewing me at the
24 time, at the Allied Security Company. We were in an
25 interview and I was filling out the same document.

1 And I informed him that I did have a felony and --
2 years ago, about 25 years ago. And I wasn't aware
3 of the probation violation. I wasn't aware of that,
4 just now hearing it.

5 But I did everything the court asked me to
6 do. I went in front of a judge that put me on
7 restitution probation. Everything was done. And
8 so, like I said, this was, like, 25 years ago, and
9 supervisor says, don't worry. Like you said, they
10 were looking for people to work at that time, and
11 they were just putting people through at the time.

12 But not blaming anything on anyone. I
13 hadn't worked in about 30 years, and I had just
14 filled out the application after not working after
15 30 years. And I just recently lost my husband. I
16 had to get back to work. So I'm not blaming anyone,
17 but I was told that it was so many years ago it was
18 okay to -- you know, to go ahead and get hired.

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you.

20 MS. GOODMAN-MURPHY: I'm just asking for a
21 second chance. I am working for Marksman Security
22 right now. And doing a pretty good job. Just
23 asking for a second chance.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
25 other questions?

1 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
2 Brown.

3 Yes. Ms. Murphy, did you just state
4 you're currently working for Marksman Security
5 Corporation?

6 MS. GOODMAN-MURPHY: I am. I'm working
7 for Marksman Security. Unfortunately, I did have a
8 work-related injury, so I'm on workmen's comp. I
9 cut my hand pretty bad. But I'm still -- I'm still
10 with the company. Right now the doctor put me on
11 light duty. So -- but yes.

12 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: In what role do you
13 work for them?

14 MS. GOODMAN-MURPHY: I'm -- security.
15 Security, but I can't do security without the guard
16 card, of course. So once I get my guard card back,
17 I'll go ahead and get going with my station. They
18 put me in a particular station to work.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You're not actively
20 working for them right now, but you're on their --
21 you're -- you're employed by them.

22 MS. GOODMAN-MURPHY: Yes.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got you.

24 MS. GOODMAN-MURPHY: Yes.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Do we want to add

1 this?

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Is it the same
3 company?

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: No. But, you know,
5 it's crunch at the Super Bowl.

6 DAG HARRIS: DAG Harris, for the record.
7 Who completed her application? Just to reconfirm on
8 the record.

9 MS. GOODMAN-MURPHY: Allied. It was a
10 supervisor that was interviewing me at the time. I
11 should have gotten a statement from him, but I
12 didn't, that he was -- told me that it was okay.
13 Because it was so many years ago. The felony was
14 over 25 years ago, so he said no problem. Just, you
15 know, don't mark it. And I just -- back of my mind,
16 I knew it was not the right thing to do. But I
17 needed to work because my husband had just passed
18 away. My income completely stopped. I needed to
19 work.

20 DAG HARRIS: So you're saying you
21 completed the application, but you received bad
22 advice from an Allied representative.

23 MS. GOODMAN-MURPHY: I was online. It was
24 online on a computer. But I was actually at the
25 Allied company with the supervisor filling out the

1 application. We were together on the computer doing
2 it together.

3 DAG HARRIS: That means you also saw that
4 stop sign?

5 MS. GOODMAN-MURPHY: I did, I did. I did
6 see the stop sign. And that's when I got the
7 supervisor over and we talked. And he said, no, 25
8 year ago, he said, no problem. Just to mark no. So
9 I did. But like I said, back of my mind, I knew it
10 wasn't the right thing to do.

11 DAG HARRIS: Members of the Board, that's
12 the tricky part that this is the distinguishable
13 circumstance. Because for the other matters that
14 were previously discussed. Because ultimately, and
15 as a reiteration to the public as to why the Board
16 cares. It's always a character assessment. If
17 you're able to be fully transparent about your past
18 criminal history, there is a true, proper character
19 marker as these professions do demand that.

20 So, the concern here, or what I would say
21 what appears to be distinguishable here, is that
22 there's -- is that for the other applicants that
23 were previously mentioned, if they're not filling
24 out the application themselves, then they're not
25 seeing the warning, they're not seeing the

1 disclaimers and reiteration to disclose everything.

2 There is, as what's been already testified
3 here before, that she did see the warning and that
4 she was given bad advice from a representative of
5 Allied to disregard that warning anyway.

6 I leave it up to the Board what it wants
7 to do with that information, but I just wanted to
8 clarify the distinction for the record.

9 MS. GOODMAN-MURPHY: Yeah, I do, too.
10 That's my responsibility. I should have said, you
11 know -- and I had the one felony. It was, like I
12 said, '96. And actually occurred when I was 18.
13 But it didn't catch up with me until that time. But
14 it's my responsibility, so I understand, you know,
15 coming back a year, that's no problem. But, yeah,
16 it was a mistake. And like I said, they were
17 needing people to work right away. And I was -- I
18 fell short and it was -- and I needed to work. But
19 I understand.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
21 further questions for Ms. Goodman-Murphy?

22 Hearing there are no further questions,
23 I'll entertain a motion.

24 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
25 Brown. Unfortunately, Ms. Goodman-Murphy, or

1 Mrs. Goodman-Murphy, based on the circumstances and
2 due to your admission you did see the stop sign but
3 you went ahead with the bad information, I'm going
4 to move that we uphold the denial of your
5 registration for work card based on the failure to
6 disclose.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
8 we have a second?

9 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
11 have a second. All in favor say aye.

12 (All present Board members voted aye.)

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So unfortunately, we
14 do have to move forward with that denial. But I
15 would encourage you to come back in one year. It
16 was so long ago. Just fill out the information and
17 please come see us again.

18 MS. GOODMAN-MURPHY: This has followed me
19 for a long time. I've been in front of judges, so I
20 just -- spend a little bit more time with my
21 grandkids.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We look forward to
23 seeing you again.

24 MS. GOODMAN-MURPHY: Thank you. Take
25 care. Have a good day.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You, too.

2 Agenda Item No. 100, Jeffries Boyce (sic).

3 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: He's here, Madam
4 Chair.

5 MR. JEFFRIES: Good afternoon. Actually,
6 it's Boyce Jeffries.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Sorry about
8 that, Boyce.

9 MR. JEFFRIES: Not a problem. Not a
10 problem.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
12 Swarthout, could you please tell us why we're here
13 for Mr. Jeffries?

14 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
15 denied for a felony conviction, 1990.

16 The applicant listed a 1979 out of
17 California. Willful, unlawful possession of
18 controlled substance, cocaine. Sentenced to 90
19 days' jail, 36 months' probation and a fine.

20 The applicant also listed a 1997 out of
21 Utah, DUI. Said he was committed to community
22 service. That one was not actually found on his
23 fingerprints.

24 The applicant did work for CSC, but the
25 felony for the unlawful possession of a controlled

1 substance was listed on his application that was
2 done online, but it was listed as a misdemeanor
3 offense. So he was made probation, because they did
4 list them as misdemeanors.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got you.

6 Board, are there any questions for
7 Mr. Jeffries?

8 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
9 Brown.

10 Mr. Jeffries, why were you under the
11 impression that your 1979 conviction was a
12 misdemeanor? There's a button --

13 MR. JEFFRIES: It's red. Not a problem.

14 I was under the understanding at the time
15 back in 1979 that once I had completed my probation
16 in three years and my sentence of 90 days, that
17 would reduce to a misdemeanor.

18 And did I follow up? No. Something in
19 the past, shut the chapter up and moved forward.

20 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you, sir.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
22 for Mr. Jeffries?

23 Hearing there are no further questions,
24 I'll entertain a motion.

25 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick. I

1 move we grant the work card for Mr. Jeffries based
2 on full disclosure of criminal history.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
4 we have a second?

5 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown.
6 I'll second.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
8 have a second. All in favor say aye.

9 (All present Board members voted aye.)

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations, sir.
11 You will receive your work card. The office will
12 contact you with next steps.

13 MR. JEFFRIES: And I'd like to shed some
14 light on CSC. I worked for them out of the Bay Area
15 office, but satellite in Sacramento. We were
16 supposed to work the Super Bowl. So ten of us came
17 up in a van up to Reno. And it was -- I thought it
18 was a staff member from your department. It wasn't.
19 It was a CSC out of Reno that did the
20 fingerprinting, took pictures, and we did the paper
21 applications. So I thought it was weird that they
22 would do it in-house and submit the paperwork,
23 rather than doing it online. I think that could be
24 a problem with some of the applicants that -- just
25 for your information.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We appreciate that,
2 sir. Thank you. Thank you. We appreciate that.

