NOTICE OF WORKSHOP TO SOLICIT COMMENTS ON PROPOSED REGULATIONS

The Private Investigator's Licensing Board, 3110 S. Durango Drive, Suite 203, Las Vegas, NV (702) 486-3003 is proposing regulation changes pertaining to chapter 648 of Nevada Administrative Code. A workshop has been set for 8:00am on October 22, 2015. This workshop will be held at the Grant Sawyer State Office Building, 555 E. Washington Ave., Attorney General Conference Room, Suite 4500, Las Vegas, NV 89703 and will be video conferenced to the Office of the Attorney General, 100 North Carson Street, Mock Courtroom, Carson City, NV 89701. The purpose of the workshop is to solicit comments from interested persons on the following topics that may be addressed in the proposed regulation changes:

- 1. NAC 648.310 Proposed language will clarify who is responsible for the administration of the examinations to licensee applicants.
- 2. NAC 648.330 Proposed language will clarify the expectation of a licensee to place his or her individual license into abeyance to become a qualifying agent for a corporate license holder.
- 3. NAC 648.338 Proposed language will give authority to the Executive Director or designee to grant an exception for a work card to someone eligible to contribute to any public employee's retirement system.
- 4. NAC 648.340 Proposal will repeal this regulation as this fee is no longer a requirement.
- NAC 648.341 Proposed language will require all work card applicants to pass an examination and will adjust the passing score from 100% to 80%.
- 6. NAC 648.342 Proposed language will clarify who is responsible for ensuring each registered employee has passed the examination.
- 7. NAC 648.343 Proposed language will eliminate outdated requirements and establish audit procedures for the Board.
- 8. NAC 648.344 Proposed language will require a licensee to notify the Board of a new employee being added to their roster. This language will bring the number of days into compliance with the NRS.
- 9. NAC 648.530 Proposed language will clarify the need for licensees to add their license number to any vehicles associated with their work and will clarify badge requirements.
- 10. NAC 648.570 Proposed language will allow for unlicensed persons to submit a bid for activities regulated by this chapter; however it does not permit that person to conduct any activity in the State prior to obtaining a license to do so.
- 11. Proposed language to establish the definition and duties of qualifying agent.
- 12. NAC 648.3403 Proposed language will increase work card registration fees from \$85 and \$95 to one flat rate of \$135.
- 13. NAC 648.431 Proposed language will increase the amounts of fines for violations of Chapter 648.

Small Business impact statement:

Proposed regulations for topic numbers 1-11 have no estimated economic effect on the business which it is to regulate or on the public. Additionally, there are no estimated adverse effects of topics 1-11. These proposed regulations will benefit licensees by clarifying existing regulations, repealing outdated requirements, bringing regulations in-line with existing NRS requirements and defining terms used in currents regulations.

Proposed regulation for topic number 12 will have a \$50 increase for persons applying for registered work cards. Work cards are valid for 5 years resulting in a \$10 per year increase. This increase will assist in covering the cost of processing the registered work card applications and falls in line with the NRS.

Proposed regulation for topic number 12 will have an impact on license holders only when they are in violation of the provisions of NRS/NAC Chapter 648. The proposed changes will benefit the agency in addressing repeat offenders and pursuant to NRS 648.040, money collected from the imposition of fines is deposited into the State General Fund.