3 MR. JEFFRIES: Thanks again. Have a nice
4 day.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 101,
6 Marchetta Davis. Go ahead and trail that.

7 Agenda Item No. 102, Derek Ellis.

8 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Madam Chair, I'm
9 sorry.

10 MS. DAVIS: Can I let you know, it's
11 Marchetta. Marchetta is the name.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: My apologies.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: My guidance over here.

14 MS. DAVIS: It's okay. It happens all the
15 time.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

17 Investigator Swarthout, if you could
18 please tell us why we're here for Ms. Davis.

19 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
20 denied due to felony convictions.

21 2005 out of Nevada, obtain money under
22 false pretenses. Sentenced to 12 to 30 months at
23 NDOC, suspended. 60 months probation. She was
24 honorably discharged from probation on 2-27-2008,
25 and provided paperwork showing that.

1 2005 out of Nevada, felony embezzlement.
2 Sentenced to six days -- six days to 60 days jail,
3 suspended and probation.

4 The applicant was not made provisional.
5 She disclosed all arrests, and she even provided the
6 court docs out after she was denied.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: One quick question,
8 Ms. Davis.

9 Were you sworn in earlier?

10 MR. WILLINGHAM: Yes, ma'am.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Perfect.

12 Board, any questions for Ms. Davis?

13 Hearing there are no questions, I'll
14 entertain a motion.

15 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
16 Brown.

17 I move that we grant the appeal for
18 Marchetta Davis so that she can get her work card
19 based on full disclosure.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
21 we have a second?

22 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
24 have a second. All in favor say aye.

25 (All present Board members voted aye.)

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations,
2 Ms. Davis. You will get your work card. The office
3 will contact you for next steps. Thank you.

4 Agenda Item No. 102, Derek Ellis.
5 Good afternoon, sir.

6 MR. ELLIS: Good afternoon.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Just to clarify,
8 you've been sworn in?

9 MR. ELLIS: Yes.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

11 Investigator Swarthout, why are we here
12 for Mr. Ellis?

13 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
14 denied for conviction of the illegal use, possession
15 of a dangerous weapon; failure to disclose arrest
16 history.

17 2010 out of California. Willful discharge
18 of a firearm with gross negligence. Sentenced to 20
19 days jail suspended and three years' probation.

20 2016 out of California. Battery, spouse
21 et cetera, significant other, date, et cetera,
22 dismissed.

23 The applicant was made provisional. He
24 was working for Staff Pro, Inc., dba Allied
25 Universal Event Services before he was denied.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
2 questions for Mr. Ellis?

3 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
4 Brown.

5 Mr. Ellis, on our paperwork from the
6 investigator, it indicates that you applied in
7 November of 2023. I figure you probably wouldn't
8 have been able to go to our December meeting because
9 of that. But you didn't have any opportunity to
10 appear in March?

11 MR. ELLIS: No.

12 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Was that because the
13 investigation wasn't done or you couldn't appear?

14 MR. ELLIS: It just wasn't done. The
15 investigation wasn't done.

16 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. So, then, my
17 next question would be, why did you fail to disclose
18 your misdemeanor charges?

19 MR. ELLIS: I just didn't know how it
20 worked, to be honest. And watching other people
21 cases, seeing how you go, I probably misunderstood
22 it. And I thought that you only report, like, if
23 you were in trouble in Nevada -- in the State of
24 Nevada. I figure I was in a whole different state
25 so it didn't matter if I haven't been in trouble up

1 here. Just didn't know how to go.

2 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. And you're
3 aware it's a little different now?

4 MR. ELLIS: Correct.

5 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. Thank you,
6 sir.

7 MR. ELLIS: You're welcome.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
9 for Mr. Ellis? Okay.

10 Hearing there are no further questions,
11 I'll entertain a motion.

12 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick. I
13 move we uphold the denial based on nondisclosure of
14 criminal history.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
16 we have a second?

17 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown.
18 I'll second.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
20 have a second. All in favor say aye.

21 Aye.

22 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Aye.

23 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Aye.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Still on...

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We're on --

1 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Was that enough for a
2 quorum?

3 DAG HARRIS: Yes.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Just for the record,
5 Board Member Cortez had stepped out of the room.
6 And so you're not going to vote?

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I'll abstain from
8 voting.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a quorum
10 that passes.

11 Unfortunately, you won't get your work
12 card at this time. Please come and apply in one
13 year. You have the documentation, or they do, and
14 they'll help you fill out your application.

15 Good luck to you, sir. Thank you.

16 MR. ELLIS: Thank you.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 103,
18 Angelo Hernandez.

19 MR. HERNANDEZ: Yes.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: And just to verify,
21 you have been sworn in?

22 MR. HERNANDEZ: Yes, I have.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
24 Swarthout, why are we here for Mr. Hernandez?

25 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was

1 denied for felony convictions. As you can see, he
2 had multiple convictions. All of his case -- when
3 he first came in and applied he presented the 1203.4
4 paperwork and disclosed them all on his application.
5 So he was not made provisional and he's been
6 forthright providing any court documents dealing
7 with his cases.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
9 questions for Mr. Hernandez?

10 Seeing there are no questions for
11 Mr. Hernandez, I'll entertain a motion.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
13 motioning to approve Mr. Hernandez's appeal for the
14 work card based on full disclosure and doing what we
15 asked.

16 MR. HERNANDEZ: Thank you, guys.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
18 we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
21 have a second. All in favor say aye.

22 (All present Board members voted aye.)

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Your work card will be
24 granted. The office will contact you for next
25 steps.

1 MR. HERNANDEZ: Thank you.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations.

3 We have about ten more agenda items. Does
4 anybody need a break? Everybody's good?

5 THE REPORTER: I need a short break, yeah.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we're going to take
7 a quick ten minutes. Be back here at 3:00 p.m.,
8 please. Thank you.

9 (Off record.)

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We'll go back through.
11 We have a couple of trailed items to close out
12 before we move to the next agenda items.

13 We have Agenda Item No. 85, 87, 95 -- that
14 was it, right?

15 So, do we have Mark Tilmon?

16 Robert Tapia? Or Karen Armour. Or Karen
17 Armour. Okay, all right.

18 So I will then take a motion concerning
19 those agenda items. They were told to come in at
20 1:00 p.m. and they have not shown. It is now 3:00
21 p.m.

22 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
23 motioning to uphold the denial based on no-call,
24 no-show, items agenda No. 85, 87, 95 -- and 95.
25 Sorry.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
2 we have a second?

3 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
5 have a second. All in favor say aye.

6 (All present Board members voted aye.)

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item 104,
8 Andrew Franklin.

9 THE REPORTER: Motion passes?

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes. I'm
11 sorry.

12 MR. FRANKLIN: Hello.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good afternoon,
14 Mr. Franklin.

15 MR. FRANKLIN: How you doing?

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Quick question. Have
17 you been sworn in, sir?

18 MR. FRANKLIN: No, I haven't.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Is there anybody else
20 in the audience that is just coming in and has not
21 been sworn in?

22

23 AUDIENCE MEMBERS,
24 having been duly sworn,
25 testified as follows:

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator

2 Swarthout, tell us why --

3 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Madam Chair, this is

4 Board Member Brown.

5 Just for the record, we have no more

6 audience members in the north.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

8 Investigator Swarthout, could you tell us

9 why we're here for Mr. Franklin?

10 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was

11 denied for the conviction of illegal use or

12 possession of a dangerous weapon.

13 2017 out of Louisiana. Illegal carry

14 concealed weapon, possession of drug paraphernalia,

15 marijuana possession 14 grams or less. Sentenced to

16 six months probation.

17 2018 out of Louisiana, disturbing the

18 peace, six months probation.

19 2010 out of Louisiana, theft of goods,

20 sentenced to six months probation. The applicant

21 did disclose all arrests and he was not made

22 provisional.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

24 Board, any questions for Mr. Franklin?

25 Hearing there's no questions, I'll

1 entertain a motion.

2 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: This is Bezick.

3 I move we grant the work card based on
4 full disclosure.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
6 motion. Do we have a second?

7 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown.
8 I'll second.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
10 have a second. All in favor say aye.

11 (All present Board members voted aye.)

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Congratulations, sir.
13 You will get your work card. The office
14 will contact you for next steps, okay?

15 MR. FRANKLIN: Okay.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Good luck
17 to you.

18 Agenda Item No. 105, Frank Cressey.

19 Good afternoon, sir.

20 MR. CRESSEY: Good afternoon.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
22 Swarthout, can you tell us why we're here for
23 Mr. Cressey?

24 Am I pronouncing that right?

25 MR. CRESSEY: Cressey, yes.

1 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
2 denied for the conviction of illegal possession of a
3 weapon.

4 2010 out of California, CCW in vehicle.
5 Carrying a loaded firearm in public place. He was
6 sentenced to 36 months' probation and ten days'
7 jail.

8 2012 out of Nevada, domestic battery.
9 That one was dismissed.

10 2004 out of California. Vandalism,
11 misdemeanor. Sentenced to 30 days' jail suspended,
12 36 months' probation, \$100 fine.

13 The applicant originally was made
14 provisional. The company that he was going to get
15 hired from that wasn't CSC did tell him that he did
16 not have to disclose because of how old it was.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
18 Cortez.

19 Investigator Swarthout, I'm a little
20 confused. So he did or he did not disclose?

21 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: He originally did
22 not disclose. Once we talked to him about it and he
23 provided text messages from the company that told
24 him he didn't have to disclose because they were so
25 old.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. Just because
2 the report indicates that, yes, everything was
3 disclosed. But, thank you for the clarification.

4 Mr. Cressey, is there a reason why you
5 failed to disclose prior to being told that you were
6 denied?

7 MR. CRESSEY: I went in to -- I went in
8 to --

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You have to push the
10 button.

11 MR. CRESSEY: I went in to fill out the
12 paperwork. It was random, you know, because they
13 pressing everybody doing private security. You got
14 to have a PILB card in order to do it. So I went to
15 the office to go fill the paperwork out. I got to
16 that portion. I asked the young lady, I have a gun
17 case, some stuff on my record. Do I need to put it
18 on here? She said, well, how old is it? I said,
19 well, it was back 2010, 2007, something like that.
20 And she said, well, you don't have to put it on
21 there. I said, are you sure? I asked her plenty of
22 times, was she sure. She said, you don't have to
23 put it on there. I do this all the time. Don't
24 have to worry about nothing. I said you sure? She
25 said yes.

1 I paid for the service and I went on about
2 my business. And then come March I got the
3 paperwork in the mail for the denial. And I took my
4 denial paperwork in to the office off Flamingo. And
5 then the lady told me, don't press us. Don't be
6 calling up here asking questions about your
7 paperwork. We going to get in touch with you. So I
8 said okay.

9 So comes April, I hear nothing, whether
10 I'm denied or approved or anything. So I call the
11 young lady again. I say, hey, I haven't heard
12 anything. They told me to wait. So she called the
13 office on Flamingo, and then they said that I didn't
14 even have any appeal paperwork in, right? So then I
15 called -- contacted them myself and told them what I
16 did.

17 I went in there, turned in the paperwork,
18 signed the paper saying I turned in the paperwork
19 with all my convictions, from tickets to whatever I
20 had. I put it all -- I gave it all to them. And I
21 was just waiting.

22 And I been e-mailing back and forth with
23 the office and telling me we going to have a
24 hearing, come to the hearing. I was, like, okay.
25 I'll show up. Told me to be here at 2:00. I got

1 here at 1:40.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Can I ask a couple
3 questions? Whose the "they"? Who's the company?

4 MR. CRESSEY: I don't know the exact name
5 of the company. The young lady named Abby. I
6 think.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You said it was on
8 Flamingo?

9 MR. CRESSEY: No, the PILB is on Flamingo.
10 The company's -- it's in North Las Vegas.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Is it Bulwerks? Is
12 the name of the company Bulwerks?

13 MR. CRESSEY: I think so. I think so.
14 I'm not all the way 100 percent sure. I think it's
15 Bulwerks. Texted my buddy just a minute ago just to
16 try to get the name.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The -- so the PILB is
18 on Durango. Is the company you were working for on
19 Flamingo?

20 MR. CRESSEY: No, no the P- -- no. The
21 company I worked for is the Money Team. So we were
22 in the -- what is that, the Wynn? And the security
23 approached us and was, like, where you all paperwork
24 and stuff like that? We was, like -- we was caught
25 off guard. So we looked into it. And he was, like,

1 you got to have a PILB card to do security out here
2 now.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Are you doing
4 executive protection?

5 MR. CRESSEY: Yes. Yes.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Got you. And the
7 company that you were doing the executive protection
8 for in Nevada, right? Are you out of a different
9 state?

10 MR. CRESSEY: No, I'm self-employed. I'm
11 my own company.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. This just got
13 super messy. Who's on Flamingo?

14 MR. CRESSEY: Can I look at my phone?

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Yeah, yeah, that's
16 fine.

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
18 Cortez.

19 Investigator Swarthout, I just want to
20 make sure that you do have documentation which there
21 is somebody admitting that, yes, we told him, no,
22 you don't need to put any of your criminal history
23 because of the time? Hang on one second.

24 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yes, it was -- I
25 believe her name -- it's Abby. I want to say her

1 last name is Martinez. The company used to be
2 called Bulwerks. It's now called Battle Born
3 Security Services.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I do recall them.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I do, too.

6 So there's a couple of different --
7 there's a couple of different things, though.

8 Because you're saying your self-employed.

9 MR. CRESSEY: Yes.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Why were you going
11 through Battle Born?

12 MR. CRESSEY: To get the PILB card.
13 Trying to obtain a PILB card. Because I was told
14 that I can't do security in Las Vegas and Nevada
15 unless you have a sheriff's card or a PILB card.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Are you from a
17 different state?

18 MR. CRESSEY: I've been in Nevada since
19 2001.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

21 MR. CRESSEY: Yeah.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, the guard card,
23 the work card, does not allow you to work --

24 MR. CRESSEY: Privately.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Privately. You have

1 to work for another company. Unless you become a
2 company and go through, like --

3 MR. CRESSEY: LLC and everything. I'm --

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You still have to get
5 a different license.

6 MR. CRESSEY: Different license.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: To work as a security
8 company.

9 MR. CRESSEY: Okay.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay? So, you were
11 trying to get your -- just your regular work card
12 thinking that that would work for you for your --
13 for a company.

14 MR. CRESSEY: Yeah.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Your company. We have
16 two different situations.

17 Battle Born. Do we know any history on
18 Battle Born?

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
20 Cortez.

21 Yes, Madam Chair, we do have history with
22 Battle Born. As previously indicated, they were
23 call Bulwerks. And I believe they were on our
24 agenda late last year, mid last year, whatnot. And
25 it was either unlicensed activity or individuals on

1 the roster that weren't licensed, or just --

2 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Investigator
3 Swarthout.

4 Yes, we do. Mr. Whitfield had been denied
5 a changed name a couple years ago. Last year it had
6 been approved because he finally had time and
7 distance from his other citations. He's -- they --
8 before they got licensed they had unlicensed
9 activity. And I want to say probably about six or
10 seven violations after they got licensed, including
11 one audit.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Is he the gentleman,
13 if I'm -- my senior moment just passed. He was the
14 gentleman that was asking for a name change because
15 he had so much bad history.

16 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yes. And if I
17 remember correctly, at one board meeting he kept
18 blaming his business partners for all the
19 violations.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Right. So now he's
21 running Battle Born, and apparently up to the
22 same -- hopefully you can spell this -- shenanigans.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is the Board
24 Member Cortez.

25 I just want to have one more question for

1 Mr. Cressey. And I just want to confirm.

2 Did you indicate that you had assistance
3 from people from the Battle Born?

4 MR. CRESSEY: Yes.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And they indicated
6 to you that you didn't need to worry about your
7 criminal history?

8 MR. CRESSEY: Yes.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: As you heard, they
10 are very well aware of the PILB. They have full
11 understanding what the application requires.

12 MR. CRESSEY: Basically --

13 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: And they told you --

14 THE REPORTER: Excuse me.

15 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You don't need to --
16 okay. just wanted to make sure. Thank you.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have that
18 documentation?

19 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: Yes. He did send
20 a text message with them. Showing that.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, I'm sort of at a
22 loss.

23 Any further questions from the Board?

24 Hearing there are no further questions,
25 I'll entertain a motion.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez,
2 motioning to approve the appeal.

3 Reason being is that we have actual,
4 written documentation that Mr. Cressey was wrongly
5 informed in not providing his criminal history when,
6 in fact, he was willing to do such. But because we
7 have the actual, physical writing, I'm okay moving
8 forward motioning to approve the appeal.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
10 we have a second?

11 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. I
13 have a second. All in favor say aye.

14 (All present Board members voted aye.)

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We're going to pass.

16 But I want to make sure that you're
17 crystal clear on the fact that you have to work for
18 a company, hopefully not Battle Born.

19 MR. CRESSEY: Definitely not.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: And -- but you have to
21 work for a company. You cannot do this on your own.

22 When you're ready to set up your company
23 through the PILB, get with these folks here.

24 They'll help you do that, and then that way you
25 won't be another Battle Born, okay?

1 MR. CRESSEY: Yeah.

2 DAG HARRIS: Madam Chair, if I can.

3 Just -- I will caution that if you do want
4 to work with Battle Born, that is your choice. The
5 Board is not telling you to or to not work with
6 anyone. I just wanted clarification for that.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I said hopefully.

8 DAG HARRIS: Freely your choice if you
9 want to work with them.

10 MR. CRESSEY: I've been working with
11 (indiscernible).

12 THE REPORTER: With who? You were working
13 with who? Sir? You were working with who?

14 MR. CRESSEY: Mayweather Promotions.

15 DAG HARRIS: We just wanted to clarify
16 that.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: She's keeping me out
18 of hot water. Thank you. Congratulations. The
19 Board will help you -- or the office will help you
20 with next steps.

21 MR. CRESSEY: Thank you. You all have a
22 good day.

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. You, too.
24 Thank you for keeping me out of hot water.

25 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Great looking out.

1 Agenda Item No. 106, Donta Gatewood.

2 Good afternoon, sir.

3 MR. GATEWOOD: Top of the day.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You've been sworn in?

5 MR. GATEWOOD: Yes.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

7 Investigator Swarthout, why are we here
8 for Mr. Gatewood?

9 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
10 denied for the conviction of illegal use, possession
11 of a dangerous weapon or failure to disclose.

12 The applicant was working for a company.
13 One thing that we do need to note is the applicant
14 was made provisional on January 8th, 2024.
15 January 28th, 2024 out of Nevada, carry concealed
16 weapon without a permit. Sentenced to 120 days
17 jail, suspended. Six months probation. This case
18 is currently ongoing.

19 2006 out of Nevada, DUI. Sentenced to DUI
20 school, victim impact panel.

21 1997 out of California. Inflict corporal
22 injury, spouse/cohabitant. That one was dismissed.

23 1995 out of California. Force, assault
24 with a deadly weapon, not a firearm, and a DUI. The
25 first count was dismissed. Second count he was

1 found guilty of the DUI. 40 days' jail, 60 months
2 probation and a fine.

3 And then he had a probation violation,
4 which then resulted in it being modified, and he was
5 sentenced to 100 days in jail.

6 The applicant currently, SCOPE, as of
7 yesterday, as I look, he does not have a valid CCW.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So that I'm
9 clear. You applied -- he applied in December of
10 2022. January of 2024 had an incident with law and
11 it's still ongoing. But then further, didn't
12 disclose any of his arrest history.

13 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: That is correct.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
15 there any questions for Mr. Gatewood?

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Good afternoon,
17 Mr. Gatewood.

18 MR. GATEWOOD: Hi. How you doing?

19 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Good. Thank you.

20 Why did we fail to disclose our criminal
21 history?

22 MR. GATEWOOD: At the time when I filled
23 out the application thing, it was so long ago. They
24 told me that it didn't matter and it was in
25 California.

1 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: What was so long
2 ago?

3 MR. GATEWOOD: The -- my last arrest was
4 2000- -- well, out here -- well, they said it was a
5 misdemeanor. And they said if I had a misdemeanor I
6 didn't have to report it.

7 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay, thank you.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Sir, it looks like
9 here you filled out a paper application.

10 MR. GATEWOOD: I did, yes.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So did you
12 see -- did you read through the paper application?

13 MR. GATEWOOD: It was so long ago. I want
14 to say yes.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So you know we
16 have a visual --

17 MR. GATEWOOD: The stop sign. I been
18 watching, I've been paying attention. Yes, yes.

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you for that.
20 Save us the trouble of going through the speech.

21 MR. GATEWOOD: Yes.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
23 for the Board?

24 MR. GATEWOOD: My thing was, I thought it
25 was a misdemeanor. So, like I said, didn't have to

1 disclose. So everything -- everything that happened
2 in the past was all misdemeanors. They said that
3 they wasn't worried about misdemeanors.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Well, on the
5 paper, they are wrong.

6 Any further questions from the Board?

7 Hearing there's no further questions, I'll
8 entertain a motion.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
10 motioning to uphold the denial based on failure to
11 disclose criminal history.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Have a motion.
13 Do we have a second?

14 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown.
15 I'll second.

16 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion,
17 we have a second. All in favor say aye.

18 (All present Board members voted aye.)

19 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, unfortunately at
20 this time you will not get your work card. You do
21 have an opportunity to come back in one year.

22 MR. GATEWOOD: A whole year?

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: In a whole year. It
24 will fly by like that.

25 MR. GATEWOOD: No, it won't.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: You'll have that
2 opportunity in one year to come back, and you have
3 your application and it has all your criminal
4 history so you'll be able to note that. And then
5 you want to make sure your current one is closed
6 before we can look at it, okay?

7 MR. GATEWOOD: Appreciate you all.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. Have a
9 great day.

10 MR. GATEWOOD: Have a wonderful day.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Next Agenda Item is
12 No. 107, Clifford Johnson.

13 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Postponed.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item 107 has
15 been postponed.

16 Agenda Item No. 108, Cesar Puga. We'll
17 trail.

18 Agenda Item No. 109, Marla Davis.

19 Good afternoon.

20 MS. DAVIS: Hello.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
22 Swarthout, could you please tell us why we're here
23 for Ms. Davis?

24 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
25 denied for a felony conviction and for failure to

1 disclose arrest history.

2 2018, out of Colorado, flight, escape,
3 felony conviction. Sentenced to 18 months that was
4 suspended. She was arrested for contempt of court
5 in the case and probation violations.

6 2018, also out of Colorado, vehicle theft.
7 That one was dismissed.

8 2017, out of Colorado, solicit for
9 prostitution. She was sentenced to 365 days jail
10 suspended, 12 months probation.

11 2017, out of Colorado, dangerous drugs,
12 controlled substance. Sentenced to 180 days jail.

13 2017, out of Colorado, one count
14 trespassing; second count was drug paraphernalia and
15 possession. Was found guilty. The fingerprints
16 didn't show the sentence.

17 The applicant was made provisional. Based
18 off of that, there is an attached Excel with other
19 arrest history. Her fingerprints had a total of 65
20 cycles.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
22 there any questions for Ms. Davis?

23 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
24 Brown.

25 Ms. Davis, why did you fail to disclose

1 all of these arrests?

2 MS. DAVIS: When I actually filled out the
3 application, I -- when I seen the felony check --
4 the check box, I noticed that it said, like, sexual
5 harassment and, like, violent charge or something
6 like that. And so that's kind of, like, what I was
7 thinking that it was looking for. Since it was,
8 like, a private investigator position. And that's
9 basically why I didn't check the box. Because
10 that's why I actually -- when I got denied, I sent
11 over my history, because that has been an issue in
12 my past when I would get, like, you know, apply for
13 a job or something like that. I wasn't able to give
14 every single detail and date of the charges because
15 my past was so extensive. So I decided to go ahead
16 and get my criminal background. I paid for the
17 criminal background to be able to, you know, pass
18 that along to, you know, a situation like this.
19 That way I wouldn't be leaving anything out. So
20 that was basically the reason.

21 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
23 questions?

24 Hearing there are no further questions,
25 I'll entertain a motion.

1 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: I move to uphold the
2 denial based on nondisclosure of criminal history.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
4 motion. Do we have a second?

5 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown
6 will second.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
8 have a second. All in favor say aye.

9 (All present Board members voted aye.)

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we are going to
11 deny at this time, but you do have your history now.
12 And, also, the office will help you when you're
13 ready to submit again.

14 MS. DAVIS: All right.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Come back in one year.

16 MS. DAVIS: Thank you.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Look forward to seeing
18 you.

19 MS. DAVIS: Thank you.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Agenda Item No. 110,
21 Ocean Brown.

22 Good afternoon.

23 MR. BROWN: Good afternoon.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
25 Swarthout, could you tell us why we're here for

1 Mr. Brown?

2 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was
3 denied for a felony conviction. 2013 out of Nevada,
4 possession of credit or debit card without
5 cardholder's consent. He was sentenced to 12 to 36
6 months NDOC and five years' probation.

7 The applicant was arrested in February of
8 2017, March of 2017 for probation violations.
9 Probation was revoked in April 2017. He spent about
10 one year in prison and then he was paroled in August
11 of 2018.

12 The applicant did disclose his arrests on
13 his app.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are
15 there any questions for Mr. Brown?

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
17 Cortez.

18 Mr. Brown, are you on probation or parole
19 right now, any supervision?

20 MR. BROWN: No, ma'am.

21 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: No current
22 supervision? Okay. No further questions.

23 MR. BROWN: I turned myself in. I came
24 from California, turned myself in because I was
25 denied interstate compact. I couldn't get a job and

1 then a lot of -- a month and a half. They denied
2 me. I came and turned myself in.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Good job. That
4 chapter is closed. You no longer have to look
5 behind your back. That was a good move.

6 MR. BROWN: Thank you.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, any further
8 questions?

9 Okay, hearing no further questions I'll
10 entertain a motion.

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
12 motioning to grant Mr. Brown's appeal for the
13 registration card based on full disclosure.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So we have a
15 motion. Do we have a second?

16 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown,
17 I'll second.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
19 have a second. All in favor say aye.

20 (All present Board members voted aye.)

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, motion passes.
22 You do get your work card. The office will contact
23 you for next steps, okay?

24 MR. BROWN: All right. Thank you, guys.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you.

1 Thank you.

2 Agenda Item No. 111, Carolyn Davis.

3 Agenda Item No. 112, Tracy Lagrande.

4 MR. LAGRANDE: Lagrande. Good afternoon.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good afternoon.

6 Board up north, you have paperwork,

7 additional paperwork for this one?

8 MR. LAGRANDE: Have what?

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: No, sir. Hang on.

10 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Yes, ma'am, we do.

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Perfect.

12 Investigator Swarthout, could you please

13 tell us why we're here for Mr. Lagrande?

14 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: The applicant was

15 denied for felony conviction and for failure to

16 disclose arrest history.

17 2000 out of Michigan, aggravated stalking.

18 60 days jail and a fine of \$750.

19 1992 out of Michigan, controlled

20 substance, possession, cocaine, heroin, or other

21 narcotic less than 25 grams. Sentenced to 180 days

22 jail, fine of 830 -- \$830 and 36 months' probation.

23 1996 out of Michigan, misdemeanor

24 controlled substance, imitation, manufacture, or

25 distribute. Sentenced to one year probation.

1 1997 out of Michigan, misdemeanor larceny.
2 Had to pay a fine of \$100.

3 The applicant was made provisional and was
4 working for two companies at the time that we got
5 the fingerprint results back.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
7 questions for Mr. Lagrande?

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Good afternoon,
9 Mr. Lagrande.

10 This is Board Member Cortez.

11 Sir, is there a reason why you failed to
12 disclose any of your criminal history?

13 MR. LAGRANDE: I disclosed all of my
14 criminal history which I brought with me today. I
15 left one with Allied Universal with the guy.
16 Because when it came to that part where it says
17 stop, I had this with me. And I asked him if he
18 wanted me to put this all in there. He told me no,
19 just give it to him and he would attach this to my
20 application. He would send it to the PILB. As far
21 as my knowledge is concerned, Brandon sent all this.

22 When it came down to -- I don't know, what
23 was I doing? Like, I had to come to the PILB, I
24 guess to reapply or whatever, and I left this with
25 the young lady, also on Durango. I left the same

1 copies with her.

2 So I have not failed to disclose anything.
3 I brought everything with me. I worked -- I'm out
4 of Hawaii. I worked three years over there doing
5 the same thing and I had this problem. So I knew to
6 bring all of this with me so that I wouldn't go
7 through this again.

8 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. So quick
9 question. I know you brought your paperwork, but
10 I'm seeing that you did the application online. Did
11 you put the information online?

12 MR. LAGRANDE: My sister did the
13 application for me online. I was still in Hawaii
14 when she did it. And I was getting calls from
15 Allied, which I didn't come until '24.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Hang on. You just
17 said something. She did it. When you say when she
18 did it, are you saying that somebody else filled out
19 the application?

20 MR. LAGRANDE: Yes. My sister filled it
21 out for me.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Your sister did?

23 MR. LAGRANDE: Yes, ma'am.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Thank you, so much.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions

1 from the Board?

2 Hearing there are no further questions,
3 I'll entertain a motion.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
5 Cortez motioning to uphold the denial based on the
6 no disclosure of the criminal history on the
7 application.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, we have a motion.
9 Do we have a second?

10 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown
11 will second.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
13 have a second. All in favor say aye.

14 (All present Board members voted aye.)

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, unfortunately,
16 your application wasn't filled out properly.

17 MR. LAGRANDE: Okay.

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, it was not on the
19 application that you had those felonies. Which is
20 unfortunate, because you do have the paperwork and
21 you're ready to disclose it, right? You do have an
22 opportunity to come back and see us in one year, and
23 then you can make sure that all that stuff is
24 documented on your actual application.

25 MR. LAGRANDE: Okay.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Look forward to
2 seeing you in one year.

3 MR. LAGRANDE: Thank you.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you, sir.
5 Agenda Item No. 113. Is Mr. Flowers here?

6 MR. FLOWERS: Yes.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
8 Swarthout -- Blackmore. Could you please tell us
9 why we're here?

10 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Yes. So, some
11 back story.

12 So Mr. Flowers has had a registered work
13 card with the agency since February 25th of 2019.
14 He did start the renewal process on February 5th.
15 There was an incident where the applicant did have a
16 provisional issued, and there was a working incident
17 that occurred on March 31st.

18 The incidents that occurred resulted in
19 him being on duty at the time at his job, and got
20 into a physical altercation with a customer. And
21 that resulted in a police report and a restraining
22 order being filed. Due to this behavior, we did go
23 ahead and revoke his provisional from him and he's
24 here to appeal that today.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, are

1 there any questions for Mr. Flowers?

2 Sir, hang on one second. It's for the
3 Board. They're going to ask you questions.

4 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
5 Cortez.

6 I just want to confirm, Mr. Flowers, are
7 you from Nevada?

8 MR. FLOWERS: No.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Okay. No further
10 questions, as far as that goes.

11 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board Member Brown
12 for Investigator Blackmore.

13 I wonder, in your report it says police
14 report was filed with Metro. Does that report
15 confirm the information that we have in your report?
16 As to how the incident went down.

17 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Correct. So
18 there was a domestic relationship between him and
19 another coworker at that time. That coworker was at
20 the same spot where he was on duty at the time with
21 some friends. There was an incident to where he
22 approached his coworker and the friends, and then
23 the physical altercation occurred. To the point
24 where Circa security themselves had to get involved
25 and then Metro was soon involved as well.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So that I'm
2 understanding, was he on duty at the time, or was
3 she on duty at the time?

4 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Correct. He was
5 on duty.

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
7 Cortez.

8 Mr. Flowers, tell us what happened.

9 MR. FLOWERS: You want to know as far as
10 what happened in the incident?

11 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: I want to know in
12 your words what happened.

13 MR. FLOWERS: My actions --

14 THE REPORTER: Can you slow down a little
15 bit?

16 MR. FLOWERS: My actions did get the best
17 of me. I did approach -- I did approach her at the
18 time, because I wanted to get some stuff from her
19 that I originally did not receive. And once they --
20 once the altercation happened, they already had me
21 in handcuffs. No charges or anything at that time,
22 wasn't -- because I didn't get -- didn't get
23 arrested or anything at that moment.

24 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do you believe that
25 you were aggressive towards people there?

1 MR. FLOWERS: Yes, I agree.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do you believe that
3 your behavior while on duty was unprofessional?

4 MR. FLOWERS: Yes, it was unprofessional.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Quick question.

6 Were there charges filed with the police
7 department? Are you currently in an active case
8 over this?

9 MR. FLOWERS: No.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So there was no
11 charges?

12 MR. FLOWERS: It was -- the only thing
13 was, she did file the TPO, which -- that was months
14 after the incident happened.

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay.

16 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do you happen to
17 know when that TPO expires?

18 MR. FLOWERS: Yes. That expired at the
19 end of May.

20 INVESTIGATOR BLACKMORE: Investigator
21 Blackmore, for the record.

22 Yeah. So there was a Temporary
23 Restraining Order that was filed. It was issued on
24 4-11 of 2024, and is set to expire on May 26th of
25 this year. I have no updates regarding if they

1 extended that order or any further action was
2 pursued.

3 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: What was your last
4 interaction with the victim, Mr. Flowers?

5 MR. FLOWERS: That was it. I just...

6 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is an
7 ex-girlfriend, correct?

8 MR. FLOWERS: Yes.

9 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Are you still in a
10 relationship with them?

11 MR. FLOWERS: No.

12 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Last interaction?

13 MR. FLOWERS: The last -- like, what you
14 mean?

15 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Last time you saw her.

16 MR. FLOWERS: Since -- well, since the
17 incident that occurred at the Circa?

18 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Are you -- were you an
19 armed officer?

20 MR. FLOWERS: I was unarmed.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Unarmed.

22 Board, are there any further questions?

23 With no further questions, I'll entertain
24 a motion.

25 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member

1 Brown.

2 I move that we uphold the revocation of
3 Amir Flowers' registration due to on duty actions
4 and time and distance.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
6 we have a second?

7 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

8 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. We have a
9 motion, we have a second. All in favor say aye.

10 (All present Board members voted aye.)

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, motion passes.

12 Counsel, what would be his next step?
13 Because this is -- his revocation is upheld. But
14 does this mean -- I probably should ask for how
15 long? When can he reapply?

16 DAG HARRIS: I would have to double --
17 hang on one second. Quick indulgence.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: While we're waiting,
19 this is Board Member Cortez.

20 Mr. Flowers, have you ever attended any
21 kind of anger management classes?

22 MR. FLOWERS: No. And I don't want to.
23 I'm fine. If you guys got to do -- I'll retire
24 after this.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: What we're trying to

1 do right now is find out when you can reapply for
2 your guard card. So just -- if you could hang out
3 for one second, we'll figure some stuff out here.

4 DAG HARRIS: Okay. So regulatory
5 authority on point here. Okay. So pursuant to NAC
6 648.3447, Subsection (1), provides that an applicant
7 whose registration has been denied, suspended, or
8 revoked by the Board may not reapply for
9 registration earlier than one year after the date of
10 the final decision of the Board to deny, suspend, or
11 revoke. So it would be approximately one year.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. So, you can
13 come back in one year and reapply. Again, you just
14 make sure you note all of this information. It's
15 unfortunate that you let the -- your emotions get
16 the best of you, but that's the next steps, okay?

17 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Don't give up,
18 Mr. Flowers. This is just --

19 MR. FLOWERS: Understand, this -- I did
20 this when I was back in 2022. That's part of my
21 emotions there as well. Ain't got nobody. It's
22 just me now. I understand.

23 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: You'll have us here
24 next year. So you have a year. Don't give up.

25 MR. FLOWERS: All right.

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you, sir.
2 Agenda Item No. 114, Candice Sims.
3 Good afternoon.

4 MS. SIMS: Afternoon.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
6 Swarthout, can you tell us why we're here for
7 Ms. Sims?

8 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: So, the
9 applicant's card was revoked after it was -- after
10 we were notified by her employer that she had stolen
11 a firearm from an antique gun show in January. On
12 her resignation letter to the company, she wrote --
13 her reason was, I stole from the Westgate Convention
14 Show. And we do have the police report which does
15 confirm. They had watched her on camera and that,
16 rummaging through the location where the firearm
17 was. And when she was detained by officers and
18 asked why she had taken the firearm, she had said,
19 "It looked pretty."

20 If you guys need more details on the
21 firearm, the firearm was valued at about \$85,000.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Okay. Board, any
23 questions?

24 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
25 Brown for Investigator Swarthout.

1 It indicates in your report that the
2 charge was denied by the DA. Do you have any
3 information as to why the DA denied the charge?

4 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: No. My only
5 thought is, when the officers went and detained her
6 for the theft and that, she told them exactly where
7 the gun was and it was recovered. That's my only
8 thought why the DA dropped the charges.

9 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any further questions
11 from the Board?

12 Hearing there are no further questions,
13 I'll entertain a motion.

14 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: This is Board Member
15 Cortez upholding -- motioning to uphold the
16 revocation based on the details of the incident.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
18 we have a second?

19 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
21 have a second. All in favor say aye.

22 (All present Board members voted aye.)

23 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So, unfortunately at
24 this time we're going to uphold your revocation.
25 You have an opportunity to apply again in one year.

1 Please make sure you note all of your situations.

2 MS. SIMS: All right.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Good luck to you.

4 MS. SIMS: Thank you.

5 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Do we have images of
6 that \$85,000 weapon?

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The next -- or the
8 next agenda item is Agenda Item No. 115, David
9 Alvarez-Sanchez.

10 Good afternoon, sir.

11 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: Good afternoon.

12 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Investigator
13 Swarthout, could you please tell us why we're here
14 for Mr. Alvarez-Sanchez?

15 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: We are here
16 because in January there was an incident involving
17 Mr. Alvarez and Nye County Sheriff's Department.

18 He was pulled over. And when asked
19 multiple times to stop reaching for stuff, did not
20 want to comply with orders. When asked to get out
21 of the vehicle he did not want to respond to orders
22 to get out of the vehicle. And once he was out in
23 front of the other squad car's vehicle, he still
24 wanted to be argumentative with the law enforcement
25 officers. So much so that they took him into

1 custody.

2 We do have body cam footage. They're
3 waiting on trying to find somebody to get it to play
4 in here.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Board, are there any
6 questions for Mr. Alvarez-Sanchez?

7 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
8 Brown.

9 First, a question for Investigator
10 Swarthout. It says in the report that he was a
11 felon and had a firearm in the car. Have we
12 confirmed that he's a convicted felon?

13 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: I have no
14 confirmation. That was in the police report that he
15 supposedly was telling the officers that he was a
16 felon and there was a firearm in the car.

17 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Thank you.

18 Questions for Mr. Alvarez-Sanchez. Can
19 you tell us what happened in your words?

20 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: Yes. I got pulled
21 over right after I got off work. I was complying
22 with the officer. He asked me to hand him my
23 driver's license, which I did. He wanted -- as soon
24 as I handed him, tried to get my driver's license
25 out of my pocket he freaked out and had his hand on

1 his weapon. He kept saying, "What are you reaching
2 for?" And I told him, "I'm just reaching for what
3 you asked."

4 Of course, I was freaked out because he
5 was already -- he was already escalating the
6 situation. He asked me -- he kept asking me what
7 I'm reaching for. Kept ask -- tell -- answering.
8 And then he pulled his weapon out on me, pointed it
9 at my head and said, "Do you want to get shot
10 today?" And I was, like, not really.

11 Of course, my language wasn't as calm as
12 it is right now. I did call him stupid multiple
13 times. Because he pulled a weapon on me for no
14 reason. I was not -- I wasn't being aggressive, I
15 wasn't being combative. I was following orders he
16 was telling me.

17 There's not much else to say. But the
18 officer escalated the situation to where it wasn't
19 supposed to be escalated.

20 On the body cam footage, while I was
21 already in custody, you can hear the officer say to
22 the dispatcher officer that was right in front of
23 me, "I did profile him." Which then the dispatcher
24 tells -- and looks at me. So, yes, there is body
25 cam footage from everything saying -- even looked at

1 him saying that he profiled me. That's why he
2 pulled me over.

3 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Sir, I'm
4 misunderstanding, I think, what you said. When he
5 told the other officer, what did he actually say?
6 He pulled a file on you?

7 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: A firearm. He
8 pulled a firearm on me way before, you know, he
9 could actually, you know, give me a chance to do
10 anything.

11 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: If Investigator
12 Swarthout is able -- video, or somebody is able to
13 get this video to upload for us, are we going to
14 see -- it looks like we might be able to see it
15 right here.

16 Go ahead.

17 (Video playing.)

18 INVESTIGATOR SWARTHOUT: I think the first
19 couple seconds don't have audio on it.

20 (Video still playing.)

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I don't know if the
22 Board has any questions, but I will make a statement
23 to you, sir.

24 I've been pulled over and asked the same
25 questions. And I immediately turned because my

1 purse is in the backseat. Turned around. The
2 individual asked me the same question, "What are you
3 reaching for?" And I said, "My purse is in the
4 backseat. I'm reaching for my license." He said to
5 me, very clearly, "That makes us really nervous
6 because we don't know what you're doing." Right?
7 And I said, "Oh, I'm very sorry." I put my hands
8 back on the steering wheel and I said, "Tell me what
9 you want me to do next."

10 I'm obviously very Latina looking as well.
11 I didn't do what you did, and I drove away that day
12 without incident, without being pulled out, without
13 being held at gunpoint, without being -- any of the
14 stuff that you just went through.

15 So I think the gentleman asked you a very
16 valid question, because they have an opportunity --
17 and I'm not law enforcement. Some of these folks
18 have served in law enforcement, right? But they
19 have two seconds to make a decision. You took your
20 two seconds and turned it south.

21 That's my statement.

22 Board, are there any more questions for
23 Mr. Alvarez-Sanchez?

24 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Yes. This is Board
25 Member Brown.

1 Mr. Alvarez-Sanchez, you are currently --
2 well, with the exception of revocation, you're
3 currently a security professional, are you not?

4 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: Yes.

5 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Okay. How would you
6 react if somebody you were giving commands to
7 reacted the way that you did?

8 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: Well, depends on the
9 attitude.

10 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: With your attitude
11 that you just had.

12 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Based on the --

13 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: I wouldn't have
14 escalated it that quick. I would have not escalated
15 that quick. And I've been in situations where I've
16 been an armed guard where I -- where people have
17 given me attitude, and I don't escalate it that
18 quick.

19 I'm -- right now, I'm -- as we speak, I'm
20 applying for NDOC. So I'm going through the process
21 of being part of that, you know, community. So I
22 came from a correctional facility. I was doing
23 corrections, dealing with people. That put me in
24 worse places than -- like that. I didn't give them
25 attitude like he did. I didn't ask --

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The attitude started
2 with you. He asked you a question. And instead of
3 just answering the question, and saying I'm reaching
4 for my wallet like you asked. You said a whole
5 bunch of other stuff, right?

6 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: Correct.

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Had you simply just
8 answered the question, would it have continued to
9 escalate?

10 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: Yes. Because --

11 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The answer is no.

12 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: Yes, ma'am, it would
13 have --

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The answer is no. He
15 even said, when he pulled you over, he -- when he
16 had the gentleman handcuff you, he asked him to
17 check for your wallet in the back. And -- your
18 back. He said check for his wallet. Because he
19 just wanted to know what you were reaching for, and
20 then he wanted to validate it.

21 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: Correct.

22 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Like I said, I had the
23 same situation happen to me. They asked --

24 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: But you heard what
25 he said. I saw all the tattoos --

1 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: At the end, sir. At
2 the end --

3 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: No.

4 THE REPORTER: Excuse me.

5 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: He --

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: This is Board Member
7 Cortez. Hang on one second, sir.

8 This is what I saw. What a great video
9 for training purposes, and this is why. You, sir,
10 escalated it. And this is why and when.

11 The minute he asked you for something and
12 you didn't like how he was asking you, your ego
13 kicked in. Your ego kicked in, you're, like, "Damn
14 ese."

15 As a Latina, I'm not impressed with either
16 one of you. What a poor representation of our
17 culture. Because I know for a fact that your -- our
18 mothers raised us to have respect for anyone with a
19 level of authority. And whether you liked his
20 attitude or not, whether he was white, black, or
21 brown, whether he was an ex-homie from the gang, he
22 obtained a position of authority. One in which you,
23 too, carry when you're on duty.

24 I have also been in situations where
25 people mouth off at me and call me all kinds of

1 names. It is my level of professionalism to return
2 appropriately. You, sir, escalated it. With all of
3 that mouthing that you did.

4 Hang on one second. Let me finish. I'm
5 truly happy to see you here today. This could have
6 gone left. And my concern is that I'm not sure you
7 see that. Because your ego is still in the way.

8 I absolutely heard you, what -- heard you
9 and what he said. Dude, I'm looking at his tats.
10 He's talking to me like this.

11 If you already know that there is a chance
12 of you getting profiled, then why don't you just be
13 quiet and follow the instructions. Do we like it?
14 Absolutely not. Do our egos want to shut people
15 down and tell them exactly where to go? All day
16 long. But unfortunately, you are in a position to
17 have to shut your mouth and do exactly as you're
18 told, whether you like it or not.

19 Now you said, sir, I'm going to sue you.
20 I'm going to sue you. That's your chance to mouth
21 off. But at that moment, not only did you put your
22 safety in jeopardy, but now your livelihood. You
23 might lose a job, because what? Because your ego
24 got involved because somebody else came at you not
25 in a way that you would have.

1 A lot of people are going to come at us in
2 ways that we don't like. It's how we react to that
3 that's going to make a world of difference. You
4 would not be here today if your ego didn't get in
5 the way. And I'm sorry, but unfortunately I've seen
6 it time and time again. It's our ego that gets in
7 the way. We want to be right. We don't like how
8 people talk to us. But unfortunately, he was in a
9 position to talk however he wanted to talk.

10 Is it rude? Maybe. But that's not
11 illegal. It's not illegal to be rude. It's not
12 even illegal to be an ass. But in your situation,
13 you needed to just be quiet and be respectful. The
14 minute you told him, "Damn ese," bro, you just went
15 right out the door with respect. That's rude.

16 And I guarantee you, you would not
17 appreciate it -- let's just say you were supervising
18 me and I told you, "Damn, homie, what's up? Check
19 yourself." That's rude. I need to have respect for
20 you. And what that gentleman was doing on duty was
21 asking for some respect. He was doing his job.
22 Whether you liked it or not. And I'm just not
23 impressed. I don't like what I saw.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Also a quick question.
25 Did -- in the impound of that vehicle, did they find

1 a weapon?

2 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: Yes.

3 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Where was that weapon?

4 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: It was behind the
5 seat.

6 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So it was behind the
7 seat that you were reaching.

8 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: No, I wasn't
9 reaching in the seat. I was reaching in my pocket.

10 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: In the video, did
11 you see him come right next to you? He cannot see
12 anything to your right, behind you, next to you,
13 underneath you. You're a very -- you're a smart
14 guy. I'm not going to sit here and think that you
15 don't understand where this is going.

16 When he approaches your vehicle, he has,
17 A, no clue whether you are under the influence,
18 mentally unstable, or if there are actual loaded
19 weapons, or if you have a vendetta to go kill the
20 next officer coming to pull you over. They don't
21 know that. They, too, have a family and they want
22 to go home. You escalated it. You know how fearful
23 that cop was? It is not easy to pull a trigger and
24 kill someone. You placed him in that position --

25 MR. ALVAREZ-SANCHEZ: If you're that

1 scared to be a cop, then you shouldn't be a cop.

2 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Congratulations with
3 that.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Any other questions
5 for the Board?

6 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
7 Brown. I was going to say my piece, but after his
8 last comment, I think we should just move on.

9 DAG HARRIS: Madam Chair, if I may?

10 DAG Harris, for the record.

11 So, I just wanted to just -- because it's
12 we know the grounds for the arrest, but I just
13 wanted to clarify with just our -- as existing
14 authorities. For the motion, depending on how the
15 Board votes, you could decide to overturn the
16 revocation as one option. Any -- in the event that
17 the Board is inclined to uphold the revocation, just
18 for purposes of the record because it was quite
19 distinguishable from the last one, to at least
20 clarify the reasons for it.

21 The only two that I would see would be
22 applicable again, that is if the Board is inclined
23 to uphold the revocation. The first being pursuant
24 to NRS -- this is just me stating that on the
25 record, that it would be pursuant to NRS 648.156.

1 Any act that would subject a licensee for possible
2 revocation. Those same acts are also grounds for
3 revoking a registered work card.

4 So in this case, whether -- if the Board
5 should find either unprofessional conduct under NRS
6 648.150, Subsection (4), that could apply if that's
7 the Board's findings.

8 The second part -- or the second option,
9 as far as authorities that appear applicable, if the
10 Board finds today, based on everything that is
11 reviewed and based on everything that it's heard, if
12 the registered work card holder failed to disclose
13 any fact or misstated or otherwise misled the Board.
14 And that could be based on any communications from
15 him to Board staff or any communications made to
16 him -- made from him during today's hearing.

17 So, again, the Board has options to
18 determine whether or not it wants to revoke the work
19 card. I'm just explaining the options. But if the
20 Board is inclined to find a revocation, just to
21 clarify on the record the reason for the revocation
22 and to be mindful of the two areas that would appear
23 applicable during today's hearing.

24 That was all.

25 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you, Counsel

1 Harris.

2 Are there any further Board questions?

3 Hearing no further questions, I'll

4 entertain a motion.

5 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: This is Board Member
6 Brown.

7 I'm going to give this a shot based on
8 what DAG Harris just said. But, I move that we
9 uphold the revocation of David Alvarez-Sanchez's
10 registered work card for unprofessional, off-duty
11 conduct, misrepresenting his actions to the Board as
12 confirmed based on the body camera footage, and in
13 accordance with NRS 648.156.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion. Do
15 we have a second?

16 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

17 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have a motion, we
18 have a second. All in favor say aye.

19 (All present Board members voted aye.)

20 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Motion passes. Your
21 guard card is revoked, continues to be revoked.

22 If you have any questions, you feel free to
23 call the office. You do have an opportunity to
24 reapply in one year.

25 My suggestion would be, you understand that

1 your arrogance is probably what got you here and
2 it's going to continue to keep you here if you don't
3 drop it.

4 So, good luck to you, sir, and have a
5 great day.

6 Agenda Item No. 116, Board comment and
7 future agenda items.

8 If I could ask counsel, is this where we
9 would have the conversation or did we already have
10 the conversation about the next meeting?

11 DAG HARRIS: We've already had that
12 conversation, but just to reiterate. Feel free to
13 jump in if I'm missing anything.

14 Board staff has the instruction to follow
15 up with CSC, as far as retrieving for those
16 individuals who used their services for completing
17 their applications. Getting copies, if any, of
18 those paper applications, as well as speaking with a
19 certified representative to clarify the process --
20 the process of completing the application. Whether
21 it's a joint process between CSC and the applicant
22 as well, or is it just solely CSC and they're the
23 only ones making the representation on the
24 application.

25 Then it's also recommended that once we

1 get those -- once all that information is provided
2 for individual -- for those individuals who the
3 Board staff can confirm used their services, for
4 those items to be renoticed. Again, it's not a
5 guarantee as to what would happen either way. But
6 just for it to be renoticed and to get them -- and
7 at that time at the hearing, the Board should then
8 have the representation provided by, more than
9 likely, Executive Director Saladino as to what is
10 that process.

11 Because if CSC makes its own
12 representations that they're not involved or it's a
13 joint completion of the application, that may not --
14 that more than likely may not change the results
15 that the Board made. But if there is confirmation
16 that it's solely CSC representatives completing
17 those applications, then that may change some
18 outcomes. It's really going to be dependent on
19 that.

20 But, we don't need an actual motion on
21 that. The Board did make its action, so my
22 recommendation is Board staff has their
23 instructions, and for these items to be renoticed,
24 and specifically for the caption on the agenda to
25 say, like a corrective action, and then a quick

1 blurb as to, you know, why this agenda item is being
2 brought back. But that's something that the Board
3 staff can work alongside counsel with.

4 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: And then it was
5 just -- sorry, it was just brought to my attention
6 we did have some trailed items in the last session
7 that I need to address.

8 So we have trailed Agenda Item No. 108,
9 111.

10 There is no one in the audience in the
11 south. Is there anyone in the audience up north?

12 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: No, Madam Chair.

13 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We have Agenda Item
14 No. 108, Cesar Puga, who is not in the audience.
15 And Agenda Item No. 111, Carolyn Davis -- or Carolyn
16 Davis, who is not in the audience.

17 So at this time I'll take a motion.

18 BOARD MEMBER CORTEZ: Board Member Cortez
19 motioning to uphold the denial based on no-call,
20 no-show. It's now 4:09 p.m.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion.
22 Do we have a second?

23 BOARD MEMBER BEZICK: Bezick seconds.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: So we have a motion,
25 we have a second. All in favor say aye.

1 (All present Board members voted aye.)

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The motion passes.
3 Those cards will stay the same.

4 Can I ask a question off record real
5 quick?

6 (Off Record.)

7 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Counsel Harris.

8 DAG HARRIS: Just before everyone leaves,
9 because we still have some folks in the north, I did
10 want to just inform everybody that this will be my
11 last meeting. I'm --

12 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SALADINO: Denied.

13 DAG HARRIS: I did accept another offer,
14 and I wanted to be able to tell each and every one
15 of you -- who's got onions? And I wouldn't have
16 traded all the different -- sorry. Oh, these
17 onions.

18 It has been an absolute pleasure working
19 with each and every one of you. You have been some
20 of the best people to begin my legal career with.
21 And that, I think, was the saddest part. I couldn't
22 even bring myself to call Vinny after I gave notice
23 on that.

24 I'm just so proud of how this Board moves.
25 I'm just -- I just appreciate how honorable each and

1 every one of you on the Board is, including crazy
2 Bobby G. I'm proud of how hard Board staff works,
3 especially when I have an opportunity to see how
4 fair and how honorable you are to persons of color,
5 to individuals who maybe may have not been born with
6 a silver spoon in their mouth, who may have made
7 poor decisions in their life. But if they're open
8 and they're honest with that, you give them a
9 chance.

10 And that's going to be the toughest part
11 for me. Because we always say that, you know, we
12 have hard-headed clients, right? And we always
13 have -- we have -- always have some clients that
14 have been difficult. But I couldn't even think of a
15 more perfect client to have worked with, each and
16 every one of you.

17 And so, I don't know how far this would --
18 this technically goes or how much weight this would
19 have, but it has been an absolute honor working with
20 each and every one of you. And I'm going to miss
21 our meetings. And I have never been just so proud.
22 I mean, you get sworn in, you do your job, but never
23 have I just walked out of any meeting and just been
24 proud of the client that I worked with. Because you
25 all are just some honorable people. You're fair,

1 you give everybody a chance.

2 And despite what anybody else says, it has
3 just been easy to be an advocate for this Board.
4 Because I have such tremendous respect for this
5 Board. And I know this Board will continue to be
6 great afterwards.

7 The other part is, I have done my best to
8 give the best representation that I can to each and
9 every one of you, and I want you to continue to
10 expect the same representation, the same level of
11 zealous advocacy from anybody. And I hope you do
12 hold anybody to that same standard and that same
13 bar. Because each and every one of you deserve it
14 and the Board deserves it.

15 So I just wanted to leave that piece with
16 you. Thank you all, you know, for even being
17 patient with me as I got to grow and get acclimated
18 to everything. I just -- I mean, I'm a G from
19 Miami, so I didn't expect this. But there's -- I
20 say all the time that this was my favorite Board,
21 and it's -- my little tears are representative of
22 that. So I just wanted to leave that piece, since
23 this is my last meeting.

24 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: We thank you and all
25 you've done for us and keeping us out of trouble.

1 DAG HARRIS: To the last day.

2 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: I know we can be
3 lively, so I do appreciate that. And then, you
4 know, gosh, we're going to miss you. We are going
5 to hold someone to get us a good one. Big shoes to
6 fill, but we look forward to seeing someone new.

7 Hopefully you're going to something new
8 and great.

9 DAG HARRIS: I am. I did accept one, but
10 it's like the -- what the funny part is, there's,
11 like, another one in the background. But because I
12 gave an acceptance to one, I have to give the
13 appropriate notice. But I will update.

14 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Keep in touch.

15 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Chricy, I just want
16 to thank you for all the advice that you've given
17 us, given me personally.

18 I've worked with a lot of attorneys over
19 the years. I would have never known that you were
20 just starting out when you came to us. You are
21 truly one of the best attorneys that I have ever
22 worked with. I know that you're going to go on to
23 do great things and help a great many people.

24 And I really hope you do have some input
25 as to who we get on the Board. This seems to be

1 something that we have. Every time we get a great
2 DAG, they move on to bigger and better things.

3 So I don't know if we should request a
4 cruddy one, since they stay around for a while.
5 They move on to bigger and better things. But thank
6 you, and I appreciate all the work that you've done
7 for us in guiding our staff.

8 DAG HARRIS: Thank you.

9 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you. And,
10 again, sorry -- really sorry to see you leave.

11 We'll go on to the next agenda item,
12 that's No. 116, Board comment future agenda items.

13 I think we did discuss what we're going to
14 bring up, so that's -- going to be actual.

15 So the last thing before we adjourn is
16 public comment.

17 We have no public comment up north -- down
18 south. I don't know where I'm at. You guys don't
19 have anybody?

20 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: No, ma'am.

21 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: The meeting is
22 adjourned.

23 Thank you, guys, for the power session.
24 We got through it.

25 BOARD MEMBER BROWN: Board staff, I'm

1 sorry for the extra work. But I'm hoping with this
2 CSC thing, we can maybe change some things. Because
3 I felt maybe some of the people truly did get denied
4 when it wasn't their fault.

5 MADAM CHAIR NIXON: Thank you.

6 (Proceedings concluded at 4:17 p.m.)

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
